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A DULL stock market is the opportunity of the specialist; consequently the features of the market, awaiting the result of next Tuesday's polling, have been the manipulation of such issues as Chicago gas and minor railroad stocks, in the latter of which there is generally a fair suspicion that the buyer and the seller is for the most part the same individual. Outside of this movement of specialties and a very limited commission business, the interest of Wall Street has been mainly political. To an impartial observer it would seem that the only salvation of the monetary world would be the triumph of a third party at the polls. These prophecies are as natural to elections as hair to the head. If anyone will cast a thought across the Atlantic to England for other than free trade or tariff argument, he will at the present moment find a party trying to forget the foolish things it said would follow if the government of the nation was taken out of its hands and it relegated to the merely watchdog position of the party in opposition which it now holds, and a party in power not yet able to show how it is going to redeem the many promises of good to follow the transference of control to its hands. It will not be forgotten, too, that the prospects of Mr. Gladstone's accession to power made some foolish people sell their shares in the Bank of Ireland. If any here think of disposing of their investments for purely political reasons, let them remember these things. Of course, professional operators will act on the result one way or the other, and a temporary change of prices will result. The continuance of the present administration and its fiscal policy is generally conceded to be likely to least disturb quotations.

THE effect of the slight revival of business confidence which has recently taken place in London may be seen by a number of indications. The Chilian loan, lately offered, was subscribed to many times over, showing that the English investor is still favorable to South American securities. Another indication to the same effect is a recrudescence of more than doubtful new companies inviting subscriptions of new capital. This revival of speculative confidence has not been induced by any revival of trade. The increase in the bank rate was due to the foreign withdrawals of gold. Within the past few weeks these withdrawals have amounted in the aggregate to more than £2,000,000. The only question is whether the present advance in rate will prove a sufficient protection, and as to this considerable doubt is expressed. Austro-Hungary must have gold wherewith to carry out the scheme of currency reform upon which the two governments have embarked. Chili also wants gold in order to restore her paper currency to a specie basis. Both of these are new demands and, although they are not likely to be unduly pressed, they will always be hanging over the London money market and causing an absorption of the metal whenever opportunity offers. These and other demands are so threatening that a high Bank rate is to be expected until they are abated. One indication of the business depression in Great Britain is the sensible decrease in the demand for skilled workmen. The falling off is not confined to any special branch of trade. The returns sent in by the chief trade unions show that in every case there is an increase in the number of unemployed workmen on the books of such societies. Since the middle of last year the labor market has slowly but surely indicated the progress of a period of trade depression, but in no month during the whole of that time has the change for the worse been so strongly marked as during the month just passed away. Owing, of course, to the slackness of trade, of which the unfavorable nature of the late unemployed returns furnish so strong an indication, there have recently been many movements to reduce wages or otherwise to render conditions of labor more difficult for the employed. In consequence there has been a great increase in the number of strikes. It is to be noticed

that all attempts to conciliate the disagreement between the cotton spinners and their employers have failed; and that one of the most important strikes in the history of English industry is likely shortly to take place. So far as France is concerned, trade during September diminished compared with last year, both in the imports and the exports, but principally in the former, the large arrivals of wheat caused by the failure of the crop in France, and of the new vintage of Spanish wines, in view of the application of the higher tariff having commenced last year. The imports and exports of manufactures have each declined eleven millions of francs, but the loss represents 20 per cent in the imports and only 7 per cent in the exports.

In an excellent article, the *Commercial Bulletin* draws attention to the unreliability of the reports of the stock of gold held in this country, issued annually by the Director of the Mint. The stock is accounted for under four heads: (1) gold held by United States Treasury; (2) held by National Banks; (3) held by state, private, and savings banks, trust companies and other financial institutions, partly estimated; (4) in private hands. Roughly speaking, the first three account for about one-half of the country's stock of gold as estimated, and the figures are very nearly positively accurate. Under the fourth head, however, stands something over \$300,000,000, and it is about this amount that question arises. There is, of course, no reliable means of finding how much gold is in the actual possession of individuals at any moment. At best it can only be guessed at, and there are no data available to give any sort of certitude to the guess. It can proceed from known facts about as well as an estimate of the population of Mars. The Directors of the Mint have started in their stock-taking, under this head, from an assumption, and have modified this assumption annually according to still further assumptions. A process of this kind naturally stultifies itself in time, and the *Commercial Bulletin* raises the question whether the point of manifest absurdity has not already been reached. It is generally known that gold is not commonly current among our people, who much prefer bills. It is comparatively seldom met with in every-day monetary transactions, and the tendency of the holder is to pass it away as soon as possible, or deposit it in a bank. Neither are our people given to hoarding. The old-stocking method of saving is in little repute among an active commercial community such as ours is. But there is over \$300,000,000 of gold coin to be accounted for, if the report of the Director of the Mint is accurate—that is between five and six dollars for every man, woman and child in the land. It isn't possible to demonstrate that this amount is largely fictitious; but demonstration is not necessary. The probabilities against its existence are even stronger than a demonstration. As the *Commercial Bulletin* says: "The official reporting of a hypothetical immense idle surplus of gold is a matter of very questionable prudence. In affairs of such fundamental importance we cannot afford to be misled by mere official guesses. The monetary affairs of the world are verging on a crisis in which it may be vitally important to know, with approximate accuracy and without possibility of mistrust, how much gold the United States have to depend upon, and to be told, under such circumstances, that we have seven hundred millions, when we have possibly but five hundred millions, might lead us into very grave errors of national policy. If no better estimates are possible than those that yield the present unbelievable result—which may possibly be the fact—then it would be far better for the Government to leave the responsibility of taking the national stock of gold to those who can make guesses without responsibility. The Director of the Mint would be entitled to the respect of the public if he were to say, in his next annual report, that the outcome of the available methods of estimate had become so incredible that he had concluded to discontinue his statements of the stock of gold."

WE have been assured from every quarter that the present campaign is a "Campaign of Education." Everybody is parroting the phrase, and it is probable that a great many people really believe what they repeat. But, where are we to find any process in recent electioneering which one dare dignify with the term "Education?" We wish some one would show it to us, for look where we may we can find nothing of the kind. It is true, the brass band, the highly decorated "personality," and many of the circus accompaniments of previous campaigns have played a very small part so far in the present contest. This is, undoubtedly, a welcome concession to public decency and decorum. It is, in a way, a lesson in good manners and good sense, which may be effective in the future. But it is not Education in the sense intended by those who assure us that the campaign has been one of Education. It may be that voters have been studying economics and statistics in secrecy, and have acquired for themselves not only a close knowledge of facts relevant to the questions of the campaign, but that which is even more valuable and is the indubitable sign of

real education, a mental "temper and behavior," patient, flexible, sincere, quite free from prejudice and hastiness; but, no evidence is visible that any process of the sort has been going on.

**Q**UITE the contrary, on a cold calculation it would be found that fully three parts out of four of all that has been written and uttered on press and stump by both parties is "bosh." It is difficult to adequately characterize the cooked statistics, the reckless assertions, the perverted, concocted stuff with which the country has been deluged during this campaign of "Education." Much of it suggests what might be said and printed in a mock campaign carried on in a lunatic asylum. Are we so ignorant and so feeble-minded as this nonsense makes us out to be? Who believes the stuff? and if nobody pays any real attention to it, why is it printed and bawled about the country with such energy? Surely the whole affair is a joke? The learned orators must be winking when they tell us that the difference last year between the declared value of our European imports and of our European exports, some \$200,000,000 we are told, was paid to us in gold. The statistics of the United States Treasury are easily accessible, and they show that we received less than \$50,000,000 in gold from Europe, and sent thither something over \$50,000,000—leaving a slight balance against us. Is this education, or is it sublime reliance upon the crass ignorance of the people? Mr. Depew quotes the census of 1890 as giving statistics for 1891—a year later! Is this Education? Whether the *Tribune* or Mr. MacVeagh was the first to charge Mr. Egan with dishonesty, is used one way and the other to influence Irish-Americans to vote for Mr. Harrison or Mr. Cleveland. Is this Education? Idiotic diagrams, silly rhymes on little tin plates, wholesale charges of bribery, corruption, colonizing, gaibled reports of speeches, extracts from foreign journals, are these, forsooth, the evidences of Education? If not, where else are we to look for the "education?"

