► FIRST-AND-10

• Michigan State closes the regular season against No. 11 Penn State on Friday, Nov. 24 at Ford Field in Detroit. Kickoff is set for 7:35 p.m. The game will be televised on NBC and streamed live on Peacock with Noah Eagle (play-by-play), Todd Blackledge (analyst) and Kathryn Tappen (sidelines) on the call.

• The Spartans (4-7, 2-6 Big Ten) defeated Indiana on the road last week, 24-21, to reclaim the Old Brass Spittoon from Hoosiers, while Penn State (9-2, 6-2 Big Ten) won 27-6 over Rutgers on Senior Day in Happy Valley. The Nittany Lions are ranked 11th in this week's College Football Playoff rankings, and are also ranked 11th in the AP and Coaches Polls.

• Friday's game marks the 38th meeting between Michigan State and Penn State. The Spartans have won six of the last 10 meetings against the Nittany Lions and the all-time series is tied, 18-18-1. This marks the first-ever neutral site game between the two schools.

• Since the renewal of the series in 1993, the winner of the Michigan State-Penn State game has been presented the Land-Grant Trophy. The trophy honors the two universities' unique places in history as the two pioneer land-grant schools in the nation. Each institution was founded in 1855: Michigan State on Feb. 12 and Penn State on Feb. 22. The schools were the prototypes after which the land-grant system was patterned. Since 1993, Penn State leads the series, 17-10, but the Spartans have won six of the last 10.


• Friday's game against Penn State marks the second-ever game for Michigan State at Ford Field. The Spartans beat Florida Atlantic, 30-17, on Sept. 11, 2010, during their first appearance at the facility. Prior to that win over Florida Atlantic, MSU's last visit to downtown Detroit was Oct. 27, 1944, when Coach Charlie Bachman led the Spartans to a 32-0 victory over Wayne State in a contest played at University of Detroit Stadium. Michigan State also played Detroit at U of D Stadium in 1923, 1928, 1931 and 1933.

• Although this marks the first time Michigan State has played a game on the Friday after Thanksgiving, the Spartans had a long tradition of playing on Thanksgiving for many years, beginning in the second-ever official season for the school in 1897. Michigan State has played on Thanksgiving a total of 17 times (1897-99; 1901; 1906-09; 1911-12; 1917-22; 1963).

2023 SEASON

- All requests for working press, photo and broadcast credentials for Michigan State's 2023 home football games should be submitted online. Please contact the athletic communications office at (517) 355-2271 for the website.

- Priority for the issuance of credentials will be given to daily print/digital media outlets and radio and television stations which cover MSU football on a regular basis.

PRESS BOX

- The Spartan Stadium press box, located on level eight, is the working press deck for reporters that features 193 seats and three radio broadcast booths. Level six is the television camera deck as well as the broadcast location for national telecasts. Admission to the press box is through Gate F on the west side of the stadium. All press personnel are subject to search prior to entering Spartan Stadium.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCES

- Post-game press conferences from both head coaches are conducted in the media center on the lower level of the north end zone facility at Spartan Stadium. Reporters can access the media center from the concourse. Selected Spartan players will also be available for interviews following the game. Quotes from both coaches and selected players will be posted online at msuspartans.com approximately one hour after the game.

MEDIA INTERVIEWS

- Outside the weekly press conference, interviews during the week with coaches or any Spartan players should be arranged through the MSU Athletic Communications Department. The best time for player interviews is following practice on Tuesday. All player interviews should be completed by Wednesday. Please contact the MSU Athletic Communications Department for all player interview requests at least 24 hours in advance.

GAME NOTES/POST-GAME MATERIALS

- Upon request, a final statistics book, quotes and notes can be e-mailed to media members approximately 90 minutes after the conclusion of the game. To be added to the list, please e-mail football contact Ben Phlegar. In addition, statistics, game notes and quotes will be posted on msuspartans.com after the game.

SPARTAN MEDIA NETWORK

Michigan State Athletics and Playfly Sports announced in August 2020 a rebrand of the statewide Spartan Sports Network as the Spartan Media Network. In addition, long-term extensions were announced with the three flagship stations that anchor the network: Detroit's WJR 760-AM, Lansing's WVFN 730/WJIM 1240-AM and 94.9 WMMQ-FM. The Spartan Media Network is the largest and most expansive radio network in the State of Michigan and extends its programming nationally and worldwide via partnerships with SiriusXM and TuneIn radio.

RADIO SHOW: THURSDAYS FROM 7-8 P.M.

The Spartan Media Network produces and distributes Michigan State's weekly radio program Thursdays from 7-8 p.m. ET. Spartan play-by-play announcer George Blaha hosts this live show, featuring insight from coaches, players, special guests, features and phone calls. The radio show can be heard statewide as well as locally on flagship station WJIM Radio (AM 1240) and WMMQ (FM 94.9) and on msuspartans.com.

SPARTAN ALL-ACCESS

Spartan All-Access is a sports docu-series providing an exclusive look into Michigan State Athletics, its student-athletes, coaches and the people that make the Michigan State Athletics family what it is. The series airs on MSU Athletics' social media platforms throughout the season. The show is produced by the Emmy award-winning Spartan Vision team.



Michigan State interim head coach Harlon Barnett is in his 15th year overall on the Spartan coaching staff. A former All-American defensive back at MSU, Barnett has coached in four BCS/New Year's Six Bowl games with the Spartans and has been on three Big Ten Championship staffs. He recorded his first win as a head coach on Nov. 4 as MSU beat Nebraska on Senior Day, 20-17.

- Michigan State's schedule currently ranks tied for the most difficult in the FBS – along with Penn State – according to the NCAA (opponents with a .664 winning percentage; 73-37 record). The Spartans have played three AP Top-10 teams (No. 2 Ohio State, No. 3 Michigan, No. 4 Washington) and seven opponents have clinched postseason berths (Richmond, Washington, Maryland, Iowa, Rutgers, Michigan, Ohio State). Penn State will be MSU's fourth ranked opponent of the season, and five of MSU's opponents are currently in the College Football Playoff rankings (Ohio State, Michigan, Washington, Penn State, Iowa).

- Secondary coach **Harlon Barnett**, who is in his 15th year overall on the Spartan coaching staff, was named acting head coach by MSU Vice President/Director of Athletics **Alan Haller** on Sunday, Sept. 10 and has since been appointed interim head coach. Barnett came back to East Lansing in 2020 after spending two seasons (2018-19) as the defensive coordinator at Florida State. He previously spent 11 seasons (2007-17) as the secondary coach at Michigan State, including three seasons as the co-defensive coordinator (2015-17) and one as the associate head coach (2017), before departing for FSU. Barnett has coached in four New Year's Six/BCS bowl games with the Spartans (2014 Rose, 2014 Cotton, 2015 CFP Semifinal, 2021 Peach) and has been on staff for three Big Ten Championship teams (2010, 2013, 2015). Barnett recorded his first victory as head coach of the Spartans with a 20-17 win over Nebraska on Nov. 4 in East Lansing.

- Michigan State has nine players from Detroit on its roster (OT **Brandon Baldwin**, WR **Sebastian Brown**, DB **Dorian Davis**, WR **Antonio Gates Jr.**, DT **Derrick Harmon**, RB **Jaren Mangham**, RB **Davion Primm**, S **Armorion Smith**, DE **Jalen Thompson**). A total of 28 players on MSU's roster are either from Detroit or the Metro Detroit area.

- Michigan State had two players recognized by the Big Ten Conference for their performances in the win at Indiana. Redshirt junior tight end **Maliq Carr** was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week, while redshirt freshman quarterback **Katin Houser** was tabbed the Big Ten Freshman of the Week. Carr had a career-high seven catches for 119 yards, the most by a Spartan tight end since Dion Sims had 122 vs. Eastern Michigan in 2012, to go along with a career-high two touchdowns. He opened the game on MSU's first series with a 17-yard TD catch in the corner of the end zone. Down 21-17 with 4:06 remaining, the Spartans marched down the field 75 yards for the game-winning touchdown drive. Houser connected on a 36-yard TD pass to Carr with just 1:19 left on the clock to put MSU on top, 24-21. Carr caught the ball inside the 15-yard line, absorbed a big hit, then raced into the end zone for the game-winning score. Houser finished his best game as a Spartan with 279 passing yards while completing 25-of-39 throws for three touchdowns. He also connected on a 29-yard TD to **Montorie Foster Jr.** in the second quarter.

LAST TIME OUT: MICHIGAN STATE 24, INDIANA 21

► SUMMARY

• Michigan State rallied in the fourth quarter to defeat Indiana, 24-21, last Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium, reclaiming the Old Brass Spittoon from the Hoosiers. It also marked the first road win of the season for MSU.

• Down 21-17 with 4:06 remaining, the Spartans marched down the field 75 yards for the game-winning touchdown drive. Redshirt freshman quarterback **Katin Houser** connected on a 36-yard TD pass to redshirt junior tight end **Maliq Carr** with just 1:19 left on the clock to put MSU on top, 24-21. Carr caught the ball inside the 15-yard line, absorbed a big hit, then raced into the end zone for the game-winning score.

• Michigan State leads the all-time series against Indiana, 50-18-2, including a 24-10-1 record in Bloomington.

• The 24-21 final score was MSU's third game this season decided by one-score and the Spartans are now 2-1 in one-score games, also beating Nebraska, 20-17 on Nov. 4 and losing at Rutgers, 27-24, on Oct. 14.

► OFFENSE

• The Spartans' 279 passing yards were their most in a Big Ten game (previous: 274 in the league opener vs. Maryland on Sept. 23).

• Graduate offensive lineman **J.D. Duplain** made his 41st consecutive start and played in his 46th overall start as part of playing in his 53rd career game . . . Duplain's 41st straight start not only leads all active Spartans, but moved him up to tie for No. 4 on MSU's career consecutive starts list, matching Shilique Calhoun (2012-15) . . . Duplain has the second-most consecutive starts by an offensive player in program history, behind school record co-holder Shane Hannah (1991-94) with 44, tying linebacker Dan Bass (1976-79).

• The 46 overall career starts also has Duplain at No. 2 on MSU's most starts by an offensive lineman list, trailing only Joel Foreman (2008-11) with 49 total starts.

• Redshirt freshman **Katin Houser** made his sixth straight start, finishing with career highs for completions, attempts, yards and touchdowns, going 25-of-39 passing for 279 yards and three TDs . . . Houser's previous highs for completions (18), attempts (29) and TDs (2) were all in the game at Rutgers (10/14), while his previous high for yards (165) was in the last home game vs. Nebraska (11/4) . . . Houser also rushed seven times for 11 yards overall, including a career-long 15-yard scamper during what proved to be MSU's game-winning drive.

• MSU scored a touchdown on its opening possession for the second time this season and first since the Rutgers game (10/14) . . . overall, it is MSU's fourth score on its opening drive, joining Rutgers (TD, 10/14), Minnesota (FG, 10/28) and Nebraska (FG, 11/4).

• Redshirt junior tight end **Maliq Carr** snared a career-high two TD catches, and had a third TD catch called back due to a penalty . . . he now has three TD receptions on the season . . . Carr also now has three TDs in his last two games against Indiana, as he had one TD reception in last season's meeting in East Lansing (11/19/22).

• Carr finished with seven catches for 119 yards, both career highs . . . he matched his previous game career-high of six catches in the first half alone . . . Carr's previous career-best of six receptions came in the game at Iowa (9/30), which he left in the first half due to an injury . . . with the career-high seven receptions Saturday, Carr recorded his fifth game this season with multiple catches as part of his 11th career game with two or more catches.

