## NO. 3 BADGERS HEAD TO MILWAUKEE FOR THE BIG DANCE

■ Making its 22nd appearance in the last 23 NCAA tournaments, No. 3 seed Wisconsin will take on No. 14 Colgate on Friday at Fiserv Forum in Milwaukee. Tip is set for 8:50 p.m. (CT) on TBS.

- The Badgers earned their highest seed since 2015 and have been a No. 3 seed once previously, reaching the 2008 Sweet 16.


## FAST BREAK FACTS

- BIG DANCE REGULARS: Wisconsin is 1 of 5 schools in the nation that can say it has played in at least 22 of the last 23 NCAA tournaments, joined by only Kansas, Duke, Michigan State and Gonzaga (more on Page 2).

■ OPENING STATEMENTS: The Badgers have won 11 of their last 13 opening-round NCAA tournament games, holding teams to 57.7 points per game in those initial tourney games.
■ SWEET SUCCESS: Wisconsin has advanced to the Sweet 16 or better in 6 of the last 10 NCAA tournaments. Only Kentucky (7) has made more second weekend appearances over the decade.
■ BIG TEN CHAMPS: Wisconsin clinched a share of the Big Ten title, marking UW's 2nd league championship in 3 seasons and the 20th title in school history.

- With 2 Big Ten championships during his tenure, Greg Gard joins Tom Izzo (10) and Matt Painter (2) as the only active coaches with multiple Big Ten titles.
- Wisconsin has won 6 Big Ten regular season titles since 2000, trailing only MSU (8).

■ COACH OF THE YEAR GARD: 2022 Big Ten Coach of the Year and strong candidate for Naismith National Coach of the Year, Greg Gard has led Wisconsin to 5 of 6 NCAA tournaments during his tenure. As 2020 Big Ten champions, the Badgers also would have participated in the cancelled tournament that year.

■ B1G'S BEST: In addition to Gard's Coach of the Year award, sophomore Johnny Davis was named consensus Big Ten Player of the Year.

- A first-team All-American by the AP and The Sporting News, Davis leads the Badgers averaging 19.7 ppg and 8.2 rpg . He is also second on the team with 2.2 assists per game and ranks 3rd in blocks and steals (Page 6).
- Davis leads the nation in scoring vs. Top 25 teams ( $24.1 \mathrm{ppg} \& 8.5 \mathrm{rpg}$ ), and leads all major conf. players with 21.7 ppg away from home.
- Wisconsin totaled 24 regular-season wins for just the 5th time in program history. The


2022 Big Ten champion Wisconsin has 12 wins over teams in the NCAA Tournament field, tied for the most in the country. Badgers also won 15 Big Ten games for just the 3rd time in program history.

- 9/16 - UW's 9 Quad 1 wins ranks 5th in the NCAA and its 16 Quad 1 \& 2 wins trails only Baylor, Kansas and Villanova.
- 12 - Wisconsin is $12-3$ away from home this year, including 9-2 in true road games, leading the Big Ten in wins in both categories.

■ The Badgers are 15-3 in games decided by 6 or fewer points - the most "close" wins in D-I.

- Wisconsin leads the NCAA averaging just 8.5 turnovers per game.
■ Wisconsin is averaging 70.7 ppg , which would be the team's highest mark since 2016-17.
- The Badgers are playing at their fastest pace in over 20 years. (more on Page 8)

■ A second-team All-Big Ten pick, Brad Davison has played in 100 wins at Wisconsin and is having the best season of his career, ranking 17 th in the B1G at 14.5 ppg . He is averaging 2.5 3FGs per game shooting 34.8\% (Page 8).

- Davison is 1 of just 4 players in Wisconsin history to accumulate 1,500 points, 500 rebounds and 300 assists.
- Inlcuding 19 points and 5 steals vs. \#8 Purdue (3/1), Tyler Wahl averaged 12.4 ppg and 6.3 rpg in B1G play, shooting a team-high 54\% FG.
- Named to Seth Davis's "All-Glue Team," Wahl has 12 steals in UW's last 3 games.
- Including his game-winning 3-pointer vs. Purdue, Chucky Hepburn is averaging 10.1 ppg over his last 9 games. He leads all B1G freshman with 2.3 apg and a 1.9 A/TO ratio.

■ Steven Crowl has made a big jump, averaging 9.1 ppg and 4.5 rpg . Last season, he had a total of 8 points and 9 boards (Page 8).

## UW IN THE NCAA TOURNEY

UW is making its 26th appearance in the NCAA tournament. The Badgers are 39-24 (.619) alltime in "The Big Dance," advancing to 4 Final Fours and winning the 1941 NCAA title.

- Wisconsin is 1 of 5 schools to participate in 22 of last 23 NCAA tournaments, joining Kansas, Duke, Michigan State and Gonzaga.

- That stretch includes a run of 19 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances for Wisconsin (1999-2017), which ranks as the 6th-longest streak in NCAA history.
- The only streaks longer than Wisconsin are Kansas (32, active), North Carolina (27, 197501), Duke (24, 1996-19), Michigan State (24, active), Gonzaga (23, active).

