SHOOTING THE ALL-PISTOL STAGE

NEW YORK STATE WILD BUNCH CHAMPIONSHIP MUSTER @ FORT MISERY 2023

Tild Bunch is alive and well in the great Northeast! Muster @ Ft. Misery is in the books and what a shoot it was! With 68 shooters actually shooting the match, not only is it the largest state Wild Bunch match in SASS but it is larger than some Cowboy Action Shooting[™] state matches. We had the pleasure of having Serenity (SASS #64982), Canadian Wild Bunch Ambassador, and Legendary Lawman (SASS #73160), chairman of the Wild

Bunch ROC, join us all the way from Canada. We also had shooters from CT, ME, NH, NJ, PA, and VT. As for the weather, it was almost perfect. It did rain around lunch time on Saturday, but Sunday was absolutely beautiful.

The Circle K Regulators/Rough Riders put on one heck of a match and with 10 individual berms, the majority of the stages provided down range movement. The stages were fun yet challenging and as for specialty targets,

we got 'em! We had single bird poppers, double bird poppers, progressive plate racks, regular plate racks, a circular mover, and a straight line mover, as well as targets in different shapes and sizes (large 24" x 24" squares, buffalos, snakes and little 10" circles). Best of all, on the Town Stage you got to kick down the Boarding House door! We stole a stage from EOT that was all pistol and allowed you to make up misses. We decided to think outside the box

a little and also had a no pistol stage that was all rifle and shotgun! Everyone loved both stages so they will be back in some form next year! We try to have a mix of easy, moderate, and harder stages to appeal to everyone while still remaining true to the Wild Bunch concept. We accomplish this by using a mix of specialty targets, smaller/larger targets, close/far targets, and easy/challenging target sequences in our scenarios. (If you want to see what you are missing, check out our website, www.circlekregulators.com, for the stages and pics.) It really is the most fun you can have with your clothes on! You don't want to miss it. Just ask Cholula Mike (SASS #84771) who was hobbling around with

a cast/brace on his leg, yet still managed to pull off an impressive sixth place OVERALL finish out of 68 shooters! Now that's talent.

For Spirit of the Game awards we honored Violet Cassidy (SASS #23459) for stepping up and being our scorekeeper when we were left without one and for her hard work at registration each day. But we couldn't leave out our club President, Smokehouse Dan (SASS #12524) for all the hard work he does throughout the year and behind the scenes. As for Spirit of the Game, that went to Hawkeye Harry (SASS #91326), as he assisted his dad, Hondo Harry (SASS #55725) throughout each of the stages so Hondo could safely shoot the match. What a great father/son combo, but that's what this game is all about!

We are lucky enough to have two Boy Scout troops pick brass for us and have a delicious bake sale (just in case you hadn't made back your COVID-19 pounds). They use the money to send some of their scouts to camp and this year they made \$1,373 from brass picking and \$331 at their bake sale for a total of \$1,704!

The Circle K Regulators/Rough Riders hope you can make it to next year's Muster @ Ft. Misery, June 8 and 9, 2024!






SKINNY'S SOAPBOX

CAP AND BALL INFORMATION

A lot of Cowboy Action Shooters™ (including me) are getting interested in cap and ball revolvers. After all, they truly are the firearms frontiersman possessed for the majority of the period of western expansion.

Unfortunately, many of us have also discovered that many cap and balls (with the exception of most Ruger Old Armies) come out of the box needing some help. They either have to be sent to a qualified gunsmith like Goon's Gun Works for tuning — an option that will probably cost more than the revolver or we can try to work on them ourselves — which can be daunting.


One of the best resources I've found to help make the do-it-yourselfing a little less daunting is Robert Van Nuck's website, blackpowderguide.com. He is not a Cowboy Action Shooter™ nor a SASS member, but he does know his way around front-loading revolvers and loves to shoot them. If you've acquired one or are thinking about getting one, I strongly recommend his article, "Seven Things You MUST do With Your New Percussion Revolver." 
COMIC BOOK CORNER

frequent topic on the SASS Wire and Facebook pages related to Cowboy Action Shooting™ is how do we attract new and younger shooters. Like all other clubs, The Johnson Creek Regulator's (JCR) have frequently had this discussion. We've had some success bringing in new shooters and keeping our participant numbers fairly consistent.

Some of the tactics we've used include allowing the use of .22s at our club matches, inviting new parent club (Western Wayne County Conservation Association) members, offering prizes of free matches and running limited mobility (stand and deliver) matches. Recognizing that ladies consist of the fastest growing segment of the shooting sports participants. This past year we looked at none other than Annie Oakley for inspiration.

Phoebe Ann Moses, better known as Annie Oakley, was a shooting sports star of the 19th and early 20th Centuries. Well known for her prowess with firearms and her affiliation with Wild Bill's Wild West Show, she was an early advocate for women's rights. Oakley believed women should be able to defend themselves and taught women marksmanship.

Sarge (SASS #99895) presented the idea to the JCR crew in the spring of 2022. The Regulators took the task to heart and thought Annie Oakley was the ideal namesake for our inaugural Ladies Only match. Especially since one of the goals of the match was to entice new shooters into the sport of Cowboy Action Shooting™.

Planning started in June of 2022 with input from many lady shooters from around the country. Hey Sugar (SASS #93109), Scarlett Darlin' (SASS #96680), Laurie L'Amour (SASS #94561), T. N. Tina (SASS #57583), Ruby Ruthless (SASS #105922),

Shamrock Sadie (SASS #78511), Midwest Hale (SASS #106614), and Mobetta (SASS #98793) were but a few of the ladies contributing ideas for the match.

The Annie Oakley Match was planned to coincide with the monthly JCR club match so spouse and significant others of the attendees could make the trip and participate the next day. Thirty-two shooters signed up for the match including eight new shooters, many of them taking advantage of the onsite camping and electrical hookups. Twenty-eight ladies participated.

Wolverine Regulator (SASS

#88086) took on the task of designing stages that would be challenging for the experienced shooters yet straightforward enough for new shooters to understand. Not Dead Ed (SASS #110351) agreed to handle the printing and other administrative duties while Wild Dogie rounded up door prizes and donors.

Sponsorship money was donated by local businesses and JCR members. Factory .22 ammunition and lite 12 gauge was acquired for use by Greenhorns. JCR members donated the use of leather and firearms. Stages were written allowing handguns to be staged

and restaged to simplify transition for the Greenhorns.