**T**HE letter of Thomas F. Gilroy is an interesting document. A fair conclusion from the reading of it is that New York will be a greatly favored city if Mr. Gilroy and his associates are able to carry out their policy of public improvement. It is hard to believe, however, that, as he says, there are any men living who will see the time when New York's streets will be well paved and clean, when there will be room in them for all her traffic, and viaducts for a sufficient system of rapid transit, when all present obstructions will be underground, and when her public buildings will be palaces, and her private houses comfortable, healthy and reasonably spacious. But Mr. Gilroy's consideration of our important local problems is, in the main, satisfactory. It is not, however the details of the letter that are particularly worthy of public approval. It is Mr. Gilroy's evident intention to give to New York what local improvements the city needs. Apart from routine business, it is the one great function of the Mayor of New York, as it is of the president of a great railroad, to bring the municipal machinery and plant down to date, to adapt it to the growing needs of our population. This, among other things, is what Tammany has been trying to do during the past four years, and it is what Mr. Gilroy promises to do. His achievements in the past warrant us in believing that he will do his best to keep his promises. Furthermore, we believe, that on such a platform, he deserves under the circumstances the support of his fellow-citizens. There are several important newspapers in the city that are continually reading "job," and nothing but "job" into any scheme proposed by the current administration. That jobbery in our municipal government did not cease with the building of the County Court House we very well know; but the fact remains that after four years of Tammany rule, nothing scandalous, except the appointments to office, has transpired. An unmistakable effort has been made to do something for the city as well as for the organization. Under such circumstances the Tammany leaders may be credited with a certain amount of good intention, and should receive a qualified support.

**P**ROPERTY-OWNERS on the West Side righteously feel aggrieved at the discovery that the strip of property recently purchased between 80th and 85th streets, west of Riverside Drive, is intended for the uses of the Dock Department and not for the uses of the Park Department. Whether the opinion was warranted or not we cannot say, but certainly the idea was pretty generally held on the West Side that the acquisition of this property by the city was for park purposes. Even if the Westsiders are in error in this matter, it is a disgrace that the municipality should undertake a so-called project, for such would be the extension of the dock system along the only part of our water front which is free from the nuisances, the noise and dirt incidental to commercialism. The West Side is a district of homes. Property-owners and builders alike have striven to stamp that character upon it for years, and it is the duty of the whole municipality to second and support

this effort in every way possible. A meeting should be called to protest against this outrage.

#### Municipalities as Employers of Labor.

**A** GREAT deal of discussion has been provoked in London by the final decision of the County Council no longer to employ contractors. They wish to save the profits of the middleman by managing all the work themselves, and by means of workmen in their direct employment. This is the first step in a series of reforms contemplated by that body. As it is a very important step by reason of the principles of municipal action on which it is based, and as these principles are related to the conditions of our own municipalities as well as those of England, it is worth while to consider for a moment the issues affected by the innovation.

The London *Economist*, a paper which is predisposed to doubt the wisdom of government or municipal interference, comments on the matter with such fairness that a glance at its point of view will assist, perhaps, an understanding of the question in all its bearings. According to the *Economist*, the question is one of expediency and convenience. If it proves cheaper and more satisfactory for a body like the London County Council to do its own work, then it is only right that they should put an end to the plan of getting the work done by contract. On which side does the balance of expediency and convenience lie? The *Economist* believes that it is quite possible to show that in such matters as the supply of gas and water, or the management of drainage works, an honestly and efficiently directed system of direct management is best and cheapest. These undertakings are in their nature permanent, and the continuity of labor they require enables the municipal employer to manage them with success. But, in the opinion of this journal, it is a very different thing to carry on building operations without the intervention of contractors. The Council may manage one great improvement scheme well enough, but when that is finished what is to become of the plant and the workmen? Supposing, which is almost certain, that no fresh scheme of equal magnitude is to be undertaken, are they to let many thousand pounds in scaffolding, cranes, mortar mixers and other plant remain for a year or two out of use, and at the same time to discharge a vast body of masons, bricklayers and laborers? Under these circumstances, as soon as one improvement scheme was out of hand, the Council would feel compelled to find work, and if it could not be found, to make work in order to avoid discharging the men in its employment. It would be utterly impossible for a Council that has always been eager to insist on good wages and fixed employment to face the outcry consequent upon a wholesale dismissal of its men. The *Economist* claims that even more serious problems might arise in hard times. If the County Council possessed machinery for employing large bodies of men, tremendous pressure would be put upon it in times of distress to find relief for the unemployed. It would be almost impossible for a body constituted as the Council is to withstand such pressure; yet, if once yielded to, the weakness would be utterly ruinous.

Those who carefully consider the matter will soon perceive that the arguments which we have stated are those which tell most forcibly against the policy of enlarging the municipal functions. The London Common Council, particularly, would be in this respect most unfortunately situated, for the leaders of it are radicals closely associated with the labor movement; and they would be continually tempted to sacrifice the interests of the municipality to those of their constituents and associates. But the municipal governments of other cities are placed more or less in the same position. In Paris, for instance, the municipal council is forever truckling to the local labor unions. Through this body the municipality has built for them an assembly hall, and has granted them special privileges of many different kinds. Its whole policy is that of a deliberate sacrifice of the interests of the city for the sake of the city's employes. We find many manifestations of the same tendency in our own country. Here in this city we pay the street sweepers some dollars a week more than the wages which a private employer would pay for the same grade of labor. In case this grade of labor was receiving starvation wages, we can understand that the municipality would be right in bringing the remuneration up to a more humane level; but no such fact can be urged in excuse of these or of any similar disbursements. The ordinary rates of wages are sufficient for the support of the laborer; his extra dollars are a pure gratuity. It should be noticed, also, that this New York case is one of permanent and not merely transitory employment. It is a deliberate gift to the workingmen in the interest, not of the city, but of the organization which conducts our city government. In case the municipality should assume the function, say, of supplying gas to the consumers or of operating local railways, the payment of such materially increased wages to the employes would make a large hole in any saving on the cost price which the municipality might be able to make by such an extension of its functions. It would be distributing over a few thousand laborers the money saved from the

clutches of half a dozen capitalists, and the consumer, in whose interest the change was ostensibly made, would gain little or nothing. Under the present circumstances there would be particular danger of such a subversion of the interests of the community. As we all know, the labor unions are active in politics. They do not run tickets as often as they did, but they are adopting the more cautious and effective tactics of coercing the cowardly politicians into granting them any favors they want. A flagrant illustration of what they are able to get by these means is the law passed by the last Congress, providing that no laborer on a government contract shall work more than eight hours a day. If our municipalities were large employers of union men there is no telling how much "organized labor" might be able to extract from the coffers of our disorganized municipalities.

