



## Courts-Martial Report

LCpl. Gregory S. Hill, 2/3, was convicted during a Special Court-Martial, Oct. 4, of using marijuana on two occasions and wrongful possession of marijuana. He was sentenced to forfeit \$100 a month for five months; confinement at hard labor for five months; and a reduction to private.

LCpl. Randy W. Edde, 2/3, was convicted during a Special Court-Martial, Oct. 16, of unauthorized absence from July 10, 1982, to Sept. 7, 1984. He was sentenced to forfeit \$390 a month for five months; be reduced to private; confinement at hard labor for five months; and to receive a Bad Conduct Discharge.

LCpl. Kevin S. Green, H&MS-24, was convicted during a Special Court-Martial, Oct. 23, of two counts of distributing marijuana and LSD. He was sentenced to forfeit \$250 a month for five months; be reduced to private; and confined at hard labor

LCpl. Lawrence E. Harrison, VMFA-235, MAG-24, was convicted during a General Court-Martial, Aug. 31, of conspiracy to commit an assault consumated by a battery on another Marine; and committing an assault upon another Marine by stabbing him. He was sentenced to be confined at hard labor for one year; to receive a Bad Conduct Discharge; and reduced to private.

LCpl. Jeffrey Dees, MAG-24, was convicted during a General Court-Martial, July 26, of intentionally inflicting grievous

bodily harm upon another Marine by stabbing him; and compiracy to commit housebreaking and aggravated assault. He was sentenced to forfeit all pay and allowances; be reduced to private; be confined at hard labor for two years; and to receive a Bad Conduct Discharge.

Sgt. James E. Webb, MAG-24, was convicted during a General Court-Martial, June 18, of intentionally inflicting grievous bodily harm upon another Marine by stabbing hin; and conspiracy to commit housebreaking. He was sentenced to forfeit \$596 a month for 24 months; be reduced to private; be confined at hard labor for two years; and to receive a Bad Conduct Discharge.

LCpl. William M. Brooks Jr., MAG-24, was convicted during a General Court-Martial, June 12, of attempting to murder another Marine by stabbing him; and conspiracy to commit an aggravated assault. He was sentenced to forfeit all pay and allowances; be reduced to private; be confined at hard labor for 10 years; and to receive a Dishonorable Discharge.

LCpl. Dan T. Nakamura, H&HS; was convicted during a Special Court-Martial, June 11, of stealing two computers, two video cassette recorders, one stereo equalizer, two remote telephones, one stereo cassette recorder and one radio/headphone set valued in excess of \$1,800 from the Marine Corps Exchange. He was sentenced to forfeit \$397 a month for six months; be reduced to private; be confined at hard labor for six months; and to receive a Bad.Conduct Discharge.

## New training system under development

The U.S. Navy has awarded McDonnell Douglas Corpora-tion a contract, valued at \$438 million, for full-scale development of the T-45 Training System.
The training system will be

used to train up to 600 Navy aviators a year for carrier-based fighter and attack squadrons Using the system, the Navy expects to cut the cost of training pilots by 50

percent.

McDonnell Douglas will be responsible for all elements of the system, including the aircraft, both simulators, academic astruction, logistics support and a computer-based training integration, system training integration system. This is the first time the military las bought a complete training system with

complete training system with a single contractor.

The Douglas Aircraft Company division of McDonnell Douglas is the prime contractor and system integrator on the T-45 Training System. Teamed with McDonnell Douglas are British Aerospace, upon which the Hawk aircraft design, the T-45A trainer, is based; Sperry Corporation provides the Corporation provides the simulators, and Rolls Royce the aircraft engines. Savings with T45TS will

result from a combination of factors:
A more fuel-efficient aircraft

Requirement for fewer aircraft because advanced simulators will be used to reduce flying time needed to qualify pilots; Lower maintenance costs on aircraft and ground equip-

ment; and

ment; and
Fewer ,people needed to
maintain the training system.
Some 300 T-45A aircraft are
needed for the Navy's training
requirements. McDonnell
Douglas and British Aérospace will build the aircraft
jointly, with final assembly to
be done in Long Beach.

Under terms of the contract

Under terms of the contract, McDonnell Douglas will build two test aircraft. Construction of those test aircraft will begin late next year, with first flight scheduled for late 1987.

McDonnell Douglas and British Aerospace are modifying the Hawk design to make the plane capable of aircraft carrier landings and takeoffs. The changes include a dual-wheel nose landing gear and catapult bar; strengthened main landing gear; a tail hook to catch carrier-deck arresting cables; relocated speed brakes; and general structural strengthening to accommodate the stresses of carrier operations.