With Greenhorns (new shooters) coming in for the first time, it was decided it would be a good idea to provide them with several opportunities to shoot before the actual match. One opportunity came about a week before the match when they were invited to a JCR club practice session. The second opportunity was a mandatory session the morning of the match.

The Greenhorn seminar started with an overview of the SASS safety rules and what expectations were on the range. They were then broken up

into four groups of two and rotated through four shooting stations, one for revolver, one for rifle, one for side-by-side shotgun, and one for the '97 shotgun. Each Greenhorn was provided with instructions in how to operate the firearms and given a chance to shoot each gun. While the Greenhorns were practicing, the experienced ladies were attending seminars presented by Hey Sugar and Laurie L'Amour.

Hey Sugar presented Preparing for the Stage. Her discussion included preparation for the match; checklist for one-day and multi-day matches; setting up a routine; mental preparation; and

how to avoid distractions.

Laurie L'Amour conducted an equally outstanding seminar on costuming. Her topics included where to obtain outfits; small things you can do to change the appearance of a simple outfit; accessorizing; comfortable footwear; corsets and how they can provide support.

The shooters were split into two Posses with four Greenhorns assigned to each. The experienced shooters quickly began taking the Greenhorns under their wing, providing both advice and encouragement.

Hey Sugar and Indiana Jules (SASS #109972) distanced themselves from the other competitors with Hey Sugar taking the overall Top Shooter award. Get Even Eva was the top Greenhorn. Isabella Bird (SASS #111136) and Hey Sugar shot the match clean. Awards were handed out for each category with separate awards given out for experienced shooters and Greenhorn participants. Costuming awards went out to Shutterbug Red (SASS 3113830 — Greenhorn), Deadwood Kitty (SASS #96904), Hey Sugar and Indiana Jules.

Feedback from the competitors was 100 percent positive. As a result of the success of this match, the Johnson Creek Regulators will be making this an annual match. Our 2024 Annie Oakley Match is scheduled for June 22, 2024.

The big question is, were we successful in attracting new shooters to our game? Of the eight new shooters in attendance, six of them returned for our July monthly match. The father and brother of Ms. Holiday (our Greenhorn Buckarette) enjoyed watching the match so much, they tried their hands at our July match as well.

Thanks to all of the Johnson Creek Regulators and Wolverine Ranger Cowboys who helped to make this match a big success. Many of them showed up to run timers, pick brass, spot, act as loading and unloading table officers, and assist at the banquet. Special thanks to Sarge, Not Dead Ed, Wild Dogie, Wolverine Regulator, Slow Gin Ricky (SASS #50299), KC Kimmy and River Runner (SASS #112531) for bringing this match to fruition.



COMANCHERIA DAYS 2023 BEST LITTLE BIG MATCH IN TEXAS

Tame away from Comancheria Days 2023 thinking this may be the best one I have ever attended. There is just something about this match that made it special.

The Texican Rangers' Comancheria Days is the annual match initiated in 1995 by Mike Harvey (Texas Jack, SASS #5148), owner of Cimarron F.A. Co. This year, the match was completed by 158 shooters who bravely made the journey from all over Texas, as well as 36 shooters from 14 other states, for a total of 194. Hence my claim to calling this the biggest little match in Texas.

The tradition of this Old West shootin' match has endured now for 28 years. I am proud to say the Texican Rangers is the second oldest Cowboy Action Shooting™ club in the Texas Hill Country. The match actually began on Wednesday, April 26 this year, when Range Officer (RO) Classes were offered by Texas Jack Daniels (SASS #8587), and the Wild Bunch RO course taught by Asup Sleeve (#90965).

President and Match Director Alamo Andy (SASS #101775) and Club Vice President Sheriff Robert Love (SASS #8960) apparently put in their weather requests early and got some great Texas Hill Country weather for the match. Starting with cool and breezy mornings and warming up pretty good in the afternoons. Almost perfect Texas Hill Country weather!

Thursday was side match day, starting with a four-stage Wild Bunch Mini-Match. Other side matches, including Fastest Rifle, Revolver, Shotgun, Derringer, and Pocket Pistol, were available for all to challenge or use as warm up for the main match. Of special note was our Blazing Saddles side match, where competitors rode a 55-gallon drum down a ramp while shooting targets. This year we also brought back our Trail Walk side match. Long Range competition also occurred on Thursday, along with a Bolt Action Military Match (BAMM), very popular with our Wild Bunch shooters, and Fastest 1911. The day ended with a three-stage Plainsman Mini-Match. Everything went quite smoothly.

We had nine vendors this year. Now, I have been to Comancheria Days with more vendors in the past, but even though small in number, they were high in quality. There were vendors at the match who had ammo, powder, primers (Federal!), bullets, brass, grips, clothing, guns, Rugged Gear cart parts, and numerous other products you didn't know you absolutely needed. (It's true! Every purchase from Scarlett Darlin' came with a hug.) Buzzie's BBQ and Alex's Tacos served up some great food as well, so no one went hungry.

Our thanks go out to our Main Match sponsor, Cimarron Firearms, the only sponsor Comancheria Days has ever had for the last 28 years. Thank you again to Mike Harvey and the fine folks at Cimarron. A big thank you goes out to all our Stage Sponsors.

We had some top-notch Posse Marshals for the Main Match, Wild Bunch, and Plainsman, including Sheriff Robert Love, Brushy Creek Bill, Doc O'Bay, Texas Jack Daniels, Roy's Creek Dan, Texas Gunslinger, Newt Ritter, Dodge City Mike, Roamin' Shields, Caprock Kid, Whiskey Kid, Joe Darter, Asup Sleeve, Mad Dog McCoy, and Three Fingered Dutchman.


The Main Match started on Friday with everyone shooting five of the ten stages. The remaining five stages were shot Saturday. The stage scenarios were designed and written by Assistant Match Director Sheriff Robert Love.

The stages were not all typical left-to-right revolver, rifle, shotgun sequences. We had two stages that started that way, one stage that started on the right and the other seven stages were shooter's choice where you started where you wanted, as long as you didn't shoot the rifle last. All but one stage was 10, 10, 4+, with the exception being 10, 10, 2+. Stages were gunfighter friendly and a variety of sweeps and patterns kept things interesting.

They always say with Cowboy Action Shooting[™] that you come for the guns but stay for the people. I had the misfortune to have both my main match and back-up rifles break before the match. I had offers from five different shooters to let me borrow their rifle.

