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HAT the stock market is in for a heavy reactionary movement is probable from the fact that great leading interests have come to the conclusion that it is time to contradict some of the most absurd of the reports made quite gratuitously on their account. It is a great pity they waited as long as they did. Irregularity of movement has characterized the market all the week, and the list of the stocks and bonds that have either come to a standstill or taken the back track has daily grown longer. European interest in the bull movement, which did not reveal itself until that movement was well under way, was such a cautious one that it never went beyond the mark set by the New York example, and now shows signs of reverting to the other side and of being accompanied by further realizations of long holdings, for which we are still offering good opportuni-The Industrials, which have taken a surprisingly small part in the advance, are the first to display weakness on the turn of speculative septiment. The cause of this will probably be found in the competition that has arisen as a result of the extremely profitable industrial years, 1898-9, and in the probable conviction in the minds of the managers of the industrial combinations, that it will not be possible to get back to the high prices out of which they made their enormous profits in those years. So far as general business is concerned, this would be a good thing if true, as it most probably is, because prices of materials were undoubtedly the primary cause of the dulness which last year saw, and if there is assurance of fairly moderate figures for a future of reasonable length, the fact will create confidence and stimulate activity.

F the European industrial and commercial outlook is dimmed, that of accumulated capital is more satisfactory on the theory that every dog should have his day as well that by a rule of Providence that he is sure to get it. A general and rapid decline in the prices of commodities in the past two months proclaim that the point of over-production was reached some time The London Economist's figures for 1900 are eloquent of this. The highest point in two years was reached last September, but the changes in the last two months of the year brought, not only the average down below the figure for the opening of the year, but put most of the list in that position. That is to say, the decline in the average is not explained by large breaks in a few articles, but by a tendency common to all but a few. At the same time the year was one in which the demands on the money market were abnormally heavy, the total amount, \$827,-000,000, exceeding that of any year for which figures exist. The Government alone took \$240,000,000, without counting temporary accommodations represented by Treasury bills; and notwithstanding the fact that the borrowings make the record, very little was loaned outside of the Empire, and comparatively little in the Colonies, so that the home demands were very heavy in-The terms at which loans were made emphasize the strength of this demand; the best of municipal offerings, including those of the London County Council, had to be put out at well over three per cent, in order to make them attractive. The circumstances of the times are distinctly good for investors, because although the shrinkage in industrial operations, which must follow reduced prices, will lessen the demands for capital from that source and eventually release a good deal, the government requirements are still large and pressing. The Bank of England retains its high discount rate and is industriously seeking to control the market, doubtless in order to be in a position to meet the requirements of the British Treasury, and the intention of the German Government to appeal to the market for large accommodations, \$150,000,000, is as good as announced. This last mentioned fact is confirmed by the movement of Imperial 3s, which have lost two points in a few days, and are now selling at about 3.5 per cent. and 7 points below the issue price of 92. The terms of the new loans must be generous to secure acceptance, and there is no probability of an early return to the low rates that were the despair of capitalists who live upon interest they received a few years ago. What will result from another general collapse of industrial and commercial activity, such as was seen ten years ago, it is not necessary to consider now. It suffices for the time being that the uses of capital are so extended that fair rates of remuneration may be confidently demanded and as confidently expected for some years to come.

OTH sides, employing and employed, have come from the recent arbitration and conciliation conference at Chicago convinced that differences and difficulties between them can be best overcome by voluntary, spontaneous effort, and that compulsory measures are more likely to be mischievous than helpful. One of the representatives of labor, Martin Fox, President of the Iron Molders' Union of North America, speaking of the conference, said: "It has demonstrated beyond peradventure that compulsory arbitration is viewed with disfavor and is deemed impractical by both the managing and the working forces of industry in this country. It has further demonstrated that there is a general trend towards conciliatory measures in the adjustment of disputes that arise between the workmen and the employer at intervals in every branch of industry, and a disposition on both sides to avoid irritating cessation of employment and strikes."

HE agreement about Bronx rapid transit, which property owners in that vicinity have reached, manifestly depends upon one far-reaching and important extension of the rapid transit system as already planned. It depends, that is, upon an independent tunnel on the East Side from Forty-second street across the Harlem River. It is becoming more and more evident that such a tunnel would be not merely a desirable addition to the system under construction, but an absolute necessity to the development of the Bronx and to the convenience of residents on the East Side. The Bronx needs rapid transit, both on Jerome and on Westchester avenues, and the line on Westchester avenue must have a southerly connection better than could possibly be provided by any of the existing elevated lines. Furthermore, people living between Park and Fifth avenues, north of Fifty-ninth street, are also badly in want of some means of transit to the City Hall more convenient than the Third avenue elevated road, and quicker than the surface lines. These necessities have, no doubt, long been recognized, and the only reason they have not been met is that the commission did not see any way of providing for the additional cost of the proposed East Side extension. But if the difficulty about the Bronx has been settled on the understanding that such a line will be started before two years have elapsed, it is evident that a determined effort will be made to remove the obstacles in the way of a tunnel east of the Park. Such an addition to the prospective transit facilities would also make it much easier to give an effective southerly connection to the suburban passengers of the Central, New Haven and Harlem roads, for some arrangement whereby the local traffic on those lines could be carried south by the rapid transit route would be an obvious solution of the terminal and tunnel difficulties of the Vanderbilt lines. It would, moreover, give those suburban travelers a very much better service than they are likely to get in any other way. The reasons demanding the construction of such a tunnel are so obvious and so overwhelming, and the new rapid transit system will be so mutilated and partly ineffective without it that most determined pressure should be brought to bear until every obstacle in the way has been removed.

THE successful marketing of dwellings built speculatively, or more properly, commercially, on upper Fifth avenue, is one of the signs of the rapidly growing wealth of the country and, of course, of this community. The builders are to be congratulated rather upon their foresight than upon their luck. It need not be supposed that the putting of from a quarter to half a million of dollars into one house is done in any haphazard way, but rather on deliberate design slowly matured and in the reasonable certainty of finding a market for the house when completed. Most of the fine dwellings on Fifth avenue alongside the park have been built by contract for private owners, and the gradual extension of this line of mansions above Fiftyninth street has been as clearly an indication of the growth of the wealth of the country as have been the statistics of finance and commerce. But of late this wealth has grown much faster

