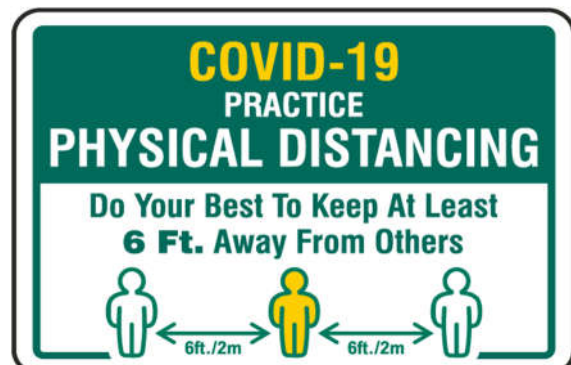
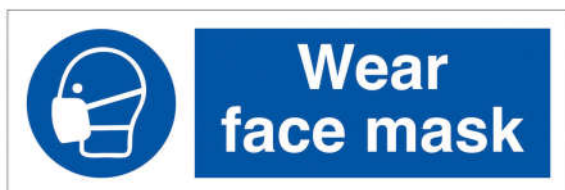

Stay Hydrated



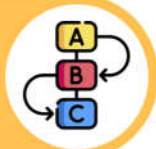
Put a water bottle on your work desk, and keep yourself hydrated throughout the day.

Communicate with Colleagues



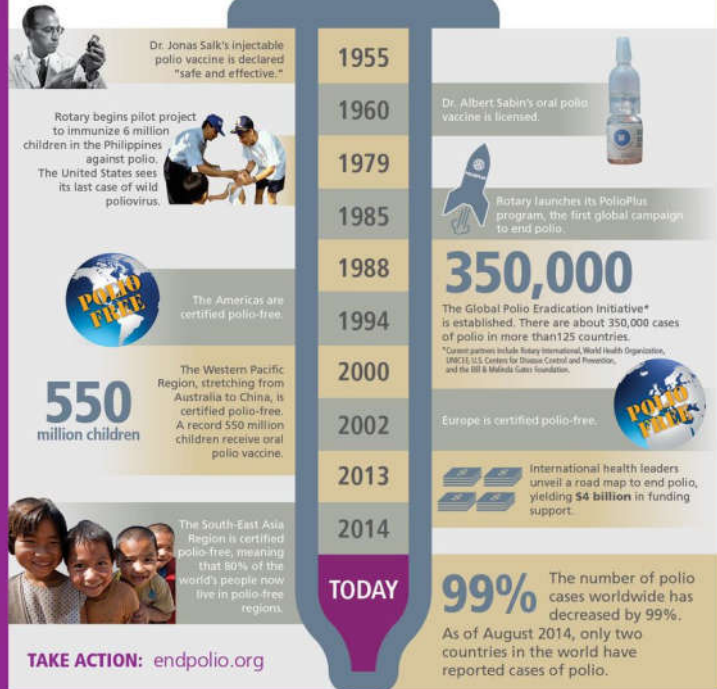
Communication is vital while working from home, do video or voice calls, and build strong relationships with co-workers.

