FAMOUS IDAHO POTATO BOWL: GEORGIA STATE (6-6, 4-4 SBC) vs. UTAH STATE (6-6, 4-4 MW) Saturday, Dec. 23 | 3:30 p.m. | Albertsons Stadium | Boise, Idaho

THE KICKOFF: Georgia State looks to finish the 2023 season on a strong note as the Panthers face Utah State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Dec. 23 in Boise, Idaho.

> Playing just its 14th season of football and 10th at the FBS level, Georgia State is playing in its sixth bowl game and fifth in seven seasons under head coach Shawn Elliott. GSU returns to a bowl game for the third time in the last four years.

> The Panthers have won their last two bowl games, the 2021 TaxAct Camellia Bowl vs. Ball State and the 2020 LendingTree Bowl vs. WKU.

> Head coach Shawn Elliott has led the Panthers to bowl games in five of his seven seasons. He coached the first three bowl victories in program history (2017, 2021 and 2022).

> Darren Grainger, the MVP of the 2021 TaxAct Camellia Bowl, will be under center for his second bowl game. Grainger is Georgia State's career leader in total offense, touchdown passes and touchdown responsibility while ranking second in passing yards and fourth in rushing yards.

> This season, Grainger has passed for 2,364 yards and 17 touchdowns while rushing for 625 yards and eight scores.

> Grainger is one of nine Panthers named to the All-Sun Belt Conference team:

RB Marcus Carroll (1st), T Travis Glover (1st), CB Gavin Pringle (3rd), LB Jontrey Hunter (3rd), WR Robert Lewis (3rd), QB Darren Grainger (HM), WR Tailique Williams (HM), OLB Kevin Swint (HM), S Jeremiah Johnson (HM).

> All-Sun Belt cornerback Gavin Pringle is tied for the conference lead with four interceptions.

> Senior ILB Jordan Veneziale has moved into second place in GSU history with 277 career tackles. The GSU record is 381 by Joseph Peterson (2012-15).

> Veneziale will play in game No. 59 of his career, just one behind the GSU record of 60 games played by Shamarious Gilmore.

> Georgia State is playing on national television for the seventh times this season. This will be the Panthers' second exposure on ESPN, along with four games on ESPN2 and one on ESPNU.

> After starting 4-0 for the first time, Georgia State achieved another milestone on Sept. 24 by receiving a vote in the US LBM Coaches' Poll, the Panthers' first-ever in either national poll.

GO WEST: Georgia State has played out West several times before in its brief history, including a previous trip to the state of Idaho for a 2016 game against Idaho, then a member of the Sun Belt.

> In the regular season, Georgia State has also played at Washington (2014), New Mexico State (2015), Oregon (2015) and Air Force (2016).

> In bowl play, the Panthers were in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl in 2019.

> Head coach Shawn Elliott has witnessed the blue turf first hand as a player at App State. The Mountaineers played at Boise State in the 1994 FCS playoffs but fell 17-14. Playing defensive end, Elliott had an interception in the game.

> One of the top moments in Georgia State athletics history occurred in Boise, but on the hardwood rather than the blue turf. Playing in the 2001 NCAA Basketball Tournament in Boise, the GSU men's basketball team earned its first NCAA Tournament win with a 50-49 upset of sixth-seeded Wisconsin in the first round. The Panthers, seeded 11th, trailed 49-44 with a minute to play but won on Shernard Long's basket with 12 seconds left. Lefty Driesell's Panthers fell to No. 3 seed Maryland in the second round.

GSU vs. USU: Georgia State if facing Utah State for the first time, but the Panthers have faced Aggies quarterback Levi Williams. Williams was the starter for Wyoming in the 2019 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

> Georgia State has also faced Utah State head coach Blake Anderson, formerly at Sun Belt member Arkansas State.

GRAINGER RECORD WATCH: Quarterback Darren Grainger is Georgia State's career leader in total offense, touchdown passes and touchdown responsibility while ranking second in passing yards and fourth in rushing yards.

> The first three-year starting quarterback in program history, Grainger will make his 36th career start in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

> Counting his two seasons at Furman, Grainger has amassed 10,297 yards of total offense, including 7,925 yards passing and 2,372 yards rushing with 91 TDs (69 passing,

PRINGLE'S BIG PLAYS: In his first season at GSU, cornerback Gavin Pringle earned All-Sun Belt honors. He leads Georgia State and is tied for the Sun Belt lead with four interceptions.

> Pringle made the play of the season thus far with his game-saving interception in the end zone to preserve the Panthers' 20-17 win at Louisiana. With Georgia State holding a three-point lead, Louisiana faced 3rd-and-4 at the GSU 7-yard line with 30 seconds left when Pringle grabbed the interception in the end zone to seal the win.

> In his Georgia State debut, Pringle delivered a 21-yard interception return for a touchdown in the season-opening win over Rhode Island. GSU had just tied the game at 28-all late in the third quarter, and Pringle's big play gave the Panthers a 35-28 lead they would not relinguish. **CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM** is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, <u>formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and</u>

then Turner Field, for the 2017 season. The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, which opened in 2022 at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

BIG SHOES TO FILL: Georgia State will enters the bowl game without its leading rusher (Marcus Carroll, 1,350 yards, 13 TD; portal), receiver (Robert Lewis, 70 receptions, 877 yards, 7 TD; portal) and tackler (Jontrey Hunter, 96 tackles, 7 TFL, 3 FF; opt out) as well as starting offensive linemen Travis Glover (opt out), Montavious Cunningham (portal) and Avery Reece (injury).

> Freddie Brock steps in at running back. Although he had just six carries for 31 yards this season, the transfer rushed for 1,145 yards in three seasons (25 games) at Maine, including an all-conference season in 2021.

> On the offensive line, senior Ben Chukwuma will make just his second start at left tackle. Redshirt freshman center Alec Johnson will make his first start, and sophomore transfer Lamar Robinson steps in at guard.

True freshman Cam Marshall delivered a signature moment with his blocked punt against ... Marshall.

> In a 7-7 game in the first quarter and the Thundering Herd punting from their own 17-yard line, Marshall broke through and blocked the punt. Redshirt freshman Izaiah Guy scooped it up for a 4-yard touchdown to give Georgia State the lead for good.

> Marshall's blocked punt is the first for Georgia State in 10 years (Demarius Matthews vs. Troy, 2013) and it led to the Panthers' first special teams touchdown of any kind since 2018.

IT'S ACADEMIC: Long-snapper Seth Glausier is a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy® for the second straight year. The award recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the country for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership.

> A senior from Jefferson, Ga., Glausier is a three-time CSC Academic All-District (2020, 2021 and 2023) selection. He has been recognized on the Sun Belt Conference Commissioner's List and Georgia State University President's List (4.0 semester GPA). **GOLDEN EFFORTS VS. 49ERS:** QB Darren Grainger had a record-setting performance in the Panthers' 41-25 win at Charlotte.

> Grainger completed 27 of 33 passes (82 percent) for 466 yards for the second-best single-game in program history, just five yards behind Nick Arbuckle's 2015 school record of 471 yards. He added 23 yards rushing for 489 yards of total offense, also No. 2 in GSU annals.

> Grainger rushed for one touchdown and threw three TD passes, including a 97-yard scoring pass for the longest play in GSU history. He also threw a 78-yard touchdown and a 59-yard completion to the 1-yard line to set up another score.

> Grainger's big day earned him Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week honors for the second time in his career. He was also named to the Davey O'Brien Award's Great 8 List for Week 3 and a Manning Award Star of the Week.

NEW FACES: The Panthers bolstered their roster with 32 newcomers, including 19 four-year transfers, one junior college transfer and 12 scholarship freshmen.

> Among those additions, cornerback Gavin Pringle (Bucknell), safety Tygee Leach (Lehigh), noseguard Henry Bryant (Louisville), defensive lineman Anthony Blume (Norfolk State) and offensive guard Trevor Timmons (Charlotte) have earned starting roles.

> Key backups from the transfer portal include outside linebacker Kevin Swint (Clemson), receiver Jacari Carter (Merrimack), linebacker Josiah Robinson (Coastal Carolina), offensive lineman Lamar Robinson (Norfolk State) and defensive lineman Corey Warren (Coastal Carolina).

NEWCOMERS ON STAFF: Georgia State has just one new member of the coaching staff in defensive coordinator Chad Staggs, who spent the last four years in the same role at Coastal Carolina. The veteran coordinator helped the Chanticleers go 31-7 over the last three seasons and served as interim head coach for the TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl.

