The Match-Up: No. 18/20 Lafayette (9-2, 5-1 PL) opens up NCAA FCS Playoff action on Saturday at No. 12/11 Delaware (8-3, 6-2 CAA) at 2 p.m. on ESPN+. The Leopards and Blue Hens have squared off 28 times previously, last playing in 2018. The winner of Saturday's game will travel to face Montana on Dec. 1

Back In the Mix: The Leopards are making their fifth FCS Playoff appearance and their first since 2013. Lafayette is searching for its first NCAA Playoff victory in the Patriot League era. Lafayette played at Delaware in 2004 (28-14), at Appalachian State in 2005 (34-23), at Massachusetts in 2006 (35-14) and at New Hampshire in 2013 (45-7).



Still Celebrating: Lafayette needed a win in the regular-season finale vs. archrival Lehigh on Nov. 18, and it was up to the task. The Leopards trailed by seven at halftime, but then outscored Lehigh 35-0 in the second half to claim a 49-21 win while securing the Patriot League title and the conference's automatic berth into the NCAA FCS Playoffs. It is the eighth Patriot League championship for Lafayette.

- A Championship Season:** 2023 has been a breakthrough/standout season for the Leopards in year two of the **John Troxell '94** era. Lafayette...
- eclipsed its win total (4) from 2022 and equalled or surpassed the win total from the previous 40 seasons (last winning nine games in 1981).
 - finished its league season with a 5-1 mark for the first time since 2006.
 - recorded a win over No. 11/15 Holy Cross (the Leopards' first top-25 win since 2013) and snapped Holy Cross' 18-game conference win streak.
 - captured its first Patriot League championship in a decade.
 - secured the program's first winning season since 2013.
 - appeared in the Top 25 for the first time since 2009.
 - finished off the month of October undefeated for the first time since 2009.
 - beat Princeton for the first time in 13 meetings (first time on the road since '82).

700 Club: The Lafayette football program reached the 700-win plateau with the dominating victory over Lehigh in the regular-season finale. The Leopards, whose inaugural season was 1882, ranked 52nd among all levels of college football at the beginning of the 2023 campaign when only 49 programs (at all levels) in the nation had won 700 or more games.

Turnover Tales: The Leopards went four straight games (Monmouth, Bucknell, Princeton and Holy Cross) without a turnover before handing the ball over twice at Georgetown and three times against Colgate. Lafayette did not have a turnover vs. Fordham (0) or Lehigh (+3). For the season, Lafayette is +5 in the turnover category.

Interviews

Media Availability: Head coach John Troxell and members of the team will be available each Tuesday at noon for weekly media luncheons in Pfennig Alumni Center.

Media members wishing to attend practice should contact Phil LaBella for availability and to pre-arrange interviews.

Running the Ball: Lafayette is averaging 195.7 rushing yards per game, a mark that ranks the Leopards **19th in the nation** among 128 schools. Behind a strong offensive line, soph. **Jamar Curtis** accounts for most of the yards, racking up a Patriot League best 133.3 yards per outing (**second in the nation**) and 1,333 total rushing yards (**fourth in the nation**). Curtis also ranks third in the conference and **18th in the nation** in yards per carry (6.5 ypc).

Trox Selected as Finalist for Robinson Award: John Troxell '94 is one of 20 national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award, given annually to the national coach of the year in Division I FCS college football. In just his second year, Troxell guided Lafayette to a Patriot League title, pushed the Leopards to a national ranking and a 9-2 overall record, secured the 700th win in program history while earning **Patriot League Coach** of the Year honors.

Joseph Tabbed as Rice Award Finalist: Freshman DT **Jaylon Joseph** has been named a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award. The award, named after the Hall of Fame wide receiver, has been presented to the top FCS freshman since 2011. Joseph has started 10 games as a rookie, piling up 26 tackles (13 solo) with 5.5 tackles for a loss of 31 yards, including four sacks. The Houston native has eight quarterback hurries and a blocked kick.

Shaeffer Tagged as Buck Buchanan Award Finalist: Senior **Billy Shaeffer** has earned a spot as a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award, given annually to the national defensive player of the year in Division I FCS college football and presented by FedEx Ground. The outside linebacker has a team-leading 10 sacks (**fourth in the nation**), the most for a Leopard since 2000 and the second-most ever in a season at Lafayette. Shaeffer also has 20 tackles for loss (**third in the nation**). Shaeffer, who has twice been named the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week in 2023 (10/2, 10/9), leads the team with 75 tackles.

He has turned up the pressure in the last seven games with 10 sacks and 18.5 tackles for loss in a 6-1 stretch for the Leopards. Versus Colgate, he had three TFL with two sacks and a forced fumble. At Georgetown, Shaeffer had 12 tackles, a sack, two tackles for loss, a forced fumble and two pass breakups. That followed a Holy Cross game when he had seven tackles with 2.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks in the win. At Princeton, he had 10 tackles with three TFL, including two sacks, in a 12-9 victory. In the Patriot League opener vs. Bucknell, Shaeffer rang up 3.5 sacks, 5.5 tackles for loss and forced a fumble to go along with nine tackles.

Curtis a Finalist For Walter Payton Award: Soph. RB. **Jamar Curtis**' season has not gone unnoticed by the national media. He is a finalist for the Walter Payton award handed out annually to the national offensive player of the year in Division I FCS college football and presented by FedEx Ground. Curtis has 206 carries for 1,333 yards (6.5 ypc) with 13 TDs while adding 16 receptions for 140 yards and a TD in 10 games.

A Grand Run: Soph. TB **Jamar Curtis** ran for 204 yards against Fordham, surpassing 1,000 yards in a season for the first time in his career. Curtis is the first player to hit 1,000 rushing yards in a season since Ross Scheuerman (2014). He currently has 1,333 yards (206 carries), the fourth most in a season at Lafayette. His 12 rushing touchdowns in a season have tied him for 10th place.

A Stack of Sacks: The Leopards are **fifth the nation** in sacks per game (3.2) and rank 13th in tackles for loss (7.3). Lafayette piled up seven sacks each against Princeton, Bucknell and Monmouth. For the season, 12 different players have been able to get home, with **Billy Shaeffer** (10) and **Tim O'Hearn** (4.5) leading the way.

In the Top 25: Lafayette's 38-35 Patriot League road win over No. 11/15 Holy Cross pushed the Leopards into the Top-25 polls on Oct. 23, ranked 19th in the AFCA FCS Coaches Poll and 21st in the Stats Perform Poll, which selected Lafayette its FedEx Ground FCS National Team of the Week.

The No. 16 ranking on Oct. 30 was the highest any Lafayette team has reached in the Patriot League era (since 1986), surpassing the 2004 squad which finished at No. 19 in both polls. Prior to this season, the last time Lafayette was ranked in either poll was Dec. 21, 2009, (No. 24 in the Stats Perform Poll and No. 25 in the FCS Coaches Poll).

With W's Come Awards: Following the Lehigh win, Lafayette saw soph. QB **Dean DeNobile** and freshman K **Jack Simonetta** collect Patriot League Offensive and Special Teams Player of the Week awards, respectively. DeNobile threw for three touchdowns and ran for another to earn game MVP honors at the 159th Meeting, while Simonetta connected for all seven of his PATs.

Delaware Connections: Lafayette offensive coordinator **T.J. DiMuzio** is a 2006 Delaware grad who coached the running backs (2007) and wide receivers (2008) at his alma mater and was a teammate of Delaware coach Ryan Carty. DiMuzio played quarterback for the Blue Hens and was a member of the 2003 national championship team. Head coach **John Troxell** was on the Lafayette staff as an assistant the last time the two teams met in the playoffs (2004). Current defensive coordinator **Mike Saint Germain** and cornerbacks coach **Jeff Sejour** were both members of that Patriot League title team.

On the other sideline, Delaware defensive coordinator Manny Rojas spent the 2019 season as Lafayette's defensive coordinator, as did current Delaware special teams coordinator Art Link from 2014-16.

Opponent: No. 12/11 Delaware enters the first round of the NCAA FCS Playoffs at 8-3 (6-2 in CAA play). The Blue Hens have won three of their last five games, claiming victories vs. Hampton (47-3), Towson (51-13) and Campbell (45-7) while losing to Elon (33-27) and Villanova (35-7).

Averaging 261 passing yards, the Blue Hens are led by junior QB Ryan O'Connor who has completed 57 percent of his passes for 1,907 yards with 17 touchdowns and seven interceptions. Grad students Jourdan Townsend, Joshua Youngblood and Braden Brose have 39, 28 and 23 receptions, respectively, combining for 1,200 receiving yards. On the ground, senior RB Marcus Yarns averages 77 yards per game, contributed 846 rushing yards with 14 TDs in 2023. He also has 24 receptions with three touchdowns.

Defensively, LB Jackson Taylor leads the team with 97 tackles, including 11.5 TFL and 3.5 sacks. LB Dillon Trainer (57) and DBs Ty Davis (43) and Nic Ware (43) are also among the tackling leaders. DE Chase McGowan has rung up 14 tackles for loss and five sacks.

Delaware is coached Ryan Carty (Delaware '06) who spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Sam Houston State prior to taking over at Delaware.

LEOPARDS PLACE 12 ON ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE TEAMS

EASTON, Pa. -- A championship season has produced a host of Patriot League postseason awards for the No. 18/20 Lafayette Leopards, including Coach of the Year and Rookie of the Year honors announced on Tuesday. The Leopards had a Patriot-League best 12 selections listed on the All-Patriot League Teams, eight on the first team and four on the second team.

