Understanding That We Don't Understand

A fter hearing tragic news, there are people who may verbalize their questions while others may just think about

the fact that so many people are suffering. "Why is Hashem doing this?" they wonder. The Ibn Ezra, who was born in the year 1089 in a Spanish province, had a very difficult life. He had such a hard time making a living that he is quoted as saying, "With my mazel, if I went into the Chevra Kadi-

sha business, people would be guaranteed to stop dving."

One day the Ibn Ezra was approached by a few individuals who complained about their lack of understanding of Hashem's ways. They couldn't understand how Hashem allowed certain things to happen. The Ibn Ezra told them he would help them

understand, if they first listen to a story. Two people were travelling together. Reuven had three loaves of bread with him while Shimon had two loaves of bread. Levi joined them and he had no bread at all. When it was time to stop to eat, Reuven and Shimon invited Levi to partake in their meal and they all ate the five loaves together. Upon finishing, Levi put down five gold coins and said, "This is payment for the bread I ate. Divide it between yourselves as you see fit." Levi then left. Reuven and Shimon started arguing about how to split up the money. Reuven said that he deserves three gold coins and his friend should receive two gold coins. Shimon claimed that since Levi ate from both of them equally,

> he deserves two and a half coins and so does Reuven.


> The two travellers arrived at the next town and went to the Rov with their question of how to divvy up the five gold coins. The Rov paskened that

the one who had three loaves gets four gold coins and the one with two loaves gets only one coin. Upon hearing this psak, the people who came to the Ibn Ezra burst out laughing. They said, "The person with three loaves was only asking for three gold coins and he was awarded four gold coins?!" The Ibn Ezra responded to them by saying, "You can't even explain a simple question like this and yet you expect to be able to understand the cheshbonos of Hashem?"

The Ibn Ezra turned to his visitors and told them, "I will explain the Rov's psak to you. Since there were five loaves of bread divided by three people, we can break the bread down into fifteen parts, where each person ate five parts. Reuven, who contributed three breads, owned a total of nine parts. He ate five parts himself, and gave away four parts to Levi. Shimon, who contributed two breads, which was comprised of six parts, ate five parts. He therefore gave Levi only one part of his bread. Hence, the psak of four gold coins to Reuven and one gold coin to Shimon.

It is impossible to explain something unless one has all the facts and factors in hand. Since we do not know everything the Ribono Shel Olam knows, we can understand one thing: that it is impossible to understand the ways of Hashem.





OS POWERBALD KOSHER? By: Rabbi Gil Student

he recent frenzy over the billion dollar-plus Powerball prize raises serious question about the a halachic and moral viability of lotteries. There is more to discuss than just the greed, which we addressed in the past. We must remember that until relatively recently, lotteries were illegal in most states and were instead run by organized crime as the "numbers racket." Lotteries are a form of gambling that particularly impact poor communities, the people who can least afford it. Powerball-and lottery in general-raises important issues that may bring into question common features of our community. Since, as we shall see shortly, Rav Ovadiah Yosef forbids buying lottery tickets, how can our schools and shuls hold raffles and Chinese auctions? What message are we sending when we elevate gambling into an acceptable pastime, when yeshivos even reportedly buy tickets for their faculty?

I. GAMBLING IN THE TALMUD

The primary source in the Mishnah (Sanhedrin 24b) is a statement that dice players are invalid witnesses, and a debate in the Gemara over why this is the case. Rav Sheishes says that the problem is asmakhta, a failure to truly commit to paying a bet because of a reliance on winning. Rami Bar Chama disagrees and says that the problem with a professional gambler is the lack of a job and a sense of the value of money.

According to Rav Sheishes, any time someone places a bet with an expectation of winning (even if unrealistic), he does not really expect to pay the bet. Therefore, if he loses the bet, anyone who takes his money is guilty of stealing. According to Rami Bar Chama, this either is not theft at all or not sufficiently obvious theft to invalidate someone as a witness. Rami Bar Chama only invalidates as a witness professional gamblers.

