The Big 12 began its 2lst year in 2016-17 as it continues to promote the strength and success of one of the nation's premier athletic conferences under the direction of fifth-year commissioner Bob Bowlsby.

TCU and West Virginia joined the league on July I, 2012 and became the Big I2's first additions since inception, joining Baylor, lowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas and Texas Tech.

With 10 members, the Big 12 remains as the only autonomy conference to determine its champions in all sports directly on the field of play with a full round-robin schedule. The Conference's hard work ethic and strong values have translated to enormous success in its first 20 years. Since it began competition in 1996-97, the league can boast of 54 NCAA team titles and 625 individual national championships.

The Big 12 has been at the forefront in college athletics reform, specifically with student-athlete welfare issues to include cost of attendance, studentathlete time demands and strengthening its policy for concussion diagnosis and management. In 2014-15, the Big 12 introduced and hosted three "State of Collegiate Athletics" forums to examine the issues facing college athletics. Two were conducted in Washington, D.C and one in New York City. Panelists included respected authorities from intercollegiate athletics, university leadership and sports journalism. The third forum featured a special session comprised of student-athletes. The Big 12 continued the "State of Collegiate Athletics" forums in 2015-16 with Dallas serving as the site for a November 2015 event.

The Conference had a banner year on the national stage in 201516. Two teams competed in 2015 College Football Playoff New Year's Bowls for the second consecutive season. Oklahoma made the Conference's first appearance in the CFP semifinals in 2015, the second year of the structure, while OU men's basketball advanced to the Final Four. Other highlights included national championships by Texas men's swimming and diving and Oklahoma women's gymnastics and softball. National runner-up finishes were recorded by Texas volleyball, Oklahoma State wrestling, TCU equestrian, Texas men's golf, Oklahoma men's tennis and Oklahoma State women's tennis. Three Big I2 squads were among the eight teams that advanced to baseball's College World Series.

The Big 12 lays claim to five Heisman Trophy winners since 1996 and has had a finalist in 12 of its seasons. Twenty-five major individual awards have been won by Big 12 student-athletes in football over the past seven campaigns. Overall, more than 4,800 student-athletes have earned All-America recognition. West Virginia soccer standout Kadeisha Buchanan earned the Hyundai Young Player Award at the 2015 World Cup while playing for her native Canada, given to the player born in 1995 or later that made the biggest impression in the competition.

Through its first 20 years, the Big 12 has claimed a team national championship in 17 of the sports it sponsors. The Conference finished the BCS era ranked tied for second with seven appearances in the National Championship Game. The league has finished in the top two of women's basketball conference RPI in nine of the last 10 years and sent at least 70 percent of its teams to postseason for the seventh-straight season. In men's basketball, the league has had seven teams earn NCAA bids four times in the past seven years. Every coach has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament - including five that have led teams to the Final Four - while seven boast career win percentages of .700 or higher. During the last 12 years a total of 36 NCAA trophies have been hoisted by Big 12 institutions, with at least one national crown won in all but one year for the Conference, including 19 consecutive seasons.

The Big 12 and its member institutions are committed to a competitive environment where sportsmanship and fair play take center stage. Whether on the field, in the classroom, or within the community, the student-athletes, administrators, coaches and game officials of the Big 12 support the highest ideals in sportsmanship.

National academic accolades have always been strong in the Big 12. Ty Darlington (Oklahoma) was the recipient of the 2015 William V. Campbell Trophy, known as the Academic Heisman. Gabe Ikard (Oklahoma) was presented the NCAA

Today's Top IO Award in January 2015. It recognizes former student-athletes for their successes on the fields and courts, in the classroom and in the community. Since 1996, the Big 12 has a total of II honorees for this prestigious award. In the last five seasons, nine student-athletes were recipients of the NCAA Elite 90 Award with volleyball's Janae Hall (Kansas), men's basketball's C.J. Cole (Oklahoma), women's golf's Laura Lonardi (Baylor) and baseball's Tyler Floyd (Texas Tech) picking up the latest honors in 2015-16. The accolade showcases individuals who have reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level, while also achieving the highest academic standard among their peers.

In its short history, the Big 12 has over 600 Academic All-America recipients, averaging about 30 each season. Big 12 student-athletes have shown commitment to their studies by earning numerous individual academic recognitions. Twelve times in the past 12 years a league athlete has garnered the top academic honor for their respective sport, including Christina Hillman (lowa State) in track \& field/cross country in 2016.