We have dwelt at length on the dark side of this matter, because we believe that this tendency to pay labor more than it is worth is the greatest danger which municipalities starting to extend their functions will have to face. A little firmness exhibited in the beginning would shortly brush aside this incipient evil; and it is very possible that when the time comes the proper firmness will be shown. If our municipalities are to become, as we believe that they ought to become, large business concerns, they will have to be managed by business men—men who will pay for a service just what it is worth and no more. Unless such a class of men assume control of our municipalities the purpose of these extensions of municipal functions will not be fulfilled. If the city's interests are continually mismanaged, one of two things will happen. Either the incompetents will be replaced by honest and able executive officials, or else matters will go from bad to worse until the whole attempt will be given up as a bad job. Now, of these alternatives the first is by far the more reasonable. It may take some time to get the good men permanently established, but we have sufficient confidence in the American people to believe that they will eventually elect capable men to perform important tasks. It should be remembered in this connection that submission to the exactions of labor unions would be a peculiarly disastrous case of mismanagement, because the demands of these unions would grow until it would become impossible to satisfy them.

#### Investments—Good and Bad.

In the late fall, when money is in demand for shipment to the interior, the prices of bonds, both speculative and investment, generally sag off to go up again in December, in anticipation of the demand which comes soon after the first day of the year for employment of new investment funds created by the January interest disbursements. This fall the decline has not been very marked, although the demand for bonds has been light. It does not follow from this that prices will not advance next month; on the contrary, the strength now is, if anything, indicative of an advance when the demand must become greater. The present condition of the market proves that in the minds of their holders, at least, there is a belief that a better time is coming for American railway bonds. If this were not the case, prices would decline now, because the employment of money in the open market is more profitable than good bonds can be. But a good bond is profitable to hold not for a month or even a year alone, but for its life. Hence, with the prospect of better prices for bonds, or at least no decline in prices, people of capital will not take the chances of losing good investments, which they may not be able to get back again for the extra profits of an ordinarily strong money market which they know must disappear when the interior demand for New York funds has been satisfied, and the movement this way recurs. In fact, brokers have for some time complained of the small amount of really good bonds offering, and these bonds sell on a basis of from 4 to 4½ per cent, and singular to say, no matter what the demand or how small the offerings, this basis is not changed. This point is brought out clearly in the table following, which contains the names of a number of well-known issues with their prices for the opening of November for three years brought together with a view to gauge the condition of the market now by comparison with the same period in other years:

Between the periods mentioned there have been fluctuations, and sometimes severe ones, as, for instance, between the first two periods which covered the Baring failure; but, as a whole, the figures show what ordinarily an investor would have to pay for certain bonds, and what he might confidently rely upon getting for them if he patiently waited his time. For instance, the quotations for the West Shore 4s on the three days mentioned vary so slightly as not to appreciably vary the yield on such a long-time bond. Whenever there has been a considerable advance in the price of any of the bonds mentioned since November, 1891, the advance can be traced to direct cause, and it will be noticed that the advance has generally stopped at a point which secures a yield of about 4½ per cent. That is the point at which good, but not exceptionally good bonds like the West Shore, have stopped, and for that reason the investor who would buy for the appreciation as well as security of capital, and there are very few who would not, should make his selection outside of those that have touched that limit. The advance in the St. Paul bonds is explained by the great and growing earnings of the property for the past two years and the resumption of dividends on the common stock. The coal combination has been the means of putting up the prices of a good many bonds, but where there has been no such or similar influences the prices have remained settled. For instance, mark the three quotations given of the Atchison 4s, Rock Island Extension 5s, Colorado Midland 1sts, Morris & Essex 7s, Lake Shore 2ds and others. It could be shown, if it were necessary, that this stability of price goes much farther back.

The more important question, however, is the best selection to make for profits as well as security. There are on the active list many issues whose yield will certainly be reduced as soon as our currency conditions give foreigners confidence to buy, and the best among those which pay 5 per cent now under such buying will rise to figures that will pay only 4½ per cent, like some mentioned above. In this class surely Atchison 4s, Brooklyn Elevated 1sts, Kansas & Texas 1sts 4s, and many others may be named. Among the more speculative bonds, though in some of these cases it is hard to see where the speculation comes in, except in the mind or prejudices of the public, there are certainly some that are very cheap. Atlantic & Pacific 4s and Colorado Midland 4s are backed by the Atchison guarantee, but are still speculative, but Lake Erie & Western Second Consols and the East Tennessee Consol 5s are really neither of them so. The first still suffer from the default of years ago, the result of dishonest management, as well as of the rascality outside by which Erie suffered in credit so much. It is hardly likely that a recurrence of so many miseries at any one time is possible. The East Tennessee Consol 5s are selling ten points below what they were two years ago as a consequence of the bad times through which all Southern railroads have passed, but which are probably at an end. They have committed no default and the property on which they are based is receiving so much attention from well-known money makers that its worth is fully attested. The bonds, too, of the Toledo, Ann Arbor & North Michigan are worthy of examination. The road on which they are issued, while making no great surplus has, in bad times as well as in good, enabled interest to be met promptly, and the indications now are that its prospects are better than ever. These and many similar discriminations may be made in the active bond list and as this is the time when bonds usually feel the loss of money at this centre and is yet near the period when bonds advance in anticipation of the January purchases, it is also unquestionably time when such discriminations and selections should be made.

#### As to Architectural Competitions.

VIEWS EXPRESSED BY THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS.

At their annual meeting in Chicago recently the American Institute of Architects gave utterance to their views on the subject of architectural competitions as follows:

While the American Institute of Architects emphatically disapproves of architectural competitions as usually conducted, long experience having shown that they result almost invariably in disappointment and harm to all interests concerned, to the public as well as to the profession, and to owners equally with architects; and while the Institute advises that wherever practicable an architect should be selected individually in the same manner with lawyers, physicians and other professional men; still, where, as on Government work, for many reasons an architectural competition is unavoidable, the following precautions are suggested to both owners and architects as calculated to obviate the principal causes of miscarriage and to enlist the co-operation of architects who will otherwise be likely to refuse participation in the competition:

1. An experienced architect of repute should be engaged by the owners at the start as consulting architect throughout the competition. All the papers and correspondence should be controlled by him. Of course he will not participate as a competitor.

2. The rules and restrictions should be as few as possible, and so explicitly stated as to prevent misunderstanding.

3. Two kinds of competition are customary, viz.: an open and a limited competition. In the latter a certain number of architects are invited to submit designs and all others are excluded. In the former the competition is open to every one. An open competition is often preliminary to a limited competition confined to those architects (usually three to six in number) whose designs received in the open competition have been placed highest.


4. Every invited architect should be paid for his competitive design the schedule commission of 1 per cent on the estimated cost of the building. The architect whose design is placed highest should be guaranteed the work at the schedule fee of 5 per cent for plans and superintendence. Unsuccessful designs should be returned free to their author immediately after the award is made—no portion of them to be used without the consent of their authors.

5. The site of the building should be given and the requirements as to accommodation, cost, etc. It might be well to arrange the requirements in two classes, viz.: those which are arbitrary and must rigidly be adhered to, and those which are advisory only. As a rule, owners will find their interests promoted by making the list of arbitrary conditions as small as possible.

6. All transactions relating to the competition should be in writing and recorded and open to the inspection of each competitor.

7. A date should be fixed within which the awards should be announced and all premiums paid.

8. After the award all drawings should be open to the inspection of all competitors for at least twenty-four hours. In many cases an exhibition open to the public would be desirable.



9. The selection and premiation of the designs should be made by a jury of which at least two-thirds should be disinterested and experienced architects, whose report should be in writing, and accessible to each competing architect.

Mr. Seth Low, formerly Mayor of Brooklyn and now president of Columbia College, and Mr. Richard Watson Gilder, the editor of the *Century Magazine*, were voted honorary members of the Institute.

### The Central Bridge and St. Nicholas Viaduct.

NEW PLANS FOR THE BRIDGE APPROACH—THE VIADUCT NEARLY COMPLETED—A SPLENDID SYSTEM OF DRIVEWAYS IN PROSPECT.

