CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

The Media Relations Office will issue credentials to working press only. All credential requests should be made in writing at least 24 hours in advance of the scheduled game.

PRACTICES

As a general rule, all practices are open to the media and the public. There may be instances, however, when all or part of a practice session is closed. Please contact the Media Relations Office in advance if you plan on attending a practice session so an escort can be made available.

INTERVIEW POLICY

Media interviews of players and coaches are encouraged, and every effort will be made to accommodate media requests. In-person interviews are preferred, but telephone interviews can be arranged through the Mercer Media Relations Office. Under no circumstances will student-athletes' residence numbers be supplied to the media.

INTERVIEWS

All interviews with Mercer student-athletes should be coordinated through the Media Relations Office. Players are generally available for interviews up to 30 minutes prior to the start of practice and directly afterward. Head coach Susie Gardner is generally available in the morning.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Following a 10-minute "cooling-off" period, coaches and players from both teams will be made available to media members in a post-game press conference. The Media Relations Office will poll the media prior to the end of the game to determine any player requests.

FAX & EMAIL SERVICE

Media outlets may request to be included on the broadcast fax and email lists to receive updates regarding Mercer women's basketball. The Mercer Media Relations Office fax number is (478) 301-5350. To be added, submit a request to waldman_srf@mercer.edu.

HAWKINS ARENA

Hawkins Arena was originally opened in 2005 as The University Center and immediately vaulted Mercer to a position among not only the best, but most efficient facilities for any university of its size. The arena facility not only provides a premiere venue for athletics competition -- basketball and volleyball -- but as serves as a centerpiece for Mercer's vibrant campus life.

The 3,200-seat main arena was renamed Hawkins Arena in the spring of 2012 in response to a \$1 million donation by Macon cardiologist, Dr. Chuck Hawkins, and his wife, Kathy. Hawkins Arena is home to Mercer's men's basketball, women's basketball and women's volleyball teams.

Hawkins Arena served as host to the 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 Atlantic Sun Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments.

The facility is comprised of three main floor levels. The bottom level is home to Mercer's Athletics Department offices and conference rooms. The lower level (arena floor level) houses team/locker rooms for each of Mercer's varsity programs, visiting team and officials locker areas, sports medicine offices and athletics training facilities, as well as an aquatics area. The upper level includes Mercer's ticket office, Board of Trustees meeting room, the President's Dining Room, Bear Market and Heritage Hall.

Adjacent to the arena via the upper level of the facility is a food court and solarium-style eating and congregation area, floor-to-ceiling windows overlooking the pool, weight room and exercise rooms, a fitness center, offices for University Center employees and offices for Recreation Sports and Wellness.

Susie Gardner

Head Coach ♦ 21st Season Overall ♦ 10th Season at Mercer ♦ Georgia '86, '88

Mercer University named veteran NCAA Division I coach Susie Gardner as the school's 10th women's basketball head coach on June 24, 2010.

With over 300 Division I wins on her resume, Coach Gardner has transformed Mercer into one of the top mid-major programs in the NCAA, let alone the Southeast.

Gardner has accumulated 144 total wins at Mercer, making her the all-time winningest coach in program history. Gardner's teams have amassed 20-plus wins in five of the last six seasons, including four consecutive 20-or-more win seasons.

Mercer continued its winning ways once again in the 2018-19 campaign, winning its second-straight Southern Conference Tournament title and advancing to the NCAA Tournament where the Bears fell just short of pulling off the upset of second-seed Iowa in Iowa City. The Bears won at least 25 games for the third straight season after going 25-7 overall and 14-0 in conference play while extending a streak of 34 consecutive SoCon regular season victories. Following the season, Gardner was named the SoCon Women's Basketball Coach of the Year and the Georgia Women's Coach of the Year. KeKe Calloway and Amanda Thompson shared SoCon Player of the Year honors (media and coaches, respectively) and Thompson was later named the SoCon Female Athlete of the Year.

The 2017-18 season was one for the record books as Mercer registered its first 30-win season in program history. The Bears concluded the season with a 30-3 overall record, claiming both the Southern Conference Regular Season and Tournament Titles. Mercer earned its first-ever nod in the NCAA Division I Tournament after snatching the SoCon's automatic berth. Mercer's SoCon Regular Season Title was the third consecutive season that the Bears claimed the top slot. Mercer has now competed in the postseason in four consecutive seasons following the NCAA Tournament berth.