The guiding force behind the Leopards' Patriot League championship season was head coach **John Troxell '94**, who was named the Dick Biddle Coach of the Year on Monday, just a day after being selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year award given annually to the national coach of the year in Division I FCS college football.

Selected fourth in the Patriot League preseason poll, the Leopards were perhaps well ahead of schedule for Troxell and his staff who were in just their second season. Troxell spurred the Leopards to a 9-2 overall record, the program's best mark since 1981 and its first winning season since 2013. Lafayette finished the Patriot League campaign with a 5-1 mark for the first time since 2006, winning the program's eighth Patriot League championship and securing its fifth berth into the NCAA FCS Playoffs.

Lafayette is coming off a 49-21 win over Lehigh in #Rivalry159, beating its archival for the second straight season and fourth time in the last five tries. That victory marked win No. 700 in the program's history.

Joining Troxell as a major award winner is freshman defensive lineman **Jaylon Joseph** who was selected as the Patriot League Rookie of the Year. On Monday, Joseph was tagged as a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award given to the top FCS freshman. The All-Patriot League Second-Team selection has started 10 games, piling up 26 tackles (13 solo) with 5.5 tackles for a loss of 31 yards, including four sacks. The Houston native, who has eight quarterback hurries, is the 12th Lafayette player to garner conference Rookie of the Year honors since the league's inception in 1986.

The Leopards had eight players tabbed for the All-Patriot League First Team, four on each side of the ball. Topping the list is sophomore running back **Jamar Curtis**, who also was named as a finalist for the Walter Payton Award, given annually to the national offensive player of the year. Curtis leads the Patriot League and ranks second in the nation with 133.3 yards per game. He is also fourth in the NCAA with 1,333 total rushing yards and 18th with 6.5 yards per carry. The first Leopard since 2013 to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, Curtis has 13 scores on the

ground and is coming off a three-touchdown performance vs. Lehigh in the regular-season finale.

Seniors **Mike Barr**, **John Olmstead** and **Mason Gilbert**, all of whom play key roles in the run game, garnered All-Patriot League First-Team status. Olmstead and Barr started every game this season, at center and right guard, respectively. Barr has started 25 games over the last three seasons while Olmstead played in 21 games over parts of four campaigns. For Gilbert, it is his third naming to the First Team, having started 30 games during his career. In 2023, he has 19 catches for 217 yards and two touchdowns (all career bests).

The Leopard offense also featured three second-team honorees. Junior **Ryder Langsdale** joined his offensive line mates in garnering conference laurels. The tone setter for the front five, Langsdale has started in 22 games at left tackle the last two seasons.

At the skill positions, sophomores **Dean DeNobile** and **Elijah Steward** were second-team honorees. DeNobile was a three-time Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week after starting 10 games. He has completed 160-of-240 (67 percent) for 18 touchdowns and five interceptions, leading the conference while ranking 14th in the nation in completion percentage. In his last outing, he threw three touchdowns and ran for another to grab game MVP honors in Rivalry 159.

Steward is one of DeNobile's favorite targets, leading the team in receptions (48) and receiving yards (646 yards) to go along with four touchdowns. He accounts for nine plays of 20 yards or more, second behind only Curtis.

Defensively, the Leopards had at least one selection at every level of the unit, led by senior linebackers **Marco Olivas** and **Billy Shaeffer**. For Olivas, it is his third appearance on the All-Patriot League First-Team, adding to second-team honoring in the spring of 2021. The vocal team captain is third on the team with 65 tackles, including 7.5 TFL and 2.5 sacks.

His long-time running mate Shaeffer, played his way onto the first team via a sack-laden senior season. Shaeffer was honored as a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award, given annually to the national defensive player of the year. The outside linebacker is fourth in the nation with 10 sacks and third in the nation with 20 tackles for loss. The team leader with 75 tackles, Shaeffer was a second-team selection in his sophomore season.

Providing the pressure up front is senior **Blamassi Meite** who has 27 tackles spurred by 5.5 tackles for loss with four sacks. Meite

has played in 40 games, starting all 11 in 2023. It is the first All-Patriot League selection for the Georgia native. The same is true for Peach state native **Saiku White**, who was one of the Leopards' most consistent performers on the defensive side of the ball. White was second on the team in tackles (71) and led the Maroon and White with three interceptions, including tide-changing picks in road conference wins over Georgetown and Lehigh.

Joined by second-team honoree Joseph, the Leopards lead the Patriot League in sacks (35 for fifth in the nation), scoring defense (22.2 ppg), rushing defense (115.8 ypg) and red-zone defense (72% for 12th in the nation).

John Troxell '94 | Fred M. Kirby '42 Head Football Coach | 2nd Season at Lafayette, 18th Overall



John Troxell '94 enters his second season as the Fred M. Kirby II '42 Head Football Coach at Lafayette College. Troxell was re-introduced to the College Hill community at a press conference on Dec. 14, 2021. Troxell is the 29th coach in the program's history, third who is an alum, taking over prior to the 2022 season.

Troxell began re-shaping the program in 2022, guiding the Leopards to a third-place finish in the conference standings, despite an offense that was significantly affected by injuries. Lafayette opened the season with a shutout

of Sacred Heart in Troxell's debut and added conference road victories over Bucknell and Colgate before wrapping the season with a home victory over archrival Lehigh. The Leopards also took NCAA quarterfinalist Holy Cross to the wire in a 24-21 final. In 2022, Troxell saw Malik Hamm earn Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year honors, as the conference's first five-time All-Patriot League selection, before signing with the Baltimore Ravens.

Troxell came to College Hill after a 16-year head coaching stint at Franklin and Marshall College where he molded the program into a consistent winner. Prior to his arrival at the Lancaster, Pennsylvania school in 2006, F&M had managed one winning season in the previous 13 campaigns. Four years later, after a full recruiting cycle, the Diplomats finished with a 9-2 record and have continued to climb, subsequently reaching the postseason on nine occasions.

Troxell was twice named the Centennial Conference Coach of the Year winning most recently in 2017 and 2009 when he was also a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year national award. The program's high-water mark came in 2017 when the team was 10-1 and captured its conference championship. That season kicked off a span from 2017-21 when Troxell and Franklin and Marshall posted a cumulative mark of 31-13. In his 16 seasons, Troxell posted a 92-67 overall record, ranking second in career coaching wins at the school where he coached 111 all-conference selections.

Alumni engagement was integral to Troxell's success at Franklin and Marshall and is key within his plan for his return to College Hill. He developed a mentoring and internship program utilizing the alumni network and played an integral role in mobilizing the group behind the construction of a \$19.6 million football stadium project.

Troxell has been a key ingredient in program rebuilds at each of his stops, and his time on College Hill as an assistant coach on Frank Tavani's staff was no exception. He served various roles as the running backs coach, recruiting coordinator and special teams coach from 2001-05. His selection as the recruiting coordinator in 2003 helped kick off a stretch of three straight titles for the Leopards in 2004, 2005 and 2006 that coincided with the program's first three NCAA FCS Playoff appearances.

As an assistant at Lafayette, he mentored 2004 Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year Joe McCourt '05 to a record-setting career. McCourt, the 2001 Patriot League Rookie of the Year, concluded his career as Lafayette's and the Patriot League's all-time leader with 50 rushing touchdowns and was second on the school's all-time rushing list with 4,474 yards while earning All-America honors in 2002 and 2004. He also mentored Brandon Stanford '06 who set

the current Lafayette single-season record for punt return yardage and ranks 11th in career receiving.

Prior to Lafayette, Troxell was part of a dramatic reversal at Muhlenberg College from 1997-2000 under head coach Mike Donnelly. He served multiple roles, working as the special teams coordinator (1997-99), quarterbacks coach and wide receivers coach (1997-2000) and offensive coordinator (2000). Muhlenberg progressed from a 1-9 season in 1997 to the Eastern College Athletic Conference title with a record of 9-2 in 2000. In 2000, under Troxell's tutelage, the offense ranked 22nd in the nation and led the Centennial Conference in total offense (427.8 ypg) while averaging 31.0 points per game.

Troxell joined the Muhlenberg staff after serving as an assistant coach for three seasons (1994-96) at Columbia University under head coach Ray Tellier, beginning his career path of coaching at elite academic institutions. In 1996, Troxell oversaw a secondary that recorded the third-best passing defense in the country. The turnaround tendency first showed itself at Columbia in 1994 when the Ivy League school recorded its first winning season in 23 seasons. An 8-2 mark and the program's best finish in 15 years followed in 1996.

His first extended stint on College Hill came as a student-athlete from 1990-94, when he earned his bachelor's degree in government and law. Troxell was the starting free safety on the Leopards' 1992 Patriot League Championship team and received the Unsung Hero Award as a senior. He completed his master's degree in sociology and education in 1997 while on staff at Columbia.

The 52-year-old Troxell is native of Phillipsburg, New Jersey. He and his wife, Pamela, have two daughters, Summer and Capri.

Streaking: The Leopards had their six-game win streak snapped in overtime vs. Colgate on Nov. 4. Lafayette had also put together eight consecutive wins over FCS opponents (dating back to the win over Lehigh in the 2022 season finale). The six-game overall winning streak was the longest since the 2009 season.

Maroon and "White": Junior **Saiku White** has been a defensive standout from his safety position. White, who is second on the team in tackles (71), turned the momentum of the Lehigh game, picking off a pass that led to the game-tying score. He had a two-interception performance at Georgetown (10/28), one of which he returned 42 yards for a touchdown en route to collecting Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week honors. The team captain opened the season with a game- and career-high 12 stops at Sacred Heart. The Atlanta, Ga. native followed with a game-high 11 tackles at No. 21 Duke. Against Monmouth, White made a game-high nine stops.

