Letter from the Sports Information Office at Chadron State College

It only seems like only weeks ago the 2007-08 school year ended, and yet here I am compiling the 2008-09 Chadron State College Year in Sports. I guess the clock has a tendency to run a little fast when one is dealing with sports.

The 2008-09 school year had several exciting moments, not to mention the addition of some new faces in the coaching ranks at CSC. Three new men, two of whom grew up in Chadron and the other graduated from college here, joined the coaching fraternity at Chadron State throughout the year. Tim Connealy, a Chadron native, was hired in August to guide the women's basketball program and he led the Eagles to a successful 11-16 season. Scott Simons, also a Chadron native, was hired in the winter to coach the women's golf team. And Ryan Baily, a CSC graduate, was hired in May to replace longtime track and field coach John Reiners. All three are excellent motivators and I'm looking forward to watching their programs develop over the coming years.

The student-athletes at CSC provided many memorable moments. The football team continued their record streak through the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and advanced to the playoffs for the third season in a row. Also in the fall, the volleyball and women's golf teams showed a lot of promise and grit.

In the winter, the CSC wrestling team put an automobile accident behind them and qualified four grapplers to the national tourney. Brett Hunter, who became the all-time winningest wrestler at CSC, claimed his second national championship and Josh Majerus became the school's first three-time NCAA Division II All-American.

The men's and women's basketball teams each improved their win totals from the season before and gave fans in Armstrong Gymnasium plenty of thrills.

In the spring, the track and field team, under the guidance of interim coach Willie Hoffman, steadily improved and the softball team, in just its third season of play at the D-II level, narrowly missed out on making the conference playoffs.

The success of these wonderful student-athletes only further reinforces the fact that Chadron State College is not only building futures every day, but setting all of its students up for accomplishments in other realms.

The following pages contain plenty of specifics regarding each athletic team and I hope I didn't leave anything pertinent out of the publication. The Year in Sports is celebrating its 31st year of existence and much of the credit for it reaching its third decade is due to the work of my predecessor, Con Marshall.

I hope the next year is even more successful.

Eagles dominate in 2008; win third straight RMAC title

No question about it, the Chadron State College football team had another impressive run during the 2008 season while finishing with an 11-2 record.

For the third straight year, the Eagles claimed the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference title and won a game in the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Throw in their 27-game RMAC winning streak and 13 school records and it is apparent that the season was one of the most successful in school history. No other RMAC team has ever gone won three straight conference titles or been undefeated in conference play three years in a row.

"It was probably the most satisfying season I've ever had," CSC coach Bill O'Boyle said. "The defense played well all year and it was probably the most complete team I've been around. There weren't any individuals. We played as a team and we won as a team. It was one of the hardest working teams I've ever seen."

The Eagles' only regular-season loss was to Pittsburg State 38-31 in the second game. They then won nine consecutive conference games and defeated Wayne State 23-17 in the opening round of the playoffs. Minnesota Duluth edged CSC 20-10 in the second-round game. Duluth has won twice since then and will play for the national championship on Saturday.

Led by 10 players who were first-team all-conference, the Eagles were a force to be reckoned with on both sides of the ball. Through the regular season, they averged 36.4 points and allowed the foes just 15.8 points a game. They averaged 386.11 yards a game and gave up just 240.9 to rank sixth nationally in total defense.

Chadron State led the RMAC in scoring offense and defense and total offense and defense.

Quarterback Joe McLain, who was named the RMAC Offensive Player of the Year and ended his career with a 38-4 record as a starter, set four school records before having his senior season cut short by the broken collarbone late in the third quarter of the game with Wayne State.

The Chadron native completed 238 of 374 passes for

2,707 yards and 28 touchdowns this fall. His number of completions, touchdowns and 63.6 completion percentage are CSC records. So were his 38 pass completions against Pittsburg State. He also ranks second or third in six more CSC seasonal and career lists.