■ Since 2002, the Badgers have gone 15-3 in opening round
 NCAA tourney games. Wisconsin's only 3 firstround losses came in 2006, 2013 and 2018.

- Under head coach Greg Gard, UW is 3-1 in opening round NCAA games, including last season's 85-62 win over North Carolina.
- The Badgers have reached the Sweet 16 or better in 4 of the last 7 NCAA tournaments. Only Gonzaga (6), Kentucky (5) and Michigan (5) have gone more frequently.
- Wisconsin has also been to the Sweet 16 or better in 6 of the last 10 NCAA tournaments. Only Kentucky (7) has gone more frequently in that span. Duke, Kansas, North Carolina, Gonzaga and Michigan are the only other schools with 6 Sweet 16s since 2011.
- Wisconsin has won 14 NCAA tournament games since 2014, trailing only Michigan (16) for the most among Big Ten teams and 7thhighest total in the nation.
- Since 2000, UW has won a total of 34 NCAA tournament games, the 2nd-highest total in the B1G and 8th-highest mark in the NCAA.

UW has won 18 NCAA tourney games over the last 10 tournaments, which ranks 8th in the nation. Only Kentucky (28), Kansas (22), Gonzaga (24), North Carolina (24), Michigan (22), Duke (20) and Florida (19) have more.


Wisconsin has reached the Sweet 16 in 6 of the last 10 NCAA tournaments, trailing only Kentucky for most in the nation. The Badgers have made the NCAA tournament's second weekend in 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

31 NCAA tournament games in 21 seasons with Greg Gard on staff. In the 63 years of the NCAA tourney prior to Gard's arrival in 2001-02, the Badgers won a total of 9 tourney games.


During Greg Gard's tenure as head coach, UW has been selected for 5 of the 6 NCAA tournaments. Michigan (6), Michigan St. (6), Purdue (6) are the only other B1G teams with 5+ bids since 2016.

■ The Badgers earned a No. 3 seed in the Midwest Region, the team's highest since being a No. 1 seed in 2015.

- UW has been a No. 3 seed on one other occasion, reaching the 2008 Sweet 16 from that spot. That season, the Badgers defeated No. 14 Cal State Fullerton and No. 11 Kansas State before falling to No. 10 Davidson.
- This marks the 8th time the Badgers have been a top -4 seed in the last 15 NCAA tournaments.
■ Wisconsin is 25-10 all-time against lower seeded teams. That includes a record of 9-0 against teams seeded 13th or lower.
- This marks UW's first appearance in a Midwest Region since 2008. Overall, the Badgers have been placed in the Midwest Region 3 times, reaching the 2005 Sweet 16 in Minneapolis, the 2nd Round in 2007 and the 2008 Sweet 16 in Detroit.
■ The Badgers are 12-6 (.667) against the 2022 NCAA Tournament field. Wisconsin's 12 wins is tied with Purdue for the most in the nation.



## WISCONSIN IN MILWAUKEE

- Wisconsin has played 4 previous NCAA tournament games in Milwaukee, going 3-1 at the Bradley Center in 2004 and 2014.


## ■ 2004: No. 6 seed

- Wisconsin defeated No. 11 Richmond, 76-64, in the opening round. The Badgers trailed 42-29 with less than 14 minutes left before coming back to win. "Tremendous job by the fans," Devin Harris sais. "They helped us through it all the way. I'm glad we came here because I don't know if we'd have done it anywhere else."
- UW would then lost to No. 3 Pittsburgh, 59-55, in the second round.


## - 2014: No. 2 seed

- Wisconsin began their road to the Final Four by dispatching No. 15 American, 75-35, in the opener.
- The Badger then knocked off No. 7 Oregon, 85-77, in round two. In that contest, the Badgers overcame a 12-point halftime deficit to win. Sam Dekker would later say, "That was the loudest crowd I've ever played in front of, hands down."
- The Badgers went 12-8 all-time at the Bradley Center and are 0-2 at Fiserv Forum, falling to Marquette in 2018 and 2020.

- Since 2011, the Badgers have also had 4 players finish among the top 10 of the voting for the Heisman Trophy: Montee Ball (2011), Russell Wilson (2011), Melvin Gordon (2014) and Jonathan Taylor (2019).
- Wisconsin, Oklahoma and Ohio State are the only schools in the country that can claim at least 4 different Wooden All-Americans and 4 different Heisman Trophy top-10 finishers over the last 20 years.

## WISCONSIN WINS B1G AWARDS

- Big Ten champion Wisconsin headlined the conference's postseason honors with Greg Gard winning B1G Coach of the Year and Johnny Davis named B1G Player of the Year.
- Gard earned Big Ten Coach of the Year for the second time in the last three seasons. He is just the second UW coach to win the award, joining four-time winner Bo Ryan.
- Davis is the 4th Badger to be named Big Ten Player of the Year, joining Frank Kaminsky (2015), Alando Tucker (2007) and Devin Harris (2004).
- Since 2002, Wisconsin has had 11 different players earn a total of 17 first-team All-Big Ten selections - the most in the conference. Purdue and Ohio State are second with 15.