than it ever did before, and owing to the rapid realization of fortune by some and the equally rapid conversion of moderate fortunes into large ones, there are many more people who require palatial residences than before. And of course a good many of these prefer to take them ready built than to assume the bother of having them specially built for themselves. Given the realization of our expectations of industrial, trading and financial development, the first decade of the century ought to bring to New York a domestic building movement parallel to that brought to London by the development of the Rand gold fields. The movement of domestic architecture has always been one of progress and concurrent increased cost. Commercial building has followed the fashion set by the private builder of large means, and while only ten years ago a hundred thousand dollars put into a house intended for the market was looked upon as a bold if not a risky undertaking, to-day some have found buyers at twice and three times that sum, and there is one that must sell at between four hundred and five hundred thousand dollars to satisfy the builder. It need not be said that such houses are everything that modern skill, taste and experience can make them. It has been thought that such houses fetch the sums they do because they are built fireproof. This is not quite the fact. They are as near fireproof as a dwelling can be made, but that is only incidental to their representing the best form of construction of the times; the mere fireproofing does not explain the difference between the cost of a first-class house of to-day and one of the same class of ten years ago. It counts for a good deal, but not for as much as the difference in the costs of the several sites, or the difference in the sums spent for exterior and interior elaboration and finish. In fact, in a modern mansion everything goes to swell the relative cost over the old one, from site to push-button.

Frederick Clarke Withers.

LTHOUGH Mr. Withers, who died this week at the age of seventy-three, had by no means retired from the practice of his profession, and died almost in harness, his work seems to belong distinctly to a past period. The new City Prison is the work upon which he was engaged nearly up to the time of his death as much as the municipal authorities would allow him to be. For the successive steps, by which his authority was cut down and the control of work, regularly awarded to him, was in effect taken away, constituted a fresh political scandal.

The new Tombs is by no means a bad building, but also it is by no means its architect's best work or his most characteristic. A quarter of a century ago he designed a court house and prison for the site of the old Tombs, which would have been, if it had been executed, one of the most important monuments of the Gothic revival in this country. The building now, it is to be supposed, approaching completion, suffers from having evidently been designed for brick and executed in granite, so that some of the detail and a good deal even of the general disposition become meaningless and ineffective in the actual erection.

Mr. Withers was born in England and received his professional education at a time when the most active and sincere minds among British architects had become convinced of the applicability of the principles of mediaeval architecture to all modern uses, secular as well as ecclesiastical. This belief he himself never lost, nor its enthusiasm. He was reared in an atmosphere of "churchmanship" as well as of architecture. One of his brothers, who stayed at home, attained distinction in his art. A glass warehouse erected from his designs in Bloomsbury remains one of the most interesting memorials of the Gothic revival in London.

Coming to this country before the Civil War, Mr. Withers found the most appropriate sphere for his talents and accomplishments in joining the group of young men, comprising several who have since become famous, who attached themselves to the artistic fortunes of Andrew Jackson Downing. Mr. Downing's services to the development of a taste for the picturesque in this country have never been popularly appreciated at their true value, and are now ungratefully forgotten. Mr. Withers' accession to the number of his supporters and followers was very valuable, seeing that he was much more thoroughly trained than any of the others in the architectonic as distinguished from the picturesque side of architecture. A partnership with Calvert Vaux grew out of this association, and was continued for many years with mutual advantage. Mr. Vaux was essentially a landscape gardener, and his partner's superiority to him on the strictly architectural side is made very clear by reference to the works which they respectively did individually.

The work by which Mr. Withers is best known in New York, and is likely to be longest remembered, is the Jefferson Market

Court House and Jail. His design included the market, which, owing to the exigencies of politics, was afterwards done by another hand—done in a much more routine and humdrum spirit, and done so as not to give the support and completion to the group that it would have given if his design had been completely carried out. Nevertheless, what was done of the group is one of the very best things in New York, marred as the Court House has been by the elevated road and by a wanton coat of fresh red paint, against the application of which the architect vainly protested. A candid contemplation of this artistic and picturesque essay in free architecture must make fair-minded observers reflect whether New York would not be a more attractive place if the impulse attested by these buildings had not been overborne.

Mr. Withers' other works are less conspicuous, and are mostly examples of "institutional architecture." They are all well considered, artistic, and even exemplary. It is a pity he did not do more. Matthew Arnold, considering the poetry of Gray, is at considerable pains to reconcile his poetical quality with his "scantiness of production." Nobody who knew Mr. Withers could have much trouble in explaining his scantiness of production. It was due to his native incapacity to pursue his art as a trade. He had a naive idea that work was to be got by doing it well. To the end of his life he did not learn any other way. He was equally disdainful and incapable of the arts of "reclame" by which men who could not do the work nearly so well got so much more of it to do. There is no reason why it should not now be said that most of his professional opportunities in public work he owed to the friendship of Mr. Andrew H. Green, to whom the lovers of architecture are, on that account, under an obligation.

There was, however, "scarcely any species of building which he did not touch," and we may continue the quotation by adding that he touched none which he did not adorn. His country churches are excellent in their kind. Of his decorative architecture, the most familiar example is the Astor reredos of Trinity. It is characteristic of the architect that, when the present writer put this in the same class with Sir Gilbert Scott's like works in the English cathedrals, Mr. Withers should have protested: "No. The old man's work is finer." It happened to Mr. Withers to be one of the few artistic architects who essayed the problems of an iron store front, before the problem was abandoned as practically insoluble, and produced in Broome street a characteristic treatment of metal, in which the application of Gothic principles resulted in a wide departure from Gothic forms. He was an artistic architect, who deserves honor from the artistic members of his profession in the younger generation.

COMMITTEE of prominent architects appointed by the Architectural League for the purpose have drawn up a bill to regulate the practice of architecture in this State. The provisions of the bill have been much more carefully considered than was the case with some other bills prepared to accomplish the same end. It provides, in brief, for a State Board of Architects which shall be authorized to impose conditions in the way of examination and registration upon everybody who in the future wishes to set up in New York as a regular practicing architect. The fees which will be exacted for examination and registration are small, and the object of the examination would be simply to test the candidate's competency to erect buildings which are structurally safe. At the same time the greatest care has been exercised not to work injustice upon existing interests. Anybody who, at the time of the passage of the act, should be engaged in the practice of architecture in this State would be entitled to registration without fee or examination. Furthermore, exemptions are made which render the proposal very mild in its operation. "Nothing herein contained," reads Section 12 of the bill, "shall be construed to prohibit any person in this State from acting as designer of his own building or as designer for any person employing him with full knowledge on the part of such employer that the person so employed is not a registered architect in accordance with this act." The committee claims that the bill will so operate that the architectural profession will be able to serve the public more efficiently and to minimize the ignorance and dishonest practices which are at present allowed to go practically unregulated; but if we understand the meaning of the foregoing quotation, the bill, if it becomes a law, would not be sure to produce such a result. No one, however incompetent, could be penalized for practicing architecture, provided he stated explicitly on his sign, if he had one, that he was not a registered architect. The question is: What value would the public put upon such evidence of registration? If it were much the bill would fulfill the purpose of the committee; if it were little, the proposed regulation would not be particularly effective. It is desirable, however, that the

bill should sin rather on the side of leniency than of rigor; and certainly, while it might effect some good, it could neither harm an honest or capable designer nor prevent a builder from having anybody he pleased draw plans for his houses. Be it added, that full and free discussion of the bill is solicited rather than avoided. The League proposes to call a convention, in which the architects practicing in this State and all other persons can meet and talk the matter over among themselves, so that it will not be pressed to passage until everybody in and out of the profession has had a chance to ventilate his opinions.

