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Introduction and Acknowledgements

In February 1958, soon after Frank Gannett's death, his wife Caroline wrote to Edith M. Fox, Curator of the Collection of Regional History (now the Department of Manuscripts and University Archives). Mrs. Gannett wished to reaffirm the family's earlier decision to place all their personal papers at Cornell. Those of Frank Gannett were soon transferred, and those of Caroline Werner Gannett came to Cornell after her death in 1979.

Frank Gannett's collection provides a detailed picture of his growth from a rural childhood to his establishment of a national media network. The documents range from an adolescent diary recording the details of his newspaper routes, to journals documenting his service on the first United States Philippine Commission, to speeches articulating his political views and aspirations. The correspondence reflects his exchange with the political leaders of his day, as well as his interaction with members of his family. Numerous photographs document his extensive travels, his early love of aviation, and his interest in the development of new printing technology. The picture of both the private and the public man is amplified in the papers of his wife. Caroline Gannett's papers provide an extensive record of her activities in New York State education, national politics, and her personal and philanthropic efforts on behalf of children and youth. Together the papers form a remarkable record and have already been used by numerous scholars. This guide has been prepared in an effort to further facilitate research.

The first section of the guide describes the papers of Frank Gannett. The papers are divided into series based on type of document and within each series the items are arranged chronologically. A listing for each series is preceded by a narrative description. The first and largest series is the correspondence; other major series include speeches, photographs, and scrapbooks. For the correspondence and photographs, detailed descriptions of the contents of each folder or envelope have been compiled. The descriptions include the folder titles and a listing of personal and corporate names and topical subjects. The final section of the guide consists of an index to all Frank Gannett's correspondence and photographs, including those mounted in scrapbooks or albums.

Caroline Werner Gannett's papers document the role of a woman actively

involved in her husband's political campaigns, as well as in her own civic, philanthropic, and social activities. The papers include correspondence, photographs, scrapbooks, and diaries. Three series are devoted to specific topics: the Syracuse University Youth Development Center, the White House Conference on Children and Youth (1960), and the 1960 Republican presidential campaign. Each series is preceded by a narrative description, and within the various series, items are arranged and listed chronologically. Together these two collections document individuals, a family, an industry, and a political era.

The compilation of an archival guide is always the result of the combined efforts of many people. The work has included identification and analysis of the documents, their physical arrangement and storage in special containers for archival preservation, their listing and indexing, and editing and production of the guide. Tamberly Gobert and Alexandra Lipsky have provided most of the effort required in the identification, arrangement, and listing of items. Ms. Gobert has also been responsible for compiling the text of the guide and the index. This work has been carried out under the direction of Elaine Engst, who has also had primary editorial responsibility. Additional assistance was provided by Gould Colman, Kathleen Jacklin, Anne Kenney, Philip McCray, and Mary Warren. The guide was designed by Betsy Bayley of Bets Ltd., and photographic work was done by Jon Crispin.

The publication of this guide has resulted from a project supported by a grant from the Gannett Foundation. The assistance of Calvin Mayne, Vice President for Grants Administration of the Gannett Foundation, has been instrumental in the development and implementation of the project. Additionally, Marilyn Stein LeFeber, former Vice President for Communications, has provided valued consultation.

Publication and dissemination of this guide will encourage and facilitate future research. I thank all those who have contributed to its production.

Biographical Outline

Gannett Company Inc. is a nationwide information company that publishes ninety daily newspapers, including *USA Today*, thirty-nine non-daily newspapers, and *USA Weekend*. It also operates eight television stations, sixteen radio stations, and owns the largest outdoor advertising firm in North America. The company was created in 1923 by Frank E. Gannett, whose acquisitions and consolidations significantly shaped twentieth century American journalism.

