Energy Awareness Week emphasizes conservation

Energy Awareness Week is observed by Marine Corps Air Station Kaneohe Bay Oct. 27through Nov. 2 as a part of the Department of the Navy's program to emphasize the importance of energy conservation says Shelley Kaya, facilities engineer.

Products that can save energy and tips on energy conservation are featured at Navy Exchanges worldwide during the week.

MANY EXCHANGES set up special energy-saving centers to highlight items such as insulation, caulking, blankets, insulated draperies, auto tune-up parts and other items that assist families in saving energy. Since energy makes day-to-day living possible, it is important to be consciencious of energy conservation so that there will be enough energy to meet our needs in the future. The supply of fossils fuels is limited yet demands keep rising. By using energy more efficiently, we can save our natural resources, the environment and money.

Here are a few tips:

Here are a few tips:
Insulating hot water heaters is an expensive way to save money. While hot water heaters are insulated an extra coat on the outside can save approximately \$10 to \$20 per year.

If you use air conditioning, you can save between \$25 and \$30 by simply keeping windows and doors closed and curtains and shades tighly drawn. Keeping a cool washing machine is another no-cost way of saving energy. Switching to the lowest temperature setting on your washing machine can have a major impact on your utility bills.

IT TAKES ABOUT 35 gallons of water to do a full wash and rinse and approximately 16 gallons for each cycle. The amount of hot water depends on

which button you push.

Using a hot wash and warm rinse normally costs \$100 a year. Changing the rinse water to "cold," which experts say will not affect the wash results, can amount to savings of \$75 per year. If you go up one notch to a "warm" wash

and "cold" rinse, it's more money in your pocket.

Energy can also be saved while driving. Regular tune ups, changing the airfilter when dirty, using proper gas and oil and maintaining correct tire

pressure, coupled with obeying the 55 mph speed limit, is a proven way of saving 50 percent of normal driving costs.

WHILE SHOPPING, it pays to assess the real value of your purchases. Buying long-lasting products eliminates frequent replacement and saves money and resources. Recyclables such as steel, glass; aluminum and paper can be re-used to help stretch natural resources which will end up as a

Savings is what it's all about. If energy conservation was a part of every family's life-style it would help extend our supplies and reduce import burdens. If we continue to use energy as we've become accustomed, we may find ourselves in trouble before the year 2007.



How much do Ma-rines in Hawaii know about Article 15 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice? If they're like the majority of servicepersons, chances are they know very little about non-judicial punishment or, what they think they know doesn't coincide with the way the system actually works. This unfamiliarity is particularly common among enlisted person-

Try these questions. Who may be punished under Article 15? What punishments may be imposed and how do the procedures differ from a court-martial? What rights does an individual have under

Here are the answers to these and other frequently asked questions as derived from the manual for courts-

WHEN IS Article 15 imposed? Nonjudicial punishment is often used in response to failure to obey regula-tions, short unauthor-ized absences, failure to go to appointed place of duty and other minor UCMJ violations.

WHO MAY im-

pose nonjudicial punishment? In the Navy and Marine Corps nonjudicial punishment may be imposed only by commanding of-ficers. Before exer-cising authority under Article 15, the officer is required to thoroughly evaluate each case on an individual basis The amount of punishment a commander can impose is also limited the rank the officer

WHAT punish-ments may be award-ed? Commanders are encouraged to take full udvuntage of non-punitive disciplinary measures, but once the commander has de-cided to impose Article 15 und the individual has accepted Article 15, the commander must decida the amount of type of punishment to be imposed. Punish-ment depends on the seriousness of the

offense, the grade of the offender, the grade of the commander imthe commander imposing the punishment and any extenuating or mitigating circumstances (i.e. past performance, the reason the offense was committed, whether a committed, whether a certain type of punishment may cause undue hardship on the offend-

Punishment can include reduction in grade, forfeiture of a portion of a member's pay, detention of a portion of pay, placing the offender in correc-tional custody, assign-ment of extra duties, and certain combina-tions of these punish-

WHAT ARE the service person's rights? Before Article 15 can be imposed, a member is given certain rights to given certain rights to ensure the procedure and any punishments received are fair and just. Article 15 cannot be imposed without first notifying the alleged offender of his offense and of the commander's intent to impose nonjudicial punishment. punishment.