N a letter to the "Sun," ex-Mayor Hewitt makes the following astounding statement in reference to the East Side tenement house district: "At least \$100,000,000 ought to be expended as rapidly as possible in reconstructing this portion of the city. It would not be money thrown away. It could be made to pay a revenue of five per cent. per annum and yet furnish decent accommodations for half the present rental which is paid by the unfortunate dwellers on the East Side." Mr. Hewitt is a business man of wide experience and a public spirited citizen of unusual intellectual energy, but surely no more erroneous statement was ever made by the most inexperienced and fool-hardy clerical reformer. Suppose a group of philanthropic capitalists, somewhat exhausted by their efforts to invest their money in safe securities yielding as much as four per cent., should adopt Mr. Hewitt's plan for benefiting their fellowmen and making five per cent: what economic conditions would such a plan be obliged to meet and overcome? Owing to the activity of the speculative builder during the past ten years, the East Side has been pretty well covered with five and six story tenements. This is so far the case that the old three-story buildings, which have been torn down to make way for these taller tenements, are now exceedingly difficult to get and are quickly gobbled up when they appear upon the market. Now, these tall "double-deck" tenements are just the buildings which Mr. Hewitt wants to destroy, and his association of philapthropic capitalists, in case they began operations on a large scale, would have to purchase and tear them down by the wholesale. Each of these tenements represents an investment of from \$30,000 to \$35,000, and after they were torn down, it would presumably cost as much as \$20,000 per lot to replace them with some abode of cleanliness and light. Can any one who has the slightest knowledge of East Side conditions believe that any organization, business or philanthropic, could invest money at the rate of \$50,000 per twenty-five-foot front, give the tenants better accommodations than they get at half the cost, and at the same time pay five per cent, on the investment? The notion is absurd. Even with the present rentals, with the lot costing less than \$20,000, and every inch of available space utilized for renting purposes, it is rare that the return is as much as seven per cent. on all the money invested. By means of operating on a larger scale and with more abundant capital a block of model tenements might well give better accommodations for present rentals, but the rentals themselves are fixed by inexorable economic conditions.

OME months ago one of the most successful builders of tenements on the East Side gave an account in the Record and Guide of the economy of speculative investments in such property. Considering the trouble of securing the property, financing the operation, and of renting and taking care of the building, he claimed that unless he could obtain ten per cent. on the capital which he invested himself, such enterprises did not pay. Probably at least four-sevenths of the money needed for such an undertaking would be borrowed at four and a half or five per cent., and on the remaining \$15,000 of his own money which was risked he expected a return of ten per cent., which would make the aggregate yield of the property somewhere around seven per cent. It must be remembered that in all half-philanthropic and half-business enterprises, such as the erection of model tenements, a vast amount of work in the way of making financial preparations, arranging plans and the like, is contributed for nothing by the organizers of the enterprise, and an individual investor would expect, and have a right to expect, a return for the labor and ingenuity which he expended for such purposes. By getting all such work for nothing, and by building on a block of land much larger than the ordinary 25x100 lot, model tenements can afford more and better accommodations to their tenants than they can get in any other way, but when allowance for such advantages are made it will be found that tenement house property is much like other property, and that it does not yield exorbitant returns. In many cases the tenements are owned by small proprietors in the neighborhood, who, by taking care of the renting and collecting themselves, can show a handsome income on the investment; but here again the increased

profit is the result of increased labor. In short, money and labor are worth about as much in tenement houses as they are in other kinds of property, and the margin of profit for a given accommodation which Mr. Hewitt sees in a huge building operation on the East Side is wholly imaginary. It is possible that the city of New York could borrow money at less than three per cent. and erect tenements on a large scale, which would provide a better accommodation at a smaller cost, but the time has not yet come, nor is it in sight, when the municipality can afford to go into the tenement house business.

Street Opening.

DISCONTINUANCE OF STREETS AND AVENUES BY FILING MAP.

In the matter of opening of Morris av. from Tremont av. to Park View Place, an appeal from a Supreme Court order denying a motion to refer the claim of Theodore Sattler et al to Commissioners of Estimate was taken to the Appellate Division, who held as follows:

The filing by the municipal authorities of the City of New York of the map or plan of the 23d and 24th Wards, under chapter 545 of the Laws of 1890, discontinued the street shown on the map as the old Morris av, under the provisions of section 2 of chapter 1006 of the Laws of 1895, and the owners of property abutting on such street are entitled thereunder to compensation from the city for all injuries they sustained in consequence of the discontinuance of the street as a public street. Whether such an abutting owner is entitled to damages for the interference with his private easement in the discontinued street, quaere.

When the local authorities, under the power granted by chapter 545 of the Laws of 1890, filed their plan or map of the 23d and 24th Wards of the City of New York, locating upon that plan or map certain permanent streets and avenues, all streets and avenues not therein designated as permanent streets or avenues were, by virtue of section 2 of chapter 1006 of the Laws of 1895, discontinued as public streets and avenues.

The provision in the statute, that the municipal authorities should designate only the streets, avenues and roads which they might determine to lay out or improve as the permanent streets and avenues of that portion of the city, was substantially complied with in the map or plan filed.

Commissioners of estimate and assessment having been appointed in a proceeding to open Morris av, the owners of property abutting on the closed streets are entitled, under section 14 of the Act of 1895, to have such commissioners ascertain and determine the compensation which should justly be made for any loss or damage to the property occasioned by such closing.

West End Affairs.

TAXATION-CHARTER REVISION-INLET MONOPOLY.

The usual monthly meeting of the West End Association took place on Monday evening last, with Cyrus Clark, president, in the chair, when Wm. Henry Crossman, No. 270 W. 89th st.; Charles R. Pelgram, No. 91 Riverside av.; M. M. Sternberger, No. 117 W. 74th st.; Walter E. Thompson, No. 327 W. 70th st., were elected members. During 1900, 67 members were added to the association, while the loss by deaths and resignations was only 30.