• Carr's 100-yard receiving outing is MSU's first 100-yard receiving game of the season, and first since last year's meeting with Indiana (11/22/22), with Keon Coleman snaring eight receptions for 107 yards . . . it's the most receiving yards by a Spartan tight end since Dion Sims had 122 vs. Eastern Michigan in 2012.

• The two TD catches by Carr is the most by a Spartan receiver in a game this season.

• Senior wide receiver **Montorie Foster Jr.** snared his third TD catch of the season, now with two in the last three games, also with a TD catch vs. Nebraska (11/4) and also at Rutgers (10/14) and matching career-high for the fifth time.

• Foster finished with seven catches for a career-high 94 yards, bettering his previous career-best of 79 yards vs. Iowa (9/30), and just shy of his career-high for receptions of eight in the same game vs. Iowa . . . the seven catches gives Foster at least one reception in all 11 games this season and in his last 12 games played dating back to last season and has at least one reception in 22 of the last 34 games played.

- Graduate running back **Jaren Mangham** had an MSU career high in carries for the second straight game with 12 rushes, bettering his previous high of nine at Ohio State . . . Mangham had 27 yards after 35 against the Buckeyes, giving him 21 rushes for 62 yards in his last two games after four carries for 7 yards in his previous three games, making his MSU debut in the Michigan game (10/21) after missing the first six games with an injury in his first season as a Spartan after transferring from USF.

- Mangham also had collegiate career-highs of five receptions for 33 yards, bettering his previous top marks of three catches for 30 yards during his USF career . . . he now has seven catches for 37 yards on the season.

► DEFENSE

- Senior defensive back **Angelo Grose** logged his second double-digit tackle outing of the season with 10 stops, matching his season-high of 10 tackles at Minnesota (10/28) . . . Grose now has five career games with 10-plus tackles as the two this season are joined by two in 2022 and his career-high of 16 tackles in 2021 . . . Grose added 0.5 tackle for loss, as he now has 3.0 TFLs for the season.

- Sophomore defensive back **Malik Spencer** registered 10 tackles, his second most of the season, trailing his career-high 11 tackles vs. Michigan (10/21).

- Graduate linebacker **Aaron Brule** tallied eight tackles for his second most of the season, behind a season-high 11 stops vs. Michigan (10/21).

- Senior defensive back **Chester Kimbrough** posted a pass break-up in back-to-back games with a PBU in the second quarter after one last week at Ohio State (11/11) . . . Kimbrough finished with a season-high seven tackles, surpassing his previous season-best of four with five stops in the first half alone.

- Senior defensive tackle **Simeon Barrow Jr.** blocked an IU field-goal attempt right before halftime, for his second blocked field goal of the season, both coming on the road, also getting a paw on a field goal attempt in the game at Minnesota (10/28) . . . Barrow is the first Spartan with two blocked kicks in the same season since Jerel Worthy had two in 2011 . . . Barrow added a sack in the third quarter and now has 3.5 sacks on the season.

- Freshman linebacker **Jordan Hall** logged five tackles including 1.0 sack for 14 yards . . . Hall now has 55 tackles on the season, including 6.5 TFL and 3.5 sacks.

► SPECIAL TEAMS

- Redshirt freshman punter **Ryan Eckley** punted four times for a career-high 51.0 ypp average with a long of 56 yards . . . three of Eckley's four punts went for 50+ yards, with a 50-yarder on his first punt in the opening quarter and adding a 52-yarder in the second quarter and a 56-yarder in the third quarter . . . Eckley's 51.0 ypp average bettered his previous top single-game mark of 48.8 ypp in the Iowa game (10/30) . . . he also had three inside the 20, including two inside the 11, highlighted by one being downed at the IU 1 in the third quarter.

- Graduate senior placekicker **Jonathan Kim** made a 43-yard field goal in the fourth quarter . . . Kim now has split the uprights at least once in the last four games as part of moving to 13-of-18 on the season . . . he is now 3-of-5 from 40-49 yards out . . . Kim added 3-for-3 on PATs to improve to 17-for-17 on the season.

► A QUICK GLANCE AT NO. 11/11 PENN STATE (9-2, 6-2 BIG TEN)

• The Nittany Lions tote a 9-2 overall record and 6-2 Big Ten ledger into Friday night's clash with the Spartans in Detroit at Ford Field. Penn State is ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, as well as No. 12 in last week's CFP Rankings. PSU is coming off a 27-6 win over Rutgers on Saturday afternoon to get back in the win column after the Nittany Lions' 25-14 loss to Michigan on Nov. 11.

• In last week's win over the Scarlet Knights, Penn State got down 3-0 after the first quarter but scored a TD and a field goal in the second quarter, before Rutgers made a field goal as time expired before halftime to pull within four points, 10-6. The Nittany Lions added a field goal in the third quarter before a pair of TDs in the fourth quarter to pull away from the Scarlet Knights for the 27-6 win.

• Overall, Penn State is second in both the Big Ten and FBS in total defense (238.7 ypg), leading the league and ranking third in the nation in rushing defense (79.2 ypg), while ranking fourth in the conference and sixth in the country in passing yards allowed (159.5 ypg). The Nittany Lion defense is also fourth in the both the Big Ten and FBS in scoring defense (12.5 ppg).

• PSU's defense leads the conference and is second in the country in takeaways (24), while also leading the league and ranking second in the nation in fewest turnovers (6), to lead both the Big Ten and FBS in turnover margin (+18 / +1.64 pg).

• Additionally, Penn State's defense also leads both the league and the nation in team sacks (3.73 pg) with 41.0 total sacks, along with ranking first in the Big Ten and fourth in the FBS in team tackles for loss (8.1 pg) with 89.0 total TFL.

• Offensively, PSU is second in the conference and 15th in the country in scoring offense (36.7 ppg). The Nittany Lions are also sixth in the league and 75th in the nation in total offense (373.3 ypg), ranking second in the Big Ten and 41st in the FBS in rushing offense (177.9 ypg) and 10th in the league and 100th in the nation in passing offense (195.4 ypg).

• Individually, sophomore quarterback **Drew Allar** is third in the Big Ten and 25th in the FBS in passing TDs (21), while ranking second in the conference in points responsible for/game (13.6), fourth in passing efficiency (135.0), fifth in both completion percentage (.610) and completions/game (17.9), sixth in both passing yards/game (185.8) and total offense (201.9 ypg) along with 10th in passing yards/completion (10.38). Allar is 197-of-323 for 2,044 yards with 21 TDs and just one INT, adding 66 rushing attempts for 177 yards (2.7 ypc/16.1 ypg) with four rushing TDs.

• Junior wide receiver **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** is fourth in the Big Ten in receptions/game (4.7) and sixth in the league in receiving yards/game (59.2), along with tied for 13th in the conference in receiving TDs (4). Lambert-Smith has a team-leading 52 receptions for 651 yards (12.5 ypc/59.2 ypg) with a long of 72 yards, and four TDs.

• Junior tight end **Tyler Warren** leads PSU and is tied for fifth in the Big Ten in receiving TDs (6), with 27 receptions for 273 yards (10.1 ypc/24.8 ypg) with a long of 23 yards.

• Sophomore **Kaytron Allen** and sophomore **Nicholas Singleton** are a 1-2 punch for the Nittany Lions on the ground, with Allen ranking seventh in the Big Ten in rushing yards/game (64.9), while Singleton is ninth (53.1). Singleton is tied for fifth in the league in rushing TDs (7) while Allen is tied for eighth (6).

• Redshirt sophomore **Kobe King** spearheads the Nittany Lion defense with 49 total tackles, adding 5.0 TFLs and 1.5 sacks, with one fumble recovery.

• Senior defensive end **Adisa Isaac** is third in the Big Ten and tied for 29th in the FBS in tackles for loss (13.5) and fourth in the league and tied for 31st in the nation in TFL/game (1.23). Isaac is also third in the conference and tied for 43rd in the country in sacks (6.5). He has 28 total tackles, with just shy of half of them being TFL, with four QB hurries, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

• A total of nine different players have snared at least one interception, as PSU has 11 total team INTs.

• Senior kicker **Alex Felkins** is second in the Big Ten in scoring (8.2 ppg), ranking third in the league in both field goals (16) and PATs (42). He is 16-of-19 (.842) on field goals with a long of 50 yards, going 7-of-10 from 40+ yards. Felkins is also 42-of-42 on PATs.

• Senior punter **Riley Thompson** is fourth in the league in punting average (45.3 ypp) on 42 punts, with a long of 56 yards, one of 11 punts of 50+, with 14 inside the 20, one touchback and inducing 18 fair catches.

• Penn State head coach **James Franklin** is in his 10th season leading the Nittany Lions, logging an 87-38 ledger, part of amassing a 111-53 overall record in his 13th season as a collegiate head coach

► MSU/PENN STATE SERIES NOTES

• Friday's game marks the 38th meeting between Michigan State and Penn State. The Spartans have won six of the last 10 meetings against the Nittany Lions and the all-time series is tied, 18-18-1. This marks the first-ever neutral site game between the two schools.

• Since the renewal of the series in 1993, the winner of the Michigan State-Penn State game has been presented the Land-Grant Trophy. The trophy honors the two universities' unique places in history as the two pioneer land-grant schools in the nation. Each institution was founded in 1855: Michigan State on Feb. 12 and Penn State on Feb. 22. The schools were the prototypes after which the land-grant system was patterned. Since 1993, Penn State leads the series, 17-10, but the Spartans have won six of the last 10.

► HARLON BARNETT

• Secondary coach **Harlon Barnett**, who is in his 15th year overall on the Spartan coaching staff, was named acting head coach by MSU Vice President/Director of Athletics **Alan Haller** on Sunday, Sept. 10 and has since been appointed interim head coach. Barnett came back to East Lansing in 2020 after spending two seasons (2018-19) as the defensive coordinator at Florida State. He previously spent 11 seasons (2007-17) as the secondary coach at Michigan State, including three seasons as the co-defensive coordinator (2015-17) and one as the associate head coach (2017), before departing for FSU. Barnett has coached in four New Year's Six/BCS bowl games with the Spartans (2014 Rose, 2014 Cotton, 2015 CFP Semifinal, 2021 Peach) and has been on staff for three Big Ten Championship teams (2010, 2013, 2015). Barnett recorded his first victory as head coach of the Spartans with a 20-17 win over Nebraska on Nov. 4 in East Lansing.

• Barnett came back to East Lansing in 2020 after spending two seasons (2018-19) as the defensive coordinator at Florida State. He previously spent 11 seasons (2007-17) as the secondary coach at Michigan State, including three seasons as the co-defensive coordinator (2015-17) and one as the associate head coach (2017), before departing for FSU. Barnett has coached in four New Year's Six/BCS bowl games with the Spartans (2014 Rose, 2014 Cotton, 2015 CFP Semifinal, 2021 Peach) and has been on staff for three Big Ten Championship teams (2010, 2013, 2015).

• Barnett has coached 11 Spartan defensive backs that have been selected in the NFL Draft, including two first-rounders (Darqueze Dennard, No. 24, Cincinnati Bengals, 2014; Trae Waynes, No. 11, Minnesota Vikings, 2015), and 15 have been invited to the NFL Scouting Combine. In 2015, Michigan State became just the sixth school to have cornerbacks selected in the first round of the NFL Draft in consecutive years, joining Alabama (2012-13), LSU (2011-12), Miami-Florida (2005-06), Ohio State (1999-2001) and Notre Dame (1993-94). In addition to Dennard and Waynes, Jeremy Ware (2010, Oakland, seventh round), Chris L. Rucker (2011, Indianapolis, sixth round), Trenton Robinson (2012, San Francisco, sixth round), Tony Lippett (2015, Miami, fifth round), Montae Nicholson (2017, Washington, fourth round), Justin Layne (2019, Pittsburgh, third round), Khari Willis (2019, Indianapolis, fourth round), Josiah Scott (2020, Jacksonville, fourth round) and Ameer Speed (2023, New England, sixth round) have been chosen in the NFL Draft.