Few, if any, CSC quarterbacks could throw better on the run and keep opposing defenses off-stride more effectively.

Other seasonal records were Brandon Harrington's *Continued on Page 5*



82 pass receptions, Travis Atter's 17 field goals and freshman Maurice Threatts 32.4-yard kickoff return average. With one more season to go, Atter has already set career records for most extra points (162) and kick scoring points (279), breaking marks that had belonged to Chadron product Jay Masek.

Harrington and another tall, athletic junior, Isaac Stockton, gave the Eagles one of the nation's elite pass receiving duos. While Harrington grabbed 82 passes for 899 yards and nine touchdowns, Stockton caught 69 for 739 yards and 10 TDs.

The running game was not a potent as it had been the previous four seasons when two-time Harlon Hill Trophy winner Danny Woodhead was on his way to becoming college football's all-time leading rusher. The Eagles averaged only 135.5 yards rushing this fall, their lowest figure since 1988, and rushed for a total of just 55 yards in the two games they lost.

At the season's end, all four of the Eagles' top running backs were nursing injuries, illustrating that a team can't have too much depth at the position.

Still, the Eagles nearly always found a way to score. They posted points 87 percent (54 of 62) times they reached the red zone. The fact that the offensive line allowed just 17 sacks, or 1.4 per game, was another bonus.

The kicking game was another positive. Along with Atter's record-setting placekicking, Kevin Berg averaged 39.6 yards per punt and didn't have any of his 62 punts blocked.

The defensive unit, led by a bevy of seniors—several of them four-year regulars—was outstanding, as O'Boyle pointed out. Blessed by lots of savvy and excellent speed, the defense ranked among the top 10 in Division II in several categories including rushing, total and scoring defense and sacks. The Eagles had 48 of the latter for 302 yards in losses by the opponents. The 109 total tackles for losses illustrate how aggressive the defenders played.

Ten of the Eagles' 11 busiest tacklers were seniors this fall. Inside linebacker Zach Wheeler participated in 80 stops while his mate at the position, Austin Bailey, took part in 76, one more than safety Trevor Hyatt.

"The work ethic and the leadership were outstanding," O'Boyle said of the senior class, which finished with a 39-10 record the past four years and 35-4 during the last three. "This was a group that we didn't have to say a lot to. It meant so much to them to be prepared each week and the guys were always watching film on their own. This group really put their time in. Hopefully it rubbed off on the younger players."

Verify Sports **Pieces are in place for successful volleyball team**

Although the Chadron State volleyball team didn't end its 2008 season with the number of wins it was looking for – the Eagles finished with a 3-26 record – coach Amy Spruiell feels the pieces are in place for future success.

"We have a young setter who trained well this year and we're looking for her to do good things in the future," she said. "We have a good nucleus of experienced players, especially on the defensive side."

To be sure, the Eagles will have to replace some holes left by five graduating seniors, but with six underclassmen and three redshirts getting into the action next season, Spruiell is excited about the potential her team possesses.

"We feel like we have a solid recruiting class and I'm really excited to see the incoming freshmen work together with the returning team members," she said. Despite the losing record this season, there were several bright spots for CSC. Senior libero Jennifer Luatua was named the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year. It's the first time in school history a volleyball player has won a conference player of the year award. Luatua, a senior libero from Everett, Wash., led the Eagles with 483 total digs and averaged 5.62 digs a set. Luatua's average of 5.62 digs led the nearest RMAC defensive specialist by more than one dig.

For her career, Luatua averaged 5.22 digs a set (1,233 total), the highest dig average of any volleyball player in school history. She was a three-year letterwinner and a team captain in 2008.

Jamie O'Brien also had a solid season, exemplified by her consistent play at a variety of positions, and Spruiell liked the steady progression of true freshman setter Skye Duncan.

## CSC women took strides under first-year head coach

The Chadron State women's basketball team had a successful season, posting an 11-16 record to finish with the most wins since the 2002-03 squad won 13 games.

