

Senator Shelby's Pork Parade

Senator Richard Shelby (R-AL) has extensively earmarked federal dollars to companies and organizations represented by his former staffers. Eight staffers to Sen. Shelby left his office to join or create lobbying firms: Ray Cole, Stewart Hall, Richard Roberts, Wesley Ryan Welch, Amelia Blackwood, Phil Rivers, Jennifer Bendall and Geoffrey Gradler. Since Fiscal Year 2008, Sen. Shelby has earmarked \$266,524,500 to clients of former staffers. These lobbying firms and clients have donated at least \$999,471 to his campaign committee and leadership PAC since 1999. Lobbying firms employing former staffers of Sen. Shelby have collected at least \$10,075,000 in lobbying fees from clients represented by the former staffers. Additionally, CREW uncovered connections between Sen. Shelby and former hill staffers, including a former defense appropriations staffer who now lobbies on behalf of companies that have received Shelby earmarks and one of the senator's previous chiefs of staff who founded a NASA contracting firm.

Ray Cole

Ray Cole served as Sen. Shelby's State Director from 1993 to 1999, he was also Sen. Shelby's campaign manager during the 1998 election.² Upon leaving his position with Sen. Shelby, Mr. Cole joined the lobbying firm Van Scoyoc Associates, where he is now vice president.³ Mr. Cole and Sen. Shelby may have parted ways, but their activities suggest they have not severed all ties.

Since 1999, employees of Van Scoyoc Associates have donated \$167,132 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC.⁴ Sen. Shelby earmarked or requested \$14,222,500 to companies and organizations represented by Ray Cole through Van Scoyoc Associates in Fiscal Years 2008, 2009, 2010⁵ and 2011.⁶

The following companies and organizations have hired Mr. Cole to lobby on their behalf and have received earmarks from Sen. Shelby.

The University of Alabama System has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$1,260,000 in lobbying fees since 2007. Sen. Shelby has earmarked \$175,559,000 for The University of Alabama System since FY 2008. Employees of the University of Alabama System have contributed at least \$153,321 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC since 1999. 9

Southern Research Institute has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$400,000 in lobbying fees since 2007. Sen. Shelby has earmarked \$3,440,000 to Southern Research Institute since FY 2008. Southern Research Institute also hired another former staffer to Sen. Shelby, Stewart Hall. In 1999, the institute hired Ogilvy Government Relations and Mr. Hall, an existing lobbyist for the firm, was placed on the account. From 1999 to 2003, Southern Research Institute paid Ogilvy Government Relations \$380,000 in lobbying fees.

Baldwin County Commission has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$430,000 in lobbying fees since 2007. ¹⁴ Sen. Shelby earmarked \$1,282,000 to the County Commission in FY 2008 and FY 2009. ¹⁵

MILTEC has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$400,000 in lobbying fees since 2007. ¹⁶ MILTEC is a subsidiary of Ducommun Incorporated, an aerospace and defense contractor. ¹⁷ MILTEC, however, is the company's only component that actively lobbies. Employees of Ducommun and MILTEC have donated \$75,900 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC since 1999. ¹⁸ Sen. Shelby earmarked \$1,680,000 to MILTEC in FY 2010. ¹⁹

St. Clair County Commission has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$210,000 in lobbying fees since 2007. Sen. Shelby earmarked \$164,500 to the County Commission in FY 2008.

City of Calera has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$85,000 in lobbying fees since 2008.²⁴ Sen. Shelby earmarked a combined \$341,000 to the city in FY 2008 and FY 2009. 25 The City of Calera also hired another former staffer to Sen. Shelby, Jennifer Bendall. In 2005, the city hired the Eris Group and Ms. Bendall began to lobby on the city's behalf. ²⁶ From 2005 to 2008, the City of Calera paid the Eris Group \$205,000 in lobbying fees.²⁷

City of Gadsden has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$260,000 in lobbying fees since 2007. 28 Sen. Shelby earmarked a combined \$800,500 to the city in FY 2008 and FY 2009. 29

City of Gulf Shores has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$230,000 in lobbying fees since 2007. Sen. Shelby earmarked a combined \$514,500 to the city in FY 2008 and FY 2009.

Southern Company has paid Van Scoyoc Associates \$940,000 in lobbying expenses since 2001.³² Southern Company is a significant donor to Sen. Shelby, since 1999 it has

contributed \$162,900 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC.³³ Sen. Shelby, however, has not earmarked to the company.

