## Housing recycling

The Marine Corps Base Hawaii refuse collector has reported that residents continue to place "contaminated" materials in recycling bins. Contaminated materials are those which contain non-recyclable items such as food or food residue, glossy magazine or newspaper inserts, and non-recyclable plastics. When these items are mixed with recyclable materials the whole shipment may be refused at the recycling point. Housing residents should rinse bottles and cans and take care and separate non-recyclable times from those that can be recycled. ## Programs address youth crime

The Military Police Department and the Base Magistrate utilize child awareness programs and mandatory community service, as measures to prevent MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay from reflecting the rising number of crimes committed by juveniles in America.

Robert "Yummy" Sandifer, an 11-year-old in Chicago, committed 23 felonies and five misdemeanors before he was shot and killed by two fellow gang members. Last fall in Wake County, N.C., 13-year-old Andre Green was arrested for assaulting and raping a 22-year-old neighbor. In Honolulu, a 17-year-old boy, with 67 prior arrests, was arrested for allegedly assaulting and robbing a 15-year-old boy on a city bus. Children in America are committing an increasing number of violent crimes. Although tight security and an active community aboard military installations shelter residents from a considerable amount of criminal offenses, crime still exists.

"We've had everything from fighting, and petty theft, to a gang burglary ring that robbed base homes of over \$50,000 worth of belongings," said GySgt. Eileen Osterhout, MCB Hawaii, inspector's office. "The burglary ring was made up of kids ranging in age from 10 to 14. All of the children involved were barred from the base."

It is routine for the base magistrate to bar a family member from the base who has committed serious or repetitive crimes. If the family resides in base housing, they are placed in a predicament. The family must either move out of base housing, or send the barred member to live somewhere else. Through a judiciary agreement, bar- See Crimes, A-5

## Maintenance officer receives Capt. Virg Lemmon Award

The 1995 Captain Virg Lemmon Award for Naval Aviation Maintenance excellence was recently presented to Major Paul F. Lease, Marine Aviation Logistics Support Element, 1st MAW ASE, Kaneohe. This is the first time this prestigious award has been won by a Marine.

This award, named in recognition of Captain Virg Lemmon, recognizes the Aviation Maintenance Officer who has made the most significant contribution to Naval Aviation maintenance during the last year. Captain Lemmon was the consummate Aviation Maintenance Officer who played a key role in modernizing the Naval Aviation Maintenance Program and was the driving force in establishing the Aerospace Maintenance Duty Officer community.

Captain Lemmon's legacy to Naval Aviation, his tenacity and unequalled maintenance expertise, have been identified in the leadership qualities displayed by Maj. Lease.

Lease has served 24 years in the naval aviation field as an enlisted aircrewman, Warrant Officer and Limited Duty Officer. He is considered to be one of the premier Aviation Maintenance Officers in the Marine Corps today.

As Aircraft Maintenance Officer, Marine Aircraft Group 24 (Now 1st MAW ASE, Kaneohe), Lease provided the technical knowledge and support that enabled the MAG to meet and maintain Chief of Naval Operations readiness goals.

He planned and implemented a Fatigue Life Tracking Program and an Aircraft Dehumidification Program which had a far ranging impact on the operational squadrons within MAG-24.

Lease also recognized the potential benefits of combining the capabilities of all Navy/Marine maintenance activities on Oahu. Together with "Founding Fathers" from the Navy Submarine Base Pearl Harbor, the Ship Intermediate Maintenance Activity Pearl Harbor, and the Aircraft Intermediate Maintenance Department Barbers Point, Lease developed the Oahu Area Inter-Operability Program. Since its inception, this program has realized a combined savings of over \$4 million.