Owners of property in the vicinity of the new Central (Macomb's Dam) bridge and on Washington Heights are congratulating themselves over the near completion of the giant viaduct that connects Washington Heights at St. Nicholas terrace and 155th street with the Harlem plains, and by way of the new Central Bridge with the North Side. The bridge is as yet in the earliest stages of contractors' work, and will not be completed for over a year. But the important item of approaches to the bridge from the most important avenues to the north and south, are of scarcely less interest to the property-owners in the vicinity. As originally planned, the south approach was by Macomb's Dam road, which leads directly to 8th avenue at 150th street. There was no way of reaching the approach from 7th avenue, the direct road from Central Park to the North Side, except by abrupt turns through narrow 153d street, between the precipitous sides of the rocky promontory that fills the space between Macomb's Dam road and 7th avenue, north of 153d street.

Commissioner Gilroy has prepared a plan for the improvement of this approach which seems to meet the approval of all who have heard of it, and which we give in illustration herewith. Commissioners are already applied for to condemn this triangular plot, and it is Mr. Gilroy's plan to have it graded down to an average grade of 7th avenue and the Macomb's Dam road approach and through it to construct the gently-winding approach from 7th avenue, as shown in the diagram. By this means an unobstructed view of the approach and the St. Nicholas viaduct can be had from 7th avenue, and the perils of a hidden and tortuous way be avoided. The original plans for the north approach to the Central Bridge have recently been abandoned, and the Park Department has the new plans now under consideration. The only probable alteration will be to widen the lines of the approach to 100 feet and to provide a connecting approach with Sedgwick avenue.

The viaduct itself is nearly finished. Foot passengers are already using it between St. Nicholas terrace and the elevated railroad station. Commissioner Gilroy said on Thursday that a water-proof granite block pavement would be laid on the carriage-way at once, and as soon as the first span of the Central Bridge (a land span extending from 155th street to the river's edge) was completed the connection could and would be made and the viaduct would be open from 7th avenue to St. Nicholas place.

The viaduct is built of iron. Commencing at the precipitous height at 155th street and St. Nicholas place, which overlooks Harlem plains and the most attractive stretches of the Harlem River, it follows the line of 155th street and by a gradual descent reaches Macomb's Dam road. It spans the elevated road, to which access is gained by a flight of steps from the viaduct to the elevated station at 155th street. A continuation of these stairs reaches 8th avenue. The viaduct will have cost, when finished, \$650,000 and the bridge about \$1,250,000.

These two important improvements, together with a third that is contemplated, will do even more for the districts which they connect than was imagined. The United States law requiring bridges over the Harlem River to be 24 feet above the spring tides also requires them to be constructed at right angles to the bulkhead lines, and this latter requirement has entailed a number of very important and far-reaching changes on both the Manhattan Island and North New York sides of the river. The new bridge, when built, will cross the channel at right angles and will have its southern approach at Macomb's Dam road and its northern approach at 162d street and Jerome avenue, instead of at the beginning of Jerome avenue, as is the case with the old bridge. The piers of the bridge on the North New York side of the river will be to the east of Jerome avenue, and the approach will be built over marsh land, which is at present useless. The approach will be through a lane 100 feet wide, and will be carried to 162d street by an easy grade. The viaduct will connect with the bridge at an obtuse angle, and there will be a large open space made by the junction of the viaduct, the bridge and the road.

When the bridge is finished, and the viaduct open for traffic, a complete system of drives will be ready for use that is not excelled in any city in the world. On the West Side there is St. Nicholas avenue, reaching from Central Park at 110th street on the south to 165th street, where it merges into the Kingsbridge road, a fine driving thoroughfare that crosses the old Kingsbridge, and finds a continuation in Broadway or the picturesque Riverdale avenue to Yonkers. To the east is the broad 7th avenue, which will find an outlet over the new Macomb's Dam Bridge, up Jerome avenue to the racing park, or up Sedgwick avenue to Kingsbridge. Both these systems of drives are fed by smaller but quite as fine driving roads, and the two systems made by the viaduct and the new Central Bridge a rational whole will be something of which New York may justly be proud. The avenues mentioned have long been used by the owners of trotting horses, and since the remarkable popularity of the bicycle, by the cyclists, and they have brought into prominence a section of the city which, twenty years ago, suffered a serious setback in the matter of real estate values. Undoubtedly, the improvements effected by the viaduct and the new bridges will materially increase the interest of the public in contiguous real estate, and this interest not only means the rapid improvement of the district, but an increase in tax values that will fully pay for all the public improvements.

The business aspect of the matter is no less satisfactory. Besides the quick communication made possible by the viaduct an improvement is

contemplated that will largely supplement the usefulness of the Harlem Ship Canal. The proposed improvement is the building of an exterior street, from 138th street on the south underneath the McComb's Dam Bridge to the precipitous bluff of St. George on the north. This exterior street will increase the value of the water front property to an appreciable extent and thereby benefit neighboring property.

Altogether the property-owners in the 12th, 23d and 24th Wards, through which these splendid drives run and which these improvements will most benefit, have reason to be satisfied with the outlook.

### The New Appraiser's Warehouse.

MICHAEL GIBLIN THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER.

Supervising Architect of the Treasury, W. J. Edbrooke, opened bids yesterday week for the work of building and supplying material (excepting plumbing, heating apparatus, elevators, electric wiring and approaches) for the new Appraiser's warehouse to be erected in this city on the block bounded by Greenwich, Barrow, Christopher and Washington streets. There were thirteen bidders, of whom nine were from this city, two from Brooklyn, one from West Troy, N. Y., and one from Pittsburgh, Pa. Such well-known contractors as J. & L. Weber, Chas. T. Wills and Michael Giblin were among the competitors, and the latter was the lowest and successful bidder, his figures ranging from \$59,500 to \$595,785, the work to be completed in 300 days. The next lowest bid ranged from \$599,300 to \$606,871, which shows how close the figuring was.

The lowest bidder, Mr. Michael Giblin, is very well and favorably known as a successful contractor and builder, having erected such fine structures as the Barge Office and the Mercantile Exchange, corner of Hudson and Harrison streets, to say nothing of numerous flats and private dwellings on the West Side, among the latter being eighteen fine dwellings on 80th street and 81st street, near Columbus avenue which he is now building in connection with James W. Taylor. Mr. Giblin during the construction of the new Post-office was master mason of the job. It is a great satisfaction to know that so important a contract will be placed in such good hands as Mr. Giblin's.

### Rapid Transit Matters.

THE SALE OF THE FRANCHISE POSTPONED.

The advertisement of the terms of sale of the projected Broadway and Boulevard and 4th avenue underground electric railroad, that was intended to begin its course of six weeks' publication last Tuesday, has been deferred until probably a week from next Tuesday. At the last moment, when everything was supposed to be in readiness, Mr. John M. Bowers, the legal adviser of the Commission, went over all the records, the plans, reports and terms of sale, to see if they agreed with each other so as to make a perfectly consistent legal record, and so as to comply with the full intent of the law, and he found matter which, in his judgment, demanded a postponement of the publication.

Mr. Bowers' idea was to, if possible, fortify the work of the commission against any possible attack upon it in the courts. In that view of the matter, and while it was considered that from an engineering point of view the plans were sufficiently explicit and ample, it was deemed advisable to make them still more precise as to certain details. This work the engineers have now in hand, and will complete early in the coming week. But because of the breaking in of election day on the week—a legal holiday—the publication will probably be put off still another week.

### Higher Taxes in Brooklyn.

VALUATIONS IN SOME LOCALITIES ALSO LARGEY INCREASED.