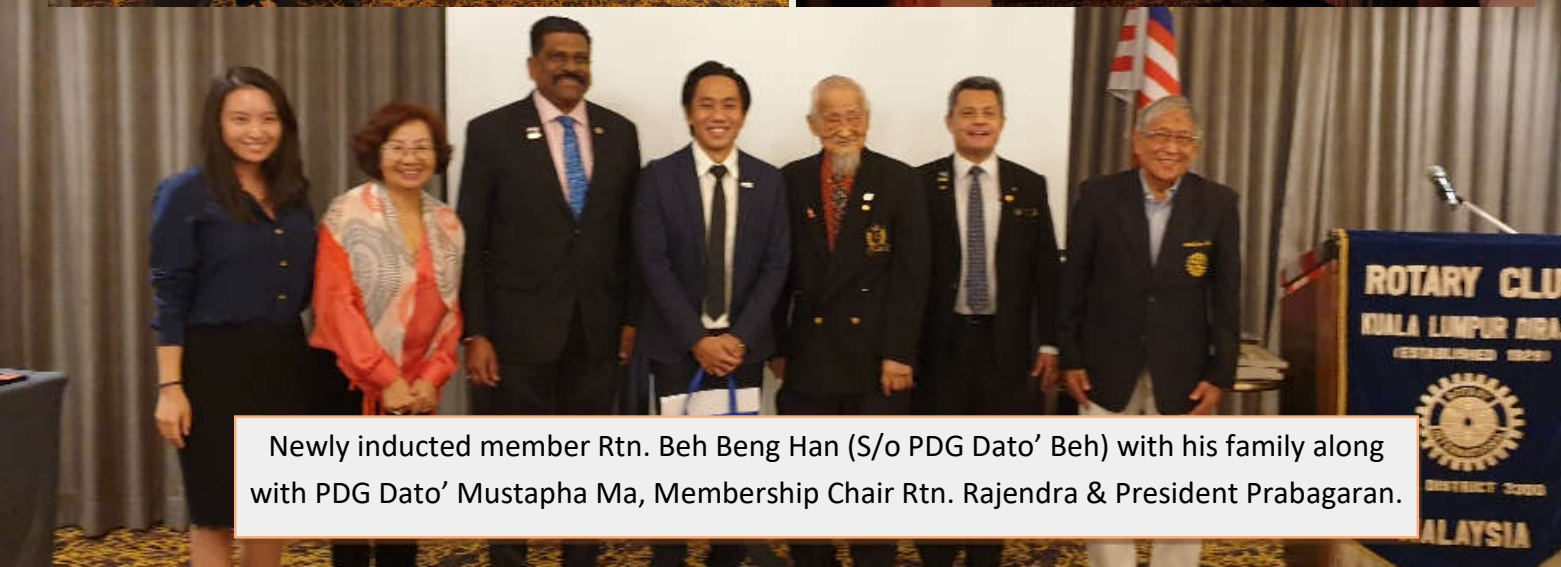

James Wheeler Davidson Rotary Clubs

In September several clubs including 4 Rotarians from Kuala Lumpur DiRaja of the JWD clubs met virtually, Grand son of James Wheeler was present in the meeting. James Wheeler Davidson of Calgary, also famously known as the Marco Polo of Rotary establishing Rotary clubs as far as Greece, Egypt, across Asia — Turkey, Israel, Iraq, India, Myanmar, Thailand, China, Malaya, Indonesia — to Australia & New Zealand in the last 1920s and early 1930s. I think Davidson's amazing feat can never be achieved again. In all, Davidson chartered 7 clubs in Malaya: KL, Seremban, Malacca, Penang, Ipoh, Klang, Singapore around 1930 in one sweep! In so doing, he proposed to R.I. some changes that led to a broader interpretation of the classification system.