Francisco Collazo

Francisco Collazo is President and CEO of COLSA Corporation and the owner of Collazo Enterprises.³⁴ Collazo Enterprises has been one of Sen. Shelby's largest donors and in return COLSA Corporation has received substantial amounts of money in federal earmarks.³⁵

Since 1999, COLSA and Collazo Enterprises have contributed at least \$246,400 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC. ³⁶ Sen. Shelby has earmarked nearly \$21 million to the company since FY 2008. ³⁷

COLSA and Collazo Enterprises have hired the lobbying firms of three former staffers to Sen. Shelby. ³⁸ They include Stewart Hall formerly, with Ogilvy Government Relations and now founder of Crossroads Strategies, Richard Roberts with RR&G L.L.C. and Kraig Siracuse with Park Strategies.

Stewart Hall

Stewart Hall served as Sen. Shelby's legislative director from 1992 to 1996.³⁹ Mr. Hall left Sen. Shelby's office to create the lobbying firm, the Federalist Group, which merged with Ogilvy Government Relations; in 2010, Mr. Hall founded another government relations firm, Crossroads Strategies. ⁴⁰ Mr. Hall has lobbied on behalf of three groups to which Sen. Shelby has provided earmarks in Fiscal Years 2008, 2009, 2010 and for which he has quested earmarks in Fiscal Year 2011. In addition, employees of Ogilvy Government Relations donated \$27,000 to the senator's campaign committee and leadership PAC from 1999 to 2004.

In 1996, the year Mr. Hall created the Federalist Group, **COLSA** hired him to lobby on its behalf. COLSA paid the Federalist Group and Ogilvy Government Relations, \$1,080,000 in lobbying fees between 1999 and 2004. Sen. Shelby has earmarked nearly \$21 million to COLSA since FY 2008. Southern Company, an electric company and one of Sen. Shelby's largest donors, hired Mr. Hall and two other former staffers to lobby on its behalf. Since the first quarter of 2010, Southern Company paid Crossroads \$70,000 in lobbying expenses.⁴⁴

Southern Research Institute also hired Ogilvy Government Relations and lobbyist Mr. Hall. From 1999 to 2003, Southern Research Institute paid Ogilvy Government Relations \$380,000 in lobbying fees. ⁴⁵ Sen. Shelby has earmarked \$3,440,000 to Southern Research Institute since FY 2008. ⁴⁶

The connection between Sen. Shelby and Mr. Hall drew media attention in February 2010, when Sen. Shelby placed a blanket hold on 70 presidential nominees as a tactic to pass a \$35 billion earmark to **EADS**, another company for which Mr. Hall lobbied through Ogilvy

Government Relations.⁴⁷ Employee of EADS and Northrop Grumman have donated \$66,000 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC since 1999.⁴⁸

Richard Roberts

Richard Roberts served as Sen. Shelby's chief of staff from 1987 to 1990.⁴⁹ He left Sen. Shelby's staff to take a position as a Commissioner of the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission and he is now a partner at the lobbying firm RR&G L.L.C.⁵⁰ Mr. Roberts has lobbied on behalf of several organizations which have received earmarks from Sen. Shelby.

COLSA hired Mr. Roberts and RR&G in the first quarter of 2010.⁵¹ Since the first quarter of 2010, COLSA has paid \$10,000 in lobbying fees.⁵² Sen. Shelby requested a \$9.3 million earmark to COLSA in FY 2011.⁵³

Since 2008, **Frontier Technologies** has paid RR&G at least \$145,000 in lobbying fees.⁵⁴ Sen. Shelby requested a \$5,000,000 earmark for the company in FY 2011, in conjunction with Auburn University and University of Alabama Huntsville.⁵⁵

In 2009, **Auburn University College of Engineering** hired Mr. Roberts to lobby on its behalf and has paid RR&G at least \$30,000 in fees. ⁵⁶ Sen. Shelby requested \$15 million in earmarks to the University in FY 2011, \$5 million of which is in conjunction with Frontier Technologies and University of Alabama Huntsville-⁵⁷ notwithstanding the \$20,382,500 the Senator earmarked to Auburn University from FY 2008 to 2010. ⁵⁸

Wesley Ryan Welch

Wesley Ryan Welch served as Sen. Shelby's legislative assistant from 2002 to 2005 and legislative director from 2005 to 2007. ⁵⁹ Mr. Welch joined the lobbying firm Cauthen Forbes & Williams immediately after departing Sen. Shelby's office in 2007, he is currently senior vice president at the firm. ⁶⁰ Employees of Cauthen Forbes & Williams have donated \$21,918 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC since 2005. ⁶¹ Mr. Welch lobbies on behalf of three organizations for which Sen. Shelby secured earmarks in Fiscal Years 2008, 2009, 2010 and has requested earmarks for Fiscal Year 2011.