Saturday evening found folks in their finest period clothing at the awards banquet, returning this year to the Grand Ballroom, Inn of the Hills Hotel & Conference Center in Kerrville. The banquet featured the always popular "stretch raffle," as well as registered shooter drawings for guns, gift cards, gift certificates and more. Participants also had a chance to purchase

playing cards in a double-deck card raffle Thursday through Saturday for a chance to win a pair of Cimarron 1873 Model Ps, color case hardened frame, walnut grips, standard blue, with 5-½ inch barrels in .38/.357. A portion of the proceeds from the Deck of Cards Raffle went to the SASS Scholarship Fund. 

MONTANA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP BATTLE AT BLACK HORSE 2023

he 2023 Montana State Championship Match hosted shooters from fifteen states and provinces with a variety of accents and background experiences. Despite their differences, all shooters present gathered with one major commonality. All the shooters assembled spoke the language of Cowboy Action Shooting™, and conversations were flowing in Great Falls, MT, July 13-16.

In the fall of 2022, the core organizers of the Black Horse Shootists of Great Falls, Montana were exhausted. They had been putting on the Montana State Match since 2015 and were ready for a change. In came the 2023 Volunteer Committee. A group of shooters from Western Montana representing the Bitterroot Buckaroos, the Rocky Mountain Rangers, and the Bigfork Buscaderos rode to the rescue, figuratively, to help plan, manage, and run the Montana State shoot. Coordinating the group's efforts with Jeb's Lady (SASS#76599), secretary/treasurer of the Black Horse Shootists, Chiparoo (SASS #77607) headed the group. A few minor overall changes were made to the structure of the match, but essentially, it was very similar to the Montana State shoots of the past.

The week of July 13-16 dawned with near perfect Big Sky weather. It was a Goldilocks kind of shoot — the temperatures were just right, the wind was enough to cool the potentially sweltering sun but not blowing hats away, and the skies remained dry and clear during the shooting. The only drawback witnessed by the shooters was a haze of smoke from the Canadian fires.

The Wild Bunch participants commenced throwing lead down range on Thursday morning. Twenty-nine shooters on two posses battled for bragging rights and the first-place plaques. 


The Montana State Champion-



WOWS Station is located in the scenic hills of Northwestern Wisconsin with the range itself being located in a valley. It is a dedicated Cowboy Action range with thirteen permanently constructed stages arranged in a U-shape configuration giving the appearance of an old west town. Additional buildings include a clubhouse that resembles a train station and a caboose themed restroom facility. Dry camping is available at no additional charge on the range itself, of which several shooters availed themselves.

Twenty-one registered shooters gathered together early Saturday morning for the shooters meeting conducted

by Match Director Colonel Carbine and Safety Briefing by Chippewa River Bob (SASS #102669). There were also an additional nine shooters present for the club's regular monthly shoot. They would be shooting as a separate posse on Saturday only. Although it was the Wisconsin State Shootout, there were several out of state shooters who joined in as well. WOWS has run this dual format for several years as a way to introduce more members and other local shooters to the black powder experience. Saturday's events included shooting six Cowboy stages with a delicious lunch of sloppy joes, homemade potato salad, and fresh watermelon prepared by Lucky Leslie (SASS #66961) and Wild Annie "O" (SASS #84236).

The forecast for Saturday was unseasonably warm temperatures with humidity and no breeze — ideal conditions for fully experiencing black powder shooting! 



SHOOTING YOUR FIRST MATCH

ttend a few matches before shooting. The folks there will be glad to see you and after a match or so they will offer you the honor of picking up brass, pulling shotgun targets back up, and, after training, spotting.

BASIC COSTUMING

I don't believe anyone will say I'm not into costuming. I've won all the

major costuming matches at least once. One EOT I won all three contests. I've been a costume judge at EOT for several years. I don't wear shorts and t-shirt on "Summer Rules," or "Paniolo" days. I have worn leather chaps (and full costume underneath) in 101-degree weather. But I don't care what anyone else wears as long as it meets the rules. At costume contests, then I care.

After all, Lucas McCain wore Wrangler jeans and a modern western shirt. Would you turn him away? Marshal Dillon on *Gunsmoke* wore a wristwatch at times. I suppose this means you can, too (take it off for the costume contest). Anything above this level is voluntary. It's mandatory in Classic Cowboy/Cowgirl and B-Western, but then they're voluntary, too.

FIRST REQUIREMENT: SHOW UP "90% OF LIFE IS SHOWING UP." — WOODY ALLEN

Show up early enough to register, unpack your gear and get ready to shoot

before the shooters meeting. Put on your shooting glasses and your ear protection. At least have the latter on your person so you can put them on before hearing gunfire.

The shooters meeting will start with either the national anthem or the pledge of allegiance or both. If you're a civilian, take off your hat and put your hand over your heart. If you are visiting from another country, just stand at attention. You may put your hand over your heart if you wish. If you're a vet and can render a snappy salute, then leave your hat on and salute if you wish. Saluting is a privilege earned by veterans. Afterwards be prepared to take/keep your hat off for a prayer. In Texas expect to pledge allegiance to the Texas flag. For real. Visitors and new members will be welcomed, sometimes by name.

There is a safety briefing. Listen as though your life depended on it. Additionally, posses will be read out. You might have signed for posse 2, but to even numbers out, they might have moved you to another posse.

AT THE FIRST STAGE

Hopefully you will, at this time, have a mentor. Follow his/her suggestions. Get your ammunition ready. Fill your shot shell belt and put a few rifle rounds on it for reloads, anticipated or not. Listen carefully to the posse marshal's stage description. If you don't understand, ask your mentor. If he uses a term others don't understand, someone else will ask the question.

Example — Posse marshal says, "Rifle, do a Nevada sweep on four targets for ten rounds starting on the [left, right, either end]." NOTE, some sweeps are well-known and have names that are used frequently. Others are unique to that club. It might be the same sweep in four clubs with four different names. They should/must describe the sweep, preferably on the written stage description. Do not worry about learning all the names for sweeps. It's impossible because sadistic monsters keep coming up with new sweeps and new names. (Only kidding... partially.)

The Nevada sweep for 10 rounds on four targets would be, if starting from the left, one on target 1, one on target 2, one on target 3, one on target 4, one on target 3, one on target 2, one on target 3, and one on target 2, one on target 3, and one on target 4. It might be shown as 1-2-3-4-3-2-1-2-3-4. Yes, it can get complicated. As for realism, you will remember in "Tombstone," Doc Holiday was given a ten second penalty for shooting the targets out of order. Not. But he would be at a SASS match.

