

Rare Plant Status Review: *Plagiobothrys hystriculus*

Until 2005, *Plagiobothrys hystriculus* was presumed extinct and placed on List 1A because it was last seen around 1892 in the Montezuma Hills area of Solano County. Due to the recent rediscovery of this species, a move from List 1A to 1B is warranted, by definition. However, this status review is intended to inform others who are doing surveys in the area (Montezuma Hills, Potrero Hills, Jepson Prairie, Wilcox ranch) about the species' rediscovery as well as the habitat characteristics and survey window.