Frank Ernest Gannett was born on September 15, 1876 at Gannett Hill, near Bristol, Ontario County, New York. According to the family genealogy, the Gannett family had come from Dorsetshire, England, in 1638 to settle in Hingham, Massachusetts, on the south shore of Massachusetts Bay. Frank Gannett's great-grandfather Joseph served with the Minute Men. Joseph's brother, Benjamin, married Deborah Sampson who, disguised as a boy, served as a soldier in the Continental Army. In 1944, Frank Gannett's daughter Sally dedicated a Liberty Ship named for Deborah Sampson Gannett.

After the Revolutionary War, Joseph Gannett moved west to New York State. He bought land in Lafayette, near Syracuse. His son Warren owned a large farm north of Syracuse, as well as 750 acres of timberland on an island in Lake Ontario, offshore from Sackett's Harbor. Warren had three daughters and six sons. During the Civil War, Warren's fourth son, Joseph Charles, served in Company H of the Second New York Cavalry under General Philip Sheridan. After the war, he married Maria Brooks. With their families, Joseph and three of his brothers moved to marginal farm land near Bristol, New York where Frank was born. Many years later, Frank Gannett bought this land and built a weekend home there overlooking Canandaigua Lake.

Joseph Gannett moved several times during the next few years. After a short time as a tenant farmer at Blood's Depot (now Atlanta, New York), Joseph Gannett became the proprietor of a series of hotels, in Howard, Wallace, Bolivar, and Oneonta, New York. While living at Blood's Depot, Frank began his newspaper career as a newsboy for the *Rochester Democrat and Chronicle*. Frank delivered the *Buffalo Times* and the *Buffalo News* when the family moved to Bolivar. He also began to report local news, earning one dollar per story. Frank attended Bolivar Union School and Academy. When the family moved to Oneonta, he remained to finish his studies and graduate.

Frank Gannett won a scholarship to attend Cornell University in 1894. During his freshman year, Gannett waited on tables, delivered laundry, and ushered at Sage Chapel. At the end of the year, he was elected class representative to the Board of Editors of the *Cornell Daily Sun*. His regular beat was the univer-

sity president's office. There he frequently interviewed President Jacob Gould Schurman, who served as a major influence on his career. The next year, the *Ithaca Journal* hired him as its campus reporter. Gannett also submitted copies of stories about campus events to newspapers in Buffalo, Syracuse, New York, Boston, Philadelphia, and Chicago. He eventually hired other students to provide additional copy. That summer, Gannett worked as a general reporter for the *Syracuse Herald*. As a senior, Gannett concentrated on the study of economics, writing his final thesis on "The History of Insurance Legislation in New York State."

After graduating in 1898, Gannett returned to Ithaca to do graduate work in history, economics, and literature, but he soon became completely occupied in reporting campus events. After Christmas vacation, he received a telegram from Jacob Gould Schurman offering him a position as his secretary while Schurman headed the First Philippine Commission. (President William McKinley had appointed Schurman to head this commission to visit the Philippines, which the United States had just acquired in the Spanish-American War. The commission's charge was to recommend a plan for governing the islands.) While in the Philippines, Gannett learned Spanish, and translated a well-known Filipino book, *Noli Me Tangere* by Jose Rizal under the title *Friars and Filipinos*. He also wrote long descriptive letters to the *Syracuse Herald* and kept a journal. The Commission completed its work late in 1899.

Journalism

Gannett returned to Ithaca in 1899 as city editor of the *Ithaca Daily News*. He later became business manager with overall responsibility for the operation of the paper. After a political and commercial disagreement with the owner involving a political party printing contract, Gannett left the *Daily News* in 1905. He worked for a short time for *Frank Leslie's Illustrated Weekly* and then edited *The Index*, a similar publication in Pittsburgh. On a visit to Ithaca, he met a young man named Erwin R. Davenport who had just bought an interest in the *Elmira Gazette*. Davenport needed a partner to handle the news and editorials while he managed the business operations. The *Gazette* was an afternoon paper of Democratic sympathies. In 1906, at the age of twenty-nine, Frank Gannett purchased a half interest in the *Elmira Gazette* for \$20,000. The next year, Gannett and Davenport merged the *Elmira Gazette* with the *Evening Star* (owned by Isaac Seymour Copeland and James F. Woodford) to form the *Elmira Star-Gazette*. In 1912, Gannett purchased the *Ithaca Journal*. While the *Elmira Star-Gazette* was a Democratic paper, the *Ithaca Journal* had always been a Republican paper. Gannett's management philosophy permitted each paper to maintain its own editorial policy, a position that he would retain throughout his career.