Nice to Have You Back: Soph. RB **Jamar Curtis** missed the second half of the Georgetown win and all of the overtime loss vs. Colgate. He came back with something to prove against Fordham, carrying a career-high 31 times for 204 yards and a touchdown in the victory. It was the second 200-yard game of his career and 12th in Lafayette history, garnering him Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week for the first time in his career.

Bruce Producing as a Rookie: Freshman RB **Troy Bruce** parlayed his 98-yard rushing game (including a 71-yard touchdown) at Georgetown into Patriot League Rookie of the Week laurels. He followed with 26 carries for 138 yards (both career highs) and a touchdown vs. Colgate. Bruce was also the Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 2.

The Road to November: The Leopards did not play a home game in October, with three road games and a bye week on the ledger. Lafayette finished the month with an undefeated mark for the first time since 2009.

DeNobile Under Center: Soph. **Dean DeNobile** has started the last 10 games. The Upper Saddle River, N.J. native has completed 67 percent of his throws for 1,833 yards with 18 touchdowns and five interceptions. He **leads the conference and is 14th in the nation** in completion percentage. DeNobile threw for a career-high 262 yards in an Oct. 21 win over nationally-ranked Holy Cross. DeNobile tossed three TDs and ran for another to garner game MVP honors vs. Lehigh (11/18) and secure his third Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honor.

He ran for two TDs and threw for two others in a win over Monmouth. DeNobile completed 10-of-14 for 110 yards while carrying the ball 12 times for 50 yards. Against Bucknell, he threw four TDs (the first Leopard to do so since 2015) in the second quarter to four different receivers in a 56-point effort.

Weekly Winners X 13: Lafayette has had 13 Patriot League weekly award winners this season. **Dean DeNobile's** Lehigh game MVP performance earned him Offensive Player of the Week honors for the third time this season while **Jack Simonetta** collected his second Special Teams nod.

Soph. **Jamar Curtis'** 204-yard game vs. Fordham led to his first selection as the Offensive Player of the Week. **Saiku White** and **Troy Bruce** were the Defensive and Rookie of the Week, respectively, following the Georgetown win. **Billy Shaeffer** took home Defensive Player of the Week honors on Oct. 9. Lafayette had three honorees on Oct. 2 when Shaeffer (Defensive) DeNobile (Offensive) and Bruce (Special Teams) were recognized. It was the second straight award for DeNobile who also won on Sept. 25. The first three winners came

from the freshman class. Following the Columbia game, freshman DL **Jaylon Joseph** made his second start of the season and recorded three tackles with a half sack to garner rookie honors. Joseph helped the Leopards limit Columbia to 137 yards of total offense. Simonetta secured special teams laurels on Sept. 18, connecting on his first career field goal, a 34-yarder in the fourth quarter. **Michael Vaughn (9/4)** was the rookie of the week after a two-sack performance in the opener vs. Sacred Heart.

Hamm in NFL With Baltimore Ravens: Malik Hamm '23, a five-time All-Patriot League selection and two-time Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year is on the Baltimore Ravens' 53-man roster after signing an undrafted free agent contract in April.

Hamm, a Baltimore native, left Lafayette as the school's career sacks leader (32), and fittingly the final play of the final game of his collegiate career was a game-ending sack of Lehigh's quarterback in a 14-11 win in Rivalry 158 on Nov. 19, 2022. He also ranks fourth in the Patriot League annals for career sacks. Hamm is currently on injured reserve.



In the Classroom: Lafayette athletic programs continue to excel on a national level. The Dec. 2022 release of the NCAA Division I annual Graduation Success Rate (GSR) report shined a light on those academic achievements.

Lafayette claimed a 98 percent GSR overall for its 19 sports measured while 18 Leopard teams achieved a graduation success rate of 100 percent.

In addition to those programs with perfect GSR scores, the Leopard football program had the sixth best score (94) in the country. Lafayette joined institutions from the Southeastern Conference, Atlantic Coast Conference, Colonial Athletic Association, Big Ten and the Ivy League in the top 10.

Troxell Passes the Century Mark: Lafayette's win over Bucknell marked the 100th career coaching victory for Leopard head coach **John Troxell '94**. Troxell came to Lafayette with 92 head coaching wins while at Franklin and Marshall and has 12 wins through two seasons at Lafayette.

200+ Plus = Wins: The Leopards churned out 223 rushing yards at Sacred Heart, a mark they had not reached since week three of 2019. They followed with 239 vs. Columbia, 206 vs.

Monmouth, 316 vs. Bucknell, 236 at Holy Cross, 211 vs. Fordham and 214 at Lehigh, all leading to victories. The 316-yard performance vs. Bucknell is the high-water mark in the Troxell era, as is **Jamar Curtis'** 229-yard day at Holy Cross. Curtis was the first player since Ross Scheuerman in 2014 to run for 200-plus yards.

Year Two in the Troxell Era: Lafayette football is under the leadership of **John Troxell '94** who is in his second season at the helm of the College Hill program. Troxell guided the Leopards to a 3-3 conference finish and third place in the Patriot League standings in 2022. Lafayette capped the season with a rivalry victory over Lehigh and won two of its last three games. Troxell captured his 100th career coaching victory in week five of the 2023 season and has the Leopards out to their most wins since 1981 and the first Patriot League title in a decade.

In the Red: The Lafayette defense is currently ranked **12th in the nation** in **red-zone** defense, allowing opponents to score 72 percent of the time inside the 20.

Getting Down: The Leopards converted 8-of-13 (62%) third downs at Holy Cross and 8-of-12 (67%) against Bucknell. Against Columbia, Lafayette was 9-of-16 (56%) on third down and 3-of-3 on fourth down. For the season, Lafayette ranks **sixth in the nation** in third-down conversion percentage (48%).

Bucknell Spoils: Following the Patriot League opener vs. Bucknell (9/30), Lafayette raked in three Patriot League Weekly awards. **Dean DeNobile, Billy Shaeffer** and **Troy Bruce** were named the Offensive, Defensive and Special Teams Players of the Week, respectively. DeNobile secured the award for a second straight week after throwing four TDs, all in the second quarter. He was also named the **STATS Perform FCS National Freshman Player of the Week** (based on his freshman eligibility). Shaeffer tallied 3.5 sacks, 5.5 tackles for loss and forced a fumble to go along with nine tackles. Bruce affected all realms of special teams play, blocking a punt that set up a score, while also returning a kick off (25 yards) and a punt (5 yards) and adding six carries for 33 yards out of the backfield.

Offensive Output: Lafayette's season-high 56 points against Bucknell were the most for a Leopard offense since 2009 (when Lafayette tallied 56 in a win over Colgate).

Fresh Faces: Two Leopards have forced their way into the starting 11 on defense. **Jaylon Joseph** has started 10 games at defensive tackle while **Ahmir Crawley** started the season opener at nosetackle. They have been joined by **Michael Vaughn, De'Marion McCoy** and **Darien Riley**, all of whom have had significant reps on the D Line.

Offensively, **Carson Persing** has been the team's holder for the majority of games and has started six games at wide receiver. He is surrounded by a smattering of fellow rookies on special teams, including **Jack Simonetta** at kicker and **Darren Wu** handling kick-off duties.

Curtis Carried Away in the Opener: Soph. **Jamar Curtis** enjoyed a breakout game for the Leopards in the season opener, carrying 19 times for a then career-high 181 yards and a touchdown. Curtis had 115 yards in the first half (topping his previous single-game best of 108 vs. Lehigh on Nov. 19, 2022 when he garnered Patriot League Rookie of the Week honors). Curtis' longest run was a 47-yard carry in the final minute that allowed the Leopards to run out the clock.

Defensive Stand at SHU: Soph. **Taylor Smallwood** picked off Sacred Heart QB Cade Pribula on 4th-and-goal from the five-yard with 1:40 left to help put away the win at Sacred Heart. His first career interception followed three straight stops on running plays: one for no gain when **Terrell Cannon** and **Jaylon Joseph** teamed up, one for a yard loss thanks to **Billy Shaeffer** and **Blamassi Meite** and a final rushing stop by **Saiku White** for no gain. Lafayette held Sacred Heart to 254 total yards (115 rushing, 139 passing).

It Tolls For Thee: "The Bell" has become a fixture on the Lafayette sideline. In lieu of a turnover chain, title belt, etc., head coach **John Troxell** supplied a bell which players ring after securing a turnover or scoring a touchdown or a field goal. Troxell said the bell, which travels with the team, symbolizes the "hard-fought battle" that is football.

Preseason All-Patriot League: The Leopards had three players selected to the 2023 Preseason All-Patriot League Team. LB **Marco Olivas**, an All-Patriot League First-Team selection in 2022, started all 11 games while leading the team with 92 tackles. An Academic All-Patriot League selection the past two seasons, Olivas added 7.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks in 2022 while forcing a pair of fumbles and recovering two more. He helped guide a defense that ranked eighth in the nation and first in the Patriot League for rushing defense (106.7).

Junior S **Saiku White** started 11 games at free safety in 2022, finishing second on the team in tackles. The Economics major tallied 84 stops with 1.5 TFL while adding four pass breakups. He was one of 46 selections to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2022.

On the offensive side of the ball, senior **Mason Gilbert** secured preseason All-Patriot League recognition at tight end. The DeWitt, Mich. native garnered All-Patriot League First-Team honors the past two seasons. In 2022, Gilbert started 10 of 11 games and finished with 15 catches for 174 yards and a touchdown. In 2021, the Economics major played in 11 games with nine starts and made 17 catches for 134 yards.