The Alabama District Attorneys Association and **Auburn University** hired Cauthen Forbes & Williams on the same day, February 27, 2008. 62 The Alabama District Attorneys

Amelia Blackwood

Amelia Blackwood served as a receptionist for Sen. Shelby from 2003 to 2005.⁶⁹ After leaving Sen. Shelby's office, Ms. Blackwood joined the lobbying firm Alexander Strategy Group, which is now defunct due to its controversial connections with former House Majority Leader Tom DeLay and convicted lobbyist Jack Abramoff.⁷⁰ While at Alexander Strategy Group, Ms. Blackwood lobbied on behalf of **Southern Company**, which paid the firm \$40,000 in lobbying expenses.⁷¹ In 2006, Ms. Blackwood joined the lobbying firm Polaris Consulting L.L.C. where she continued to lobby for Southern Company.⁷² Since 2006, Southern Company has paid Polaris \$440,000 in lobbying fees.⁷³

Ms. Blackwood is one of three former staffers to Sen. Shelby who now lobbies on behalf of Southern Company.⁷⁴ Southern Company recently hired Sen. Shelby's former aide Stewart

Shelby, but is one of Sen. Shelby's largest donors. Since 1999 the company has contributed \$162,900 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC.⁷⁹

Jennifer Bendall

Jennifer Bendall served as a political advisor to Sen. Shelby from 1986 to 1990, prior to working on the senator's campaign. ⁸⁵ In 2003, Ms. Bendall formed the lobbying firm Bartlett & Bendall which soon changed its name to the Eris Group. ⁸⁶ **The City of Calera**, Alabama hired Ms. Bendall and the Eris Group to lobby on its behalf from 2005 to 2007. Meanwhile the City of Calera also hired Ray Cole and Van Scoyoc Associates to lobby on its behalf. The City of Calera paid \$190,000 in lobbying fees to the Eris Group. ⁸⁷ Sen. Shelby earmarked a combined \$341,000 to the city in Fiscal Year 2008 and 2009. ⁸⁸

Ms. Bendall has also lobbied on behalf of the **Federal Home Loan Bank of Atlanta** through the Eris Group since 2003; the firm has received \$695,000 in lobbying fees since 2007. 89

Geoffrey Gradler served on Sen. Shelby's staff handling legislative issues related to the Senate Finance Committee. In 2005, Mr. Gradler formed the lobbying firm Capitol Ideas, where he specializes in lobbying members of the Senate Banking Committee and the House Financial Services Committee. Since 2006, **Federal Home Loan Bank of San Francisco** has paid Mr. Gradler \$370,000 to lobby on its behalf. Federal Home Loan Bank donated \$20,000 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC between 2003 and 2008.

Shelby is the ranking member on the Committee on Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs, a powerful position on the Senate committee responsible for writing and directing legislation related to banking issues. ⁹⁵

Other Connections

Kraig M. Siracuse

Kraig M. Siracuse served as a staff member on the U.S. Senate Appropriations Committee, Subcommittee on Defense from 1999 to 2005, the committee on which Sen. Shelby is a senior member. Hr. Siracuse joined the lobbying firm, Park Strategies L.L.C. in 2005, and since then employees of Park Strategies have donated \$10,100 to Sen. Shelby's campaign Committee. The strategies have donated \$10,100 to Sen. Shelby's campaign Committee.

Collazo Enterprises hired Park Strategies to lobby on its behalf, the same year Mr. Siracuse joined the firm. From 2005 to 2009, Collazo Enterprises has paid Park Strategies \$850,000 in lobbying fees. ⁹⁸

Park Strategies was founded by former Senator Alfonse M. D'Amato (R-NY), who also lobbies on behalf of Collazo Enterprises. ⁹⁹ Alfonse D'Amato and his brother Armand D'Amato

have been associated with corruption and fraud. ¹⁰⁰ In 1991, Armand was charged with 24 counts of mail fraud for creating a fraudulent billing scheme that concealed he lobbied his brother on behalf of the defense company, Unisys Corporation. Alfonse was paid \$120,500 for lobbying his brother and never registered as a lobbyist with the government. ¹⁰¹ In 1993, Armand was convicted of 7 of the 24 counts and was sentenced to five months in jail, but he was later exonerated by a federal appellate court. ¹⁰²

Collazo Enterprises is not the only Park Strategies client for which Sen. Shelby has earmarked. 103 Mr. Siracuse has lobbied for Lockheed Martin. In 2009 and 2010, **Lockheed**Martin paid Park Strategies \$200,000 in lobbying fees. 104 Sen. Shelby earmarked \$4,000,000 to Lockheed Martin in FY 2010. 105 Employees of Lockheed Martin have donated \$38,300 to Sen. Shelby's campaign committee and leadership PAC since 2005. 106

Park Strategies has lobbied on behalf of Ogilvy Government Relations, where Mr. Hall is currently a managing director and represented COLSA, Collazo Corporation's sister company. According to lobbying disclosure reports, Park Stratgies lobbies Congressional Defense Committees and members on defense authorizations and appropriations bills. 108