"Major Lease's 'Back to Basics' approach was the key to MAG-24's success," explained LtCol. J.F. Buranosky, commanding officer, MALSEK. "He has helped to instill a solid maintenance philosophy that shows great foresight. He is the consummate Aviation Maintenance Officer and serves as a role model for all who know him."

receive my priority interest. One, Mission Preparedness. We have to make sure the forces we have assigned here are trained and ready for combat. Two, Quality of Life. Everything that touches the Marines and Sailors and their families is part of quality of life. That includes housing, mess hall support, and MWR support. Also involved in this is how someone feels about their job. How they feel about themselves, and what outlook they see for themselves in the organization. If a person likes what he's doing and feels good about himself, and he feels he is doing something meaningful, then this is part of a good quality of life.

Three, Preserving and Protecting. We have to continue to preserve and protect this base and the environment that we're given. Four, Our Involvement with Community. The Hawaiian community is part of Marine Corps Base Hawaii, and we are part of them. We are going to continue and enhance the programs we have now, so that we have a great outreach to the community and also involve them in what we do here.

Q: What issue of quality of life concerns you most, and how will you address it?

A: Let me say first of all, what a great place this is. I see a lot of

tremendous quality of life initiatives ongoing. One area that has concerned me and other leaders is the bachelor enlisted quarters. This is going to be the top area that I look at, to fix up what we have and to begin long term military construction. Somethings we can't fix overnight, in terms of construction, but we're going to make sure that we provide our men and women the absolute best housing we can and then look at the long term projects of bringing in new and better BEQs for them.

Q: There are several MWR projects in the developmental stages already

## JTF-FA 36th mission

On June 22, 1995 (Vietnam date), technical representatives of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam and the United States began another joint investigation and remains recovery operation pertaining to Americans unaccounted for as a result of the Vietnam War.

This will be the 36th joint field activity conducted by U.S. and Vietnamese representatives since 1988 and the 21st since Joint Task Force-Full Accounting was formed in January 1992. Operations will be conducted in eight central Vietnamese provinces. The operation is scheduled to last 34 days.

The joint team plans to investigate as many as 37 cases and excavate as many as 14 sites. The U.S. team will consist of 107 military and civilian specialists with experience in investigations and remains recovery operations and will be joined by Vietnamese officials. The U.S. team will be led by Army Lt. Col. Melvin Richmond, commander of JTF-FA's Detachment 2 in Hanoi. There are 2,204 Americans still unaccounted for in Southeast Asia. Of that total 1,618 are unaccounted for in Vietnam. (JTF-FA)

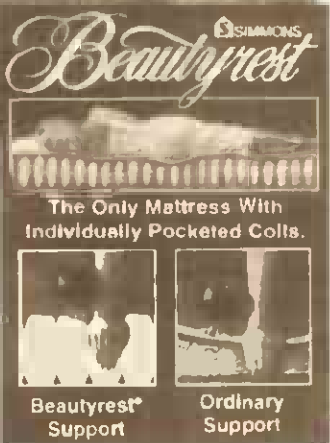

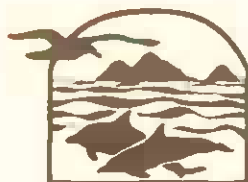

### Manana housing to get tot lot

Marine Corps Base Hawaii Family Housing Department officials recently met with representatives from companies that sell tot lot equipment, in an effort to purchase the most sturdy, attractive, safe and affordable playground equipment for the Manana family housing area.

"We hope to purchase colorful, plastic deck-type equipment," said Family Housing Department Leeward Satellite Division Housing Manager Lydia Caldwell. "That means that instead of having individual pieces of equipment, like a slide and swing, the equipment will probably be in one large piece. We're hoping to get decks, cargo nets, tunnel crawl tubes and bridges. We're also trying to get bubbles and a few big tic-tac-toe games," she added.

Purchase of the tot lot equipment is somewhat complicated by the fact that the Marine Corps and Navy share ownership and responsibility for Manana housing. Of the 247 units there, the Marine Corps owns the 168 homes on the west side and the Navy owns the others. Because all Manana residents will share

the new tot lots, funding and responsibility for the equipment will also be shared, said MCB Hawaii Family Housing Director Becky Ray.

"There are several ways we can accomplish the purchase of this equipment," Ray said, "some more expensive than others. We're working with the Navy to decide on the equipment to buy and how best to handle the purchase. After that has been agreed upon, we should be able to give residents an idea of when the new equipment will be installed."