The Captains: Seniors **Mike Barr, Marco Olivas, Carl Smith** and **Saiku White** have taken over the leadership reins of the Lafayette football team in 2023, selected as recipients of the Chris LaPietra '89 Captain Award for the 142nd season.

For Olivas, it marks his second straight season as a team captain. The 2023 Preseason All-Patriot League linebacker was an All-Patriot League First-Team selection in 2022. He started all 11 games for the Leopards and led the team with 92 tackles. An Academic All-Patriot League selection in 2021 and 2022, Olivas added 7.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks in 2022 while forcing a pair of fumbles and recovering two more. The Integrative Engineering major helped guide a defense that ranked eighth in the nation and first in the Patriot League for rushing defense (106.7).

White, a defensive teammate who was also a 2023 Preseason All-Patriot League honoree, started 11 games at free safety in 2022 and finished second on the team in tackles. The Economics major rang up 84 stops with 1.5 tackles for loss while adding four pass breakups. He was one of 46 Lafayette selections to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2022.

Offensively, Barr anchors the line. He started 10 games in 2022, including the final eight at center after playing right tackle early in the season. The Economics major played in eight games with four starts in his junior campaign.

Smith is coming off a 2022 campaign in which he played in eight games with two starts at wide receiver. The Art major finished the season with nine catches for 120 yards and two touchdowns, making at least one grab in five games.

...It's Where You Finish: Lafayette was picked fourth (of six) in the Patriot League Preseason Poll. With 39 points, the Leopards were slotted behind Holy Cross (72), Fordham (62) and Colgate (51) and ahead of Lehigh (32), Georgetown (19) and Bucknell (19).

Also Under Center: Sophomore **Ryan Schuster** was the starter coming out of camp and played all but the final two series in the opener at Sacred Heart. He was 6-of-12 for 40 yards with an interception.

In his rookie season, Schuster, whose older brother Tommy is the starting QB at North Dakota, earned the starting spot. The Macomb, Mich. native's play early on in 2022 did not disappoint, as he garnered Patriot League Rookie of the Week honors each of the first three weeks of the season. A broken femur knocked the Mechanical Engineering major from the Penn game in the third quarter and ended



his season. Schuster completed 43-of-78 for 406 yards and a pair of touchdowns while also rushing for two more touchdowns in the four games.

Showing no ill effects of his injury after surgery and a thorough rehab, Schuster beat out junior **Ah-Shaun Davis** and classmate **Dean DeNobile** for the starting nod in week one. Schuster did not play in week two and played one series against Columbia in week three.

Davis, a Willingboro, N.J. native, has played in 18 games through two seasons, completing 194-of-335 for 2,058 yards and 10 touchdowns.

The Front Five: Lafayette's offensive line was hit hard by injuries in 2022, forcing rookies into early action and one player to switch from defense. The Leopards are in a much better situation this season. Senior captain **Mike Barr** leads the unit from the center spot, having started 14 of 18 games played in 2021-22. He lines up alongside right guard **John Olmstead**, who was limited to three starts at the beginning of the 2022 season. Sophomore **Brian Baucia** returns at the other guard spot after starting every game as a rookie. He is playing next to **Ryder Langsdale** who also started every game there last season after making the move from defensive tackle. Soph. **Reed Collins** has started every game in 2023, splitting time with **Matthew Sherer** at right tackle after a preseason injury to Wake Forest transfer **Thomas Grippio**.

Linebacking Corps: The strength of the Leopards' defense is its linebacking corps led by fifth-year seniors **Marco Olivas** and **Billy Shaeffer**. Olivas has started 40 of 48 career games, earning all-league status the last two seasons. Shaeffer is also an all-conference caliber player when healthy and has started 32 of 47 games at OLB since 2018 while also logging reps as a key special teams performer on coverage units and as a long snapper. Senior **Preston Forney** is the Leopards' WILL linebacker, a spot in which he has excelled, starting 26 games since 2021 while his tackle numbers have climbed steadily. Junior **Reggie Thomas**, senior **Semaj Cross** and soph. **Ian Langan** all have played roles in the linebacker rotation.

FBS Foes: Lafayette faced No. 21 Duke in week two, the lone FBS foe in 2023. The Leopards have sprinkled in FBS opponents intermittently over the last seven seasons, playing Army in 2016 and 2018, Air Force in 2021, and Temple in 2022. *(The Leopards were slated to play Navy in 2020 when COVID delayed the season).* Lafayette will play Buffalo in 2024 and Bowling Green and Army in 2025.

The D Line: The defensive line is the youngest of the three levels on that side of the ball. Malik Hamm (11 starts), Jyaire Stevens (11 starts) Damon Washington (9 starts) and Ian Grayson (5 starts) were lost to graduation and **Adam Port's** (6 starts) training camp injury has him sidelined for the season.

The Leopards brought back senior **Blamassi Meite** at end along with junior **Tim O'Hearn** at the other end/hybrid linebacker spot. Juniors **Terell Cannon** (NT) and **Phillip Peiffer** (DT) combined to play in seven games last season and compete with freshmen **Jaylon Joseph**, **Michael Vaughn**, **De'Marion McCoy** and **Darien Riley** for reps in the middle of the line.

Rushing D: Lafayette led the Patriot League and finished eighth in the nation in rushing defense (106.7 ypg). The Leopards were second in the conference in total defense (347.9 ypg) and scoring defense (21.7 ppg) and led the circuit in kick return defense (17.9 ypr) and red zone defense (71%).

Run Game: The Leopards were 4-1 when the team rushed for 100+ yards in a game. Lafayette counted Sacred Heart (30-105), Bucknell (43-137), Colgate (51-176) and Lehigh (28-124) in the win column with the lone exception being No. 6/9 Holy Cross (37-163).

Hide the Hankies: The Leopards ranked first in the Patriot League in fewest penalty yards (443), fewest penalty yards per game (40.3), fewest penalties (57) and fewest penalties per game (5.2). Lafayette finished 19th in the nation in fewest penalty yards per game and 20th for fewest penalty yards.

Quality Opponents: Five of the Leopards' losses came against FCS opponents who enjoyed stellar 2022 campaigns. Holy Cross (12-1), William & Mary (11-2), Penn (8-2), Princeton (8-2) and Fordham (9-3) posted a combined record of 48-10 with all five finishing ranked or having received votes in the top 25 polls.

Turnover Margin: Lafayette held a slight edge in the turnover battle, going +3 for the 2022 season. In week two at Temple, the defense forced three fumbles (all recovered) and did not turn over the ball.

Inspired Defensive Effort: The play of Lafayette's defense was steady throughout 2022 and the Holy Cross game was no exception. Lafayette held No. 6/9 and eventual FCS quarterfinalist Holy Cross to 15 points below its season scoring average. The defense also limited Holy Cross to 99 rushing yards and 82 passing yards -- both season lows for the Crusaders. **Marco Olivas** made a game-high 13 tackles, including 10 solo stops, 0.5 TFL and two QB hurries.



— All-Time Notes —

Lafayette's Football Inventors: Two primary elements of the game of football -- the helmet and the huddle -- were invented by former members of the Lafayette football program. **George "Rose" Barclay** from the Class of 1898, one of Lafayette's all-time great running backs, invented the helmet when the "threat of cultivating cauliflower ears" led him to piece three thick leather straps around his head for an 1894 game against Penn.

Former Lafayette coach **Herb McCracken** (1924-35; 59-40-6) is often credited with calling the first huddle system during the 1924 season after learning the University of Pennsylvania football team had stolen Lafayette's signals. Lafayette "huddled" before each play and this system was immediately adopted by other teams. (Several other schools also lay claim to the huddle).

The Football Helmet: At the school credited with inventing the football helmet, a quick look at the 2023 version shows maroon player numbers on the right side of the helmet and a white Leopard on the left. Other versions will feature a metallic "L" on each side and a maroon center stripe and an L with Leopard head logo on both sides.

At It A While: Since fielding its first college football team in the fall of 1882 (the same year that coward Robert Ford shot Jesse James in the back and that Tchaikovsky's *1812 Overture* debuted), Lafayette has had a proud, colorful gridiron tradition on the way to a total of 700 victories (**700-639-39**). Lafayette ranks 52nd among all college football teams in all-time wins entering the 2023 fall season, posting its first win in 1883 (25-0 vs. Rutgers). Lafayette accumulated 100 victories by 1900, 200 by 1915 and 300 by 1934.

Lafayette is in its 142nd season.

Patriot League Titles: Lafayette has won eight Patriot League championships in the history of the league (1988, 1992, 1994, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2013, 2023). The 2004-06 titles led to three straight NCAA Playoff appearances, making Lafayette one of six teams in the country to appear in the 16-team field in three consecutive years.

Patriot League Football: The Patriot League is in its 37th season as a football conference and is comprised of Bucknell, Colgate, Fordham, Georgetown, Holy Cross

and Lehigh. Fordham and Georgetown are associate members in the 10-team all-sport conference which includes Army, Navy, American, Boston University and Loyola (Md.). American, Boston and Loyola do not have football and Army and Navy football compete in the FBS.

- The league is known for its academic priority, perennially finishing at or near the top spot in the NCAA's Graduate Rate Report and in APR rankings.
- The Patriot League presidents voted in February 2012 to begin allowing scholarships with a maximum of 15 per season until reaching a maximum of 60 equivalencies in any given year. The Class of 2017 represented the Leopards' first class of scholarship student-athletes during the Patriot League era. Previously, financial aid was awarded based solely on financial need.
- Redshirts are granted only for medical reasons. Typically (pre-pandemic), there were only a handful of fifth-year seniors on any given squad.