The Eagles found their niche under first-year coach Tim Connealy and his free-flowing motion offense. CSC averaged 70.4 points a game, which is 10 more points than the 2007-08 team averaged.

The Eagles were also lethal from beyond the arc by shattering the school record for most 3-pointers made in a season by knocking down 261 treys. The old record was 205 set in 2000-01.

The Eagles also led all of NCAA Division II with 3-pointers made per game with 9.7.

A pair of junior guards led the Eagles and for their efforts they were placed on the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference All-Conference teams.

Sunni Busch was named to the East Division Second Team, and Alyssa Lyman earned a spot on the third team.

Busch scored 15.6 points and grabbed 9.4 rebounds a game to lead the Eagles in both categories. She also handed out 3.4 assists a game and collected 41 steals. Busch tied for the RMAC lead with 12 double-doubles and became the ninth woman in CSC history to score over 1,000 points.

Busch has scored 1,067 points in her career to rank ninth all-time at CSC and she's the fourth-leading rebounder in school history with 587.

Lyman was second on the team in scoring with 14

## CSC men's basketball team continues to improve

For the third straight year, the Chadron State men's basketball team improved its seasonal record and the Eagles were highly competitive in a number of games.

Chadron State finished the 2008-09 campaign with an 8-19 record but the Eagles were close in a majority of contests, losing 12 games by less than 10 points. Add to that CSC's inexperience – seven of the 11 players were freshmen – and it's easy to see why head coach Brent Bargen is excited for the future.

"We had a very young team and we were very competitive," the third-year coach said. "I'm excited about this team and the program and we'll continue to move forward with what we learned this season."

Tim McLaurin, a sophomore from Compton, Calif., led the Eagles in points (18.2), rebounds (5.4) and assists (3.7) and he was named to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference East Division First Team. He was the team's high scorer in 17 games and reached double-digit points in 25 of 27 games played.

For the season, McLaurin shot 42 percent from the field (166-394) and 79 percent from the foul line (125-157).

McLaurin also recorded just the second triple double

## Seniors led wrestling team; Hunter wins national title

The storybook of Brett Hunter's wrestling career just added another chapter, not to mention the perfect ending.

Hunter, who is the school's all-time winningest wrestler with a 133-32 record, won his second national championship by claiming a 3-2 decision over Nebraska-Kearney's Marty Usman during the 174-pound finals of the NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships on March 14.

"It feels amazing to be on top of that podium again," Hunter, a senior from Rushville said. "This championship by far means so much more to me than the one two years ago because Usman beat me all year. And after not placing last year, I'm sure I had doubters. I knew if I got to the national championship, I'd wrestle my best and it was my time.

"To say I ended my career at Chadron State with two titles is very special. There have been a lot of great wrestlers to come through this program and to be mentioned with them is an honor. Nineteen years of wrestling has paid off."

The victory was especially sweet since Usman had defeated Hunter three times this season leading up to Saturday's match.

In the finals, Hunter and Usman wrestled to a 0-0 tie after the first period, but Hunter got on the board with a takedown with 36 seconds remaining in the second period to take a 2-0 lead. Usman escaped seconds later and the period ended with Hunter leading, 2-1.

In the third period, Usman chose bottom and Hunter gained over a minute of riding time before cutting Usman lose with 30 seconds to go.

With less than six seconds to wrestle, Usman tried to takedown Hunter, but the shot fell short and Hunter claimed the 3-2 victory, thanks to the point for riding time.

Hunter said a big key to the match was when he chose neutral at the beginning of the second period.

"Usman has turned me every time this year he's been on top, so I went neutral and stayed low," he said. "I attacked and it worked because my gameplan was to get a lead on him and I was able to do that once I got a takedown out of neutral. From there I just got

momentum and stayed in good position.

"Late in the third period, I saw there was 52 seconds of riding time and so I knew I had to do whatever it took to ride him out for eight more seconds. I cut him after I got over a minute and I was able to hold on for the win."

