Eucalyptus blakelyi

Common Name: 'Blakely's Red Gum'

Landscape value:

The blakely's Red Gum is commonly used as a paddock tree, providing shade and shelter to stock or as a street tree.

Like other eucalypts, the trunk sheds flake of smooth white bark revealing a variety of colour white, pink, and grey.

Red Gums are generally used for fencing, fuel, gum and honey.

Typical size: 11m x 8m

Growth rate: Moderate to fast

Habit: Evergreen, medium to large

spreading eucalypt

Foliage: Dull green or grey-green leaves. Juvenile leaves are ovate, adult leaves are shaped like a lance

Flowers: White, mainly summer, but also late spring. Heavy flowering may occur every 2-3 years, depending on season

Position: Full sun

Season of Interest: All season

Soil Type: Adaptable to most soils

Tolerances/cultivation: Tolerates frost, winter water logging and

drought.