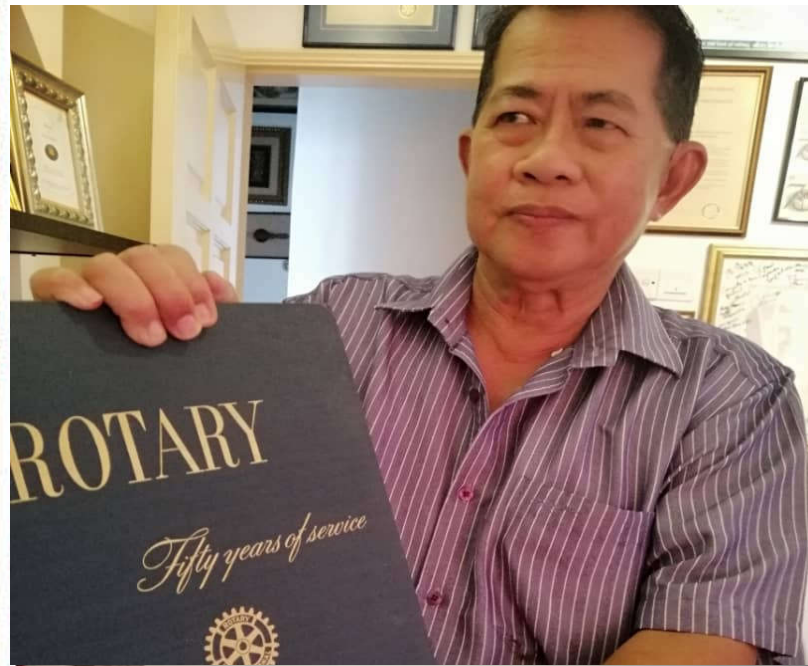

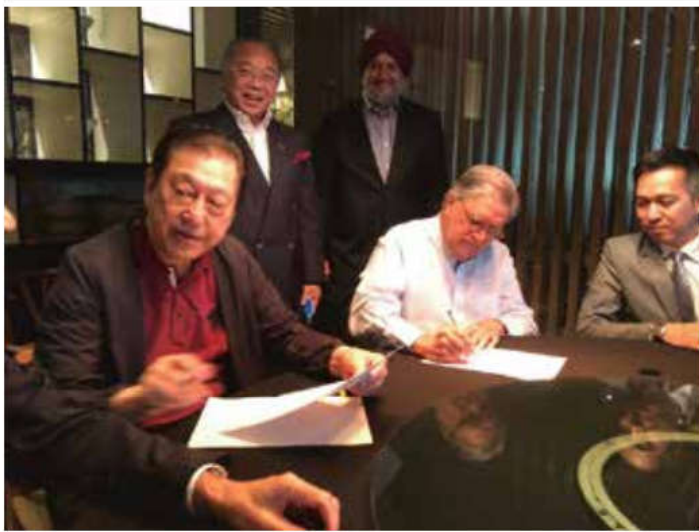

Taken 15 long years to fundraise and build, this well-designed residence sitting on a pristine 2.3-acre land has the capacity to house a maximum of 150 underprivileged and at-risk children.

"It all began with the thought of building a safe home for abandoned children," says Datuk Chan Kam Fatt (RCKLD), Exco Chairman of BRCR, "It also has to be a multiracial and multicultural home so that the children will grow up with an appreciation of each others' differences."

It is challenging and more costly to accommodate the different religious and ethnic requirements - the areas of spiritual education and food preparation - but it is a worthwhile effort.

Special attention is given to the children's character development, health matters and lifelong learning. "We are committed to cultivate our children to become compassionate citizens and 'masters of their craft'," affirms Frank Lim HH, Hon. Secretary of the Rotary BRDB Trust.

BRCR is caring for 65 children and its operations depend on public donations - individuals and businesses.



Many of these children came to BRCR as young as 3, and such children of all ages need a lot of care and educational support via salaried childcare officers, to guide them towards becoming the best they could be. They too have aspirations like any other child and some are already achieving recognition in school and beyond, thanks to BRCR's social services.

INCREASE YOUR MEMBERSHIP THROUGH AN OPEN HOUSE

Zoë van der Meulen, governor of District 7170 (New York, USA) is building on a tradition established by district leaders before her: She's encouraging clubs to invite community members to receptions, or "open houses," to learn more about Rotary's work.

A member of the Rotary Club of Unadilla, New York, USA, van der Meulen says her small club has brought in 10 new members, thanks in part to open houses.

"At each open house there's someone who says, 'I've always been interested in Rotary' or 'I was a Rotary Youth Exchange student, but I never knew how to get involved,'" says van der Meulen. "So many people think very highly of Rotary but need this extra nudge to join."

Although the concept of an open house, also sometimes called a mixer, is not new to Rotary, a growing number of districts are urging clubs

to organize these events as an effective grassroots effort to promote Rotary. Van der Meulen has created an invitation template and tips (see graphic) that she shares during training sessions and club visits.

Programming for open houses varies from planning formal events to inviting guests to a regular club meeting to after-work gatherings. Wherever the events are held, van der Meulen says it is important that members talk to visitors about what Rotary means to them personally.

"At every [event], Rotarians have spoken from the heart about why they joined and what it means to them to be a Rotarian," she says. "The stories and sentiment help compel others to serve through Rotary."

10 TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL OPEN HOUSE

1

Plan with other clubs in your area so that prospective members have a variety of options for meeting times, formats, etc.

2

Do a survey of professions to identify any that are not currently represented in your club.

3

Send invitations a month before the event, and make follow-up calls two weeks beforehand.

4

Update club brochures and communications with content from the Brand Center at least three weeks before the event, and hand out the printed materials at the event.

5

A week beforehand, assign specific event tasks to club members. Put someone in charge of organizing the flow of guests as they arrive so that the event lasts no longer than 90 minutes.

6

Create a relaxed atmosphere so people can mingle informally, and remind members to share their personal Rotary stories.

7

Invite and recognize RYLA students and Youth Exchange students.

8

Discuss Rotary's global causes using the Discover Rotary presentation, to which you can add your club's own projects, both local and international.

9

Share information about your club's format and the club's expectation for membership.

10

Follow up by inviting to a future club meeting anyone who has expressed interest. Be persistent but patient.

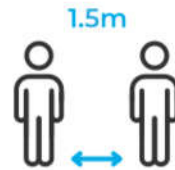
