THE OPENING KICK

» Coming off their first win of the 2023 campaign, the Pitt men's soccer team will hit the road for the first time Friday afternoon as they travel to Washington, DC to take on Georgetown. Friday's game will kick at 4 pm and air live on FloSports.

» The Panthers earned a dominant 5-0 home victory over Howard Monday night at Ambrose Urbanic Field thanks to five different goal scorers. **Albert Thorsen** netted his second goal of the season while **Fabian Grau**, **Zahir Dyke** and **Luka Kozomara** each scored their first career goals in the win. Pitt held the 22-2 edge in shots in the win.

» Freshman forward Albert Thorsen has proved to be a key member of the Pitt attack early on in his collegiate career as he earned starts in each of the first two matches. Thorsen leads the squad with two goals and six shots while netting the eventual game-winner against Howard Monday. He also added the game-tying goal in the 1-1 dra against Penn State in his first collegiate match.

» With the win over Howard Monday, Pitt improved to 33-4-6 (.837) at home over the past five seasons. The .837 win percentage marks the best in the ACC and seventh best overall in the NCAA over the span. Friday opponent Georgetown owns the second best win percentage (.887) at home in the NCAA over the same span.

**PITT EARNS FIRST WIN OF 2023**

- The Panthers collected their first win of the regular season Monday night at Ambrose Urbanic Field, knocking off Howard by the score of 5-0.
- Pitt had five different goal scorers in the match including three who netted their first career goal in the win.
- Albert Thorsen opened the scoring with his second of the season before Fabian Grau earned his first collegiate goal. Luis Sahnkow netted his first of the season while Zahir Dyke and Luka Kozomara netted second half goals, each the first of their career.
- Overall in the win, nine players netted at least one point while 12 Panthers posted at least one shot.
- In goal, Cabral Carter secured his first clean sheet of his career as he made one save while the Howard keeper made seven saves in the loss.
- For the match, Pitt posted the 20-2 edge in shots and the 4-0 lead in corner kicks.

NEWCOMERS CONTINUE TO IMPRESS

- The newcomers continued to impress in Pitt's 5-0 win over Howard Monday night.
- A total of 10 newcomers appeared in the win while four, Raphael Cilli, Fabian Grau, Felipe Mercado and Albert Thorsen, earned the start.
- Newcomers accounted for four of the five Pitt goals (Thorsen, Grau, Zahir Dyke, Luka Kozomara).
- Massimo Murania and Mercado also notched their first assists as Panthers in the win.
- After not seeing action in his freshman campaign, Cabral Carter made his second straight start and posted one save to secure his first shutout of his collegiate career.

THE SERIES VS. GEORGETOWN

- This meeting marks the 30th between the two programs all-time with the Hoyas owning the 22-7-0 edge in the series.
- Pitt won the last meeting in the series to open up the 2022 season, earning a 2-1 home victory.
- Georgetown has won seven of the

past eight in the series including a 5-0 victory in 2019 in the NCAA Tournament.

- Pitt is 2-11-0 all-time on the road against the Hoyas, losing the past four in Washington, DC.

SCOUTING THE HOYAS

- The Hoyas enter Friday's match with a 1-1-0 record as they downed Santa Clara in the opener before falling 5-1 at Stanford on Sunday.
- Jacob Murrell is leading the Hoyas offensive attack through two matches as he has three goals on four shots. Kyle Linhares also has one goal while Kieran Sargeant and Max Viera each have one assist on the year.
- Georgetown is led by Brian Wiese who is in his 18th season. He has a career record of 212-92-41 (.674).
- The Hoyas were tabbed as Big East Preseason favorites to win the east division. Senior defender Kenny Nielsen was picked as preseason Defensive Player of the Year and senior goalkeeper Ryan Schewe was picked as preseason Goalkeeper of the Year.
- Georgetown earned the No. 18 ranking in the United Soccer Coaches Preseason Poll after posting a 12-6-3 overall record and a 8-1-1 Big East mark in 2022. They also advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament but fell to Tulsa, 1-0, in overtime.

