Kinship across Ross-shire: Recent Discoveries in Late Medieval Archaeology at Eilean Donan Castle and Tarbatness

Cecily Spall of FAS Heritage talks about two research projects she has co-directed. Portmahomack (1993-2007) and Eilean Donan Castle (2008-ongoing) have provided a wealth of new insight into the archaeology of the late medieval period in Ross-shire. Though quite different in form and location, the two sites are richly connected by evidence for metal-working, population movement and burials and funerary sculpture. 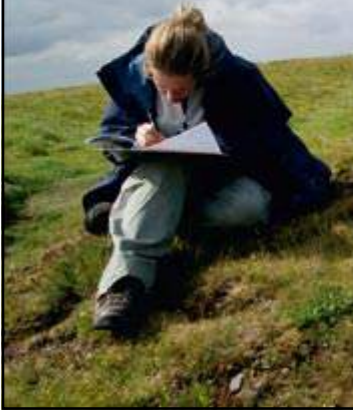

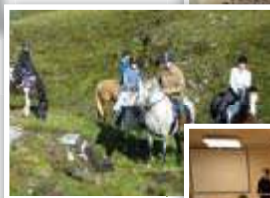

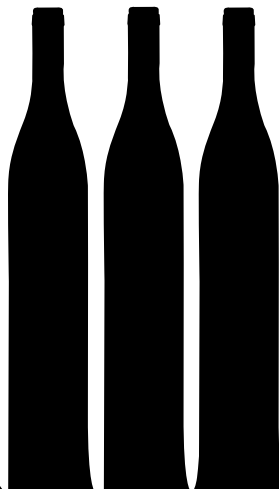