• In addition to the four All-Americans, Barnett has coached three Thorpe Award semifinalists (Dennard, Waynes, Otis Wiley) at MSU. A unanimous All-American, Dennard became the first Spartan to win the Thorpe Award, given to the nation's best defensive back, in 2013.

• Barnett's players have earned All-Big Ten honors 31 times as secondary coach at MSU, including nine different first-team players (Wiley in 2008; Robinson in 2011; CB Johnny Adams in 2011-12; Dennard in 2011-12, S Isaiah Lewis in 2013; Drummond in 2013-14; Waynes in 2014; S David Dowell in 2017; Brown in 2020). All four of MSU's starters in the secondary garnered All-Big Ten recognition during the 2010, 2011 and 2013 seasons, and Barnett has coached two Big Ten Defensive Backs of the Year (Dennard in 2013, Drummond in 2014).

• A native of Cincinnati, Barnett was a three-year starter and a four-year letterwinner for Coach **George Perles** at Michigan State (1986-89). He was a member of the 1987 Big Ten and 1988 Rose Bowl championship team that went 9-2-1 overall and finished eighth in the final polls. Barnett, who also played in the 1989 Gator Bowl and the 1989 Aloha Bowl during his time as a Spartan player, earned first-team All-America recognition by The Sporting News as a senior in 1989. He was a primary reason that the Green and White ranked No. 1 in the Big Ten and No. 11 nationally in both rushing defense (95.4 ypg.) and total defense (280.5 ypg.). He finished his career with 154 tackles, six interceptions and 13 pass break-ups. Barnett is the fourth former Spartan player to lead his team as head coach (**George Gauthier**, 1918; **Frank "Muddy" Waters**, 1980-82; **George Perles**, 1983-94).

• Haller also announced on Sept. 10 that former MSU head coach **Mark Dantonio**, the winningest head coach in school history, will return to the Spartan staff as an associate head coach. Dantonio will serve as an advisor to Barnett and the coaching staff on game days and throughout the week at practice and in meetings. After a storied 13 seasons as head coach of the Michigan State football program, Dantonio announced his retirement on Feb. 4, 2020. He finished his career with a record of 114-57 in East Lansing, 132-74 in 16



seasons overall. During his time at the helm of the Spartan program, Dantonio compiled an impressive list of accomplishments including three Big Ten Championships, two victories in the Big Ten Championship Game, victories in the 2014 Rose Bowl and the 2015 Cotton Bowl, and an appearance in the 2015 College Football Playoff, finishing his career as the winningest football coach in Michigan State history.

- Michigan State has two new assistant coaches for the 2023 season. **Diron Reynolds** joined the Spartan staff in January as the program's defensive line coach. Reynolds, who has more than 25 years of coaching experience both at the NFL and Power 5 levels, previously spent the past seven seasons (2016-22) as the defensive line coach at Stanford. He has coached on multiple championship teams, including winning a Super Bowl ring with the Colts, and has worked with numerous All-Americans, NFL Draft picks and All-Pro players. During his time at Stanford, Reynolds coached four NFL Draft picks on the defensive line, including Solomon Thomas, who was the highest defensive player drafted in school history at No. 3 overall in 2017 by the San Francisco 49ers.

- **Jim Salgado** was named the program's cornerbacks coach on March 16. Salgado, who has nearly 30 years of coaching experience, spent the past six seasons with the Buffalo Bills (2017-22). He arrived in Buffalo in 2017 and spent his first three seasons as a defensive assistant. Salgado was promoted to nickelbacks coach in 2020 and was the team's safeties coach in 2022. While he was in Buffalo, Salgado coached multiple Pro Bowl players as the Bills won three consecutive AFC East titles (2020-22). The Bills' defense regularly finished among the best in the NFL during his tenure, ranking second in total defense in 2018, third in 2019, No. 1 in 2021 and No. 6 in 2022. In addition, the Bills were the top-ranked pass defense in the NFL in 2021 and ranked third in the league with 19 interceptions. Prior to coaching in the NFL, Salgado spent 23 seasons in the collegiate ranks.

- **Chris Kapilovic**, who enters his fourth season as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator at Michigan State, was promoted to assistant head coach in January 2021. Kapilovic, 54, joined MSU's staff in East Lansing in February 2020 after spending the 2019 season as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator in Colorado. Kapilovic has more than 30 years of coaching experience, including roles as an offensive coordinator and/or run game coordinator at Southern Mississippi (2008-11), North Carolina (2012-18) and Colorado (2019). He has coached multiple NFL players, first-round draft picks and record-setting offenses during his career. In 2021, the Spartan offensive line was named one of 13 semifinalists for the Joe Moore Award, which is given annually to the nation's top offensive line.

- **Jay Johnson**, a 2021 Broyles Award nominee for the nation's top assistant coach, begins his fourth season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Michigan State. Johnson, 53, is a veteran coach and administrator of 28 seasons, including 13 as an offensive coordinator at five FBS schools (Michigan State, Colorado, Minnesota, Louisiana, Southern Mississippi) in addition to coaching quarterbacks, running backs and tight ends as a position coach. Johnson arrived to East Lansing after serving as the offensive coordinator at Colorado for one season (2019).

- A 27-year coaching veteran with stints at all levels of collegiate football and the NFL, **Scottie Hazelton** is in his fourth season as the Secchia Family Defensive Coordinator. Hazelton arrived in East Lansing after spending one season as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Kansas State in 2019. He also serves as the program's linebackers coach.

- **Ted Gilmore** coaches the tight ends for the Spartans. Gilmore, who has coached 28 years, has experience at the FBS and NFL ranks and has developed numerous NFL players, draft picks and All-Americans during his career. He was named the 2011 FootballScoop Wide Receivers Coach of the Year after mentoring consensus All-American Robert Woods and 2011 Freshman All-American Marqise Lee at USC. Gilmore, 56, previously spent five seasons (2015-19) as the wide receivers coach at Wisconsin.

- Former Spartan great **Courtney Hawkins** is in his fourth season as the wide receivers coach. Hawkins helped develop back-to-back NFL Draft selections the past two years in Jalen Nailor (2022, sixth round, Minnesota Vikings) and Jayden Reed (2023, second round, Green Bay Packers).

- With more than three decades of coaching experience, **Ross Els** is in his fourth season as the program's special teams coordinator. In addition, after coaching the linebackers his first two seasons in East Lansing, Els helped assist the nickelbacks in 2022. Els, 56, has previous experience in the Big Ten, serving as the defensive coordinator at Purdue in 2016 and four seasons at Nebraska under Coach Bo Pelini from 2011-14.

- **Effrem Reed**, who served as an offensive analyst in 2020-21, was promoted to running backs coach in January 2022 and returns for his second season on the full-time offensive staff.

- Defensive analyst **TJ Hollowell** was designated as MSU's 10th on-field assistant coach on Sept. 15. Hollowell is in his fourth season as a defensive analyst at Michigan State and was one of seven coaches at this year's training camp with the Houston Texans as part of the Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship.

- #4 **Sam Leavitt** (Fr., 6-2, 200, West Linn, Ore./West Linn) (4 games, 15-of-23 passing [.652], 139 yards [34.8 ypg], 2 TDs, 2 INTs)

► HOUSER GETS STARTING NOD LAST SIX GAMES FOR SPARTANS

• Redshirt freshman **Katin Houser** has started the last six games for Michigan State, posting a 2-4 record in those contests, including wins over Nebraska and Indiana. Houser has completed 101-of-172 passes (.587) for 1,043 yards, six touchdowns and four interceptions in 10 games of action this season. In his six starts, Houser is 92-of-156 passing (.590) for 887 yards (147.8 ypg), six touchdowns and three interceptions. He also has two rushing touchdowns on the season.

• Houser was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week following his best performance as a Spartan last week at Indiana. He completed 25-of-39 throws for 279 yards and three touchdowns – all career bests – including the game-winning touchdown pass, a 36-yarder to **Maliq Carr**, with just 1:19 on the clock that gave the Spartans a 24-21 victory.

• Houser recorded his first victory as a starting quarterback at Michigan State on Nov. 4 against Nebraska. He completed 13-of-20 passes for 165 yards, including an 11-yard TD to **Christian Fitzpatrick**.

• Making his first career start at quarterback at Rutgers on Oct. 14, Houser was 18-of-29 passing for 133 yards and two touchdowns against the Scarlet Knights. Houser threw his first career TD pass on MSU's opening drive with a 13-yard scoring pass to senior wide receiver **Montorie Foster Jr.** He also rushed for a 12-yard rushing TD in the second quarter part of eight carries for 27 yards..

• Houser scored his first career TD on a 4-yard run against No. 8 Washington in Week 3 to cap an 11-play, 99-yard drive for the Spartans in the fourth quarter.

• A product of Anaheim, California, Houser was a highly touted four-star quarterback and Elite 11 finalist who enrolled early in January 2022. He took reps with the offense during practices last season, but still preserved his redshirt season after making just one appearance in Week 2 in his collegiate debut vs. Akron.

► KIM STARTS FIRST FIVE GAMES FOR MICHIGAN STATE

• Redshirt junior quarterback **Noah Kim** started the first five games for the Spartans, but has not seen game action the past six games. Kim is 91-of-160 passing (.569) for 1,090 yards, six touchdowns and six interceptions. He has also rushed for 53 yards on 27 carries.

• Kim was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week following his performance in the win over Richmond in Week 2. Kim was 18-of-22 passing for a career-high 292 yards and three touchdowns against the Spiders, and completed a school-record 15 straight passes to close the game.

• Making his first career start at quarterback, Kim was 18-of-31 passing for 279 yards and two touchdowns against Central Michigan in Week 1. After a slow start in the first quarter, Kim was 9-of-16 passing for 147 yards in the second quarter, and was 8-of-10 for 134 yards and two TDs in the second half. After redshirting in 2020 and not seeing game action in 2021, Kim was 14-of-19 passing for 174 yards and three TDs last season.

• In four games of action off the bench last season, Kim was very efficient, completing 74 percent of his passes (14-of-19) for 174 yards and three touchdowns. During his two Big Ten games, Kim was 6-of-7 passing for 70 yards against Minnesota, including a 27-yard touchdown, and was 6-of-10 for 82 yards and a 25-yard TD vs. Ohio State. He has also shown the ability to move the chains with his legs, bringing an added dimension to the Spartan offense.



► LEAVITT THROWS GAME-WINNING TD PASS AGAINST NEBRASKA

• The Spartans also welcomed in four-star quarterback **Sam Leavitt**, the 2022 Oregon Gatorade Player of the Year, to the program this summer after he signed a National Letter of Intent in December. Leavitt threw 82 career touchdown passes in high school and closed his prep career by passing for 36 TDs and 3,065 yards in addition to rushing for 693 yards and eight scores as a senior.

• Leavitt has played in four games this season, completing 15-of-23 passes (.652) for two touchdowns and two interceptions. He made his collegiate debut on the last drive of the Maryland game in the fourth quarter and was 2-of-2 passing for 9 yards while rushing twice for 7 yards. He played 15 snaps against Michigan, completing 4-of-7 passes for 32 yards and one interception.

