Dear Friends,

All organizations go through stages of change as they grow and mature. It was only a handful of years ago that Sheltering Wings was a dream. Five years ago it was a brand new facility accepting its first women and children in crisis. Now in 2007, the shelter is more focused has become a valued and respected organization in our community having housed 137 women and children and answered 1,150 crisis calls in 2006. All of this work has been done in God's name and with the financial support and prayers of all of you.

We are now focused on beginning an exciting new chapter in the shelter's history. April Bordeaux, our Executive Director these past five years, has been a remarkable leader--she has developed and organized a staff that is both highly professional and deeply passionate about the needs of the women and children they serve. on programs

It is a moving experience to fulfill someone's needs—whether it be clothing, food, shelter, appliances, healthcare; but how much more moving to touch and change a life forever. Many can focus on the evident, the physical, and the every day needs. But what does it take to fulfill needs deeply embedded within the soul?

Sheltering Wings teaches women and children to focus on a lifelong positive change. “No one who leaves the shelter is the same as when they entered,” said a former resident. “You leave the shelter feeling strong and powerful. We learn that we have the power to make positive changes.”

Over the past five years, through excellence and effective services, 400 women and 550 children have called Sheltering Wings their place of refuge and hope. There have been focused answers to more than 4,000 crisis calls and 44,000 community residents have been educated about the impacts of domestic violence.

This year, Sheltering Wings developed a

follow-up program, maintaining contact with women up to six months after they leave the shelter. We discovered that more than 70% of the families that leave Sheltering Wings have learned to focus on that positive change, going on to lead safe and successful lives.

We focus on our success, and we also focus on our future. 2006 marked the groundwork for future programs that will ensure our effectiveness in the lives of even more women and children.

And just as our programs reach into and change the lives of women, the experience is the same for the children who enter Sheltering Wings. Recognizing their vulnerability as youth, we sense the importance of the effects of our programs on our lives and continue to develop and improve these services.

on staff

Our organization is a focused one, operating effectively and efficiently because of our trained professional staff. Not only do they contribute to the professional functions of Sheltering Wings, they have big hearts, bursting with compassion to the point of overflowing. And here, that heart full of compassion also is focused into an effective tool for God's mercy and ministry.



In January, we granted full-benefits to Sheltering Wings employees, a shift that helped recruit and retain the most qualified and compassionate individuals. With a desire to maintain their focus, staff members attended two-week intensive training sessions and various on-going retreats.

But more than being trained to do their job well, the Sheltering Wings staff members are instruments to give hope to the hopeless and put their faith into action. They are vessels that God can mold and focus in ways that He knows are best.

“Sheltering Wings is a place where I can share Jesus with the women and children and show them they are of great worth and they deserve to be safe and free. I want to be able to make a difference in the lives of the victims of domestic violence and show them Christ's love and compassion [in tangible ways],” says Linda, our residential manager.

Great things happen when passion is focused—people sense it and they are changed. That is why so many residents say, “The staff gave me courage and strength. I want to thank them for that. They are so passionate about what they do and that really shows in their attitudes and love for the women and children.”

We promise to keep you informed as we add to our staff and policies in order to expand our mission.

We continue to be amazed at the many ways God helps us serve women and children. We have achieved our successes with a budget that is about half that of most domestic violence shelters our size due in large part to the many people who are so generous with their time. In 2006, our volunteers contributed over 8,000 hours of their precious time to Sheltering Wings.

If you would like to become one of those volunteers, we welcome your help, and encourage you to call us at 317-745-1496. Volunteers are required to complete a training orientation and those who will have direct contact with women and children must also undergo drug screening and a background check. Opportunities for volunteers fall into four categories.

ADMINISTRATIVE:

Answering phones, doors and assisting in accepting donations, affixing mailing labels, sorting newsletters, and helping with other bulk mailings.

MAINTENANCE:

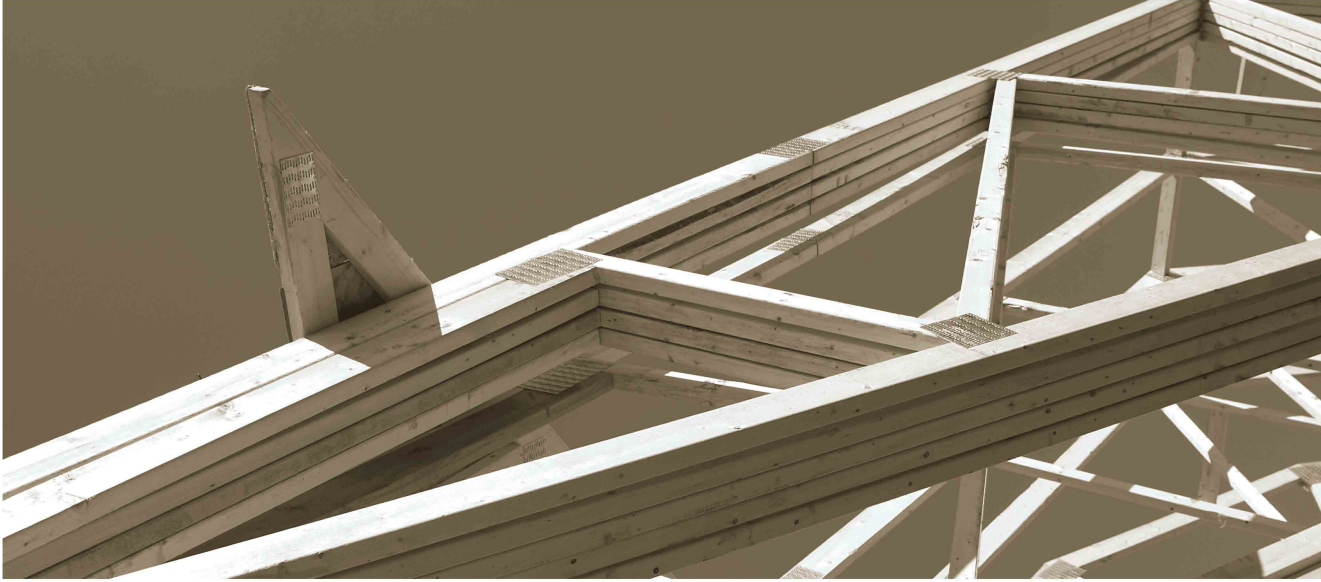
Everything from changing a light bulb, fixing a broken dishwasher, and cutting the grass to weeding the flower gardens.

PROGRAMS:

Crafts or activities with women and children, providing transportation for women without vehicles, running errands, and coordinating fun/movie nights.

SPECIAL EVENTS:

Organizing, public relations and volunteering on the day of special events, and representing the shelter in booths at public functions.

We all need a roof over our head, but for the victims of domestic violence, Sheltering Wings is more than just shelter from the weather. It is a place of refuge—a haven—a quiet place of rest and refocus.

For many residents, life at Sheltering Wings is their first chance to know the feeling of being safe. “There are so many things I could say about the shelter,” said one woman. “But the most important is the security. There was not one day that went by where I didn’t feel safe. I knew as long as I was here, I was out of harm’s way.”

Sheltering Wings promises to provide emergency housing in a safe and secure area to all victims who call it home. And with our success climbing, we move more focus to our facilities in order to fulfill this promise.

This year, we opened a satellite office by leasing a building near the shelter, relocating the support staff. The move enabled



us to set up private counseling and assessment rooms and create separate rooms for resident intake and crisis calls.

Sheltering Wings is bursting at the seams and plans of expansion are underway for the coming years. A focused ministry is a well-managed one, and we know that God will continue to bless the shelter with needed facilities.

WAYS TO GIVE

As you consider how you can help Sheltering Wings, you may want to explore one of the planned giving strategies described below. Many of these strategies offer substantial tax benefits. Your attorney, accountant, financial planner or banker can explain how these strategies may work for you.

EMPLOYER MATCHING:

Many companies match donations made by their employees, which can double or triple the impact of your generosity. Ask your Human Resources department for information about your employer's program.

STOCK GIFTS:

If you own shares of stock that you no longer need, donating them to Sheltering Wings may allow you to take a substantial tax deduction.

BEQUESTS:

As you prepare your will, please consider designating a set amount or percentage as a bequest to Sheltering Wings. If you already have a will, ask your attorney to add a codicil that reflects your wishes.

LIFE ESTATE ARRANGEMENTS:

With this type of giving, you can donate your home, land or other property to Sheltering Wings, but continue to use that property for life.

INSURANCE GIFTS:

If your dependents are financially secure, you may not need all of life insurance coverage. Designating Sheltering Wings as a beneficiary for part or all of your benefits – or taking out a new policy listing us as a beneficiary – may offer tax advantages.

ANNUITIES:

Purchasing a charitable gift annuity or a lifetime annuity allows you to make a gift now, and receive an income as long as you and your beneficiaries live.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUSTS:

These trusts allow Sheltering Wings to benefit from your gift for a specified period, with the assets then returning to you or your beneficiaries.