Residents who would like to get an idea of what the equipment will look like should take a look at the tot lot located near the pool at Manana, Caldwell said.

"They won't be exactly like that one, but we're looking for something similar," she said.

And new wiring... The Navy Public Works Center recently awarded a contract to Niking Corporation to complete the final phase of electrical rewiring in Manana Housing. The project will significantly upgrade electrical capabilities in homes there, according to MSgt. John Martin, facilities

chief at MCB Hawaii, Camp H.M. Smith.

"The wiring will be completely replaced in the affected homes," Martin said. "The junction box will be upgraded, a ceiling fan installed in the dining room area and exterior lights installed in the backyard for security purposes."



The rewired homes will also feature two dedicated outlets that comply with the new MCB Hawaii Energy Conservation Policy standards for air conditioners. "One 220 volt outlet will be in the living room, and one 110 outlet will be in the master bedroom. Right now, when residents need a dedicated outlet for an air conditioner they have to pay to have it installed. That can be very expensive," Martin said.

A Manana resident himself, Martin said that the work will cause a minimum of inconvenience to housing residents.

Work is expected to be completed during the months of July through Sept. 1995. Families will be notified one week in advance, in writing, that the work will begin. If the time is inconvenient, the contractor will try to reschedule the work.

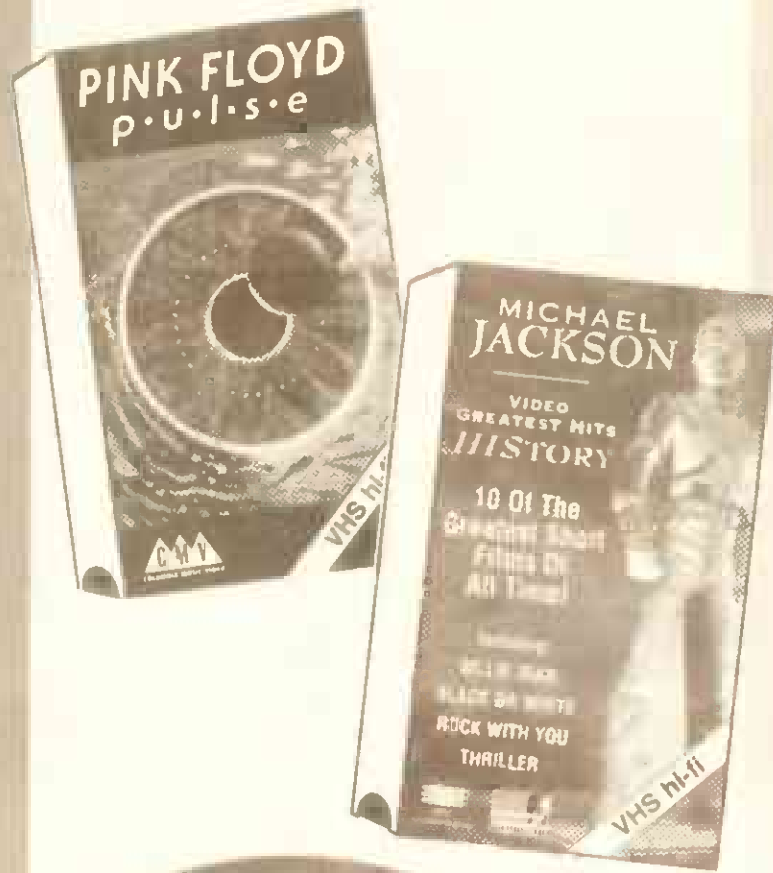

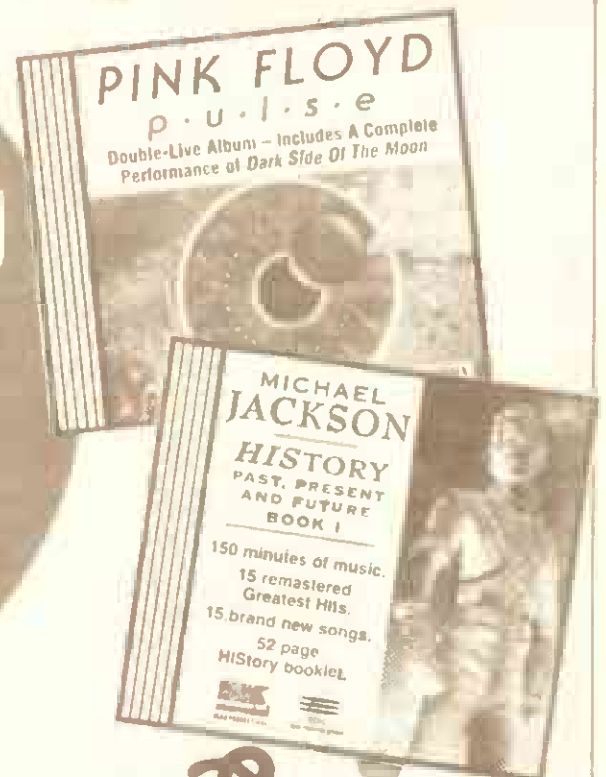

# Job search assistance available through TAMP office

The wake up call for many Marines and Sailors often times comes upon them as they approach the end of their active duty service. They face a competitive job market requiring specific skills which produces a fear or uneasiness among those transitioning to civilian life.

Where do they go for help? So many questions, but who has the answers?

Well worry and fret no more, the Transition Assistance Management Program office located on MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay has the answer and a plan. They have access to two national job banks and one local job bank which provide current listings of available jobs. In addition to those, they provide services to help decide what job might be most suitable, to learn more about federal jobs, and to help with applying for the jobs.

The first prerequisite for finding a job is, of course, having the desire for a job.

Next, comes the decision of what kind of job to look for. To make the search easier, the TAMP office has a program called "Discover."

This is a career assessment program