WHEN TO SHOOT

Commonly these days shooters can shoot in any order, and it works just fine. If they assign an order, shoot in that order. When I started, they frequently shot in alphabetical order. I almost changed my alias to Zee Captain

If there is no order and you're new, watch a few shooters (two or three in a posse of 15 or more) then get in line. They may have a limit for the number of people in line to shoot or on the loading table itself.

Some like to shoot first. Some people like to work first, then shoot. That way they get to watch a few shooters. That's an idea for your second or maybe

tenth match. They will probably have a rack for your long guns. If not rest the butts of the long guns on the toes of your boots until you can put them on the table.

LOADING

Put all four guns on the table. Unless you have a loading strip/block, etc. put your ammunition on the table in five-round rows. Put rifle ammunition on top. Load the rifle first—always. Do it one way all the time and you're less likely to pick up a gun on the stage and find it to be empty or misloaded.

Normally we shoot 10 rifle rounds. BEWARE THE NINE-ROUND RIFLE STAGE. MAKE SURE YOU PUT NINE ROUNDS ON THE TABLE AND INTO THE RIFLE. (If, when you shoot the rifle, you realize it's a nine-round stage and you loaded 10 rounds, rack the rifle as you put it down to empty it.)

Then load five rounds in each revolver and make sure the empty is under the hammer. Put the revolver back on the table. Keep the revolvers on the table until you are the next

shooter. Then holster them. This is required in some clubs and a good idea anyway. If you walk more than a couple of arm's length from the loading table with loaded firearms, you have earned a Stage DQ.

LOADING OFFICER

The club may or may not have someone watching the loading of every firearm. If so, just follow his/her instructions. If not, show your revolvers to the shooter ahead of you in line so he can see the empty under the hammer. Let him know you're at your first match. If you started with four rows of five rounds, it's easy for him to note that you put 10 in the rifle.

LOADING FIVE ROUNDS SAFELY COLT ACTION

Pull hammer to half cock. • Open Loading Gate • Load One • Skip One

Chamber • Load Four • Close Loading Gate • Pull Hammer to Full Cock (if you don't the bolt will scrape the cylinder, eventually causing a ring) • Lower Hammer (gently just in case) • Check to see that no round is under the hammer.

RUGER ACTION

Hammer Down • Open Loading Gate • Load One Round • Skip One Chamber (listen for a click; when you hear it, the hole is in position for loading) • Load Four Rounds • Close Loading Gate • Check to see that no round is under the hammer.

CHECKING FOR HIGH PRIMERS WHILE LOADING (COLT ACTION)

Pull Hammer to Half Cock • Open Loading Gate • Insert Five Rounds • Spin cylinder at least one full rotation. A high primer will stop or drag the rotation • Rotate cylinder until empty is under loading gate. Rotate cylinder four clicks • Close Gate • Pull Hammer to Full Cock • Lower Hammer Carefully • Empty should be under hammer.


RIFLE SAFETY

Make sure the hammer is fully down before taking a step away from the loading table. "Leaving the Loading Area with a cocked/loaded rifle: In such instances the shooter will be directed to point the rifle safely downrange, to bring the hammer to full cock if it is in the half-cock/safety position, then pull the trigger. If no round is fired, the shooter will be directed to finish staging firearms to start the stage (No Call). If a round fires when the shooter pulls the trigger, the shooter will be assessed a STAGE DQ and directed to proceed to the unloading table." (Copyright Single Action Shooting Society, Inc. 2022 Version 26.2)

READ, UNDERSTAND, MEMORIZE

When you move up the line, try to read the written stage instructions posted at the head of the line. Make sure you understand the course of fire. If not, ask. Big matches have expeditors between the loading table and the stage. He/she will answer questions and check your ammunition.

Mentally walk through the stage, doing, at least in your head, every action. For example, "Start at left win-

dow, hands on hat. Line: 'I'll make ya famous,' At beep pick up strong side revolver. Front sight. Shoot 1-2-3-4-3 Draw weak side revolver as you holster strong side. Both hands on revolvers. Front sight. Shoot 2-1-2-3-4. Move right foot to right as you holster left revolver. Smoothly turn as you run toward rifle. Plant feet in rifle shooting stance as you pick up rifle. Put strong hand on stock in shooting position. Raise stock. Slide weak hand under forearm to shooting position as you lift the rifle, placing the butt in the firing position inside your shoulder. Rack lever as soon as rifle hits your shoulder, against your cheek, not on the way up (it's faster, really). When front sight is in front of first target fire 1-2-3-4-3-2-1-2-3-4 rack lever open, noting the last round was ejected. Place on table, etc. securely with trigger guard on surface. [One method of loading the shotgun] With weak hand grab two shot shells. At shotgun pick up shotgun, roll the rounds in from over the top, looking at the shotgun. (I know, it's not tactically

correct. Even after 24 years I tend to look at the target—and fumble my reload.) Close shotgun. While doing all this the shotgun should be "addressing" the first target so when the gun is slammed closed, the front sight is on the target. Two quick shots, open, angling the barrel upward while shoving the gun forward to eject the hulls, while weak hand picks up two more shells. Repeat. Check for empties. Listen for the time from the TO and misses if any. Remember the time. Retrieve rifle. Go to unloading table." Got it all?

Ask yourself these questions: Do I have the required shotgun ammunition on my belt? • Do I understand the course of fire? • What is the starting

position? (You can ask the Timer Operator.) • What is the starting line? (You can ask the Timer Operator — At most matches it is posted where you start.)

DO NOT LEAVE THE LOAD-ING TABLE UNTIL CALLED. (SDQ)

Pick up the long guns, keeping the muzzles pointing up and down range the entire trip, the guns held vertically. Even though the shotgun is open, angle the barrels of SXS downrange for the entire trip. Place the guns on the appropriate tables with the TRIGGER GUARD on the table. The butt may stick out over the edge to facilitate picking it up. Revolvers, if staged, must be completely on the table. All guns are staged flat. (Laying a saddle ring carbine on its left side with the ring against the receiver is flat. Trying to extend the ring and prop the gun up on it is not.

I have encountered a rash of loading tables that are too short, and an anti-splash back screen is hanging over the front. This has occurred in multiple states. Be extra careful picking the gun up to clear it.

Vertical staging, while considerably less common, is more complicated. Ask the timer operator for help if necessary. He/she will show you how it should be done, assuming it wasn't explained during the stage description. Make sure you know if it must be restaged vertically or if it can be discarded flat. Make sure you know how to retrieve it without violating the 170-degree rule, even with that open SXS shotgun.

Vertical staging is used at END of TRAIL, so some clubs use it occasionally. But you may not see it all year.