> Another key staff addition is strength coach Mike Sirignano, who was instrumental in helping head coach Shawn Elliott reset the program's mindset during the offseason. Elliott and Sirignano previously worked together at South Carolina.

2015 AUTONATION CURE BOWL

SAN JOSE STATE 27, GEORGIA STATE 16 Dec. 19, 2015 • Citrus Bowl • Orlando, Fla.

A late rally fell short and Georgia State fell to San Jose State 27-16 in the inaugural AutoNation Cure Bowl. In just their sixth year of existence, the Panthers were making their first bowl appearance.

Sun Belt Player of the Year Nick Arbuckle was held to just 14-of-29 passing for 208 yards and two touchdowns but still finished the season with a Sun Belt Conference single-season record of 4,368 yards.

Georgia State saw its four-game winning streak snapped and finished 6-7.

With Georgia State trailing 13-7 early in the fourth quarter, Wil Lutz uncorked a 70-yard punt that rolled inside the SJSU 5, and the Panther defense forced a three-and-out. On the Spartans punt from the end zone, a poor snap gave Georgia State a safety, pulling the Panthers within 13-9 with 12:44 left.

After the free kick and a 24-yard return by Donovan Harden, the Panthers took over at the SJSU 36. Arbuckle hit freshman tight end Ari Werts for a first down at the 20, and two plays later Todd Boyd caught a short pass and raced 19 yards for the score. That gave Georgia State its first lead at 16-13 with 10:46 left.

But San Jose State regained the lead with a quick touchdown on a 42-yard touchdown run by quarterback Kenny Potter, moving the Spartans back in front, 20-16, with nine minutes to go.

Georgia State moved to midfield but failed to convert a 3rd-and-one with eight minutes left. The Panthers went for it on fourth down, and freshman receiver Penny Hart got behind the defense, but Arbuckle's pass was just out of his reach.

"We put the ball in the hands of the best player in our conference, the best player on our offense and on our team – Player of the Year," head coach Trent Miles said. "We had a guy that was one of the best receivers in the nation running wide open for a touchdown and it just didn't work. If the ball was about six inches shorter, it's a touchdown. We're back in the lead and everybody says what a great play call that was made. But he over threw him, and that's football."

The Spartans took over and held the ball for more than five minutes before scoring the clinching touchdown for the final margin.

"Well my hat's off to San Jose State," Miles said. "They did an excellent job defensively, stopping us from rushing the ball and throwing the ball, moving the ball. We were one of 10 on thirddown conversions. They killed us with the time of possession, and they did an excellent job of getting us off the field offensively. And then at the end, they did what they needed to do to move the ball and score and make it the situation where we didn't have enough time to come back. So my hat's off to them, and I'm very proud of our team."

San Jose State running back Tyler Ervin rushed for 132 yards on 30 carries and had an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown in the first half.

Trailing 10-0 in the second quarter, Georgia State got on the board with a 5-play, 87-yard drive. After Arbuckle opened the drive with a 20-yard completion to freshman tight end Ari Werts, a 29-yard pass to Werts gave the Panthers a first down at the SJSU 38. On the next play, Arbuckle found Harden down the right sideline for a 38-yard touchdown, pulling GSU within 10-7 with seven minutes left in the first half.

On that play, Arbuckle surpassed the Sun Belt season record for passing yards, formerly held by Troy's Levi Brown (4,254 yards in 2009).

San Jose State struck first on a 19-yard field goal by Austin Lopez after the GSU defense came up with a big third-down stop at the 2-yard line to force the field goal.

But on their ensuing possession, the Panthers came up just short on third down and punted the ball to Ervin, who returned the punt 85 yards for the score and a 10-0 Spartan lead.

Playing for injured all-conference tight end Keith Rucker, Werts finished with three receptions for 63 yards after he had just two catches all season.

When asked what he would remember most about this season, Miles said, "I'm going to remember a bunch of guys that pulled together to take a team that's been playing FBS football for three years and got themselves from 2-6 to a bowl game. That showed a team that would never quit, never gave up on each other, believed in what was going on. A great group of guys that are still young."

2017 AUTONATION CURE BOWL

GEORGIA STATE 27, WESTERN KENTUCKY 17 Dec. 16, 2017 • Camping World Stadium Orlando, Fla.

Led by Most Valuable Player Conner Manning and a record-setting effort by the defense, Georgia State earned the first bowl victory in school history with a 27-17 win over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl at Camping World Stadium.

The win also gave the Panthers (7-5, 5-3 Sun Belt) their school-record seventh victory of the season under first-year head coach Shawn Elliott and secured their first winning season as an FBS program.

"We're just a bunch of misfit players and misfit coaches who are blue collar, work hard and love one other and look at us," Elliott said. "First bowl win, most wins in school history - I'm damn proud to be a Georgia State Panther, I know that!

Manning, the senior signal-caller, completed 20 of 28 passes for 276 yards and one touchdown while directing a GSU offense that also rushed for 143 yards. Georgia State accomplished that while essentially playing without top weapon Penny Hart, who was battling an ankle injury and was limited to a handful of snaps.

"Coming into this season, my only goal was to lead this team to a bowl victory," Manning said as he accepted the MVP award.

The Georgia State defense limited Western Kentucky's high-powered offense to 349 yards. With six sacks, including two by senior Mackendy Cheridor, the Panthers set a school record by holding WKU to a net of minus-two yards rushing.

Leading 13-10, the Panthers used a flea flicker to take a 10-point lead in the third quarter. After two flips, Manning got the ball back and found freshman tight end Roger Carter all alone down the left sideline for a 42-yard touchdown and a 20-10 advantage with 5:55 left in the third quarter. The touchdown was set up by Hart's lone catch of the game, a spectacular 27-yard grab at the WKU 42-yard line.

In the fourth quarter, the Panthers effectively sealed the game a 16-play, 74-yard drive that ate up nine minutes on the clock. The drive started after Jerome Smith's interception, and Kyler Neal tallied the clinching score on a 1-yard run to put GSU ahead 27-10 with 5:50 left in the game.

Neal's score gave him sole possession of the GSU record for rushing touchdowns with 13.

Georgia State got on the scoreboard first with Brandon Wright's 42-yard field goal on the Panthers' opening possession, giving GSU a 3-0 lead midway through the first guarter.

Then the teams traded quick touchdowns on a total of just five plays. First, WKU needed just two plays to score, including White's 54-yard touchdown pass to Deon Yelder.

But the Panthers' answer was almost as quick. Devin Gentry rushed for 10 yards, and then Manning found Tamir Jones down the left sideline for 49 yards to the WKU 26. On the next play, Demarcus Kirk broke through the middle of the line and rambled 26 yards for the score to regain the lead at 10-7 with 6:19 to play in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, the teams exchanged field goals, with Wright's second three-pointer of the day, this one from 37 yards, giving GSU a 13-10 lead with nine minutes left in the first half.

With his third-down sack in the first quarter, Cheridor became the Panthers' career leader, surpassing Christo Bilukidi (9.0, 2010-11). Cheridor added another sack, which caused a fumble, in the

second quarter to bring his record total to 10.5. He also has the GSU record for forced fumbles with six.

Junior linebacker Chase Middleton recovered a fumble and returned it 19 yards and also had a sack and an interception.

Redshirt freshman Jonathan Ifedi had career highs of six catches for 56 yards, while Carter had four catches for 85 yards. Glenn Smith rushed for 73 yards on 23 carries.

2019 NOVA HOME LOANS ARIZONA BOWL

WYOMING 38, GEORGIA STATE 17 Dec. 31, 2019 • Arizona Stadium • Tucson, Ariz.

Georgia State fell 38-17 to Wyoming in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl on New Year's Eve afternoon at Arizona Stadium.

Playing in their third bowl game in the last five years, the Panthers finished the season at 7-6.

"What an extraordinary senior class we have who took this field and fought to the very, very end," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We just didn't play the ballgame the way we needed to play to win – a lot of mishaps from us as coaches and players. Hats off to Wyoming.

"I'm extremely proud of this football team and the steps they took to make this program worthy to come out to this bowl game and compete. This isn't just a one or two-time occurrence. We're going to be here for a while, and we've got a lot to keep building on.

"This is a disappointing loss," Elliott continued. "As a coach or a player, you fight like hell every single day to prepare your football team to win. We didn't make the plays to win today, but we're going to work hard and get better."

In his final game in a Georgia State uniform, senior quarterback Dan Ellington went 13-for-26 for 156 yards and a touchdown through the air, while rushing 14 times for 70 yards and a touchdown.