that will let an individual answer questions about his personality, likes and dislikes, aptitude, etc., into the computer. After the questioning is completed, a listing of job types is then printed. These will be the jobs which come closest to fitting that person's personality and temperament.

When the type of job has been decided, a location of desired employment and the available jobs in that area must be found.

If the area is on the continental United States, there are two large options available.

The first is called the Transition Bulletin Board. This is a program which is on-line with Monterey, Calif. With this program, a person can search for a job type in the continental United States or narrow the search to a region of the country or to a certain state. There are also some jobs listed in foreign countries.

The second national job bank is the America's Job Bank. This is a listing of all jobs posted by the state employment offices. This list is updated weekly.

If the job being searched for is here in Hawaii, then TAMP offers the Joint Employment Management Systems. This is a local job bank

Information System is another TAMP resource. FOCIS will describe what the different federal jobs are like and what they do. It also tells what qualifications are required, what the average grade/pay-level is, and the number of people currently in the occupation.

Once the jobs are selected to apply for, thought should be given to writing and submitting a resume.

The TAMP's ResumeMaker is a program which organizes education and experience and formats the information in a standard resume format.

The resume can then be entered into the Defense Outplacement Referral System. The DORS is a large resume/job application repository in Monterey, Calif. When employers are looking for new employees, they specify what qualifications they are looking for, and the DORS will give the employer a list of all qualified applicants.

"There is a very high referral rate for applications submitted through our office," said Jim Gardner, transition assistance specialist. "Ninety-one percent of the applications we submit to the DORS are

given to prospective employers. This is a very successful program."

"The JEMS program is also very effective for Hawaii," continued Gardner. "What we have at TAMP is a very successful program for job finding. I see it as a win/win situation."

Mae Ooka, TAMP manager, is concerned that not enough people know about or utilize the programs.

"We have the tools, and we have the job referrals," said Ooka. "What we need is for the individual to get the word and to get involved with the programs, or all of our capabilities go to waste."

"There are many good jobs here in Hawaii, both full and part-time, but many of them will be located in the Honolulu area," continued Ooka.