• Leavitt played two series in the 20-17 win over Nebraska on Nov. 4. With MSU leading 13-10 in the fourth quarter, Leavitt took over a Spartan drive at the Husker 38-yard line and directed a four-play, 38-yard scoring drive, capped by a 25-yard touchdown pass to **Montorie Foster Jr.** with 12:13 left in the game. Leavitt also had a 7-yard run on a third-and-4 play on the drive. He finished the game 1-of-2 passing for 25 yards.

• At Minnesota on Oct. 28, Leavitt threw the first TD pass of his Spartan career, hitting sophomore wide receiver **Tyrell Henry** for a 9-yard TD in the fourth quarter. Leavitt ended the game 8-of-12 passing for 73 yards with one TD and one interception. He also rushed six times for 52 yards with a long of 22 yards, MSU's longest rush of the day. On Leavitt's first series of the game in the fourth quarter, he engineered an eight-play, 75-yard touchdown drive in just 3:30.

• Redshirt junior **Andrew Schorfhaar** made his collegiate debut while playing one series at Ohio State on Nov. 11.

• Offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Jay Johnson** is in his fourth season with the Spartans.

► CARTER RANKS THIRD IN BIG TEN IN CARRIES, SIXTH IN RUSHING

• Redshirt sophomore running back **Nathan Carter** ranks sixth in the Big Ten rushing, averaging 68.5 yards per game (753 total). He also ranks third in the conference in carries (178) and 11th in all-purpose yards (855; 77.7 ypg), and leads the team with four rushing touchdowns.

• The UConn transfer has rushed for 100 yards in three games, including a season-high 113 yards on 18 carries in his debut against Central Michigan in Week 1. He had 111 yards on 19 carries vs. Richmond in Week 2 and ran for 108 yards on a season-high 20 carries at Iowa in Week 5.

• Carter became the first Spartan since Jehuu Caulcrick in 2007 to score three touchdowns in a single quarter after running for three scores (2 yards, 44 yards, 6 yards) in the third quarter of the 45-14 win over Richmond in Week 2.

• Making his Spartan debut, Carter rushed 18 times for 113 yards and one touchdown vs. Central Michigan. A transfer from UConn, Carter took his first carry as a Spartan on the first play from scrimmage and raced 31 yards for the longest rush of the game by any player. He scored his first TD in the Green and White on a 2-yard run late in the second quarter. Carter became the third consecutive Spartan transfer to start in the season opener and rush for more than 100 yards (**Kenneth Walker III**, 264 vs. Northwestern in 2021; **Jalen Berger**, 120 vs. Western Michigan in 2022).

- Carter still has three seasons of eligibility remaining after playing in only four games last season for the Huskies before suffering a season-ending injury. He rushed for 983 yards on 190 carries with three TDs in two seasons (2021-22) at UConn, including a team-leading 578 yards as a freshman in 2021. He was averaging more than 100 yards rushing a game last year (101.3 ypg), highlighted by a career-high 190 yards in the season opener vs. Utah State, before his injury in Week 4.

- Carter has rushed for 1,736 yards on 368 carries in his 27-game collegiate career (16 at UConn from 2021-22; 11 at MSU in 2023), including seven rushing touchdowns.

► SPARTANS SUFFER INJURIES BEHIND CARTER IN BACKFIELD

- **Jalen Berger** (R-Jr.), who posted career highs in rushing yards (683), carries (148) and rushing TDs (6) while starting 11 of 12 games last season after transferring from Wisconsin, is out for the season after suffering an injury in the Michigan game on Oct. 21. He previously missed two games (Washington, Maryland) with an injury but returned to play in a limited role at Iowa in Week 5 before rushing for 49 yards on 11 carries at Rutgers on Oct. 14. Berger finished the season with 25 carries for 93 yards.

- **Jaren Mangham** (Gr.-5), who joined the team in January and competed during spring practice, missed the first six games of the season due to an injury, but made his Spartan debut on Oct. 21 vs. Michigan and has played in the last five games. The past two weeks, Mangham has seen his workload increase, rushing nine times for 35 yards at No. 1 Ohio State on Nov. 11 and 12 times for 27 yards in the win at Indiana on Nov. 18. He also had a career-high five catches for 33 yards against the Hoosiers.

- For the season, the 6-foot-2, 235-pound Mangham has rushed 25 times for 69 yards and has seven receptions for 37 yards.

- Mangham, brother of current Spartan sophomore defensive back Jaden Mangham, played two years at Colorado (2019-20) and two at USF (2021-22) prior to arriving in East Lansing as a graduate transfer. He has collected 1,316 rushing yards and 23 rushing touchdowns in 37 collegiate games (16 at Colorado in 2019-20; 16 at USF in 2021-22; 5 at MSU in 2023). Mangham had a career-high 671 yards and 15 rushing TDs as a junior at USF in 2021 to lead the Bulls.

- Sixth-year senior **Harold Joiner III**, who transferred from Auburn to MSU in 2021, spent two seasons at running back (2021-22) before transferring to the defense as a safety in spring practice. He moved to line-backer in preseason camp but returned to the backfield in Week 5 at Iowa to provide depth at the position for the Spartans. He has five carries for 5 yards this season.

- **Effrem Reed** is in his second season as the running backs coach for MSU.

► SENIORS TRE MOSLEY AND MONTORIE FOSTER LEAD YOUNG WIDE RECEIVER ROOM

• Michigan State has a group of talented young wide receivers that have had increased roles in the offense in 2023, but the unit is led by fifth-year graduate senior **Tre Mosley**, who has played in 44 career games, including 28 starting assignments, over the past five seasons (2019-23). Mosley has given the Spartans steady production over the course of his time in East Lansing with 126 career receptions for 1,464 yards and 10 touchdowns in his career. He ranks among MSU's all-time leaders in catches (tied for 17th with 126), TD receptions (tied for 25th with 10) and receiving yards (28th with 1,464). Mosley had caught at least one pass in 25 consecutive games, but he has missed the last three games with an injury.

• In addition to his play on the field, Mosley's leadership will be counted on to mentor the wide receiver room. He is also nominated for the AFCA Good Works Team and the Wuerffel Trophy for his work in the community.

• Mosley currently ranks second on the Spartans with 28 catches for 288 yards and two TDs.

• Senior **Montorie Foster Jr.** has had his best year as a Spartan, posting career highs in catches (41), receiving yards (538) and TD receptions (3). Foster had a career-high eight receptions for 79 yards at Iowa, and had a career-best 94 receiving yards on four receptions on Senior Day vs. Nebraska on Nov. 4.

• In the win at Indiana on Nov. 18, Foster had a highlight reel one-handed catch in the middle of the field at the IU 22-yard line, then spun around a defender and raced into the end zone to put the Spartans on top, 14-7, at the 1:10 mark in the second quarter. The catch was named the No. 1 play of the week by the Big Ten Conference. Foster had seven catches for 94 yards overall against the Hoosiers.

• A three-year letterwinner, Foster has played in 41 career games and has 60 receptions for 802 yards and five TDs.

• Two-year letterwinner **Christian Fitzpatrick (R-Jr.)**, who missed the final seven games of last season due to an injury, is back this season for MSU. After playing in a reserve role the past two seasons, Fitzpatrick, a former Louisville transfer, has contributed more to the offense in his third season at MSU. Fitzpatrick has a career-high 16 catches for 237 yards (14.8 avg.) and one TD, including a 72-yarder in the season opener vs. Central Michigan and a 61-yarder in Week 3 vs. Washington.

► TRIO OF YOUNG RECEIVERS PROVIDING PRODUCTION FOR MSU

• Sophomore **Tyrell Henry**, who earned a letter as a true freshman returning kicks in 2022, has had an expanded role in the offense this fall, along with redshirt freshmen **Antonio Gates Jr.** and **Jaron Glover**. The young trio all showed promising signs during spring practice and continued to work on their development in preseason camp heading into the season.

• Henry has 23 catches for 194 yards and a team-leading three touchdowns, including a leaping one-handed TD grab vs. Central Michigan in Week 1 that was named the No. 3 play of the day on ESPN's SportsCenter. He also has 12 punt returns for 88 yards (7.3 avg.) and 10 kick returns for 167 yards (16.7 avg.). He ranks third on the team in all-purpose yards (43.5 ypg; 435 yards).

• In his first career start against Nebraska on Nov. 4 with Tre Mosley out of the lineup, Henry responded with a career-high four catches for 52 yards; he had 73 all-purpose yards in the game, second most on the team (54 receiving, 11 kick return, 8 punt return).

• Glover is averaging 18.6 yards per catch with 14 receptions for 261 yards in eight games (did not play vs. Michigan due to sickness; missed last two weeks with an injury). He has had six catches of 20-plus yards.

• Gates caught his first collegiate pass for a 45-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter against Richmond. For the season, he has five catches for 82 yards (16.4 avg.).

• The Spartans also added transfer **Alante Brown** from Nebraska over the summer. Brown played three seasons (2020-22) with the Huskers, collecting 22 receptions for 262 yards in 30 games. He posted career highs in catches (16) and yards (191) last season while playing in all 12 games, including 10 starts. His speed and versatility will give the Spartans another option in the passing game in 2023. For the season, he has eight carries for 15 yards and three catches for 27 yards; he also threw a 42-yard pass to Montorie Foster Jr. against Nebraska.

• Former Spartan **Courtney Hawkins** is in his fourth year on the offensive staff as the wide receivers coach.

► J.D. DUPLAIN, NICK SAMAC BRING FIVE YEARS OF STARTING EXPERIENCE TO O-LINE

• Michigan State returned five players with starting experience on the offensive line this season, led by multi-year fifth-year senior starters **J.D. Duplain** and **Nick Samac**, who are both using their extra year of eligibility in 2023.

• Michigan State has used a total of five different starting combinations on the offensive line in 11 games this season.

• Duplain, a native of Strongsville, Ohio, has started 41 consecutive games at left guard, the second-longest streak by an offensive lineman in school history (Shane Hannah with 44 from 1991-94). Duplain's 46 starts overall are also second most in MSU history by an offensive lineman (record: Joel Foreman with 49 from 2008-11). The four-year letterwinner has played in a total of 52 career games for the Spartans from 2019-23; he started five games as a true freshman in 2019, then five more during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. Duplain started all 13 games in 2021 and all 12 in 2022. He has earned honorable mention All-Big Ten accolades the past two seasons. Duplain's starting streak dates back to Nov. 7, 2020, at Iowa.

• Samac, who was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List, started all 12 games at center last fall and has 32 starts overall in his career while playing in a total 49 games the past five seasons (2019-23). He played a career-high 803 snaps in 2022, most on the Spartan offense, and earned honorable mention All-Big Ten by the coaches and media. Unfortunately, Samac suffered a season-ending injury in the first half at Indiana. Redshirt junior **Dallas Fincher**, who started the season opener at center, took over for Samac last week.

• Graduate fifth-year senior **Spencer Brown** started all 12 games last season at right tackle and started 20 consecutive games at the position before sitting out the first half at Minnesota on Oct. 28. He started his first career game at left tackle vs. Nebraska with Brandon Baldwin out due to an injury, and was also the starting left tackle last week at Ohio State. Brown returned to his starting right tackle position last week at Indiana.

• Redshirt junior **Brandon Baldwin** took over the starting role at left tackle the final four games of the 2022 season and gained valuable experience while playing a total of 405 offensive snaps. It was Baldwin's first season playing at the FBS level after redshirting in 2021 following two years at Independence Community College. He started at left tackle in the first eight games to run his streak to 12 straight starts at the position before missing the last two games due to an injury; he returned to the starting lineup at Indiana.