With 355 yards of total offense, Georgia State broke its season record, collecting 5,718 yards to surpass the previous record of 5,627 yards set in 2015. GSU had already set new season records for points, touchdowns, rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.

Ellington led the Panthers down the field for a touchdown on their opening possession with a 6-play, 75-yard drive. He completed a 23-yard pass to Devin Gentry and Tra Barnett had a 7-yard run, but Ellington picked up the rest of the yardage on the ground, despite playing with a torn ACL in his right knee. He had a 29-yard gain down to the 20-yard line and scored on a 4-yard run, his first rushing touchdown since the injury, to give the Panthers a 7-0 lead just two minutes into the game.

"I'm thankful I was part of this program," Ellington said. "To the fans, I want to say thank you for believing in me. Thank you for cheering on a guy from Mississippi and having me as your family."

Wyoming took a 17-7 lead with two touchdowns in the final two minutes of the first quarter, both set up by Panther miscues in their own territory, first a failed fourth-down attempt and then an interception. The Cowboys added a 51-yard touchdown pass in the final seconds of the first half to take a 24-10 lead into the locker room.

Senior Brandon Wright kicked a 25-yard field goal in the second quarter for the 32nd field goal of his career to break Wil Lutz's Georgia State career record. Those three points also gave Wright the GSU season scoring record, surpassing lain Vance's 80 points in the inaugural season of 2010; Wright finished with 84 points.

Wright, Gentry and senior left tackle Hunter Atkinson played in their 49th career game, tying the school record held by several players.

Barnett, who became Georgia State's all-time leading rusher earlier this season, finished with 15 carries for 64 yards.

Georgia State's receiving corps was led by Cornelius McCoy, who had five catches for 78 yards, including a 44-yard touchdown.

Wyoming (8-5) was led by freshman quarterback Levi Williams who went 11-for-26 for 234 yards and a touchdown. On the ground Xazavian Valladay rushed 26 times for 204 yards and a touchdown and was the game's Offensive MVP.

The difference in the game might have been on third down where the Panthers managed to go just 3-of-13, while Wyoming was 11-of-17. The Cowboys twice stopped Georgia State on fourth down in the red zone.

Georgia State saw 19 seniors play in their final game with many having played in two bowl games. Four seniors (Khai Anderson, Hunter Atkinson, Ed Curney and Brandon Wright) were part of all three GSU bowl teams.

2020 LENDINGTREE BOWL

GEORGIA STATE 39, WESTERN KENTUCKY 21 Dec. 26, 2020 • Ladd-Peebles Stadium Mobile, Ala.

Georgia State used a balanced offensive attack and a strong defensive effort to top Western Kentucky 39-21 in the LendingTree Bowl.

Georgia State (6-4, 4-4 Sun Belt) completed back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in the 11-year history of the program while defeating WKU (5-7, 4-3 C-USA) in a bowl game for the second time, following a win over the Hilltoppers in the 2017 AutoNation Cure Bowl for the program's first bowl victory.

"What a great win! What an awesome evening it turned out to be, finishing the 2020 season here at the LendingTree Bowl and getting a great win over Western Kentucky," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "It's awesome to watch our players and coaches fight and persevere through all the adversity this year."

Quarterback Cornelious Brown IV, the MVP of the game, went 16-for-30 for 232 yards and three touchdowns and rushed 10 times for 40 yards, helping the Panthers pile up 484 yards of offense with 227 yards rushing and 257 yards passing.

Running back Destin Coates was named the Offensive Player of the Game with 117 yards rushinghis fifth 100-yard game of the season--and one touchdown. Outside linebacker Jontrey Hunter earned Defensive Player of the Game honors, while placekicker Noel Ruiz was named the Special Teams Player of the Game.

Hunter recorded six tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery, while Ruiz nailed a pair of field goals for the Panthers, who were appearing in their fourth bowl game in the last six years.

The Georgia State defense held the Hilltoppers to 284 yards of offense--one of the top 10 performances in school history--forced three turnovers and added three sacks to its season-record total.

"Our defense was outstanding," Elliott said. "We felt like we had to keep [Pigrome] in the pocket. Our guys up front did a masterful job."

Cornelius McCoy led the GSU receiving corps with five catches for 88 yards and a touchdown, while Sam Pinckney added three catches for 62 yards and a TD.

Just minutes into the game after driving the Panthers down the field 64 yards, Brown was intercepted in the end zone, which the Hilltoppers were able to turn into a 14-play, 80-yard drive, capped by quarterback Tyrrell Pigrome's 2-yard scoring run.

Georgia State responded by scoring 27-straight points, starting with Coates' 11-yard touchdown run to tie the game 7-7 just before the end of the first guarter.

Early in the second quarter, Brown found Pinckney for a 26-yard touchdown with 9:50 to play to give the Panthers a 14-7 lead.

On the following drive, Antavious Lane intercepted Pigrome, Lane's fourth interception of the season that tied the GSU season record. It was also the first interception all season by Pigrome, ending a string of 278 attempts without a pick.

That led to Brown's second TD pass, this one to Jamari Thrash, whose diving 5-yard reception put the Panthers ahead 21-7 with 2:09 left in the half.

Pigrome followed with a second straight interception by Hunter, and that set up Brown's 8-yard TD pass to McCoy to send the Panthers into the locker room with a 27-7 lead.

Western Kentucky scored on the opening drive of the second half on a two-yard run by Gaej Walker to cut Georgia State's lead to 27-14. The Hilltoppers then forced GSU to punt, but Hunter recovered the fumbled punt at the WKU 32-yard line, and Ruiz kicked a 45-yard field goal for a 30-14 advantage.

WKU had one more chance to make it a one-score game with a first down at the GSU 11 late in the third quarter, but after a 9-yard gain on first down, the Panthers came up with three straight stops, including an incomplete pass on fourth down.

Ruiz added a 29-yard field goal to increase Georgia State's lead to 33-14 with 11:19 remaining in the game. That was Ruiz's school-record eighth-straight made field goal.

With the game in hand, freshman Mikele Colasurdo relieved Brown and found Caddarrius Thompson on a 25-yard TD for a 39-14 lead on Colasurdo's first career completion.

2021 TAXACT CAMELLIA BOWL

GEORGIA STATE 51, BALL STATE 20 Dec. 25, 2021 • Cramton Bowl • Montgomery, Ala.

The slogan for the TaxAct Camellia Bowl is "History Made Here," and the Georgia State Panthers did their part with a dominating 51-20 victory over Ball State on Christmas Day at the Cramton Bowl. The Panthers made history with their second-straight bowl win and their school-record eighth victory of the season.

"Christmas is the Happiest Day of the Year, and it certainly was for us today," head coach Shawn Elliott said after leading his Panthers to their third bowl win in his fifth season at the helm.

"I think we finished Christmas Day with one of the best presents we could have ever asked for and that's a commanding, dominating win," Elliott continued.

Quarterback Darren Grainger was named the Bart Starr Most Valuable Player after accounting for four touchdowns. The junior from Conway, S.C., completed 15-of-19 passes for 203 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for a career-high 122 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown run.

Sixth-year senior tight end Aubry Payne had career high eighth receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns, and the Georgia State defense also scored twice—another first in program history—on Javon Denis' 37-yard fumble return and Antavious Lane's 55-yard interception return.

Leading 20-13 at the half, Georgia State blew the game open with 31 straight points, including 28 in the third quarter, for their fourth straight win and seventh in the last eight games. The Panthers also won back-to-back bowl games for the first time.

"We'd never won eight games, never won back-toback bowl games. I say this a lot ... anytime you do something for the first time, do you know what that feels like?" Elliott said. "Every single player and coach in that locker room just did something that had not been done before at Georgia State."

Trailing 7-0 early, Georgia State got on the board with a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive, capped by Grainger's 18-yard TD pass to Payne to tie the game at 7-all with five minutes left in the first quarter.

Three plays later, the GSU defense came up with its first huge play of the day as Jamil Muhammad forced Ball State quarterback Drew Plitt to fumble, and Denis scooped up the loose ball and raced 37-yards for the end zone to give the Panthers a 17-14 lead.

Muhammad was credited with a sack on the play, his second of the day and Georgia State's schoolrecord 36th of the season.

Super senior Noel Ruiz added two field goals to give the Panthers a 20-13 lead at the half.

