A Special Road Trip

Marshall's first road trip of the 2023 season takes the Thundering Herd to Greenville, North Carolina to meet East Carolina in a battle of history-bound rivals through tragedy.

Marshall's football team was traveling back from East Carolina following a 17-14 loss at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium on Nov. 14, 1970 when Southern Airways Flight 932 - the plane carrying Marshall's team and travel party - crashed upon re-entry to Tri-State Airport. All 75 persons aboard the plane perished.

Winning No. 600

Marshall's victory over Albany last week not only got the season off to a 1-0 start, it also marked the Thundering Herd's 600th program win against collegiate competition in its storied history.

Marshall is now in its 117th season of college football, but the program dates back to 1895 when games were played against semi-pro, YMCA, or high school teams. Those games are not counted in the all-time results.

Marshall's record against college teams is 600-539-35.

Quite The Tribute

Outside of Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium, East Carolina has placed a memorial plaque to honor the victims of the 1970 Marshall plane crash.

"This memorial is dedicated in memory of the 1970 Marshall University football team that valiantly played its final game on this very gridiron. The tragedy will be remembered and honored through this memorial for a team that gave its all. Their flight to eternity forever changed the lives of those who dearly loved them. We honor their dedication, discipline and devotion to the game of football as no other team in history has given so much. They shall live on in the hearts of their families and friends forever and this memorial records the loss to their university and the entire intercollegiate athletic community.

Game Credentials

All requests for working press and broadcast credentials for the 2023 Marshall football season should be made through **Grant Traylor**.

Credential Distribution

Any credentials not picked up prior to game day will be at the Fans Assistance gate (located near Gate A) at Joan C. Edwards Stadium, starting two hours prior to kickoff.

Parking

Parking will be accommodated on a space-available basis. The media parking lot is on 18th Street, two blocks west of Joan C. Edwards Stadium. To reach the 18th Street Lot, travel west along Third Avenue (a one-way street) and make your way to the left lane. There's a traffic light at 18th Street - turn left at that light. This puts you into the 18th Street Lot. These spaces are normally used for handicap parking on the Marshall campus. This is not the case on game day - media members can park in these handicap spaces by displaying their parking pass on GAME DAY ONLY. This same pass gives access to the Third Avenue Parking Garage, located across Third Avenue from the Cam Henderson Center (right lane as you travel along Third Avenue), if the 18th Street Lot fills up or if you simply prefer to park in the garage.

Interview Availability

Monday - Coach Charles Huff and the other Sun Belt Conference head coaches will participate on a weekly news conference via Zoom, facilitated by the Sun Belt Conference. The entire news conference is scheduled to run from 11:30 a.m. to 1:08 p.m. eastern time, with Coach Huff's time slotted as 12:54 to 1:01 p.m.

Tuesday - Coach Charles Huff will hold an in-person interview session at noon on Tuesdays of game week in the Shewey Building Multipurpose Room (upper level). Marshall players are available for inperson interviews at 12:30 in the same room.

Thursday - Coach Charles Huff does his weekly radio show at the Giovanni's across Third Avenue from Joan C. Edwards Stadium, 7:05-8:00, on the West Virginia Lottery Thundering Herd Sports Network from Learfield.

Post-Game Interviews

Coach Huff and Marshall players will be available for interviews after home games in the team meeting room, located in the lower level of the Shewey Building.

Coach Charles Huff

Marshall head coach Charles Huff is in his third season in 2023.

In his first two seasons with the Thundering Herd, Huff led Marshall to a pair of winning seasons and bowl appearances, compiling a 16-10 record along the way.

Huff led Marshall to a 9-4 record in 2022, which included a 26-21 win on the road at No. 8 Notre Dame – the team's first win over a top-10 team since 2003. Huff also navigated the Thundering Herd to a five-game winning streak at the end of 2022. The 2022 season culminated with a 28-14 win over UConn in the Myrtle Beach Bowl.

In Huff's inaugural season in Huntington, Marshall finished 7-6 while going to its 17th bowl appearance since moving up to FBS in 1997.

Charles Huff was named Marshall's head football coach on January 17, 2021.

An elite recruiter and developer of talent, Huff's proven track record bolstered head coach Nick Saban's staff for the 2019 and 2020 seasons.

An elite recruiter and developer of talent, Huff's proven track record bolstered head coach Nick Saban's Alabama staff for the 2019 and 2020 seasons, helping the Crimson Tide to the 2020 National Championship. He was named the 2020 National Recruiter of the Year by 247 Sports.

In his inaugural season in Tuscaloosa, Huff helped Najee Harris rush for a career-best 1,224 yards on 209 carries with 13 rushing touchdowns while catching 27 passes for 304 yards and seven more scores. Brian Robinson Jr. added 441 rushing yards and five scores while then-freshman Keilan Robinson added 254 yards and two touchdowns. In 2020, Harris was a consensus All-American who led the nation in total touchdowns (30), rushing touchdowns (26) and points (180). He also ranked third nationally in rushing yards (1,466) and holds the school record for total touchdowns (57), rushing touchdowns (46) and rushing yards (3,843).