Anyone interested in using the facilities at the TAMP office will need to call and make an appointment at 257-3135. The office is open Monday-Friday, 7:30 a.m.-4 p.m.

"There is no way this system is going to fail an individual unless that person says they don't want to be a part of it," said Gardner. "Our system works."

# Family Service Center offers courses to alleviate marital discord

Each year there are approximately 2.5 million marriages in the United States. Studies show half of those marriages will end in divorce. Although some circumstances are unavoidable, the Marine Corps Base Hawaii Family Service Center offers a program to help reduce those odds.

The Prevention and Relationship Enhancement Program teaches couples how to handle arguments and disagreements productively.

"In other words, it teaches couples how to fight fair," said Gail Kiefer,

Family Advocacy prevention specialist.

Couples learn powerful techniques for managing conflict and communication. They also learn how to commit, how to be intimate and above all how to maintain the fun in their relationship.

"We use the speaker and listener system. It is formatted so that partners take turns speaking without interruption," Kiefer said.

In order to keep the sessions effective, a consultant listens to the couple's argument. This ensures the couple does not stray from the method the program teaches.

A tool the consultants use is to give

the couple a little piece of carpet, which is called the floor. Whoever is holding the floor can make new statements.

"Most people's first response when confronted or attacked is to present their side, which limits their ability to listen," Kiefer said.

The method of communication the program teaches slows down the argument. This allows couples to express their feelings.

"Our society is not very good at expressing our feelings. The program helps people explore more specific feelings," Kiefer said. It is important to understand that the program is not

therapy, and couples are not receiving counseling. Instead it is a skill building class. It teaches couples to use tools that work, Kiefer explained.

"Successful couples continue to use the skills on a regular basis, even after the six-week course," Kiefer said.

Each week of the program a new skill is learned. Then it is practiced in a private setting with the trained consultant.

"We teach them to use 'I' words. For example, 'I feel very upset'. This way the listener is not put on the defense. And he or she is ready to hear what the other has to say," Kiefer said.

Although the program is designed for couples who may be having difficulties, many couples take the program as a way of preventing future problems.

The program is open to all service-members who are anticipating marriage, newlyweds or married couples.

In the two and a half years the program has been offered by FSC, more than 100 couples have participated. It is offered free of charge. Similar courses in the community often cost more than \$600, said Kiefer.

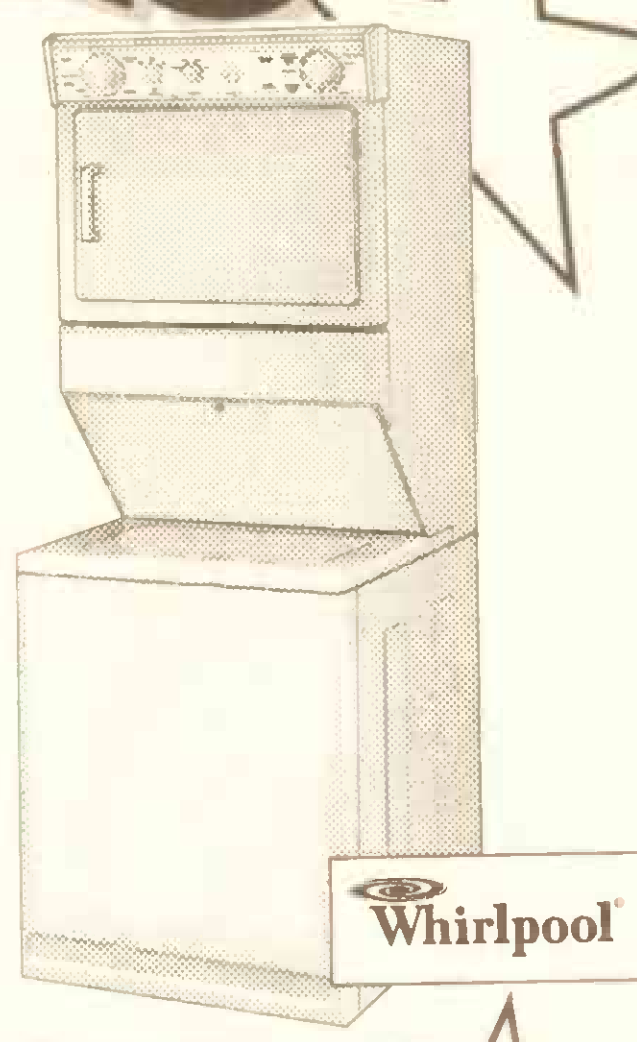

on base, such as a new PX, retail outlets and a fitness center, do you anticipate anything else coming from MWR that could impact the base community?