PITT RANKS #8 IN WEEK 1 POLL

- The Panthers ranked No. 8 in the United Soccer Coaches Week One poll announced Tuesday afternoon.
- It marks the second straight week being ranked after opening the season at No. 5.
- Pitt has earned a top-10 preseason ranking in the poll a program record three straight seasons.
- Dating back to last season, Pitt has now been ranked inside the top-10 in three straight polls.

SCORING FIRST A MUST FOR PITT

- Since 2019 (five seasons), Pitt owns a 44-1-3 overall record when they record the first goal of the match. Pitt is 1-0-0 this year, scoring the first goal in the win Monday over Howard.

- In 2022, Pitt was 10-0-1 when scoring the first goal while being just 2-4-3 when allowing the first goal of the match.

- The last game the Panthers lost when scoring the first goal of the match came against #2 Indiana on August 30, 2019, falling 3-2 on the road in double overtime.

LET ME ASSIST YOU

- A major strength of the Panthers over the past couple seasons has been the way they distribute the ball.

- So far this season, Pitt has six assists on six goals scored.

- Last season, Pitt totaled 48 assists on 42 goals. The 48 total assists ranked 12th most in the NCAA.

- The 48 assists ranked 2nd in a single season in Pitt history, trailing only the 2021 squad's total of 63 assists.

- Filip Mirkovic led the way with 12 assists, a new program record, while a total of 10 players notched at least two helpers on the year and nine had at least three.

- In 2021, Pitt led the NCAA in assists (63) and assists per game (3.15), both of which marked program records.

- Over the last four seasons (including 2023), Pitt leads the NCAA in total assists with 163 helpers.

THORSEN MAKING NOISE

- Freshman forward Albert Thorsen has burst on the scene for Pitt through two matches.

- The talented player has started both matches and produced two goals (one in each) to go along with six shots.

- Thorsen came up clutch in the season opening draw against Penn State as he netted the game-tying goal in the 79th minute. He then notched the game-winning goal against Howard.

- Thorsen is one of six freshman in the nation with at least two goals on the season.

MIRKOVIC THE MAGICIAN

- Senior midfielder Filip Mirkovic has developed into one of the most dangerous and creative players in the country during his time as a Panther.

- Mirkovic earned the start in Pitt season opening draw against Penn State and posted a game-high four shots in 80 minutes. He was given a red card in the 80th minute and missed the 5-0 win over Howard.

- With expectations higher than any previous season, Mirkovic will look to build on the momentum from a career year last season.

- In 2022, Mirkovic was great as he started 20 matches and posted three

goals, a team-high and ACC-leading 12 assists and 18 points while adding 38 shots. He ranked 1st in the ACC in assists (12) and 6th in total points (18).

- He also capped his junior campaign ranked 7th in the NCAA in assists per game (0.60).

- Entering his senior season in 2023, Mirkovic ranks fourth in program history in total assists (19) and assists per game (0.32) while ranking seventh in points per game (0.62).

- His 19 career assists ranks 10th in the NCAA among active players. He is just four assists shy of Tom Cooklin from Western Michigan.

- The senior brings loads of experience to the field for the Panthers as he has appeared in 60 matches and started 56. He has posted nine goals, 19 assists and 37 points to go along with 83 shots in four years of action for Pitt.

GILMAN EARNS CAPTAIN ARMBAND

- Heading into his sophomore campaign in 2023, Jackson Gilman has earned the respect of his teammates through his hardwork and dedication to the Pitt crest.

- Gilman will wear the captain's armband for Pitt this season following in the footsteps of former teammate and captain Jackson Walti who also earned the armband as a sophomore.

- Gilman becomes the ninth different Panther to sport the captain's armband for Pitt since Jay Vidovich took over the program in 2016.

- So far this season, Gilman has played every minute (180) on the backline for Pitt while adding one assist and two shots offensively.