Another Talmudic passage (Shabbos 149b) gives a person special permission to divide food at a Shabbos meal to his children with a lottery (obviously without any money). You may not even do this during the week to those outside the family because it constitutes gambling. Tosafos (as loc., sv. mai) say that we do not follow this Gemara but the codes quote it. Others suggest that the concern is with a potluck meal, in which everyone contributes. If they contribute expecting to win a big piece but receive a small piece, there may be a problem of asmakhta.

II. LOTTERIES AND WINNINGS

Regarding dice playing and gambling in general, medieval authorities disagree whether we follow Rav Sheishes or Rami Bar Chama. The Shulchan Arukh (Choshen Mishpat 370:3) follows the Rambam who rules like Rav Sheishes, effectively forbidding gambling. The Rema (Choshen Mishpat 207:13, 370:3) follows Tosafos who rule like Rami Bar Chama, thereby permitting occasional gambling. It would seem, then, that Ashkenazim who follow the Rema may but lottery tickets while Sephardim, who follow the Shulchan Arukh, may not. That is how Rav Ovadiah Yosef (Yabi'a Omer, vol. 7 Choshen Mishpat 6) rules, although he adds that Ashkenazim should also refrain. Many others disagree regarding lotteries.

Gedaliah Schwartz (Sha'arei Rav Gedulah, p. 312) approvingly quotes a responsum by Rav Ovadiah Hodaya (Yaskil Avdi, vol. 8 Yoreh De'ah 5:3) in which this Sephardic authority distinguishes between people betting against each other and a lottery. In a classic case of gambling, one person wins and the other loses. It is as makhta if the person who pays had assumed that he will win. In a lottery, the payout will always happen. Therefore, whoever runs the lottery and pays the winnings does not have asmakhta and even a Sephardi can buy a ticket. Rav Hodaya explains that this is why Jews have historically held lotteries to raise funds for charities.

Rav Ovadiah Yosef (ibid., par. 5) quotes this responsum and counters that, in a lottery, the winnings come from the proceeds of tickets sold. If any purchaser of a ticket assumed he would win, then the money he contributed to the pot is stolen because of the purchaser's asmakhta. He adds that Rav Yosef Chaim of Baghdad (Responsa Rav Pe'alim, vol. 2 Yoreh De'ah no. 30) explains the historical lotteries in that the winning was an object (like in a Chinese auction) and not a portion of the proceeds from the tickets sold.

Rav Ya'akov Ariel (Be-Ohalah Shel Torah, vol. 1 no. 111) offers a similar approach as Rav Hodaya. Without quoting any of the recent literature, Rav Ariel suggests Rav Yosef's objection and counters that lottery is different because people pay in advance. When you make a bet and do not put money down in advance, you may be relying on your winning the bet. But if you pay in advance, you clearly recognize the possibility of losing. This seems to be the view of Rabbeinu Tam, followed by the Rema (Choshen Mishpat 207:13). I'm not sure that it would help Sephardim.

III. LOTTERIES AS INVESTMENTS

Rav Moshe Sternbuch (Teshuvos Ve-Hanhagos, vol. 4 no. 311) offers a different explanation of the mechanics of a lottery. He sees buying a lottery ticket as he purchase of a good, not a wager. Before the drawing, you can even sell the ticket for its original purchase price. Therefore, you are effectively investing in a fund that will use some of the proceeds to cover expenses and pay the remainder as a dividend to specific, randomly chosen investors. Rav Menashe Klein (Mishneh Halakhos, vol. 15 no. 176) follows



a similar approach, as does Rav Aharon Lichtenstein (Daf Kesher 1:83-85, cited in Rav Chain Jachter, Gray Matter, vol. 1, pp. 129-130). This approach allows Sephardim to purchase lottery tickets, as well.

Rav Sternbuch (ibid.) also suggests that the odds of winning a lottery are so low that no purchaser assumes he will win. Therefore, there is no asmakhta. Additionally, there is no competition between two (or multiple) players, like in a card or dice game. Rather, this is a completely random process. This seems to fit in with the view of Rashi (Sanhedrin 24b sv. kol) that there is no asmakhta when the wager is on something random that involves no skill.