The Brooklyn city government is hot after more money for public purposes. The city budget for next year was largely increased, the State tax made an increase of about \$300,000, and the county budget was increased \$77,000 over last year's. Instead of an average rate of \$25.652 per \$1,000 of valuation for the current year, Brooklyn taxpayers will have to pay at the rate of \$27.729 per \$1,000, an increase of \$2.076 per \$1,000.

Besides this, property-owners along the park slope are complaining of largely increased assessments. Ex-Mayor Chapin's house has been raised from \$16,000 to \$17,000. Another piece of property on the same block has gone up from \$12,500 to \$14,000. Michael Dwyer will have to pay on a valuation of \$21,000 instead of \$19,000, and Richard Hyde's will be \$17,000 instead of \$16,000. Ex-Commissioner Robert Furey was raised from \$14,000 to \$17,500. General Christenson's valuation is \$30,000 this year instead of \$23,000. Ex-Commissioner Elijah R. Kennedy will pay taxes on \$25,000 instead of \$22,000. Last year John H. Hanan's house, at 8th avenue and Carroll street, was unfinished, and was assessed at \$40,000. This year, as a penalty for having improved the looks of the neighborhood, Mr. Hanan will pay taxes on \$60,000.

### The Ruddell Houses on West Seventieth Street.

In the description of these houses given in our issue last week one or two contradictions occurred, due, we regret, to a typographical omission. It will be remembered that the Messrs. Ruddell built five houses, and these were properly accounted for in our story, except in the description of the parlors, the second and third floors, where it was made to appear that there were six houses. As to the material used in these floors, three of the parlors and music-rooms are finished in red mahogany and two in white mahogany—a very handsome wood. Three of the second floors are finished in maple and two in oak; and the third floor finish in three is of sycamore and in two of hazel, while the fourth floor throughout in all the houses is finished in birch with good effect. We take pleasure in announcing that since the description the second house of this row has been sold. These houses are so well situated and so well constructed and finished that they are not likely to remain for very long on Messrs. Ruddell's hands.



The price, which is estimated by the *Real Estate and Building Journal* at half and half for the building and land, or \$5.50 per square foot for the land, is considered very low. The *Journal* says: "It is such sales as this which accentuate the prices paid for choice corners in the strictly down-town district. While corners and frontages on favorite streets are worth from \$80 to \$120 a square foot, property located on the same streets only a few blocks away from the business centre

indicators, mail chutes, burglar and fire alarms, servants' calls, oral communicators, fire and burglar-proof safes, etc. The kitchen in the basement is a model of neatness and convenience. The latter is outside of the main building, thus doing away with too intense heat and other nuisances.

All the appointments of the new hotel are of the best, the carpets, draperies, upholstery and pictures coming from W. & J. Sloane; the rooms are large and light and are supplied with ample closet room. The hotel opens under the most auspicious circumstances for its success. Mr. Henry J. ness, giving his interest to his youngest son, William J. Kenny, at which time the present firm of George J. Kenny & Bro. was formed.


## LOAN AGENTS SHUNNING THE WORLD'S FAIR DISTRICT.

Projectors of World's Fair hotels near Jackson Park complain that there is difficulty in securing loans on their buildings. One of them recently said to a reporter: "Our company had bought land valued at \$50,000, and proposed to erect a building to cost \$60,000. We paid for the ground, but decided to borrow \$20,000 toward the construction of the hotel. As money was easy we expected that money loaners would jump at the opportunity of making a \$20,000 loan on security worth \$110,000, but we were cruelly disappointed. Financial men told us frankly that they had received instructions from their clients not to make loans in the Fair district under any consideration, and we were compelled to raise the \$20,000 among ourselves. It is not to be wondered at that there is no more building around Jackson Park than there is, and if visitors find inadequate accommodations next year the blame will rest not so much on Chicagoans as on the wealthy eastern insurance companies which supply the bulk of the money loaned for building purposes."—*Real Estate and Building Journal*.

### THE REAL ESTATE SECTION OF TO-DAY'S PARADE.

# BUILDING NEWS.

## MUNICIPAL NOTES.

Charles W. Dayton, George W. Birdsall, Chief Engineer of the Department of Public Works; Walter Katte, Chief Engineer of the New York Central Railroad system; John Fox and John Carstensen, the Commissioners appointed by Mayor Grant under Chapter 339 of the Laws of 1892, to prepare plans for and carry out the improvement of Park avenue, north of 116th street, have presented their report upon the plans for the elevation of the Central railroad viaduct and the new railroad bridge, to Commissioner of Public Works Thomas F. Gilroy, for his approval, as required by the act. Commissioner Gilroy said the plans were not yet ready for public inspection.

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Commissioner Thomas F. Gilroy, of Public Works, is busy now with the surveys and soundings preliminary to the preparation of plans for the new bridges which are to cross the Harlem ship canal at 3d avenue and at Kingsbridge road. The work has been delayed all through the summer by the failure of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to provide the funds to pay for this preliminary work. Mr. Gilroy said yesterday that the engineers were now actively engaged upon it, and it would be pushed with all proper dispatch to completion. If elected to the Mayoralty, he would see to it that his successor in the Department of Public Works carried the work forward as it was laid out.

\* \* \*

Proposals will be received at the Department of Public Works, until noon of next Thursday, for flagging, curbing, etc., 132d street, from Broadway to Amsterdam avenue; 129th street, north side, from Columbus to 10th avenue; 63d street, from Central Park West to the Boulevard; for regulating, grading, curbing and flagging 130th street, from Amsterdam to Convent avenue; for furnishing the materials and curbing and flagging the sidewalks of the new Harlem Court House at 121st street and Sylvan place; for taking up and relaying the pavement in Rector street, from Broadway to Church street; Warren and Murray streets, from Broadway to College place, and Dey street, from Broadway to Church street; in Spruce street, from Nassau to William; Maiden lane, from Broadway to William; Nassau street, from Beekman to Fulton; Ann street, from Broadway to Nassau; and Roosevelt street, from New Chambers to Cherry street; and for regulating and paving with granite blocks (to be furnished by the Department of Public Works) on the present concrete foundation, 5th avenue, from the north side of 30th to the north side of 32d street; from the north side of 45th street to the north side of 47th street, and from the north side of 51st to the north side of 53d street.

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At the meeting of the Sinking Fund Commissioners on Thursday, Comptroller Myers was authorized to issue \$3,000,000 of dock bonds, and the Commissioners approved a purchase of 203 feet on the North River front, between 23d and 24th streets, by the Dock Department, for \$101,250. The Commissioner of Public Works was authorized to spend \$11,000 on the temporary heating of the new Criminal Court Building, to allow the work of construction to go on all winter. The control of the Castle Garden dock was taken from the Dock Department and restored to the Park Department. A city lot was leased to the Mt. Sinai Hospital for twenty-one years, at a nominal rental, with a privilege of two renewals. A lease of the building at Washington avenue and 160th street, for police purposes, was approved, at \$950 a year. A five-years' lease of Nos. 357, 359 and 391 West 12th street was taken, to be used by the Street Cleaning Department as stables, at \$4,000 a year for five years, with privilege of renewal.

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The Park Board has under consideration a proposition to exclude equestrians from all the carriage roads in Central Park, south of 102d street, and requiring them to keep to the bridle paths, except at crossings. The proposition emanates from many of the habitual drivers in the park. They complain that a large proportion of the riders in the park, especially the pupils of the riding schools in the vicinity, crowd into the carriage ways just to show themselves, often making ridiculous exhibitions of themselves in so doing, and making driving difficult and dangerous. They say the bridle paths were especially provided for the riders and all vehicles are rigidly excluded from the paths, and argue that the riders ought to be required to confine themselves to the bridle paths. They argue further that consideration for the saddle horse, for whose hoofs the carriage roads are too hard, demands that the riders should keep to the paths; and finally, that the present overcrowded condition of the carriage ways demands this much relief in the interests of safety to riders and drivers alike. Commissioner Straus offered the resolution looking to this exclusion, but preferred not to press it until all the members of the board should have opportunity to consider it.