Normally "the line" and the starting position will be posted. If in doubt, ask the Timer Operator. SASS Default is standing straight up, hands at side. Some shooters try to bend over, cup their hands over the grips of their guns, etc. Don't.

THE LINE

Traditionally it has been said "With Feeling." If Tex (SASS #4) is the Timer Operator, you will say it with feeling. However, if the line is long, it's okay to just say the last sentence. Some people never learn the line and just say "Ready," or the equivalent. If the timer operator wants you to say the line, say the line. Some old timers don't appreciate not

"playing the game.

Exceptions noted: Once at EOT, the lines were from "The Wild Bunch." The line writer apparently didn't understand Spanish, and the line was "Puta." Several people, and all the Juniors did not say the line. Posse Marshals explained that it was optional. At other times some lines were definitely masculine, and some women altered them appropriately. Normally all the lines are meant to be G-rated, so don't expect too many from "Blazing Saddles."

All kinds of starting positions are used. Once you are in position, the Timer Operator will say, "Say your line when ready." Then, in a loud, clear voice, preferably in character if it's a movie line, say the line, such as, "I'll make ya famous." The Timer Operator will say, "Stand by." Short pause, then Beep.

Shoot the stage carefully. You don't have to win first overall on your first match. Just hit the targets in order. **SLOW IS SMOOTH. SMOOTH IS FAST.** Ignore those Facebook videos of 15-second stages. Thirty seconds clean is unattainable by probably a third of SASS shooters.

When finished, the Timer Operator may tell you to holster your revolver or otherwise make your firearms "safe." Then he SHOULD call out the time in a loud, clear voice that everyone, including you and the scorer can hear. Then he should show you the time. Note the time. Once or twice, I have gotten to the scorer and saw a different time recorded.

The timer had gotten bumped between the line and the scorer. This is not a worry at your first match but start making the habit now. At least once the real time was lost, and I got a reshoot.

The TO will poll the three spotters. Usually, a glance at all three will give him the answer, "clean," or "one miss," etc. They might be discussing how many or a penalty. At this point, pick up your rifle and shotgun, holster your revolvers, muzzles up and down range even though you are walking up range, and walk to the unloading table.

LOOK at your long guns as you walk, especially if one was the last gun shot. Look for empty hulls on the shotgun or brass on the rifle that wasn't caught by the Timer Operator. If you find, say, a hull in the shotgun, put the rifle down, clear the shotgun, and then put it down. If the shotgun was the last gun fired, and you haven't put it down and let go of it and you put it down without clearing it, you have earned a minor safety. If you catch it after shooting it but haven't put it down or shot another gun, then you may clear it without penalty. Once you put it down and take your hands off, the penalty is yours. Feel free to re-read the last part until you understand it.

UNLOADING TABLE

Turn the SXS so he can see the empty chambers, then lay it down. Rack the lever on the rifle (or the slide on pumps), letting the unloading table

officer see the carrier and the chamber, then turn it upside down so he can see the follower ('66s and '73s). Put it down. Eject all the cartridges in the revolver and turn it SLOWLY so he can see into the cylinder. Do not spin the cylinder like TV, rotate the cylinder so he can see six empty chambers. He SHOULD say, "clear." I keep turning it slowly until he does. I also look for five empties. It's a double check that will eventually save you. (At least two World Champions used to spin the cylinder and snap the loading gate closed. Both reached the next stage and opened their revolvers to load them and found an empty in one of them. Both then told the scorer to give them Stage DQs for the previous stage.) By the way, nobody is impressed by spinning the cylinder and snapping the loading gate closed. Put that revolver ON THE TABLE. Clear the second revolver, THEN holster both. Why? The stage does not end until all firearms are cleared. If, as has happened, you drop the first revolver holstering, it's a stage DQ if the other revolver hasn't been cleared. If you drop it after it's cleared, it's a no call, just as it would be if you dropped it at your gun cart.

Your brass will be brought by a brass picker and either put on the table or a screen for the brass. Thank the brass picker for bringing it. Pick it up and put it in that brass bag I mentioned, including shot shells if you reload. If you don't, you may leave them for reloaders. Thank the unloading table officer. At many match-

es you magically turn into an unloading table officer and check the shooter behind you. If that is the case stay for the next shooter. "I've got the table."

Now go to your gun cart and put the long guns in it. An Alternative: If there is room, leave long guns on the unloading table or a nearby rack. Take the brass to your gun cart and put it in your brass bag.

Grab your big shotgun bore brush, a bottle of the oil you use, and a rag, and go to the long guns where you can safely point them downrange to clean them. Swab the chamber of the shotgun, spritz the carrier and chamber of the rifle, wipe both guns down, and bring everything to your gun cart. I shoot black powder, but I learned to clean the shotgun every stage from two smokeless World Champions, Tequila, and T-Bone Dooley.

RELOAD YOUR SHOTSHELL BELT, reload what you keep cartridges in, and drink water or whatever non-alcoholic drink you drink.

Some matches want you to sign the score sheet. If so, do it now. Look at the

time and penalties. This is why I told you to remember the time. None should be a surprise. If it is, now is the time to find out why. Thank the scoring person and tell her she's doing a great job. She is. I don't want to do it. (I have, many times.)

Now, if you haven't worked, go offer to take the brass picker, spot (if trained), or pull targets. You might want to help scoring or work the unloading table.

Just a note about picking up brass. In my career I have seen several brass pickers run over. Pay attention. Shooter has right of way.

When you leave the range, take off your shooting glasses and put on your driving glasses so you don't realize you have the wrong ones on just after you entered the toll road. Take off your hearing protection and, if appropriate, put in the hearing aids you use when not around loud noises. If you put your wallet in your gun cart, put it in your pocket, ditto the iPhone.

Put all your guns and gear back in your vehicle and secure it.

If there are vendors, visit them. If possible, buy something. They're supporting the sport. If there is a lunch, enjoy it. If they give out awards, applaud.

Hydrate. Drive safely.

LOADING LONG GUNS ON THE CLOCK


There are videos on techniques that work. They are better than any series of photos I could post here. YouTube has a bunch. You will load the shotgun on every stage. Either get or make dummy rounds and practice these techniques as often as you can. If you have a mentor, follow his instructions.

SXS have two basic techniques, loading with weak hand or strong hand; '97 shotguns have two or three methods for right handers, and one or two for lefthanders; the '87 shotgun has its own techniques (check YouTube).

You will need to be able to load a single round into your rifle. Again, there are multiple techniques. Try each technique. Practice the one you like most as much as you can.