During the 2017-18 season, Mercer led the conference in 12 categories, including but not limited to: scoring offense (70.7), scoring defense (54.9), total assists (538), assists per game (16.3), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.78) and field-goal percentage (43.7). The Bears also finished first in the NCAA in fewest turnovers (303) and turnovers per game (9.2).

Prior to the start of the 2016-17 season, Gardner authored a children's book to help promote children's literacy titled "1, 2, 3 Team!". The book, which touches on teamwork and how to be a good teammate, is geared towards readers ages four to eight. Gardner was named a finalist for the Georgia Author of the Year Award in the Children's Book category.

In her time at Mercer, Gardner has coached four SoCon Players of the Year, including Kahlia Lawrence who has thrice garnered the award. In addition, Gardner has coached three Freshman of the Year winners, one Defensive Player of the Year, nine First Team All-Conference honorees and three Second Team All-Conference winners. Five freshmen have been awarded a spot on the conference All-Freshmen team under Gardner's tutelage. Gardner has been twice named SoCon Coach of the Year (2018, 2016). Gardner's teams also excel in the classroom as 31 student-athletes have been named to the Academic Honor Roll/All-Academic Team under her guidance.





Gardner has taken the Bears to five postseason tournaments in eight seasons. Prior to Gardner's arrival, Mercer had not competed in postseason play since 1985. Under Gardner's guidance, Mercer has taken part in one NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament, two Women's National Invitation Tournaments and two Women's Basketball Invitational Tournaments.

Before arriving at Mercer, Gardner spent three seasons (2007-10) as an assistant coach at the University of Florida. She joined the Gators after four seasons (2003-07) as the head coach at the University of Arkansas, giving her seven seasons as a coach in the Southeastern Conference.

While at Florida, the 2009 Gators advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament with Gardner on staff. Florida sandwiched the NCAA Tournament appearance with WNIT appearances in 2008 and 2010 (advancing to the round of 16 during Gardner's first year and to the second round in 2010).

With Gardner at the Razorbacks' helm in 2004-05, Arkansas earned a trip to the WNIT tournament. Prior to that, she had the SEC Player of the Year in 2003-04. Arkansas was a combined 64-54 during Gardner's tenure and her 2005-06 team raced out to the best SEC start in the Lady 'Hogs program history.

Gardner cut her teeth as a Division I head coach at Austin Peay State University in Clarksville, Tenn., where she had a highly successful seven-season run (1996-2003) and was 112-93. The Lady Gobs accomplishments during that period included three Ohio Valley Conference tournament championships (2001, 2002 & 2003), and OVC regular season title (2003) and three NCAA post-season berths (2001, 2002 & 2003). Gardner was tabbed as the OVC "Coach of the Year" in 2003. She also produced the OVC Player of the Year in both 2003 and 2004, with her players also garnering the league's Freshman of the Year awards twice (2000 and 2001).

From 1992-95, Gardner was the assistant coach at Western Athletic Conference power San Diego State University. In her three seasons with the Aztecs, she was a part of a program that won three-consecutive WAC tournament championships and, subsequently, also made three NCAA tourney appearances. SDSU was 69-20 with Gardner on staff and garnered two WAC regular season crowns in 1994 and 1995.

Gardner is no stranger to middle Georgia or the Southeast region, having spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at the University of Georgia (1986-88) following a highly-successful four-year career for the Bulldogs under legendary head coach Andy Landers. UGA made the NCAA Final Four in 1983 and 1985 with Gardner on the squad – including a national runner-up finish in 1985 – and reached the NCAA tournament both of her years as a graduate assistant, as well. The Bulldogs won the SEC title in 1983, 1984 and 1986 as Gardner played alongside other noteworthy Georgia players like Teresa Edwards, Janet Harris and Katrina McClain.

Gardner was a member of the 1983 Sports Festival South Team which earned a gold medal. She was also a member of the USA's Select Team which competed in Canada.

Gardner earned her Bachelor of Science degree from Georgia in 1986, followed by a Master of Education degree in 1988.