Present plans call for work to begin on the first 12 production aircraft in 1988. Those aircraft, along with the associated ground training systems, are scheduled to be in presenting with the Marrier operation with the Navy in 1990 at the Naval Air Station at Kingaville, Texas. The T45TS program calls for Sperry to build two types of

simulators — operational flight trainers with wide-view visual systems, and instru-ment flight trainers. The two simulators have a high degree of commonality to keep costs

Sperry will rely heavily on the technology now used in the F/A-18 Hornet simulators it is building for the Navy Many of the pilots trained in the T45TS will eventually be flying in the McDonnell Douglas F/A-18.

Some 30-35 percent of the academic work during training will be done through computer-aided instruction programs, which will allow the student aviator to proceed at his own pace and get more individualized instruction in less classroom time.

The training integration system will provide the most efficient use of aircraft, classrooms, simulators, instructors and other resources through computer-aided scheduling and management of the various parts of the training system training system.

#### Memorial added to Park Service

On April 27, 1979, a group of On April 27, 1979, a group of Vietnam veterans formed the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund (VVMF) so Vietnam veterans would have "a tangible symbol of recognition by American society," says Jan Scruggs, president and founder of the VVMF.

On Veterans Day, November 11, Secretary of the Interior William Clark is scheduled to within Clark is scheduled to accept the Vietnam Veterans Memorial — built through VVMF efforts — as a new addition to the federal government's National Park Service System.

The VVMF was set up as a nonprofit charitable organic

nonprofit, charitable organinonpront, charitable organization. No government money was used to build the memorial. Scruggs says the people of America were all saying "thank you to the veterans" when they donated almost \$9 million toward its construction.

construction.

A The U.S. government will be responsible for maintaining the memorial and the grounds. However, the VVMF will maintain a fund for catastrophic damages to the memorial, to maintain the etatue, and to update the names and symbols on the memorial.

## Statue overlooks Vietnam Memorial

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial sits on two acres in Constitution Gardens in Washington, D.C., dedicated to honor the "courage, sacrifice, and devotion to duty and country" of the approximately 2.7 million Americans who served in the war zone. Some 300,000 were wounded and approximately 75,000 permanently disabled.

Since the memorial was dedicated on Nov. 13, 1982; it has been visited by more than three million people many of

three million people, many of them friends and relatives of the more than 58,000 honored dead whose names line the black granite walls.

A jury of eight internationally recognized artists and designers - selected the memorial's design through a

memorial's design through a national competition.

Ms. Maya: Ying Lin, who submitted the winning design, wanted to create "...a park within a park, a quiet protected place unto itself." reason, she chose polished black granite for the two walls of the memorial. Its mirror-like

surface reflects the images of the surrounding trees, lawns, and monuments.

and monuments.
Each wall is 246 feet, 8 inches long. The East wall points to the Washington Monument and West wall points to the Lincoln Memorial. The walls are supported by 140 concrete pilings driven 35 feet into bedrock. The memorial is more than 10 feet tall at its highest point. The names were carved point: The names were carved using a computer-generated photo stencil sandblasting

process developed specifically for the memorial. The black granite used for the walls, safety curbs and walkways is from Bangalore, India, the only place in the world it could be obtained in the sizes obtained in the sizes required.

There are 58,007 names on the memorial. About 1,300 are classified as missing in action. Eight women, are listed: seven Army nurses and one Air Force nurse. There are no

The names are listed in

chronological order according to date of the casualty. The first men to die were military advisors, killed on July 8, 1959. The list of names starts and ends in the center of the two walls. Beginning with July 1959, the names read to the right to panel number 70 on the east wall. The names then continue on panel number 70 on the west wall, reading to the right, and reaching the center of the monument and the names of the last casualties in Cont. on A-8

Professional Women: Communications Issues" is the subject of the conference produced by the Hawaii Women Lawyers, the Hawaii chapter of the American Medical Women's Association, and the Hawaii chapter of the Society of Women Accoun-

## DACOWITS: more diversified and involved

HQMC — Its mission may be relatively unknown to the public, but since 1951, when Secretary of Defense George C. Marshall invited 50 women of distinguished accomplishments to visit him in Washington, the Defense Advisory Committee on Women in the Services has had a dramatic and far-reaching impact on all servicemembers,

women and men alike.
What Secretary Marshall
had in mind 33 years ago was to get more women volunteers to help out on the homefront during the Korean conflict. DACOWITS' first mission was to advise the secretary on how to bolster recruitment of women for the Armed Forces, increase their retention rate and better utilize their capabilities. Their efforts paid

Through a nationwide recruiting program, public appearances and field trips to military installations, DACOWITS was instrumental in helping the services overcome their manpower shortage — nearly 50,000 women served on active duty at the peak of the Korean conflict.