Seeking to expand their holdings, Gannett and his partners purchased two of the three afternoon papers in Rochester, combining them as the *Times-Union* in 1918. Gannett and Davenport moved to Rochester to direct the new paper.

There Gannett was introduced to Caroline Werner, the daughter of William E. Werner, Judge of the New York State Court of Appeals. They were married in March 1920. Although Gannett's newspaper holdings continued to expand and his various business and political interests led him to travel widely, Frank and Caroline Gannett always considered Rochester their home.

Gannett and his partners further expanded their holdings by purchasing and combining the two Utica afternoon papers, the *Herald-Dispatch* and the *Observer* to form the *Utica Observer-Dispatch* in 1921. Two years later, they acquired the *Elmira Telegram*, a Sunday paper, and the *Elmira Advertiser*, a morning paper, giving them control of the entire Elmira market. Gannett repeated the process in Ithaca when he bought the *Ithaca Daily News* and merged it with the *Journal*. To formalize the consolidated enterprises in Elmira, Utica, and Rochester, Gannett and his partners created the Empire State Group in 1923. Later that year, Gannett formed the Gannett Company. By selling stock in this new corporation, Gannett bought out his partners and established independent ownership. Davenport and Gannett remained close personal friends, and Davenport rejoined the company in Rochester fourteen years later. The success of the Rochester venture provided the base from which Gannett newspapers achieved national prominence.

The 1920s represented the period of Gannett's greatest expansion. In 1928, he acquired the *Hartford Times*, the *Knickerbocker Press* and the *Evening News* (both Albany), the *Rochester Democrat and Chronicle*, as well as the *Brooklyn Eagle*, which he resold in 1932. He merged the *Knickerbocker News* with the *Evening News* to form one afternoon paper in 1937. An agreement with William Randolph Hearst led Gannett to abandon the morning and Sunday field in Albany in return for Hearst interests in Rochester. In 1943, he purchased the *Binghamton Press*. By 1948, Gannett owned or controlled twenty newspapers in fifteen cities and towns, and partial interest in an additional paper—the nation's largest newspaper chain in number of papers. Only three of the papers were published outside New York State. Affiliated with the Gannett group were six radio stations. Management was decentralized, with each paper maintaining its own editorial and circulation policies. The only exception consisted of a ban on alcohol advertising.

A dispute with the International Typographical Union led Gannett to investigate the possibilities of replacing pressed type in the 1920s. Gannett helped the Teletype Corporation to develop a machine that could produce paper tape which could be "read" by a typesetting machine. The Teletypesetter Corporation was formed with Gannett as a member of the board of directors and minority stockholder. Gannett's continuing interest in technological advances also contributed to the development of a simplified photoengraving process.

In September 1935, Gannett announced the formation and incorporation of the Frank E. Gannett Newspaper Foundation. As owner of the Class A common stock of the Gannett Company, the Foundation assumed control of all

Gannett newspapers. Under the terms of incorporation, all of the Foundation's resources were to be devoted to "public, charitable, educational, and general philanthropic uses and purposes." Eventually, tax law changes forced the Foundation to divest itself of much of the stock, but as owner of 11% of the company, it remained the company's largest shareholder. In 1980, it was renamed The Gannett Foundation. Among the nation's twenty largest private foundations, with assets of more than \$570 million, its 1986 grants and program-related expenses totaled more than \$24 million. Although a private foundation, the Gannett Foundation supports community-based programs in areas where Gannett Company, Inc. has subsidiaries. The foundation also funds national programs for improving journalism education and professionalism, promoting adult literacy, and advancing philanthropy and volunteerism; it supports a variety of scholarships as well. Its two operating programs are the Gannett Center for Media Studies at Columbia University, the nation's first institute for the advanced study of mass communication and technological change, and the Paul Miller Washington Reporting Fellowships in Washington, DC.