- Assisted KeKe Calloway and Amanda Thompson to SoCon Player of the Year honors as selected by the media and coaches associations, respectively
- Coached a Mercer team that had the second-fewest turnovers and the second-lowest turnover per game average in the country
- Oversaw Calloway as she led the league in points scored (593) and field goals made (224)

- Watched the Bears' offense lead the conference in assists (538), assists per game (16.3), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.78), fewest turnovers (303), field-goal percentage (43.7), scoring offense (70.7) and scoring margin (15.8)
- Coached SoCon Player of the Year and WNBA Draftee in Kahlia Lawrence
- Oversaw Lawrence, Sydni Means and KeKe Calloway on being named to the SoCon First Team All-Conference
- Under Wierzba's guidance, Lawrence ranked first in the conference in field goal attempts (566), field goals made (253), total points (636) and points per game (19.3)
- Oversaw Means in leading the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio (4.80), while ranking first in the conference in assists (264), and assists per game (8.0)
- Guided Calloway as she led the conference in three pointers made (99) and threes made per game (3.0)

- Helped coach the Bears to a 25-7 record, setting a program record for the most wins in the NCAA DI era.
- Aided Mercer to a WNIT berth, competing in the postseason for the third consecutive season.
- Helped lead the Bears to a 12-2 conference record, claiming the regular season SoCon title for the second consecutive season.
- Wierzba's tutelage of the offense helped Mercer to finish first in the conference in scoring offense (65.8), assists per game (14.3) and scoring margin (9.1).
- Coached SoCon Player of the Year in Kahlia Lawrence as well as SoCon All-Conference First Team member, Sydni Means.
- Lawrence finished second in the conference in scoring (18.0), while Means led the league in assists (216), assists per game (6.8), assist-to-turnover ratio (3.5).

- **2015-16 – Assistant Women's Basketball Coach**

- Helped coach the Bears to a 24-9 record, including a 12-2 SoCon mark.
- Mercer finished the season second in the conference in scoring with 64.5 points per game and third in field goal percentage (.401).
- Coached the SoCon Player of the Year in Kahlia Lawrence as well as the SoCon Freshman of the Year in Linnea Rosendal.
- Lawrence finished the season second in the conference in points per game (18.0), while Rosendal finished second in three-point field goals made per game (1.97).

Mercer Women's Basketball has a rich, successful history filled with star-studded players. Two of the more notable student-athletes in program history are Andrea Congreaves and Kahlia Lawrence.

Andrea Congreaves

Congreaves re-wrote the Mercer record book during her stellar four-year career. She was a three-time Atlantic Sun Conference Player of the Year and a member of the 1993 Kodak All-America team. Congreaves remains the all-time leader in points (2,796), field goals (1,107) and field goal percentage (.580). She also currently ranks third in free throws made (429), rebounds (1,141) and sixth in blocked shots (83) and three pointers made (153).



Andrea Congreaves is the only player to be named Atlantic Sun Player of the Year three times. She also earned a spot on all-conference team each of her four years at Mercer.

Congreaves led the Bears to back-to-back conference championships in 1990-91 and 1991-92. She led the nation in scoring in 1991-92 (33.0) and 1992-93 (31.0).

Congreaves incredible season also included a field goal percentage of .633, 11.6 boards per game and 77 three-point field goals made.

She was drafted by the Charlotte Sting in 1997 and went on to play four seasons in the WNBA. She is also one of only three former Bears to have their jersey retired in the rafters of Hawkins Arena, honored with a ceremony in 1993.

Kahlia Lawrence

Lawrence's legacy began as a freshman, earning SoCon Freshman of the Year honors after scoring 13.4 points per game and pulling down 5.5 rebounds. Her stamp on Mercer continued

throughout her career, becoming the SoCon's first-ever three-time Conference Player of the Year. Lawrence joins Congreaves as one of only seven players to ever claim Georgia Women's College Player of the Year honors in back-to-back seasons.

Lawrence finished her career third all-time in Mercer history for career points (2,275), second in career field goals made (931) and seventh in points per game (17.1) and steals (188). Lawrence also finished her career 10th in rebounds with 696.

In her four seasons with the Bears, Lawrence led Mercer to four consecutive postseason appearances, including the program's first-ever NCAA DI Tournament appearance in 2018. The Bears claimed at least a share of the SoCon Regular Season title three consecutive years with Lawrence, before winning outright in 2018 en route to the 2018 SoCon Championship Title.