- A vocal leader on the pitch, Gilman appeared in all 22 matches in 2022 as a true freshman and played 1,992 total minutes. He also added three assists and 17 shots in his first season.

RETURNERS LEADING BY EXAMPLE

- The 2023 roster features just 12 players from last season and only seven that appeared in at least five matches a season ago.

- Juniors Luis Sahnkow and Guilherme Feitosa earned a pair of starts to open the season and have enjoyed some strong play so far. Sahnkow has notched one goal on two shots while Feitosa has one assist while leading the squad with six shots.

- On the backline, Jackson Gilman and Mateo Maillefaud have provided the Panthers with stability after working together towards the end of last season. Both players have collected one assist while helping Pitt allow just one goal through two matches.

HOME TURF ADVANTAGE

- The Panthers have been one of the best teams in the country on their home turf over the past four seasons as they own a 32-4-6 record at Ambrose Urbanic Field.

- Pitt held a 19-match home winning streak from Oct. 7, 2019 to Nov. 10, 2021, which at the time was the longest streak in the ACC and second longest unbeaten streak in the nation.

- Head coach Jay Vidovich is 36-17-8 at home in his eight seasons at Pitt.

- Since the start of the 2019 season, Pitt has outscored its opponents 109-41 at home including a 24-12 advantage last season.

- Dating back to last season, Pitt is unbeaten at home in their last eight matches (4-0-4).

- The Panthers win percentage (.833) at home since 2019 is the best in the ACC and tied for 7th best overall in the NCAA.

- Since head coach Jay Vidovich's arrival on campus in 2016, the Pitt men's soccer program has begun to build a culture and program of winning and developing in Oakland.

- In total, 14 former Panthers are currently playing professional soccer in the US.

- Last season, a program record seven Panthers signed professional contracts after Pitt advanced to the College Cup.

- Pitt has seen eight players selected in the MLS SuperDraft including a program record three last season.

ROSTER TURNOVER

- Heading into the 2023 season, the Panthers will be looking to replace a lot of important pieces that helped lead them to the College Cup a season ago.

- The Panthers lost a total of 15 players from a season ago, seven of which signed professional contracts. Two of those players were top-10 all-time in points scored at Pitt (Valentin Noel, Bertin Jacquesson).

- The departing players accounted for 67% of the goals (28), 66% of minutes played (14,616) and 52% of the assists (25).

- Pitt is returning just 12 players from last years squad. They accounted for 14 of 42 goals from 2022 (33%).

- They are welcoming 16 newcomers to the roster this season including nine true freshmen.

PRESEASON PLAYER PRAISE

- Coming off of the best season of his college career, Filip Mirkovic has garnered tons of preseason praise ahead of his senior campaign.

- Mirkovic was named to the Hermann Trophy Watch List, College Soccer News Second Team All-American, United Soccer Coaches Midfield Watch List as well as the ACC Preseason Watch List.

- Pitt also had a pair of players named to the Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Top-100 players list as Filip Mirkovic was No. 16 and sophomore defender Jackson Gilman was No. 46.

RECAPPING THE 2022 CAMPAIGN

- The Panthers made history once again in 2022 as they advanced to their second NCAA College Cup in

the past three seasons. Pitt fell in the national semifinal to the Indiana Hosiery for the second time, 2-0, in Cary, NC.

- Pitt capped their strong campaign with a 12-5-5 overall record and a 3-2-3 ACC mark. They collected four NCAA Tournament victories including a pair of home matches at Ambrose Urbanic Field.

- The Panthers were ranked No. 4 by TopDrawerSoccer and No. 8 by United Soccer Coaches in the final regular season rankings. The No. 4 ranking was the highest to close a season for Pitt in program history.

- Hosting an Elite Eight match for the first time at home, Pitt didn't disappoint as a sold-out crowd of 2,200 people witnessed a dominant performance by the Panthers that ended in joy as Valentin Noel headed home the game-winning goal in the 104th minute after a great cross by Bertin Jacquesson. Pitt was dominant from the opening whistle as they outshot Portland 32-8 for the match.