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The proposition to have the 3d avenue bridge over the Harlem closed between the hours of 6 and 9 in the morning and 5 and 7 in the evening came up before the Park Board on Wednesday on Commissioner Tappan's resolution to that effect. Fordham Morris, representing the New York & Northern Railway and many property-owners along the river and on the North Side, was present. He said he recognized in Commissioner Tappan's proposition a reasonable modification of former demands and, in behalf of the people and interests represented by him, was prepared to state that there would be no opposition to it. The Board deferred final action in the matter until after other persons interested should have an opportunity to express their views, and for that purpose appointed a public hearing in the matter at the Board rooms, in the Emigrant Savings Bank building, in Chambers street, next Wednesday at noon.

\* \* \*

The Board of Street Opening and Improvement yesterday adopted resolutions providing for the opening of 8th street from Avenue B to the East

River. They also took final action looking to the opening of 116th street and the widening of 120th street through Morningside Heights in conformity with the agreement made with Columbia College.

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Fordham Morris in behalf of himself and other property owners argued long and earnestly with the Board of Street Openings and Improvement yesterday to induce them to order the abandonment of the proceedings to open Cammann street, that have been pending four years. Commissioner Heintz opposed the proposition, and at his suggestion the matter was laid over to give parties in opposition opportunity to be heard. Mr. Morris offered to pay the costs of the proceeding to date. While the condemnation proceeding has been pending the land has advanced rapidly in value.

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Another measure looking to the safety of travel on the carriage roads in Central Park has already been adopted by the Park Board. It requires all bicycle riders to keep to the right side of the road. Bicycle riding in the park has increased to an amazing extent in the last year, and some such rule was found necessary, for many of the cyclists became so daring that they would dart from side to side of the road directly in front of speeding teams and with even greater peril to their own limbs than to those who were in the carriages. Running counter to the stream of travel, when on the wrong side of the road, they have frequently so frightened horses that they have caused many runaway accidents and smash-ups. The police have instructions to rigidly enforce the new rule.

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Robert Hanna & Co. were awarded the contract for constructing a retaining wall on Riverside Drive at a cost of \$32,000.

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## FRAME DWELLINGS ON WASHINGTON HEIGHTS.

Mainhart & Lowe, of No. 2085 7th avenue, the well-known Harlem brokers, are completing seven attractive three-story and basement frame dwellings on 182d street, between Audubon and Amsterdam avenues, Washington Heights. The houses contain eleven rooms, with all improvements, and are 18x50 feet on lots 70 feet deep, and are offered at \$7,500 apiece. The same firm finished five houses of a like character in the spring, which were quickly sold at from \$8,000 to \$8,500 each.

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## BUILDING TRADES' CLUB BILLIARD TOURNAMENT.

Arrangements have been perfected by the House Committee of the Building Trades' Club for the annual billiard and pool tournament, for members of the club only, to commence on the evening of Monday, October 14th. Entries may be made until Thursday evening next. The prizes are five handsome cues, one to go to each of five winners in an equal number of sets of ten. There are a number of good players in the club and the tournament is sure to attract attention. Assistant Steward Wiseman will manage the play.

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## A TWENTY-FOUR-TON STOOP STONE.

The stoop stone to be laid in front of the Huntington mansion, 5th avenue and 57th street, will be the largest stone ever carried by rail. It weighs twenty-four tons and measures 22 feet in length, 15 feet in width and is 8 inches thick. At the present time it is being dressed at J. J. & F. P. Treanor's stone works, at Hastings-on-the-Hudson, and will be brought to the city in a couple of weeks on Treanor's patent stone car. In front of the Vanderbilt mansion there is a stone weighing eighteen tons.

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## A SILVER BUSINESS ANNIVERSARY.

A peculiarly interesting publication has just come to hand. It is an illustrated souvenir of the 25th business anniversary of Mr. Henry Herrmann, the well and widely-known furniture manufacturer and producer and dealer in hardwood lumber and furniture stock. A native of Germany, Mr. Herrmann came to America in 1866, a master cabinet maker. The next year he began manufacturing in a small way in a shop in Mott street on a cash capital of \$43. From this humble beginning the business thrived under Mr. Herrmann's skillful management with amazing rapidity until now it includes factories, lumber yards, sawmills and warerooms, not only in several places in this city, but in various places in Indiana, Illinois, Kentucky and Tennessee, and an establishment recently sold to an English syndicate in London. Over 2,000 persons are employed in Mr. Herrmann's various establishments, the annual product of which amounts to about \$3,000,000. The record is truly an inspiring and noteworthy one.

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## SIXTY-NINTH REGIMENT ARMORY SITE.

The Sinking Fund Commissioners have finally approved the site selected some time ago by the Armory Board, for a new regimental armory and quarters for the Sixty-ninth Regiment. The site selected includes the ground occupied by Tompkin's Market, in 3d avenue, between 6th and 7th streets; Hall place, east of it, and enough land east of Hall place to make the site 319 by 183 feet in area. Comptroller Myers' objection a month ago was that the site cost too much. He estimated it at \$900,000, and as his estimate is necessary under the statute, it looked as if the Sixty-ninth would have no new armory. A great deal of feeling resulted, but Mr. Myers altered his mind, at the same time asserting that a better and larger site further east, in the same block and fronting on 2d avenue, could be had for \$250,000. But he deferred to the judgment of his colleagues.

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## FORMAL OPENING OF THE GRAHAM FAMILY HOTEL.

One of the pleasantest events of the week was the formal opening of the

new Graham apartment house, on the southwest corner of Madison avenue and 89th street. The building, which is a handsome seven-story structure, in the Romanesque style, of Indiana limestone and Pompeian brick, takes its name from the architect and builder, Mr. Thomas Graham. It fronts 139 feet on the avenue and street and contains thirty-one suites of from two to six rooms, each with separate bath and toilet room, and with private hall entrances. The interior finish is rich in every particular, and bright and attractive. Over sixty persons sat down to dinner in the spacious oak dining-hall on the first day of active business.

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**A SPLENDID PIECE OF MARBLE WORK.**

A familiar feature of the modern improved interior construction of fine buildings is the extent to which marble is used in vestibule, hall, kitchen and bath-room wainscoting and tiling, and in mantel facing. The increased use has led to the development of quarries of marvelous beauty, and more kinds, coming even from old Abyssinia and Syria, are in use than ever before. Nichols & Shipway, of Nos. 105 to 111 East 128th street, are importers and finishers of all the approved kinds. They have recently finished several of the finest jobs in the city, among them the marble tile, mosaic and mirror work in Richard Webber's new market on 3d avenue, between 119th and 120th streets, said to be the most costly and lavishly-decorated market in the world, costing Mr. Webber \$50,000. The floors are mosaic, the wainscot and counters throughout are of Italian marble, the walls of enameled tiles, broken by twenty pilasters of pink Numidian marble, supporting carved capitals of the same marble, also six pilasters of bright pink Tennessee marble, with similar caps. The ceiling is of enameled tiles, broken by beveled French plate mirrors, 4x10 each.

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**EAST RIVER BRIDGE MATTERS.**

A hearing was had last Saturday at the Army building, in Whitehall street, before the Engineer Board, upon the question of the height above the tide level of the proposed new East River bridges. The engineers representing the promoters of the scheme favored a maximum of 135 feet, which is the height of the present bridge, and that was generally viewed with approval. No action was taken.