Georgia State opened the second half with another scoring drive, moving 75 yards on eight plays as Grainger hit Robert Lewis from 10-yards out for the score. Lewis' first career touchdown gave the Panthers a 27-13 advantage three minutes into the third quarter.

Grainger then broke the game open with a 34-yard touchdown run and then a 16-yard TD pass to Payne, putting the Panthers up 41-13 late in the third quarter. Payne's second touchdown catch of the game was the 13th of his career to pass teammate Roger Carter for the GSU record for a tight end.

On the final play of the quarter, Lane grabbed his school-record fifth interception of the season and returned it 55 yards for a touchdown and a commanding 48-13 lead.

Ruiz, celebrating his birthday on Christmas Day, added a 45-yard field goal in the third quarter for 51 points, Georgia State's highest total in a bowl game.

Grainger's 122-yard effort on the ground put him over the 1,000-yard mark for his career, including his time at Furman.g.

HEAD COACH SHAWN ELLIOTT

In his 27 seasons as a Division I coach, Shawn Elliott has been part of 22 winning seasons and 21 postseason appearances, including five bowl games in his seven years at Georgia State.

ow in his seventh season as head coach, Shawn Elliott continues to produce firsts for the Georgia State football program. A coaching veteran who brought 20 years of experience in winning programs, Elliott was introduced as Georgia State's third head football coach by then-President Dr. Mark Becker and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Dec. 9, 2016. He came to GSU after highly successful stints at South Carolina, where he served as the co-offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and interim head coach, and Appalachian State,

where he coached the offensive line. In 27 seasons as a Division I coach, Elliott has been part of 22 winning seasons, 21 teams that reached the NCAA playoffs or a bowl game, and three consecutive NCAA FCS titles from 2005-07.

That success has continued at Georgia State, where Elliott has led the Panthers to bowl games in five of his seven years in Atlanta, including the first three bowl victories in program history.

Other notable accomplishments in Elliott's first six seasons in Atlanta:

- GSU's first winning season as an FBS program in 2017
- School-record eight victories and the program's highest winning percentage in 2021
- First consecutive winning seasons with three straight from 2019-21
- Three straight bowl berths from 2019-21 and the first back-to-back bowl wins in 2020 & 2021
- First win over ranked opponent with 42-40 victory at No. 21 Coastal Carolina in 2021
- Stunning upset at Tennessee in 2019 for the

program's first Power 5 win

- First 4-0 start in 2023, which resulted in the program's first vote in the US LBM Coaches' Poll
- 71 All-Sun Belt Conference players
- One All-American and one Freshman All-American
- GSU's first Academic All-American[®] and eight Academic All-District[®] selections
- Program-record 3.03 GPA in his first semesterEleven players signed to NFL free agent
- contracts, including five who have played in the NFL

Not surprisingly for a long-time offensive line coach, Elliott has built the Georgia State program by establishing one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. Over the last four seasons, the Panthers have averaged 221 yards rushing per game, a figure that ranks No. 8 in the nation during that time period.

That rushing productivity was evident in 2022 as the Panthers ranked No. 14 in FBS, led by senior Tucker Gregg, who became the program's career leader with 2,265 yards.

The 2022 Panthers also ranked No. 11 in FBS with a school-record 25 turnovers forced.

Elliott's 2021 squad won seven of its last eight games to set the program record with eight victories. The Panthers achieved their third straight winning season at 8-5 while earning Georgia State's third straight bowl berth, also firsts in program history. GSU capped the season with a resounding 51-20 victory over Ball State in the TaxAct Camellia Bowl to win back-to-back bowl games for the first time.

After facing one of the toughest schedules in the Group of Five, Georgia State fought back from a 1-4 start to set the school-record for wins and establish a program record for Sun Belt Conference victories with a 6-2 mark, good for second place in the East Division.

The 2021 team achieved another milestone with the program's first win over a nationallyranked opponent as the Panthers knocked off No. 21 Coastal Carolina 42-20 on the road.

GSU averaged 226.4 rushing yards per game to rank No. 8 in FBS, along with an aggressive defense that set school records with 38 sacks and 92 tackles for loss. Thirteen Panthers were named to the 2021 All-Sun Belt Conference team, and following the season, offensive guard Shamarious Gilmore and tight end Roger Carter, one of Elliott's first recruits, signed NFL free agent contracts.

Elliott and his staff navigated the challenges of 2020 to steer the Panthers to a winning season,

capped by a victory in the LendingTree Bowl, marking the first back-to-back winning records and bowl berths in school history.

The 2020 Panthers featured another prolific offense that averaged a school-record 33.3 points per game and an opportunistic defense that ranked in the top 10 in the nation in sacks with 35 and turnovers forced with 21. A program-record 14 individuals earned All-Sun Belt honors.

The 2019 season began with another major first for the Georgia State program as Elliott's Panthers earned a dominating 38-30 victory over Tennessee at Neyland Stadium for the school's first win over a Power 5 opponent.

Elliott was named the Dodd Trophy National Coach of the Week, and his Panthers were recognized as the FWAA Reveal Suits National Team of the Week. That is the third time that Elliott has been part of the National Team of the Week; his Appalachian State team was recognized for its 2007 victory at Michigan and his South Carolina squad for its 2010 win over No. 1 Alabama.

The win over Tennessee launched a recordsetting 2019 season as the Panthers won seven games in the regular season for the first time and achieved their best home record with a 5-1 mark.

The 2019 team set numerous team and individual records, most notably establishing new season standards for points, touchdowns, rushing yards and total offense.

Following the regular-season, 10 Panthers were named to the 2019 All-Sun Belt squad, and the team earned a berth in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Despite taking over a Georgia State program playing just its eighth season of football in 2017, Elliott not only guided GSU to a bowl game in his first year at the helm, but he led the Panthers to their first bowl victory, 27-17 over Western Kentucky in the AutoNation Cure Bowl. That win gave the program a then-school record seven victories in Elliott's first season.

The 2017 GSU defense set season records for fewest points allowed per game, and fewest rushing yards allowed per game (136.4) while recording the first shutout in school history. On offense, the Panthers established new marks, since broken, for highest completion percentage (64.2) and fewest interceptions (9) in a season, as well as most total yards in a game (670) and most points vs. an FBS opponent (47).

Nine Panthers earned All-Sun Belt honors in 2017. Senior cornerback Chandon Sullivan shined in the classroom and on the field as Georgia State's first football Academic All-American and the first Panther to be invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl.

Sullivan, one of three 2017 seniors to sign NFL free agent contracts, is entering his sixth NFL season with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

After inheriting a senior-dominated roster for his first season, Elliott's second campaign proved to be a rebuilding year as the Panthers were forced to play numerous freshmen. Still, there were many positives during the 2018 season. First-year quarterback Dan Ellington passed for more than 2,000 yards, led the team in rushing and set a school record for fewest interceptions.

Punter Brandon Wright ranked No. 3 in FBS in punting average and net while setting the Sun Belt record at 48.3 yards per kick. The Ray Guy Award semifinalist was GSU's first semifinalist for a major college football award.

Standout receiver Penny Hart finished his career ranked fourth in Sun Belt history in receiving yards and eighth in receptions. He signed a free agent contract with the Indianapolis Colts, as did linebacker Chase Middleton. Hart is now with the Atlanta Falcons.

Before taking over the Georgia State program, Elliott worked seven seasons (2010-16) at South Carolina under Will Muschamp and Steve Spurrier, highlighted by three consecutive 11-win seasons from 2011-13 during the most successful run in the Gamecocks' history. In addition to coaching the offensive line, he was the running game coordinator in 2010 and 2011, was elevated to co-offensive coordinator in 2012, and then served as the interim head coach following Spurrier's retirement midway through the 2015 season.

Elliott originally joined the South Carolina staff in 2010 and helped the Gamecocks reach five straight bowl games while coaching some of the most prolific and balanced offenses in school history. The Gamecocks turned in the program's best offensive season, statistically, in 2013, averaging 34.1 points while rolling up a school-record 452.3 yards per game.

South Carolina's 2014 unit scored nearly 33 points per game while averaging over 440 yards of offense as All-America and All-Southeastern Conference offensive guard A.J. Cann paved the way. In 2010, Elliott's first season in Columbia, his offensive line blocked for record-setting running back Marcus Lattimore, the National Freshman of the Year. In addition to Cann, a third-round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2015, Elliott developed future NFL linemen Corey Robinson, Ronald Patrick, Brandon Shell, T.J. Johnson and Rokevious Watkins.