DISPATCHES FROM CAMP BAYLOR EXTRA NEW DILLON PRESS ENHANCEMENTS FROM UNIQUETEK

niqueTek is a long time SASS vendor and supporter. I started seeing them at Winter Range in the early 2000s and they are at EOT now. They're a vendor of a lot of items. Many of them are aimed at Dillon Precision and/or at Cowboy Action Shooters™. These work for both.





POWDER FUNNEL/EXPANDER FOR HI-TEK COATED BULLETS

They make a large selection of "unique" powder funnels. The correct powder funnel can make or break the loading of a non-standard load. We'll confine this to .38 special/.357 mag. (SKU: T1736) It's also available in 9mm.

The Dillon powder funnel works quite well for loading lead bullets with no coating. I've loaded more than 100,000 with them. Polymer coated bullets are easier to load well with a funnel designed for them. If you find small coating shavings in the output box, you understand. Cutting to the chase, I get no shavings with this funnel.

"This one is especially designed for loading Hi-Tek Coated .38 caliber cast lead bullets. It provides enough case expansion to reduce shaving of the polymer coating." When I read this, I ordered one immediately. When I used It, I wrote about it on my Facebook page. It got almost 6,000 views. Combined with UniqueTek's popular email newsletter, word got out.

They quickly ran out of these funnels. To complicate things their web provider went south. Several people complained to me. It's nice to know somebody is reading my stuff. Well, it's all okay now. They have a new web provider and they have resupplied these powder funnels.

The photos explain it. Photo 1

shows this funnel on the left compared to a stock funnel. The new one measures 0.358" (Photo 2) compared to standard ones in the 0.354" range. The expander section is three times as long as stock.

Photo 3 shows a case that has been sized and expanded. The expanded portion is long enough for 125- and 158-grain HTC bullets. Note the minimal belling. Many split cases are caused by belling.

Photo 4 shows two cases. The left one has a seated bullet awaiting roll crimping. The right one was dropped into the case and has not been seated yet, but it slipped almost into position with mild finger pressure.

Photo 5 shows a 105-grain Coated Truncated Cone (CTC) bullet (from Bullets By Scarlett — (843) 833-0770, bulletsbyscarlett.com — designed for smooth operation in lever guns, with a cartridge overall length of 1.4845" when crimped at the shoulder (optimum for '66s and 173s) with a smooth roll crimp. Yes, you have seen them here before. But that's what I use. I have loaded thousands of these and I no longer get any shaving in the output box. I haven't been able to do Ransom Rest testing, but logic tells me it's got to be more accurate for those 75-yard pistol targets on stage 12. Additionally, pulled bullets keep more of their coating than pulled bullets from other rounds. Photo 6 shows a bullet on the left that was pulled from a round loaded this way vs. a new round. The









pulled bullet can be loaded again.

When pulling bullets is necessary, I noticed less pressure is needed to get the bullet out. Coated bullets have been hard to extract until I used this method.

DILLON PRIMER MAGAZINE ALIGNMENT GAUGE SET SKU T1775

Another tool I bought at first sight — "This is a precision ground gauge set that fits RL550 and XL 750 priming systems. It aligns the Dillon Primer Magazine Tube to the Primer Slide Assembly. Stops flipped primers, skipped primer pick up, random primer feeding problems, and the dreaded "flying primers." No More Adjusting the Primer System Blindly."

Photo 7 shows the gauges. Photos 8 and 9 demonstrate its use basically (not a substitute for reading the instructions). Photo 8 shows the Primer Magazine Alignment Gauge inserted into an empty Primer Magazine Tube Assembly. Photo 9 — Lower the Operating Handle. The Primer Magazine Alignment Gauge should drop about 1/8" into the Primer Seating Cup.

Of course it comes with detailed instructions including how to adjust the Slide Pickup Adjustment Screw. Adjustments as little as 0.005" can improve the reliability of RL550/XL750 type priming systems. This Primer Alignment Gauge makes precision adjustments easy.


CASE FEED ARM ALIGNMENT TOOL


Photo 10 — "This simple tool aids in aligning the Case Feed Arm to the Case Feed Body Bushing during caliber conversions. This is especially critical when the caliber conversion involves a change between pistol and rifle cartridges. It makes precision adjustment of the Slide Cam easy by holding the Case Feed Arm in perfect alignment to the Case Feed Body. (Photo 11—adjusting the alignment.) You no longer have to get into the awkward position needed to look down onto the top of the press to visualize proper alignment.


THE BULLET BIN

Lastly, just prior to the deadline for this I received the online flyer for this

















one, and it got my attention. When I put together the new shop, adding a Dillon XL750 to the XL650 (now 25 years old) and the RL900 (now 21 years old) let's just say funds were spread thin due to the move. I had a Dillon Bullet Tray. I moved it back and forth between the 650 and 750. I never got around to buying another. "Instead of a permanently attached bullet tray, The Bullet Bin™ uses Akro Bins® that are easily swapped when you change calibers." The bin easily holds a full 500-count box of 105-grain .38 caliber bullets. The Bullet Tray does not, and I like putting in a bag of bullets and not having to refill. Not a big thing, but I like it.

It fits the Dillon 550/650/750 Strong Mount (Dillon Stock No. 22051) and the Dillon SDB Strong Mount (Dillon Stock No. 22223) with no modifications.

For the Dillon 750/650 Strong Mount (Dillon Stock No. 22052), the one I have, you will need to drill two additional 1/4" mounting holes in the strong mount. (Photo 12 — I used a 1/4" Bosch Clic-Change self-centering drill bit to make pilot holes followed by a 1/4" drill bit.

I find it quite comfortable to load from. When I fill it, I use a bin dam, from UniqueTek. (Photo 13 — BBS decal not included.) I have a bunch of Akro Bins, most with Bin Dams.



DEACON OF DEATH THE STORY OF JIM MILLER



ne of the most remorseless outlaws of 19th century America was known as "Deacon Jim" or "Killer Miller." He hid behind a façade of respectability - he didn't drink, use foul language, or smoke. Deacon Jim was a regular churchgoer and devoted family man. He dressed well and was often seen in his trademark frock coat, no matter how hot the weather became. Unfortunately, his true avocation was homicide, either to settle old grudges or to gain money. Miller could blow someone's head off with a shotgun, show up in church the next day and sing "What a Friend We have in Jesus"without batting an eye.

