Program Timeline

1928: UConn finishes its first season of collegiate soccer with a 2-2 record under head coach Roy Guyer.

1937: John Squires takes over as head coach, a post he would hold for 28 of the next 29 seasons ... Coach Squires passed away in 2006 at the age of 94 as one of the true pioneers of intercollegiate soccer.

1943-1945: Due to World War II, UConn did not field teams for these three seasons.

1948: UConn is crowned the NSCAA National Champion after completing an 11-0 season ... Carlos Fetterolf becomes the first All-America selection.

1969: Joe Morrone becomes the seventh head coach in UConn history ... Morrone coached 28 years, earning a 358-178-53 record, before having the soccer stadium named after him in 1996.

1972: Frantz Innocent scores four goals vs. Hofstra on Nov. 4 to set a school record for single-game goals (record remains intact).

1979: Joe M. Morrone sets the school records for goals (22) and points (57) in a season ... Both records would stay intact until the 2007 season when O'Brian White moved atop in goals with 23.

1980: The Huskies win a program-best 21 games, including 17 straight, on their way to the NCAA Quarterfinals ... Joe M. Morrone wins the Hermann Trophy, given annually to the best collegiate player.

1981: UConn wins its first NCAA National Championship, beating Alabama A&M 2-1 in overtime on Dec. 6 in Palo Alto, Calif. ... The Huskies finish the season with a 20-3-2 record.

1983: In just the second year of BIG EAST soccer play, the Huskies win their first of seven conference championships.

1988: Dan Donigan receives the Adi Dassler Award for the most outstanding senior soccer player.

1997: Ray Reid becomes UConn's newest head coach after eight seasons at Southern Connecticut State.

2000: The Huskies capture the NCAA National Championship with a 2-0 win over Creighton on Dec. 10 in Charlotte, N.C. Chris Gbandi earns the Hermann Trophy for being the best collegiate player.

2006: UConn celebrates the 25th Anniversary of the 1981 NCAA Championship with an elaborate reunion weekend and celebration.

2007: The Huskies won their third BIG EAST title in four years, while also taking the regular-season crown. O'Brian White breaks the school record for season goals en route to winning the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy.

2008: UConn made its 29th overall appearance in the NCAA Tournament, including its 11th straight. The Huskies also fought their way into the NCAA Round of 16 for the 19th time in program history.

2009: UConn won the BIG EAST Regular Season title in the Blue Division before making its 30th overall appearance in the NCAA Tournament and its 12th straight.

2010: UConn made its 31st NCAA Tournament appearance as they posted a 12-2-6 overall record. The Huskies were led by All-Americans Josh Ford and Tony Cascio along with freshman All-American Andrew Jean-Baptiste. Cascio was named BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year, while Ford was tagged as the Goalkeeper of the Year.

2011: The Huskies earned the No. 1 national ranking for four straight weeks and finished 19-3-3. UConn made it's 14th straight NCAA post-season appearance and 32nd overall, hosting the NCAA Quarterfinals in Storrs. Freshman Andre Blake and junior Carlos Alvarez were named All-Americans. UConn set a program record with 16 shutouts, including nine straight.

2012: The Huskies finished the season at 17-4-1, earning their 12th ever BIG EAST regular season title and reaching the quarterfinals in the NCAA Tournament for the 13th time in program history.

2013: Connecticut finished the year with a 12-3-8 overall record, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament for the 16th straight season. The Huskies became the only school to reach the NCAA Quarterfinals in each of the last three seasons. Keeper Andre Blake earned NSCAA All-American honors for the third straight year.

2014: UConn won its 13th-ever conference regular season title after topping No. 25 USF on Nov. 1.

2015: The Huskies secure their 18th NCAA Tournament bid in the last 19 seasons with a 10-6-6 campaign, reaching the conference tournament finals.

2018: UConn ends a two-year hiatus from postseason play by earning an at-large bid to the 2018 NCAA Tournament with a 12-6-2 mark and an appearance in the AAC Tournament Semifinals.

INFORMATION & CREDENTIALS

Requests for home game media passes, photography passes and broadcast accommodations must be made in writing, via email or fax, to the UConn Office of Athletic Communications. All approved requests may be picked up by a representative of the media outlet at the Media Will Call area.

MEDIA AREA SERVICES

The UConn Office of Athletic Communications will provide all working media members pre-game materials and statistics prior to each game. Halftime and final statistics will also be provided.

