

- 2. Meditate (meditatio) Read the passage again, thinking about the word or phrase that attracted you. Do you "hear" or "see" Christ in the this verse?
- 3. Pray (oratio) Respond in prayer with God, have a conversation with God about what he may be asking of you .
- 4. Contemplate (contemplatio) Rest in God's presence.