Lawrence was joined by Sydni Means for four seasons as the duo compiled to be one of the most effective backcourts in program history. Means finished her career just shy of 1,000 career points. However, the point guard had a keen eye in finding her teammates, ranking second in program history in career assists with 686. Means also finished second in career steals with 246, seven steals shy of becoming the all-time leader in program history. Means led the NCAA as a senior in assist-to-turnover ratio (4.8).

Lawrence went on to be selected in the second round with the 24th overall pick in the WNBA Draft by the Minnesota Lynx. Lawrence became the highest player drafted from the Southern Conference. Means remains at Mercer, taking over the helm of Assistant Coach for the Mercer Bears.

Success in the Seventies

You don't have to look too far in the 1970s to see the success. From 1971-1975, the Bears were led by the first "Dynamic Duo" in Myrel Huskey and Sybil Blalock. The duo combined for one of

the most dominant four-year runs in program history.

Huskey (1,867) and Blalock (1,856) rank sixth and seventh, respectively, on the all-time scoring list at Mercer. Huskey and Blalock were the first players to record 1,000 points in their Mercer careers.

Myrel Huskey held the top spot on Mercer's all-time scoring list for nearly a decade, when surpassed by Vivian Humphrey. Huskey's name still remains near the top in every major offensive category in Bears' history.

Blalock, former Mercer head coach and current SWA, has achieved many accolades that are still remembered throughout the Mercer record books. She was honored as a member of

the WNIT All-America Team in 1975 and was recently named "Trailblazer of the Game" on June 19, 2018 by the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

The next big impact in the 70s came from Cindy Brogdon. Though she only played for Mercer for two seasons, Brogdon dominated the floor for the Orange & Black. She averaged 30.1 points per game for each season, the third highest total in school history, only sitting behind Congreaves (33.0 & 31.0).

Brogdon finished with 1,746 points in just two years, placing her eighth on the scoring list. Her two seasons of 902 points in 75-76 and 844 points in 76-77 stood as the best single-season marks until Congreaves remarkable 1991-92 season.

Following her Mercer career, Brogdon played for the 1976 U.S. Olympic women's basketball team in Montreal. She aided the American squad in bringing home the silver medal.

Peggy Collins was at the helm of the Mercer team during the 70s, guiding the Bears to a 21-1 overall record in 1971-72, claiming both the regular season and tournament titles in the Southern Women's Athletic Conference. The Bears went on a run of six-straight winning seasons under Collins, who is second all-time in career wins at Mercer (133) and first in career winning percentage (.801).

Jane Fontaine took over for Collins in 1977-78 and guided Mercer to back-to-back GAIWA State Championships in 1978-79 and 1979-80. Fontaine led Mercer to 51 wins in those two seasons, thanks in large part to another Mercer legend, Vivian Humphrey.

Humphrey is Mercer's second all-time leading scorer with 2,284 points and is one of only three numbers to be retired in Mercer Women's Basketball history. Humphrey ranks third all-time in field goals made (925), second in field goals attempted (2,125) and first in free throws made with 434.

Humphrey led the Bears during one of the most successful periods in the program's history. During the 78-79 season, the Bears won 22 games en route to winning the GAIWA State Title. The next season the Bears came back strong to defend their title, winning a then program-record 29 wins. The Bears rolled through the GAIWA Tournament, into the Region III Tournament. The Bears hosted Texas in the AIAW National Tournament, falling 81-80.

Playing alongside Humphrey was Charlotte Nicholson and Kathy Singletary. Nicholson concluded her career 14th all-time in Mercer scoring with 1,256 points, while Singletary finished 11th with 1,389. The trio led Mercer to notable wins over: Georgia, Florida, Florida State, Ole Miss, Auburn and Clemson.

Enjoying the Eighties

The 80s began with a promising start as Emma Mumphrey was entering her sophomore season after an elite freshman campaign alongside Humphrey, Nicholson and Singletary. Mumphrey became the third player in Mercer history to eclipse 2,000 career points, finishing her career fourth on the all-time list with 2,098 points. Mumphrey is second in field-goal percentage, finishing her career with 859 made on 1,524 attempts, a .564 shooting percentage.