WORKING MEDIA AREA

Due to the men's soccer team playing its home contests off campus this season, press seating is available on a first-serve, first serve basis.

PRESS PARKING

Press parking is available at the stadium and media members are asked to request a parking pass at least one week prior to each contest.

POST-GAME PROCEDURES

All post-game interviews will take place after a 10-minute cooling off period. Head Coach Ray Reid and requested players will be available at a specified area that will be given on game day. Visiting coach and player interviews should be arranged through the visiting SID.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS

Interviews with Connecticut players and coaches should be pre-arranged with the UConn Athletic Communications Office at least 24 hours in advance. On game days, no interviews will be allowed prior to the game.

RADIO POLICY

Visiting radio should contact the Athletic Communications Office at least two weeks prior to the scheduled game. Telephone lines are available to visiting radio for charge calls or collect calls only; the fee per line will be \$75.00.

ROAD REQUESTS

Please direct all credential requests for the Huskies' road games to the host institution's men's soccer media relations contact. A member of UConn's Athletic Communication office may be available at selected road games to help facilitate post-game interviews.

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Joseph J. Morrone Stadium at the Rizza Family Performance Center



Joseph J. Morrone Stadium at the Rizza Family Performance Center is home to UConn men's and women's soccer and the women's lacrosse program.

The stadium is named after former UConn men's soccer coach, Joe Morrone. Morrone led the Huskies for 28 seasons, had a record of 358-178-53, advanced to three straight national semifinals in 1981-1983, and won the national championship in 1981. Morrone, a member of the NSCAA Hall of Fame, retired from coaching in 1996.

Former UConn men's soccer player Tony Rizza ('87) contributed significant financial donations to help build both the new Morrone Stadium and the sports performance center that will house men's and women's soccer, lacrosse, baseball and softball teams.

The Huskies will have their player locker room, player's lounge and coach's offices in the performance center. An athletic training room and strength and conditioning area will also be featured in the Performance Center. There will also be a room that the team can utilize for meals and film.

Morrone Stadium has a bleacher capacity of 4,169 with standing room that will push stadium capacity to 5,300 and feature a FieldTurf Core-2 playing surface that measures 75 by 120 yards.

The facility features a press box that will hold multiple radio and TV booths, and an area for PA/scoring and the press.

Since 1999, the UConn men's soccer program has ranked in the top-five in attendance every year, including leading the nation in average or overall attendance in 1999, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2007 and 2008. 2007, 2011, 2017 and 2018. Both the men's and women's soccer programs have hosted a number of conference and NCAA post-season events over the years. The men's team


has produced three national championships.

Head Coach | 32nd Season | Southern Connecticut State '82

The 31-year head coaching career of Reid includes just two stops----eight years at his alma mater Southern Connecticut State University (1989-1996) and the past 23 seasons at the University of Connecticut (1997-present). His record as a college head coach stands at 450-142-76, a 73.1% winning effort, which ranks him No. 3 in the nation in overall winning percentage among all NCAA active head coaches.

His brilliant head coaching resume includes 25 NCAA Tournament berths --- including 18 of the last 22 seasons, and four NCAA National Championships---the 2000 NCAA Division I National Championship at UConn, and the 1990, 1992 and 1995 NCAA Division II National Championships at Southern Connecticut State University.

Reid's overall NCAA Tournament post-season record is 36-15-10 (12-3-3 at SCSU, 24-12-7 at UConn). He holds an 8-3-2 (6-2-2 at SCSU, 2-1 at UConn) mark in eight appearances in the NCAA "Final Four"/College Cup and has

also coached his teams to the NCAA National Quarterfinals in 13 different seasons (6 at SCSU, 7 at UConn).

His success story at UConn has included 20 consecutive winning seasons and 18 trips to the NCAA Tournament. In addition, the UConn men's soccer program has been ranked in the National Top 25 in 19 of the past 23 seasons.

A total of 17 different UConn soccer stars have earned All-American recognition including six standouts who have been honored as First Team All-Americans (Maurizio Rocha-1998, Chris Gbandi-2000 & 2001, Julius James-2006 & 2007, O'Brian White-2007, Tony Cascio-2010, Andre Blake-2012 & 2013).