■ In addition, Brad Davison earned secondteam All-Big Ten honors, Chucky Hepburn earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team and Tyler Wahl was awarded All-Big Ten honorable mention.

## HISTORY VS. COLGATE

- Wisconsin and Colgate have met just once before, with the Badgers claiming a 68-41 home win on Nov. 16, 2011.
- UW is 6-0 all-time against current members of the Patriot League, including 2 NCAA tourney wins.
- The Badgers defeated No. 14th Bucknell, 71-62, in the second round of the 2005 Tournament and No. 15 American, 75-35, in the opening round of the 2014 Tournament in Milwaukee.
- Earlier this season, the Wisconsin volleyball team opened the 2021 NCAA Tournament with a 3-0 win over Colgate en route to winning the volleyball national championship.
- Wisconsin's men's hockey team defeated Colgate, $7-3$, in the 1990 NCAA Championship Game.

- The Badgers won 24 regular season games for just the 5th time in program history.

## GOING ON THE OFFENSIVE

"This is a different Badgers team...This isn't your knockdown, drag-out, rough it up Badgers. They can do that too, but they can also outscore you." - Stephen Bardo, FOX Sports

■ The Badgers are averaging 70.7 ppg , which would be the team's 2nd-highest mark under Gard and the most since averaging 72.4 ppg during the 2016-17 season

- According to KenPom.com, the Badgers have an adjusted offensive tempo of 66.5 possessions per game, which would be the team's fastest mark since he began tracking the stat in the 2001-02 season.
- Dating back to 2002, UW's second-fastest team was the 2005-06 squad that had an adjusted tempo of 65.2.
- To put it another way, 21.7\% of UW's initial shot attempts (excluding FGAs off O-Reb.) have come in the first 10 seconds of the shot clock, the team's highest in at least 10 years.


## ROAD WARRIORS

Wisconsin is 12-3 away from home, including an impressive 9-2 mark in true road games.

- UW owns the most true road wins (9) and most wins away from home (12) among all Big Ten teams.
- UW's 9 true road wins trails only Miami (10) and Villanova (10) among major conference teams. Arizona and USC also have 9 road wins.
- UW's 12 road/neutral wins leads the Big Ten and trails only Arizona (14), Villanova (14), Duke (13), Miami (13) and USC (13) among major conference teams
- Wisconsin won games at Purdue, at Michigan State and at Indiana in the same season for the first time in school history.
- The Badgers are the first team to win at Mackey Arena, Breslin Center and Assembly Hall in the same season since Ohio State in 2010.
- UW also earned a pivotal win at Rutgers.

■ Under Greg Gard, the Badgers own a 41-36 (.532) record on the road overall, including 37-29 (.561) in Big Ten games.

- In fact, no Big Ten team has a better league road record than Wisconsin since 2016.

## DAVISON BECOMING A LEGEND

Senior Brad Davison is back for a 5th season and enjoying the best season of a career that is shaping up to be one of the best in Wisconsin Basketball history.

■ Davison is 1 of just 4 players in Wisconsin history to accumulate 1,500 points, 500 rebounds and 300 assists, joining Michael Finley, Nigel Hayes and Ethan Happ.

■ With five 3 -pointers at Nebraska (1/27), Davison became Wisconsin's all-time 3-point leader. Davison now has 299 3FGs, surpassing Bronson Koenig (270) on the all-time chart.

- A Second-Team All-Big Ten honoree this year, Davison is enjoying the finest offensive season of his career, ranked 2nd on UW and 17th in the Big Ten avg 14.5 ppg.
- He leads UW with a 2.3 assist-to-turnover ratio, Davison has 61 assists to 26 turnovers.

■ Davison is 5th in the Big Ten averaging 2.5 triples per game, shooting 34.8\% 3FG (77-221).

- Davison has recorded nine 20-point games this season, most recently scoring 23 points vs. Michigan State (3/11). It's just the latest in a career full of signature performances:

Davis is averaging 8.2 rebounds per game.
Since 2005, only 3 major conference players who were listed as guards have averaged at least 20.0 ppg and 8.0 rpg: Wooden Award winners Kevin Durant (2007) and Evan Turner (2010) as well as Stanford's Landry Fields (2010).


Davis leads the nation in scoring against Top-25 opponents, averaging 24.1 ppg and 8.5 rpg in 8 games vs. ranked teams (min. 3 games).
He has scored at least 20 points in 6 of the 8 games.


Davis ranked 4th in the Big Ten in scoring (19.9 ppg) and 3rd in rebounding (8.9 rpg) during conference play.

- Overall, Davis ranks 3rd in the Big Ten this season averaging 19.7 points per game.
- Davis is 9th in the Big Ten, shooting 78.3\% from the FT line (141-for-180). He is 2nd in the conference averaging 4.9 made $\mathrm{FTs} / \mathrm{gm}$.

## BATTLE-BACK BADGERS

"Hopefully nobody left early. If they did, that will teach them not to give up on this team."