Run Like A Champion: The Lafayette Leopards have won five Patriot League Championships over the last two decades and the common thread has been the program's ability to run the ball. In 2023, Lafayette has averaged 195.6 yards per game led by 1,000-yard rusher Jamar Curtis.

Lafayette won three straight titles under head coach Frank Tavani in 2004-06. Kicking off the run in 2004, Lafayette churned out 212.8 rushing yards per game led by Joe McCourt who accumulated 1,193 yards with 16 touchdowns. Quarterback Brad Maurer was a dual threat, scampering for 643 yards with nine rushing touchdowns. In that season, the Leopards had nine passing touchdowns and 33 scores on the ground.

In 2005, the Leopards were only 15 yards away from having their second consecutive 1,000 yard rusher. RB Jonathan Hurt ran for 985 yards and 13 TD on the way to Lafayette's second straight Patriot League title. The Leopards averaged 150.9 rushing yards per game and improved on that number for the 2006 title run. Hurt helped guide the Leopards to a third consecutive NCAA Playoff berth, running for 1,165 yards on 229 attempts while scoring 15 touchdowns. The Leopards averaged 165 rushing yards per game and racked up nearly 2,000 for the season.

In 2013, Lafayette wore down opponents and possessed the ball. Ross Scheuerman carried the load with 1,113 rushing yards and 14 touchdowns on 218 carries, guiding Lafayette to a 4-1 conference mark and a Patriot League title.

No. 53: Prior to the Harvard game on Oct. 1, 2011, the No. 53 was retired in honor of Fred Morgan Kirby '42, the first retirement of its kind for the football program. Kirby

was a member of the 1940 undefeated football team that ran through the likes of Army, Rutgers and Lehigh, while allowing just 33 points in a nine-game slate. After graduating from Lafayette, Kirby served in Europe in World War II and later earned his master's degree from Harvard. He served as the chairman of the Allegheny Corporation for 39 years and was one of the College's most prominent and dedicated alums. Kirby, who passed away in 2011, left behind a legacy of academic, athletic, military, professional, civic and charitable achievements.



World Series Champion: Lafayette's most famous football alum has made his name on the diamond rather than the gridiron. **Joe Maddon '76** was a two-sport athlete at Lafayette. Wearing No. 12, he completed 14-of-17 for four touchdowns in a win over archrival Lehigh in a 1972 freshman game. That was his last football game, as the Hazleton, Pa. native chose to focus on baseball (wearing No. 22). Maddon twice has been named the American League Manager of the Year, also earning the honor in the National League (one of seven managers in history to win it in both leagues). His career-defining moment was guiding the Chicago Cubs to a 2016 World Series title. Maddon recently managed the Angels from 2019-22.

Mowins on the Call: Another Lafayette athletic alum has left her mark on the broadcasting industry. On, Sept. 11, 2017, **Beth Mowins '89** became the second woman ever (and the first in 30 years) to broadcast an NFL regular-season game. Mowins joined ESPN in 1994 and has called college football since 2005. She graduated from Lafayette with a degree in English in 1989 after a playing career as a point guard on the basketball team. Mowins was Lafayette's commencement speaker in 2022.

No. 80: Brian Keller's No. 80 was retired before the start of the 2015 season. Keller passed away in a car accident in the month of June just prior to the start of his senior season.

200+ Rushing Games: Since 1990, there have been 12 200-yard individual rushing performances for the Leopards, six of which were the work of Maroon Club Hall of Fame honoree Erik Marsh '95.

Greatest Game Never Played: The 1948 football team is enshrined in the Maroon Club Hall of Fame. The team was 7-2 with wins over Fordham, Bucknell, George Washington, Washington and Jefferson, Muhlenberg, Ohio Wesleyan and Lehigh and losses only to No. 6 Army and Rutgers. The team averaged 260.2 rushing yards per game, among the leaders in the East, led by Maroon Club Hall of Fame quarterback Frank Downing '51.

More notably, Lafayette was invited to the Sun Bowl in El Paso, Texas. The College rejected the invitation, however, after the Sun Bowl committee's decision to exclude David Showell '51 from the game because of his race, and the segregation laws in Texas. Showell, who played on offense and defense, served his country in World War II with the Tuskegee Airmen. *The Greatest Game Never Played* (as it was later referred to in a song) helped raise awareness of exclusion of African American players in college football bowl games based on their race.

National Championships: The Lafayette football program has claimed three national championships -- 1896, 1921 and 1926 -- and recorded five undefeated seasons -- 1896 (11-0-1), 1921 (9-0-0), 1926 (9-0-0), 1937 (8-0-0) and 1940 (9-0-0). Of recent note, the Leopards have won seven Patriot League championships -- 1988, 1992, 1994, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2013 -- and made four appearances in the NCAA FCS Playoffs.

And We Go...To Overtime: Lafayette has played 12 overtime games all-time and is 3-9 in those contests, last playing an overtime game on Nov. 4, 2023.

A Tradition of Kicking: Lafayette has boasts three of the top four kick scoring leaders in Patriot League history. The most recent addition was **Davis Rodriguez '10** (251 career points). He is fourth in the Patriot League annals for career kick scoring leaders, trailing Fordham's Michael Marando (283) and fellow Leopards **Jason McLaughlin '95** (255) and **Jim Hodson '91** (254). The trio ranks fifth (Hodson-5.91), sixth (McLaughlin-5.8) and seventh (Rodriguez-5.7) in career kicking points per game. **Martin Brecht '03** rests in 10th place in the same category (5.3).



Historic Fisher Stadium: Fisher Stadium has hosted the College's home football games since 1926. The facility underwent a \$35 million transformation in 2006 and the playing surface was replaced prior to the 2021 season. A 28' by 47' video board replaced the original 19' by 36' video board prior to the 2023 season.

The Bourger Varsity Football House includes a locker room, offices and team meeting rooms, as well as sports medicine and strength and conditioning areas. Now in its 97th season, Fisher Stadium has been host to 473 Lafayette football games with the Leopards enjoying an overall record of 269-192-13 for a winning percentage of .581. Of the previous 96 seasons, Lafayette has produced 13 undefeated home seasons with the most recent a 2-0 mark in the COVID-shortened 2021 spring season. Prior to that, the last team undefeated at home was the 1992 Patriot League champion Leopards who went 5-0 (the first since 1970). During the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons, Lafayette won 10 straight home games to tie the Fisher Stadium school record for consecutive wins first set in 1926 and 1927 in the first 10 games ever played in the stadium.

The Series: College football's most-played rivalry dates to 1884 (one year after standardized football rules were instituted in the U.S.) when Lafayette beat Lehigh 56-0 in Easton. The two teams met twice a year from 1884-1901 (three times in 1891) and once a year since then, with the exception of 1896 (when a player eligibility dispute canceled the game) and 2020 (COVID pandemic). The Leopards lead the series 82-72-5. The rivalry had been played every year since 1897 without interruption, reaching 123 consecutive years in 2019.



In 2021, the teams played twice in the same calendar year for the first time since 1944, when Lafayette played a limited schedule during World War II. Lafayette topped Lehigh 20-13 on April 10, 2021 in a game postponed from the 2020 fall season. They met again on Nov. 20, a 17-10 Lehigh win in Bethlehem.

Series Shift: College football's most-played rivalry will see a slight adjustment to the schedule over the next four seasons. The teams, who played in Bethlehem, Pa. in 2023, will also play the 2024 installment at Lehigh's Goodman Stadium in a game originally slated for Easton.

The series will move back to Fisher Stadium for two straight contests in 2025 and 2026, when Lafayette undertakes its bicentennial celebration in the 2025-26 academic year in honor of the school's 1826 founding by the citizens of Easton. From 2027 on, the ledger will feature the matchup rotating between the two campuses located less than 20 miles apart.

Series MVP: Media members have voted on the game MVP since 1960. Soph. QB **Dean DeNobile** claimed the award in 2023 when he threw for three touchdowns and ran for another. OLB **Billy Shaeffer** won in 2022 after recording a 50-yard pick-six to go along with eight tackles and a fumble recovery. **Jeffrey Kordenbrock '21** captured the honor in 2019 -- the first Leopard kicker since 1970 to win. Prior to that, Ross Scheuerman '15 was the last Leopard winner (2014), running for a school-record 304 yards to lead Lafayette to a 27-7 win at Yankee Stadium in Rivalry 150. There have been nine two-time winners: **Jon Hurt** (2005, 06) **Brad Maurer** (2004, 06), **Tom Costello** (1988, 89) and **Erik Marsh** (1992, 94) from Lafayette and **Kim McQuilken** (1972, 73), **Marty Horn** (1983, 85), **Ron Jean** (1998, 99), **J.B. Clark** (2008, 09) and **Nick Shafnisky** (2015, 16) from Lehigh. In the series, there have been co-MVP's twice (1976 and 2006).

Rivalry Appearances: Rivalry 159 marked the second appearance in the annual match-up for **John Troxell '94** as Lafayette's head coach with a 2-0 record. As an assistant coach from 2001-05, Troxell had a 3-2 record. As a player (1990-93), the 1994 alum was 1-3.

Leopard defensive coordinator **Mike Saint Germain '07** and cornerbacks coach **Jeff Sejour '07** were each 3-1 against Lehigh during their playing careers. Saint Germain can also claim a win at Yankee Stadium in 2014 as an assistant coach under Frank Tavani.

GAME 1 LAFAYETTE 19 SACRED HEART 14

FAIRFIELD, Conn. – Sophomore **Jamar Curtis** ran for 181 yards and a touchdown, propelling Lafayette to a 19-14 win over Sacred Heart.

