Director's Notes

Nearly every year, students have begged for me to choose *Into the Woods* as the Joan and Marvin Rosenberg High School Musical. This year, I finally listened! I am so glad - what an incredible show you are about to see!

I think I have seen stage performances of *Into the Woods* more than any other musical. I grew up watching the PBS recording of *Into the Woods* starring Bernadette Peters, which opened on Broadway in 1987. I also saw Vanessa Williams play the Witch in the 2002 Broadway revival, and I enjoyed the 2014 Disney film of *Into the Woods*, which surprisingly did not Disney-fy most of the difficult source material. Most recently, I saw the 2022 Broadway tour at the Kennedy Center, which starred Neil Patrick Harris and Sara Bareilles when it was in New York. Along the way, I've seen my fair share of Red Ridinghoods, evil Stepsisters, and Milky Whites in regional and community theater productions. *Into the Woods* continues to be one of the top ten musicals produced in high schools across the country.

It is not an easy show. Sondheim musicals never are - the melodies are difficult, the harmonies even more so. We spent time learning about the *leit motifs* in the score, the repeated musical phrases, that Sondheim has woven throughout the musical emphasizing character and theme. Sondheim uses music as a language, and it's fascinating to uncover the level of sophistication in his score.

Thematically, it's also challenging. I can't think of any other musical whose acts are so clearly split between comedy and tragedy. Without spoiling too much, whenever I have taken students on field trips to *Into the Woods*, there are always student voices that question why act two even exists - shouldn't the show end with act one? (In fact, the "junior" production of *Into the Woods*, that is a version of the show written for middle school students to perform, ends the show with the act one finale.) I can understand why a young person would ask why act two is necessary. As we get older, we understand the purpose behind the show's difficult second act.

This is a show we can sink our teeth into: we've spent time discovering the layers of our characters, while diving into the show's metaphors and the philosophical ideas they embody. It's also a difficult show to rehearse while there is so much pain in the world around us, and *Into the Woods* channels some of that pain. I am hoping that coming together to witness students sharing their art with others is a moment of hope, even in the darkest of times.