Earlier in the day, Hunter defeated Upper Iowa's Mitch Norton in the semifinals 5-3 to secure his spot in the finals.

Chadron State's Josh Majerus also earned All-American honors during Saturday's championship by finishing in fourth place. For Majerus it was the third straight year he earned All-American status.

Majerus, a national champion in 2008, won two matches on Saturday before falling to Nebraska-Kearney's Matt Ferrell in the third place match. He earned a 4-1 decision over Augustana's Tyler Copsey and a 15-0 technical fall over New Mexico Highlands' Luke McPeek. However, Farrell won the third place match by pinning Majerus in 4:50.

Majerus is just the third CSC wrestler to garner All-American honors three times and he's the first to accomplish that feat while competing at the Division II level. Majerus ends his career with the second most wins in school history, posting a record of 117-43.

The University of Nebraska-Omaha walked away with the team title, scoring an impressive 146.5 points. The national championship is the fifth for the Mavericks.

Newberry finished second with 80.5 points.

Chadron State finished in 11th place, scoring 36 points.

# Softball team continues to climb in its third season

The Chadron State softball team took the next step in its progression as a third-year program in 2009 by just missing out on qualifying for the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference playoffs. The Eagles, who finished the season with a 20-30 overall and a 13-21 mark in the RMAC, were just one game away from advancing into the postseason tourney.

Although the Eagles didn't reach their ultimate goal, the 2009 season was still a success. The 20 victories is a school record and that includes their first-ever win against a ranked opponent when they defeated Metro State.

The Eagles also fared well at the Rebel Spring Games in Florida. Against some of the better teams in Division II, CSC posted a 5-5 record.

Several individual honors also went to senior pitcher Casey Williams.

Williams, a senior from New South Wales, Australia, include being named CSC's RMAC Female Scholar-Athlete for 2008-09. In addition, she was placed on the 2009 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American Softball Team selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

She was also chosen by the coaches as the RMAC's Pitcher of the Year and was placed on the Daktronics All-Central Region Second Team.

Then came an array of academic honors. She was the conference's Academic Player of the Year and was placed on the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District 7 First Team. The Academic All-American honors followed last week.

This past season, she had a 15-10 record and tossed 19 complete games, including four shutouts. At one point in the season, she had a 22-inning scoreless streak. Her 185 strikeouts were posted during 156.2 innings in the circle. She gave up just 124 hits and walked 64.

Williams led the RMAC in earned run average (2.46), strikeouts (185) and opponents' batting average (.220) this spring.

During her two seasons at CSC, Williams struck out 357 batters in 319.1 innings, had 37 complete games and seven shutouts. She was the Eagles' winning pitcher in 29 of the 40 games they won the past two years.

Cassie Humphrey of Chadron also was named to the RMAC All-Academic First-Team for 2009 and made

Erica Colbert of Cheyenne was placed on the RMAC Academic Second-Team. Her GPA after four semesters at CSC is 3.82.

Stephanie Hillman of Rapid City, Jamie Mazankowski of Kearney, Angie Heesacker of Hay Springs, Melissa Lohr of Eaton, Colo., Katelyn Moore of Chadron and Andrea Wyman of Silver Creek received honorable mention.

Katie Bolin, a sophomore from Kearney, had the team's highest batting average. She had 37 hits in 106 at bats for a .349 average. Her hits included six doubles, a triple and seven home runs.

Allison Hendricksen, a junior from Cozad, hit .319, collecting a team-high 52 hits in 163 at bats. She had nine doubles and eight homers. She scored 52 runs and drove in 32, both team highs.

Also hitting well was senior Kristy Long of Sterling, Colo. She finished the season with a .315 average after getting 39 hits in 124 at bats. She had five doubles and seven home runs.