Those were the words from head coach Greg
Gard after the Badgers' historic 22-point comeback win vs. Indiana (12/8). Wisconsin has shown an impressive resiliency all season long.

■ UW has won 4 games when trailing by double digits this season, including 3 second-half comebacks of $10+$ points.

- UW has 3 second-half, double-digit comebacks for the first time in the same season since 1999-00. That year, UW came back from 15 (vs. ILL), 13 (at IOWA) and 12 points (vs. IND).

■ Hosting Indiana (12/8), Wisconsin was down by as many as 22 points, including 18 in the second half before pulling out a 64-59 win.

- UW's 22-pt comeback matched the largest in school history. UW also erased a 22 -point deficit in an 82-81 OT win vs. Ohio State in 1976.
- In that game, the Badgers also equaled the team's greatest 2nd-half comeback (18).
- UW trailed Nicholls by 12 points with 18:40 left in the 2nd half before winning, 71-68.
- In the Maui Invitational championship game, the Badgers trailed Saint Mary's by 10 (37-27) with $\sim 16: 00$ left before claiming a 61-55 win.
- Wisconsin trailed Texas A\&M by 16 (26-10) in the first half, before putting together a 51-9 run to storm back for a 69-58 win.


## WALL-TO-WAHL PLAYER

"Tyler Wahl is one of the best defenders in the country. The box score doesn't truly indicate his value." - Jay Bilas, ESPN

- Wahl had ESPN's Jay Bilas singing his praises after an All-Tournament Team performance during the Maui Invitational in Las Vegas.
- In 3 games, Wahl averaged 11.0 ppg (18 pts and 4 blk in championship game), plus 5.3 rpg .

■ More recently, Wahl has found his scoring stride with double figures 16 of his last 20.

- That includes a career-high 23 points vs. Rutgers (2/12). Wahl shot 9 -for-14 from the
floor, including 1-1 3FG, 4-5 FT. He also tallied 3 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals.
- Wahl also had 20-point outings at Maryland (21 pts) and vs. \#16 Ohio State (20 pts), which marked the first 20-pt games of his career.
- Wahl scored the game-winning basket with 31sec left to beat Penn State, 51-49, on Feb. 5.
- Wahl led UW in scoring vs. \#8 Purdue (3/1), finishing with 19 points ( $8-14 \mathrm{FG}$ ) and 5 steals.

■ He did not play vs. Michigan St (1/21) - injury
■ On the year, Wahl ranks 3rd on the team in scoring (11.4 ppg) and 2nd in rebounding (5.7 rpg). He leads the team shooting 52.5\% FG.

- Wahl is tied for the team lead in both blocks (24) and steals (35).

Wisconsin is off to its best start in years and has done so by winning in a variety of ways

- Wire-to-wire: Never trailed vs. Ohio State or Houston and led for the final 38:05 vs. Iowa.

■ Rally from behind: Wisconsin matched its largest comeback in school history by erasing a 22-point deficit vs. Indiana, plus a 16-pt hole vs. Texas A\&M, 12-pt deficit vs. Nicholls, 10-pt deficit against Saint Mary's and 7-pt secondhalf deficits at Purdue and Indiana.

- Win big: Double-digit wins over Ohio State (10), Marquette (13) and Texas A\&M (11).

■ Win close: $15-3$ in games decided by 6 or fewer points.

- Win with offense: UW scored over 80 in wins against Marquette, lowa and Northwestern an 78 points vs. OSU.

■ Win with defense: Wisconsin has held 7 teams at or below 60 points, including Indiana, Penn State, Saint Mary's and Texas A\&M.

## CHUCKY AT THE POINT

■ An Big Ten All-Freshman Team honoree, point guard Chucky Hepburn has started every game for the Badgers this season.

- Hepburn is averaging 8.2 ppg while leading the team in assists (72) and steals (35).
- Hepburn is trying to become just the 5th true freshman at UW to average 8.0 ppg in the last 25 years (more Page 8).

■ Hepburn's heroics lifted Wisconsin past \#8 Purdue on March 1, hitting a go-ahead 3-pointer with 1.5 seconds left. He finished with a career-high 17 pts (4-6 3FG).

- He has scored double figures 12 times this season and UW is 11-1 in those games.
- In earlier road wins at \#17 Michigan State and at Indiana, Hepburn averaged 9.5 ppg with 6 assists and zero turnovers in 67 minutes
- Over the last 9 games, Hepburn has just 8 turnovers in 307 minutes played.

■ Hepburn is maintaining a 1.9 assist-to-turnover ratio with 72 dimes and 37 turnovers.

■ Since 2010, Hepburn trails only Josh Gasser for the best assist-to-turnover ratio by a Badger in his freshman season.

## CROWL COMING ON

Playing in 12 games and a total of 39 minutes last season, sophomore forward Steven Crowl has started all 31 games this season, continuing to develop and grow his game with experience.

- Over the last 8 games, Crowl is averaging 9.5 points per game shooting $56.4 \%$ from the floor and 8-for-10 FT.
- Crowl has reached double-figure scoring in 7 of the last 15 games for Wisconsin. He's scored 9+ points in 13 of the last 18 games.
- Wisconsin is 12-1 in games this season when Crowl scores in double figures.