The Big 12 can take pride in other stories that combine on and off the field success. In the fall of 2013, former Texas Tech track and field student-athlete Ifeatu Okafor was named the Big I2's first NCAA Woman of the Year. Patience Knight (Texas Tech) was the recipient of the Honda Inspiration Award in 2008 while Imani McGee-Stafford (Texas) was honored in 2015. It is given to an outstanding female college athlete who overcomes adversity to excel in her sport. Oklahoma State women's basketball was the inaugural recipient of the "Together We R" Team Award in 2012, recognizing programs that have strived to succeed in the face of adversity. Following a devastating tornado south of Oklahoma City just before the Big I2 Baseball Championship in 2013, several league baseball teams along with other student-athletes, coaches and former Conference players contributed help in a variety of ways. Plus, the Conference contributed $\$ 200,000$ to the relief efforts. In the fall of 2014, Oklahoma football student-athlete Sterling Shepard and head coach Bob Stoops were honored with the Disney Sports Spirit Award while Kansas football student-athlete JaCorey Shepherd received the Lee Roy Selmon Community Spirit Award. Ty Darlington (Oklahoma) earned the 2015 Wuerffel Trophy which recognizes community service along with athletic and academic success.

Competitive excellence, scholarship and sportsmanship are all equal components of the Big 12 philosophy. All-Big 12 teams and Academic All-Big 12 squads are recognized for each sport at the end of their respective seasons. At the end of each academic year, the Conference honors its top male and female student-athletes with the Big 12 Athlete of the Year and Big 12 Sportsperson of the Year awards.

Institutions can also nominate student-athletes for the prestigious Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarships. A total of 381 scholars have received over \$2.7 million in postgraduate financial aid through the first 20 years of the program.

The Big 12 sponsors 23 sports. Men's squads include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track \& field, outdoor track \& field, swimming \& diving, tennis and wrestling. Women's teams are fielded in basketball, cross country, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, indoor track \& field, outdoor track \& field, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming \& diving, tennis and volleyball.

Big 12 institutions create a league that encompasses five states and nearly 38 million people. Nearly 5,000 student-athletes from across the United States and around the World compete annually in the sports sponsored by the Conference.

The Conference conducts postseason championships for 20 of its 23 sports. Each championship helps to determine teams and/or individuals that will represent the Conference in national postseason competition.

In its first 20 years, the Big 12 has distributed approximately $\$ 2.6$ billion to its member institutions, including a record \$30.4 million per institution in 201516, an increase of 20 percent over the previous year. The Conference office is headquartered in Irving, Texas.

## BIG 12 HAS HIGH WIN TOTAL

The Big 12 recorded nine victories in the 2016 NCAA Championship, tied for the second-highest total of any conference in the nation. It was the most wins in March Madness for the league since 2012.

## TOP-RATED RPI

For the fourth time in seven years and the third straight campaign, the Big 12 ranked first in the nation in the RPI on Selection Sunday when it claimed the top spot in 2016. The Conference has been rated in the top five each of the past nine seasons.

## SEVEN IS A NUMBER WE'RE GETTING USED TO

For only the second time in NCAA Championship history, one conference has sent seven or more teams to the dance for three consecutive years. The Big 12 has done it each of the last three campaigns (2014, ' 15 , ' 16 ). Only the Big East can match the feat, doing so in 20II, ' 12 and ' 13 as well as from 2010-12 and 2008-10. The Big 12 has had seven teams earn NCAA bids four times since 2010.

## 70 PERCENT IS RARE ... AND BIG 12 HAS DONE IT THREE TIMES

The Big 12 had 70 percent of its teams in the NCAA field - just the seventh time in NCAA history that a conference has sent 70 percent of its teams. Five of the seven times have been by either the Big Eight or Big 12 Conferences.

## BIG 12 HAS SEEN SEVERAL IN FINAL FOUR

Over the last 15 years, the Big 12 has had eight teams advance to the Final Four - among the most of any conference in the nation.

## HIGH SEEDS SHOWCASED BIG 12 STRENGTH

Every single Big 12 team playing in the NCAAs wore the home uniform for its first game as league squads were all seeded from No. 1-No. 8. The average seed of Big 12 teams (4.1) last year was a league record. It is the eighth straight campaign that conference squads averaged 6.0 or better for seeding.

## BIG 12 ALSO RANKS HIGH ON OVERALL SEED LIST

In the overall seed list published by the NCAA, the Big 12 had three of the top nine teams - most of any conference in the nation. All seven schools were among the top 29 seeds - also the highest total nationally.