The sustained success of the UConn men's soccer program under Reid has allowed 41 UConn standouts to be recognized and drafted in the Major League Soccer (MLS) annual draft of young soccer stars (1999-Present). Most recent selections include Jake Nerwinski (1st Round, 7th pick, Vancouver) and Kwame Awuah (1st Round, 16th pick, NYCFC) in 2017 Jacob Hauser-Ramsey (2nd Round, 42nd pick, Colorado) in 2019, and Dayonn Harris (1st Round, 20th pick, Real Salt Lake) in 2020.

A total of 16 UConn players have been MLS First Round selections with 2000 National Player of the Year Chris Gbandi being the No. 1 pick in the First Round of the 2000 MLS Draft. In January of 2014, Andre Blake became the first goalkeeper to ever be selected No. 1 overall in the MLS SuperDraft after he was selected by the Philadelphia Union and striker Cyle Larin was taken No. 1 in 2015 by Orlando City, marking the first time any college program boasted back-to-back No. 1 overall selections.

From 2001-2010, the UConn men's soccer team compiled a 136-51-32 overall record. Over this 10-year stretch, Reid led the Huskies to four Big East regular season (2001, '05, '07, '09) and three Big East conference titles (2004, '05, and '07). During this span, Reid was also inducted into the Connecticut Soccer Hall of Fame as a member of the 2003 class.

In just four short seasons at the helm of the UConn men's soccer program, Ray Reid led UConn to the pinnacle of the Division I soccer world in 2000 when the Huskies hoisted the 2000 NCAA National Championship trophy above the crowd of the UConn soccer faithful in Charlotte, NC. The Huskies finished the season with an overall record of 20-3-2 and ended the year atop the NSCAA and Soccer America Magazine polls. For his accomplishments, Reid earned his fourth NSCAA National Coach of the Year award in addition to garnering Northeast Regional Division I Coach of the Year honors.

Named the eighth head coach of Connecticut on December 18, 1996, Ray Reid took over the coaching reigns after directing the Southern



Connecticut State University program to NCAA Division II national titles in 1990, 1992 and 1995. As head coach of the owls, Reid compiled a 146-17-15 mark while leading Southern to six regular season titles, seven conference tournament championships and six trips to the NCAA Division II 'Final Four', including one in each of his last five seasons. Additionally, between 1990 and 1996, Reid's teams at Southern Connecticut lost just 10 games, recording a 132-10-14 mark (89.1 % winning percentage) and undefeated seasons in 1990 and 1994. His success during this span earned him the National Soccer Coaches' Association of America National Coach of the Year award in 1990, 1992 and 1994.

In 1989, Reid took over the reins of the Southern Connecticut soccer program after replacing Bob Dikranian as head coach of the Owls. In only his second year (1990) at the helm, Reid won the NCAA Division II National Championship after posting an undefeated season, 22-0-1. SCSU tacked on two more national championships under Reid's tutelage, capturing the title in 1992 with a 21-2-1 record and then once again in 1995, posting a 21-1-1 mark. He was inducted into the Southern Connecticut State University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.

Following graduation, Reid served as the top assistant to then Southern Connecticut head coach Dikranian from 1983-1988. During that period, SCSU posted a 96-20-14 record and captured the 1987 NCAA Division II National Championship.

The Brentwood, N.Y. native graduated from SCSU in 1982, following a successful collegiate career where he was a three-year starter and two-year captain for a Southern Connecticut team that went 46-13-3 and made three NCAA national semi-final appearances during that span.

Reid coached the Connecticut U-17 Olympic Development team for four seasons and also coached the U-15 team as well as the USSF U-13f Region One Select Team. He is a member of the Connecticut Junior Soccer Association coaching staff and holds a USSF 'A' coaching license.

Reid is married to the former Valerie Casares and has two daughters, Cate and Dannielle.

Michael Miller

Associate Head Coach | 5th Season | Jacksonville '04

Mike Miller, an 18-year veteran of the collegiate coaching ranks, has developed a strong reputation for turning around programs and has recruited and promoted 20 players to Major League Soccer, including 11 first-round picks, in his coaching career. Originally from East Brunswick, N.J., he completed his fourth season as associate head coach at UConn in 2019.

Succeeding at every stop in his coaching career, Miller has transitioned from a goalkeeper coach at the University of Evansville to a highly respected associate head coach and recruiter at UConn in just an 11-year span – earning a nod to the list of Top Assistant Coaches by College Soccer News in each of the past three years. Additionally, Miller was responsible for bringing in the nation's 12th-best recruiting class of 2019, a class that featured 10 freshman and five Division I transfers.