- Following the run to the College Cup, the Panthers saw a program record three student-athletes drafted in the 2023 MLS SuperDraft. Bertin Jacquesson became the highest draft pick in program history as he went No. 16 overall to Real Salt Lake. Valentin Noel was taken with the 20th pick by Austin FC and Jackson Walti was taken with the 56th pick by Austin FC.

- The duo of Jacquesson and Noel became the first duo at Pitt in any sport to go inside the top-20 in their respective sport draft since Bill Fralic and Chris Doleman were selected No. 2 and No. 4 overall in the 1985 NFL Draft.

FRESH FACES

- The rebuilt Pitt roster features a total of 16 newcomers including four transfers, three international student-athletes and nine freshmen.

- The four transfers are Joao Souza, Felipe Mercado, Luka Kozomara and Nick Blacklock.

- Joao Souza signed with Pitt after a strong four-year career at Marshall where he appeared in 74 matches and earned 50 starts. The midfielder netted 11 goals, 10 assists and 32 points on 82 shots across his career. He also won a national championship ring in 2020-21 with Marshall as he earned six starts across 17 games that season.

- Felipe Mercado transferred in following two seasons at the University of Charleston (WV) where he appeared in 27 matches and made 18 starts. He posted career totals of five goals, nine assists and 19 points while playing for the DII power.

- Luka Kozomara joined the squad this year after two years at Temple where he appeared in 23 matches and made 21 starts on defense. He was named to the American Athletic Conference All-Rookie Team in 2021 after his strong play.

- Nick Blacklock comes to Pitt after spending the past four seasons playing for ACC foe Virginia Tech. Across his career, he totaled 63 matches and earned 45 starts while netting seven goals, eight assists and 22 points. Blacklock will miss the 2023 season due to a knee injury sustained during summer training.

- All three international players have professional playing experience, two in France and one in Germany.

- Defender Fabian Grau spent the past four seasons playing for FC Eintracht Norderstedt 03 who plays in the fourth tier in the German Football League system. The 6-2 presence appeared in 67 matches for the club while netting four goals, two assists and playing a total of 5,794 minutes.

- The Panthers also signed a pair

of french players who played in the Championnat National 3 league, the fifth tier in France, last season.

- Raphael Cilli will play right back for Pitt after spending last season at Marcq olympique where he netted four goals, 12 assists and 20 points.

- Abdoulaye Toure will play on the wing for Pitt after spending last season playing for Pau FC B.

- Pitt will also be welcoming a big group of true freshmen who will be looking to make an immediate impact this season. Kyle Durham, Jack Moxom and Eli Mumford will be battling for playing time in goal. In the midfield, Pitt welcomes Santiago Ferreira and Felipe Mercado. Pitt will be looking for some contributions from a forward group that includes Albert Thorsen, Zahir Dyke, Massimo Murania and Alex Hauskrecht.

PITT PICKED AS COASTAL FAVORITES

- For the third straight season, Pitt was tabbed by ACC coaches to finish first in the Coastal Division in the ACC Coaches' Preseason Poll.

- Pitt garnered five first-place votes in the Coastal Division, a division they have won twice in the past three seasons.

- The Panthers also earned one vote to claim the overall ACC title.

INTERNATIONAL PANTHERS

- Pitt has started to recruit international since head coach Jay Vidovich took over the program in 2015 and it has been a successful recipe for the Panthers.

- The Panthers have a total of 10 players on their roster from outside the US.

- In all, Pitt features players from six different countries including France, Germany, Colombia, Brazil, Norway and the USA.

- The Panthers have a total of four

players from France (Cilli, Toure, Maillefaud, Lefebvre) and two from Brazil (Feitosa, Souza) on their 2023 roster.

VIDOVICH'S COACHING SUCCESSES

- Head coach Jay Vidovich has made a total of five College Cup appearances as a head coach including two at Pitt.