Rav Joseph B. Soloveitchik (cited by Rav Jachter, ibid., p. 129) points out that these concerns do not apply to charity fundraising. Because giving money to tzedakah is a mitzvah, there is an assumption that people give willingly. Therefore, asmakhta does not apply to charitable pledges and donations (Shulchan Arukh, Yoreh De'ah 258:10). This means that Sephardim may participate in raffles and Chinese auctions for shuls and schools.

IV. MORAL CONCERNS

However, some authorities have gone beyond the technicalities of theft when it comes to lotteries and gambling. The Rivash (Responsa, no. 432) decries gambling as "disgusting, abominable and repulsive." Rav Ovadiah Yosef (ibid.) points out that many poor people spend money they cannot afford to lose on lottery tickets. They think about the highly improbable dream of winning rather than the reality of supporting their families. Lotteries prey on the poor, deepening their poverty and often leading to addiction.

For many people, gambling is a serious addiction. Lotteries prey on those with addictions and deepen the financial troubles of those already suffering. When millions of people lose a lottery, as just happened with the Powerball, we can focus our attention on the dreams of many and the newfound fortune of the rare winners. Or we can use this as a teaching moment about the millions of people who threw away money at a statistically negligible dream, about the negative social effects of government-sponsored gambling, and the addictions facing many within our own communities. I do not think that the Rivash would consider Powerball kosher.





Hashem's Outstretched Arm By Rabbi Moshe Meir Weiss

he Torah informs us that Hashem saved Klal Yisroel with a "Yad HaChazakah u'Vizroah Netuyah -- A strong Hand and an Outstretched Arm." Of course these terms are anthropomorphic in nature for, as we know, Hashem has no corporeal form. It is our job to understand what each metaphor is meant to convey.

The Yad HaChazakah refers specifically to the plague of the first born with its devastating impact of death to every single Egyptian palace, home, and hovel. It also refers to the mighty feat of compassion manifested when Hashem took out the B'nei Yisroel, though they had already sunk to the forty-ninth degree of contamination. Indeed, it is this attribute of mercy that we remember twice a day when we mention the

Exodus, always recalling that no matter how low a person has fallen, he or she can always turn around as did the B'nei Yisroel from their lowly state in Egypt where, in a mere seven weeks, they merited seeing the Divine Splendor at Har Sinai.

But, what does the term 'Vizroah HaNetuyah' come to convey? This is not simply a study on how to define the words. In the Lesheim Yichud which we say before putting on our Tefillin, we state, "Al hayad lezichron zeroa hanetuya," we put the Tefillin on the, "Upper arm to remember Hashem's outstretched Arm." Thus we see that the meaning of 'zeroa netuya' is one of the primary reasons that we are supposed to contemplate daily when wearing the Tefillin on our arm. It behooves us, therefore, to research what this phrase is meant to convey.

The Ramban and other Rishonim explain that, once the plagues started, Hashem's protection over us never ceased. Indeed, even between the major plagues, Hashem peppered the Egyptians with other problems so that they wouldn't trouble us further. Thus, these commentators are explaining the 'zeroa hanetuya' to mean that Hashem, once he started the redemption phase, never put down His Arm of protection from over us.

There is a beautiful Chassidic interpretation of the Outstretched Arm. They explain that this refers to the miracle of Basya's arm that telescoped four hundred amos as she attempted to retrieve Moshe Rabbeinu in his little ark from the waters of the marsh. This miracle indeed allowed Moshe Rabbeinu to be saved and the redemption to begin. In a similar beautiful fashion, they explain that this is also the intent of what we say in our morning prayers, "Vayar Yisroel es haYad Hagedolah asher assah Hashem b'Mitzrayim -- Yisroel saw the Big Hand which Hashem made in Egypt." What Big Hand did Hashem make in Egypt? Now we understand! It refers to Basya's hand that became greatly enlarged in order to bring the greatest of Jews to the shore and begin the great miracle of the Exodus. What a beautiful thought to have in mind when wearing Tefillin each day!