"Coach Miller has done a great job recruiting for us," said head coach Ray Reid. "His ability to identify some of the best talent in the country, both domestically and internationally, has aided in the resurgence of the UConn men's soccer program."

Since coming to UConn, the Huskies have earned seven selections to the All-American Athletic Conference First Team and had four players chosen in the MLS SuperDraft under Miller's tutelage – including first round picks Jake Nerwinski (seventh overall, Vancouver) and Kwame Awuah (16th, NYC FC) in 2017, 2018 second-round pick Jacob Hauser-Ramsey (42nd overall,

Colorado and most recently, Dayonn Harris (20th, Real Salt Lake).

The Huskies qualified for the AAC semifinals from 2016-2018, including an 12-6-2 record and a trip to the NCAA Second Round during the 2018 campaign. Five players garnered All-Conference recognition in Miller's fourth year on the UConn staff, including Moussa Wade and Ben Awashie who both earned spots on the AAC All-Rookie team. In 2018, Miller coached freshman Ibrahima Diop (All-Conference Rookie Team) and Dayonn Harris (Second Team All-Conference) to conference honors. Six players received All-Conference recognition in each of Miller's first two seasons, including freshmen Blaise NGague and Josh Burnett being named to the All-Conference Rookie Team in 2017.

Miller has recruited and coached a long list of MLS draft picks in his collegiate tenure, including eight overall first picks – Nerwinski, Awuah, Miles Robinson (second overall, 2017), Jeremy Embossed (fourth overall, 2017), Julian Buescher (11th overall, 2016), Alex Bono (sixth overall, 2015), and Skylar Thomas (11th overall, 2015).

Prior to UConn, Miller gained Major League Soccer experience with Sporting Kansas City as a domestic scout. His responsibilities included scouting first team, USL and academy players, putting to work his talent of finding highly skilled players. He brought Gianluca Busio to the team, the second-youngest MLS signee all-time, as well as Wan Kuzain bin Wan Kamal.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Miller served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Duke from 2014-16. He was instrumental in the rebuild of Duke's program, responsible for student-athlete development, fundraising efforts, video analysis and opponent scouting. In three seasons, he produced a pair of top-15 recruiting classes, including a fourth-ranked class in 2014.

Miller left his stamp on the Duke program even after departing for UConn, as the Blue Devils reached the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament and were ranked No. 6 in the RPI at the conclusion of the 2017 season.

Besides the ability to recruit and develop young talent, Miller's coaching skills have resulted in improved team results at each of his previous stops – including two of the biggest turnarounds of any team in the country while at Evansville (2006) and Syracuse (2012).

Serving four years on the Syracuse staff from 2010-14, he received more recognition from College Soccer News as one of the nation's top assistants in 2013. He was vital in producing three-straight top-40 recruiting classes for the Orange from 2011-13 and was promoted to Head Recruiting Coordinator in 2011 for his efforts.

Most notably, however, Miller's guidance on the field helped lead the Orange (14-6-1) to a breakout season in 2012 – advancing to the NCAA Round of 16, just the program's second all-time NCAA postseason appearance. Syracuse finished the year ranked No. 17 in the NSCAA/Continental Tire Poll, after going just 3-12-1 the year before in 2011.

His 2012 recruiting class at Syracuse was tabbed 14th nationally by College Soccer News, while the group featured a trio of top freshmen – including All-ACC Second Team player Emil Ekbom. In addition to his recruiting duties with the Orange, Miller mentored the goalkeepers, while handling video editing and opponent scouting.

Miller received his master's degree while serving as an assistant at Evansville from 2006-10, leading the Purple Aces to an incredible turnaround in just his first season with the staff. A team that went 2-14-1 in 2005 improved to a 9-8-0 mark in 2006 with Miller working closely with the goalkeepers, while helping to bring a pair of College Soccer News Top 40 classes during his tenure. He worked with Alec Dufty,

Cory Elenio, and Robby Lynch, all MLS players.

His coaching career began in 2004 as an assistant coach at North Florida, serving his role with the Ospreys until 2006.

Andy Parker

Assistant Coach | 6th Season | St. Anselm '12

Andy Parker completed his sixth season as an assistant coach in 2019. His primary role is working with the UConn goalkeepers.

In 2016, Scott Levene excelled under Parker, ranking at the top of multiple American Conference statistical categories. Levene led the conference in goals against average (0.77) and save percentage (.792). He was also tied for the conference lead with eight shutouts registered on the year.

