



The wonderful pit orchestra was always trying to keep up with all of the cues. Some of the cast didn't use the same lines twice in a row which kept the orchestra on their toes.









Katie Voss was the Trojan's varsity setter for three years. She comments, "It was sad being my last year playing here, but we had such an awesome season that was good to end on."
