The service persone must then be informed of his rights with respect to the proposed punishment. One of the most important of these rights is the right to consult with an at-torney. The member may also request a private hearing with the commander, and submit written statements or present wit-nesses which set forth defenses and mitiga-ting or extenuating circumstunces surrounding the offense.

HOW DOES Article 15 differ from a court-martial? The accused's decision to demand trial by court-martial involves a number of considerations and should not be made without the advice of

between Article 15 and triul by court-martial is the permancy of the record, the amount of punishment that can be imposed and the formality of the proceedings. Unlike a court-martial, Article 15 involves no formal proceedings, no judge and no jury. Further, the maximum punishment imposable under Article 15 is less than the maximum punish the maximum punish ment that may be

imposed as the result of

The main difference

being found guilty in a trial by court-murtial. The most significant difference is that conviction by court-martial is a Federal court conviction which remains part of an individual's criminal record, even after the individual has been separated from the ervice. An Article 15 does not amount to a Federal court convic tion. It is merely placed in the person's service record book where it remains for two years or until the individual separates, whichever is

WHEN IS non-judicial punishment imposed? Only after the accused has had the chance to consult with legal counsel and submit statements does a commander actually

punishment. Once the punishment has been imposed, the offender has 15 days in which to submit an appeal, which will not be considered by the commander who im-posed the punishment, but the next higher authority.


The grounds for uppeal are based on whether the accused feels the punishment awurded was too severe for the offense committed. Only the severity of the punishment may be

The individual may request the punishment be suspended, reduced, remitted or set aside in whole or in part. In the meantime, the individual may be punished as adjudged. Punishments involving restriction, correctional custody and other forms of personal restraint are held in abeyance until a decision on the appeal has been reached.

THE POINT to remember is that non-judicial punishment is intended primarily to promote discipline and improve behavior in the command Persons further information on Article 15 procedures should contact their unit legal assistance officer.

Students' visit adds understand

EDITOR'S NOTE:

series. The first segment reports on the
success of a human
relations project inrealing 150 Castle EDITOR'S NOTE: relations project in volving 150 Castle High School students and personnel of MCAS Kaneohe Bay. The second addresses past and present causes for the Windward youth conflicts, as identified by 228 students from four local high schools.

The purpose of this MCAS human relations project is to better relations where community assault statis tics indicate they are needed most: that is, single, male Marines and local youths between the ages of 15 and 24. The high school students were selected because of their age proximity to the because of their acco bility through the school system.

THE PILOT project began in April several visits classrooms of Castle High School. Initially, the students were asked to describe, in writing, their feelings toward Marines and the reasons they thought conflicts arose between Marines and local youths. Following that, a slide show was presented depicting many of the positive community, environ-mental and humanitarian, as well as national defense functions

Marines serve.
Days later, the students were taken on class tours of the air station/1st Marine Brigade facility. Various student tour activities included: firing blank rounds from an M-16 rifle; because of their age examining various jet proximity to the fighter and helicopter conflicting group and aircraft; going for a

spin in an amphiblous tracked vehicle; view-ing scenic Windward Oahu from atop Kansas Tower; watching the air station Crash Crew Marines extinguish a demonstration fire; firing a shoulder harnessed missile harnessed missile tauncher (Dragon) simulator; observing the brigade's 1980 "Super Squad" Ma-rines attack a fortified enemy position; and feasting at a C-rations cookout or the all-you-can-eat luncheon at the brigade dining facility.

Every tour effort was

geared toward pro-moting the maximum

of the students and Marines.

ON THE DAY following the tour, the students completed showed that 96 percent of the students thought the tour was a positive experience (marking either "good" or "great"). Ninety-four percent further reported the project was a

Before the human relations project began, 28 percent of the students recorded positive opinions of Marines, 40 percent were neutral and 32 percent had negative opinions. After the tour, 92 percent of the students reported positive opinions of Marines. In short, the project was a success. Quite simply, it provided the necessary opportunity for Marines and students to come together in a positive setting, where they could discover each other's human-

THE HUMAN relations project was conducted during the last month of the 1979-80 school year. This is the reason there was only time to include one of the four Windward

high schools on the tours. The results were so overwhelmingly positive, however, that they clearly indicate such programs have a tremendous potential for improving militarythe Windward youth populations. The 1980-81 school year represents an even greater opportunity to expand and refine these human





Even though most of us don't really believe in the weird creatures associated with this occasion, we do find ourselves thinking about scary things—witches, bone-rattling skeletons and evil, unnatural happenings.