## THE MOST AMONG THE ELITE

The Big 12 has had two teams in the regional finals in five of the past nine seasons (2008, '09, 'I0, 'I2, 'I6). Eleven times in the last 15 years at least one conference squad has advanced to the Elite Eight. In addition, the Big 12 has had 21 regional finalists in the past 15 years - the most of any conference during that span.

## THREE TEAMS WERE SWEET

For the sixth time in Big 12 history, three teams advanced to the Sweet 16 in the same season as lowa State, Kansas and Oklahoma all played in regional semifinal matchups. The Big I2 has had at least one Sweet 16 team in all but one year in conference history, with multiple teams 13 times.

## SWEET SUCCESS FROM THE BIG 12

In the last 10 years, the Big 12 has the third-best winning percentage and the third-most victories in "Sweet I6" contests.

## BIG 12 COACHES HAVE WINNING EXPERIENCE

Every current Big 12 coach has led a team to the NCAA Tournament during their careers, with a total of 95 bids tallied by the entire group. Each coach that was in the NCAAs in 2016 has won at least one game in the event.

## TRIO OF ELITE COACHES WITH BIG 12 TIES

Six coaches have taken three schools to the Elite Eight and three have Big 12 ties. Lon Kruger, Bill Self and Eddie Sutton have accomplished the feat, along with John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Gene Bartow.

## STRONG RESULTS AT THE START

The Big 12 has done well at the start of the NCAA Championship. The league is $30-20$ (.600) in NCAA games in the round of 64 over the past eight seasons (2009-16). Since 2008, Big 12 teams are 35-2I (.625) in the same round and $38-21$ (.644) during the previous 10 tournaments.

## BIG 12 BASKETBALL IS ALWAYS WELL-REPRESENTED

The Big 12 has had at least five teams in the NCAA Tournament in nine consecutive seasons, while no fewer than six Big 12 squads have made the field in seven of the past nine years. A minimum of five NCAA bids have been earned 16 times in the 20-year history of the conference.

## THREE SCHOOLS IN UNIQUE GROUP

Baylor, Oklahoma and West Virginia were three of just 10 programs nationally to compete in a bowl game and the NCAA Men's and Women's Basketball Championships during the 2015-16 season. The Big 12 leads all conferences with the most schools in this elite group.

## RANKINGS REGULARS

Nine of 10 teams in the Big 12 have been ranked in the top 25 since 2014, with every team in the conference having been ranked at least once since the 2010 campaign.

Entering the 2016-17 season, at least one conference squad has been ranked every week since the Big I2 began competition in I996-97, a span of 387 consecutive weeks.

## SEC / BIG I2 CHALLENGE

## CONTINUES IN JANUARY

For the second straight year, the Big 12 and SEC will meet up to play 10 games in one day on Saturday, January 28. The two conferences have arranged a mutual bye date for the fourth annual event and ESPN will provide exclusive coverage of all 10 games on its networks.


ESPN's College GameDay Covered by State Farm - the Saturday morning and evening roadshow that discusses the top storylines of the college basketball season - will originate from one of the Challenge games, to be announced at a later date.

The Big 12 is 20-10 (.667) in the Challenge, having won the series in each of its first three seasons. The Big I2 has posted a 48-30 (.6I5) record in the last two conference challenge series it has played (vs. Pac-10, SEC) dating back to 2007.

Over the past four years, Big I2 teams are 40-23 (.635) against SEC foes.

## BIG 12 A REGULAR PLAYER IN NBA DRAFT

In recent years, Big 12 players has been fixtures in the annual NBA Draft. The Big 12 has had at least one player selected among the top II picks each of the past II seasons (2006-I6).

The Big l2 boasts 24 first-round picks in the last seven years. A total of 43 Big 12 players have been drafted since 2010 , with nine or more players picked in the same draft three times since 2008.

The Big I2 has had at least four players drafted in 12 of the last 13 years. Overall, there have been 15 times in the 20-year draft history of the Big 12 that at least four athletes have been chosen.

## PHILLIPS 66 BIG 12 MEN’S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship will continue in Kansas City in 2017, with Sprint Center hosting the league championship for the eighth time. All IO institutions will participate with seeding based on regular season finish. The top six squads in the conference standings earn first-round byes. The Big 12 champion earns the league's automatic bid to the 68-team NCAA Championship field. The entire Big 12 Championship will be televised nationally on ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU.