For the second straight season, Lafayette needed a defensive stand to hold off the Pioneers, and the defense's repeat performance did not disappoint. Sophomore **Taylor Smallwood** picked off a fourth-down pass with 1:40 left in the game with Sacred Heart threatening from the five-yard line.

The Leopards took over and Curtis' 47-yard run put the Leopards in the win column. He had 19 carries for 181 yards (both career highs) and a touchdown, including 115 yards in the first half (which matched Sacred Heart's final game total).

The Leopards scored on their first offensive possession of the 2023 season, putting together an eight-play, 86-yard drive. Curtis, the Leopards' leading rusher from 2022, ran five times for 71 yards on the drive and finished off the scoring march with a breakaway 28-yard touchdown run. Rookie **Jack Simonetta** added the PAT for the 7-0 lead six minutes into the game.

A turnover appeared to shift the momentum toward the hosts' side. Soph. QB **Ryan Schuster** hit TE **Mason Gilbert** for nine yards, but the Pioneers dislodged the ball and took over at the Lafayette 40. The Leopards' defense was up to the task. Freshman **Michael Vaughn** and junior **Phillip Peiffer** recorded back-to-back sacks and forced a 36-yard field goal that went wide right. Lafayette led 7-0 at the end of the first quarter.

Two and half minutes into the second quarter, the Leopards extended the lead to 13-0. Curtis had 19 rushing and 11 receiving yards on the drive and was aided by 17 rushing yards from junior **Jermaine Conyers**. On the scoring play, Schuster faked the handoff to Conyers, and slid off the left tackle and in for a four-yard score.

Sacred Heart got on the scoreboard just before the end of the first half. Jalen Madison bounced off a couple of would-be tacklers to run it in from 17 yards out. Despite the score on the drive, Lafayette's defense held Sacred Heart's running game in check, limiting the Pioneers to 31 yards in the opening 30 minutes. Curtis' 115 rushing yards eclipsed his single-game high from 2022 (108 vs. Lehigh on Nov. 19).

The 13-7 halftime advantage held through the end of the third quarter and as the Pioneers missed a second field goal, a 23-yarder midway through the session.

At 11:41 in the fourth, Sacred Heart took its first lead of the game on Cade Pribula's 11-yard pass to Ethan Hilliman in the corner of the endzone. The PAT was good and Sacred Heart lead 14-13.

After the score, the Leopards went to sophomore **Dean DeNobile** at quarterback and junior **Nahjee Adams** at running back. A 24-yard screen pass to Adams kept the drive moving, and then a DeNobile 21-yard scramble took the Leopards to the one-yard line. A one-yard run off tackle by Adams gave the Maroon and White a 19-14 advantage on Adams' first career score.

Lafayette went for two, as DeNobile completed a pass to Smith, but Lafayette was whistled for offensive pass interference, negating the try. Lafayette's second pass attempt went incomplete and Lafayette led 19-14 with 7:24 left.

On the ensuing kickoff, Sacred Heart's Jon Moccia tore off a 47-yard return and Leopards' kicker **Jakob Trestik** saved a score by knocking him out of bounds just inside Leopard territory. The Pioneers picked up a 3rd-and-9 at the Lafayette 45-yard line with an 11-yard completion. Then, Malik Grant's 14-yard run took SHU to the four-yard line.

On the next snap, junior **Terrell Cannon** and freshman **Jaylon Joseph** stopped Grant for no gain. The Pioneers went to Grant again and seniors **Billy Shaeffer** and **Blamassi Meite** stuffed Grant for a loss. It was junior safety **Saiku White's** turn on third down and he stopped Pribula for no gain. After a Lafayette timeout, Sacred Heart went back to the pass, setting up Smallwood's game-changing interception with 1:40 left.

Smallwood smartly knelt down for the touchback and the Leopards took over. Two plays later Curtis' 47-yard run ended the suspense.

Defensively, White had a team-best 12 tackles while senior LB **Marco Olivas** added nine. Senior LB **Preston Forney** contributed 3.5 tackles for loss and seven stops while Vaughn had a pair of sacks.

GAME 2 LAFAYETTE 7 DUKE (NO. 21) 42

DURHAM, N.C. – No. 21 Duke pulled away from Lafayette in the second half, finishing with a 42-7 final on a rainy night at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The Leopards and Blue Devils traded scores in the first quarter. Duke, coming off a win over No. 9 Clemson, took the opening possession and put together an eight-play, 68-yard drive over 3:48 to lead 7-0. Riley Leonard's 19-yard pass to Jalon Calhoun accounted for the score.

When the Leopards got the ball for the first time, the offense was ready. With sophomore **Dean DeNobile** under center, Lafayette engineered a 13-play, 75-yard scoring march. Lafayette possessed the ball for 9:15, as DeNobile completed five passes for 42 yards and ran for 11 more.

GAME 3 LAFAYETTE 24 COLUMBIA 3

EASTON, Pa. – Lafayette turned in its best offensive performance to date, racking up 392 yards of total offense on the way to a 24-3 final over Columbia at Fisher Stadium.

Sophomore running back **Jamar Curtis** registered his second 100-yard rushing game of the season, churning out 145 yards on 20 carries with a pair of touchdowns. Junior RB **Nahjee Adams** and sophomore **Dean DeNobile** added 61 and 20 rushing yards, respectively. DeNobile made his second straight start at quarterback and finished 15-of-22 for 149 yards in the air.

Nine minutes into the game, Columbia took an early 3-0 lead when Hugo Merry converted a 42-yard field goal try on the Lions' second possession of the game.

On the ensuing Leopards' drive, the Maroon and White offense got things going. Facing a 3rd-and-15 near midfield, DeNobile completed a pair of passes to Curtis for 12 and seven yards to pick up the first down. At the Columbia 33-yard line, Adams looked as if he had been stopped at the line of scrimmage, but kept his feet, spun off the pile and broke away for a 32-yard gain before being upended at the one-yard line. A play later, DeNobile and company rammed the ball in for a one-yard score, taking the Leopards into halftime.

In the second half, the Lafayette offense created some breathing room. DeNobile hit junior WR **Chris Carasia** for a 30-yard pass to midfield. Five plays later Curtis ran in his second TD of the game, carrying it in from 29 yards out for the 21-3 lead.

Just before the end of the third quarter, Lafayette recorded its first turnover of the game when soph. DB **Byron Johnson** intercepted Columbia QB Caden Bell. A 16-yard **Jermaine Conyers** rush set up a 34-yard field goal by Simonetta that extended the Leopards' lead to 24-3 with 14:14 left in the game.

That score held as the final as Lafayette knelt down in the final minute just short of the endzone. The Leopards enjoyed an 11-minute advantage in time of possession. Perhaps most telling was their performance on third down, as the Leopards converted 9-of-17 and were 3-for-3 on fourth down.

Defensively, Lafayette limited Columbia to 157 yards of total offense and 2-of-11 on third down. Senior LB **Marco Olivias** was flying all over the field on Saturday, making seven tackles with 1.5 sacks, joining fellow linebacker **Preston Forney** with seven stops, while **Tim O'Hearn** contributed six stops.

EASTON, Pa. – Soph. QB **Dean DeNobile** threw two touchdowns and ran for two more to spur Lafayette to a 28-20 win over Monmouth on a rainy afternoon at Fisher Stadium.

The Leopards improved to 3-1 with the win over the CAA opponent, a mark Lafayette last reached in 2012.

Lafayette's second straight win was sparked by the running game, as the Leopards racked up 206 yards. Soph. **Jamar Curtis** churned out his third 100-plus yard rushing game of the season, carrying 28 times for 143 yards. The Waldorf, Md. is averaging 128 yards per game. Making his third start of the season, DeNobile ran for 50 yards of his own with two rushing TDs.

On the other end of the field, Lafayette's defense limited Monmouth's running game to 59 yards led by junior S **Saiku White** and senior LB **Preston Forney** with nine tackles apiece. Lafayette rang up a season-high seven sacks (the most since 2021).

Just before the end of the first quarter, the Leopards forced the first turnover of the game. Forney dislodged the ball from the Hawks' Jaden Shiren, and the Leopards took over near midfield. On the resulting drive, Lafayette moved the ball on the ground as Curtis accounted for 47 yards. DeNobile finished off the scoring march with a one-yard push and a little help from his friends. The Leopards led 14-3 with 8:23 left in the half.

Monmouth added a 36-yard field goal as time expired and the Leopards led 14-6 at halftime.

As the second half opened, the Leopard defense stopped the Hawks on the opening drive and forced a punt. PRINCETON, N.J. – **Blamassi Meite's** safety with 1:57 left in regulation sealed the Leopards' 12-9 win over Princeton on a rainy, but joyous, afternoon at Princeton Stadium.

Lafayette improves to 5-1, its best mark since 2009, and eclipses the program win total from each of the last eight seasons. The Leopards finish their non-league slate with a 4-1 mark, snapping a 12-game series win streak for the Tigers.

Playing in his home state, soph. QB **Dean DeNobile** completed 20-of-28 for 177 yards and a touchdown. Soph. RB **Jamar Curtis** carried 22 times for 83 yards against a formidable Princeton run defense. On defense, seniors **Billy Shaeffer** and **Marco Olivass** registered 10 tackles apiece with Shaeffer accumulating three tackles for loss with two sacks and a forced fumble. The Leopards had seven sacks for the third straight game. The defense stifled the Princeton run game, holding the Tigers to three yards while limiting them to 3-of-13 on third down.

The teams traded field goals on the opening possessions of the game. DeNobile's 36-yard toss to **Elijah Steward** set up a 40-yard field goal for **Jack Simonetta** (the longest kick of his career).