The Medrash HaGodol defines Zeroah Hanetuya as the miracle of the Red Sea that includes both the devastating end of the nine million Egyptians who drowned there and the miraculous escape of Klal Yisroel through the perilous and tempestuous waters of the Red Sea. This definition fits in very well with the fact that the Tefillin refer specifically to the Outstretched Arm for it is the miracle of the Yam Suf that is the climax of the entire series of miracles of the Exodus. It is only then that we were finally and completely saved from our tormentors of almost two centuries.

But there is much more here than at first meets the eye. Because of what merit did the Red Sea split? The Medrash informs us that initially the Red Sea was reticent to interrupt its natural behavior. In Tehillim, and as we say in Hallel, Dovid HaMelech poses the question, "Mah raah hayam she'yanus --What did the sea see that it fled?" The Medrash answers this with a very short statement. "Nas mipnei haNas -- It fled from before the one that fled." This means that when the Sea saw the Jews carrying the coffin of Yosef and saw his power of breaking his nature and not succumbing to the powerful temptations and seductions of the wife of Potifar, it too reacted by going against its nature and splitting its water.

Thus we see that the miracle of the Yam Suf was achieved through



the righteous ability of conquering the temptations of one's heart. This is exactly the intent that we are taught to have when we put on the Tefillin upon our arm. As the Lesheim Yichud continues, "Al haYad lezichron zeroa hanetuva, u'kneged haleiv l'shabeid b'zeh taivos u'machashavos libeinu la'avodoso -- ... And towards the heart to control with it the desires and emotions of our heart's to Hashem's service." Thus, it all fits together! The Tefillin on the upper biceps recalls Hashem's Outstretched Arm at the Red Sea that we earned through Yosef's moral strength in combating his passions. And this is what we commit ourselves to attempt to emulate when we wear our Tefillin daily opposite our heart.

This further fits in beautifully with another Medrash. The posuk says, "Vahamavim lahem chomah, miminom um'smolam -- The waters were like a wall on their right and their left." The Medrash points out that the word chomah is written defectively - without a vav. It therefore can be read "cheimah" which means anger. Homiletically therefore, this verse conveys the meaning that the waters of the Yam Suf were raging against the Jews in order to drown them, for, as the Angel said, they too worship idolatry like the Egyptians. But, the posuk concludes that they were spared because of that which was to their right and to their left. To their right refers to the Torah, which Hashem gave from His Right Hand, and to their left refers to the Tefillin, which we put upon our left hand.

Thus, we find that the Tefillin, which we put on to remember the miracle of the Red Sea, was indeed one of the reasons why we merited the miracle in the first place. The Gemora in Menachos tell us that the posuk, "Hashem Alechem yich'yu," refers to putting on Tefillin. In the merit of our donning the Tefillin and all our other mitzvahs, may we be zoche to good health happiness and everything wonderful.







IDF DEMOLISHES HOMES, SYNAGOGUE DEEMED ILLEGAL IN SAMARIA Tazpit

amaria (TPS) – Units of the Israeli Border Police and the Civil istration released a Administration carried out multiple home destructions on Thursday, January 14 in Jewish communities deemed illegal by the Israeli government.

The first demolition took place during the early morning hours in Givat ried out on an illegal Menachem near Nahliel, a ultra-Orthodox community of around seven hundred residents in the Binyamin region, near the Arab villages of Beitillu and Deir Ammar.

Malachi Hefer, a 17-year-old inhabitant of a destroyed home claimed in an interview with Tazpit Press Service (TPS) that the Border Police and Civil Administration came to the area without presenting any demolition warrant.

"They began destroying my house while damaging olive trees owned by Palestinians," Hefer said. However, despite his claims, intentional damage caused to any other property by the IDF has not been verified.

The Civil Adminstatement reporting its own version of how events transpired.