A letter from George S. Lespinasse describing the system of taxation in Paris was read and referred to the Committee on Taxation. A vote of thanks was tendered to Mr. Lespinasse for his letter. On motion of Mr. Stabler, the Committee on Taxation was requested to collect information regarding the tax systems of other cities. The fact that the Chamber of Commerce had favored the Elsberg Taxation bill, which was introduced into the last Legislature at the instance of this association, was also reported, and it was understood that the Committee on Taxation would be prepared to act at Albany this year with reference to the subject specially consigned to them.

Charles H. Israels, architect, drew the attention of the association to the Department of Buildings' interpretation of Rule 79 of their Plumbing Regulations, which relates to fresh air inlets. This interpretation, he said, forced on architects a special device that worked no better than others of the same type, and was much more expensive. By practically ordering this inlet and no other to be used the Building Department, he claimed, was violating the law by establishing a monopoly. The subject was referred to the Legislative Committee, who will report upon it at the February meeting.

Other business done was the adoption of propositions as follows: To request the Park Board to name the small park at Broadway and 63d st. Empire Square and to improve the same; to empower the chairman to appoint a committee of five to take part in conferences on charter legislation; to make Eugene A. Philbin, the new District Attorney, an honorary member of the association.

The Special Committee on Charter Legislation was subsequently named as follows: John C. Coleman, De Borden Wilmot, Jas. Van Dyck Card, J. Edgar Leaycraft and G. B. Sheppard.

At Albany.

TAXATION AND MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT THE LEADING QUESTIONS.

The Legislature may be said to have got down to work, for this week, the standing committees having been appointed, there were introduced a number of bills to give effect to the recommendations of Governor Odell contained in his opening mes-

The first in importance of these bills is the one of which Senator Stranahan has charge in the Senate and Mr. Kelsey in the House, for creating a single-headed police department for New York city, but giving the governor equal power of removal with the mayor of the city. The bureau of elections in the Police Department is to be abolished, and a new board of elections created to consist of four members appointed by the mayor, of whom no more than two shall belong to one political party. It is contended that there is a strong demand for the provision that gives the governor equal power of removal of the head of the department with the mayor, but, on the other hand, it is also claimed that were it not for the peculiar temper of the times, this would open up a contest between the advocates of municipal autonomy and those who are working for further concentration of administrative control at Albany, and may yet do so. A fair consideration of the matter would lead one to believe that, if the mayor cannot be trusted to put his duty toward the public above the political sympathies that would naturally exist between himself and his appointee at the head of the police department, the right of the city to govern itself should still be protected to the extent of requiring that gubernatorial interference should only result from complaints, sustained on hearing, from citizens. This would put the final responsibility for the proper administration of the police department where it properly belongs-namely, with the citizens.

Other bills introduced to carry out the wishes of the governor are those to consolidate State commissions, and thereby save expense. With these New York city is not likely to quarrel, provided their text does not finally reveal objectionable provisions. To readers of this journal the most important is that creating a State commissioner of labor, and giving him the powers and duties hitherto possessed by the Board of Arbitration and Mediation, the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Factory Inspector. It is proposed that the new commissioner of labor be appointed for three years, and have a salary of \$3,500 per annum. He will have two deputies at \$2,500 each, and the various work of the three commissions will be divided into departments, which will be conducted by the commissioner and his deputies. The employees under the first deputy in the various departments remain.

Senator Elsberg introduced his tax bill, which is that approved by the Chamber of Commerce and recently discussed in these columns. It provides: "(1) For a return to the State Tax Commissioners of the gross revenue, as defined in the bill of each tax district in the State itemized as respects the sums derived from each class of taxables.

"(2) For the filing and tabulation of these returns by the State tax commissioners.

"(3) For basing the State tax proportionately on the gross revenue (as defined) of each county or other political division.

"(4) That the local governing bodies may declare what property now taxable shall be free from taxation, or subject to taxation at a reduced rate." This will be one of the bills of largest interest in real estate circles this year, and likely, therefore, to receive no little attention. It is understood that Senator Stranahan also contemplates the introduction of a bill, similar to the one which he produced last year, to tax mortgages and bank capital, and perhaps to include some of the governor's suggestions for increasing the number of taxables in order to relieve real estate. These two measures alone will be sufficient to give the question of taxation in this Legislature prominence equal to that of administrative reform as called for by the governor and the revisers of the charter of the City of New York.

Assemblyman McInerney, of New York city, introduced a bill intended to bring companies who purchase and hold real estate, who are now exempt from taxation, within the provisions of the statute. Speaking of his bill, Mr. McInerney said: "I have introduced this bill for the purpose of curing some defects in the tax law relative to corporations. Under the construction given by the courts to the statute which provides for the taxation of corporations, many companies have been enabled to escape the payment of taxes. For instance: In a decision which has greatly reduced the State's income from corporations, the Court held that a company organized 'to purchase and hold real estate' was not subject to taxes for the reason that its capital was not 'employed in doing business,' the Court saying, 'If capital can be invested without being employed, the case before us seems to be a fair instance of it.'"

The prominence given to the question of taxation at this session has stimulated the ambition of many would be solvers of the problems involved, and produced a number of bills that are not likely to do more than advertise their framers. Included among these must be Assemblyman Smith's, requiring every

resident of a tax district to make a return of his or her personal property for the purposes of taxation. Another such is Senator Wagner's bill to amend the tax laws by making personal property taxable in the place where it is located, and without respect to the residence of the owner.

Among the bills introduced were the following:

Senator Brackett—Providing that employers shall be fully responsible for all accidents to employes during hours of labor.

Mr. Vacheron, while providing for punishment for pool selling or bookmaking, would enact that: Any person who, being the owner, lessee, or occupant of any room, shed, tenement, etc, knowingly permits the same to be used or occupied for any of these purposes, is guilty of a misdemeanor, except when another penalty is provided by law, and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of \$250, and in default of the payment of such fine, shall be committed to the county jail of the county until such fine be paid or satisfied by imprisonment.

Some important street improvement bills were introduced this week. They were: Senator Plunkett's, providing for additional wharfage of 1,500 feet for the Dock Department at West 92d st.; Assemblyman W. H. Smith's, for widening and improvement of West 135th st., west of St. Nicholas av.; Assemblyman Price's, to put two-thirds of the cost of grading and paving of Prospect av., Brooklyn, between 9th av. and the old city line, upon the city at large.

Mr. Holsten-Establishing a public market in the Eighth Ward, Brooklyn.

Mr. W. H. Smith—Authorizing the Controller of New York State to acquire title to the Hamilton Grange at Convent Avenue and 143d st., New York.