■ Crowl ranks 2nd for UW shooting 50.5\% FG. In Big Ten play, that number climbed to $53.1 \%$ FG (69-130), including 32.6\% 3FG.

- He is shooting $80.0 \%$ (36-45) at the free throw line, including 87.0\% in Big Ten play.

■ Crowl led UW in scoring at Minnesota (2/23) with 20 points - 1 short of his career high shooting 7 -for-9 FG and 5-6 FT, plus 7 boards.

■ Crowl scored a season-high 21 points vs. Illinois State (12/29), shooting 7-for-8 FG (2-2 $3 F G)$. He also grabbed 7 rebounds that game.

## MAUI INVITATIONAL CHAMPS

Wisconsin claimed its first-ever Maui Invitational championship last week in Las Vegas. UW became the first Big Ten school to win the Maui Invitational since Illinois in 2012.

■ Johnny Davis was named tournament MVP after averaging 23.7 ppg and 6.7 rpg .

■ Tyler Wahl averaged 11.0 ppg and 5.3 rpg to earn All-Tournament honors.

## WISCONSIN 69, TEXAS A\&M 58

■ Trailing by as many as 16 in the first half, UW used two big runs of 15-1 and 15-3 to take the lead never look back in the win.

■ Davis tallied a career-high 20 points and 9 rebounds, with Davison adding 19 points (6-6 FT) and 7 rebounds.

## WISCONSIN 65, \#12 HOUSTON 63

■ Wisconsin jumped to a 13-0 lead and shot a season-high 49.6\% FG ( $57.1 \%$ in 1 H ). The Badgers turned it over just 9 times. Houston entered averaging 17.0 forced TOs per game.

■ UW held Houston to just 20 first-half points.
■ Davis scored a then-career-high 30 points, while Davison and Wahl each added 9 points.

WISCONSIN 61, SAINT MARY'S 55
■ UW erased a 10-point second-half deficit (3727 with 15:58 left).

- Davis had 20 points and 7 rebounds, while Tyler Wahl added a career-high 18 points, 5 rebounds and 4 blocks.


## WINNING AT WISCONSIN

With a record of 24-7, the Badgers have reached the 20-win milestone yet again. Since 2003, Wisconsin has won at least 20 games in 17 of 20 seasons, including a school-record 36 wins in 2014-15.

Greg Gard has five 20-win seasons on his ledger with a high of 27 wins in 2016-17, a mark that ranks 5th in UW history.

## 2022 BIG TEN COACH OF THE YEAR

n jn just his seventh year as a head coach, Greg Gard has already put himself in the conversation of the nation's top coaches. A two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year and the 2016 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year, Gard has led Wisconsin to a pair of Big Ten regular-season championships and qualified for six NCAA tournaments in seven years.

A coaching veteran of more than 30 years, Gard earned 2022 Big Ten Coach of the Year after helping Wisconsin win a share of the conference championship. That marked the team's second Big Ten title in the last three seasons, also winning it in 2020.

Wisconsin has enjoyed incredible postseason success on Gard's watch also, reaching the NCAA tourna ment in five of his first six seasons (Big Ten automatic qualifier status in canceled 2020 Big Dance, due to COVID pandemic).

Gard's postseason ledger includes a pair of Sweet 16 appearances in each of his first two seasons at the helm. In fact, Gard is just the third coach in the last 20 years to pilot his team to the Sweet 16 in each of his first two seasons, joining UCLA's Steve Lavin (199697) and Gonzaga's Mark Few (2000-01).

Entering the 2021-22 season, Gard has posted a record of 119-70, the second-fastest ( 157 games) Wisconsin coach to 100 overall wins in the NCAA tournament era. He has also guided UW to a 69-45 record in the Big Ten. His .605 conference win percentage ranked eighth among B1G coaches in the last 40 years.

After initially taking over on an interim basis midway through the 2015-16 season, Gard would go on to win the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award that season and was officially named head coach of the Badgers on March 7, 2016.

Gard's leadership during the 2019-20 season might have been his best. After opening 5-5 overall and 5-5 in the Big Ten, Wisconsin won nine of its last 10 games, including its final eight to win a share of the 2020 conference championship and claim the No. 1 seed for the later canceled Big Ten tournament.

In his inaugural season as head coach, Gard led the

Badgers to the 2016 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16, becoming just the second-ever first-year coach to win the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award. He followed that up by leading UW to the fifth-highest single-season win total in school history (27-10) and making a second-consecutive visit to the Sweet 16, including a signature win in the NCAA tournament, knocking off the nation's No. 1 team Villanova.

In 2018-19, Gard piloted the Badgers back to the Big Dance, posting a 23-11 overall record and 14-6 in the Big Ten. UW won 14 conference games for just the 3rd time in school history

During his tenure as head coach, Gard has helped a trio of players reach first-team All-Big Ten status: Nigel Hayes (2016), third-team All-American Ethan Happ (2017, 2018 and 2019) and first-team All-American Johnny Davis (2022).