Mercer went through some rebuilding after the magical 1979-80 season, but the success returned to Porter Gym for the 1984-85 season. The Bears were led by the senior leadership of Anita Meadows. She finished her career with a total of 1,088 points, which is 20th all-time for the Bears. Throw on top of that the strong play of freshman and eventual 1,000-point club member Dawn Jackson (1,120 points, 19th all-time). Their 24 wins equaled the second-highest total in school history. They

compiled a 14-game win streak, a mark only to be topped by the remarkable 19-0 start in the 1971-72 season.

The 1984-85 team found national success on a level the program had never seen before, reaching the NCAA Division II Tournament and continuing their run of great play. A victory over North Alabama clinched the NCAA South Championship, followed by a victory over Quinnipiac in Hamden, Conn., in the NCAA Quarterfinals put the Bears in the Final Four in Springfield, Mass. Mercer took its 14-game winning streak to Springfield, squaring off against Central Missouri. The Bears fought tooth-and-nail before falling to Central Missouri, 82-79.

Never Forget the Nineties

The late 80s and early 90s brought in a dynamic pair of players

for Mercer. Andrea Congreaves and Stephany Raines formed a valuable 1-2 punch, bringing home two banners for the Bears. Congreaves patrolled the hardwood of Porter Gym from 1989-1993, filling up the stat sheets with 2,796 points, 1,107 field goals made, 153 three pointers, 429 free throws and coralling 1,141 rebounds. She was supported by Raines during the two championship seasons for Mercer. Raines proved to be an elite threat on the offensive end, becoming Mercer's all-time leader in career assists with 851.

During the 1990-91 season, the duo opened the season against perennial powerhouse Old Dominion, on the road, under the guidance of first year head coach Lea Henry. The Bears went into Norfolk, Va., walking out victorious after a 74-71 win. The Bears carried the momentum to a 4-0 start.

The Bears finished 18-9 overall with a 10-2 conference record. Congreaves led the nation in scoring with 33 points per contest.

The Bears dropped an 85-74 contest to Florida A&M to end the season, but not before the first New South Women's Athletic Conference (NSWAC) banner in program history adorned the rafters of Porter Gym.

The 1991-92 Bears started slowly by dropping the first two games to Tennessee State and South Florida. After drawing back to .500 with wins over Marist and UCF, Mercer fell to 2-4 after consecutive losses to Georgia and College of Charleston. Things then started clicking as the Bears ran off nine straight victories. Following a loss to Southeastern Louisiana, the Bears reeled off eight more wins.

Mercer clinched a share of the regular season title yet again, this time sharing with Florida International as both finished 10-2 in league play. The Bears finished the season 20-8 and Congreaves led the NCAA in scoring once again after averaging 31.0 points. She won her second Conference Player of the Year award and set the stage for her selection to the Kodak All-America Team in 1993.

Mercer only posted two more winning seasons in the 90s, both under the direction of Billy Holmes. Holmes coached six different 1,000-point club members, including Lashon Brown who ranks 10th all-time with 1,402 career points.

A New Century

The 2000s featured some ups and downs for the program as well as five different coaches in a span of 10 seasons. Holmes' era concluded following the 2000-01 season, making way for Sharon Baldwin. Baldwin guided Mercer to a 16-13 mark in her only season at the helm of the program.

Brenda Welch-Nichols took over following Baldwin's leave, coaching Mercer for four seasons. The Bears held a record of 51-62 in the four-year span before Mercer alum, Sybil Blalock, took a shot at coaching for one season. Janell Jones rang in the conclusion of the 10-year span to jump start the 2000s, leading Mercer to a 17-14 record in 2008-09. Jones coached a Mercer great in Latoya Jackson.

Jackson concluded her Mercer career with 1,208 points, ranking 16th all-time in program history. Jackson was a deadeye shooter for the Bears, concluding her career with 216 three pointers made and 621 attempted. Jackson's 216 threes made was a Mercer record for nearly a decade until KeKe Calloway broke the record in 2017-18. Her .350 career three-point percentage ranks seventh in program history, while her .820 career free-throw percentage sits in second. Jackson trails only Cindy Brogdon (.821) for the career free-throw percentage in program history.

Susie Gardner Era

The dawn of a new era began in the 2010-11 season when the Bears hired Susie Gardner to take over the reigns.