Today, the committee's purpose is broader in scope. Its membership, appointed in three-year terms by the Secretary of Defense, remains a diverse group of professional and accomplished citizens chosen on the basis of their outstanding reputations in business, the professions, public service and civic leadership.

Its goals, while predomin-ately geared toward the

quality of life for military women, often impact on the

service community at large.

DACOWITS is an advisory group, but its recommendations, often tackling policies which are prejudicial to the equal advancement of military women, have resulted in some sweeping legislative changes.

Among them are admission of women into the military academies; eligibility of dependent parents of military personnel to use civilian medial facilities; authoriza-tion for women with minor children to serve on active duty; removal of promotion ceilings on women in the Armed Forces; and a clearly defined policy statement from the Secretary of Defense on sexual harassment.

These examples represent a few of the historical strides made by DACOWITS for the retirement of women in the military services, but they are indicative of the broad influence and top level political recognition they've earned.

DACOWITS, which included prominent citizens like Sandra Day O'Connor, the first woman Supremem Court Justice, has conferred with presidents, Congressmen, and secretaries and service chiefs of each branch of the Armed

The committee's ongoing examination of service objectives and quality of life for its service members is carried out through periodic meetings and visits to military installations. In achieving its purpose, the committee conveys to the public the need

for and the role of women as an integral part of the armed

It also encourages public acceptance of military service as a citizenship responsibility and as a career option for qualified women. DACOWITS provides a vital link between the Armed Forces and civilian communities.

Now in its fourth decade of service, DACOWITS has on its work calendar these specific goals, including:

— removal of combat restrictions for women in the Navy and Air Force with the repeal of Title 10, U.S.C., section 6015 and 8549;

establishment of equal minimum admission stan-dards to all service branches, excepting only those legiti-mate physical differences;
— ensuring all military women are properly uniformed

to perform their specific duties;

enhancing the role of women in the reserve forces

and the National Guard;

 availability of adequate housing, health care and child care for all service personnel: monitoring and countering sexual harassment with appropriate education pro-grams and reporting pro-cedures for violations of regulations; and

focusing on the morale of military women and their perceived value to the military.

Symbols mark each name. A cross indicates a person is still missing in action (the cross is not used as a religious symbol). A diamond next to a name indicates that person was killed in action. Crosses can be converted to a diamond if and when those listed as missing are confirmed dead. A circle will be inscribed around the cross for any individual reported missing who may return alive.

At the entrance to the memorial stands a life-size bronze statue depicting three American fighting men. Jan Scruggs, founder and president of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, says the statue, sculpted by Frederick Hart, is "very humanistic and reflective of the young fighting men who served in Vietnam."

Scruggs adds, "The three men have very intense expressions on their faces. They are looking directly at the memorial wall. They look courageous, but vulnerable.

Also at the entrance to the memorial is a 50 foot bronze flag staff containing the five service emblems.

Since the memorial has ecome one of the most become popular tourist sites in the nation's capital, new lighting has been installed. Scruggs says that installation of the lighting will provide not only for improved safety and security, but will also "make the memorial come alive at night as well as better accommodate the large number of visitors who come to the site almost 24 hours a day."

The new lighting illuminates the memorial walls as well as the flag and sculpture.

A large number of Marines are visiting the Republic of the Philippines while on leave insufficient funds, without a round-trip airline ticket and without proper

military attire, according to u recent FMFPac message.

Marines arriving in the Philippines have been relying totally on MAC space available flights for their return trip to their original return trip to their original destination.

Often personnel must wait several weeks for flights, and as a result, they are requesting extensions the before, the day of, or the day after their leave expires.

Since January 1984, the Subic Bay chapter of the Navy Relief Society has given financial assistance to 56 Marines on leave in the Philippines. Marines must be issued stragglers orders back issued stragglers orders back to their commands, and a confirmed flight must be arranged. Normal processing time is two weeks. Requests to the Philippines

should be screened to ensure that Marines have sufficient funds, a return trip airline ticket and a complete military uniform.



## By air, land and sea Operation Bell Volcano tests Marines' mettle

PACIFIC MISSILE RANGE FACILITY, Barking Sands, Kauai, Oct. 31 — The 37th Marine Amphibious Unit conducted a successful amphibious and heliborne landing

here last week.