**A:** General Vercauteren and his staff have certainly done a lot of hard work to initiate these ongoing projects. I am going to continue to push to finish these projects. We are looking at not only tacking on a new fitness center to the main gymnasium, but enhancing the fitness centers we already have. We want to improve the ball fields we have with new irrigation to keep from getting burned-out grass. We're looking at a whole range of activities through MWR to provide that good quality of service and support to our Marines and Sailors and their families.

**Q:** Recently, your billet as Commanding General of MCB Hawaii was redesignated to include the title of Deputy Commander III MEF, Hawaii. How will this impact the Marines and Sailors aboard MCB Hawaii?

**A:** I don't see it impacting the individual Marines and Sailors because they will still go about their duties as usual. What it will do is allow us to take on some of the operational issues in a more coordinated manner. It allows the Commanding General of III MEF, located in Okinawa, a single point of contact where he can come to coordinate issues and topics that are germane to all his forces here in Hawaii.

**Q:** MCB Hawaii has strong ties with the community through programs like the adopt-a-school, and races aboard the base that have been opened to the public. What efforts do you have planned or want to initiate that will continue to foster goodwill with the community?

**A:** Anytime that we can put the local community in contact with our men and women is good. The best salesmen, the best ambassadors we have are our Marines and Sailors. I am going to look for opportunities to get our men and women involved in the community, whether it's through the formal functions like adopt-a-school or organized athletics, or whether it's through the more informal

programs like the Boy Scouts, the Girl Scouts, or the little league teams. Our men and women are involved in those sort of activities and I am going to encourage that they continue. We have the role model for the young people of America serving in our Corps. The more we can put them in contact with the local community helps the community, and it helps us because there is a feeling of goodwill that individuals get from being involved.

**Q:** As the new Commanding General, what do you expect from your Marines and Sailors.

**A:** I am expecting them to continue with what they are doing and to continue to enhance their readiness. One of my points of command, as a leader, has been to empower the individual. I want to allow the individual to make decisions on the job because the individual that works there is really the best person around to determine how best to do the job. I want to do this where possible when it doesn't effect safety, legality, or ethics. I am going to encourage that we empower the individual to make the best choice. When we do that, we get a more motivat-

ed individual, and we get better work out of him.

**Q:** Do you have anything you would like to say to the Marines and Sailors of MCB Hawaii?

**A:** I am certainly delighted to be here. I believe that MCB Hawaii has an important function and role to fulfill, and that role is to support the operating forces assigned here. Unlike other support services that only work during certain hours, we are Marines all the time. We are doing a valuable job in supporting the operating forces, and I want everyone to know it.

I am a big believer in technology and putting technology to use for us. We (the Marine Corps) are getting smaller, and we have to become more capable. Technology is a way of becoming more capable. I do have a goal to make sure that this base is one of the leaders of exploiting technology in support of Marines, from the area of communications, to the area of simulators - both in weapons training and in leadership training with models. In the area of limited man-power and limited resources, we really have to exploit technology.

ment includes all military reservations in the Hawaii.

In the past, there has been a problem with illegal entry to the base, with 86 documented cases of trespassing since 1992. In an effort to stop trespassing, new policies have been implemented to make it easier for junior enlisted Marines and family members to sponsor guests, and allow civilians unsponsored access to Pyramid Rock beach on Sundays.

A large problem for Camp Pendleton, Calif., has been gang related activities. The

most popular of these activities has been what is called "tagging". This is when a group of youths, called a tagging crew, claim territory by spray painting it with their particular logo. This not only defaces government property, but it also creates the potential for a violent conflict between crews that cross out each others marks.