In 2015, Parker completed his first season as assistant coach on the Husky bench, helping the team reach the NCAA Tournament for the 17th time in the last 18 seasons.

Parker concluded his third season as the Director of Quality Control for the University of Connecticut men's soccer team in 2014. The Huskies tallied their 13th regular season conference title with Parker on the bench, and UConn finished its 2014 campaign with wins in six of its final seven matches.

Prior to his time at UConn, Parker was a four-year letter winner for the men's soccer program at Saint Anselm, earning Northeast-10 All-Rookie Team honors during the 2008 season. Parker earned a starting assignment in all 72 games he played and left Saint Anselm as the all-time leader in minutes played. A member of the 2011 Northeast-10 All-Academic Team, Parker was a two-time team captain and was selected as a 2011-12 Senior Scholar-Athlete.

A 2012 graduate of St. Anselm with a degree in international business, Parker earned his M.S. in Sport Management in 2015 from the University of Connecticut. He also holds an NSCAA National Diploma and USSF "C" License.

Nick Heckt


Volunteer Director Quality Control

2000 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Head coach Ray Reid and the Huskies won the 2000 NCAA College Cup with a 2-0 win over Creighton in the championship game on Dec. 10. Chris Gbandi scored a goal in the first half and Darin Lewis sealed the win in the 86th minute to give UConn the victory.

Gbandi was the most outstanding defensive player, while Lewis was the most outstanding offensive player.

UConn opened NCAA play with wins over Dartmouth and Clemson before defeating Brown in the quarterfinals in a renewal of one of New England's original college soccer rivalries. A 2-0 win over Southern Methodist in the semifinals set up the championship game.

UConn finished the year with a 20-3-2 record while Chris Gbandi, Darin Lewis and Brent Rahim all earned All-America honors.







1981 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Head coach Joe Morrone and the Huskies were on top of the men's college soccer world in 1981 as UConn topped Alabama A&M by a 2-1 score in overtime on December 6 at Stanford Stadium to win the NCAA Championship.

UConn posted victories over Vermont and Long Island at home in opening round NCAA games before topping Eastern Illinois by a 2-1 overtime score in the national semifinals to move on to the championship.

UConn had a 20-3-2 record in 1981 as Elvis Comrie and Pedro DeBrito were both named All-Americans.





1948 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 1948 UConn men's soccer team, under head coach John Squires, posted a perfect 11-0 record and was named the national champion by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

The team beat such schools and teams as Yale, Tufts, UMass, MIT and Fort Devens – but had to wait until February of 1949 before it was officially voted the national champion.

Stuart Johnson and Merritt Baldwin were both All-American performers that year.





Conference Tournament Championships





n November of 2007, UConn recorded its seventh BIG EAST Tournament title and its third tournament crown in four years.

With the title, head coach Ray Reid recorded his fourth BIG EAST Tournament victory in 10 seasons with the Huskies.

The Huskies went 30-18-5 in 28 years competing in the Big East Tournament. In the first four seasons as a member of the American Athletic Conference, UConn has gone 5-1-3 in tournament play.



The University of Connecticut men's soccer team has won 12 Big East Conference regular season titles and one American Athletic Conference regular season crown as head coach Ray Reid has led the Huskies to nine of these 13 championships.

In 2014, the team earned its first-ever American Athletic Conference crown with a 1-0 win over USF.


In 2000, the Huskies won the BIG EAST regular season crown before being eliminated early in the postseason conference tournament by a 3-2 overtime loss to Seton Hall.

Despite the loss, the Huskies won their last five games of the season to win the NCAA Championship title. During that postseason run, UConn outscored its opponents, 10-1.

JONATHAN THE HUSKY MASCOT

The official mascot of the University of Connecticut is a Siberian Husky dog named Jonathan. The first Husky dog came to the Storrs campus in Dec. 1934 and the puppy was named for Jonathan Trumbull, $Governor\ of\ Connecticut\ during\ the\ Revolutionary\ War.$

Jonathan I's pedigree was traced back to include a great-grandfather, who traveled to the North Pole with Admiral E. Byrd in 1909. Jonathan III was with Admiral Byrd when he undertook "Operation High Jump" to the Antarctic in 1946-47.

A costumed mascot, an all-white Siberian Husky, gained popularity over the past several decades and through national television exposure has become "in demand" throughout the state and region, representing his University.

SCHOOL COLORS

The official colors of the University of Connecticut are National Flag Blue and White. To be specific, the blue is listed as PMS 289, a deep shade of navy.