Gard served as an assistant at Wisconsin for 14 -plus seasons, serving as the Badgers' recruiting coordinator in addition to constructing the team schedules and serving as director of the Badger Boys Basketball Camps.

Gard helped guide the Badgers to back-to-back Final Fours in 2014 and 2015, and in 2015 UW reached its first national championship game since 1941.

In fact, Gard has been on the bench for each of the top 13 winningest seasons at Wisconsin.

Prior to coming to Wisconsin in 2001, Gard spent the previous two seasons as Ryan's assistant at UW-Milwaukee. Previously, Gard served as an assistant coach to Ryan at UW-Platteville from 199399. During Gard's years on the Pioneer staff, UWP compiled a 161-13 (.925) record and won three NCAA Division III titles, five straight WIAC championships and appeared in six consecutive NCAA tournaments.

Gard is a 1995 graduate of UW-Platteville with a degree in physical and health education. He received a master's degree in counselor education from Platteville in 2007. Gard and his wife, Michelle, have two daughters, Mackenzie and Peyton, and a son, Isaac.

## GET TO KNOW JAHCOBI

Jahcobi Neath begins his first season with the Badgers after transferring from Wake Forest. The Toronto, Ontario native played the last two seasons for the Demon Deacons and had an immediate impact as a true freshman in 201920. Neath played in 30 games and started five, averaging 5.3 points and 2.2 assists per game his first season, shooting 42.2 percent from the floor, including 48 percent from 3-point range. Last season as a sophomore, Neath played in 20 games for Wake Forest and made four starts. He averaged 3.8 points and 1.7 assists in 15.8 minutes per game. Neath represented Canada at the U18 and U19 levels, playing internationally at the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup. ## GET TO KNOW TYLER

Junior forward Tyler Wahl has had an immediate impact at Wisconsin since stepping onto campus. Having played in over 90 career games as a Badger, the Lakeville, Minnesota native played in all 31 games for the Badgers last season (18 starts). Averaging 5.2 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.0 steals per game last year, one of Wahl's best games came when he led the Badgers in scoring with 14 points, plus a team-high 6 rebounds and 2 assists in vs. Northwestern. ## GET TO KNOW BEN

A four-star recruit by ESPN, 247Sports and Rivals, sophomore forward Ben Carlson appeared in seven games last season before an injury sidelined him for the rest of the year. The Woodbury, Minnesota native scored 13 points in last year's season opener. A finalist for Minnesota Mr. Basketball as a high school senior, Carlson went down as one of the most decorated players in East Ridge High Scahool history. The 6-foot-9 forward set school records for career points $(2,004)$, rebounds $(1,083)$ and blocked shots (145). Carlson also became the first player in program history to be nominated to the McDonalds All-American Game in 2020. His senior season, Carlson averaged 24.3 points and 11.7 rebounds per game while leading the Raptors to a 20-7 record and a conference title. As a junior, he led East Ridge to the Minnesota Class AA state tournament while averaging a double-double (16 $\mathrm{ppg}, 11.3 \mathrm{rpg}$ ). Off the court, Carlson was a member of National Honors Society.

## GET TO KNOW STEVEN

Steven Crowl enters his second season in the Wisconsin program after appearing in 12 games last year as a true freshman. The 7-foot forward from Eagan, Minnesota scored his first points as a Badger in UW's season opener against Eastern Illinois, while also grabbing his first career rebound. In the first round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament, Crowl played 3 minutes and grabbed 2 rebounds against North Carolina to help UW to an 85-62 win. A three-star recruit by 247 Sports and Rivals, Crowl had a standout senior season at Eastview High School where he was a finalist for Minnesota Mr. Basketball finalist. One of the most decorated players in Eastview history, Crowl finished his prep career as the school's all-time leading scorer (1,747 pts), rebounder ( 832 reb) and shot blocker (103 blk). The 6 -foot-9 forward also set Eastview school records for career field-goal percentage ( $59 \% \mathrm{FG}$ ), rebounds in a season (332), rebounds in a game (19) and single-game field-goal percentage ( $90 \%$ FG). As a senior, he averaged 26.7 points and 12 rebounds per game, while also leading his team in assists (4.3 per contest). Crowl played travel basketball for D1 Minnesota, the same program as current Badger teammate Tyler Wahl.

Chucky Hepburn begins his first season as a Badger in 2021-22. The 6-foot-2 point guard from Omaha, Nebraska was a four-star recruit by ESPN and ranked as the No. 20 point guard in the nation. The 2020 Nebraska Gatorade Player of the Year, Hepburn averaged over 15 points, eight assists and five rebounds per game as a senior at Bellevue West. Englund scored again minutes later, and John Kotz added a pair of free throws to put Wisconsin up 51-46 with just over a minute remaining. Dartmouth scored the game's final four points, including a desperation field goal from near half-court as the final gun sounded. Englund (18) and Kotz (15) led the Badgers in scoring.