In story, verse and song, witches have always been portrayed as evil, wart-nosed hags who put cruel whammies on unsuspecting individuals, only to be foiled at their own game by good and wise persons who thus become the heroes of the saga. But that is not always the case. A recent song about a witch in the bayou country of Louisiana says she made a mana millionaire because he promised to marry her. But after he got his million, he decided

not to marry her, so she did away with him.
The belief in witches, however, predates recent history. The ancient Egyptians and Romans believed in witches. During the 16th and 17th centuries, thousands of

women were tortured and killed after they had been charged with practicing witchcraft in England. There were many persecutions of Suspected witches in the early American colonies of Massachusetts, Connecticut and Virginia. Through the influence of Cotton Mather, a New England witch hunter of that day, there were widely-publicized executions of so-called witches in Salem, Mass.

Although the belief in broomstick-riding, spell-custing witches is no longer common.

spell-custing witches is no longer common, witch hunts by other names still continue, often based on fears as unfounded as the superstitions of a less enlightened age. In another context but with related significance, President Franklin D. Roosevelt's message to congress in 1941 emphusized the importance of human freedoms, especially "freedom from fear."

Halloween will come and go—and the witches and goblins with it—but our confrontations with superstition still remain. The fight to free ourselves from superstition—unfounded feelings and beliefs, prejudices, etc.—continues. One English writer has said, "Fear is the main superstition and content of the source of superstition, and one of the main sources of cruelty. To conquer fear is the beginning of wisdom."

Sailing skills open new frontier

Mastering the skills of handling a sallboat is an exhibitanting experience. Once acquired, these skills open a new frontier on the ripples of Kancohe Bay. All that is needed to experience this frontier of freedom is a sailboat and a license.

THE MCAS Kane-ohe Bay Special Ser-vices, Station Marina presently has eight sailboats available for patrons at the air station to take out for their enjoyment. They include six main-sail Laser sailboats, one 13-foot jib-sail/main-sail

Puffer, and one 19-foot Lightning boat. The 19-foot Lightning sailboat was turned over to the MCAS Special Services Office from the docks of Pearl from the docks of Pearl Harbor Naval Base a month ago.

CAPT JAMES Da vis, adjutant and special services officer, Marine Barracks, Marine Barracks, Hawaii at Pearl Harbor, requested Headquarters Marine Corps approv-al to have the hoat relocated at the MCAS

marina.

Marine Barracks had no further use for the sailboat, which had been docked there for a long period of time. Special Services at Kaneohe Bay has made several plans to put the Lightning boat and all their new floating additions to good use.

THE BOATS will be

used as rental boats for persons carrying licenses which state they can safely operate them. For sailors who have the experience to operate the boats but no license, the personnel at Special Services

have taken care of that

as well. Patrons who wish to qualify for operation of the Laser and Puffer sailboats, the smallest of the fleet, can do so by of the fleet, can do so by taking a written and practical boat test at the marina for a minimal fee. A small fee added to that of the initial testing can qualify a person for a license to sail the Lightning and Apollo sailboats, the largest in the marina's fleet.

the marina's fleet. ROY BENDEL, sailboat licensing instructor at the station marina, explained, "All marina, explained, "All testing and practical application training is done here. Classes are held every Wednesday. Thursday, Saturday and Sunday. People have the option of choosing between two morning classes from 9 a.m. till noon or two forces classes from the started or the same classes from the same classes are the same afternoon classes from 1 to 5 p.m.

"The requirements call for persons to have six hours in the classroom and two hours of practical applications. An additional four hours is required in the practical application portion cal application portion before one of our students receives a boating license





According to FDA surveys from the mid'70s, choosing appropriate foods for a nutritionally well-balanced diet doesn't mean just the variety of

foods eaten.
The choice of foods which provide the proper nutrients for a healthy body should be selected from the four main food groups; milk, meat, bread and wegetables (fruits included). A diet of these foods supplies enough needed cafories, protein, vitamins and minerals, if served properly. Generally, a well balanced diet can be maintained by including two or more servings from each of the four main food groups each day.