Mazankowski hit .294 (42 hits in 143 at bats), Humphrey .287 (49-171) and Williams .265 (39-147). Mazankowski led the Eagles in doubles with 10, one more than Humphrey, who also smacked five homers and was successful on all eight of her stolen base attempts to pace the Eagles.

Humphrey also led the team in runs scored with 30 and was second in RBI's with 25.

Colbert ranked second in runs scored with 25. She finished with seven doubles, a triple and nine home runs while batting .235. Her home run total was the team high.

## CSC track team had many bright spots, despite injuries

There were some lows, but also many highs for the Chadron State College track and field team during the 2009 season.

Most of the lows can be explained in two words: injuries and weather. Both kept the Eagles from accomplishing as much as was hoped. However, interim coach Willie Hoffman pointed out the athletes who were able to compete did well.

Six proven veterans missed all or parts of the season because of a variety of leg ailments, while several freshmen also experienced physical problems that sidelined them entirely or limited their performances.

Because of the weather, six meets, or about half those on the schedule, were either cancelled or had to be rescheduled. Much of the spring also was not conducive to training outdoors.

However, the Eagles also had lots of bright spots. They had 44 performances that made the school's all-time top 10 lists in various events. Twenty-three of them came indoors and the remaining 21 outdoors.

Some of the highlights included:

■ Winning six field events at the Colorado State-Pueblo Meet to open the outdoor season and claiming five firsts and five seconds at the Nebraska-Kearney Twilight Meet. Also, Brandon Harrington won three firsts at the University of Colorado Open Meet in April and won the long jump at the RMAC Outdoor Meet.

■ Personal bests in nearly every event they entered by throwers such as Jessica Horsley, Kate Jungck and Wade Crawford, and the progress made by Ryan Shelton, who's shot put mark of 53-3 ³/₄ is the best ever by a CSC freshman.

■ An excellent group of male long and triple jumpers led by Harrington and freshman Lanar Newman. The Eagles placed first, third, fourth and fifth in the long jump, and second and fifth in the triple jump at the UNK Twilight Meet. Ten days later, Harrington was first and Newman was third in the long jump at the RMAC Meet. Both also placed in the triple jump. Harrington had CSC's fourth best all-time outdoor long jump (23-10 ½) and Newman had the third best indoor triple jump (48-3 ½) and tied for sixth best

■ Consistent performances by all three woman pole vaulters. Each of them finished among the top six at both of the RMAC Meets. Senior Kelli Payne finished third and junior Megan Harrell fourth on CSC's all-time indoor list with marks of 10-11 ³/₄ and 10-6, respectively, while freshman Kalen Prentice cleared 10-8 ³/₄ at the RMAC Outdoor Meet to match the school record Payne set in 2007. Payne, who had a stress fracture in her foot but still competed, cleared 10-6 three times in addition to going 10-11 ³/₄ to earn second place at the RMAC Indoor Meet.

■ The promise shown by freshman Lincoln Proud in the 400 hurdles and multi events. He finished fourth in both the RMAC heptathlon indoors and the RMAC decathlon outdoors.

Hoffman said losing some of the team's top athletes such as high jumper Riley Northrup, distance runner Joe Schultz and middle distance runner Jake Gruver before the season began was a big blow. Also among the men, John Ritzen missed the outdoor season because of an ankle problem after he had done well, particularly in the triple jump, indoors.

The women's team had a major setback when distance standout Stacy Girard, who improved her own school record in the mile indoors and qualified for both the National Indoor and Outdoor Meets, was forced to withdraw from both because of a persistent foot problem.

A foot injury also limited the availability of Julia

Bayer, the team's leading jumper and hurdler. Bayer's indoor marks of 19-1  $\frac{1}{2}$  in the long jump and 38-  $\frac{1}{4}$  in the triple jump rank third and fifth on CSC's all-time lists, respectively, but she was able to jump just twice outdoors.

Two of the top freshman female recruits, Kaylee King of Crawford and Trae Patch of Lingle, Wyo., missed both the indoor and outdoor seasons because of leg problems that were left over from their high school days.