March 19, 1994 • Ogden, Utah • Dee Events Center $(12,126)$ Big Eight Player of the Year Melvin Booker poured in a career-high 35 points, hitting 11-of-14 field goal tries, 6-of-8 3-point attempts and all seven FTs, to lead top-seeded and fifth-ranked Missouri to a second-round victory in the NCAA West Regional.
The Tigers, who shot under 41 percent from the field the previous four games, shot a season-high .680 against Wisconsin, including a sizzling .708 mark in the second half. Mizzou connected on 6-of-6 3-point tries in the second half and was 12 -of-19 from
beyond the arc for the game (.632). The Badgers were led by Michael Finley, who netted 36 points, and Tracy Webster, who tallied 27 points, seven assists and four steals. Webster tied the school records for 3 -pointers (7) and three-point attempts (13). Missouri jumped to a 26-13 lead and led 54-47 at halftime. The Badgers cut the gap to 67-63 at the 13:24 mark, but the Tigers responded with a 25-9 run to go up 92-72 with less than seven minutes left. The Badgers could get no closer than 10 points the rest of the way. The teams combined for an NCAA Tournament record 27 three-point field goals.

In his final game as a Badger, Kirk Penney scored 20 points (5-7 on 3 -pointers). Neither team led by more than seven points (UW 15-8 at the 11:19 mark of the first half and UK 62-55 with 11 seconds left).

In front of the largest crowd to ever witness a college basketball game, 79,444 , the fans at AT\&T Stadium were treated to one of the most entertaining national semifinals in history. It was a game-winning 3-pointer from Kentucky's Aaron Harrison that proved to be the difference as the Wildcats advanced with a thrilling 74-73 victory. Wisconsin did almost everything it needed to do to beat Kentucky, as UW held one of the country's most dominant offensive rebounding teams off of the glass, while shooting a Final Four record 95.0 percent (19-20) from the charity stripe. Bronson Koenig provided most of the entertainment in the first 20 minutes of action after point guard Traevon Jackson was charged with his second foul just six minutes into the first half. Coming off the bench, the freshman lit up Kentucky for 11 points in 16 minutes, as UW took a 40-36 halftime advantage into the locker room. After a Sam Dekker 3-pointer opened the second-half scoring, Kentucky went on a 15-0 run to build a 51-43 lead. UW would answer with a 10-2 run to tie the game and set up a thrilling finish. With the game tied at $72-72$ and 16 seconds left in regulation, Jackson was fouled and sent to the line for three free throw attempts, making 2-of-3. The Badgers' lone miss from the line gave Kentucky the hope it needed, as Harrison's deep 3-pointer clanged in with five seconds remaining. Jackson, who has earned a reputation for knocking down clutch game-winners, missed a jumper at the buzzer and the Badgers fell short in their quest for the school's first national title appearance since 1941.

Led by Sam Dekker's career- and game-high 23 points, the Badgers proved their grit, however, rallying in the final 10 minutes to hold off North Carolina, 79-72, and advance to the Elite Eight. Both teams shot 46 percent for the game, but UW improved to 58 percent in the second half and made 20 of 23 free throws to keep its hopes of a second straight Final Four berth alive. Zak Showalter came off the bench in the second half and scored six points that sparked a $19-7$ comeback run that helped UW regain a 65-60 lead with just over five minutes remaining. Marcus Paige hit consecutive 3-pointers that drew North Carolina within one with 54 seconds to go, but UW made all eight of its free throws -- four by Frank Kaminsky -- over the closing seconds to help UW stave off No. 4 seed North Carolina. Kaminsky added 19 points and eight rebounds in the win, while Nigel Hayes had 12 points and six rebounds.

March 28, 2015 • Los Angeles, Calif. • Staples Center $(19,067)$ On one of the biggest stages in college basketball, Sam Dekker had a second-half performance that will go down in Wisconsin basksetball lore. Despite trailing by three points at halftime, Dekker hit five of UW's 10 3-pointers in the second half -- a perfect 6-for-6 from the floor in the final 20 minutes -- on his way to a career-high of 27 points and helping UW secure its second-straight trip to the Final Four with an 85-78 win. Frank Kaminsky kept the Badgers in the game throughout, including a key stretch that fueled an offensive outburst from UW to start the second half. Kaminsky scored eight of UW's first 14 points out of the break and finished with a gamehigh 29 points. Arizona applied full-court pressure in the last four minutes, which helped the Wildcats twice draw the game to within five points in the last two and a half minutes. Dekker put his foot down, both times connecting on arcing 3-pointers that led top-seeded Wisconsin past No. 2 Arizona and onto the fourth Final Four in school history. UW hit 10 of 123 -pointers in the second half, connecting on a season-high 67 percent overall, and outscored UA 30-3 from long range. Dekker had five 3-pointers and was named West Regional Most Outstanding Player. A rematch of last year's West Regional Final, Wisconsin denied Arizona a Final Four berth for the second-straight year, having also beaten them by one point in overtime in Anaheim, California, a year ago when their seeds were reversed.