Mr. Marson—Adding a new section to the lien law by providing that a creditor may acquire a lien upon property of a third person or persons, partnership or corporation belonging to a debtor of such creditor.

Mr. Blackwell—Prohibiting the construction of railroads upon Ashland place, Brooklyn.

Senator Humphrey—To protect the stockholders in building and loan associations by forbidding the investment of funds of the association in anything but first mortgages.

A BROKER'S DUTY.

An interesting opinion rendered by the Supreme Court, Appellate Division, in the case of Archibald Gracie v. Edwin A. Stevens et al, and which was a claim for commission for procuring the sale of the Hoboken ferries, contains the following exposition of the broker's duty towards his client in certain cases:

"There can be no doubt of the general rule that a broker who is employed to sell property and whose duty it is not only to find a purchaser, but to negotiate the sale, cannot accept any compensation from any other person than his employer, and if he does make an agreement to be paid by the purchaser, or if he assume a position with reference to the transaction where his duty and interest might clash, he loses all right to his commissions from his employer. Among the numerous cases where that rule is laid down it is only necessary to cite Abel v. Disbrow (15 App. Div., 536) and Knauss v. Brewing Co. (142 N. Y., 70). But that rule, as is stated in the cases above cited, applies only to a case where the duty of the broker to his employer calls the exercise of his judgment or discretion when he must confine himself to acting for the person who employed him, and look solely to him for his reward. But when he is employed simply to find a purchaser upon terms fixed by his employer, his duty is performed by bringing to the seller one who is willing to purchase upon such terms. He has no discretion to exercise, and there is no reason why he should not be permitted to take from the purchaser such compensation as he may see fit to give for the benefit he has received by being informed of the fact that he would be able to make such a purchase (Knauss v. Brewing Co., 142 N. Y., 70)."

MASTER CARPENTERS FIX WAGES.

At the last monthly meeting of the Master Carpenters Association an unusually large attendance was secured through the expectation that the question of wages would come up for discussion, an expectation that was fully realized. It was pointed out that a committee of the association had worked for many months endeavoring to amicably arrange with the journeymen a scale of wages, and that these efforts were defeated by the refusal of the men to authorize their representatives to act in the matter. It was, therefore, proposed to end once and for all the petty annoyances to the individual members, coercion and intimidation of the journeymen carpenters on the part of the walking delegates, ordering strikes promiscuously, and hounding hard working honest carpenters who wish to work at their trade undisturbed, by fixing the rate of wages for journeymen carpenters for the year commencing February 1, 1901, at forty-four (44) cents per hour. This proposition was enthusiastically approved by a majority consisting of all but three of the gentlemen present.

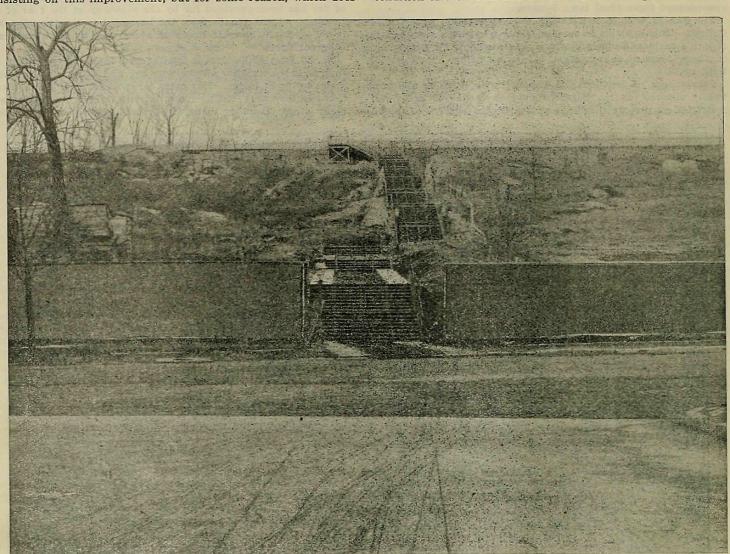

The only opposition to the proposed opening up of 135th St. comes from people who are interested in another public park scheme to take in that part of Convent Hill. But there are al-

ready plenty of public parks in the neighborhood, while crosstown thoroughfares are very decidedly needed. One Hundred and Thirty-fifth St. is a half-mile long. It contains an e evated railroad station, and there is at present no cross-town street opening up the hill from 8th Ave. to Amsterdam Ave., between 127th and 141st Sts. The interests of many million dollars worth of property are suffering from the lack of sufficient opportunities for cross-town traffic; and the improvement conse-

quently has behind it strong property interests. The North Manhattan Taxpayers' Association, of which Mr. Whitehead is president, and Paul Mayer secretary, have gone about securing it in the most businesslike way. No objection has been offered by the city departments; and the plans have been prepared, so that the park will be improved rather than injured. There are many good reasons why the bill should go through the Legislature successfully.

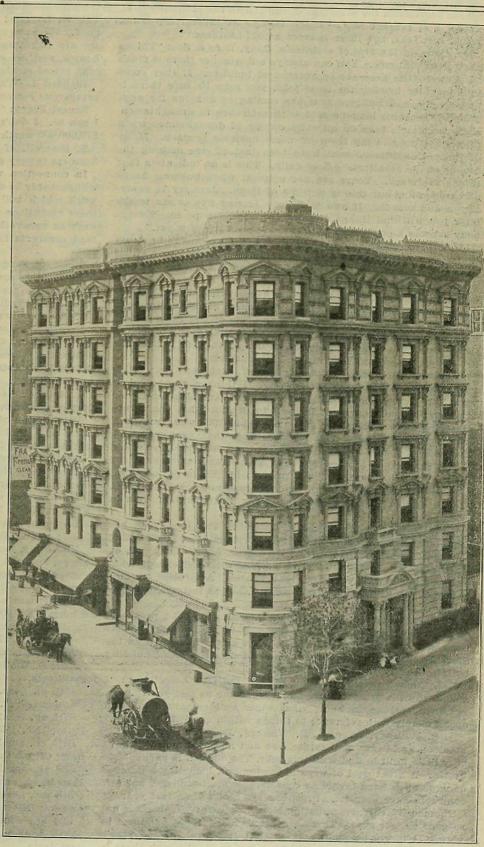

Building Prospects for 1901

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From the Viewpoint of Some Architects and Builders.

"What is the outlook for business in the building line at the opening of the new year," was asked of a number of prominent architects and builders, and their answers are recorded below:

Clarence M. Smith, treasurer of the Standard Structural Co.: "On general principles the outlook is good, and there are two contributing causes. First, the prices of materials are lower than last year, especially iron; second, the general prosperity of the country. In addition, it may be said that the setback which industrials have received through mismanagement and other causes has turned the attention of capitalists toward real estate. There is at present not so much talk as at the corresponding period last year, but there is more actual business."