In fact, Mercer returned to prominence in just her third season (2012-13), posting a 20-12 overall record for the program's first 20-win season since 1991-92. The Orange & Black went 13-5 during ASUN Conference play, setting a program record for most league wins in a single season. The Bears captivated the nation from early January to late February when they went on a 12-game winning streak, the longest for the program since the 1984-85 edition of the Bears won 14 consecutive games as a Division II institution. Mercer capped off the season by earning the No. 1 seed in the 2013 Women's Basketball Invitational for its first appearance in a nationally sponsored postseason tournament since 1985.

The Bears notched their second 20-win season in three years during the 2014-15 campaign. Mercer also registered its second WBI appearance, advancing to the semifinal round. In addition, Mercer recorded a 46-39 win over SEC foe, Alabama, for the Bears' first win over an SEC opponent since Dec. 19, 1981.

Individually, Precious Bridges led Mercer and the Southern Conference with 20.5 points per game, ranking 21st nationally. Bridges was named the 2015 SoCon Player of the Year and earned First Team All-Conference and All-Tournament selections. Bridges concluded her career with 1,886 career points, ranking fifth all-time in program history. Bridges ranks in the top 10 in eight different categories, including second in career free throws made (433) and third in free throws attempted (571).

The 2014-15 season also featured Mercer's next lethal duo, Kahlia Lawrence and Sydni Means. Lawrence was recognized for her efforts as a freshman, leading all SoCon freshmen in scoring with 13.4 ppg and was named 2015 SoCon Freshman of the Year.

The following season, a young Mercer team tallied a 24-9 record. The Bears also notched a SoCon Regular Season Championship, an appearance in the SoCon Tournament Championship game and a WNIT berth. Mercer led the SoCon in several categories, including scoring margin (8.2), assists per game (13.7) and turnovers per game (11.5). Mercer ranked sixth nationally in turnovers per game.

In just its second season in the SoCon, Mercer once again claimed Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year honors as Lawrence and newcomer Linnea Rosendal took home the hardware. Lawrence concluded the season second in the SoCon in points per game (18.0), while Sydni Means led the league in assists (189), assists per game (5.7), assist/turnover ratio (2.91) and steals (80).

The 2016-17 season proved to be another trend in the right direction as the Bears notched 25 wins, setting a new program record for most wins in the NCAA Division I era. Lawrence was named Georgia Women's College Player of the Year to go along with SoCon Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. Means led the Bears in assists (216), assists per game (6.8) and assist/turnover ratio (3.5). Means ranked third nationally in assist/turnover ratio. The duo guided Mercer to its third WNIT berth after claiming the SoCon regular season title for the second consecutive year.

The 2017-18 season was the cherry on top for a rising Mercer program. The Bears started off 3-2 before winning a program-record 27 consecutive victories to set a new Mercer record with 30 overall wins. Along the way, the Bears defeated North Carolina, Charlotte and finished 14-0 in league play for the first time in program history. Mercer went on to run the table in the SoCon, winning both the regular season and tournament titles for the first time in program history. The Bears earned the SoCon's automatic bid to the Big Dance, marking the first NCAA Division I appearance in program history. Lawrence was named SoCon Player of the Year for the third consecutive season. Meanwhile, Means capped off an astonishing career, ranking

second in career assists (686) and steals (246). Means led the nation in assist/turnover ratio (4.80) and her 264 assists ranks second most in a single season.

The 2017-18 campaign saw the rise of KeKe Calloway into a perimeter threat for opponents. Calloway grabbed the nation's attention when she buried an NCAA-tying 12 three pointers against Furman on Jan. 6, scoring 40 points for the Bears. Calloway set both a Mercer and SoCon record with 99 threes in a single season, while also taking over the top spot in program history with 219 career threes made. In just three seasons, Calloway has registered 1,218 career points to rank 15th all-time in program history.

Stat of the Game

The biggest stat to stand out on the sheets was Georgia's ability to score in the post and grab rebounds. The Lady Bulldogs outrebounded Mercer 45-34, while owning the paint, 32-8.

Player of the Game

Sydni Means had an all-around performance today, scoring 11 points, while dishing seven assists and grabbing five rebounds. Means did not turn the ball over once and managed to swipe three steals in the process.