Politics

During the 1920s, Gannett became involved in political issues. An interest in farm problems was reinforced by his election in 1926 to the Board of Trustees of Cornell University. Cornell agricultural economist George Frederick Warren heavily influenced Gannett's thinking. Many of Gannett's early speeches dealt with Warren's price theory. In 1934, Gannett became further identified with monetary policy when he became chairman of the Board of Directors of the *American Agriculturist*, which was edited in Ithaca and influenced by Warren and other faculty at the College of Agriculture at Cornell. During the New Deal, Gannett opposed Roosevelt's farm policy in association with the New York Dairymen's League, headed by Fred Sexauer, and with the National Grange.

In the 1936 presidential primaries, Gannett agreed to run as the vice-presidential candidate with Senator William Borah for the Republican nomination. Alfred M. Landon eventually won the nomination. After defeating Landon by a landslide, Franklin Roosevelt then pressed for legislation that would increase the size of the Supreme Court by as many as six more justices. Senator Borah urged Gannett to form a committee to oppose the "court-packing" bill. Gannett spent \$50,000 to found the National Committee to Uphold Constitutional Government. The committee mounted one of the first "direct-mail" campaigns, mailing over ten million pieces of literature in its first six months. The campaign succeeded and the bill was narrowly defeated.

Gannett's success in the court-packing case and his opposition to certain other New Deal policies led him to run for president in 1940 as "the man who stopped Roosevelt". Although Gannett received thirty-three votes on the first ballot in the Republican convention, it was clear that he could win only if a deadlock occurred. When the third ballot showed that more votes were going to Wen-

dell Willkie, most of Gannett's delegates switched their allegiance and Willkie was nominated on the sixth ballot.

Gannett remained politically active. In 1942, he served as Assistant Chairman of the Republican National Committee. He also proposed a new coalition party in which Republicans and dissatisfied Democrats could unite to defeat the New Deal. His direct involvement gradually decreased as he devoted time to philanthropic interests including the Navy Relief Society, the American Red Cross, the United Negro College Fund, the Gannett Youth Center in Rochester, Cornell University, and various other educational institutions. Continuing his interest in agricultural issues and particularly the problem of world hunger, Gannett joined with state agricultural officials to hold a National Food Conference in Chicago in 1943.

In 1946, the United States War Department invited Gannett to join a representative group of editors and publishers to visit the occupation zone in Europe and to observe political, social, and economic conditions in Germany. Gannett, deeply impressed by what he saw, concluded a series written when he returned: ". . . in my opinion what happens in Europe in the next two or three years may determine the whole future of the world, decide whether we shall have another war which, according to scientists, might end our civilization. . . . The biggest problem in the world today is food. . . . Next to food, the one common topic in Europe is Russia." Labor troubles in Rochester prevented Gannett's participation in a similar trip to the Far East in December 1946. In November printers from the *Democrat and Chronicle* and the *Times-Union* had struck in a wage dispute that lasted three months. He was able, though, to join a group of publishers on the Pan American Airways inaugural "Round-the-World" flight in June 1947.

Despite declining health, Gannett maintained an interest in politics. In 1952, he wrote an open letter to President Dwight D. Eisenhower urging him to create a cabinet-level Department of Peace. Frank E. Gannett died at his home in Rochester on December 3, 1957.