It isn't absolutely sary to eat meat, fish or poultry to stay healthy. Vegetarians do not damage their health by omitting this food group. If you disagree with statement namber two, you have been slightly misinformed, according to the FDA survey.

As long as there are

enough dairy foods consumed to replace enough dairy foode consumed to replace the meat group, they can readily provide the high quality protein that meats supply. Alternatives, such as peanut butter or eggs, can add protein needed for the body's health. Strict vegetarians

Strict vegetarians who do not eat eggs or dairy products, may have a difficult time have a difficult time providing themselves with an adequate protein diet. They may require vitamin B supplements.

It's often supposed that snacks ruin a properly maintained diet. The fact of the matter is that put titing.

matter is that nutritional value is mainly dependent on the types dependent on the types of foods eaten. If you agree with statement three, you are correct.

A hard boiled egg, an orange and a tuna sandwich as a snack

can contribute to a well balanced diet because they carry high protein values. However, heavy consumption of junk food snacks such as candy, potato chips and soft drinks, all of which are relatively high in calories and low in nutritional value, can be harmful to health. When they take the place of nutritious foods during regular meals. they're even

more harmful. If you agree with three quarters of the people surveyed by the FDA you believe that eating fresh home-cooked vegetables is cooked vegetables is preferable and more Pioneer's Choice Specials

nutritious. The FDA considered their beliefs

wrong.
The reason they claim these people are incorrect about fresh, frozen or canned vege-tables is that the content of nutrients available in vegetables depends on the way they are cooked and stored, According to the administration, vege-tables lose nutrients during the cooking process and in storage, even factory storage.

Overcooking destroys manu nutrients. Cook-ing vegetables in excessive water loses many valuable water-soluble vitamins, such as C and some of the B

as C and some of the B vitamins.
Storing fresh vegetables at improper temperatures for periods of time, or keeping them in open containers also contributes to a reduction in nutrient values. Vegetables begin to grow older faster.

Retained nutritional value really depends on the way vegetables are handled and prepared. rather than whether they are bought canned, frozen or fresh.

Being a smart con-sumer means buying the right things at the right prices. Freed

right prices. Food purchase is an important process for the majority of American consumers. Baying the proper foods for yourself and your family can be a big





New Zone C Marines rate reenlistment payment

Active duty Marines with 10 to 14 years of service now rate a zone C reenlistment bonus in various fields.

To be eligible for a zone C selective reenlistment bonus, the enlisted member must have completed at least 10 but no more than 14 years of active service on the date of reenlistment or by the end of an extension of enlistment.

THEY MUST also reenlist or voluntarily extend their enlist ment for a period of at least three years, provided that the reenlistment or extension, when coupled with existing active service will provide a total of 14 years active service, and members must not have received a zone C SRB. the reenlistment bonus maximum of \$12,000 has been raised to \$16,000.

Marines enter royal domain of Neptunus Rex

ABOARD THE USS NEW ORLEANS Sept. 2 — Hundreds of Marines and sailors from the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit and their shipmates were initiated into the solemn mysteries of the order of the deep this morning when their ship crossed to Mombasa, Kenya for a liberty visit.

His Majesty, King Neptunus Rex, along with his bride, child and royal staff, came aboard the evening of Sept. 1 to begin

To wit, they had alluded to cover their bodies and enter their minds a certain amount of slime that is usually found on pollywogs and other lower specimens of the lower specimens of the realm."

wopery, chit request-ing, apple polishing, sympathy secking, gundecking, procrasti-nating, goldbricking, reveille neglecting and liberty hounding" were also brought.

The day of reckoning found pollywogs humbling themselves and pleading their cases before the royal court. The benevolent pre-siding judges pre-scribed a suitable penance, the exact nature of which is one of the most highly of the most mgnly guarded secrets of the deep.

MOMBASA, KENYA, Sept. 7 — Warm weather and person-able people greeted Marines and sailors of the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit during their recent port visit to this East African coastal

Thirty-first Marine Amphibious Unit personnel and their shipmates from the USS New Orleans and USS Vancouver stop-ned in Morphage for ped in Mombasa for four days of liberty following a month-long Indian Ocean deployment aboard the ships of the Navy's Amphi-bious Squadron One.