Before going to South Carolina in 2010, Elliott coached his entire career at Appalachian State, his alma mater. In 13 seasons, he was an integral part of App State's three consecutive NCAA titles from 2005-07 and the Mountaineers' historic upset at Michigan in 2007.

Beginning in 1997, he worked two seasons as a defensive assistant (1997-98) and then two seasons as the tight ends coach (1999-00) before taking over the offensive line in 2001.

In nine seasons as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach, Elliott's players earned All-America distinction on 12 occasions, including four different linemen who received first-team All-America accolades. He also coached All-American and future NFL tight end Daniel Wilcox in 2000. In 2003, offensive lineman Wayne Smith was the first pick in the Canadian Football League Draft. From 2005-07, Elliott coached three-consecutive Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Trophy recipients.

Elliott helped lead the Mountaineers to 10 NCAA playoff berths in 13 seasons with two trips to the national semifinals and three appearances in the quarterfinals in addition to the three championships.

He was one of three App State coaches to earn the NCAA's Award of Valor for their efforts in rescuing two individuals from an automobile accident in 2000.

The two head coaches under whom Elliott spent the bulk of his time as an assistant coach, Spurrier at South Carolina and Jerry Moore at Appalachian State, are both enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Elliott was the first player in Mountaineer annals to appear in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs four separate seasons. He was a fouryear letterwinner, helping the Mountaineers to two Southern Conference titles and a combined record of 36-16. He served as a co-captain of the 1995 Appalachian State squad that finished 12-1 while earning all-league distinction as a defensive end.

A native of Camden, S.C., Elliott earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1996. He is married to the former Summer Scruggs, also an App State grad and a standout tennis player for the Mountaineers, and the couple has two children, Maddyn and Max.

- Passed for 175 yards and one TD and rushed for 104 yards and another score in 31-17 win over Old Dominion.
- Rushed for a career-high 143 yards on 13 attempts in win at Southern Miss, highlighted by a 60-yard to set up a TD. Passed for 133 yards and two touchdowns.
- Career highs with 25 completions, 40 attempts and 349 yards passing vs. ULM, along with 50 yards rushing, one TD pass and one TD rushing.

Marcus Carroll rushed for a career-high 184 yards and three touchdowns and cornerback Gavin Pringle returned an interception 21 yards for a touchdown as Georgia State opened the season with a 42-35 win against Rhode Island in a Thursday night game at Center Parc Stadium.

GSU quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 193 yards, tossing two touchdowns without throwing an interception, and the super senior also added 51 yards on the ground. Pringle, the graduate transfer from Bucknell making his GSU debut, put Georgia State (1-0) ahead for good at 35-28 late in the third quarter.

"Rhode Island is a very good football team, and tonight was a great test of everything we went through the last sixth months. We overcame a lot of adversity. We're up 21-7 and thing kind of go off the rails a bit. They take a seven-point lead, but we didn't flinch. That's what our offseason was about.

"I'm very proud of these guys, the way we kept playing. We gave up some big plays in the secondary, some things we've got to fix, but I really love the way our guys looked right in the face of adversity and said, You know what, not tonight."

Grainger's most prolific target in the ballgame was Robert Lewis, who caught seven passes for 97 yards, including a 39-yard touchdown, while Tailique Williams caught a 42-yard scoring pass.

Carroll's rushing effort is the fourth-highest singlegame rushing total in GSU history. He now has three of the top five single-game performances in program history over his last five games, including his 163-yard effort last season at Southern Miss.

GSU won the turnover battle in Thursday's game, forcing two turnovers while avoiding any giveways.

Georgia State put together a stellar showing on the ground, racking up 231 rushing yards while averaging 6.1 yards per carry and out-rushing Rhode Island by 119 yards. The GSU offense did a good job extending drives, converting on 50 percent of third-down attempts. GSU also went 1-for-1 on fourth down.

How It Happened

Georgia State jumped in front 14-0 on Robert Lewis' 39-yard touchdown catch and Marcus Carroll's 9-yard TD run.

After a Rhode Island touchdown, Georgia State answered immediately on Darren Grainger's 42-yard TD pass to Tailique Williams to lead 21-7 four minutes into the second quarter. The Rams cut the deficit to 21-14 with a touchdown late in the first half.

Rhode Island then scored on consecutive drives in the third quarter to move ahead 28-21, but Georgia State tied the game on Carroll's 23-yard scoring run, the second of his three touchdowns.

Then Gavin Pringle gave the Panthers the lead for good with his 21-yard pick six with 1:30 to play in the third quarter.

Carroll extended the GSU lead to 42-28 in the fourth quarter as Carroll broke through the line for a 63-yard run down to the 12-yard line and then scored one play later.

Game Notes

» Safety Cody Jones prevented a score with a spectacular interception in the end zone.

» Jeremiah Johnson led the GSU defense with eight tackles.

» In his first start, Kade Loggins punted five times for GSU with an average of 47.2 yards per punt while pinning URI inside their own 20 one time. » The GSU didn't allow a sack in the contest.

» Georgia State got off to a fantastic start in the contest, putting 14 unanswered points on the board before Rhode Island could respond.

» Grainger completed 80 percent of his passes, including his first 14 throws, going 16-for-20 while averaging 9.6 yards per attempt.

Darren Grainger and Marcus Carroll each broke the century mark on the ground to help Georgia State cruise to a 35-14 victory over UConn Saturday night at Center Parc Stadium.

The Panthers improved to 2-0 behind big days from Grainger, the senior quarterback who racked up 142 yards and one touchdown, and Carroll, who tacked on 107 yards and three touchdowns to lead the rushing attack. Grainger also passed for 144 yards on 15 completions with one touchdown pass.

"A really convincing a good UConn football team," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We came out and executed in all three phases. Our defense was all over the field, attacking. The speed was really evident."

The Georgia State defense forced three turnovers and held the Huskies scoreless for three quarters before UConn managed two late scores. Although UConn finished with 326 yards of offense, 194 of those came in the fourth quarter after GSU had taken a 28-0 lead.

Jeremiah Johnson paced the Georgia State defensive effort with two fumble recoveries. Josiah Robinson added one interception, and Jontrey Hunter had eight tackles with one tackle for loss and forced fumble.

Georgia State recorded a stellar showing on the ground, racking up 250 rushing yards while averaging 5.6 yards per carry and out-rushing UConn by 200 yards.

How It Happened

28-42

Georgia State scored first on Darren Grainger's career-long 65-yard touchdown run with 8:40 left in the first quarter to take a 7-0 lead. The Panthers then increased the lead to 14-0 on Grainger's 9-yard TD pass to Robert Lewis.

Georgia State kept UConn off the scoreboard and extended its lead to 21-0 with 23 seconds left in the second quarter as Carroll scored from two years out.

After stopping UConn on its first possession of the second half, Georgia State went on a 15-play, 92 yard drive that ate up 7:20 on the clock, resulting in Carroll's 3-yard scoring run and a 28-0 lead with four minutes left in the third quarter.

"We walked out of the locker room saying the most important drive of the whole season may be this first drive of the second half," Elliott said. "And we did a fantastic job coming out there and shutting them down, and I knew we were right where we needed to be."

After UConn finally got on the scoreboard with nine minutes left, the Panthers answered immediately on Carroll's 39-yard scoring run. His third touchdown of the day made it 35-7 with 6:26 remaining.

Behind 466 yards passing by Darren Grainger and a school-record 220 receiving yards by Robert Lewis, Georgia State improved to 3-0 for the first time in program history with a 41-25 victory at Charlotte Saturday night at Jerry Richardson Stadium.

Grainger completed 27 of 33 passes and three touchdowns while accumulating 466 yards, just five yards shy of the GSU single-game record. He added 23 yards and one touchdown on the ground.

"I'm really proud of our football team for the first 3-0 start in school history," head coach Shawn Elliott said.

"I thought our throwing game was really on point tonight," he continued. "We took advantage of some things we saw. We've got some really special receivers who made some plays, and Darren made some great throws. We couldn't really get our ground game going, but our passing game really took over."

Lewis needed six catches to rack up 220 yards and two touchdowns, including the longest play in Georgia State history. With the Panthers backed up on their own 3-yard line, Grainger hit Lewis at the GSU 40, and Lewis outraced the defense for a 97-yard touchdown reception. Lewis also had a 59-yard catch down to the 1-yard line and a spectactular 38-yard touchdown catch that put GSU ahead 41-25 early in the fourth quarter.

Tailique Williams joined Lewis in the 100-yard column with a career 129 yards receiving on five catches, including a 66-yard touchdown.