• Redshirt sophomore **Geno VanDeMark** earned starting assignments at right guard the last two games of the 2022 season and has an increased role on the offensive line heading in his third season in East Lansing. He started the three games at right guard this season before missing two games with an injury (Maryland, Iowa). He returned to play 33 snaps at Rutgers on Oct. 14 and was back in the starting lineup at right guard vs. Michigan on Oct. 21; however, he did not play at Minnesota on Oct. 28. VanDeMark again returned to the starting lineup in the win over Nebraska on Nov. 4 and also started at Ohio State, but missed the game at Indiana.



• Redshirt sophomores **Ethan Boyd** and **Kevin Wigenton II** also earned their first letters as Spartans last year and have seen increased time in the playing rotation. Wigenton earned starts in three straight games at right guard (vs. Maryland, Iowa and Rutgers) with VanDeMark sidelined and has five starts overall, while Boyd has seen his snap count increase at right tackle throughout the season. Boyd earned his first career start on Oct. 28 at Minnesota and started three consecutive games at right tackle.

• Assistant head coach **Chris Kapilovic** is in his fourth season as MSU's offensive line coach and run game coordinator. Kapilovic's unit in 2021 was named a semifinalist for the Joe Moore Award, which is given annually to the nation's best offensive line.

• Redshirt junior **Maliq Carr** leads the tight ends with a career-high 26 catches for 320 yards. He had a career game in the win over Indiana last week with seven receptions for 119 yards and two touchdowns, all career bests. It marked the most receiving yards by a Spartan tight end since Dion Sims had 122 vs. Eastern Michigan in 2012.

• For his effort in the victory against the Hoosiers, Carr was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week. Down 21-17 with 4:06 remaining, the Spartans marched down the field 75 yards for the game-winning touchdown drive. Houser connected on a 36-yard TD pass to Carr with just 1:19 left on the clock to put MSU on top, 24-21. Carr caught the ball inside the 15-yard line, absorbed a big hit, then raced into the end zone for the game-winning score. He also had a 17-yard TD grab in the first quarter.

• Carr missed two games with an injury (Minnesota, Nebraska) and was limited at Ohio State (14 snaps). He had six receptions for 43 yards in the first quarter alone at Iowa on Sept. 30 before leaving the game with an injury. He also had five catches for 53 yards in the Big Ten opener vs. Maryland. After playing basketball during the winter of 2021-22, Carr had a full offseason with the team heading into this fall.

• Graduate transfer **Jaylan Franklin** (Wisconsin) joined the team in January and has five catches for 70 yards, including a career-long 46-yard reception vs. Nebraska. Fellow graduate transfer **Tyneil Hopper** (Boise State) had two catches for 24 yards and one TD but suffered a season-ending injury in Week 3 vs. Washington.

• In addition, redshirt senior **Evan Morris** will be relied upon his blocking skills. He earned his first career start in the season opener against the Chippewas while also recording his first career reception (4 yards). Morris has started nine games overall and has four receptions for 8 yards.

• True freshman **Brennan Parachek**, a four-star recruit from Dexter High School, has seen his playing time increase the second half of the season. He has six catches for 55 yards, all coming in a four-week span (vs. Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, Ohio State), but missed last week's game with an injury.

• **Ted Gilmore** is in his fourth year at Michigan State as the tight ends coach.

► DIRON REYNOLDS IN FIRST SEASON AS SPARTAN DEFENSIVE LINE COACH

• **Diron Reynolds**, who was named the program's defensive line coach in January, got his first on-field look at the position group during spring practice. Reynolds has more than 25 years of coaching experience both at the NFL and Power 5 levels and previously spent the past seven seasons (2016-22) as the defensive line coach at Stanford. He has coached on multiple championship teams, including winning a Super Bowl ring with the Colts, and has worked with numerous All-Americans, NFL Draft picks and All-Pro players.

► ROTATING D-LINE: SPARTANS HAVE STARTED NINE DIFFERENT DEFENSIVE LINEMEN IN 2023

• Sophomore defensive end **Zion Young** is tied for the lead on the Spartan defensive line with 4.5 tackles for loss (20 yards) and also has 1.5 sacks (5 yards). According to Pro Football Focus, Young leads the team with 24 total QB pressures on the season.

• The Spartans have started a total of six defensive ends, including Young (eight games), seniors **Khris Bogle** (five games), **Avery Dunn** (one game) and **Brandon Wright** (four games), and true freshman **Jalen Thompson** (three games).

• Thompson earned his first career start vs. Nebraska on Nov. 4 and responded with a huge game, recording five tackles and two sacks, including a forced fumble. He has started the last three games and has 18 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss in just seven games of action as a true freshman.

• Bogle, a Florida transfer and former top-100 recruit, only played in four games last season due to an injury in his first season in East Lansing. He has 14 tackles and 1.5 sacks in nine games this season, including five starts.

• Dunn saw his playing time increase toward the end of last season with starts against Rutgers and Indiana, and he recorded career highs in tackles (28), tackles for loss (5.5) and sacks (3.0) to earn his first letter. He earned his first start of the season in Week 4 vs. Maryland and has 10 tackles this season.

• In his second full season at defensive end in 2022 after spending time as a running back his first two years in East Lansing, Wright played in eight games with two starts, including 14 tackles. He has a career-high 19 tackles and two sacks this season in 11 games, including four starts, and is second with 23 QB pressures.



► BARROW, HARMON & HANSEN LEAD THE SPARTAN INTERIOR

• Along the interior, redshirt senior **Maverick Hansen** has played in 41 career games at defensive tackle, including four starting assignments. He has 19 tackles in 2023, including a career-high 1.5 sacks on Senior Day vs. Nebraska. Hansen, who owns a 3.77 grade-point average as a hospitality business major, was named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, which is the top scholar-athlete award in college football. He is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten and Big Ten Distinguished Scholar recipient.

• Redshirt sophomore **Derrick Harmon** has started nine games this season and has 37 tackles, including 3.5 TFLs and 1.5 sacks. He has started in 13 career games for MSU.

• Redshirt junior **Simeon Barrow Jr.** has started in 29 games over the past two-plus seasons (2021-23) and has 34 tackles, 4.5 TFLs (39 yards) and 3.5 sacks (38 yards) in 11 games and nine starts this season. He ranks third on the team with 22 QB pressures and was named to the Senior Bowl preseason watch list. Barrow has blocked two field goals this season (vs. Minnesota and Indiana) to become the first Spartan since Jerel Worthy in 2011 to block two kicks in the same season.

• The Spartans also signed three highly ranked players at defensive end as part of their 2023 recruiting class. **Bai Jobe**, the No. 1 player in the state of Oklahoma, played in the All-American Bowl and was ranked the No. 54 overall player in the nation according to the 247 Sports composite rankings. **Andrew Depaepe**, a consensus top-150 recruit from Bettendorf, Iowa, also enrolled in January for the Spartans. **Jalen Thompson**, a four-star prospect from Detroit Cass Tech and the consensus No. 1 defensive end in the state of Michigan, joined the Spartans over the summer and has 18 tackles in seven games.

► PLENTY OF EXPERIENCE AT LINEBACKER FOR SPARTANS

• The linebackers, coached by fourth-year Secchia Family Defensive Coordinator **Scottie Hazelton**, feature two experienced starters in sixth-year graduate senior **Aaron Brule** and redshirt junior **Cal Haladay**, along with talented freshman **Jordan Hall**. Fifth-year senior **Jacoby Windmon** started the first three games of the season but has since suffered a season-ending injury. In addition, redshirt junior **Darius Snow** has played in four games after missing nearly the entire 2022 season with an injury, but hasn't seen game action the past four weeks.

► HALADAY LEADS TEAM, RANKS 10TH IN BIG TEN IN TACKLES

• Redshirt junior linebacker **Cal Haladay** leads the team and ranks 10th in the Big Ten with 7.4 tackles per game (81 total). In addition, he ranks third on the team with five tackles for loss. He has 297 total tackles for his career in 40 games, which ranks 20th in school history. Haladay led the Big Ten in tackles per game last season (10.0 avg.; 120 total).

• During the third quarter at Iowa, Haladay tied a school record with the third defensive touchdown of his career as he returned a fumble 42 yards for a scoop-and-score in the third quarter against the Hawkeyes. He had two interception returns for touchdowns in 2021 (30 yards vs. Indiana and 78 yards vs. Pitt in Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl). Haladay is the fourth Spartan in school history to score three defensive touchdowns, joining RJ Williamson (2012-15), Shilique Calhoun (2012-15) and T.J. Turner (1997-2000).

• Haladay was named to preseason watch lists for the Butkus Award, the Bednarik Award and the Nagurski Trophy.

► BRULE PLAYING IN 64TH COLLEGIATE GAME ON FRIDAY

• Sixth-year graduate senior linebacker **Aaron Brule** leads the team in tackles for loss (7.5) and sacks (4.0) and ranks fourth with 59 tackles overall. Brule, who played four seasons (2018-21) at Mississippi State before transferring to Michigan State in 2022, will be playing in his 64th collegiate game overall on Friday against Penn State (40 at Mississippi State, 23 at Michigan State). For his career, Brule has 230 tackles, 31.5 tackles for loss and 15.5 sacks.

► JORDAN HALL: FRESHMAN BY NAME ONLY

• True freshman **Jordan Hall**, the only three-time captain in IMG Academy history, enrolled in January and has made an early impact in his first year with the Spartans. The consensus four-star recruit ranks fifth on the team with 55 tackles, second with 6.5 tackles for loss and tied for second with 3.5 sacks.

• Hall earned the first start of his collegiate career in his first Big Ten game against Maryland in Week 4 and has started in five games overall (Maryland, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, Indiana).

• On Oct. 28 at Minnesota, Hall had a career-high two sacks, including a forced fumble on one in the first quarter that led to a Spartan field goal. Hall had a career-high nine tackles overall against the Gophers.

► ON THE MEND

• **Jacoby Windmon**, who transferred to MSU from UNLV in 2022, burst onto the scene last season with four sacks in his Spartan debut against Western Michigan to earn Big Ten and National Defensive Player of the Week honors. He became the first Spartan and just the sixth Big Ten player to earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week accolades three times in one season (vs. Western Michigan, Akron and Wisconsin), and he was also named the National Defensive Player of the Week in his first start at linebacker vs. Wisconsin in Week 7 after starting the first six games at defensive end. The New Orleans native, who led the team in TFLs (10.5) and sacks (5.5) and ranked first in the nation with six forced fumbles, returned to his natural position of linebacker in the spring and earned the start in Week 1 vs. Central Michigan. He had 15 tackles, two tackles for loss and one sack in the first three games of the season before being declared out for the year due to an injury.

• Redshirt junior **Darius Snow**, who began last season at linebacker after playing in the secondary his first two seasons, unfortunately suffered a season-ending injury vs. Western Michigan in the first game of the 2022 season. He returned to action for the first time in Week 3 vs. Washington in a reserve role and had three tackles while playing a season-high 20 snaps at Iowa on Sept. 30. Snow ranked third on the team and 18th in the Big Ten with 87 tackles as a sophomore in 2021. In four games this season, Snow has six tackles.

• Former Spartan All-American and NFL veteran **Harlon Barnett** is in 15th year overall on the defensive coaching staff at Michigan State. He was named acting head coach on Sept. 10 and is also the program's secondary coach. First-year assistant **Jim Salgado** is the team's cornerbacks coach.

• After recording an FBS-low two interceptions last season, Michigan State ranks tied for seventh in the Big Ten with nine picks this season, led by **Jaden Mangham** with four. **Angelo Grose** is second on the team with two, while **Cal Haladay**, **Chance Rucker** and **Khalil Majeed** have also picked off passes this season. MSU also has 39 pass break-ups as a team, which is sixth most in the Big Ten.