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**THE WIREMEN'S STRIKE.**

The strike of the electric wiremen that a few days ago seemed in a fair way to breed serious difficulties for the electric light men shows signs of weakness. The sympathetic strikes upon which the union wiremen depended very largely for their success have not taken place, and the unions that have been appealed to have thus far refused to order any sympathetic strikes.

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**STONE FOR THE THIRTEENTH REGIMENT ARMORY.**

The sills, coping and doorway stone for the new Thirteenth Regiment armory, at Sumner avenue and Jefferson street, Brooklyn, are being furnished by John W. Moran, the bluestone dealer, at Hamilton avenue and Hicks street.

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**A TRIP TO PHILADELPHIA IN PROSPECT.**

John McGlensey, President of the Plasterers' Union, is making up a party of builders and others interested in the building trades to go to Philadelphia to inspect the new mortar plant of the Warner Process Mortar Co.

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**GETTING SOME GOOD PLUMBING.**

The Beekman Salutary System Co., of 36 Beekman street, are furnishing fifteen of their double-flushing "Whirlpool" closets in the offices of the R. G. Dun & Co. commercial agency.

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**Out Among the Builders.**

John Hauser is the architect for the following houses: Six three-story brown and limestone front dwellings, 16, 16.8 and 17.4x50, to be built by Louis Wirth on the south side of 114th street, 200 feet east of Lenox avenue, the houses to be trimmed in hardwood, and to have plumbing of the most improved description; for Geo. Schreiner, five five-story brick and stone flats, 25x77, three of the houses to be built on the south side of 77th street, 188 feet east of 1st avenue, and two at Nos. 423 and 425 East 77th street, at a cost of \$90,000; for Joseph Schreiner, two five-story brick and stone improved flats, 25x77, to be built at Nos. 510 and 512 East 82d street, at a cost of \$36,000; for the same builder, one five-story flat, 25x86.6, to be built at No. 227 East 122d street, at a cost of \$23,000; for W. F. Rohrig, four five-story brownstone flats, 25x87, with all improvements, to be built on the north side of 18th street, 275 feet west of 7th avenue, at a cost of \$97,000; for four five-story brownstone flats, with all improvements, 27x77, to be built by Thomas Healy on the north side of 102d street, 210 feet west of 3d avenue, at a cost of \$95,000; for Bertine & Egan, plans for two five-story brick and stone flats and stores, corner 27.6x96, inside house 31x82, to be built on the southwest corner of St. Ann's avenue and 138th street; and for the same owners, plans for two similar flats, 27.6x96 and 35x82, respectively, to be built on the southeast corner of St. Ann's avenue and 138th street.

On the north side of 94th street, between Madison and 5th avenues, Smyth & Robinson will build six first-class brick and stone dwellings, designed by Cleverdon & Putzel. They will be four stories and basement in height, 20, 21 and 22 wide by 60 feet deep. The houses are to have all modern improvements, including elevators and electric lights, and are to cost \$100,000.

On the west side of Macombs Dam road, near Kingsbridge road, a handsome residence, designed by W. H. Symonds, will be built for Dr. J. H. Eden. The house will be 160x100 in size, three stories high, and of stone and frame construction. It is to have cabinet finish throughout and the best of appointments in every respect. The cost has not been determined.

D. J. Dwyer will build two three-story and basement houses in 143d street, on the north side, near Amsterdam avenue. One will be 20x65 and the other 18x56 in size, both with extension. The fronts will be of stone and the interior finish first-class in all respects, including hardwood trim and exposed plumbing. The two will cost about \$30,000. Paul F. Higgs is the architect.

Frank A. Cooke has plans on the boards for a three-story brick extension, 4x15, to be made to the dwelling, No. 10 West 83d street, by the owner, P. V. Myers, at a cost of \$2,000.

Louis Lese will build a seven-story factory building, 25x75, on the northeast corner of Sheriff and Delancey streets. The architect has not yet been selected.

Joseph Schreiner will build a five-story tenement on the lot, 25x160, No. 227 East 122d street.

One will be 27x40 in size, and the other 2 feet narrower. Paul F. Higgs has the plans, from which the cost is estimated at \$4,500 each. The same architect has finished the plans for a \$3,000 cottage, to be in this vicinity, for J. T. Brundage. The house will be 24.6x30, and two-and-a-half stories in height.

**PLAINFIELD, N. J.**—Teale & Longyear will draw plans for the five-story brick, iron and stone building to be built for Geo. H. Babcock on the northwest corner of Front street and Madison avenue. that the walking delegates will tackle the lumber trade directly again, but they may indirectly cause trouble.

Last advices report an advance in canal lumber freights, but there may be a chance of getting considerable stuff through to tide water, as the Chamber of Commerce has requested the State Superintendent to keep the canals open until the latest possible moment. This request is due to a desire to relieve the mammoth grain blockade at the West.

Eastern Spruce has been gradually but surely gaining in tone without the necessity of any special effort on the part of salesmen and receivers. Supplies have come to hand very moderately, and while as a matter of fact there was neither force or volume to the demand in comparison with what is ordinarily found at this season there were buyers enough to take care of everything wanted and to make a place for even greater quantity had it been available. For a time small and large dimensions were selling at pretty much the same price, but latterly the large stuff has commenced to work upward in cost to a more natural relative difference and is in greater favor. A great many buyers have been disappointed this fall over inability to place special orders at the mills and it is believed some of them will endeavor to get something to help them along from any choice random cargoes that may arrive.

Quite a supply of piling came to hand during the past month, and for a time the accumulation, if not exactly uncomfortable, was quite as full as receivers required. Of late, however, the additions have been gradually growing less, and while no advance in price is talked of at the moment the market shows firmer and more promising conditions.

Hemlock may be considered as very steady and doing well in matter of movement. Some sections of the local trade appear to have obtained probably all the supply that will be taken this fall, but quite a number of dealers in this district are still buying, and from custom in other directions orders are plentiful enough to create a very cheerful line of reports from the selling side. Manufacturers have not thought it wise to make any change in cost.

White Pine retains favor, and the recent improvements in value are sustained without difficulty, with, indeed, some agents taking higher rates as a strong probability. Local wants are not so general as a few weeks ago, but there are a great many dealers in this vicinity who have for various reasons been somewhat dilatory in getting their supplies, and it looks as though they might be compelled to pay rather more money than those who contracted at an earlier date. Every mail from points of supply goes to confirm the reports of reduced and broken stocks, and at some of the markets quotations are relatively above anything as yet asked here. Exporters are showing some interest, and upon a satisfactory basis of cost.

Yellow Pine has pretty much the same old dull tone, and it is difficult to find operators who appear particularly cheerful over the situation. The market is not burdened with much of an open offering because manufacturers feel that it would be folly to send forward stock, and there is apparently at the moment a falling off in demand for specials. Indeed, it was stated this week that orders now on the market are fewer in number than for many years past at this season. Values are nominally unchanged.

Carolina Pine is selling steadily and freely and appears to be holding quite as good a position as any lumber on the list. Here and there dealers may be found who do not care to negotiate just now, but it is only because previous purchase has given them an excellent accumulation, and there are plenty in this district who are still buying, besides a good run of custom from outside sources. All standard grades of rough and dressed kiln-dried are in favor and command former rates.

Hardwoods have a firm market for all staple descriptions and a very good average sale into channels of consumption, but there is nothing particularly active in the demand for bulk lots. Choice oak quartered and even plain has fair attention when offered, and there is considerable poplar being placed, all about former rates, with probably the offering quite as full as the market can take care of. Cherry, as usual, has a sure sale when offered, especially wide staves, and, as a substitute, birch has a chance, while of the miscellaneous woods there is a moderate movement only. The periodical claim of reviving interest in walnut may be heard, but it is a claim only.