- Vidovich owns a 2-4 overall record in his College Cup coaching career as his Wake Forest team won the 2007 National title, defeating Ohio State 2-1 in the championship match.

- He has posted a career coaching record of 341-176-63 (.642). His 341 career coaching wins are the 12th most among active D1 head coaches.

- With the win over NC State last season, Vidovich became the first head coach in ACC history to collect 100 regular season conference wins. He currently owns a 101-78-29 (.555) record in ACC matches.

- Vidovich is one of the most decorated coaches in the NCAA as he earned one national title (2007, Wake Forest) while earning two NSCAA National Coach of the Year awards (2007, 2008) and seven ACC Coach of the Year awards (2002, 2004, 2006, 2008, 2009, 2020, 2021).

Jay Vidovich, one of America's most respected and accomplished soccer coaches, is entering his eighth season as head coach of Pitt in 2023. He was named the third men's soccer head coach in program history at the University of Pittsburgh in December of 2015.

Vidovich has taken the Panthers program to unimagined heights since taking the reins of the program. Under his tutelage, Pitt has advanced to a pair of College Cups in the past three seasons including in 2022.

Following the impressive 2022 campaign, the Panthers had a trio of players selected in the 2023 MLS SuperDraft which marked the most picks in a single draft in program history. Junior forward Bertin Jacquesson earned a Generation Adidas contract (first in program history) and became the highest drafted Panther in program history when he was selected with the 16th pick by Real Salt Lake. Fellow Panther Valentin Noel also was taken in the first round as he went 20th overall to Austin FC while stalwart midfielder Jackson Walti was taken in the second round, 56th overall by Austin FC.

Jacquesson and Noel became the first pair of teammates at Pitt (any sport) to be selected in the top-20 of the draft since Bill Fralic and Chris Doleman were taken 2nd and 4th overall in the 1985 NFL Draft.

Overall, Pitt capped their impressive 2022 campaign with a 12-5-5 record including a 3-2-3 mark in ACC matches. After knocking off Cleveland State and Akron at home to open up the 2022 NCAA Tournament, the Panthers went on the road and notched the biggest upset of the tournament as they handed the No. 1 overall seed Kentucky a 2-1 loss thanks to a Bertin Jacquesson goal in the 87th minute despite playing down a man.

With the win over Kentucky, the Panthers earned their first ever home NCAA Tournament Elite Eight match as they hosted the Portland Pilots in front of a sold-out crowd at Ambrose Urbanic Field. After a dominant performance, Pitt came out on top in double overtime as Valentin Noel found the back of the net in the 104th minute to send Pitt to their second College Cup in three seasons.

Pitt capped the 2022 campaign ranked No. 4 in the final Top Drawer Soccer rankings, their highest final ranking in program history. They have now earned a top-10 ranking in the final poll in three straight seasons for the first time in program history.

The awards rolled in following the season as Pitt placed five on All-ACC squads while Noel earned Third Team All-American honors and First Team All-South Region honors. Filip Mirkovic also collected First Team All-South Region honors while freshman Jackson Gilman was named College Soccer News First Team Freshman All-America.

In total seven student-athletes from Vidovich's 2022 squad signed professional contracts which are the most signings in a single season in Pitt history.

Off the pitch, the Panthers had another strong season as well as they placed a program record 11 players on the All-ACC Academic Team while also earning the highest team GPA of any men's team at Pitt.

Vidovich and the team picked up where it left off in 2021 and captured a share of the ACC Coastal Division Title for the second-straight season and appeared in the NCAA Elite Eight for the second consecutive year. His efforts at the helm earned him ACC Coach of the Year for the second-straight season and seventh time in his illustrious career.

Since the start of the 2020-21 campaign – one split into two seasons due to the COVID-19 pandemic – the Panthers have been nationally ranked and have totaled 31 straight weeks in the United Soccer Coaches Poll. Of those 31 weeks, 21 have been in the top-five and 26 in the top-10.