Collection Description

The Frank E. Gannett Papers contain correspondence, news releases, speeches, scrapbooks, articles and pamphlets concerning FEG's youth, his student days at Cornell University, editorial policies of the Gannett Newspapers and the establishment of the Frank E. Gannett Newspaper Foundation in 1935, temperance and liquor advertising, various newspaper and professional organizations in which FEG was active, the Cornell University Board of Trustees and School of Nutrition, the gold standard and the United States economy, the 1937 United States Supreme Court "packing" plan, the 1938 Executive Reorganization Bill, the Wages and Hours Bill of 1938, the St. Lawrence Seaway, the 1943 National Food Conference of Consumers and Producers organized by Gannett, presidential election campaigns of 1936 and 1940, Republican National Committee chairmanship and Congressional elections (1942), the proposed National Coalition Party (1944-1945), the National Committee to Uphold Constitutional Government, World War II finance, the role of aircraft in wartime, Red Cross War Fund Drive, Navy Relief Society, Rochester's United Negro College Fund, Department of Peace proposal, donation of the Gannett Medical Clinic to Cornell University, and other topics. Other items include family letters, autograph albums, genealogy, and memorabilia; Gannett's notebooks (1899) concerning his work for the First Philippine Commission; loose and mounted photographs; diaries, notebooks, and account books; a few financial and legal papers; audio discs of radio broadcasts; certificates; memorials; and newspaper clippings and other printed material.

