**Chilian Government and the insurgents.**  
Chilian Government refused to make any proposals that would give rise to any from the representatives of the revolutionary Congress. The rebels asked for the resignation of President Balmaceda, the transfer of the reins of power to some influential public man, and last not least, for the annulling of the recent elections for members of Congress. As might have been expected, President Balmaceda refused to listen to such propositions and the negotiations fell through. It cannot be said that the Chilian Government sought to gain time by proposing negotiations, for in twenty-four hours it had notified the world affair, and its summary proceedings leads one to suppose that in spite of reverses in the North and the advance of the revolutionary forces, the Government must feel itself in a very strong position as yet.

**CANON OUT OF FOREST SCHOOL.**  
For the benefit of the many "Old Foresters" now in the River Plate, who will have heard with regret of the death of Bradford, and in 1852 came to Forest School as the founder of the school. Canon Guy was published the following short account of his life, written by Canon Shapell (also an Old Forester), which appeared in the *Observer* of the 28th of March:—  
Dr. Guy was something more than a successful schoolmaster. He was a man of marked original character, who stamped his influence and personality upon his pupils and friends in no ordinary degree. He was born at Hove, in Yorkshire, in 1825, and received his earliest training at the Howard Grammar School. At Lincoln College, Oxford, he came under the influence of the Tractarian movement. Almost all the great figures of the movement were among his friends, Newman excepted. It was for a short time Head Master of Bradford, and in 1852 came to Forest School as Dr. Gilderde's second in command. In 1856 he became Head Master, and under his leadership thirty years the school steadily increased in numbers and its reputation, until it became well known at the Universities and in London, and prominent on the cricket and football fields.  
Dr. Guy's nature was that of a supporter of Lord Selborne, then Sir Rowland Palmer, when he stood as a Liberal for the University of Oxford.  
Dr. Cloughton, when Bishop of St. Albans, marked his sense of the worth done at Forest School by offering an honorary canonry to the Head Master; and in 1886, Dr. Guy retired from the active direction of the school to the village living of Great Greens, near Clevedon.  
Dr. Guy's native Yorkshire shrewdness, great power of organization, keen insight into character, and resolute purpose, would have compensated him in any walk of life. But they were concentrated and inspired by a disciplined enthusiasm of devotion to Christian ideals, which found a schoolmaster's life as its seldom found.

**THE CONGRESS OF 1891.**  
Congress opens to-day, and the business to be laid before it will be pregnant with the fortunes of the Republic. If it resolves itself into the question of banking and currency, we may entertain the best-founded hope that in ten years (perhaps less) the country will be once more on the high road of prosperity. But if it falls back on the old method of issuing Argentine money, the country will not be better off than it is now. It is not easy to anticipate the discussion on the banking question, but it will probably be long and tiresome. The debate on the question will be watched with great interest both here and in Europe.

**BANK PROJECT.**  
Among the numerous projects on this subject we notice that the Argentine Bank will be summed up thus:—  
The Bank of the Republic will be on a similar footing to the Bank of England, the capital being provided entirely by shareholders. The Bank will have to manage the currency, and the Bank to have sole right of emission in the Argentine Republic.  
The capital is to be from 20 to 50 million dollars, the bank to emit 150 million dollars in metallic notes, from 5 dollars upwards. All the present paper-money to be called in at the rate of 40 cents, that is \$100 in metallic notes for every \$400 in paper. The Bank to be obliged to burn 100 millions yearly of the said issue of 150 millions, until the issue is reduced to double the paid-up capital. Then the Bank will have to convert its notes for gold on demand, and for this purpose the specie reserve must always be at least 33 per cent of the metallic notes in circulation.  
For small change, under 50 cents, the Bank will issue silver, nickel or copper money. The Bank will take over the liquidation of all State Banks, without charging any commission. If the assets of the banks exceed their liabilities, the Bank will receive the surplus, and will distribute pro rata among depositors and other creditors, and if there be still any remainder it shall be distributed among the shareholders of such liquidated banks.  
The Bank of the Republic may commence operations as soon as one-third of the capital shall be paid up in gold. From that date the metallic notes above mentioned shall be legal tender in discharge of all obligations at the rate above stipulated, namely 100% for the obligations of 100% in gold, or for 250% in currency.  
Such is Mr. Linck's project, and until we see that of the Finance Minister, it is difficult to offer an opinion as to its merits. Meaningful underpinnings to many of the projects heretofore advanced, and would save us from Governor Costas's scheme of making a fresh issue of shillings to enable the Provincial Bank to continue its career of ability.  
Some less would certainly accrue to persons holding credits in gold, as the present currency is worth only 27 cents and Mr. Linck's project would convert it into gold at 40 cents. But it is evident that in order to remedy the currency a loss must fall on some portion of the community. On the other hand, the society at large would gain by reforming the currency, and on the whole the results would be much better than if we had a fresh issue of shillings.