• Sophomore **Malik Spencer** started the first seven games of the season at safety and ranks second on the team with 71 tackles. He also ranks second on the team with six pass break-ups. Spencer earned his first career start at nickelback at Ohio State on Nov. 11.

• Fellow sophomore **Jaden Mangham** has started in nine of the 11 games at safety (DNP at Iowa due to injury). Mangham ranks tied for third in the Big Ten and tied for 12th in the FBS with four interceptions. He recorded a pick in back-to-back games (at Minnesota, vs. Nebraska), and also had interceptions against Washington and Rutgers. In addition, he has three pass break-ups and ranks tied for sixth on the team with 48 tackles.

• Senior **Angelo Grose** has started games at both safety and nickelback the past four seasons (2020-23) and has played in 39 games overall since his arrival on campus in 2020, including 34 starts (21 at safety, 13 at nickelback). The three-year letterwinner has 221 tackles with 8.0 tackles for loss, 18 pass break-ups and three interceptions during his collegiate career. Grose has started at nickelback in five games and at safety in four games. He is second on the team with two interceptions and ranks third with five pass break-ups and 62 tackles.

• At cornerback, sophomore **Dillon Tatum** started eight of the first nine games, but has missed the last two weeks with an injury. He leads the team with seven pass break-ups and has 45 tackles on the season.

He also ranks third in the conference with 18 punts of 50-plus yards and second with 21 punts inside the 20.

• Eckley has been added to the Ray Guy Award Watch List and was named one of "Ray's 8" for the week of games on Nov. 4, as he averaged 48.3 yards per punt (seven punts for 338 yards) in the win over Nebraska, including three inside the 20 and five of 50-plus yards.

• Eckley punted four times for a career-high 51.0 ypp average with a long of 56 yards at Indiana, and punted three inside the 20.

• The Spartans, who used multiple placekickers in 2022 and only made six field goals during the season, brought in graduate transfer **Jonathan Kim** from North Carolina over the summer. Redshirt sophomore **Stephen Rusnak** has also kicked in games this season.

• Kim is 13-for-18 on field-goal attempts, including a career-long 58-yarder at Iowa, which set a Kinnick Stadium record and was the fourth-longest in school history. He is also 17-for-17 on PATs. Kim's 13 made field goals rank tied for sixth in the Big Ten, and four of those are from 50-plus yards. He is the first Spartan to kick four field goals from 50-plus yards in a single season since Dave Rayner in 2003.

• Junior college transfer **Drew Wilson** and redshirt junior **Sam Edwards** split the long-snapping duties for the Spartans.

• Sophomore **Tyrell Henry** returns punts for the Spartans, and also returns kicks in addition to **Montorie Foster Jr.** and **Alante Brown**.

• **Ross Els** in his fourth year as the program's special teams coordinator.



SPARTAN FOOTBALL PROGRAM NOTES

► PRODUCTIVE BYE WEEK FOR SPARTANS

• For the second consecutive year, Michigan State spent its bye week sending players to various locations throughout the Lansing community. This year, players spent time at the Ronald McDonald House and also visited Sparrow Hospital. Inspired by the family of former Spartan **Todd (T.J.) Duckett**, who stayed at RMHC Ann Arbor while their son was hospitalized, Battle for the Houses was a friendly competition to build awareness and raise funds for RMHC Ann Arbor and RMHC Mid-Michigan.

► SPARTANS UNVEIL NEW NIKE UNIFORM DESIGN FOR 2023

• The Michigan State football program has unveiled new uniforms, designed by Nike, for the 2023 season. Members of the 2023 team received the first glimpse of the new uniforms, along with new helmets, at a program event – “Thy Shadows” – Friday, July 28 at the Pasant Theatre inside the Wharton Center on campus.

• The uniforms are part of the Field Utility Special Edition by Nike Vapor F.U.S.E., which combines leading edge fabric technology with a precision fit. It is the first football uniform to meet Nike Dri-FIT standards.

• The new helmet design features the “Spartan Pattern” down the middle while keeping the traditional Spartan logo on the sides. The Spartan Pattern, which was inspired by a traditional Greek key pattern, was designed in 2010 to strengthen the connection to the school’s Greek history and nickname.

• The Green and White uniforms also feature the Spartan Pattern along the neckline and on the shoulder pads, while keeping the primary “Michigan State” wordmark across the front which has been used since 2010. The Spartan Pattern is also used down the side of the pants.

• MSU introduced the “Shadows” uniform as well over the summer, featuring a black chrome helmet along with black jerseys and pants. The numerals are in white, outlined by green, and feature the green Spartan Pattern along the neckline, shoulder pads and pants. Michigan State wore the uniforms for the first time on Oct. 21 for the Michigan game.

► MICHIGAN STATE CELEBRATING 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF SPARTAN STADIUM IN 2023

• This season marks the 100th anniversary of Spartan Stadium, which hosted its first game on Oct. 6, 1923. Michigan State Athletics will commemorate the 100th anniversary of Spartan Stadium throughout the fall. For more information, please visit msuspartans.com/SpartanStadium100.

• A special logo was created for the 100-year anniversary, which incorporates elements from the structure of Spartan Stadium and also pays homage to MSU’s six national championships in football.

• Michigan State began playing at the present site of Spartan Stadium with four home games in 1923. A series of projects paralleling the Spartans’ rise to national football prominence enlarged the steel-and-concrete facility from its original 13,064 seats in 1923 to its present size of nearly 75,000.

• MSU has won nearly 70 percent of its games played in Spartan Stadium (all-time record: 386-169-13, .690).

► MICHIGAN STATE ONE OF THE WINNINGEST FBS PROGRAMS IN HISTORY

• Michigan State is one of 34 programs in the FBS to win more than 700 games. The Spartans currently rank No. 27 all-time with 730 victories (all-time record: 730-486-44, .597). Michigan State is in its 127th season of football in 2023.

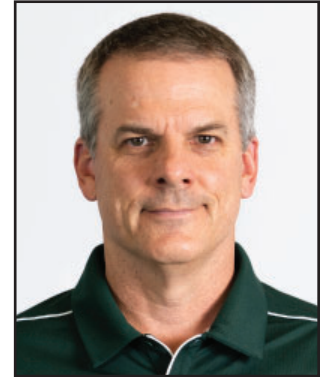

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Redshirt junior quarterback Noah Kim threw for 279 yards and two touchdowns and redshirt sophomore running back Nathan Carter ran for 113 yards and one score as Michigan State scored three times in the second half en route to a 31-7 win over Central Michigan in the season opener for both teams under the Friday night lights at Spartan Stadium on Sept. 1, 2023.

Kim, making his first career start, completed 18-of-31 passes for 279 yards and two touchdowns. Both of his scoring throws came in the fourth quarter, a 10-yard pass to Tyrell Henry and an 8-yard pass to Maliq Carr.

Carter, a transfer from UConn, carried 18 times for 113 yards and gave MSU the lead for good with a 2-yard touchdown run late in the second quarter. Redshirt junior running back Jalen Berger, who finished with eight carries for 24 yards, scored on a 12-yard run in the third quarter.

Redshirt junior linebacker Cal Haladay led the Spartans with 10 tackles, including one for loss, and had his third career interception. Malik Spencer finished with nine tackles, while Jacoby Windmon added eight, including one for loss and a sack, and Angelo Grose had six tackles, including one for loss.

After a scoreless first quarter, Jonathan Kim connected on his first collegiate field goal, a 47-yarder, to give MSU a 3-0 lead with 6:55 left in the second quarter.

The Chippewas took a 7-3 lead after driving 70 yards in just three plays, capped by a Bert Emanuel Jr. touchdown pass to Chris Parker in the end zone for a 12-yard touchdown, with 1:51 remaining in the first half.

MSU quickly responded with a seven-play, 84-yard touchdown drive to take a 10-7 lead into halftime. Kim and Glover connected on both a 32-yard and 33-yard reception on the scoring drive, and Carter scored his first TD as a Spartan with a 2-yard run with 57 seconds left in the half.

The Spartans went up 17-7 at the 2:42 mark in the third quarter on a 12-yard touchdown run by Berger.

On MSU's first series in the fourth quarter, Kim found Christian Fitzpatrick on the sideline for a long pass, and he broke free for a 72-yard reception that set up first-and-goal. Two plays later, Kim threw his first touchdown of the season to Henry, who made a one-handed leaping grab in the end zone for a 10-yard score to put MSU on top 24-7.

Michigan State took a 31-7 lead with 9:05 left in the game on Carr's 8-yard touchdown reception from Kim, capping a five-play, 55-yard drive that took just over two minutes.

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Michigan State redshirt junior quarterback Noah Kim threw for 292 yards and three touchdowns and redshirt sophomore running back Nathan Carter ran for 111 yards and had three touchdowns as the Spartans cruised to a 45-14 win over Richmond on the afternoon of Sept. 9 at Spartan Stadium.

Kim finished the day 18-of-22 for 292 yards and ended the game with a school-record 15-straight completions. Graduate receiver Tre Mosley had five catches for 84 yards and an 11-yard scoring pass in the first quarter, while Kim threw a 13-yard touchdown pass to graduate tight end Tynell Hopper and a 45-yard pass in the fourth quarter to redshirt freshman Antonio Gates Jr.

Carter had 19 carries for 111 yards and scored all three of MSU's third-quarter touchdowns on runs of 2 yards, 44 yards and 6 yards, respectively.

Senior defensive back Angelo Grose led Michigan State with seven tackles, while graduate linebacker Aaron Brule had five tackles, including 1.5 for loss, and a sack, and redshirt junior linebacker Cal Haladay and senior linebacker Jacoby Windmon each had five tackles, with one for loss.

The Spartans took advantage of an early Richmond turnover to take a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter, as the Spiders fumbled a punt, giving MSU great field position at the 19-yard line. Five plays later, Kim found Mosley in the end zone for an 11-yard touchdown pass.

The Spiders drove their third series to the MSU 32-yard line, but they were stopped on fourth down, and the Spartans took the ensuing drive 69 yards on eight plays for their second touchdown of the day, a 13-yard TD pass from Kim to Hopper, at the 13:44 mark in the second quarter.

MSU took a 17-0 lead with 5:17 left in the half on Jonathan Kim's 52-yard field goal; it marked the longest field goal by a Spartan since Michael Geiger also hit a 52-yarder vs. Michigan in 2016.

Richmond missed a 32-yard field goal at the end of the first half to keep the score 17-0 into the break.

The Spartans scored touchdowns on their first three drives of the third quarter – all three on rushing TDs by Carter – to go up 38-0. He started the half with a 2-yard score, then scampered 43 yards down the sideline for his second TD of the game. Carter then hurdled a Spider defender on his way into the end zone for the third time of the quarter, this time from 6 yards out.

Richmond got on the board early in the fourth quarter as Aaron Banks returned a fumble 47 yards for a touchdown.

Kim threw his third touchdown pass of the game on a 45-yard reception to Gates at the 11:33 mark in the fourth quarter.



Noah Kim was 18-for-22 passing for 292 yards and three TDs, completing a school-record 15-straight passes after starting 0-for-3 and was 3-for-7 after the first quarter, following his last incomplete pass on the Spartans' final drive of the opening stanza. Kim then completed his next 15 passes the rest of the game, going 5-for-5 with one TD in the second quarter, 7-for-7 without a TD in the third quarter and 3-for-3 with one TD in the fourth frame, before the reserves took over.

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- The Michigan State football team fell to No. 8 Washington, 41-7, on Saturday, Sept. 16 in Spartan Stadium.

Redshirt junior quarterback Noah Kim completed 12-of-31 passes for 136 yards, redshirt sophomore running back Nate Carter ran for 48 yards and redshirt freshman quarterback Katin House scored MSU's lone touchdown, late in the fourth quarter.

