Dear Zac:

We would like to offer to you and the Athletic Hall of Fame Committee the name of our roommate, fraternity brother and long time friend, <u>Terry Michael Faulk</u>, Class of 1968.

Terry was a varsity wrestler at Miami from 1964 to 1968. During that time he compiled a record of fifty-nine (59) wins, nine (9) losses. Twenty-nine (29) of his wins were falls (pins). He won the Mid American Conference Championship both his junior and senior years, and he went to the NCAA tournament both years. If our recollection is correct, it took fifteen years after graduation for someone to break his record number of pins in the MAC. He participated in Freshman Football, Wrestling and Varsity Wrestling and was a member of Tribe Miami. He was a counselor at Anderson Hall his sophomore year. In addition, he was a member of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity and Omicron Delta Kappa leadership honorary.

After graduation Terry spent three years as an officer in the Marines with a year in Vietnam. Following military service he spent his entire business career with Kraft Foods retiring as Executive Vice President Human Resources of this Fortune 500 Company. He and his late wife, Mary Ford Faulk, Class of 1968, have two daughters. Terry is now remarried to Annette Kays Faulk, and they live in Chicago IL and Naples FL.

In addition to his athletic accomplishments while at Miami, Terry never forgot our beloved University with both his time and money. He served on the Farmer School of Business Advisory Council with both of us, and he continues to recruit future Miami students working with Miami's Office of Admissions. On the financial side, Terry is a significant contributors to the Miami University Foundation.

In addition to our letter of nomination, you will also receive a letter from Joe Galat, Miami '62 and a current member of the Miami Athletic Hall of Fame, endorsing Terry's

nomination. Joe was Terry's coach for all four years at Miami, so he will attest to Terry's athletic skills and accomplishments while at Miami.

Terry Faulk's love for Miami University is without limits as he demonstrated as a student athlete and in later years as a caring and giving alumnus with both his time and treasure. Because of these attributes, we believe Terry should be inducted into the Miami University Athletic Hall of Fame.

Nomination for Terry Faulk to the Miami University Athletic Hall of Fame

As Head Wrestling Coach at Miami University, I first met Terry Faulk while recruiting this outstanding High School Scholar Athlete. It was obvious from the recommendations I received from his high school coaches that Terry Faulk was a special young man. Every teacher and coach had the utmost respect for Terry as they, without reservation, predicted his continued success as an athlete and student at the University level.

Terry Faulk surpassed those expectations. He set a standard for scholar athletes academically and athletically. In my over thirty years of coaching, including Miami University, Yale, University of Kentucky then the National Football League I would rank Terry Faulk as the finest citizen, most intelligent, highest performing athlete I had the pleasure of coaching.

The United States Marine Corps was privileged to have Terry serve as an officer. While others chanted "hell no we wont go", Terry prevailed during his tour of duty in Vietnam.

Terry has also set a standard as a family man of the highest character. He is a proud and dedicated husband and father of two daughters.

Terry Faulk loves Miami University. He served on the Farmers Business School Advisory Council. Financially, Terry has contributed significantly to the Miami University Foundation.

He often credits his education and his late wife, Mary Ford Faulk (Miami University 1968 honor student), for his success in the world of business and life.

Before retirement as Senior Vice President of Human Resources for The Kraft Company, he continued to lead and enhance the reputation of Miami University Graduates.