"This morning the demolition was carhome built without permits on privately owned land. The demolition was enforced in accordance with appropriate or-

ders which were obtained prior to the against the inhabitants of the land. It implementation," the statement read.

Hefer expressed his resolve, however, to begin rebuilding the dismantled construction. "In the next few hours I will start rebuilding the house. We won't give in to the destructive and weak policies of (Defense Minister) Moshe Ya'alon," he told TPS.

Later on in the morning, police entered the community of Geulat Zion

in Samaria near Shilo, with several bulldozers and heavy equipment in order to evacuate and demolish the community buildings.

Amishav Melet, a resident of the community said that "the evacucontinues ation the war waged by government the

is the government's responsibility to build new communities, not to support their destruction," he said.

Shortly after, the Civilian Administration reported that the police had demolished two illegally built structures, including a temporary synagogue, in the outpost of Maoz Ester near to Kokhav HaShahar in the Binyamin region.

and rearing of an exceptional human being who would become the

leader of Bnei Yisroel. We learn that the child was fed by his mother for the first two years of his life. Thereafter, the daughter of Pharaoh raised him. She is the one who gave him the name, Moshe.

The Midrash Rabba says that we learn from this posuk what a great reward awaits those that are "Gomlei Chessed" (do kindness.) Despite the fact that Moshe actually possessed many names, the name that the Torah uses when referring to him is Moshe. Hashem also always referred to him as Moshe.

We learn that the name Moshe was given because "he was pulled out of the water." The name Moshe actually implies that he pulled someone else out of the water. It would seem that the name should have been Moshuy which would mean he was pulled out **Rabbi Berach Steinfeld is a noted Do**

Moshe!

of the water.

One explanation for the name actually being Moshe could be that Pharaoh's daughter davened that the same way this baby was saved from his trouble; so too, when others will be in trouble, this child should be able to help out others. She said a prophecy without even realizing it. We see that Moshe helped the Yiddin time and time again as the leader of Bnai Yisroel during their difficult times; but



most of all, he took them out of the Yam Suf (he literally took them out of the water.)

Another explanation may be that as a reward for the daughter of Pharaoh rescuing Moshe from the water, Moshe will pull her out of Gehinom. The Gemara in Sota says that when the daughter of Pharaoh was going to the Nile River, she was on the way to cleanse herself from the tumah of Avoda Zora. That is why she called him Moshe; because he will save her from Gehinom.

A third reason for this specific name is in connection to the miracle that occurred when Moshe was saved. Pharaoh's daughter reached out to get the baby in the water and she saw that her hand stretched miraculously in order to be able to reach Moshe. This was such a phenomenon, that it appeared in her eyes as if Moshe actually pulled her hand to him. That is why she named him Moshe; as if he actually pulled her.


In conclusion, we learn that one good turn brings another. Good leads to good. One never knows to what extent a chessed can help another.



"AD KAN" PROMISES TO REVEAL MORE DISTURBING MATERIAL ON ISRAELI LEFT-WING GROUPS

he right-wing activists of the Ad Kan group, who secretly recorded radical Israeli leftist Ezra Nawi saving that he helps Palestinian special forces kill Arabs who sell land to Jews, plan to publish further evidence of inhumane activities carried out by left-wing NGOs. Nawi, 63, has long been regarded a prominent human rights activist for the Palestinians.

"The documentary aired last week on Channel 2 is just the beginning. We have more materials on Ezra Nawi, as well as on B'Tselem and other leftwing NGOs," Ad Kan activist, Liran Weiss told Tazpit Press Service (TPS).

details yet, but all the materials we have, will be published within the next several weeks," said Weiss.

The documentary, which featured footage recorded by right-wing activists posing as leftists who managed to infiltrate left-wing NGOs, was aired on the Israeli television network Channel 2 on an investigative journalism show called Uvda (Fact) last week

on January 7.