April 4, 2015 • Indianapolis • Lucas Oil Stadium $(72,238)$ Everyone remembered the heartbreaking loss Wisconsin suffered to Kentucky in the 2014 Final Four, especially the Badgers. It's not every day a team gets a second chance, but that's exactly what UW got when it found itself squaring off with the Wildcats in the 2015 Final Four. The opportunity would not go wasted. Wisconsin did what nobody else could, knocking off the undefeated Wildcats (38-1) in a 71-64 thriller behind 20 points and 11 rebounds from Frank Kaminsky and a clutch comeback down the stretch. Trailing by four after going six minutes without a basket, the Badgers responded with an 8-0 run to take a lead Kentucky would not overcome. The Wildcats led 60-56 with 6:37 left and didn't score again until there were 56 seconds left. By then, it was too late, as Sam Dekker added 16 points of his own, including six during UW's pivotal 8-0 run, and Bronson Koenig had 12 points to drive the Badgers in one of the program's most iconic victories. With the win, Wisconsin advanced to its first NCAA final since 1941.

The most prolific season in Wisconsin basketball history came to an unfortunate end, as Wisconsin fell in a 68-63 loss to Duke in the national championship game. Frank Kaminsky finished with 21 points and 11 rebounds, but "Frank The Tank" was unable to drive the Badgers any further on their magical NCAA tournament run. UW held a nine-point lead, 49-38, with 13:00 remaining but Duke would tie the game up at 54-54 with 7:00 left. Kaminsky hit a 3-pointer with 1:08 left that gave UW some late hope to pull within 66-61. Nigel Hayes, who finished with 13 points, then converted a dunk with 49 seconds left that got the Badgers within three. But Duke and its freshmen held on from there. Sam Dekker finished with 12 points and eight rebounds, but was unable to rely on his previously hot 3-point shot. Fouls also hurt in the second half. Wisconsin had just two fouls in the first
half, but 13 in the second - unusual for a team that led the nation in fewest fouls per game. Wisconsin ended its season with 36 wins, the most in program history.

UW had a chance to jump back in front on Bronson Koenig's drive to the rim through contact with 9 seconds left, but the shot rolled off the rim and V.J. After two relatively routine days, madness returned to the NCAA Tournament when Wisconsin bounced top-seeded Villanova from the brackets and the East region with a 65-62 win. The Badgers not only added another major upset to their resume, they stormed into the Sweet 16 for the fourth consecutive year. Nigel Hayes scored 19 points, dropping a layup in traffic with 11.4 seconds left, and Bronson Koenig shook off foul trouble and added 17 for the tournament-toughened Badgers. Senior Josh Hart scored 19 to lead the Wildcats, but the guard was bottled up and stripped by Wisconsin's Ethan Happ and Vitto Brown on a drive in the final seconds. Brown then split two free throws with 4 seconds left, but Villanova struggled to corral the rebound and then couldn't get off a final shot. When the horn sounded, Wisconsin's red-clad fans erupted in celebration and the Badgers stormed the court after taking down a No. 1 seed for the third time in four years. Wisconsin beat Arizona in 2014, Kentucky in 2015 and now can add Villanova to its list. Savvy seniors Koenig and Hayes made several key plays in the closing minutes as Wisconsin overcame a 57-50 deficit. Under head coach Greg Gard, UW improved to 39-1 when leading or tied with 5 minutes remaining, including a 24-1 record in such situations during the season.

 With 4 seconds left in overtime, Chris Chiozza took off, hoping to get to the hoop or find an open man. Instead, the Florida point guard stopped short right at the 3-point line and let fly with a shot that will go down in Gators' history. Chiozza's 3-pointer swished in at the buzzer in to give Florida an 84-83 victory against Wisconsin on Friday night in the first overtime game of this NCAA Tournament. Nigel Hayes had given the Badgers (27-10) a 2-point lead with 4 seconds left on two free throws. With no timeouts left, the Gators inbounded to Chiozza and he took care of the rest for Florida (27-8), setting off a celebration under the basket at Madison Square Garden. Zak Showalter was all set to be the star before Chiozza took it away. Showalter, a senior and former walk-on, forced overtime with a leaning 3-pointer off one leg with 2.1 seconds left in regulation as the Badgers wiped out a 12-point, second-half deficit in the last $4: 15$. The fourthseeded Gators will play South Carolina on Sunday in an all-Southeastern Conference regional final. Florida is in the Elite Eight for the first time since 2014, and for the first time with second-year coach Mike White - the former Mississippi guard who was on the losing end of one of the most famous game-winning shots in NCAA history. Eighth-seeded Wisconsin built a five-point lead in overtime, but with star guard Bronson Koenig hobbled by a leg issue the Badgers couldn't close out Florida. After Wisconsin's Khalil Iverson hit the front of the rim on a breakaway dunk that Florida's Canyon Barry got a piece of, Chiozza drove by the Badgers defense at the other end for a layup that tied it at 81 with 24 seconds left. The Badgers put it in Hayes' hands on their final possession. The senior who scored the winning bucket in Wisconsin's upset of defending champion Villanova, used a spin move to draw a foul going to the hoop. Making their fourth straight Sweet 16 appearance, it looked as if the experienced Badgers had once again found a way to survive and advance.