The season definitely was bittersweet for freshman Ackeem Smith, one of four Jamaicans to join the Eagles this year. At his first two meets, Smith set school records of 7.46 in the 55-meter hurdles and 8.04 in the 60-meter hurdles. But at the RMAC Indoor Meet, Smith was disqualified for a false start in the preliminaries.

Smith was still qualified for the National Indoor Meet and got off to a good start during the preliminaries in Houston. However, he was bumped by the runner in the next lane and was forced to catch himself on a hurdle midway the race and was again disqualified.

Hamstring problems also surfaced and it was decided that Smith should redshirt during the outdoor season.

Hoffman said the assortment of injuries could make the Eagles a stronger team next season if the athletes regain can their health. Nearly all of them took red-

Hoffman added that of all the injuries the Eagles sustained the ones that disappointed him the most were to senior sprinters Gary Metcalf and Barbara Goe at the RMAC Outdoor Meet.

Both had run extra well at the UNK Twilight Meet, where Goe won the 200 and Metcalf set a meet record in the 100 and was second in the 200. But Goe was not at full speed and finished fifth in the 200 at the RMAC Meet, and Metcalf easily qualified for the finals in both sprints, but was forced to withdraw from them.

"Both had earned lots of points and been outstanding team members since they joined us three years ago," Hoffman noted. "It was tough knowing that neither of them could run their best at the conference meet where their careers were ending. I hope they'll eventually forget that and remember all the good things they did for our team."

This season, Goe set the school record of 25.33 in the 200 meters indoors and had CSC's second best time of 25.14 outdoors. She also owns the school record of 7.93 seconds in the 60 meters and has the seventh best mark of 12.51 in the 100.

Metcalf holds the second fastest times of 6.22 in the 55 and 21.90 in the 200 indoors and had career best marks of 10.73 in the 100 and 21.21 in the 200 outdoors. The latter time ranks third on the CSC list.

# **CSC freshman qualified for College Finals in bareback riding**

Freshman Whitten Hoover of Ainsworth became the first Chadron State contestant to qualify for the College National Finals Rodeo since 2006 when he finished third in bareback riding during the 2008-09 season in the Central Rocky Mountain Region.

Hoover placed among the top five in the bareback standings at the final eight rodeos in the region during the year. He was not bucked off at any of those rodeos. He also continued to stay aboard his three broncs at the finals in Casper, but failed to mark his horse on its first jump out of the chute in the third go-round, and did not qualify for the finals.

Hoover had scores of 65 and 72 points in the first two go-rounds, putting him in 17th place among the 39 entries entering the third go-round.

Hoover is just the second bareback rider in the college's rodeo history to qualify for the national finals. The first was Sam Perkins in 1975. Perkins later qualified for the PRCA national finals in bareback riding six times. His highest ranking on the pro circuit was in 1979, when he finished second in the final standings and became just the third bareback rider in history to earn more than \$50,000 in the event in a year.

Two CSC cowgirls, senior Lisa Vroman and freshman Kelsey Scott, were in contention to rank among the top three breakaway ropers in the region right up to the end of the season. Scott had the lead in the region after the five fall rodeos.

This year's CSC rodeo coach, Dustin Luper, was selected as the Central Rocky Mountain Region's Coach of the Year by his peers. This was Luper's first year as the CSC coach. He took on the responsibility while working on his master's degree at the college.

Luper said he thoroughly enjoyed his experience at CSC in 2008-09. He had high praise for his protégés.

"Our team members did a great job," Luper said. "Many of them have made tremendous improvement. Two of them will graduate, but the rest are planning to return. I think we'll have a few more national qualifiers next year."

Another special honor went to Judd Hoos and Adam Hofmaier. Each received the Unsung Hero award from the College Football Chronicle. Hoos won it in 1996 and Hofmaier claimed the award in 1997.