Marcus Carroll rushed for 67 yards and his seventh touchdown of the season.

Gavin Pringle paced the Georgia State defensive effort, collecting three tackles, one sack, and his second interception of the season. Bryquice Brown added three tackles, two pass breakups, and one recovered fumble and Jeremiah Johnson had six tackles, 1.0 TFL, one sack, and one forced fumble in the win.

The Panthers held Charlotte (1-2) to only 88 yards rushing and forced two turnovers.

How It Happened

Georgia State struck first on Darren Grainger's 8-yard touchdown run with 8:44 left in the first quarter. Liam Rickman's first career field goal extended the lead to 10-0.

Georgia State added to its lead to 17-0 with 13:43 left in the second quarter on the school-record 97-yard touchdown pass from Darren Grainger to Robert Lewis. After Charlotte narrowed the gap to 17-10, Rickman booted a 46-yard field goal on the final play of the first half for a 20-10 lead.

After stopping Charlotte on the opening possession of the second half, the Panthers extended their advantage to 27-10 with another long TD pass, this one a 78-yard scoring play to Tailique Williams with 10:23 left in the third guarter.

Marcus Carroll's 1-yard touchdown run, set up by Lewis' 59-yard reception down to the 1, made it 34-10 late in the third quarter.

Charlotte managed two quick touchdowns to cut the gap to 34-24 before Lewis' second TD catch sealed the win with 12:57 left in the fourth quarter, bringing the GSU lead to 41-25.

Darren Grainger passed for 191 yards, Marcus Carroll rushed for 150 yards and the Georgia State defense was outstanding as the Panthers moved to 4-0 for the first time in program history with a 30-17 win at Coastal Carolina in a nationally-televised, Thursday night game at Brooks Stadium.

It was another happy homecoming for Grainger, the Conway native who is 2-0 in his hometown. The senior quarterback completed 15 of 26 passes with one touchdown pass while rushing for 47 yards rushed for another. Carroll had another big game, his third 100-yard effort in four games this season and his fifth in the last eight games, including his FBS-leading eighth touchdown on a 7-yard run in the third quarter.

"Our football team played their hearts out tonight," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "They practiced their hearts out, and they've done everything we've asked them to do, and it was really evident on this field tonight. To have our first conference win and our first 4-0 start in school history really feels incredible."

Robert Lewis had three catches for 39 yards, including his fifth touchdown catch of the season. He has caught 12 touchdowns in his last 13 games.

The Georgia State defense allowed only 10 points while constantly pressuring Coastal quarterback Grayson McCall, the three-time Sun Belt Player of the Year. The Panthers were particularly effective in the red zone, holding the Chanticleers to just three point on four trips to the red zone.

"I can't say enough about our defense," Elliott said. "Coach [Chad] Staggs coming back here, a couple of defensive players who transferred from Coastal, coming to Georgia State (Josiah Robinson and Corey Warren), they balled out tonight and got the W."

In addition to starting 4-0, Georgia State opened Sun Belt Conference play 1-0, while the Chanticleers fell to 2-2 and 0-1.

Georgia State enters the weekend as one of only two 4-0 FBS teams in the nation, along with Notre Dame.

How It Happened

Georgia State scored on the game's opening drive to take a 7-0 lead on Darren Grainger's 8-yard touchdown run, capping a 14-play, 75-yard drive. After Coastal Carolina scored to cut the Panthers lead to 7-3, Georgia State fired back with Grainger's 13-yard TD pass to Robert Lewis touchdown to make it 14-3 early in the second guarter.

After the GSU defense forced a missed field goal late in the first half, freshman placekicker Liam Rickman booted a field goal on the final play of the half for the second straight game to give the Panthers a 17-3 halftime lead.

Coastal Carolina managed a touchdown on the opening drive of the second half, but Rickman's second field goal made it 20-10 with five minutes left in the third quarter.

Georgia State continued to increase its advantage, as Carroll's 7-yard TD run with 13:13 remaining in the fourth quarter made it 27-10.

After a dropped snap on a punt led to a Coastal touchdown that brought the Chanticleers within 27-17 with seven minutes left, Georgia State's Jordan Veneziale recovered the ensuing on-sides kick, leading to Rickman's third field goal of the game for a 30-17 lead with 2:36 left.

Game Notes

» The visiting team has won all seven meetings in the series.

» Conway, S.C., native Darren Grainger has quarterbacked the Panthers to back-to-back victories in his hometown.

» Marcus Carroll rushed for 150 yards on 29 carries, his third career game with 150 or more yards and second this season.

Game 5: Sept. 30, 2023 • 7 p.m. (ESPN+) Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Georgia State fell to Troy 28-7 Saturday night at Center Parc Stadium, snapping the Panthers (4-1, 1-1 Sun Belt) season-opening, four-game winning streak.

Despite the loss, Georgia State's 4-1 record is still the best start in school history.

The Panthers prolific offense struggled, committing three costly turnovers, including two in the red zone.

"Congratulations to Troy. They're a good football team and a tough football team, and when you play a team like that, you can't beat yourself," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We had three turnovers, two in the red zone, and that's hard to overcome. It's a tough ballgame when you fight yourself, and you can't do it. Certainly Troy had a lot to do with it.

"I thought our defense played extremely well. I thought they gave us a chance to win the game, but we kept shooting ourselves in the foot offensively and that was the difference in the ballgame."

Marcus Carroll rushed for 75 yards and one touchdown and caught three passes for 37 yards. Quarterback Darren Grainger passed for 193 yards on 19 completions but threw his first two interceptions of the season and also fumbled.

Robert Lewis caught six passes for 114 yards. On defense, safety TyGee Leach, the graduate transfer from Lehigh, grabbed his first interception at GSU, while Henry Bryant had nine tackles.

"I told those guys in the locker room, So what, now what? You keep your heads up," Elliott said. "We've got a helluva football team, but we've got to play three phases. I don't want anybody to drag their heads. Yes, winning and losing is the name of the game, and to lose this game is a disappointing feeling. But I'm very confident in our players, I'm very confident in our leaders, I'm very confident in our coaches, and I think we're going to be a force to be reckoned with."

How It Happened

After the Georgia State defense forced Troy to settle for a pair of field goals, the Panthers got on the scoreboard with a 15-play, 75-yard drive, capped by Marcus Carroll's FBS-leading eighth touchdown of the season to take a 7-6 lead with 7:05 left in the second quarter. That remained the scored at the intermission.

Troy scored on the opening possession of the second half to to take a 13-7 lead. The Trojans extended the lead to 21-7 with 2:42 left in the quarter.

Midway through the fourth quarter, Georgia State appeared to score a touchdown on a long pass from Grainger to Lewis, but Lewis was ruled out of bounds on the 1-yard line. Two plays later, the Panthers committed fumbled for their third turnover of the game to give Troy possession with eight minutes remaining and a 14-point lead.

» Darren Grainger threw his first interception of the season on the Panthers' opening drive after 107 straight passes without a pick.

GEORGIA STATE 41, MARSHALL 24

Game 6: Oct. 14, 2023 • 7 p.m. (ESPN2) Center Parc Stadium • Atlanta, Ga.

Continuing the best start in program history, Georgia State used a 240-yard performance on the ground, including 159 yards from Marcus Carroll, to knock off Marshall 41-24 on Homecoming night at Center Parc Stadium, improving to 5-1 overall, 2-1 in Sun Belt Conference play.

Darren Grainger passed for 234 yards and one touchdown without throwing an interception and rushed for 62 yards and two touchdowns.

With those three scores, Grainger tied the school record for touchdown responsibility; he now has 59 touchdowns passing and rushing, equalling Nick Arbuckle's mark.

"I'm very, very proud of our football team," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "I talk about this all time, but our players are incredible. I wake up every single day thanking the Lord that I get to go be with them.

"It's just awesome to be around these guys. They fight, they push through adversity and they come out with their heads held high. It doesn't seem like anything affects us, like it did a year ago.

"[Marshall] is a really good football team, a talented football team. We just came out and did an awesome job," Elliott continued.

Carroll paced the Panthers rushing attack by accumulating 159 yards and scoring his 10th touchdown of the season. He notched his sixth 100-yard game while achieving the seventh-best single-game total in program history and third best of his career. Carroll gained 97 yards in the second half, including 68 in the fourth quarter.

Tailique Williams pulled in six catches for 129 yards, tying his career high for receiving yards, highlighted by a 74-yard touchdown catch.