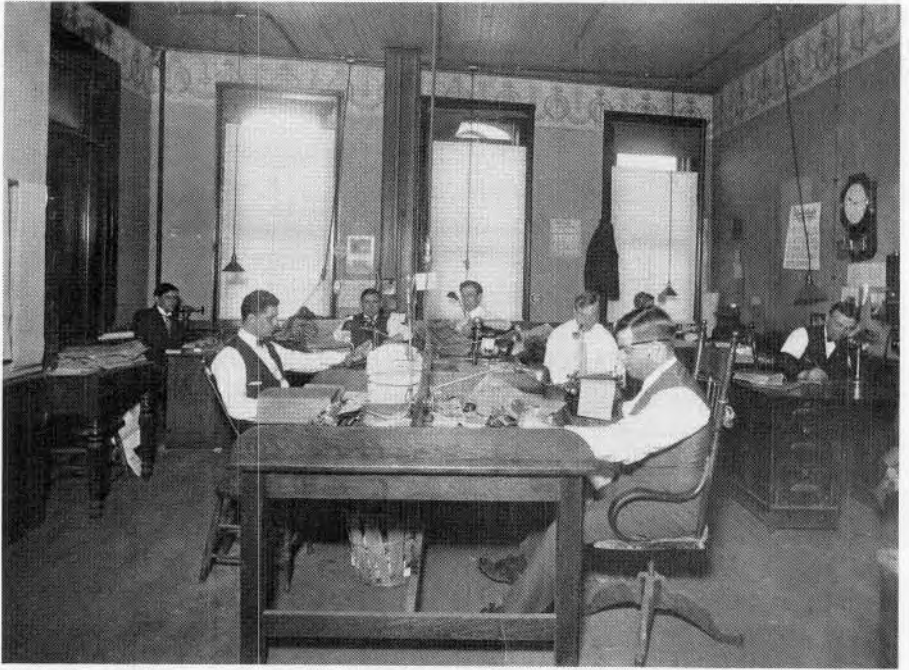

Series I: Correspondence

Correspondence of Frank Gannett includes letters regarding the development of the teletypesetter (1924-1948); the Cornell University Board of Trustees, School of Nutrition, and the Medical Clinic donated by FEG; policies of the Gannett Newspapers, including editorial independence, pension plan, profit-sharing, and liquor advertising; the establishment of the Frank E. Gannett Newspaper Foundation (primarily letters of congratulations); the Republican Party; the National Committee to Uphold Constitutional Government and its opposition to New Deal legislation; FEG's campaign for Republican nomination as William E. Borah's running mate in 1936, and as a presidential candidate in 1940; fund-raising drives organized by FEG in Rochester and New York State, including the Navy Relief Society (1942), Red Cross (1943), and the United Negro College Fund (1944-1945); controversy surrounding the publication of *Under Cover*, in which Gannett and others were accused of fascist activities (1943); the National Food Conference of Consumers and Producers (1943); the launching of the liberty ship *Deborah Sampson Gannett* (1944), named after an ancestor who posed as a male and fought in the American Revolution; the proposed coalition party, in which Republicans and dissatisfied Democrats were urged to join forces to defeat the New Deal (1944-1945); the 1946 Editors' and Publishers' Tour of Austria and Germany, sponsored by the United States War Department; the Gannett Youth Center, also known as "The Barn" (1947); Pan Am World Flight (1947); and FEG's illness and death (1955-1957). Additional subjects include the United States Constitution and Supreme Court; presidential power; monetary policy and the gold standard; Gannett's proposal for a Federal Department of Peace; religion; temperance; aviation; war production; communism; anti-Semitism; freedom of speech; freedom of the press; FEG's activities in various newspaper and professional organizations; agricultural policies of Franklin D. Roosevelt's administration; free enterprise; unemployment and other labor issues; World War II reparations and the Marshall Plan; FEG's speaking engagements; awards; and related topics.

Major correspondents include Lord Beaverbrook, Neal Dow Becker, William E. Borah, John L. Collyer, George W. Crane, Edmund Ezra Day, Thomas E. Dewey, Anthony Eden, Mark Ellingson, Victor Emanuel, James A. Farley, Edwin S. Friendly, Earl Harding, Herbert Hoover, Alfred M. Landon, Herbert H. Lehman, Norman Vincent Peale, Samuel B. Pettengill, Raymond S. Richmond, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Edward A. Rumely, Jacob Gould Schurman, Harry G. Stutz, Robert A. Taft, Walter L. Todd, Frank E. Tripp, Arthur H. Vandenberg, James W. Wadsworth, and David Rhys Williams; there is also correspondence between FEG and Winston Churchill, Calvin Coolidge, Dwight Eisenhower, Livingston Farrand, William Randolph Hearst, Benito Mussolini, J.C. Penney, Andrew Dickson White, Woodrow Wilson, and many others. Additional correspondents and subjects are listed in the index.