Princeton responded with a drive comprised mostly of passing, including a 43-yarder from Blake Stenstrom to A.J. Barber. When the Lafayette defense settled in, the Leopards forced a 29-yard field goal that tied the game 3-3.

Princeton took its first lead before the end of the first quarter. Stenstrom hit Barber for 57 yards to set up an 11-yard TD pass to Luke Collella in the corner of the endzone where he was able to get one foot down on a leaping grab. The Tigers missed the PAT and led 9-3.

The Leopards grabbed the lead just before intermission, taking over inside the Princeton half following a punt. A DeNobile to **Mason Gilbert** connection converted a 3rd-and-7 and kept the scoring drive alive. The Leopards faced a 4th-and-5 at the Princeton 15-yard line and Leopard head coach John Troxell sent a message to his team, eschewing a field goal attempt for a pass play after a Princeton timeout. The call worked as designed as Gilbert was wide open for a 15-yard touchdown pass from DeNobile up the Lafayette sideline. Simonetta's PAT gave Lafayette the 10-9 lead at halftime.

Three minutes into the second half, Lafayette stopped the Tigers near midfield when Shaeffer broke through for a sack. Princeton returned the favor, stuffing the Leopards on two straight running plays, including fourth down at the Princeton 37-yard line at 9:28.

In the third quarter, Princeton had the ball deep in the Leopards' half, before Shaeffer came up with his second sack of the afternoon and slapped the ball loose from Stenstrom. Meite recovered the fumble and Lafayette maintained its 10-9 lead through the third quarter.

Six minutes into the final quarter, the Leopards came up with another defensive stand. On third down, **Tim O'Hearn** batted away a Stenstrom pass and forced a 37-yard field goal attempt. The snap was a bit low and the attempt went wide right.

Princeton had the ball for a final time with two minutes left in the game, but Meite's safety ended the suspense as Lafayette pulled away for the 12-9 final.

GAME 7 LAFAYETTE 38 HOLY CROSS (11/15) 35

WORCESTER, Mass. — Lafayette churned out the signature victory thus far in the **John Troxell** era, a 38-35 Patriot League win over No. 11/15 Holy Cross. Soph. RB **Jamar Curtis** carried the ball 30 times for 229 yards and punched in a pair of scores as the Leopards' offense was up to the task on a rainy and windy afternoon at Fitton Field.

For the 6-1 Leopards, it is the first triumph over a nationally-ranked team since 2013 (a win over Lehigh) and today's victory guarantees a winning season on College Hill for the first time since 2009. In addition, Lafayette snapped Holy Cross' 18-game Patriot League win streak, and improved to 2-0 in Patriot League play.

The Leopards controlled the game from start to finish thanks to a balanced offensive attack and a defense that made timely plays. Leopard offensive coordinator **T.J. DiMuzio** paired Curtis' 229 yards (the most for a Leopard since 2014) with an efficient effort from QB **Dean DeNobile**, who was 12-of-17 for 262 yards with a pair of passing touchdowns and one more on the ground.

The teams traded first quarter scores. A 40-yard pass from DeNobile to **Elijah Steward** set up the Leopards' score. Curtis picked up 23 yards on the drive, including a one-yard TD run off the right end to claim the lead at 8:34.

The Crusaders responded with a drive fueled solely by the ground game. Holy Cross QB **Matthew Sluka** ran for 51 yards on the drive and finished it with a 29-yard score to knot the game at 7-7 with 4:55 left in the first.

The Leopards re-took the lead just before the end of the first quarter. With the ball near midfield, DeNobile connected with Steward for 40 yards down to the seven-yard line. Steward finished the day with five catches for 99 yards. Three plays later, DeNobile punched it in from a yard out to give Lafayette the lead 14-7 at the end of the first quarter.

The momentum stayed with the Leopards, clad in all white for their second game on grass this season. They extended the lead five minutes into second quarter when soph. TE **Dallas Holmes** got behind the Holy Cross coverage and DeNobile hit him for a 53-yard TD. **Jack Simonetta's** PAT stretched the lead to 21-7 where it remained through halftime.

In the second half, the Leopards' opening drive ended with a kick, a 32-yard field goal by Simonetta that expanded the lead to 24-7. The drive ran nearly six minutes off the clock, covering 15 plays.

Just over a minute later, Sluka brought the Crusaders back within 10, breaking away for a 70-yard TD run. He finished the game with 330 rushing yards and three touchdowns.

A minute later, the track meet continued. Lafayette freshman **Troy Bruce** returned the kick off 40 yards to midfield. Two plays later, rookie **Carson Persing** separated himself from a defender and was on the business end of a 43-yard TD strike from DeNobile, expanding Lafayette's lead to 31-14.

The No. 11 Crusaders rallied, with Sluka running in a four-yard touchdown just before the end of the third quarter. Eight minutes into the final quarter, Jordan Fuller pulled the hosts within three points (31-28), scoring on a 19-yard run up the middle.

The Leopards got the ball back with eight minutes left in the game and proceeded to pound it on the ground. DeNobile handed the ball off to Curtis eight straight times, picking up three first downs before the sophomore broke away for a 41-yard score that gave Lafayette some breathing room.

Holy Cross added a score with a minute left and went for the onside kick, but the Leopards recovered to finish off the Crusaders, 38-35.

Defensively, senior captain **Marco Olivas** finished with a team-high nine tackles while Saiku White and **Billy Shaeffer** added seven apiece and Shaeffer added 1.5 sacks.

GAME 8 LAFAYETTE (19/21) 35 GEORGETOWN 25

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Lafayette captured its sixth straight win with a 35-25 final over Georgetown Cooper Field. The Leopards, who broke into the top 25 polls at the beginning of game week, improved to 3-0 in Patriot League play for the first time since 2017.

The Lafayette defense came up with plays when it needed to, led by junior safety **Saiku White** who picked off a pair of passes. Senior LB **Billy Shaeffer** had a game-high 12 tackles and finished off the afternoon with an emphatic fourth-quarter sack. The Leopards limited Georgetown to 36 rushing yards and just 5-of-17 on third down.

Freshman running back **Troy Bruce** just missed his first career 100-yard rushing game, carrying eight times for 98 yards, including a 71-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. Soph. **Jamar Curtis** added 35 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

To start the game, the Hoyas set up the Leopards at midfield, as an onside kick attempt went out of bounds. After Georgetown stuffed first- and second-down runs, soph. QB **Dean DeNobile** uncorked a 45-yard pass to **Elijah Steward** that set up a three-yard touchdown run by Curtis. Lafayette led 7-0 just two minutes into the game and never trailed for the balance of the game.

Later in the first quarter, a healthy diet of Curtis stretched the lead. DeNobile (12-24-2, 171 yards, TD) hit him out in space and he scampered 27 yards behind a lead block from senior TE **Mason Gilbert**. On the next play, Curtis made a couple of quick cuts before taking the ball to the endzone for his second score of the day and a 14-0 lead.

Georgetown cut the Leopards' lead in half early in the second quarter. After a Lafayette punt, the Hoyas took over near midfield. QB Danny Lauter hit Jimmy Kibble for a short pass near the Hoya sideline eluding a couple of tackles and took it 43 yards for a touchdown. Lafayette led 14-7 with 11:24 left before half.

The Leopards used a big play to create some breathing room. On the first play after the ensuing kick-off, rookie **Troy Bruce** shook off one tackler at the line of scrimmage and then ripped off a 71-yard TD, the Leopards' longest play from scrimmage in 2023. Freshman **Jack Simonetta** added the PAT for the 21-7 lead.

Georgetown converted a field goal with five minutes left in the half and the Leopards led 21-10 at halftime.

As the second half opened, the teams traded touchdowns in the opening minutes. White's first career pick-six, a 42-yard effort, gave the Leopards a 28-10 advantage two minutes into the half.

The Hoyas answered quickly with an 81-yard TD from Lauter to Kibble that put the score at 28-16. Lauter ended the day 35-58-2 for 464 yards and three touchdowns. The Hoyas added a field goal with five minutes left in the third quarter.

Early in the fourth quarter when the Leopards needed some breathing room, freshman **Devin Paige** reeled in an acrobatic catch with one foot down in the endzone for his first career touchdown. The 27-yard strike from DeNobile extended the advantage to 35-19 at 13:06.

Georgetown added a late touchdown on another Lauter TD pass. The Hoyas followed with their second onside kick, which the Leopards handled to end the game.

COLGATE 37 OT

EASTON, Pa. – Colgate handed Lafayette football its first Patriot League loss of the season, beating the No. 16/20 Leopards 37-34 in overtime at Fisher Stadium.

It was a tale of two halves for Lafayette (6-2, 3-1) which lead 17-0 at halftime but was outscored 37-17 in the second half and overtime. The Leopards, who played without two of their top three tailbacks in **Jamar Curtis** and **Jermaine Conyers**, saw the continued emergence of rookie **Troy Bruce** at the position as he finished the game with 26 carries for 138 yards (both career highs) and a touchdown.

Sophomore quarterback **Dean DeNobile** threw for 237 yards and three touchdowns while connecting on 29-of-44 attempts with one interception. Colgate's Jake Stearney came off the bench to complete 13-of-21 for 146 yards and three scores. The Leopards lost the turnover battle, handing it over three times in a game in which just 18 seconds separated the teams in terms of time of possession.

Lafayette led for the entire first half, initially scoring at 6:29 in the first on **Jack Simonetta's** 37-yard field goal. Five minutes later, Lafayette extended the lead to 10-0. DeNobile threaded a pass over a Colgate defender's shoulder to rookie **Carson Persing** for a 39-yard score that held through the end of the first quarter.