Mr. Cady, of the firm of architects, Cady, Berg & See: "Things are a little dull now. You can always tell whether there is much building by the presence or absence of builders. If they come in frequently looking for loose jobs, you may be sure there is little doing, and builders now are coming in anxious for anything. The same may be said with reference to draughtsmen. Many architects take on an extra supply of draughtsmen when they are busy and lay them off when business is slack. Many of these draughtsmen who have been laid off are making the rounds of the architects' offices daily. This is an indication that things are slack. Years are not unusual when business keeps along steadily, but this is not one of them. January is generally a dull month. If you will come around five or six weeks later you will find things different, at least, I hope so. Everybody expects a good year, but there are no signs of it yet."

Mr. Hill, of the Sturgis & Hill Co.: "Quietude seems to be about the size of the situation at present. There is certainly nothing like the rush and scurry noticeable in 1898. I am informed that a great many buildings will be erected in the spring, and the building trade is looking forward to them. One of the best indications of what is going on is the movement of sub-contractors. They are a kind of barometer. If the tide of contractors rises high in your office you may count upon it that they are floated in by the desire to find something to do. If the tide is out they are busy. At present they are seeking business."

Andrew J. Robinson, of the Andrew J. Robinson Co.: "It is rather early to speak authoritatively. I think a great deal of work is being contemplated. Conditions are favorable for a good business; but, of course, it is hard to predict what the future will bring forth. The value of plans filed in 1900 was about half of the value of those filed in 1899, but what proportion the actual building had to actual building of the previous year would be hard to say. I have not seen any figures governing the point. You know many plans were filed in 1899 to get ahead of the new building law, though the work was not done until 1900. I feel confident there will be more plans filed this year than in 1900."

A representative of Clinton & Russell: "The past year has been the most prosperous in our history, but there is nothing new that I know of at present. Of course, we are busy, but on old contracts. In fact, we have nothing on hand except what has been under way for six or eight months. At present the outlook is better than usual at this season, but as intimated before, it is only an 'outlook.'"

A representative of W. A. & F. E. Conover: "The prospects ought to be good. I don't know of any large buildings besides those which have been talked about for some time, such as the Stock Exchange, but there will undoubtedly be a lot of building both in the city and in the country."

J. J. Tucker, president of the Mason Builders Association: "I should say the prospects are about the same as last year. I am not in a position to know what other builders are doing and creak merely with reference to things within my own balliwick."

speak merely with reference to things within my own bailiwick."

A. R. Whitney, Jr., of A. R. Whitney, Jr. & Co.: "I think the builders, architects, real estate men and material men will have very little fault to find with this year. The outlook is particularly bright. A great deal of work is coming out, including a number of large operations involving considerable steel tonnage, but few contracts have been let. Prospects are better than last year."

Thomas O'Reilly, representing Norcross Bros.: "Business is not so good as last year. There are not so many large buildings in view. It is my personal opinion that the result of the year's business will not differ greatly from last year, although there is, not as much talk as at the same period one year are."

not as much talk as at the same period one year ago."

Henry Rutgers Marshall, the architect, said: "It is a little early as yet to speak with any degree of definiteness regarding the building prospects. At this time of the year we always have to trust to the future. Operators are too busy about the first of the year looking out for the reinvestment of their securities to take much interest in real estate. At the present time this is unusually the case. The excitement in the Wall street market has a deadening effect on the real estate market. In addition, the builders have scared off many probable investors by advancing their bids in an unwarranted manner. They have argued with

themselves 'The season will be a good one. I'll put up my prices.' I know a number of houses that would have been erected except for an increase in the value of materials. It is rather difficult to persuade the average capitalist that building is a profitable form of investment. If they get an idea that building prices are high they turn their attention to other things, and acquire the habit of keeping out of building, and it requires considerable persuasion to bring them back. The Wall street man, as a rule, prefers to put his money in good stocks, something he can turn over at a moment's notice."

C. W. Luyster: "We think the business this year ought to be good. We have more than the usual number of houses. In fact, we are handicapped by the scarcity of lots for our class of houses, and are compelled to go slow. The demand is more for high-priced residences than before."

high-priced residences than before."
Richard L. Walsh: "You can say that we expect to have a prosperous season. 'Brevity is the soul of wit.'"

Ernest Flagg: "For the past ten years I have been as busy as I can be. I don't notice any seasons in my work. I have about \$10,000,000 worth of work on hand for this year."

T. Starrett, of the Thompson-Starrett Co.: "All I can say is business is very good with us, and we expect a good year."

DAMAGES BY THE ELEVATED RAILROAD.

Mary Vann Cohen, the owner of a building on the east side of Greenwich, south of West 11th, began suit thirteen years ago against the Manhattan Elevated R. R. Co. for damages resulting from the elevated structure, which is about 7 feet from her building. It was shown that the rental of the building had fallen from \$60 to \$40 a month since 1885. Plaintiff was awarded \$3,500 for fee damages and \$14,025 for rental damages. Supreme Court, Appellate Division, in confirming judgment said: "It must be considered that the period is over thirteen years, and it certainly is not the fault of the plaintiff that she has been compelled to wait such a long time before a trial of the action. The evidence is that the communication with the lower part of the city by the surface roads is quicker than that of the elevated roads, and in view of this fact, it is difficult to see what possible benefit to this property the elevated railroad can be. It certainly is no advantage to have a large number of people carried past her house each day between the upper and lower parts of the city, and she gets no benefit from adjoining stations."

adjoining parcel, a plot about 70x150, with a 2-sty frame dwelling thereon, was sold to Robert Miller, of this city, for \$1,650.

The transfer of the "Chimney Corner" property, on the northeast corner of 6th av. and 25th st., during the week, a lot 26.7x75, at \$125,000, recalls the auction sale last April of the northeast corner of 6th av. and 21st st., 18.9x75, at \$173,500. The 25th st. corner selling in round numbers for about \$62 per square foot, against \$123 per square foot for the 21st st. corner. The latter figure, by the way is about \$22 per square foot greater than the price paid for a plot 61.9x100 on the northwest corner of 5th av. and 34th st., transferred this week to the Knickerbocker Trust Co.

For this reason the court has directed Isidore Schweitzer, of Brooklyn, to carry out a contract made with Walter E. Warner for the transfer of No. 56 Ridge st, a parcel within the lines of the new East River Bridge approach.