IN MILD tempera-tures in the 80 s, American servicemen

wandered the streets of the city, shopped numerous curio stands, relaxed at sidewalk cafes and lounged at beach resorts.

At the souvenir huts, Marines and sailers bargained with mer-chants over the amount of Kenvan shillings to be paid for wooden carvings of animals, brasswork, Kenyan jade and other articles.

"BARGAINING over prices was really an unusual experience," commented Sgt Eric Young, 21, of Farmington, Conn., a logistics clerk with the Headquarters element. "After you got used to it, though, it was really

a lot of fun. I got some good deals and had a good time doing it," said the sergeant as he packed away his menugerie of wooden jungle creatures.

Patrick Kithuku, 32, a dealer in teak and ebony carvings, de-scribed the Americans with whom he dealt to be "quite sociable, very friendly. Of course, their visiting does bring a definite increase in business, too. For both reasons, we'd like to see them visit more frequently."

FAVORITE August to April vaca-tion spot for European tourists because of its beaches and laissez-faire lifestyle, Mombasa offers quite a cosmopolitan setting. From a sidewalk cafe table, one can pick out smatterings of conversations in English, Swahili, German, Indian and other

Attire is similarly varied; walking down most any street one can meet Indian women in traditional sarongs, West German tourists in European designer fashions, Moslems in Islamic garb on their way to one of several Mosques and Kenyans or Englishmen western-style clothing.

MOST KENYANS speak "London-tinged" English dating from British Crown colony days prior to the nation's gaining in-dependence in 1963. British influence is evident while riding in a cab or driving a rental car; traffic flows on the left-hand side of the

Influence of the English aside, though, it is obvious that Kenya is its own nation.

Shoppers in most places of business are met by the gazes, from large black and white portraits, of the two men who have served as president of Kenya since the republic was formed: the current head of state Daniel T. Arap Moi, and the first president, national hero Mzee Jome Ken-

A GOOD selection of international restaurants and a fairly

active nightlife added to the enjoyment of visiting Mombasa.

went into Mombasa carrying very little money and still had a great time," said Cpl Lance Scarlott, 23, of Burbank, Calif., a plateon guide with Company F, Battalion Landing Team 2/3, the ground combat element of the unit. "Off the main streets I dis covered some outstand-ing places to eat where prices were low, atmosphere was good and the quality of food was excellent."

Revisions improve line charge mines

QUANTICO, Va. modernize and update countermine warfare, the Marine Corps is revising the M58A1 Line Charge

Mine.
The line charge mine detonates previously enemy-set mines and mine fields, as well as destroying physical troop movement coun-termeasures such as barbed wire and cut underbrush.

At present, the line charge mine consists of a cord of C4 explosives trailing behind a rocket which is launched from a stationary launch pad and rail. The pad and rail. The mine's total weight is in

excess of 300 pounds, and requires the operators to be exposed to hostile fire during the initial "set up" time (approximately one hoar) and during

"In an effort to alleviate the problem of hostile fire and lack of mobility, we have designed a new de-livery system," said Maj Marshall Foore, mine warfare developmental project officer, Development Center.

Recently designed at MCDEC and tested at the Marine Corps Combat Training Center, Twentynine Palms, Calif., is a trailer that incorporthe presently ng line charge existing line charge line, launch pad, rail and a redesigned generator trailer. The newly designed trailer and mine can be

trailer and mine can be towed behind such vehicles as Landing Vehicle Tracked Per-sonnel 7 or the M60 battle tank. It can withstand rugged terrain as well as accomplish launch and detonation from within the confines of the

Also under development is an increased propulsion rocket to enable the effective delivery of the line charge. The present rocket system doesn't always extend the line charge to its optimum length due to the drag indaced by the charge.

When fully delivered, the line charge measures 350 feet or nearly 117 meters, and incorporates more than 1,750 poands of C4 in its charges.

Presently being considered is the Pomins line charge Pomins line charge system, designed by the Israeli Army. The system lends manportability to land mine

warfare. Pomins is a manportable system incor-porating a 30-meter line charge operated from a backpack/launching rail. Once projected onto the mine field and detonated, the anti-personnel mine neu-tralizes all mines within a 1x30 meter area, allowing person-nel movement through

mine warfare.

the previously active mine field. However, the Marine Corps is not the only organization apdating and modernizing land

"The Russians have incorporated mine warfare into every defensive and offensive unit in their command, from land-based armor to the highly mobile air force." said Foore.