## CHAMPIONSHIP TIEBREAKING PROCEDURES

Seeding for the championship will be based upon regular-season competition. The winner of the postseason basketball championship shall be declared the Big 12 automatic qualifier to the NCAA Championship. A team ineligible under NCAA or Big I2 rules for postseason competition shall not compete in the championship

Tiebreakers - The first criteria in the breaking of ties in the standings shall be head-to-head competition of tied teams. The following procedure will be used to establish the postseason championship seeds when ties exist.

Ties Involving Two Teams.
Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season. If teams remain tied, then:
i. Each team's record versus the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage. When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tiebreaking procedures), rather than the performance against individual tied teams. The lone exception to this guideline would be if there are only two tied teams in the group placement and one of the teams won both regular-season games. In this instance, the tie is deemed broken and comparison of the seed rather than the placement will be utilized.

## ii. A comparison of the tied teams Conference-games only road record.

iii. A comparison of the tied teams Conference games only road record versus the team(s) occupying the highest position in the final Conference regular season standings, and then counting down through the standings until one team gains an advantage. When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams. The lone exception to this guideline would be if there are only two tied teams in the group placement and one of the teams won both regular-season games. In this instance, the tie is deemed broken and comparison of the seed rather than the placement will be utilized.
iv. Draw. In the event tiebreaking procedures are unsuccessful and a draw is necessary in determining any portion of seeding, the following procedure will be used:
(I) The draw will be conducted in public or with media attendance.
(2) Institutions involved in the drawing have the right to have a local representative in attendance at the drawing;
(3) A single slip of paper for each institution (with name or logo) will be placed into a container and will be drawn in order of seeding from highest to lowest.

Ties involving more than two teams.
Results from the collective head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams in a mini round-robin format, ranking the tied teams by winning percentage from highest to lowest will be used to determine the seeds.
i. If during this process two teams remain tied with the same winning percentage, the two-team tiebreaking system is used, starting with head-to-head results.
ii. If during this process more than two teams remain tied with the same winning percentage, a second mini round-robin format is implemented, ranking the remaining tied teams by winning percentage from highest to lowest to determine seeds. If the teams remain tied, then the twoteam tiebreaking system is used, starting with head-to-head results.
b. If more than two teams are still tied, each of the tied team's record versus the team occupying the highest position in the final regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standings, eliminating tied teams with inferior records until one team gains an advantage. When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tiebreaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams. The lone exception to this guideline would be if there are only two tied teams in the group placement and one of the teams won both regular-season games. In this instance, the tie is deemed broken and comparison of the seed rather than the placement will be utilized.
c. If more than two teams are still tied, a comparison of the tied teams Conference games only road record.
d. If more than two teams are still tied, a comparison of the tied teams Conference games only road records versus the team(s) occupying the highest position in the final Conference regular season standings, and then continuing down through the standing until one team gains an advantage. If at any point the multiple-teams tie is reduced to two teams, the two-team tie breaking procedures above will be applied.

## BIG 12 BASKETBALL TELEVISION DISTRIBUTION

The Big 12 Conference maintains long-term television agreements to ensure the greatest exposure for its men's basketball programs. Included below is a breakdown of these rights and how they affect which games are televised, and when they are shown.

ESPN has the rights to 100-105 games, plus all games of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship. Of those contests:
> Forty-three games (minimum of 30 Conference games) will be televised on either ESPN or ESPN2
> Guaranteed national telecasts on Monday, Wednesday and Saturdays during Conference play
> Ability to sublicense 20 additional games to a national over-the-air or cable outlet
> Up to 40 games per year on ESPNU and six additional games on ESPN3

## Appearance Requirements

There are no appearance requirements (minimums or maximums) for games on the various ESPN platforms.

## Game Times/Exclusive Windows

There are only a few exclusive windows in men's basketball. Institutional packages are restricted from televising games during Big Monday telecast windows and Saturday prime times windows when a Big 12 school is hosting College Game Day. Those are fully protected two-hour windows.

## Distribution of Institutional (Local) Package Games

ESPN controls the national/regional distribution of games and the contract may limit the geographical reach of institutional (third-tier or local) package games to the state(s) of the participating team(s).

The guidelines for the distribution of these games include the following.
> Telecasts may be distributed only within the states (and overlapping DMAs) of the two participating teams, except when a game is distributed via a member institution branded outlet. The visiting team is not guaranteed the ability to take the game back to its home market(s)
> At its option, institutions may present the telecasts to ESPN for placement on ESPN Full Court
> In many instances, unselected games produced as part of the local package may be distributed by school websites

## Revenue Distribution Process

Basketball television revenue is divided equally among all member institutions. Each member retains the revenue it receives for their local package telecasts.