Huff arrived in Tuscaloosa after one season (2018) as the assistant head coach, run-game coordinator and running backs coach at Mississippi State.

The native of Denton, Maryland, boasts boasts 17 years of coaching experience on both the NFL and college levels with stops at Penn State (2014-17), Western Michigan (2013), the Buffalo Bills (2012), Vanderbilt (2011), Hampton (2010), Maryland (2009) and Tennessee State (2006-08).

Huff spent four seasons (2014-17) as Penn State's running backs coach and special teams coordinator. He recruited and developed one of the game's most electrifying players in running back Saquon Barkley, who in 2018 became the highest drafted NFL running back since Reggie Bush went No. 2 overall in 2006.

Barkley, who was called with the second overall pick by the New York Giants in the 2018 draft, produced a dynamic rookie season, rushing for 1,307 yards and 11 touchdowns. He added 91 receptions for 721 yards and four more scores to amass 2,028 yards from scrimmage on his way to Offensive Rookie of the Year honors at season's end.

Numerous records fell at the running back position and on special teams under Huff's guidance at Penn State. Barkley, a 2017 consensus All-American, became the first Big Ten running back in history to win Offensive Player of the Year honors twice. A Walter Camp National Player of the Year finalist, Barkley ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards in 2017 (2,329).

The 2016 campaign saw the Nittany Lions claim the Big Ten Championship and it was Huff who mentored two record-breakers. Barkley broke the Penn State sophomore record for rushing yards (1,496), all-purpose yards (1,972) and points scored (132), while junior kicker Tyler Davis collected All-Big Ten first-team honors after tying the league's single-season record for kicking points (128) and breaking the school record for field goals by a junior (22) and consecutive field goals made (18).

Huff recruited Barkley to Penn State, and his freshman season of 2015 was spectacular. The Freshman All-American broke the school's single-season freshman rushing record with 1,076 yards. He was named the Big Ten Network's Big Ten Freshman of the Year in the process.

Huff graduated in 2005 from Hampton University where he served as a team captain, starting 12 games at center as a senior in 2005. He also played guard, fullback and tight end in his career.

Huff resides in Huntington with his wife Jessica and their sons, BJ, Beau, and Blaze.

Ali's knockout punches

Last week, Marshall running back Rasheen Ali showed exactly how powerful of a weapon that he can be.

The 6-foot, 209-pound junior from Cleveland, Ohio, rushed 18 times for 137 yards and two touchdowns to help the Thundering Herd to victory.

Ali's touchdown runs came on consecutive drives in the second half to put Marshall ahead to stay. His 13yard scoring run in which he leapt into the end zone staggered Albany's defense. Just over four minutes later, Ali delivered the knockout blow - a 30-yard burst off the right side to put Marshall ahead to stay.

In addition to rushing for the two touchdowns, Ali hit Albany with a haymaker out of the gate on a 73-yard scoring run, but it was called back due to a hold.

Fancher Stays Efficient

Marshall redshirt sophomore quarterback Cam Fancher showed his efficiency in Saturday's 21-17 win over Albany to open the season.

Fancher completed 28 of 35 passes for 268 yards with a TD. That 80% rate ranks in the top-5 in Marshall single-game history for quarterbacks attempting at least 20 passes.

Fancher has now led Marshall to six consecutive victories and is 7-1 overall as the Herd's starting quarterback.

Huntington, West Virginia - Marshall Football earned the 600th win in program history on Saturday as the Thundering Herd opened the 2023 season with a 21-17 win over Albany in front of 25,101 fans at Joan C. Edwards Stadium.

Marshall junior running back Rasheen Ali finished with 137 yards and two touchdowns – both in the second half – while senior defensive end Owen Porter finished with a career-high 12 tackles and the game-clinching sack of Albany quarterback Reese Poffenbarger as the Thundering Herd held off a tough challenge from the Great Danes.

"Honestly, it was the best thing that could've happened tonight," Marshall head coach Charles Huff said. "We've got a lot to get cleaned up and hats off to Albany. It's a good football team and that quarterback is a good quarterback."

On an exciting day in which Marshall unveiled its new videoboard and several players made their Marshall debut, it was two of the Herd's veteran players who made sure the Thundering Herd faithful went home happy.

Albany drove inside Marshall territory looking for the game-winning score, but defensive end Sam Burton got through the line and sacked Poffenbarger for a loss of 11 to force a long fourth-down attempt.

Porter then came and capped the victory, working his way around the edge and corralling Poffenbarger as he tried to work out of the pocket.

While Porter was thrilled to get out with the win, he was especially thrilled for Burton, who finished with a career-high 2.5 sacks on Saturday.

"There's nobody I'm prouder of with everything that kid goes through – how many times he's had to sit out for injury," Porter said. "We came in together, so it just means a little more there and I couldn't be prouder of him. I said it last year – if he doesn't get hurt, he leads the team in sacks and probably the conference in sacks."

The defense stood tall on Saturday, keeping Albany without a third-down conversion in their final seven tries of the game, continuing success from last season when the Thundering Herd led the nation in opponent third-down conversion percentage.