## **Chadron State College's National Champions**

A summary of the national championship accomplishments follow:

**Wrestling**—Bob Lynch was the NAIA 158-pound national champion in 1971-72, concluding his season with a perfect 30-0 record.

**Wrestling**—Brent Hunter was the NCAA II 165-pound national champion in 2006-07, concluding his season with a 35-7 record.

**Wrestling**—Josh Majerus was the NCAA II 197-pound national champion in 2007-08, concluding his season with a 37-3 record.

**Wrestling**—Brett Hunter won the NCAA II 174-pound national championship in 2008-09, concluding his season with a 35-8 record.

**Track and Field**—Tracy Heiman was the NCAA Division II indoor high jump champion in 1994 by clearing 6-93/4.

**Football**—David Jones was both the NAIA and NCAA Division II rushing champion with 1,570 yards in 1990.

**Football**—David McCartney was the NCAA Division II scoring champion in 1992 with 154 points on 25 touchdowns and two two-point conversions.

**Football**—Danny Woodhead led NCAA Division II rushing (1,840 yards), all-purpose yards (2,087) and scoring (162 points on 27 TDs) in 2004.

**Football**—Danny Woodhead led NCAA Division II in rushing (2,756), all-purpose yards (3,158) and scoring (228 points on 38 TDs) in 2006. Each of the figures also led all of college football in 2006.

**Football**—Danny Woodhead concluded his career as college football's all-time leading rusher with 7.962 yards. (He ranks second in all-purpose yards with 9,479, just 32 yards from the leader, Brian Westbrook, and second in scoring with 654 points, just two fewer than the leader, Germaine Race. Both Woodhead and Race scored an all-time best 109 touchdowns.)

**Rodeo**—Don Meter was the national collegiate calf roping champion in 1955.

**Rodeo**—Jean Fuchs was the national collegiate breakaway roping champion in 1978.

**Rodeo**—Kathy Kennedy was the national collegiate breakaway roping champion in 1979.

**Rodeo**—Shelley Meter (Don's daughter) was the allaround cowgirl at the National College Finals Rodeo in 1987.

**Rodeo**—Will Farrell was the national collegiate bullriding champion in 1999.

**Rodeo**—Dustin Elliott was the national collegiate bullriding champion in 2001.

**Rodeo**—Will Farrell was the national collegiate bullriding champion in 2002.

It could also be noted that the CSC football team led the nation in kickoff returns in 2001, when the Eagles averaged 27.04 yards.

Also, the CSC women's basketball team lead NCAA II in 3-pointers made per game in 2008-09 with 9.7.

## Majerus, Williams named RMAC Honor Student-Athletes

Wrestler Josh Majerus and pitcher Casey Williams are the recipients of Chadron State College's Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference's Honor Student-Athlete Awards for 2008-09.

The awards are given for outstanding achievement in both academics and athletics. The RMAC annually recognizes one male and one female athlete from each of its member institutions with the student-athlete awards. The recipients receive a plaque from the conference and the names of the CSC honorees are placed on a banner in Armstrong Gymnasium.

Both Majerus and Williams were outstanding students and team leaders.

Majerus, a senior from Albion and CSC's only threetime All-American at the Division II level, has a 3.57 GPA in health and physical education. He was also named to the Division II National Wrestling Coaches Association All-Academic First Team and he was the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Academic Wrestler of the Year.

Majerus is the only wrestler in RMAC history to be named Academic Wrestler of the Year two seasons in a row.

Majerus, who won a national championship in 2008 and finished as runner-up in 2007, wrapped up his career nicely by claiming a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Division II National Championships in March at 197 pounds. He has the second most wins in school history with a record of 117-43.

Williams, a senior from New South Wales, Australia, who has a 4.00 GPA in psychology, had a stellar

ending to her career in 2009, earning a bevy of postseason accolades. She was selected to the 2009 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Softball Second Team, the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Pitcher of the Year, the RMAC Academic Player of the Year, and a member of the Daktronics All-Central Region Second Team.