An Ad Kan activist, who went by the pseudonym "Arik," managed to win the trust of well-known left-wing radical Ezra Nawi, who is active in the south Hebron Hills and in the organization, Ta'ayush, an Arab and Jewish political activist group. Nawi confided to the Ad Kan activist that he works to turn in Arabs, who want to sell land to Jews, to the Palestinian Authority security forces. "I give their pictures and phone numbers to the Preventative Security Forces," he says in footage aired on Uvda.

When asked by "Arik" what the "We are not ready to reveal more security forces do Palestinian land dealers selling land to Jews, Nawi answers, "they kill them, but first they torture."

The Palestinian Authority con-




siders selling land to Jews a capital offense that is punishable by death. The documentary also shows an activist from B'Tselem working together with Nawi in his efforts to turn in Palestinian land dealers to the Palestinian Authority.

The documentary drew backlash from Israeli government officials. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said on his Facebook page that the report "unmasked radicals among us who are driven by hatred of the settlements to the point of delivering innocents for torture and execution", and that "those who encourage murder cannot continue to hide behind the pretense of caring for human rights."

Ad Kan has filed a police complaint against Ezra Nawi, providing all their recordings and findings.

According to Liran Weiss, Ad Kan (Hebrew for was officially registered last year, although its activities started earlier. The materials exposing Israeli left-wing organisations were collected over a three-year period.

MORE THAN THREE MILLION TOURISTS VISITED ISRAEL IN 2015 Written by Michael Bachner/TPS on January 11, 2016

total of 3.1 million tourists visited Israel in the year 2015, according to figures released on Monday, January 11 by the Israel Central Bureau of Statistics. Additionally. an all-time record was set in the number of Israeli departures abroad with almost six million departures.

The number of tourist arrivals represents a 4% decrease compared that Russia is facing an economic to 2014. The number of incoming tourists gradually increased between January and September, but the number plummeted from October to December due to the security situation caused by the upsurge in terror attacks by Palestinians.

"This past year was challenging because we were still recovering from Operation Protective Edge," Tourism Ministry Spokesperson Anat Shihor-Aronson told Tazpit Press Service (TPS) last week, referring to the Gaza operation in the summer of 2014. "But in 2015, representing an increase of we were also very successful as we almost reached the numbers we had in 2013."

The largest number of incoming and August. tourists in 2015 came from the United States with 637,000 arrivals, representing a 2% increase compared to the 2014 statistic.

A total of 415,000 tourists visited from Russia, representing a 25% decrease compared to the previous year. "We have to take into consideration crisis so we are still increasing our budget in regards to promoting Israel as a Russian tourist destination," said Shilor-Aronson to TPS.

Other countries serving as the origin for the largest numbers of tourists visiting Israel in 2015 were France, Germany, the UK, Ukraine and Italy, respectively.

Meanwhile, the number of Israelis traveling abroad set an all-time record. A total of 5.9 million departures by Israeli citizens were recorded 15% compared to 2014. More than a quarter of all departures were made during the summer months of July

More than 3 million Israeli citizens traveled abroad during the year, representing a 12% increase over the previous year with 1.2 million of them departing the country more than once.

The CBS estimated the sharp increase in the number of departures to be a result of the introduction of lowcost flights in Israel and a result of the high value of the Israeli currency (the shekel) compared to the US dollar and the Euro.



HIKIND, NYS DOT HOLD 'WORKING LUNCH' MEETING OVER 3-YEAR \$8.5M OCEAN PARKWAY PROJECT Addresses Potential Issues with Ocean Parkway Construction

Brooklyn, NY, January 11, 2016 ... Assemblyman Dov Hikind (D-Brooklyn) sat down last week for a productive lunch meeting pertaining to a three-year project on Ocean Parkway to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety. In meeting with Charles O'Shea. Director of Government Affairs and External Relations for the New York State Department of Transportation, Assemblyman Hikind also raised potential issues regarding construction plans, and how it could affect residents of the community and commuters who use Ocean Parkway.

"This is a major thoroughfare that thousands of people use on a daily basis," Assemblyman Hikind said, "so we need to ensure residents of our community that this process will go as smoothly as possible."