The 2021 team proved to be one of the best passing teams in the nation, totaling 63 assists and 3.15 assists per game. The total assist mark surpassed last year's program high of 44 while the assists per game was .65 higher than the previous program best of 2.50 set back in 1971.

The team earned a key 2-0 victory on the road at No. 2 Clemson Sept. 25, 2021, snapping the Tigers' longest home winning streak in the nation. After the victory, Pitt secured the top spot of home wins in a row, a feat that lasted 19 games and six and a half weeks in the nation's toughest conference. In addition to longest active home winning streak, the Panthers held the second longest home unbeaten streak in the country at 19-0-0. Vidovich and staff have transformed Ambrose Urbanic Field as a tough place to play as Pitt has outscored its competition 84-28 since the 2019 season and outscored its opponents 43-12 in 2021.

Finishing 13-5-2 with a 5-2-1 conference ledger, the 2021 squad earned multiple accolades both on and off the pitch. Jasper Löeffelsend was named College Soccer News First Team All-American and United Soccer Coaches Second Team All-American, becoming the first two-time All-American in program history as he received both honors in 2020-21. Löeffelsend was also named ACC Defensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive season, a feat that has not happened in the conference since Ike Opara in 2008-09, a player Vidovich coached at Wake Forest.

Nine players were named to the All-ACC Team including a program best six on the Second Team. Pitt's achievements happened in the classroom as well as eight players were named to the All-ACC Academic Team with Jackson Walti earning the ACC Postgraduate Scholarship Award.

After the conclusion of the 2021 season, both Löeffelsend and Arturo Ordoñez were drafted in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft. Ordoñez was taken 39th overall by the Houston Dynamo, while Löeffelsend was selected 81st overall by Real Salt Lake.

Vidovich and the Panthers concluded one of the most memorable seasons in Pitt men's soccer history in 2020-21, finishing with a school record 16 wins, nine conference victories and a NCAA College Cup appearance, the first the program has seen. The Panthers finished 16-4 (9-1) and clinched the school's first ever Coastal Division crown with a 5-0 shutout victory at home over Virginia April 8, 2021.

Under Vidovich and staff, the Panthers earned a plethora of awards in 2020-21. Midfielder Valentin Noel and defender Jasper Löeffelsend received United Soccer Coaches First and Second Team All-America, respectively, the first All-Americans in program history. Three players were named ACC Players of the Year, including Noel (Offensive), Löeffelsend (Defensive) and Bertin Jacquesson (Freshman). A school record five were named to the United Soccer Coaches All-South Region Team, while a program record 10 were named to the All-ACC teams. Noel was also named a finalist for the prestigious MAC Hermann Trophy award, given to college soccer's best male and female player.

Pitt's offense ranked among the best in 2020-21, ranking fifth in the country in scoring offense with 2.55 goals per game. The Panthers were first in the nation in total goals (51), total assists (44), and total points (146) while ranking 13th in assists per game (2.20) and sixth in points per game (7.30). In part to leading Pitt to a high powered offense, Pitt earned the No. 1 ranking via United Soccer Coaches Poll for the first time ever Oct. 20, 2020.

Vidovich was named ACC Coach of the Year for the sixth time in his career and first as the Panthers' head coach April 14, 2021.



In his fourth year at the helm of Pitt men's soccer, Vidovich led the Panthers to a 10-8-2 record in 2019. Vidovich saw Pitt upset No. 1 Virginia on the road on Oct. 18, host an ACC Tournament game against NC State for the first time in school history on Nov. 10, earn a trip to the ACC Semifinals for the first time in program history and stamp its name into the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship for the first time since 1965.

Vidovich and the Panthers earned a monumental victory on Nov. 21, 2019 as they defeated Lehigh at Ambrose Urbanic Field, 2-0, winning the first NCAA Men's Soccer Championship game in school history. The season ended Nov. 24 against No. 2 Georgetown in the second round of the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship, but only after a record setting season that saw six All-ACC honorees, two ACC All-Tournament Team winners and one United Soccer Coaches All-South Region Team recipient.