"Trains running in the new subway here will cause no vibration such as is reported to annoy householders in London whose property adjoins underground steam and electric railways," said George S. Rice, one of the engineers employed on the new underground railroad, at his office at No. 320 Broadway, yesterday. "London is built upon a chalk foundation. If there is such a vibration as has been reported, it must be due to this fact. We shall have very few sharp corners to turn. The decided curves, as at 42d st and 4th av, will be avoided as much as possible by buying the property in question. We can lessen the curve at these points by tunnelling under the foundations of the buildings. The gneiss, or stratified granite, upon which this city rests, and through which we are digging, will make vibrations from passing trains an impossibility."

OBITUARY.

EUGENE OTTERBOURG.

Assistant Corporation Counsel Eugene Otterbourg died on Tuesday as a result of an operation for appendicitis. He was stricken on Christmas Eve, after he had finished his report of the year's work of his office, and was taken to a private hospital, where an operation was performed. The patient never rallied, as his system was weakened by a severe sickness last summer. The Board of Examiners having been told the news of Mr. Otterbourg's death on assembling Tuesday, as a mark of respect to his memory thereupon adjourned.

Mr. Otterbourg was born in this city about forty-nine years ago, and was the son of the late Justice Marcus Otterbourg, a lawyer and Police Magistrate. He founded the firm of Otterbourg, Jencks & Spring, and latterly he had law offices with Maurice Marks, the leader of the New Jersey Legis'ature, and enjoyed a good practice. He leaves a wife and three sons. The funeral arangements have not yet been completed.

Mr. Otterbourg's connection with the Department of Buildings began in 1892, when he was appointed counsel to the Department Superintendent Brady, in company with whom he gave up When Mr. Brady was made Commissioner of office in 1896. Buildings in 1898, the charter of the previous year had mode the law office of the Department of Buildings part of the office of the Corporation Counsel, and so, finally consolidated under one head all the legal work of the city, Mr. Otterbourg was appointed one of his assistants by Corporation Counsel Whalen and assigned to the Department of Buildings, where he had the management of the legal work of the Department. Those who knew him best say Mr. Otterbourg was a sound lawyer and gifted with a large fund of common sense. His attitude was towards the lessening of litigation and seeking means to avoid the harsher methods of procedure in securing compliance with the law.

At the funeral which took place Thursday, Superintendent of Buildings John A. Dooner and his entire staff; Corporation Counsel Whalen and many others well known in official, legal and building circles, were present.

The office held by Mr. Otterbourg is being temporarily administered by Major John D. Quincy, who stood next in rank to its late chief, and who has been connected with that office, with a short interval, since 1892, and is, therefore, conversant with all its details.

The Building Long Listand

Material Market.

The general market for building materials has not yet recovered from the stock-taking period and the dullness incident to the close of the year, but there is a strong current of hopefulness regarding the future which tones up the prices, and prevents any display of weakness.

The open weather of the week has had a good effect on building operations under old contracts and leads to small transactions.

It is a little early yet to predict with confidence the probable outcrop of building projects and, in fact, many architects and many builders differ with regard to the eventualities of the coming year. On the whole, however, taking the views of a majority of those interviewed recently, it may be anticipated with a fair degree of certainty that the year will result more favorably than the last.

Continued activity in the stock market keeps the attention of many investors, who will probably turn towards real estate and building when the unwonted feverishness has in a measure abated, but the attitude of builders and the prices of materials are likely to have a controlling influence. It is the experience in every line of commerce, with the possible exception of the stock market, which is more or less a legalized form of gambling and hence is not analogous to legitimate forms of investment, that fluctuations in prices act as a deterrent on business activity.

If prices are advancing, buyers are cautious, taking only such commodities as will suffice for immediate needs, in the hope that a waiting game will enable them to secure supplies at a lower figure. If values are on the decline the same reasoning prevents the laying in of supplies until the market has reached the bottom notch and is on the mend. Few men have the courage of their convictions, and buy when prices are lowest, and few are imprudent enough to purchase largely when values are much higher than the average.

This being the case, it is manifestly to the advantage of dealers and manufacturers to keep prices as nearly on an even keel as possible, so as to allow only a legitimate profit on the cost of handling and manufacture; to so restrict the amount of production that the market shall not become top-heavy with supplies and topple of its own lack of support.

The greatest volume of business is transacted in the years when prices do not vary greatly one way or the other, above or below a medium line. The business world generally accepts this to be an axiom, yet its members go on year after year squeezing all they can out of an upward trend of prices, and when production has increased under this unhealthy stimulation they rush to dispose of their product at a sacrifice, and generally lose a sufficiently large percentage to overcome the difference between their abnormal profits and what would have been legitimate profits under a steady market.

The competitive system of business is extremely irrational. With every man's hand against his neighbor, with no sort of reasonable attempt to keep the supply in proportion to the demand, it is not strange that cataclysms are periodically recurrent and men go down swamped in the maelstrom. The millennium has not arrived. It would be too much to expect all in each line of business endeavor to combine for the good of all, but each should strive to keep prices as nearly stationary as possible.

The trouble about all "gentlemen's agreements," so-called, has been that some one of the gentlemen thinks he is not getting his fair share of the business and cuts prices in secret. The secret does not remain a secret long, and his neighbors begin cutting in order to keep up with the procession.

A leading architect is authority for the statement that several houses which were projected for this year have been called off because builders have advanced their prices out of all proportion to the advance in raw materials. An advance of 12½ per cent. in raw materials induced a lock manufacturer to a 100-per cent. increase in the value of locks. This is a small item, but when all materials are advanced in proportion the cost of a house is much enhanced. These figures may be an exaggeration, but the application is obvious.

Everything points at present to a good season in the building trade, and it behooves dealers to refrain from choking the goose that lays the golden egg by creating fluctuations in prices

The past week has been quiet and without interesting developments. Prices are unchanged.

THE CINVENTION OF NEW YORK STATE ARCHITECTS.

A convention of the practising architects of the State of New York, pursuant to an invitation issued by the Architectural League, will be held at the rooms of the League in this city at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, January 19.

This convention has been called to discuss the bill drafted by the League, which proposes the licensing of architects. The circular calling the convention says: "The proposed legislation aims to enable the profession, as such, to serve the public better, more fully and more efficiently; that, through regulation, gross ignorance, recklessness and dishonest practice may be minimized."

J. F. Harber, acting chairman of the Committee on Registration of Architects Bill, stated that the bill substantially as now

proposed has been before the Legislature twice, and it passed both Houses once, but it did not become a law because Governor Morton refused to sign it.