Kevin Swint led the Georgia State defensive effort with six tackles, 3.0 TFL, two sacks, and one forced fumble. Javon Denis added a sack, and Henry Bryant had a fumble recovery.

Georgia State also got a big play from its special teams as true freshman Cam Marshall blocked deep in Marshall territory, and redshirt freshman Izaiah Guy picked up the ball and scored from four yards out. That is Georgia State's first blocked punt since 2013 (DeMarius Matthews vs. Troy) and first special teams touchdown since 2018.

"The blocked punt was a great call by our special teams coordinator Arketa Banks," Elliott said.

How It Happened

Georgia State jumped in front with a touchdown on the opening drive as Grainger led the Panthers down the field and then capped the drive with a 24-yard scoring run.

After Marshall answered with a touchdown on its first drive, Georgia State took the lead for good on Izaiah Guy's touchdown return of Cam Marshall's blocked punt. Liam Rickman added a 34-yard field to give the Panthers a 17-7 lead early in the second quarter.

Rickman's second field goal put the Panthers up 20-10 with 5:15 left in the half, and then Grainger connected with Williams for a 74-yard touchdown pass. Williams took a short pass over the middle and turned up field, racing down the right sideline for the score and a 27-10 lead with 1:19 to play in the first half.

Marshall managed a touchdown in the final seconds of the half to make it 27-10, and that remained the score until the Thundering Herd scored on the final play of the third quarter as Rashaan Ali made a spectacular catch on a tipped ball between two defenders and ran for the 65-yard score, bringing Marshall within 27-24.

But Georgia State responded on its next possession, which was kept alive by a roughing the punter penalty. After that, the Panthers moved down the field, and Grainger rushed for his second touchdown of the day from two yards out, extending the lead to 34-24 with 11 minutes left.

Carroll's 2-yard touchdown run capped the scoring with 1:42 to play.

Georgia State needed a stop inside its own 10-yard line in the final minute on Saturday night and got it with Gavin Pringle's game-saving interception in the end zone with 30 seconds left to seal the Panthers' 20-17 victory over Louisiana at Cajun Field. The win extends Georgia State's best start to 6-1 and makes the Panthers bowl eligible.

"What an incredible finish, with our backs against the wall," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We were doing nothing offensively [in the second half] and we leave it right there for our defense to make the biggest play of year to seal that victory. It was an incredible finish.

"We overcame a lot tonight," Elliott continued. "We didn't play very well offensively in the second half. I made a very, very dumb call at the end of the first half where ended up giving up a sack-fumble and giving them seven points. They got momentum, came back and set up for an unbelievable finish.

"But here we are, sitting here in Lafayette, first time victorious over this bunch, first time 6-1 in school history, bowl eligible with a lot to play for coming up this Thursday night at Georgia Southern." Marcus Carroll rushed for 110 yards and added 55 receiving yards and tight end Ahmon Green caught two touchdowns, but Georgia State's defense was the story as the Panthers earned their first ever win over Louisiana after six losses.

The Panthers (6-1, 3-1 Sun Belt) held Louisiana (4-3, 1-2) to 289 yards of offense.

Darren Grainger passed for 211 yards and two touchdowns and added 18 yards rushing. Tailique Williams pulled in six catches for 81 yards.

Josiah Robinson added seven tackles, 2.0 TFL, and one sack. Jontrey Hunter had eight tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss.

How It Happened

Georgia State took the opening kickoff and drove down the field but fumbled at the goal line. After a scoreless first quarter, the Panthers scored the game's first points as QB Darren Grainger connected with tight end Ahmon Green on a 24-yard touchdown pass. Tailique Williams had a 47-yard reception to put the Panthers in the red zone. After a missed extra point, GSU led 6-0 with 13 minutes left in the first half.

Grainger and Green connected again, this time on a 3-yard scoring play that put the Panthers up 13-0 with 9:49 left in the half. The score was set up by Marcus Carroll's 49-yard reception down to the 3-yard line. Those are the first two touchdowns of Green's career.

Georgia State was driving again when Grainger left the game due to injury. Backup QB Mikele Colasurdo, seeing his first significant action, stepped in and moved the Panthers down the field, capping the 68-yard drive with a 3-yard scoring run for a 20-0 lead with 4:23 left in the half.

Louisiana converted a fumble recovery into a touchdown with 30 seconds left in the half, sending GSU to locker room with a 20-7 lead.

The Ragin' Cajuns kicked a field goal on the opening possession of the second half and then closed then pulled within 20-17 on a touchdown with two minutes left in the third quarter.

Louisiana started its final possession at its own 20-yard line with seven minutes left and moved down the field. The Ragin' Cajuns had 3rd-and-4 at the GSU 7 with less than a minute to play when Gavin Pringle picked off Zeon Chriss's pass in the end zone.

Game Notes

» Georgia State outgained Louisiana 343-289, including a 214-124 advantage through the air. » The Panthers scored first with 13:07 left in the second quarter and never trailed the rest of the game on their way to victory.

» Georgia State tallied 20 points in the second quarter, accounting for all of their points.

» Grainger completed 77.3% of his passes on the day, going 17-for-22 while averaging 9.6 yards per attempt.

» With 211 yards passing and 18 yard rushing, Grainger now has 7,552 yards of total offense in his three seasons at Georgia State. He is just 15 yards away from breaking Nick Arbuckle's school record of 7,566 yards of total offense.

» Zeon Chriss led the Ragin' Cajuns passing attack, completing 14 of his 28 attempts for 106 yards and one touchdown with one interception.

» Chriss led the Louisiana rushing attack with 119 yards.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN 44, GEORGIA STATE 27

Georgia State got 208 yards rushing and two touchdowns from Marcus Carroll, but the Panthers fell 44-27 at Georgia Southern Thursday night at Paulson Stadium, snapping GSU's three-game winning streak in the series.

The Panthers, who still lead the series 6-4, are now 6-2 overall and 3-2 in the Sun Belt.

"Obviously a disappointing loss and a hard one to swallow," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Credit to Georgia Southern. They're a good football team with a good plan. It's unfortunate that we didn't play quite like the team we've been in that first half. In the second half we made a little bit of a comeback. We started forcing turnovers and moving the ball offensively. Credit to our team for fighting till the end and staying in that ballgame, but it's a disappointing loss."

Carroll's 208-yard effort is the second-highest single-game rushing total in school history, trailing only Tra Barnett's GSU-record 242 yards vs. Troy in 2019. Carroll topped the 1,000-yard mark for the season, joining Barnett for Georgia State's only 1,000yard seasons. He also tied the GSU season record with his 12th rushing touchdown.

Darren Grainger passed for 157 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 80 yards to become Georgia State's all-time leader in total offense. The senior from Conway, S.C., now has 7,789 yards passing and rushing to pass Nick Arbuckle (7,566).

Robert Lewis also set a school record with 12 receptions for 97 yards, including a 15-yard touchdown catch, his sixth of the season.

Safety Jeremiah Johnson had an interception, Corey Warren recovered a fumble, and Jontrey Hunter had 10 tackles and a sack.

How It Happened

Georgia State tied the game at 7-7 with five minutes left in the first quarter, driving 83 yards in 12 plays, capped by Carroll's 13-yard scoring run. But Georgia Southern scored 20 straight to take a 27-10 lead at the half.

Trailing 34-7, Georgia State cut into the lead on Darren Grainger's 3-yard touchdown pass to Cadarrius Thompson a fourth-down play. Then the Panthers forced back-to-back turnovers on Jeremiah Johnson's interception and Corey Warren's fumble recovery, which Georgia State converted into Carroll's second touchdown on a 19-yard run on the final play of the third quarter, pulling within 34-21.

Georgia Southern (6-2, 3-1) returned an interception for a touchdown before the Panthers closed out the scoring on Grainger's 15-yard TD pass to Robert Lewis.

Georgia State fell 42-14 to No. 23 James Madison at Center Parc Stadium.

The Dukes won their 12th straight game and improved to 9-0 on the year and 6-0 in Sun Belt Conference play, while the Panthers fell to 6-3 overall, 3-3 in the Sun Belt.

"James Madison deserves all the credit; that is a really good football team. They came in here undefeated, best defense in the league and all that; you would have thought we would have doggone showed up to the party to fight this team. We fought for a little bit, but we didn't fight for four quarters," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "I can't put my finger on it, but it was poor execution by me as a head coach, poor execution by our entire staff, poor execution by our entire football program. I felt like we had the team who could defeat these guys, but we didn't have the team to do it today."

Georgia State quarterback Darren Grainger rushed for 103 yards with two long touchdown runs, but the GSU offense managed just 228 yards.