## GENERAL LUMBER NOTES.

## STATE.

The situation at Albany is reviewed by the *Argus* as follows:

The lumber market is in a satisfactory condition and the week has brought no very interesting developments. The dealers in pine are busy shipping and receiving stock, but not so busily comparatively as they should be at this time of year. Trade has been rather quiet lately, and the buyers have not appeared in force during the week. However, lumber is coming in rapidly—not so fast as some houses would like, because of the scarcity of canal boats at Tonawanda and Buffalo—but about rapidly enough to keep pace with the distribution, which is carried on steadily, keeping the supply on the yards below the normal for the season. Canal freights advanced again during the week, and now stand at \$1.25, an advance of 95c. over the unprecedently low figures prevailing last summer. The common pine is still in the best demand and the supply is scant. There has been no change in quotations, which rule very firm. The market for spruce is in good condition, with more buyers about who take the stock offered without hesitation and at good prices. The movement of spruce is large, but hemlock still drags. Prices are revised somewhat. In hardwoods there is a very fair trade and the stock shows good assortments. Shingles and lath sell fairly, though the latter are in light supply and quotations strongly held.

## THE WEST.

The Northwest in Lumberman as follows:

It will be acknowledged by all lumber interests that northern pine leads in this year's trade. The extraordinary demand that has prevailed has been largely the result of the preparations for the World's Fair in this city, which has absorbed out of the aggregate supply an amount sufficient for a make-weight in demand and prices. In this great market enough product has gone into local consumption as to keep dealers here very busy in filling orders and to manifest less than usual solicitude to compete with outside shippers in the demand of the surrounding country. While the shipping business here has been large, it has not been done at the usual disadvantage, and thus prices have been maintained more easily than in

former years. For the first time in several years dealers here have occupied an independent position, and have been able to demand prices and obtain them irrespective of competition from other points of supply.

The producing season has been characterized by a scarcity of the better grades of white pine, and the effect of this has been an unusual eagerness of search for such lumber among all the mills of the pine bearing regions. As the season for sawing draws toward a close the scarcity of good lumber becomes more than ever pronounced, and it seems inevitable that before next spring there will be an advance of prices. \* \* \*

There is less lumber unsold at the mills than usual at this time in the season. The main business of the cargo men hereafter to the close of navigation will be getting forward product that has already been contracted for. The conditions of the market are not likely to greatly change from this time out. Piece stuff may advance a quarter or a half toward the end of November, and no class of stock is likely to decline in value.

Piece stuff is still selling at \$11.00 for desirable tallies, and \$11.25 for schedules that are somewhat objectionable in their shaping. Yard men are trying to buy lumber this year with especial reference to what is in it as to size and length. When the tally suits, they do not stand for the extra 25 cents a thousand. Long stuff is not so urgently wanted as short, but all that is offered sells readily.

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman as follows:

The feeling is particularly strong along the Mississippi River. Into the middle Mississippi markets less than the usual amount of rafted lumber has gone recently. This is due to low water and the inability to get the lumber out of tributary streams. The mills along the river are still reasonably well supplied with logs however, and are likely to saw until it freezes up. The run of logs from the Chippewas and St. Croix was more than ordinarily large, and an increase of production along the river for the season will undoubtedly be shown when the record is made up.

#### BRAZIL.

Mail advices from Rio Janeiro this week report:

**Pitch Pine.**—There has arrived one cargo, but particulars are wanting. We may still quote at \$7.00—\$9.00 per doz., with the market reported firm.

**White Pine.**—Receipts are about 10,000 feet per C. press, from New York, which were sold at 205 rs. per foot, and at this quotation the market is reported steady.

**Swedish Pine.**—Receipts are 581 doz per Cormorant, from Frederickshald, and 680 doz. per Arminda, from Hemsand, both to dealers. Quotations are nominal.

**METALS.—COPPER**—Ingot meets with a somewhat irregular movement, the demand at times calling for reasonably full parcels, and again settling off into a routine deal. At all times, however, the offering has appeared equal to the outlet presented, and there was no apparent inclination to raise the line of value. In the average range of valuation we quote at 11 $\frac{1}{4}$  @ 11 $\frac{3}{4}$  c. for Lake and 10 $\frac{1}{4}$  @ 11 $\frac{3}{4}$  c. for casting brands. Manufactured copper has been somewhat more active, and a number of very respectable orders were placed, covering a good general assortment of stock. The market seemed to be kept well in hand, and the list rates adhered to without variation. Segment and pattern sheets, 3c. above price of sheets required to cut them from. Cold or hard rolled copper, 1@2c. per lb. above the foregoing prices. Copper bottoms, 26@32c. per lb. IRON.—American Pig retains the characteristic of a rather slow and somewhat uncertain trade, without noticeable stimulating action on the part of buyers. Still, on the whole, the market gives evidence of an inclination toward a gain of strength, especially on the leading standard makes, though even some of the less popular product participates in the improving tendency and price cutting is now quite rare on anything at all useful. We quote at \$14.25@15.00 per ton for No. 1 X foundry; \$13.50@14.00 for No. 2 X do. and \$12.50@13.00 for Gray Forge. Old material without animation, yet on the whole the tendency of market toward some gain in tone, with moderate offerings of stock making an open market and no tendency to accumulate in first hands. We quote at about \$17.00@18.00 for old rails; \$16.00@17.00 for No. 1 wrought scrap; \$16.00@16.50 for cast scrap and \$8.00@10.00 for borings, stove, plate, etc. Manufactured iron has no unusual demand, but reports as to business doing would seem to indicate that in a quiet steady way a great many orders are being placed and the market retaining average healthy conditions. We quote Common Merchant Bar, ordinary size, at 1.20@2c. from store, and refined at 2@2.10c.; Rods round and square, 2.10@2.30c.; Bands, 2.30@2.50c.; Norway Nail Rods, 34@4c., and domestic sheet on the basis of 3.00@4c. for common Nos. 10@16. Other descriptions at corresponding prices, with 1.10c. less on large lots from cars. Steel rails have not down to the present writing shown any change in general condition of market and price remains as before. There had been an idea that some of the roads would be negotiating for more stock by this time, but as yet there is no evidence of developing demand. We quote standard sections \$30 per ton at mill, with usual advances for delivery at tide water. Pig lead has met with slow uncertain sale and found an irregular sort of market, with general tendencies mostly in buyers' favor. The supply at all points has appeared slightly excessive. We quote at 3.85@4c. per lb. The manufacturers of lead are quoted at 95c. for Pipe, 7c. for Sheet, 15c. for Tin-lined Pipe, and 37.5c. for Block Tin Pipe. Pig tin is called for by jobbers



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

Linseed Oil has found demand fully up to former average, if anything an increase, and developed quite a strong market, finally resulting in an advance on some of the intermediate grades. We quote on general range at 43c@44c. for Western, 46c@47c. for City from domestic seed, and 50c@58c. for do. from Calcutta seed. Spirits Turpentine does not show much

animation, the movement proving mainly routine in character, yet moderate supplies and indifferent offerings serve as an excellent support to values. We quote at 31c@33c. per gallon, according to quality, quantity, delivery, etc.

**TAR AND PITCH.**—A good steady movement of stock is taking place, and it makes altogether quite an acceptable market. The supply is kept under control and the ownership shows confidence enough to insist upon full former rates in all cases. We quote Pitch at \$1.70@1.75 per bbl.; Tar at \$2.15@2.40, according to quantity, quality and delivery.

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