During his third year at Pitt in the 2018 season, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over two ranked opponents in No. 12 NC State and No. 7 Virginia in the ACC Men's Soccer Tournament. The victory over the Cavaliers marked the Panthers' first ACC Tournament win in program history. Pitt collected its first conference win on the season against the Wolfpack and picked up another ACC victory over Clemson on Oct. 5.

Vidovich played a crucial role in the development of Javi Perez, who was drafted by LAFC in the third round of 2019 MLS Superdraft. With the selection, Perez became only the second player in program history to be drafted to an MLS club team. Three Panthers were also named to All-ACC teams under Vidovich's guidance as Edward Kizza was given First Team honors, Javi Perez earned Second Team recognition and Chandler Vaughn was named to the All-Freshman Team. Both Kizza and Perez earned All-Region Honors as well, with Kizza voted to the Second Team and Perez named to the Third Team.

Following his first year at the helm, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 13 Columbia and No. 21 Syracuse in the 2017 season.

Vidovich also guided four players to All-ACC recognition, with Javi Perez earning Second Team honors, Pol Planellas receiving Third Team recognition and both Alexander Dexter and Edward Kizza being named to the All-Freshman Team. The postseason accolades were the team's first in program history since joining the ACC.

Planellas would go on to become the first Pitt men's soccer player in program history to be drafted by an MLS Club team after being selected by the Los Angeles Football Club in the second round of the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, becoming the 36th professional player under Vidovich's tutelage.

Prior to making the move to Pittsburgh, Vidovich oversaw the men's soccer program at Wake Forest for 21 seasons (1994-2014), building the Demon Deacons into a national power and winning the 2007 NCAA championship. He spent 2015 in professional soccer, coaching the Portland Timbers 2 (T2) in the United Soccer League (USL).

During his Wake Forest tenure, Vidovich compiled a 272-121-50 record and led the Demon Deacons to the NCAA Tournament in 13 of his final 14 seasons. Wake Forest won five Atlantic Coast Conference titles under his watch, compiling a 76-52-22 mark in one of the nation's most challenging leagues.

In 2007, Wake Forest went 22-2-2—the winningest season in



school history—and defeated Ohio State, 2-1, in the national final to claim the program's first NCAA title. The Demon Deacons made four consecutive appearances in the College Cup from 2006-09.

Vidovich, a two-time National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) National Coach of the Year (2007 and 2008) and five-time ACC Coach of the Year (2002, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2009), ranks among the most decorated coaches in collegiate soccer.

Vidovich was the 2008 recipient of the prestigious Walt Chyzowych Award for lifetime contributions to the sport of soccer. Vidovich was an assistant under the legendary Chyzowych for eight seasons at Wake Forest from 1986-93.

Widely regarded as one of the game's top evaluators and developers of talent, Vidovich has produced 21 All-Americans and five ACC Player of the Year honorees (three offensive and two defensive). He also coached Marcus Tracy, the first player in Wake history to win the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, which honors the top individual player in college soccer.

Thirty-five players under Vidovich went on to play in the professional ranks from 2002-14. His Wake Forest teams also achieved academically, evidenced by two ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honorees, two Academic All-Americans, one adidas National Scholar-Athlete of the Year and one Senior CLASS Award recipient.

Born in Detroit, Mich., Vidovich was an all-state player for New Canaan High School in Connecticut. He played for Indiana University in 1978 before transferring to Ohio Wesleyan, where he was a three-year starter. As a senior, Vidovich was team captain and helped lead OWU to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament.

A 1982 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan with a bachelor's degree in physical education, he went on to earn a master's degree in sports sciences from the University of Denver in 1983.

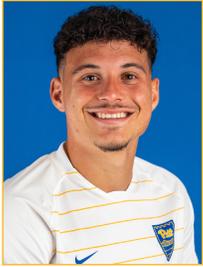