Sophomore defensive back Jaden Mangham led the defense with eight tackles, while fifth-year senior linebacker Cal Halladay and redshirt sophomore defensive back Malik Spencer had seven tackles and apiece and sophomore defensive back Dillon Tatum finished with six tackles.

Washington's Gernie Bernard scored on a 1-yard run at the 9:51 mark in the first quarter to open the game's scoring, capping a quick four-play, 55-yard drive in just 2:12. The Huskies scored their second TD of the quarter on Jack Westover's 5-yard reception with 1:14 remaining.

The Huskies scored three more touchdowns in the second quarter to take a 35-0 lead into halftime.

Washington kicked two field goals in the third quarter to extend its lead to 41-0.

Michigan State capped off an 11-play, 99-yard scoring drive when Houser ran it in from four yards out with 5:48 left to play. Houser completed two passes on the drive for 72 yards, including a 61-yard catch and run by redshirt sophomore wide receiver Christian Fitzpatrick.

POST-GAME NOTES:

• Michigan State celebrated the 10-year reunion of the 2013 Big Ten Champion and 2014 Rose Bowl Champion team with an on-field recognition at the end of the first quarter of the game. Led by head coach Mark Dantonio, Michigan State had a record-setting season in 2013, winning a school-record 13 games, defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 100th Rose Bowl Game, beating No. 2 Ohio State in the Big Ten Championship Game for the school's eighth Big Ten title, and finishing No. 3 in both national polls, the highest ranking for the Spartans since 1966. Michigan State (13-1) became just the third team in Big Ten history to win 13 games in a season. Dantonio returned to the Spartans as an associate head coach, beginning on Sept. 10.

• Former Spartan All-American running back Javon Ringer was inducted into the MSU Athletics Hall of Fame last Friday night and honored at halftime of last Saturday's game. Ringer is the school's all-time leader in all-purpose yards (5,426) and ranks second at MSU in rushing yards (4,398) and carries (843). In addition, Al Dorow, the starting quarterback on the 1951 National Championship team, was inducted into the MSU Athletics Hall of Fame posthumously.

EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Michigan State fell behind at the half and cut into the deficit in the third quarter but could not get closer as Maryland beat the Spartans, 31-9, on the afternoon of Sept. 23 at Spartan Stadium on Homecoming.

Redshirt sophomore running back Nate Carter had 19 carries for 97 yards, while redshirt junior quarterback Noah Kim completed 18-of-33 passes for 190 yards with one touchdown and senior wide receiver Montorie Foster Jr. had six catches for 67 yards.

Sophomore defensive back Dillon Tatum led Michigan State with 11 tackles, while adding one pass breakup and a quarterback hurry, redshirt defensive back Malik Spencer added nine tackles, one breakup and a hurry, and graduate linebacker Aaron Brule had seven tackles, one breakup and a hurry.

Maryland recorded an interception on the first offensive drive of the game for MSU and took advantage of the turnover, driving 45 yards on nine plays in 4:24 to score on a 1-yard TD pass from Taulia Tagovailoa to Sean Greeley.

On the ensuing drive, the Spartans drove the ball to the Terrapin 1-yard line, but were stopped on fourth-and-goal.

The Terrapins went up 14-0 at the 11:28 mark in the second quarter on Tagovailoa's 12-yard touchdown pass to Tyrese Chambers.

Maryland scored its third touchdown of the first half with 8:39 left as Tagovailoa ran in from 1 yard out.

The Spartans got on the board with 3:39 remaining in the first half on Jonathan Kim's 37-yard field goal.

Midway through the third quarter, Angelo Grose picked off a Tagovailoa pass in the end zone to thwart a Maryland scoring drive in the red zone, and Michigan State's offense responded with a nine-play, 80-yard touchdown drive, capped by a 9-yard pass from Kim to Tyrell Henry. The Spartans failed on the two-point conversion, however, to make it 21-9 in favor of Maryland with 3:34 left in the quarter.

The Terrapins extended their lead to 24-9 on Jack Howes' 48-yard field goal with 11:00 remaining in the game.

The Spartans got the ball back with 11 minutes left and drove the ball 67 yards to the Maryland 23-yard line before redshirt freshman quarterback Katin Houser was intercepted at the 9-yard line. Tagovailoa completed a 31-yard scoring pass with 2:30 left to give the Terrapins a 31-9 lead and close out the scoring.

IOWA CITY, Iowa -- The Michigan State football team fell at Iowa under the lights, 26-16, before a crowd of 69,250 at Kinnick Stadium. The Spartans held a 16-13 lead after three quarters, but the Hawkeyes rallied to score 13 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to earn the comeback win.

MSU outgained Iowa, 349-222, and held advantages in first downs (20-15), rushing yards (156-61) and passing yards (193-161), but turned the ball over four times.

With the score tied at 16, Iowa's Cooper DeJean ran a punt back 70 yards for a touchdown with just 3:45 remaining to give the Hawkeyes the lead for good. Iowa added a late field goal with under a minute left to make the final 26-16.

Redshirt sophomore running back Nate Carter recorded his third 100-yard game of the season with 108 yards on a season-high 20 carries. In the passing game, Montorie Foster Jr. hauled in a career-best eight receptions for 79 yards, while tight end Maliq Carr had six catches for 43 yards in the first half alone before leaving the game with an injury.

Redshirt junior Noah Kim was 25-of-44 passing for 193 yards, but threw three interceptions. Jonathan Kim made a career-high three field goals, including a Kinnick Stadium record with his 58-yarder as time expired in the first half. He also connected on a 31 and 32-yarder in the first half, although his fourth attempt, a 50-yarder, hit the uprights and missed in the third quarter.

Malik Spencer and Cal Haladay led the Spartans with eight tackles apiece.

Iowa opened the game with a field-goal drive, but the Spartans answered with their own field goal at the 3:48 mark in the first quarter to tie the game at 3 as Kim drilled a 31-yard attempt.

Kim made his second field goal of the half, this time from 32 yards out, with 11:04 left in the second quarter to put Michigan State on top, 6-3.

On their fourth series of the half, the Spartans drove the ball to the Iowa 20-yard line, but Kim's pass on first-and-10 was intercepted in the end zone. The Hawkeyes took advantage of the turnover and went on a five-play, 80-yard touchdown drive in just 2:16, capped by Deacon Hill's 13-yard pass to Erick All, to go back on top, 10-6.

Kim closed the first half with a 58-yard field goal as time expired, which was the longest in Kinnick Stadium history and the fourth-longest in school history, to trim the deficit to 10-9.

The Spartans threw an interception on their first series of the second half, but on the very next play, Tunmise Adeleye forced a fumble on Iowa running back Leshon Williams, and Haladay picked up the ball and ran 42 yards for the touchdown to make it 16-10 in favor of MSU. It marked the third career defensive TD for Haladay, which ties a school record.

Michigan State recorded its second turnover of the third quarter on Angelo Grose's interception, but the Spartans didn't get a first down on the ensuing series after getting stopped on fourth-and-1 from the Iowa 30-yard line. MSU's defense stepped up and didn't allow a Hawkeye first down on the ensuing series, but Iowa's Drew Stevens did kick a 53-yard field goal to trim the Spartan lead to 16-13 midway through the quarter.

The Hawkeyes tied it at 16 with 5:19 left in the fourth quarter before taking the lead on the 70-yard punt return for a score by DeJean.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. -- The Michigan State football team took a 24-6 lead into the fourth quarter, but Rutgers scored 21 unanswered points to rally for the 27-24 victory over the Spartans on the afternoon of Oct. 14 at SHI Stadium.

Making his first career start at quarterback, redshirt freshman Katin Houser was 18-of-29 passing for 133 yards and two touchdowns. Graduate senior Tre Mosley caught a team-high six passes for 36 yards, including a 4-yard touchdown in the third quarter, while senior Montorie Foster Jr. had five receptions for 48 yards. Redshirt sophomore Nate Carter led the Spartans on the ground with 52 yards on 20 carries, while redshirt junior Jalen Berger had a season-high 49 yards on 11 carries.

Defensively, redshirt junior linebacker Cal Haladay posted a team-best eight tackles, including an 11-yard sack. Jaden Mangham recorded his second interception of the season, while Chance Rucker picked off his first career pass.

The Spartans (2-4, 0-3 Big Ten) scored a touchdown on their opening drive for the first time this season, driving 75 yards on 14 plays over a span of 7:28, capped by a 13-yard pass from Houser to Foster.

Rutgers (5-2, 2-2 Big Ten) responded with a 22-yard field goal by Jai Patel on its opening drive to make it 7-3 in favor of MSU with 2:52 left in the first quarter. The Scarlet Knights added another field goal, this time from 47 yards out by Patel, on its second drive to trim MSU's lead to 7-6 early in the second quarter.

Michigan State took advantage of three Rutgers turnovers in the second quarter to take a 17-6 lead into halftime. Although the Spartans couldn't capitalize on Rucker's first career interception and were forced to punt, Rutgers' Rashad Rochelle fumbled the punt return at the Scarlet Knights' 12-yard line. On the next play, Houser raced up the middle 12 yards for the touchdown to make it 14-6 with 1:46 left in the first half.

Rutgers quarterback Gavin Wimsatt threw another interception on his next series as Jaden Mangham recorded his second interception of the season. The Spartans then went on a 10-play, 50-yard drive right before the half, finished off by a 37-yard field goal by Jonathan Kim.

MSU had a strong start to the second half, forcing a Rutgers punt on its first series, followed by a 14-play, 80-yard touchdown drive to give the Spartans a 24-6 lead at the 3:41 mark in the third quarter. Houser closed the drive with a 4-yard TD pass to Mosley.

But Rutgers took advantage of Michigan State miscues in the fourth quarter to outscore the Spartans 21-0 in the final 15 minutes.

Rutgers first capitalized to start the fourth quarter as a fumbled snap on a Spartan punt in the end zone led to a Scarlet Knights touchdown, cutting the MSU lead to 24-13. After forcing a Spartan punt, Rutgers went down the field 73 yards on 12 snaps in just 3:45 to score its first offensive touchdown of the afternoon; it added a 2-point conversion to trim the Spartan advantage to 24-21 with 8:30 left in the game.

Rutgers recovered the ensuing kickoff on a short kick to the MSU 21-yard line, and on the next play, Kyle Monangai raced 21 yards into the end zone to give Rutgers its first lead of the game, 27-24, with 7:05 remaining. The Scarlet Knights failed on the 2-point attempt to keep the lead within three points, but the Spartans were forced to punt on their next possession, and Rutgers ran out the clock with four first downs to seal the comeback win.



Redshirt freshman quarterback Katin Houser made the first start of his Spartan career and his fifth appearance this season. Houser completed his first four passes on the way to finishing the day 18-of-29 passing for 133 yards and two touchdowns. Houser threw his first career TD pass on MSU's opening drive with a 13-yard scoring pass to senior wide receiver Montorie Foster Jr. He also rushed for a 12-yard rushing TD in the second quarter part of eight carries for 21 yards. The rushing score was Houser's second rushing TD of the season, joining a 4-yard run vs. Washington.

MINNEAPOLIS -- The Michigan State football team fell at Minnesota, 27-12, before a crowd of 47,392 at Huntington Bank Stadium on the afternoon of Oct. 28.

The Spartan defense caused three turnovers, but Minnesota outgained MSU, 400-299, including a 200-109 advantage on the ground, and held the ball for 36 minutes and 15 seconds en route to the victory.