After JMU scored a touchdown on its opening possession, the Panthers answered on Grainger's 30-yard touchdown to knot the game at 7-all midway through the first quarter.

Then Bryquice Brown intercepted JMU quarterback Jordan McCloud and returned it 43-yards to the JMU 22. But the Panthers had to settle for a 33-yard field goal attempt, and Liam Rickman's attempt hit the upright. James Madison missed a field goal, also hitting the upright, on its next possession and the game remained tied at 7-all until late in the second quarter. The Dukes took over at their own 14-yard line with nine minutes in the half and put together a 15-play, 86-yard drive that ate up 7:49, capped by McCloud's 5-yard scoring run with 1:09 left for a 14-7 halftime lead.

The Dukes scored on their first two possessions of the second half to build a 24-7 lead before the Panthers answered on another long run by Grainger, this time a 58-yard scoring play that made it 28-14 with 2:43 left in the third quarter.

But JMU drove for another touchdown, extending its lead to 35-14 earlyin the fourth.

JMU quarterback Jordan McCloud accounted for six touchdowns. He passed for 307 yards and four scores while rushing for 104 yards and two touchdowns.

Georgia State fell 42-14 to Appalachian State at Center Parc Stadium.

Marcus Carroll rushed for 113 yards on a school record-tying 34 carries. The senior from Union City, Ga., broke the Georgia State record with his ninth career 100-yard game.

Georgia State quarterback Darren Grainger threw two touchdown passes, tying the GSU career record with his 51st TD pass in Panther Blue. The sixth-year senior from Conway, S.C., who was honored before the game on Senior Day, equaled the mark set by Nick Arbuckle from 2014-15.

The Georgia State defense forced two turnovers, an interception by Jeremiah Johnson, who also had six tackles, and a fumble recovery by Izaiah Guy.

Georgia State started strong, putting together a 20-play drive that last 8:40 on its second possession, but the Panthers fumbled at the App State 4-yard line. Four plays later, the Mountaineers scored on a 61-yard run by Nate Noel to take a 7-0 lead that they would not relinquish.

"App State came out strong and really were hitting on all cylinders. We controlled the line of scrimmage early and had an opportunity to take the ball down the score but we turned it over," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We didn't have what it took it today. This game humbles us, and that football right there defeated us. They were the better team today.

"Right now we're searching for some answers," Elliott continued. "We've lost three straight football games to good football teams, but we haven't executed like we did earlier in the season. We've got to find our rhythm, our execution has to be much better and our coaching has to be much better."

Despite the tough stretch, Georgia State is bowl eligible and still has much to play for.

"There's still a lot to be said for our season," Elliott said. "I want us to understand that we can finish this season out the right way and continue the momentum for this program. We have to push to find success in the next two weeks, find our bowl destination and finish this season the right way."

Georgia State fell 56-14 at No. 15 LSU Saturday night at Tiger Stadium.

Georgia State started strong, taking the opening possession and driving 75 yards on eight plays, capped by Darren Grainger's 6-yard touchdown pass to Tailique Williams. Not only did that give the Panthers a 7-0 lead three minutes into the game, it also made Grainger the GSU career leader with 52 touchdown passes. The senior from Conway, S.C., broke the mark set by Nick Arbuckle in 2014-15.

After LSU took a 14-7 lead, Georgia State answered with another long touchdown drive, this time moving 79 yards as Marcus Carroll's 44-yard touchdown run tied the game with 12:45 left in the second quarter. The score was Carroll's school-record 13th touchdown of the season.

But LSU scored two late touchdowns to take a 35-14 lead at the half.

Trailing 21-14 in the second guarter, the Panthers (6-5) drove into LSU territory and faced 4th-and-7 at the LSU 30-yard line with three minutes left in the half. GSU opted to go for it, but Darren Grainger's pass was just out of the reach of Robert Lewis in the end zone. LSU took over and scored on the next play on a 70-yard touchdown pass by Heisman Trophy front-runner Jayden Daniels. The Tigers (8-3) managed another quick score just before the half to take a 35-14 lead into the locker room.

"Obviously you've got to take some chances in these games," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "We probably executed as well as we could have going into that sequence right there. You're not going to win that game kicking field goals. You've got to take advantage on fourth down. Then the explosive play and the touchdown right after that, and it was kind of on right there at that point.

"That guarterback is a really special football player and they have receivers who can catch the ball over the top and we just couldn't contain that. Those explosive plays were the difference in this football game."

GAME NOTES

> Marcus Carroll rushed for 87 yards on 15 carries, including a 44-yard touchdown to give him 13 on the season, the GSU record.

> Carroll topped the 2,000-yard mark for career rushing. He now has 2,079 career yards.

> Quarterback Darren Grainger completed 23 of 29 passes for 179 yards and one touchdown, the 52nd of his career to break the Georgia State record. He added 32 yards rushing.

> Robert Lewis had nine catches for 53 yards.

> Jontrey Hunter caused a fumble in the first quarter; his seventh career forced fumble is a new GSU record (previous record of 6 by Mackendy Cheridor).

> LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels accounted for eight touchdowns, passing for 413 yards and six touchdowns while rushing for 96 yards and two scores.

OLD DOMINION 25, GEORGIA STATE 24

Game 12: Nov. 25, 2023 • 2 p.m. (ESPN+) SB Ballard Stadium • Norfolk, Va.

Georgia State dropped its regular-season finale at Old Dominion 25-24 as the Monarchs scored the winning touchdown on the game's final play.

Old Dominion (6-6, 5-3) scored 11 points in the final two minutes on a field goal, a safety and quarterback Grant Wilson's 3-yard touchdown run on the final play.

Georgia State jumped to a 21-0 halftime lead as quarterback Darren Grainger rushed for a 16-yard touchdown and then threw two touchdown passes to tight end Ahmon Green. But the offense stalled in the second half as the Panthers were without several key starters, most notably running back Marcus Carroll, but also receivers Tailique Williams and Ja'Cyais Credle and center Avery Reece.

What a disappointing way to end a ballgame the way we did," head coach Shawn Elliott said. "Our defense was on point and gave us an opportunity to win the ballgame, but our offense just couldn't generate any momentum in the second half.

"We had an opportunity with the ball on the 2-yard and couldn't put it in, we had an opportunity to kick a field goal and it gets blocked and we had an opportunity to recover the onside kick. We had a bad snap and it led to a safety. Our defense made a valiant effort there at the end but they converted the fourth down."

Georgia State took the opening possession and drove 75 yards on 12 plays, capped by Grainger's 16-yard scoring run for a 7-0 lead six minutes into the game.

In the second quarter, the Panthers scored on back-to-back possessions, both on touchdown passes to tight end Ahmon Green. First Grainger found Green over the middle for a 29-yard scoring play, and then he his tight end, who was again wide open over the middle from 11 yards for a 21-0 lead with 2:27 left in the first half.

Old Dominion scored on the first play of the fourth guarter to pull within 21-14, Gavin Pringle's interception, his fourth of the season, gave Georgia State possession at the ODU 39-yard line. But after Grainger hit Robert Lewis for a first down at the 2, the Panthers had to settle for Liam Rickman's 22-yard field to take a 24-14 lead with 10 minutes to play.

GSU had a chance to add more insurance after the defense sacked Wilson on third and fourth down to give the Panthers the ball at the ODU 31. But Rickman's field goal attempt from 39 yards was blocked.

ODU took over with 4:37 left and drove down the field. After a potential touchdown pass was nullified by a facemask penalty, the Monarchs kicked a 37-yard field goal to pull within 24-17 with 1:37 left. Georgia State recovered the onside kick but was called for offsides. On the second attempt, ODU squibed the ball down do the 10-yard line, where GSU took over. On the second play, a bad snap by the backup center resulted in a safety, giving ODU two points and the ball for their final drive.

"It's a huge, huge gut punch. We had an opportunity to win that ballgame and finish with seven wins," Elliott said. "It's hard. This team fights and we have a lot of great players who have done a lot of great things for us. But we still have an opportunity to go finish this thing the right way."

Game Notes

> The Georgia State defense set a school record with eight sacks, including two by Henry Bryant and 1.5 by Justin Abraham.

> The Panthers held ODU to just 44 yards and three first downs in the first half.

> QB Darren Grainger completed 26 of 36 passes for 203 yards and two touchdowns. He also netted 24 yards rushing, including a 16-yard TD. That put him over 2,000 rushing yards for his Georgia State career.