James Brown Miller was born in 1861 in Van Buren, Arkansas. His family moved to Franklin, Texas a year later. Soon after arriving in Texas, Miller's father died. His mother moved to Evant, Texas in order to live with her parents. In 1869, Miller's grandparents were found dead in their home. Jim, at age eight, was arrested for murdering them, but the charges were dropped, either from lack of evidence or because of the boy's extreme

youth. The entire incident of the deaths of his grandparents is murky, so speculation that Miller killed them needs to be taken with a shaker of salt.

Jim, as he was known, next went to live with his sister, widowed mother, and brother-in-law John Coop in Coryell County, Texas. The new living arrangement proved to be less than harmonious. In 1884, Miller shot his brother-in-law with a shotgun while he was asleep on the porch. Though he claimed he was in church at the time of the murder, Miller was arrested and put on trial for the killing of John Coop. He was found guilty and sentenced to life in prison, but the verdict was overturned on a technicality. Apparently, the lesson Miller learned was it's okay to kill people as long as you obtain skilled legal counsel in the event of capture.

For the next three years, Miller worked on a ranch that belonged to Emanuel Clements in McCulloch County, Texas. Clements had a famous cousin

named John Wesley Hardin who was another of the Old West's most pitiless killers. Eventually, Miller would marry Sallie Clements, Emanuel's daughter.

In 1887, Emanuel Clements, a suspected cattle rustler, ran afoul of a local lawman named Joe Townsend and was killed in a gunfight. Not long afterwards, Townsend was ambushed by someone who shot him with a shotgun. Although Townsend survived, one of his arms had to be amputated. They never found the shooter, but the whole episode had the signature of Jim Miller on it.

Miller wandered around for the next couple of years and eventually became a deputy sheriff in Pecos, Texas. The area was plagued by cattle rustlers. Although the rustling continued with little abatement, people noticed several of Miller's detainees were shot while "trying to escape." Eventually, Bud Frazer, the sheriff who hired Miller suspected him of playing on both sides of the law.

At this time, Jim Miller cut a striking

figure. He was tall, well-groomed and soft spoken. He wore a black frock coat regardless of the weather. When asked why he always wore the coat, Miller replied it had been given to him by a friend who was blessed by extraordinary good luck. Perhaps, Miller mused, some of his friend's good luck would rub off on him. Folks didn't tend to question Miller much when word got out he had stood up to a cowboy who ridiculed him for the coat. The cowboy, who was looking for a fight, suddenly found himself staring at a Colt revolver when he pushed Miller too far. As far as the townspeople were concerned, Miller was a model citizen. He enthusiastically attended church, had a family, abstained from alcohol, and hardly ever used profane language.

Sheriff Frazer had his deputy arrested for murder and theft. Miller lawyered up and was acquitted at his trial. This was the beginning of a blood feud between the two men. Frazer was particularly angered by the fact that one of the men who had informed on Miller was killed in New Mexico by a relative of Miller's wife.


On April 12, 1894, Frazer confronted Miller with a drawn revolver. The sheriff's first shot ricocheted off Miller's coat. Frazer's second shot hit Miller in the right arm, but Miller transferred his own revolver into his left hand and returned fire. None of Miller's shots connected, but the sheriff shot Miller three times in the chest. Finally, Miller fell to the ground and Frazer returned to his office thinking he'd vanquished his enemy.

Miller was carried to the hotel he'd purchased some time before. Everyone assumed he was mortally wounded, but that didn't turn out to be the case. Underneath Miller's ubiquitous frock coat, he was wearing a steel plate. No wonder the coat was considered "lucky." Although he was badly hurt from the wound to the right arm, Miller was hardly vanquished. He told his friends that Frazer's days were numbered.

It took Miller months to recover from the shooting. Meanwhile, Frazer had lost his bid for reelection and had moved to New Mexico. However, Frazer returned to Pecos in December and confronted Miller a second time. While Miller was standing in front of a blacksmith's shop, Frazer drew his revolver and began shooting at him. Miller was hit in the arm and leg, then he was shot square-

ly in the chest. Frazer, who hadn't heard about the steel plate, was astonished that Miller was still standing. Completely unnerved, Frazer ran away.


Jim Miller decided to go the legal route and pressed charges against Frazer for attempted murder. He hired his relative by marriage, John Wesley Hardin, to assist with the prosecution, but Hardin was shot in El Paso before the case came to trial. Eventually, after some months of wrangling, Frazer was acquitted. In those days, if someone threatened to kill you and you preempted the move by killing them first, it was considered an act of self-defense. Enough people had heard Miller's vow of vengeance against Frazer that it swayed the jury in Frazer's favor. Miller was displeased with the outcome and turned to Plan B.

It took about four months for Miller to catch up with Frazer. While Frazer was playing cards in a saloon in Toyah, Texas, Jim Miller walked in with a shotgun. Seconds later, most of Frazer's head was vaporized. One of the people at the card table remembered that "his whole head disappear[ed] in a clot of splashing blood and bone." The card player jumped out a window and fled in terror. Interestingly, he managed to keep his whiskey glass in his hand. He probably needed the contents.

A short time after Frazer's killing, his sister borrowed a gun and confronted Miller. The gallant deacon responded by saying, "If you try to use that gun, I'll give you what your brother got. I'll shoot you right in the face." When it came to violence, Jim Miller was an equal opportunity employer.

Miller was arrested and charged with murder. The trial was held in Eastland, Texas where Miller had taken up residence. The well-dressed churchgoer and family man had impressed the locals enough to secure his eventual acquittal. One of the witnesses who testified against Miller was killed by a shotgun blast three weeks later. Though nobody was arrested for the murder, it is believed Miller rode 100 miles roundtrip to establish an alibi, found the witness, and shot him. Coincidentally, or perhaps not, the prosecutor at Miller's trial died of food poisoning not long after the witnesses' murder.

For the next several years, Miller worked as a saloon keeper, gambler,

hotel owner and even did a stint as a Texas Ranger. His real occupation, however, was that of an assassin. He charged between \$150 and \$2,000 for his services. A lot of his business entailed the removal of homesteaders and sheepherders, whom the local cattlemen considered vermin. At the time, the good deacon once boasted he killed eleven men that he knew of. "I've lost my notch stick on sheepherders I've killed on the border."

The homesteaders had the audacity to hire a talented lawyer named James Jarrot to defend their interests against the cattlemen. The cattlemen in turn hired Miller to remove the pesky attorney. On August 28, 1902, Jarrot's body was found near Lubbock, Texas. He had been shot four times. According to one source, Miller complained Jarrot was "The hardest damn man to kill I ever tackled." It is believed Miller received \$500 for nullifying the lawyer. That was a fair chunk of change in those days — equal to about \$18,000 in today's currency.