Redshirt freshman Katin Houser started his third career game at quarterback for the Spartans and was 12-of-22 passing for 117 yards. True freshman Sam Leavitt played all three series in the fourth quarter and engineered an eight-play, 75-yard touchdown drive on his first series. He finished the game 8-of-12 passing for 73 yards but did commit two turnovers, a fumble and an interception, on the last two drives of the game.

Leavitt was MSU's leading rusher in the game with 52 yards on six carries, while redshirt sophomore Nathan Carter had 11 carries for 44 yards; Carter also had five catches for 9 yards to finish with 53 all-purpose yards.

Senior Montorie Foster Jr. led the Spartan receiving corps with four receptions for 55 yards. Defensively, redshirt junior Cal Haladay led MSU with 11 tackles, while senior defensive back Angelo Grose had 10 stops. True freshman linebacker Jordan Hall had a career-high two sacks for 19 yards, including a forced fumble that led to an MSU field goal in the first quarter, and posted nine tackles overall.

Minnesota's Jordan Nubin had 40 carries for 204 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Gophers (5-3, 3-2 Big Ten).

Michigan State (2-6, 0-5 Big Ten) took advantage of two early Minnesota turnovers to take a 6-0 lead in the first quarter. Derrick Harmon forced a Gopher fumble on the second play of the game that was recovered by Jaden Mangham at the Minnesota 26-yard line, but the Spartans couldn't convert a first down on its first offensive series, leading to a 38-yard field goal by Jonathan Kim.

Minnesota turned the ball over again on its second series, this time with a forced fumble and a sack by Hall that was recovered by Avery Dunn on the Minnesota 33. MSU capitalized on the turnover with Kim's 42-yard field goal to make it 6-0 at the 9:49 mark in the opening quarter.

The Gophers threatened to score midway through the second quarter, but Simeon Barrow Jr. blocked Dragon Kesich's 35-yard field goal to keep Minnesota off the scoreboard.

Minnesota did score on its next two possessions, however, with a 25-yard field goal by Kesich at the 4:54 mark and a 22-yard touchdown pass from Athan Kaliakmanis to Daniel Jackson with 19 seconds left in the half to go up 10-6 at the break.

Neither team scored in the third quarter, but Minnesota drove 87 yards on nine plays, capped by an 18-yard TD run by Nubin, to take a 17-6 lead with 12:07 left in the game.

Leavitt entered the game following the Gophers' touchdown, and promptly led the Spartans on an eight-play, 75-yard touchdown drive in 3:30 to cut the deficit to 17-12 with a 9-yard TD pass to Tyrell Henry, but MSU did not convert the 2-point attempt.

Michigan State tried an onside kick after the touchdown drive, but Minnesota recovered and then answered with a seven-play, 46-yard touchdown drive to go up 24-12 with 4:11 left in the game.

Leavitt then fumbled on his second series, and the Gophers capitalized with a 31-yard field goal by Kesich to make the final 27-12.



Freshman quarterback Sam Leavitt threw the first TD pass of his Spartan career, hitting sophomore wide receiver Tyrell Henry for a 9-yard TD in the fourth quarter. Leavitt ended the game 8-of-12 passing for 73 yards with one TD and one INT, recording season highs for completions, attempts, yards and TD. EAST LANSING, Mich. -- Freshman quarterback Sam Leavitt threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to Montorie Foster Jr. early in the fourth quarter and Michigan State held on to beat Nebraska, 20-17, on Senior Day at Spartan Stadium on the afternoon of Nov. 4.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Katin Houser, who started his fourth straight game, completed 13-of-20 passes for 165 yards and one touchdown, while Foster caught four passes for 94 yards and one score and Jonathan Kim kicked a pair of field goals (35 and 50 yards). Leavitt, who played two series in the game, also had a 7-yard run for a first down on his touchdown series in the fourth quarter; he finished 1-of-2 passing for 25 yards.

Defensively, Michigan State forced three turnovers (two interceptions and one fumble) and tied a season high with seven sacks and had 12 tackles for loss.

Sophomore safety Jaden Mangham led the Spartans with seven tackles, including one for loss, one pass breakup and his team-leading fourth interception of the year. Sixth-year senior linebacker Aaron Brule also had seven tackles, including one for loss and a sack. Sophomore cornerback Dillon Tatum added six tackles, including two for loss and a pair of pass breakups, redshirt junior linebacker Cal Haladay had six tackles and a fumble recovery, and freshman linebacker Jordan Hall had six tackles and one pass breakup. Making his first career start, freshman defensive end Jalen Thompson had five tackles, with two sacks, one forced fumble and one quarterback hurry.

Michigan State took an early 3-0 lead after driving 71 yards on eight plays on its opening possession, keyed by a 46-yard completion from Houser to Jaylan Franklin. Kim finished off the drive with a 35-yard field goal.

On its third series, Nebraska took a 7-3 lead on a 5-yard touchdown run by quarterback Heinrich Haarberg that capped a 10-play, 59-yard drive at the 12:40 mark in the second quarter.

The Spartans answered right back on their next series, driving 75 yards on just six plays, to regain the lead, 10-7. On a trick play, wide receiver Alante Brown caught a lateral and threw a 42-yard pass to Foster that put MSU in the red zone, and Houser then delivered an 11-yard touchdown to Christian Fitzpatrick for his first career score as a Spartan.

Nebraska tied the game at 10 right before halftime on a 24-yard field goal by Tristan Alvano.

After forcing a Husker punt to start the third quarter, the Spartans scored on their first series of the second half as Kim kicked a 50-yard field goal with 5:11 left in the third quarter, putting MSU back on top, 13-10.

On their first series of the fourth quarter, the Spartans added to their lead on Leavitt's 25-yard touchdown pass to Foster to make it 20-10 in favor of MSU with 12:13 left in the game.

Nebraska cut into the MSU lead late in the fourth quarter, with a 43-yard run from Haarberg setting up a 4-yard touchdown run by Emmett Johnson with 3:35 left in the game.

After the Spartans punted, Nebraska started a drive on its own 22-yard line with 2:32 to play. Haarberg was sacked by Thompson and a fumble was recovered by Haladay, but Kim missed a 44-yard field goal.

Nebraska had one last chance, getting the ball back with 43 seconds left on the clock with no timeouts on its own 27-yard line, but the Spartan defense forced a sack on the third play of the series for an 18-yard loss, and the Huskers' last pass fell incomplete on the final play of the game.

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- The Michigan State football team fell at No. 1 Ohio State, 38-3, before a crowd of 105,137 at Ohio Stadium on the night of Nov. 11.

Making his fifth consecutive start at quarterback, redshirt freshman Katin Houser was 12-of-24 passing for 92 yards. Nate Carter had 11 carries for 52 yards to lead the Spartans on the ground, while Jaren Mangham had nine carries for 35 yards.

Defensively, redshirt junior linebacker Cal Haladay recorded nine tackles for the Spartans. Graduate senior linebacker Aaron Brule collected seven stops, including a 3-yard tackle for loss, and sophomore safety Jaden Mangham contributed six tackles.

The Buckeyes outgained the Spartans, 530-182.

Ohio State (10-0, 7-0 Big Ten) scored touchdowns on its first three possessions, all by Marvin Harrison Jr., to take a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter. Harrison ran 19 yards for his first touchdown of the night on the opening series, then hauled in a 26-yard pass from Kyle McCord at the 6:56 mark in the first quarter. He then caught a 9-yard slant pass for a touchdown on the first play of the second quarter.

The Spartans got on the board with Jonathan Kim's 53-yard field goal with 5:38 left in the first half. It marked Kim's fourth field goal of 50-plus yards this season.

Ohio State scored two more touchdowns in the second quarter, a 9-yard run by TreVeyon Henderson and an 18-yard TD grab by Cade Stover, to make it 35-3 in favor of the Buckeyes at halftime.

OSU tacked on a field goal in the third quarter for the game's only points of the second half.

POST-GAME NOTES:

• Saturday's game marked the first time Michigan State played a team ranked No. 1 in the College Football Playoff rankings. The Buckeyes have topped the first two CFP rankings and entered Saturday's game ranked No. 3 in both the AP and Coaches Poll.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. -- The Michigan State football team rallied in the fourth quarter to defeat Indiana, 24-21, on the afternoon of Nov. 18 at Memorial Stadium, reclaiming the Old Brass Spitoon from the Hoosiers.

Down 21-17 with 4:06 remaining, the Spartans marched down the field 75 yards for the game-winning touchdown drive. Redshirt freshman quarterback Katin Houser connected on a 36-yard TD pass to redshirt junior tight end Maliq Carr with just 1:19 left on the clock to put MSU on top, 24-21. Carr caught the ball inside the 15-yard line, absorbed a big hit, then raced into the end zone for the game-winning score.

Carr finished the game with a career-high seven catches for 119 yards and two touchdowns. He is the first Spartan tight end to record a 100-yard receiving game since Dion Sims in 2012 (122 vs. Eastern Michigan).

Houser also had his best game of the season, completing 25-of-39 passes for 279 yards and three TDs. Senior Montorie Foster Jr. had seven receptions for a career-high 94 yards, including a 29-yard TD catch in the second quarter.

Defensively, senior defensive back Angelo Grose and sophomore defensive back Malik Spencer both recorded 10 tackles to lead the Spartans.

Michigan State leads the all-time series against Indiana, 50-18-2, including a 24-10-1 record in Bloomington.

The Spartans scored a touchdown on their opening drive for the second time this season to take a quick 7-0 lead. MSU went 80 yards on eight plays, capped by a 17-yard TD pass from Houser to Carr.

Indiana tied the score at 7 on Trent Howland's 4-yard TD run at the 9:29 mark in the second quarter.

MSU regained the lead right before halftime as Foster had a highlight reel one-handed catch in the middle of the field at the IU 22-yard line, then spun around a defender and raced into the end zone to put the Spartans on top, 14-7, at the 1:10 mark.

Indiana took advantage of a 26-yard kickoff return on the ensuing series and attempted a 45-yard field goal with six seconds left in the first half, but Simeon Barrow Jr. blocked the kick, his second blocked field goal of the season to keep it 14-7 at the break.

The Hoosiers tied the game once again by driving 75 yards on eight plays, finished off with a 3-yard TD reception by James Bomba, on their first series of the second half.

Michigan State reclaimed the lead with 9:26 left in the game as Jonathan Kim booted a 43-yard field goal to make it 17-14, but Indiana went on an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive on its next series to take its first lead of the game, 21-17, with 4:06 left to play.

The Spartans then responded with their own touchdown drive, going 75 yards on eight plays, capped by Carr's 36-yard TD.

On the last possession of the game, Indiana drove the ball to the MSU 25-yard line, but had an intentional grounding penalty which forced a 48-yard field goal with eight seconds left, which Chris Freeman missed wide right.



Redshirt junior tight end Maliq Carr (6) snared a career-high two TD catches, and finished with seven catches for 119 yards, both career highs, and was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Victory for MSU over Indiana. Carr is the first Spartan tight end to record a 100-yard receiving game since Dion Sims in 2012

Peggy scored 47 points in the Class C state championship game over Saginaw Valley Lutheran in 1989, which still stands as a state record for most points scored in a title game . . . Peggy played for the Volunteers and was a three-year letterwinner under Hall of Fame coach Pat Summitt from 1990-93 and averaged 11.5 points per game and 6.1 rebounds per game; she transferred to Ohio State and lettered in 1995 with the Buckeyes . . . his father, Cornell Mann, was named the head basketball coach at Grand Valley State in April 2022, and was also an assistant basketball coach at Central Michigan, Western Michigan, Dayton, Iowa State, Oakland and Missouri; he played college basketball at Akron for three seasons after starting his career at Colorado . . . was one of three Spartans to attend the "B1G Life Series: Selma to Montgomery" trip in the summer of 2022.