<u>"UCONN HUSKY" FIGHT SONG</u>
"UConn Husky" is the fight song of the school. It was written in the mid-1930's by Herb France, who was UConn's Director of Music until the mid-1950's. The song is widely known for its playing at different sporting events, but got "out of this world" attention in October 1989 when it was played aboard NASA's Space Shuttle to wake up the shuttle astronauts. Among those astronauts on the mission was Franklin Chang-Diaz, a 1973 UConn graduate.

THE NCAA'S MOST POPULAR PROGRAM

D uring the 2007 season, over 58,000 fans traveled to Joseph J. Morrone Stadium to cheer the Huskies to the BIG EAST regular season and tournament championships.

In fact, UConn fans made up four crowds in the Top 10 attendance figures in modern Joseph J. Morrone Stadium history, including the new record number. Some 5,495 people crowded into the stadium to watch UConn and Virginia Tech square off in the NCAA Quarterfinals.

In Soccer America's release of biggest crowds for the 2007 regular season, UConn appears three times, more than any other program.

IN RECENT MEMORY...

- >> UConn led the country in attendance in 2007 with 58,392 fans and again in 2008 with 39,138. In 2009, UConn was second in average attendance (3,037), while in 2010, the Huskies were third in the country as they averaged 3,126 fans per contest.
- >> UConn has averaged over 3,000 fans per game at Morrone Stadium since 2007.
- >> In 2011, UConn was ranked second in the nation as the Huskies welcomed 50,402 fans to Morrone Stadium.
- >>In 2012, the Huskies averaged over 4100 fans per game at Morrone, with a season total of 59,192.
- >> In 2015, UConn finished second in the nation in average fan attedance per match (3,504).
- >> In 2017, the Huskies were ranked first in all of Division I in total attendance (42,029) and average attendance (3,502). UConn earned the top attendence spot again in 2018 with an average attendance of 3,213 and total attendance of 38,555 fans.



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Media Coverage

he University of Connecticut men's soccer program continues to rank in a class by itself when the issue of media coverage arises. The Connecticut soccer program boasts the largest media following (print and electronic) of any collegiate soccer program in the American Athletic Conference, Northeast region and one of the largest in the entire nation.

Connecticut's home games often attract several daily newspapers, radio and television stations to report on the Huskies.

In addition to appearances on Fox Soccer, UConn soccer has appeared on ESPNU, CSTV, SNY, Cox Sports and the American Digital Network in the last several seasons.

In fact, the Connecticut soccer program was a pioneer in the development of college soccer on television, both nationally and regionally.

Connecticut soccer has a long history of television exposure as the Huskies have appeared on ESPN 20 times, including ESPN's live coverage of Connecticut's 2-1 overtime victory against Alabama A&M for the 1981 NCAA National Championship and UConn's 2-0 win versus Creighton to capture the 2000 NCAA National Championship

On ESPN, Connecticut has faced top national opponents such as St. Louis, UCLA, San Francisco, Virginia and North

JOHN TUITE: WHUS RADIO

John Tuite enters his 37th year as the "Voice of Connecticut Soccer" on WHUS-FM Radio (91.7 FM).

Tuite has accompanied the Husky soccer team on every major intersectional trip since 1983. In addition to his duties at WHUS, Tuite is a news and sports reporter for WILI-AM and I-98 FM Radio in nearby Willimantic, Conn.



Tuite began working at WHUS in 1982, and became a full-time play-by-play announcer in 1983.

The Storrs, Conn., native has been honored on several occasions by the Connecticut Associated Press for outstanding sports play-by-play. In 1993, Tuite received the New England Collegiate Soccer Association "Media Award". He also was honored by the Associated Press for his broadcast of the 1984 NCAA National Tournament regional match between UConn and Harvard and is a past recipient of the UConn Friends of Soccer "Recognition Award".

The fall of 2019 marks the 48th consecutive year that WHUS-Radio, 91.7 FM in Storrs, Conn., will broadcast University of Connecticut soccer. Since this unique tradition of live intercollegiate soccer broadcasts was begun, WHUS-Radio has carried Husky soccer games home and away, providing the soccer program the most extensive radio coverage of any NCAA soccer team in the nation.

The WHUS signal carries 60 miles from Storrs, and its broadcasts of Connecticut soccer can be heard in Central Massachusetts, Vermont, Long Island and Rhode Island. It can also be found live via the Internet at www.whus.org.