The Maroon and White padded their lead mid-way through the second quarter. Junior **Chris Carasia** leaped over a defender and pulled down a 12-yard touchdown pass. The scoring play capped a 94-yard scoring drive, the Leopards' longest scoring march of the season. Lafayette led 17-0 at halftime.

In the second half, Colgate scored 21 straight points to rip the momentum from the Leopards. The first touchdown was a 28-yard pass from Stearney to Winston Moore to cut the lead to 17-7. The second score was set up by a 43-yard flea flicker from Stearney to Treyphon Saunders (19-113). Two plays later Brendan Cassmajor took a direct snap into the endzone. Lafayette held the lead 17-14 mid-way through the third quarter.

With 6:05 left in the third quarter, Colgate's offense got the ball at the Lafayette 33-yard line after a 16-yard punt. It didn't take long for Raiders to take their first lead of the game, as Stearney hit Saunders for a 20-yard touchdown.

On the ensuing Lafayette possession, the Leopards went back to the ground and Bruce was up to the task. He ran six times for 65 yards, with his final carry for four yards into the end zone as Lafayette re-took the lead 24-21.

As the fourth quarter started, Colgate re-captured the lead with a 13-play scoring march concluded by a Chris Gee three-yard run at 10:48. The Raiders stretched their advantage to 31-24 with six minutes left in the game as Jacob Jaworski converted a 31-yard field goal on a drive that had been kept alive by a 16-yard Stearney run on fourth down.

Trailing 31-24, Lafayette got the ball back with 3:28 left in the game, needing a touchdown. The Leopards went to the air. DeNobile completed six passes for 69 yards (including a pair of fourth-down conversions) with the final strike hitting **Elijah Steward** for five yards and a touchdown. Simonetta's PAT on the hold of **Darren Wu** was good, tying the game with 24 seconds left and sending it to overtime.

In OT, Colgate won the toss and chose to go on defense first. The Raiders held Lafayette to a 22-yard field goal that briefly gave the Leopards a 34-31 lead. Like Lafayette, Colgate began its possession at the 25-yard line. Gee ran twice for a total of 12 yards before a Stearney to Hutchison 13-yard TD pass ended the game, 37-34.

Defensively, the crew of **Billy Shaeffer**, **Tim O'Hearn**, **Preston Forney** and **Saiku White** combined for 26 tackles and five tackles for loss. Shaeffer accounted for seven tackles and three tackles for loss, including his team-leading ninth sack of the season. Junior LB **Reggie Thomas**, who has seen more time at linebacker as of late, chipped in with five tackles.

GAME 10 LAFAYETTE (23/25) 24
FORDHAM (RV) 16

EASTON, Pa. – Lafayette secured the Patriot League victory it needed to remain atop the Patriot League standings, beating Fordham 24-16 to improve to 8-2 overall and 4-1 in conference play.

The No. 23/25 Leopards benefited from **Jamar Curtis'** return to the lineup on Senior Day. The sophomore ran for 204 yards on 31 carries after missing the last game and a half with injury. It was the 12th 200-yard rushing game in Lafayette history. In the second quarter, Curtis ripped off a 40-yard run that set up the Leopards' first score and pushed him over 1,000 rushing yards for a season (the first Leopard to reach the 1000-yard plateau since Ross Scheuerman in 2014).

After a scoreless first quarter, the Rams got on the scoreboard. Fordham ballcarrier Julius Loughridge spun off a defender on the ground and maintained his balanced for a 24-yard touchdown. After a video review, it was determined he was down at the 11-yard line, and the Rams settled for a 29-yard field goal by Brandon Peskin.

On the next possession, the Leopards took the lead for good. Curtis' 40-yard scamper set up the Leopards deep in the Fordham half. Soph. QB **Dean DeNobile** followed with passes to **Carl Smith** (10), **Mason Gilbert** (14) and finally **Elijah Steward** for a seven-yard touchdown. **Jack Simonetta's** PAT went through and Lafayette led 7-3 at 11:32.

Lafayette stretched the lead to 14-3, 10 minutes into the second half. DeNobile's 13-yard pass converted a 3rd-and-11 inside the Fordham half, as Lafayette was 7-of-12 on third down. On the next play, he hit Steward for a 24-yard strike down to the one-yard line. Three plays later, after a couple of video reviews on running plays at the goal line, DeNobile punched in a one-yard score for a 14-3 margin.

As the fourth quarter opened, the Leopards created some breathing room with Simonetta's 24-yard field goal. Lafayette led 17-3 with 12:32 left in the game.

Three minutes later, the visitors answered with a 77-yard scoring drive capped by quarterback C.J. Montes' one-yard run to make it a one-score game 17-10. Montes finished with 46 rushing yards while throwing for 253 yards on the day.

When the Leopards got the ball back, Curtis started the drive with a 72-yard run, Lafayette's longest play from scrimmage this season. Four plays later, Curtis found the endzone for the second time on the afternoon, this time from three yards out for a 24-10 lead with 6:55 left.

Fordham's 15-yard touchdown from Montes to Loughridge made it 24-16, but the PAT missed wide with 3:25 left.

Head coach John Troxell and the Leopards looked to run time off the clock, and the running game took care of that. Troxell made a gutsy decision with a 4th-and-1 situation on the Lafayette 34-yard line. After trying to draw Fordham offside, Lafayette took a timeout. Out of the timeout, the Leopards went for it and picked up six yards to put away the game.

Defensively, senior LB **Billy Shaeffer** finished with eight tackles while **Marco Olivas**, **Gabe DuBois** and **Reggie Thomas** added six stops apiece.

LEHIGH 21

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – Lafayette finished off a nine-win regular season and the program's 700th victory in the best way imaginable, beating Lehigh 49-21 to capture a Patriot League title and a triumph in Rivalry 159.

The Leopards will learn their FCS playoff first-round opponent on Sunday afternoon during the FCS Playoff selection show on ESPNU beginning at 12:30 p.m.

Under the leadership of second-year head coach **John Troxell '94**, the Leopards improved to 9-2 overall for the first time since 1981, winning the program's first championship since 2013 and the eighth Patriot League title overall. Troxell is now 2-0 against the school's archrival, pushing Lafayette to its most Patriot League victories (five) since 2006 and the program's first NCAA FCS Playoff appearance since 2013.

No. 22/24 Lafayette erased a seven-point halftime deficit, outscoring the hosts 35-0 in the second half to break open the game and start the celebration. Lafayette out-gained Lehigh 326 to 53 in the second half, as Lehigh did not make it past its own 44-yard line.

Five different Lafayette players scored touchdowns. Soph. QB **Dean DeNobile** threw for three touchdowns and 245 yards and ran for another TD to earn game MVP honors. That award just as easily could have headed to soph. RB **Jamar Curtis**, who finished the day with 27 carries for 166 yards and three touchdowns. The offense took advantage of timely play by the defense, turning the Mountain Hawks over three times, which led to 21 points.

The teams traded scores in the first quarter. With Lehigh expecting the run and stacking the box, the Leopards went right to play-action passing. DeNobile hit **Chris Carasia** for 37 yards and then **Elijah Steward** for 16 more. The Leopards faced a 4th-and-goal at the two-yard line. Senior TE **Mason Gilbert** slipped off his block and was wide open for the TD and a 7-0 lead four minutes into the game.

On Lehigh's scoring drive, the Mountain Hawks picked up 4th-and-1 at the 41-yard line. Then a 24-yard pass from Dante Perri to Jack DiPietro set up DiPietro's two-yard TD run to knot the score at 7-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Lehigh took its first lead of the game two minutes into the second quarter. Perri hit Geofrey Jamiel for a 21-yard score to cap a 12-play, 75-yard drive for the 14-7 margin.

The Leopards' defense forced a fumble deep in the Lehigh half of the field. Junior LB **Reggie Thomas** drilled Perri and rookie **Darien Riley** recovered the fumble. Lafayette's offense took advantage. A couple of Curtis runs set a DeNobile run and he stretched the ball into the endzone to tie the game at 14-14.

Lehigh re-took the lead just before the half, capping a 77-yard drive with a two-yard pass from Perri to Connor Kennedy. Lehigh led 21-14 at half, just the second time in 2023 that Lafayette trailed at intermission.

As the second half opened, the defense forced another Mountain Hawk turnover. Junior captain **Saiku White** picked off Perri inside Lehigh territory. White's third interception of the season led to a quick score. On the fifth play of the drive, DeNobile connected for a 19-yard TD to soph. **Dallas Holmes** up the seam into the endzone. Rookie **Jack Simonetta** converted the PAT and tied the game 21-21 at 11:19 in the third quarter.

The Leopards took the lead on their next possession but the drive almost ended before it got started. On 3rd-and-10 at the Leopard 24-yard line, DeNobile eluded a rusher, stepped up and zipped a pass to Curtis who picked up the first down with a 24-yard completion to midfield. On 3rd-and-7 at the 36, DeNobile hit **Elijah Steward** for 32 yards to the four-yard line. The next play to Curtis saw the 1,000-yard rusher carry it in for the TD and the 28-21 lead.

The Leopards put away the game in the fourth quarter with three more scores that finished off the Brown and White. DeNobile's pass to Carasia stretched the lead to 35-21 with 12:31 remaining.

On the ensuing kickoff, the Leopards' **Kente Edwards** forced a fumble which **Griffin Rooney** recovered deep inside Lehigh territory. The offense immediately responded, as Curtis gobbled up all of the yards and eventually scored a nine-yard touchdown. The sophomore added a 46-yard touchdown with seven minutes left to finish off the game scoring.