While the defense took care of business, Ali showed that he was back to full health, bursting through the Albany defense and notching a pair of touchdown runs that gave Marshall the lead for good.

Ali scored on a 13-yard run to cap a drive that took just 1:09 for the Herd to find the end zone, which got the crowd into it.



After Burton got a sack to force a punt and continue the momentum, Marshall took advantage of the short field and Ali found a crease off the right side for a 30-yard score that put the Herd up for good.

"It was exciting," Ali said. "I just knew once I slowed down and trusted the big guys up front that it would eventually pop."

Quarterback Cam Fancher finished 28 of 35 through the air for 268 yards with a touchdown – a 19-yard connection to Chuck Montgomery for a score that got Marshall on the board in the third quarter.

Montgomery caught a career-high six receptions for 81 yards. Tight end Cade Conley also caught seven passes for 79 yards in his first contest with the Thundering Herd.

Marshall returns to action at 4 p.m. on Saturday when the team travels to Greenville, North Carolina to take on East Carolina at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium in a nationally-televised broadcast on ESPNU.

Quarterbacks

Cam Fancher appeared at quarterback in every game in 2022, but took over as the starter after Marshall went 3-3 through the team's first six games. In his first start, Fancher led Marshall to 24 unanswered points and a 26-12 victory after the team had fallen behind 12-2 at James Madison. Following a loss to Coastal Carolina the next week, Fancher and the Thundering Herd finished the season with five consecutive wins, including a 28-14 win over the University of Connecticut in the Myrtle Beach Bowl. Graduate transfer T.J. McMahon joins Marshall this season after passing for 2,102 yards and 18 touchdowns at Rice University in 2022.

Marshall University

Namesake: John Marshall, the fourth and longest serving (1801-1835)

Chief Justice of the United States.

1837: Founded as Marshall Academy, when the region was still a part

of Virginia.

Thundering Herd

In the early 1900s, as Marshall established a varsity sports program, the school's teams were called the Big Green because of the color of their uniforms. In 1925, as Coach Trusty Tallman's powerful football team outscored the opposition by a combined 138-29 margin on its way to the inaugural West Virginia Conference championship, Huntington sportswriter Duke Ridgley dubbed the squad The Thundering Herd, based on a newly released novel by western adventure author Zane Grey.

Soon, rival sportswriter Doug Freutel countered by referring to Marshall teams as the Boogercats, which is what the Scottish immigrants in the Appalachian hills called mountain lions. Another movement sought to honor namesake John Marshall by calling the school's sports teams the Judges, but for the next 40 years most people used either the Big Green or the Thundering Herd when referring to Marshall.

In the fall of 1964, Marshall president Stewart Smith appointed a faculty-student committee to settle on an official school mascot. The final vote was taken on January 5, 1965, with 85 percent of the responses favoring Thundering Herd. The vote also set Kelly Green and White as the official school colors, while Big Green became the name of the athletic fundraising organization. Mercifully, Boogercats faded into obscurity.





Marco the Bison

Not long after Duke Ridgley dropped the "Thundering Herd" moniker on Marshall's teams, students began crafting bison costumes to wear to games and eventually cartoonists were creating their versions in the local newspapers. In 1954 the school yearbook, *The Chief Justice*, named the bison Marco - short for Marshall College.

When Thundering Herd became the official nickname in 1965, a bison costume was ordered and, even though Marshall had by then gained University status, the name Marco stuck. Charles Evans was the first to wear the official mascot costume, at a basketball game against Bowling Green on March 6th of that year.

For a brief period in the 1970s a live buffalo made appearances during home games at Huntington's Fairfield Stadium, but he proved to be a bit hard to handle - and he kept eating the artificial turf. In 1990, Marco (with Allen Young in the costume) won the Universal Cheerleader's Association National Champion Mascot competition in San Antonio, Texas.

Marshall is known for being one of the toughest places to play in college football. The program has won 80.8 percent (177-42) of its home games in Joan C. Edwards Stadium, the fifth-best mark in the country.

Joan C. Edwards Stadium (capacity 30,475) serves as the home of the Thundering Herd. Marshall is one of two FBS programs to have a stadium named for a woman (South Carolina - Martha Williams-Brice).

Mrs. Edwards and her husband James (for whom the playing surface is named) were philanthropists who gave generously to Marshall University, the city of Huntington, and countless other causes. Mrs. Edwards is also the namesake of Marshall's performing arts center as well as the cancer center at Cabell Huntington Hospital.

Mrs. Edwards was born in London, England, but her family moved to New Orleans when she was four years old. By the age of 11 she was singing on WWL radio and went on to a jazz singing career that saw her perform in places like New York and Chicago. She married James F. Edwards in 1937 and moved to Huntington. where she eventually became CEO of her husband's matress manufacturing company.

Among their business ventures, the Edwards family got into thoroughbred horse racing; they owned four tracks themselves, and Mrs. Edwards took an active role in renovating the tracks after they purchased them. They raced their horses in Canada, England, and Ireland, as well as the United States.