Operation Bell Volcano, a predeployment training exercise. involved more than 3,000 Marines and sailors who comprise Battalion Landing Team 2/3, Marine Medium Helicopter (composite) Squadron-262 and MAU Service Support Group 37. In addition to the MAU, two aircraft carrier task forces

were also in the waters off Kauai, launching air strikes against a simulated enemy known as the Indoaryan People's

The People's Army occupied the island with two battalions, approximately 1,600 men. They were armed with Various weapons, including mortars, anti-aircraft guns, and portable anti-air missiles. Their air force was made up of seve types of aircraft capable of sustained combat for only a few

As the Wednesday morning attack started, AV-8C Harriers

from HMH-262 bombed the beach area, softening the enemy position. Once the enemy was pinned down, CH-46 Sea Knight and CH-53 Sea Stallion helicopters came in to land the MAU Marines. Marine Cobras patrolled the flanks of the

air assault, protecting it from enemy attack.

Marines from Companies G and F, 2nd Bn., 3d Marines, formed a perimeter defense near LZ Flamingo, located on a small road near the beach. They waited for the arrival of reserve forces by amphibious assault, which had been delayed because of high surf conditions. The pounding waves subsided, allowing the amphibious elements to come ashore. Flanked by TOW (Tube launched, Optically tracked, Wire guided missile) crews and tanks, tracked landing vehicles carried the remaining combat units ashore.

With the landing area secure, the Marines moved up to

their primary objectives.
Elements of "G" and Weapons Companies, 2/3, advanced on the enemy forces with Dragon anti-tank weapons and M-60 machine guns protecting their flanks. The overwhelmed enemy created a smoke screen and retreated, only to come roaring back in armored personnel carriers which the Dragon platoon deftly destroyed.

As the Marines approached a stream crossing several kilometers from the objective, they came under simulated artillery fire. Weapons Co. sustained 40 percent casualties during the barrage. Since evacuation by air was impossible due to the close proximity of the enemy, ground vehicles transported the injured back to the beach and waiting landing craft.

Although the hard-charging Marines were pinned down for Although the hard-charging Marines were pinned down fo a time, they did not falter. Platoon commanders quickly reorganized and planned the next offensive. Under dense vegetation, they made their way across the stream, poking holes in the enemy's lines with small arms fire and mortars. During the battle at the stream, Marine and Navy attack aircraft took the fight to the enemy with 500 pound bombs and aircraft toward with stream, the stream of the

arretatt took the light to the enemy with 300 bound bombs and air-to-ground rockets, knocking out several air defense sites and the last remaining enemy armor. The persistant air attacks caused the Indoaryan forces to regroup behind the first objective, the airfield command and control center. Marine units took the site and closed in on the final

The command center taken, Marines from G and F Companies came on line to assault the last enemy stronghold on the airfield, six kilometers from the initial landing. The Indoaryan Army had been using a surface-to-surface missile site to interrupt communication and sea traffic on the island. With little enemy resistance, the Marines destroyed the site sending the enemy into the hills

As nightfall approached, 2/3 again reorganized and As nightfall approached, 2/3 again reorganized and tightened their perimeter expecting a fierce night attack. The enemy counter-attack never materialized, but Indoaryan forces were active in the hills above the airfield, firing morfars into the Marine position below. A search and destroy mission was ordered, and Golf Co. was sent out to destroy the position making a 12-mile march in the dark. Without making a sound or using light they stelled the

Without making a sound or using light, they stalked the without making a sound or using light, they statised the enemy. With surprise on their side, they captured the position high atop a terrorist training camp located on a hill. Stranded enemy units fled to other hills only to be picked up by members of Echo Co., who had attacked Kakelu Ridge

observed the other position.

As dawn broke, 2/3 prepared to return to their ships waiting offshore. The tactical withdrawal went smoothly as the Marines were airlifted back to the assault ship. Company F slowly withdrew from its defensive position around the embarkation area protecting the rear of the Marine withdrawal.

withdrawal.

"Operation Bell Volcano was the final test of the landing plan before the 37th MAU departs for the Western Pacific," said Capt. Raymond Held, intelligence officer, 1st Marine Brigade. "There were valuable lessons learned out here as the MAU tried to communicate, coordinate and support itself under combat conditions."

"Because it was a raid operation the 37th MAU did not a support itself."

"Because it was a raid operation, the 37th MAU did not deploy combat support elements," he continued. "The battalion carried what they needed to sustain the fight for two days, allowing themselves to train as realistically as possible. This type of exercise demonstrates the rewards of constant training," concluded Held.

## Marine bball teams dominate




The Hawaii Marine men's and women's varsity basketball teams posted back to back victories for a treat Halloween night at the Station Gym.