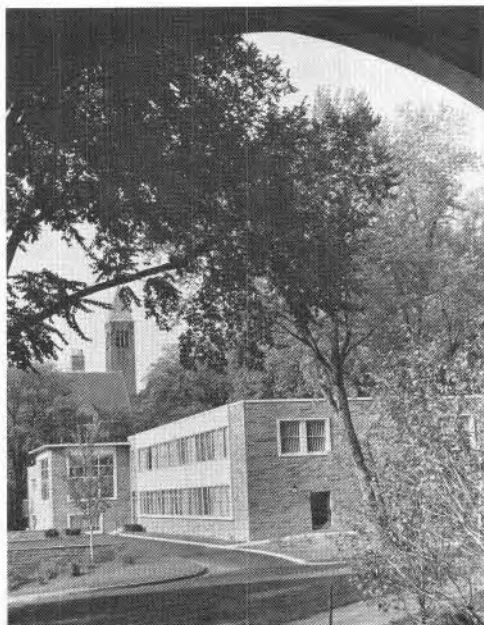

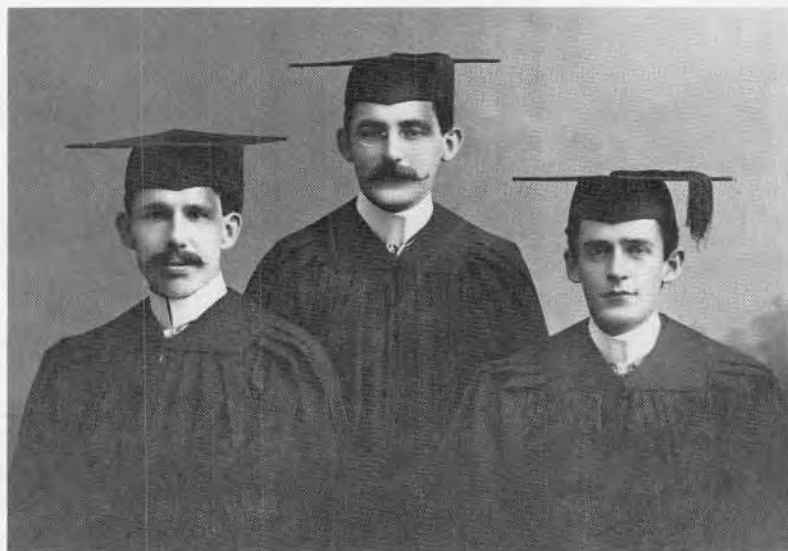

In addition there are substantial groups of photographs on the Philippine Commission (1899-1900); the debate with Harold Ickes, "Do We Have A Free Press?" (1939); the campaign for Republican nomination for president (1940); the Editors' and Publishers' Tour of Austria and Germany, including scenes of Nazi concentration camps and military destruction (1946); the Pan Am 'Round the World Trip (1947); and the construction and dedication of the Gannett Health Center at Cornell University in 1957.

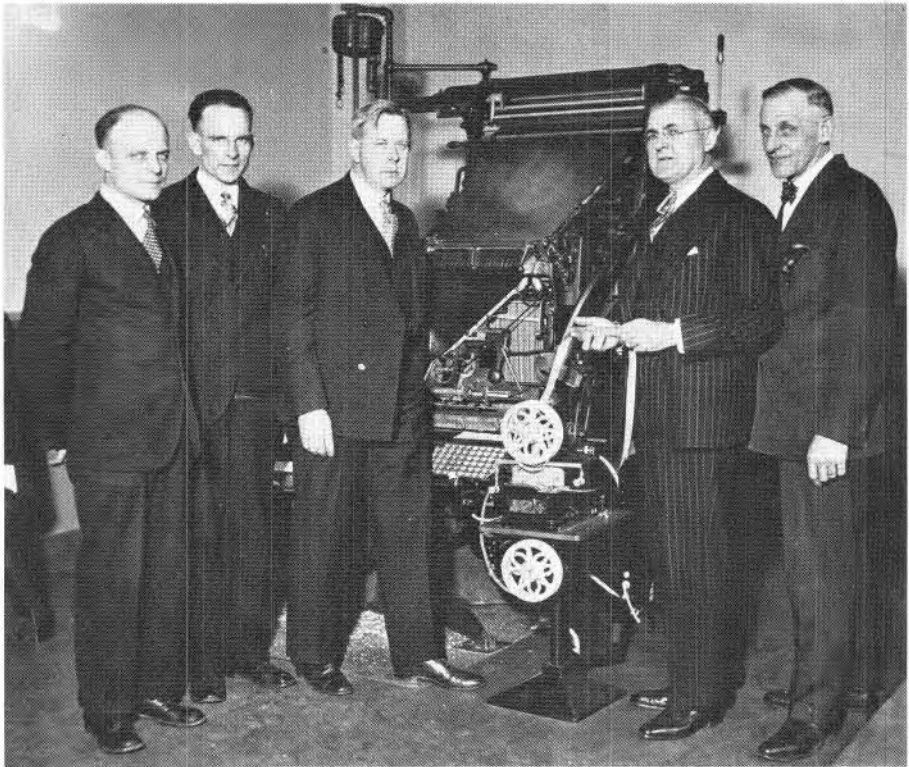

Rizal's novel Noli Me Tangere is, I believe, the best book ever written on the Philippines. It lays bare the causes of the revolution against Spain and discloses at the same time the aspirations of the people. It is at once an historical and psychological study of the greatest value, presented in the form of an entertaining novel.

An admirable translation, judiciously abbreviated, has been made by Mr. Frank Ernest Gannett under the title of Friars and Filipinos. Mr. Gannett was my secretary when I held the position of President of the First Philippine Commission and had therefore a good opportunity of familiarizing himself with the character of the people and learning to appreciate the local touches found in Rizal's story.