Each Russian division is staffed with four

armored mine layers and 12 towed mine layers, which are totally mechanized. The use of air-delivered scatterable mines has also become

an integral part of the Soviet "mine defense." The Soviets have developed their capabilities to the extent of effectively laying 30,000 to 40,000 mines

In less than 36 hours.
"With the employment of effective countermeasures, we can take the sting away from the punch demine warfare," cluded Foore.





Selected Leathernecks master defense skills urvival: against nuclear, biological and chemical agents

Since World War II the United States has devoted many resources to the development and deployment of strategic weaponry and conven-tional military forces. Not only has this been done to be prepared in case of war, but also as a measure to deter foreign hostile confron-tations and to deal with potentially dangerous contingencies.

THERE IS one specific contingency that selected Marines from various deployable units of the lst
Marine Brigade, are,
studying more closely
now than ever before the possibility of battle against nuclear, bio-logical or chemical weapons.

In Building 1027, an average of 32 to 40 Marines are assigned to attend the brigade's NBC Defense Training School. The course is

directed by WO-1 Edward Avacilla, officer-in-charge of the NBC School, and SSgt Donald Haight, class instructor.

The purpose of instruction offered by the school is to teach Marines how to detect areas contaminated by radiation or chemical agents and to be able to survive in that environ-

MANY news sources claim that the U.S. military is unprepared for defense against NBC attacks and is lacking sufficient training in this area. However, in recent months Marines de-ploying to the Western Pacific regions of the globe from the 1st Marine Brigade on Cobunged to ly train for Marine Brigade on Oahu not only train for NBC warfare in garri-son, but also while

full scale level of readiness in NBC warfare is new to the Marines, it is a course of study they readily accept. As one Marine in the class stated, "Put me in an environment where I have to keep that mask on my face or whatever else to stay alive, and I guarantee you it will be done."

AS PAST world situations have shown, when U.S. decision-makers wish to quickly involve ground forces in a situation, or at least pose a threat, their first choice is the

their first choice is the Marine Corps.

Today's Marines are expected to be no exception. As a result of the present unstable world situation, men the present unstable world situation, men attending the brigade NBC classes are being equipped, trained and organized for quick reaction.

Though attaining a pointed out, "During the Marines' training here, some are required to make presentations to the class on what they have learned. Also, upon completing the class these men are able to go back to their units and conduct classes for their own unit members."

WHILE IN THE class, Haight empha-sizes to the men in his introductory lecture the nuclear, biological and chemical strengths of the Russian army and how "the red army is considered our biggest threat when it comes to NBC tactics."

"Russia has proven they will use all means possible to win a war," said Haight in a stern

Although this training is relatively new brigade Marines, their brigade Marines, their attentiveness in the classroom shows a keen interest in the training. When asked why such a large interest in NBC exists, Burmley replied, "The float units want to be sure they have their sure they have their teams ready for NBC and are capable of handling a situation."

The men are given a knowledge of what will happen and what to expect when a nuclear weapon is detonated by learning' the basic structure of components, chemical make-up and fusion weaponry.

Students participate in a simulated class-room exercise called a "radioactive chemical survey," in which the survey," in which the men take readings in the "contaminated" areas.
The practical appli-

cation in the men's training involves NBC points that each team must monitor and report their readings to reports using radios and other detection apparatus. They emus. outdoor practical application exercises and exams, they receive a diploma and are sent back to their units for assignment to unit NBC teams.

Haight revealed, "The Russians train their people in NBC or nuclear biological radiology beginning at age eight. By the time they reach ninth grade they had at least 140 hours of NBC training before entering the military."

AVACILLA concluded, "We take 10 days to teach these Marines that their purpose is to master the skill of detection and

to be able to stay alive if placed in the area of an NBC attack."

The question of nuclear proliferation and the long term effects that it may have are questions that may remain present and unanswered for a long time, However, this 10 day NBC course of instruc-NBC course of instruc-tion ensures that if such an attack should prepared.