Jim Miller was riding high by the turn of the 20th century. He was as talented at commerce as he was at killing. He wore a diamond ring and increasingly fancy clothes. At first glance, he seemed to be a pillar of the community. He still attended church regularly, donated to charities, and seemed to be every bit the solicitous family man. It's too bad that he

was an utter psychopath.

It is possible (but unproven) that Miller murdered Pat Garrett, the lawman who killed Billy the Kid. By the early 1900s Garrett had retired from law enforcement and owned a ranch near Las Cruces, New Mexico. A neighbor, W.W. Cox wanted to buy Garrett's ranch, but Garrett refused to sell. Cox hired an assassin to take Garrett out of the picture so he could obtain the land. On February 9, 1908, Garrett's body was found beside his buggy about five miles from Las Cruces. He had been shot in the back of the head while answering a call of nature. Garrett had also been shot in the stomach. Before he was shot, he had been accompanied by two men, Wayne Brazel and Carl Adamson.

After the shooting, Brazel rode to Las Cruces and confessed to killing Garrett. He claimed to have shot Garrett in self-defense after an argument had broken out between them. According to Brazel, Garrett had reached for a shotgun that was in the buggy. Carl Adamson backed up the story. Since Garrett had been found with his pants unbuttoned, their account of his shooting seems unlikely.

A member of the New Mexico Territorial Mounted Police, Fred Fornoff, investigated the crime scene after Garrett's body had been taken away. He found two .44 WCF shell casings near

the place where the corpse was found. As it happened, Jim Miller owned a .44 WCF rifle. He was also in El Paso near the time of the murder; El Paso is not far from Las Cruces. Fornoff also learned Miller had borrowed a horse that was found grazing next to Garrett's buggy.

At Brazel's trial, none of the evidence gathered by Fornoff was presented. The jury deliberated only 15 minutes before acquitting him on the grounds of self-defense. Although it remains uncertain if Miller was involved in the murder of Pat Garrett, it's a likely hypothesis. At any rate, Jim Miller could not have been called to testify at the trial, because he had been dead for almost three weeks.

Miller's last contract was to kill Allen Bobbitt, a former Deputy U.S. Marshal and cattle rancher who lived near Ada, Oklahoma. (Apparently, he was not related to John Wayne Bobbitt, who famously received the "cruelest cut" from his wife Lorena in 1989.) Allen Bobbitt, who went by the nickname "Gus," was embroiled in a dispute with Joe Allen and Jesse West, also from Ada. Allen and West decided to settle the dispute by removing Bobbitt permanently. They contacted Miller with the help of Berry Burrell, an old friend. The fee for Bobbitt's removal was nearly \$2,000 — more than \$60,000 in today's currency. That offer was too tasty for Miller to pass up.

On February 27, 1909, Bobbitt was ambushed near his house and shot twice with a shotgun. He had been traveling with a neighbor who witnessed the shooting. Bobbitt lived long enough to identify his killer as a man he had met earlier while traveling homeward. Bobbit's neighbor backed up the story. The sheriff who investigated the shooting followed the tracks of the killer's horse to the farm of John Williamson who eventually admitted he had rented the horse to his uncle, none other than Jim Miller. More investigation revealed the complicity of Allen, West, and Burrell.

Miller was arrested near Fort Worth, Texas on March 30 and extradited to Ada, Oklahoma. The others were also gathered up and by the first week of April, were residing in the same jail as Miller. A date was set for the trial, but many of Ada's citizens had heard of Miller. When the story got around about how he had killed so many people with impunity, they decided to take matters

into their own hands. A few weeks earlier, a suspect in the murder of a marshal in a nearby town had been acquitted, which probably had an additional influence on their decision.

Around two o'clock in the morning on April 19, 1909, the electricity was cut off in Ada. The jailers were overpowered by a lynch mob and Miller, Allen, West, and Burrell were dragged to a nearby livery stable. Four nooses were strung from the rafters with boxes below them. Though Allen, West, and Burrell sniveled and begged, Miller remained composed. The deacon was the last one to be executed. When his turn came, Miller calmly asked that his diamond ring be sent to his wife. He also asked to be allowed to wear his trademark frock coat. That request was denied. Instead, he was allowed to wear his Stetson hat. It must have amazed his executioners to hear him say, "I don't want the rope to knock my hat off. You sure you got it set right?" Miller's last words were, "Let her rip!" and he jumped off the box. Later, the coat was draped over his shoulders. The bodies hung there for several hours until a photographer could be located to record the incident.

"Deacon Jim" Miller claimed to have killed more than fifty men. The actual count is probably much lower, but you have to wonder about that notch stick that he supposedly lost which accounted for sheepherders. What made him stand out was his utter lack of respect for human life, even his own. Then there is the duplicity of his life; was he really a devout Christian and family man, or was it just a ruse? We'll never know. Human beings are complex and contradictory creatures. What is certain is the fact he was one of the most evil and dangerous psychopaths ever to roam the Old West.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The Cowboy Chronicle welcomes and encourages submissions of articles and match reports from any and all readers.

Please submit articles in MS Word or something compatible. Open Office and Apple Pages (saved as MS Word) are also fine. A count of 500-800 words is a good target to shoot for, but shorter pieces are also fine. Match reports on larger events, like END of TRAIL, Winter Range, and Regional and Divisional matches may run 1000-1500 words if necessary. We will accept lengthier articles, but may choose to break them up into two or more parts to run in consecutive issues, or heavily edit them.

Please do not embed your photos in the Word document. They can be extracted for use in the *The Cowboy Chronicle*, but it can be a chore to do that. Instead, send your photos separately, in one or more emails, as attachments. Three to six photos per email usually works best. It's best to send JPEGs, but other formats are acceptable, and it's best to keep them at about 300 dpi and 3000 pixels (10 inches) on the short side. That size is

ideal and will allow us plenty of leeway when it comes to cropping and adjusting them for publication. Photos should be at least 1000 pixels on the short side to be used for publication. If you're unsure of the size of your pictures, or how to size them, send what you have and we'll adjust them and/or inform you if they're usable.

Usually, two to six photos are sufficient for an article, but we will consider using more for a "big" event, if provided. Photos need not have captions, but captions always make photos more interesting. Ideally, the caption would consist of one or two sentences that say something about the picture that is not obvious and/or is not implicit in the body of the article. "Sam making smoke" is a title but not a caption. "Sam, SASS #XXXXX, shooting his first black powder match; after much deliberation, he decided to give it a try and now he's hooked" is much better. A caption may also serve to let everyone know why the picture is worthy of being published in an international magazine.