In 2009, Williams had a 15-10 record and tossed 19 complete games, including four shutouts. She led the RMAC in earned run average (2.46), strikeouts (185) and opponents' batting average (.220).

In the last two seasons, she has won 29 of the Eagles' 40 games

Williams also owns several school records. For her career, she struck out 357 batters, threw 319.1 innings, seven shutouts and 37 complete games.

All-time teams have been chosen throughout 2009 to help celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and Chadron State College certainly wasn't left out of the festivities.

Representatives from the conference's schools selected the RMAC all-time teams. The RMAC is the fourth oldest conference in the country, and the most historic in the western U.S.

The All-Time Football Team is dominated by former Eagles. Tailback Danny Woodhead is the RMAC All-Time Offensive Player, linebacker Kevin Homer is the All-Time Defensive Player, and current CSC athletic director Brad Smith is the All-Time Coach.

In addition, Joe Planansky is on the offensive alltime team and Casey Beran is on the defensive team.

The football squad wasn't the only all-time team to feature former CSC athletes. Tricia Lukawski was placed on the women's basketball team, Ally Malzahn is on the women's golf team and Jacqueline Wells is on the track and field team.

Woodhead, who played at CSC from 2004-07, set the NCAA all-divisions rushing record of 7,962 yards. He was a two-time winner of the Harlon Hill Award, which goes to the top player in NCAA Division II, and a three-time All-American. At the conclusion of his career, he owned nine NCAA records, nine RMAC records and 13 school records. He is currently a member of the New York Jets.

Homer, who played at CSC from 1995-98, is the Eagles' all-time leader in tackles with 525. No other CSC player has ever recorded 400 tackles. Homer also has the most tackles in a season with 156 in 1997. He was inducted into the RMAC Hall of Fame in 2006 and was an All-American in 1998.

Smith coached the CSC football team from 1987-2004 before stepping down to become the college's full-time athletic director. He helped usher the Eagles into the RMAC in 1991 and posted a 110-39 record during 14 seasons. He had an 81-25 record in RMAC games and claimed five conference titles. He also led CSC to four NCAA Division II playoffs and he was a three-time RMAC Coach of the Year.

Planansky, a tight end at CSC from 1991-94, finished his career with 154 receptions and 1,877 yards. He was an All-American in 1993 and played a season with the Miami Dolphins in 1995.

Beran, a defensive end who played from 1995-99, is

CSC's all-time sacks leader with 37. He's also tied for the most sacks in a season with 14. He was an All-American in 1999.

Malzahn, a native of Sidney, had a great career at CSC from 2005-08. In just three seasons, she had nine top 10 finishes, including two individual champion-ships.

As a junior in 2007-08, she led the Eagles at nearly every meet and she was named to the RMAC Women's Golf First Team and the RMAC All-Academic First Team.

Wells, who graduated from CSC in 2006, owns four Chadron State records. They are 48-1 ³/₄ in the shot put and 61-9 in the weight indoors, and 52-1 in the shot put and 178-0 in the hammer throw outdoors. Her outdoor shot put mark is also an RMAC record.

Wells was a nine-time conference champion and a 10-time All-American in the throws. She was selected the RMAC Regional Athlete of the Year following both the indoor and outdoor meets in 2005. Altogether, she won first in throwing events 55 times during her career.

A graduate of East Chicago (Ind.) Central High School, Lukawski is Chadron State's all-time women's basketball leading scorer and possessed 12 school records when she graduated in 1993. She poured in 1,869 points in 100 games for the Eagles. She averaged 16 points as a freshman, 20.3 as a sophomore, 18.3 as a junior and 19.7 as a senior.

She graduated with a 3.83 cumulative grade point average and is in her 14th year as a physical education teacher and coach at schools in the Chicago area. She was inducted into the East Chicago Sports Hall of Fame in 2007 and the CSC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.