How It Happened

Neither team could grow separation from one another through the first 10 minutes of play as Georgia led by as many as three points. It was Mercer who struck first following Rachel Selph's jumper from the charity stripe for the 2-0 advantage. It didn't take long for KeKe Calloway to catch fire, banking home a three from downtown Macon to become the single-season SoCon leader in three pointers made with 96. Calloway tacked on two more triples, becoming Mercer's all-time leader in career threes. There were five ties in the opening frame with the last being at 14 apiece. Mercer outscored Georgia 5-4 over the final 3:57 to take the 19-18 lead at the break.

The second quarter proved to be much like the first quarter with neither team able to separate from one another. Lawrence registered 10 of Mercer's 12 points in the second quarter, while also assisting on Mercer's other basket with a dish to Sydni Means before the buzzer. The Lady Bulldogs outscored Mercer 16-12 in the second quarter to take the three-point lead, leading by as many as five points and trailing by as many as four.

The Lady Bulldogs owned the first five minutes of the second half, outscoring Mercer 11-3 to take the 45-34 lead. Georgia's Que Morrison scored six of the team's first 11 points in the half to help build the lead. The Bears stormed back to cut the deficit to five with 2:35 remaining in the quarter following a corner three from Calloway. The Lady Bulldogs stretched their lead back to 11, however Mercer proved resilient yet again, trimming the deficit to four at the conclusion of the quarter. With just five seconds remaining, LaKaitlin Wright pulled down a Georgia miss and found Lawrence for a three-point attempt at the buzzer. Lawrence missed the shot but was fouled and capitalized on all three attempts from the charity stripe to trim the Georgia lead to 52-48 with 10 minutes remaining.

The fourth-quarter went back-and-forth, despite Georgia never relinquishing the lead. Mercer cut the deficit to one possession 11 times in the fourth quarter, but could not get over the hump as the Lady Bulldogs held on to outscore Mercer 16-15 in the final 10 minutes of play.

IOWA CITY, Iowa - Fifteenth-seeded Mercer's upset bid came up just short in a 66-61 loss to No. 2-seeded Iowa in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament at Carver-Hawkeye Arena on Friday afternoon.

The Bears (25-8) forced Iowa (27-6) into 24 turnovers and tallied a season-best 17 steals behind a tenacious defensive game plan that translated to Mercer owning a two-point lead with just over four minutes remaining in the contest. Mercer was eliminated from the NCAA Tournament with the loss while Iowa advanced to the second round, where it will play No. 7 Missouri, which defeated No. 10 Drake in overtime.

Player of the Game

Amanda Thompson was the glue yet again for Mercer on Friday, doing a bit of everything to will the Bears to a near upset. The senior totaled 18 points (9-of-16), seven rebounds, six steals and two assists.

How It Happened

A buzzer-beating bucket by Shannon Titus at the end of the third quarter gave Mercer its first lead of the game, 51-50, and officially put the Hawkeyes on upset alert on their home court. Both teams traded blows to open the fourth quarter with Rachel Selph hitting a layup to go lead 53-52. Mercer's largest advantage of the contest (56-52) came with six minutes and 58 seconds remaining when Keke Calloway knocked down one of her five three-pointers.

Calloway scored Mercer's final eight points in the game and made another three-pointer to regain the lead, 59-57, for Mercer. Iowa stifled the Bears' attack down the stretch, however. Shannon Titus fouled out with 2:56 remaining and Iowa leading 60-59. With Mercer trailing by three points with 13 seconds left, a jump ball was awarded to Iowa, who then sealed it with two made free throws. The Hawkeyes scored nine of the final 11 points in the game.

Mercer's defensive presence kept the game tight throughout. Titus set the tone defensively in the first quarter, tallying two blocks and one steal on the Hawkeyes' first four possessions. The Bears fed off that and recorded seven steals and one block as a team over the first 10 minutes. Despite a scoring drought of nearly three minutes, Mercer heated up toward the end of the quarter and hit its final four shots, including two jumpers by Amanda Thompson, to trail by just four points, 16-12.

Five more steals by the Bears late in the second quarter helped them score eight of the final 13 points in the half to trail Iowa, 35-27, heading into the locker room. A pivotal 7-0 run with baskets by Calloway, Titus and Thompson in the third quarter shifted momentum in favor of Mercer. The Bears outscored Iowa, 24-15, in the frame.