The construction project, slated to begin in the spring of 2016, will feature updated traffic signals, signage and ramps to improve pedestrian and cyclist safety, as well as traffic flow. To conclude construction, Ocean Parkway will undergo a concrete pavement makeover instead of asphalt, providing for a much sturdier and long-lasting thoroughfare.

After meeting with O'Shea, Hikind offered suggestions to further improve the traffic flow along Ocean Parkway. "Through looking over the construction plans for Ocean Parkway, there are certainly some things we can address moving forward," said Hikind, who expressed gratitude for the meeting. "It is our hope that with the help from the New York State Department of Transportation, we can help make traveling along Ocean Parkway a much more pleasant experience for all parties involved."



Emunas Chachamim – Trusting Our Torah Sages

The Torah teaches us, "Lo sasur min hadavar asher yagidu l'cha yamin u'smol – Do not turn away from what they (the Torah sages) tell you, to the right or to the left." This is the primary directive in the Torah that teaches us to have unswerving obedience to the words of the Torah greats of our generation.

Rashi elaborates on the phraseology, '...to the right or to the left,' saying that even if a Torah sage instructs you that your right is left or that your left is right, you should obey and believe him. On the surface, this comment is very difficult to understand. How is one expected to listen blindly to someone who tells him that his right is left or vice versa? How can the Torah expect an intelligent human being to accomplish this?

The great Rav Isser Zalman Meltzer, Zt''l, Zy''a, gives a profound elucidation of this Rashi. He explains that Rashi does not say that we should listen if the Torah sage says that day is night or night is day – or that black is white and white is black, etc. Rather, following the lead of the verse, Rashi deliberately chooses the example of right and left for, if I am standing opposite you then my right hand is on your left side. So in reality, whether it is right or left is really a question of the angle from which you are looking at the hand.

This is exactly what the posuk is trying to convey. There are times when we might be very certain about something – only because we are looking at it from our perspective. But the Torah sage can look at it from a totally different angle, thereby seeing the opposite conclusion from what we had thought.

An example of this powerful concept is what the Gemora teaches us, "Binyan yeladim stirah, vistiras zekeinim binyan – The building of the young is sometimes really demolishing, while demolishment done by elders is in reality constructive building." In a dramatic way, the Gemora teaches us that there are times when youth, who have not yet seen enough of life and are not thoroughly saturated with Torah, think that what they are doing is constructive and commendable, when in reality it is destructive and sometimes disastrous. On the flip side, when the sages sometimes put a halt to advancement – and to the eagerness of youth, it looks like they are taking a step backward. In reality they are building and safeguarding the future.

It is all a question of perspective, and the Torah is teaching us that the Torah sage has the clarity of vision, broadened by his Torah knowledge and by the fact that the sage is trained to look ahead. As we are taught, "Eizehu chacham? Haro'eh es hanolad – Who is wise? He who is able to see ahead." This synthesis of Torah wisdom and acute foresight enables the Torah sage to see things differently, and it is this wisdom that the Torah is instructing us to follow at all times.

In its preface, the sefer Chayei Olam writes that the generations began to deteriorate terribly when emunas chachamim started to diminish. And the saintly Chasam Sofer, in his responsa [6:56], writes that it is very important to praise and aggrandize Torah sages to our family.

Let me share with you one story that illustrates vividly how important it is to adhere strictly to the words of our sages. The great Rav Moshe Feinstein, Zt''l, Zy''a, was a rabbi in the Russian town of Luban. Also living in the town was a very wicked Jew who was a moser, an informer. During this man's lifetime, he wreaked all kinds of havoc for the Jewish community.

As this informer was lying on his deathbed, he summoned the Chevra Kadisha, the Jewish burial society, and made a very unusual request. He said that as he was about to leave the world and face his final reckoning, he felt terrible remorse for the horrible things he had perpetrated against his Jewish brothers. He therefore asked the Chevra Kadisha to bury him like a donkey, with his coffin standing upright in the ground instead of lying down. In this way he hoped that this disgrace



and indignity would be an atonement for his dreadful sins. He then made the Chevra Kadisha members sign a document stating that they would bury him in this unusual fashion.