Promotional brochure for FEG's translation of Jose Rizal's *Noli Me Tangere*, 1902.

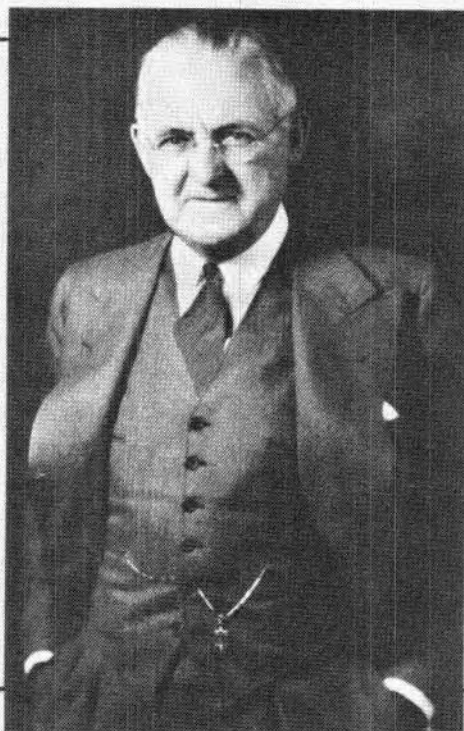

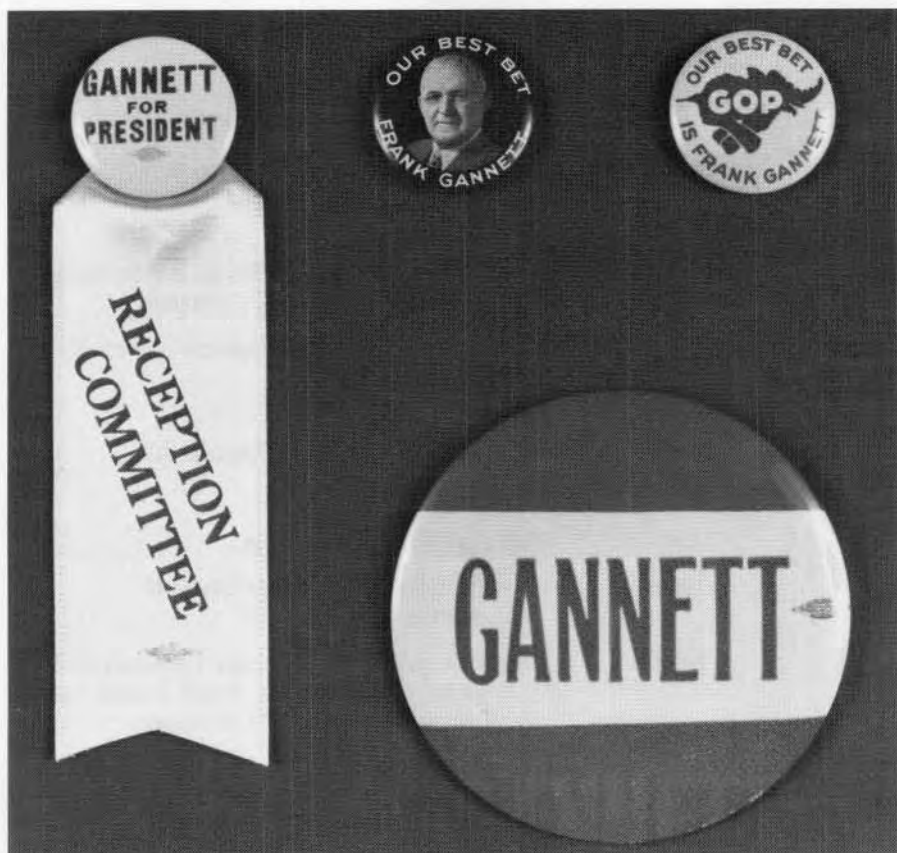