He said further: "The convention is called to ascertain the sentiment of the architects. Everybody will have a voice or vote. All shades of opinion will probably be represented. About one thousand invitations were issued, and so far about one hundred replies have been received. Of the one hundred, about sixty say they will be present, and only three of the sixty have expressed disapproval. The remainder have expressed regret at their inability to be present.

There has been some misunderstanding regarding the purpose of the convention. The bill will not be the work of the League alone. The names were selected from the directory, and the State was well covered. It is the desire of the committee and the League in general to obliterate the lines of organizations, and have the bill go before the Legislature as representing the sentiments of the architects of the State."

LANDLORD AND TENANT.

William H. Douglas, a tenant of the Chesebrough Building, has been informed by Justice McLaughlin in the Supreme Court—Appellate Division, of the legal position of a tenant differing with a landlerd as to alterations and repairs. The Justice said:

A breach of a covenant on the part of a lessor is not a legal excuse for the non-payment of rent. If a landlord fails to keep his part of the agreement, then a tenant can recover such damages as he may show he is entitled to, and when called upon to pay the rent, may, as a defence, set up a breach of the lease, and offset the damages which he has sustained against the rent due. But this does not give him the right to maintain an action in equity to compel the landlord to specifically perform, and during the pendency of the action, enjoin him from collecting any rent. This would be inequitable, inasmuch as it would permit the tenant to use the leased premises without paying for them. A tenant, when called upon to pay rent, must do one of two things; he must either pay the rent due or else restore possession of the premises to the landlord. He cannot keep both the rent and the possession.

What the Building Word Talks Of.

FACTS, IDEAS, NOVELTIES.

Roofs to serve as floors are not especially common in this country, but a recent interesting example is found in connec-

Stone Covered Roofs. tion with the new immigrant station on Ellis Island, New York Harbor, where stone roofs serve as balcony floors. These are of thick slate slabs, supported on steel beams. The slabs were selected sound and uniform in color, 1½ inches thick, and dressed smooth on both sides.

On each beam galvanized iron double gutters are fixed along each side of the top flange, to catch any leakage at the joints, which are filled with slaters' cement. The slabs are clamped to the top flanges of the beams by steel clips, having bolts set with plaster of paris in holes drilled in the slate. These metal clips are 1½ inches by 3-16-inch, and are 18 inches apart. The roof is pitched to the front edge, where it drains into a copper gutter on wrought-iron brackets, with one side flashed up over the blocks which raise the slabs from top of the beams to clear the joint gutters.—Metal Worker.

The new building will be constructed of light buff brick with stone trimmings, and the outside orgamental work will be of terra cotta. The entire first floor and vestibule will be laid with Georgia marble slabs and the main stairs will be of white Vermont marble. The corridors and halls above the first floor will have Tennessee marble, except the second story stair hall, which will have white Italian mar-ble as a base. The floors will be laid in mosaics. When the building is completed it will rank among the most attractive in the city.-Carpentry and Building.

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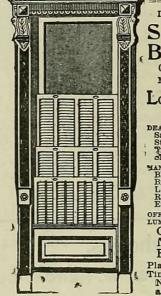
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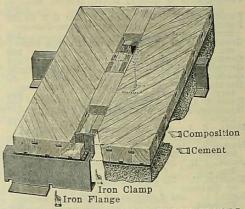
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Manhattan Elevated Electric Plant .-The electrical equipment of the Manhattan Elevated Railway will not be completed in all of its details for some months yet. At present the steam and electrical machinery is in process of construction, the power house is approaching completion, and a great part of the third-rail conductor is installed. The first generating units are expected to be ready for use about June of this year, when they will supply current for the 2d av line Describing this plant the Electrical World

When completed, the Manhattan plant will be by far the largest steam-driven electrical generating plant in the world, the only other coming within measurable distance being that of the Metropolitan Street Railway system. Its duty will be to supply current to 75 miles of third-rail, aggregating over 70,000 amperes, at 62b volts at the period of maximum load. The generators to supply this enormous amount of energy will be eight in number, each 5000-kw normal capacity. Each machine will be 42 ft. high and weigh no less than 445 tons, the revolving field alone weighing 185 tons. While the mere magnitude of the plant renders it of especial interest, this is further enhanced to the electrical engineer by a number of the technical features involved, perhaps the most striking of which is the direct generation and distribution of current at 11,-000 volts, almost twice the voltage of such modern plants as those of the Metropolitan Railway and the latest additions to the New York electric light and power central station system.

Another indication of the magnitude of the service which the plant will supply is given in the statement that the lighting of the power station, sub-stations, pas-senger stations, etc., will require 15,000 incandescent lamps and 250 are lamps, this incidental use thus corresponding to the electric lighting demands of, for instance, Troy, N. Y.

The power house is located on the East River between 74th and 75th sts. current is here generated at 11,000 volts and transmitted at this pressure to seven sub-stations, where it is transformed to a voltage of 390, and by means of rotary converters is converted to direct current at 625 volts. The generating station is designed for a maximum capacity of 100,-000 horse-power, which may, however, be

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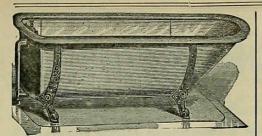
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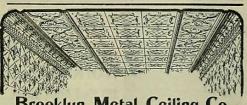
The power house is divided by a longitudinal wall into two parts, forming a boiler house 104 ft. wide and a generator house 96 ft. 6 ins. wide. The length of the building is 395 ft. on 74th st. and 415 ft. on 75th st. The boiler house contains a basement, two boiler floors and coal pockets located immediately under the The height from the basement to the top of the monitor is 128 ft. The basement is divided into three compartments by two longitudinal walls, in the central one of which are located the pumps, the ashes being handled from the compartments on either side. The coal

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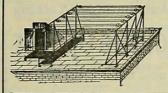
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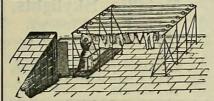


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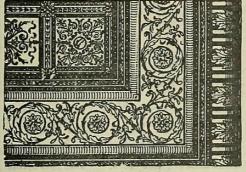
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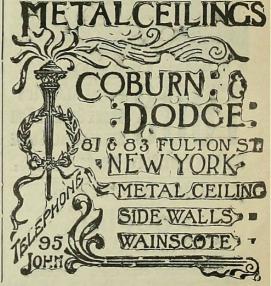
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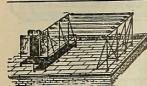
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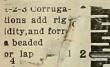
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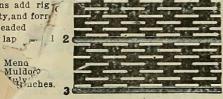


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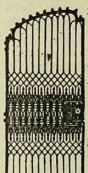
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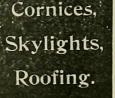
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