The Chevra Kadisha actually thought it was a very good idea that such a sinner should be publicly shamed and disgraced. It could be a lesson for others not to follow in his wicked ways. However, nothing was done in the town without the approval of the Mora D'Asra, Rav Feinstein, so they went to the Rav to get his permission.

Rav Moshe adamantly refused to agree. He said that we are taught in Shulchan Aruch that we don't bury a human like a donkey and therefore we may not do so, even to a rasha. Although the members of the Chevra Kadisha were disappointed, they buried him in the normal fashion.

Two days later, the dreaded NKVD – the anti-Semitic secret police – came to the Chevra Kadisha and demanded the informant's grave be opened. Having no choice, they exhumed the body. The Russian official looked, shrugged with surprise, and told them to rebury the body. He went on his way.

It was only then that the Jews realized the horrendous plot of the dying man. He wanted to get the Jewish community in trouble – even with his dead body, and had informed the Russian authorities that the Jews, to get even with him, would bury him like a donkey. It was only because the Jewish community sought the wisdom of its Rav and followed his words that it was saved from a terrible calamity.



The Source of Shalom Aleichem By: Rabbi Gil Student

ontrary to common opinion, the traditional Jewish greeting of "Shalom aleichem" is not a wish for peace. It is a fulfillment of the ancient enactment to greet others with God's name, using the appellation of Shalom to refer to God. The Mishnah

(Berachos 54a) describes the establishment of this practice but leaves its origin ambiguous, resting in my opinion on a single letter in the text.

Many commentators assume that Boaz, the character from the biblical book of Rus, enacted this practice. Among them are Malbim (Rus

2:4) and Maharatz Chajes (Mevo HaTalmud ch. 10). However, I suggest that this historical attribution is based on only one of two possible readings.

The Mishnah states that "they" enacted the practice of greeting with God's name. The next statement in the Mishnah cites the verse in which Boaz greets his workers with "God be with you" (Ruth 2:4). Some read this as implying that Boaz was the first to establish this practice. However, this is not necessarily the case.

The Rivan (Makos 23a u-she'eilas) offers SV. two explanations for this enactment: either it established an obligation for this otherwise permissible practice or it established permission for this otherwise forbidden practice. According to the latter approach, it is forbidden to say God's name in vain. However, due to concern for interpersonal harmony or in order to decrease the amount of theft by bringing God's name into regular conversation, "they" established that people use it in formal greetings as a proactive measure to prevent

loss of Torah. This would explain why the Mishnah continues with the classical exegesis permitting violating the Torah in order to preserve it.

According to this reading, the Boaz precedent is highly significant. He would have been violating a prohibition if not for and the Rivan's first interpretation, we no longer have any indication that Boaz instituted this practice. If

the h i s Rambam. in commentary to this Mishnah, reads the text differently. The Rambam posits that saying God's name in a greeting is entirely permissible. The verse about Boaz is cited as proof that this activity is unproblematic. (And the subsequent discussion of violating the Torah in order to preserve it is really about the importance of enactments in general.) The Rambam seems follow the Rivan's first to interpretation. Greeting with God's name is always permissible and this enactment turned it into a requirement, not for any emergency reason but because it is simply a good thing.

> texts have it "and they enacted" and some have it without the prefix meaning "and." If the "and" truly belongs, then the Mishnah implies that Ezra's court also instituted the greeting enactment.

The Vilna Shas has the "and" but the Kaufman manuscript does not. Rav Yosef Kafach, in his edition of the Mishnah with Rambam's commentary, indicates that some manuscripts he used has the "and" but his grandfather's did not.

If not Ezra then some post-Judges era court enacted that we greet each other with God's name. Thousands of years later, "Shalom aleichem" is still a frequently heard greeting in traditional Jewish communities.




