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## Introduction

This bibliography was developed especially for students interested in their own or other local and regional faunas, with what has already been published in the form of manuals, guides, catalogs, lists of species, additions to lists of species, and the like, upon the fauna of Greenland, upon the fauna of each of the various states of the continental United States, and of the various provinces of Canada.

The development of this bibliography took place over a period of a great many years by all three of its authors. Until several years ago each of us was working independently, and then the opportunity arose to allow us to combine our efforts. In addition to the references collected by each of the

authors, numerous entries were supplied us by F. Martin Brown, Harry K. Clench, and John C. Downey.

It is obvious that all literature on our North American butterflies can be listed and arranged into a faunal bibliography, since all butterflies described and discussed from any and every viewpoint in our vast literature are naturally observed or taken from some locality or localities usually mentioned in the text. Such a bibliography embracing all of the literature would be highly desirable. We early realized that such a complete treatment would take all three of us the remainder of our lives. We did not have such a definitive bibliography in mind. Rather we thought of this bibliography as one that would offer as many appropriate titles as we could find in the sources searched.

In our search we decided to select all papers having the state name in the title and most other papers covering material from two or three states

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even if the names of the states involved were not mentioned in the title. Further we listed and included in the "Supplemental Bibliography" (found after the state and province treatments) pertinent papers which each covered a number of states. Attention is called to these papers in the introductory paragraph or paragraphs of the various state and province treatments. This "Supplemental Bibliography" allows the avoidance of a great amount of repetition in citing titles under the various states and provinces.

We have included a number of references to mimeographed material that were apparently only distributed by their authors. These would not be considered published or available for taxonomic purposes; however, they were included because any source of information can be important to students of distribution and zoogeography. For the same reason we have not excluded nonpublished theses.

In general, collecting notes buried in reports of meetings and in proceedings of societies have been omitted as well as the literature on economic insects. We also omitted references to the various well-known butterfly books by Holland, Klots, and Scudder, as being too general and too broad in geographic coverage. For the same reasons the various family, subfamily, genus, and group revisions were omitted. The numerous papers reporting upon various migrations of the Monarch butterfly were usually omitted. The annual "seasonal summaries" published by the Lepidopterists' Society in the *Lepidopterists' News* and in the *News of the Lepidopterists' Society* from 1947 until the present time and edited and contributed to by numerous workers were also omitted because of the difficulty in attributing authorship to the various parts of the many summaries and also because they are readily available for reference in the serial mentioned.

In developing this bibliography the following bibliography-oriented serials were thoroughly searched: *Zoological Record* (volume 1, 1864, through volume 102, 1965, the latest volume at hand); *Entomological News* (volume 1, 1890, through volume 82, 1971, both the contents of each volume and the very valuable section entitled "Entomological Literature," which was later entitled "Current Entomological Literature" and which was published in every issue from volume 1, number 2, through volume 65, 1954); *Lepidop-*

*terists' News* (volume 1, 1947, through volume 12, 1958, both the contents of each volume, except as noted in the paragraph above, and the section entitled "Recent Papers on Lepidoptera" and later changed to "Recent Literature on Lepidoptera"); *Journal of the Lepidopterists' Society* (a change in title and a continuation of the foregoing, volume 13, 1959, through volume 26, number 3, 1972, both the contents of each volume, except as noted in the paragraph above and the section entitled "Recent Literature on Lepidoptera," which was discontinued after issue number 4 of volume 21, 1966).

For the literature of the years 1966 through 1969, particularly poor years for bibliographical research because of the cessation of published bibliographies or literature listings by the *Journal of the Lepidopterists' Society* and earlier by *Entomological News* (1954), the very excellent *Bibliography of Agriculture* was thoroughly searched through the year 1969, the year before a drastic change was made in the format of the latter.

In addition to the serial publications mentioned above, the following list of periodicals is composed of those either searched for a lengthy period of years, in some cases in their entirety or through about the year 1972. We chose to search these thoroughly because we knew them to contain a number of faunal papers beyond those listed as occurring in them in *Zoological Record* and *Entomological News* or because in some instances they were published prior to volume 1 of *Zoological Record* (1864).

In addition, numerous titles encountered elsewhere through the year 1972 were added. The authors, however, do not claim to have found all appropriate titles and will be receptive to notices of omission.

Article titles are quoted verbatim from the journals in which they appeared. Punctuation and the rendering of bibliographic terminology such as "number" and "part," however, have been made consistent herein for clarity in usage.

The arrangement of the numerous bibliographies offered in this paper is of a single alphabetical list combining Greenland, the provinces of Canada, and the states of the United States. Thus the bibliography for Greenland is found after Georgia and before Idaho, and the bibliography for Saskatchewan is found after Rhode Island. Each of the political districts into which the Northwest Territories, Canada, is subdivided are treated separately because of their immense size. This was thought to be more meaningful than to have a single set of entries under the broader heading.

A perusal of this paper shows that there are no statewide or province-wide lists or other comprehensive treatments at all for Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, Delaware, District of Franklin, District of Keewatin, District of Mackenzie, Idaho, Maryland, Massachusetts, Missouri, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Prince Edward Island, Rhode Island, Saskatchewan, South Carolina, South Dakota, Vermont, West Virginia, and the Yukon Territory. The butterfly faunas of numerous other states and provinces have not received adequate attention.

Bibliography is the handmaiden of all research. It is our hope that this bibliography will stimulate much future work on the fauna of North America.

## Alabama
