

This is the **20**th Anniversary of the Sarasota Film Festival. This year we are showing 90 features, 131 shorts, and have curated six sidebars of interest to our community. We have more events programmed into a 10 day festival than we could have ever dreamed of.

In the beginning, the Sarasota Film Festival was a three-day festival. Over the last 20 years, we have grown to become a 10 day festival and one of the largest regional festivals in the country. We have hosted celebrities and luminaries from around the world, never losing sight of our mission to support the independent film community.

We also serve as a platform for many local human services and arts groups. Every year, we partner with a number of local charities such as the *Harvey Milk Festival*, *Nathan Benderson Park*, and *Embracing Our Differences*, just to name a few. We are especially appreciative of our local sponsors, many of whom have been with us during the entire 20 years of our existence.

By 2006, SFF was experiencing success of epic proportion. Our educational programming was (and still is) among the most outstanding on the festival circuit. Our educational program will expand this year with the introduction of the 20 Hour Film Contest. As in our past festivals, we continue to provide programming of, by, and for students within the Sarasota-Manatee region.

In 2008, we were not immune to the financial crisis, as our community was in the virtual epicenter of the collapse. We rebuilt slowly and thoughtfully throughout 2009 and became increasingly efficient in our operation. At the same time, we doubled down on our focus: independent filmmakers.

Over the last several years, we have expanded our reach as we proceed into the next decade of operation in our growing city. We pledge to keep up with the changing media landscape of serialized content, virtual reality, augmented reality, and any other mode of expression that our extraordinary filmmakers continue to submit to us.

I thank all of our sponsors, our entire Board of Directors, our brilliant staff, and, of course, our viewing audience. It is with enormous pride, pleasure, and relief that we present the 2018 Sarasota Film Festival.



children in Manatee
County, was closed due
to the official end of
segregation. Fourteen
years after Brown vs.
The Topeka Board of
Education had been



decided, integration was finally implemented in the Manatee County school system. Instead of going to high school in their neighborhoods, black children were required to attend one of three nearby white schools in the county.

THROUGH THE TUNNEL is a story of how ordinary people were figured out how to live with that change. Coach Eddie Shannon and Henry Lawrence talk about that first year of integration and how it went. They also remember the school that's gone, Lincoln High, with a feeling of ardent love and reverence, which has endured for over forty years since the day its doors were forever closed.

FACEing MENTAL ILLNESS: THE ART OF **ACCEPTANCE** traces the course of yearlong project conducted in Sarasota. Florida that was aimed at reducina bias against individuals with mental illness, eliminating the stiama associated with a mental health



diagnosis, and building a more supportive, inclusive community. As participants create artwork exploring their illnesses and share their stories of challenge and recovery in weekly newspaper articles, we see residents coalesce in support of an isolated and misunderstood population and take up the cause of acceptance and advocacy as their own.



LOVE MEANS ZERO

At eighty-six, famed tennis coach Nick Bollettieri is a living legend. At his academy near Bradenton, Florida, he raised a generation of champions: Courier, Seles, Agassi, and many more. 



This program is in partnership with Embracing Our Differences, a local nonprofit that focuses on diversity and the arts in our community.



YEAR-ROUND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS



The mission of the Education Department is to inspire, educate, and entertain students by promoting creativity, collaboration, and community involvement.

Beyond our annual Festival, The SFF Sarasota Film Festival Education Department offers a number of scholastic programs. Applying the State of Florida Educational standards, students from elementary school through college participate in programming designed to encourage thoughtful citizenship and creativity through film literacy.

Operating both in and out of local classrooms, our department has reached over 17,000 students through filmmaking, film review, screenwriting, and movie screening programs.

CLASSROOM CRITIC

We believe it is important that students learn how to "read" films just as they learn to read books. The Classroom Critic program offers an in-class curriculum that centers on developing critical-thinking skills in film review and screenwriting. The new program this year includes an introduction to film language and key filmmaking tactics, using age-appropriate film clips from a variety of sources in American and international film history.

JUNIOR JURY

By being on the Junior Jury, high school students learn about film analysis, cultural and media literacy, and critical review. The program is highly competitive, with participants chosen based upon the applications and personal statement responses.


Junior Jurors meet with the professional SFF Jury to learn the process of critically reviewing the efficacy and artistic value of submitted films as well as to get insights about careers in the film industry.

GENDER IN MEDIA

In this partnership with the Geena Davis Institute on Gender in Media, young boys and girls learn to evaluate the ways gender roles are portrayed in TV and film. These lesson plans help students to be conscious media consumers as they learn about gender representations and stereotypes in the media and the world ground them.

Get Gone, the debut album by Shreveport, Louisiana natives SERATONES, makes a strong case that this little-known corner of the country is musically fertile ground. Serving up a combination of Southern musicality, garage rock ferocity, and general badassery, Seratones create music that the band calls "an expression of freedom that's all about waking people up," and defies definition. The pure emotion of soul (singer A.J. Haynes found her voice in a Baptist Church at the age of 6), the grit and energy of punk,

and the swagger of swing and blues coalesce into an experience that can only be described as... Seratones.

TANGINA STONE

Combining elements of soul, rock, electronic and r&b, TANGINA STONE has been championed by The FADER, Pigeons & Planes, CBC Radio Canada, Noisey, among others, as a universal breath of fresh air. Her debut album,

Elevate (2017), featuring Nelly Furtado and Liana Banks, peaked at #27 on the iTunes Top 200 R&B albums chart and at #44 on Apple Music Japan. Her music can be heard in nationally syndicated television shows on VH1 and TV One, and at her acclaimed performances around the globe.



DJ WHITNEY

DJ WHITNEY Bibeau kicked off her musical career as onair host with Source Life Radio, where she would ultimately become the station's first female DJ. Perfecting her craft by curating sounds at venues

all over NYC, in addition to working with major companies like Reebok and BMW, Whitney is the official DJ for singer and songwriter Tangina Stone. She has dedicated her career to empowering women and girls interested in breaking into the male-dominated world of deejaying and music production.



PYLON REENACTMENT SOCIETY

PYLON is considered to be

one of the most influential bands of the Athens, GA, alternative rock boom in the late 1970's and early 1980's along with The B-52's and R.E.M. Fronted by Vanessa Briscoe (now Briscoe Hay), whose inimitable vocal textures and phrasing defined the band's sound for most listeners, Pylon's music draws from the deepest pockets of post-punk and No Wave to create a compulsively danceable sound that is as cerebral as it is visceral. They toured with Gang of Four, U2, Mission of Burma, REM, and Talking Heads, until their celebrated history coming to an abrupt end in 2009 with the death of iconic guitarist Randy Bewley, reincarnating in reverence under the moniker Pylon Reenactment Society.

The Brothers Cummings Film team wrote and directed the feature, BLOOD IN THE WATER, a psychological thriller starring Willa Holland, now on Netflix and NINE OUT OF TEN (aka Blue Blood), a Noir starring Roy Scheider. Orson lives and works out of Southampton, NY and New York City.



DAVID EDELSTEIN

David Edelstein is the chief movie critic for New York Magazine (and its culture site, Vulture) and NPR's Fresh Air, as well as a commentator on film and television for CBS Sunday Morning.