"There are a lot of gang 'Wanna-bes' aboard the base," said Sgt. Woodrow Owens, crime prevention, Military Police Department, MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay. "The kids get there style and personality from the image of gangs."

The Military Police Department and the Honolulu

Police Department have a partnership in the Drug Abuse Resistance Education program at Mokapu Elementary School. This program not only focuses on preventing children from someday becoming drug users, through awareness they also express how negative and violent life is for a gang member.

"We haven't had too many problems with tagging because the kids know that if they get caught, they will suffer a stiff penalty," said Owens. "Kids don't like to have to pick up trash and scrape paint on the weekends, so they don't take the chance on getting caught breaking the law."

Through mandatory community service, violators of less

severe offenses are being taught that consequences will accompany misbehavior. In the past, the base magistrate could either bar an offender from the base, which is routine for serious or repetitive crimes, or issue a warning. Depending upon the severity of the offense, first offenders still may receive a strict warning, or they may be assigned mandatory community service. The magistrate has penalized juveniles with as little as 25 hours of community service to as much as 250 hours. Every Saturday, parents escort their children through four hours, or six if parents consent, of menial labor focused at beautifying the base.

# Civilian in the Spotlight

## Laying it all out for the record is support specialist job

Pinpointing exact locations with information from satellites in orbit, searching through historical records for data, and combining information to create a pictorial overlay of the base are just some of the things that Darrell Robertson does as part of a new position recently developed by the MCB Hawaii Environmental Department.

Last fall, Robertson was hired as a Decision Support Systems Specialist. This position was developed as a means of documenting and displaying environmental information critical in management decisions, such as location of archaeologically sensitive areas, endangered species, and underground storage tanks.

The geographic information Robertson has mapped includes everything from the precise location of historic properties to underground storage tanks and the Nu'upia ponds.

Robertson takes this information that is gathered and inputs it into a geographic information system. The GIS is a computer with special software that can manipulate the information entered and display it on a full-scale model of the base.

"The accuracy of the data is relatively precise," said Robertson. "If I had a plotter big enough, I could print off a map of the base on a 1:1 scale and drive around on it."

As part of the Environmental Department, the data supplied by Robertson's office is combined with other critical information provided by the Facilities Department and others in the planning of new projects for the base. This information helps pre-determine problems that might arise with a project and find solutions

before the problems actually occur.

"If the project is the construction of new on-base housing, for example, here are some problems I might have to identify ahead of time," said Robertson. "Will the proposed sight for the project cover any ancient burial sites? Is the site within the 100-year floodplain? Are there any underground storage tanks in the area? Is the area historically significant?"

According to Maj. George Wheeler, director of the Environmental Department, in the future the demand for information will increase in other areas as well.

"There is a very large potential for future use in planning the training of our Marines," said Wheeler. "Darrell's job will be to identify the environmental restrictions of local training areas and then combine that with the hazards caused by the different training being requested for the area. Once that is done, our office (Environmental) can then project what kind of impact the training will have on the local environment."

"Also, with using the GIS, MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay saves money," continued Wheeler. "We are now able to gather and compile data we once had to bring in outside contractors to do. We are still in the early stages with Darrell's position, so we still use some contractors. In the future, though, we will be able to use the GIS more extensively and get away from the reliance on outside help."

The GIS is more than just a map. It is a three-dimensional representation of the base, made that way through an association with an informational database. When an object is called up on the screen there is associated information to go along with that object. If a storage tank is called up, then related information can be

viewed, such as what the tank holds, who operates it, when the tank was built and when the last inspection was.

Robertson's job is to locate all the related data and make sure that it gets entered into the GIS.

"There could be some information on someone else's computer or inside of someone's head," said Robertson. "Maybe there was a significant historical event that took place on this spot, and John Doe is the only one around here who knows. If I can locate that

information and get it entered in the GIS, then I don't have to worry about losing it because John Doe gets transferred or retires."

Just finding the information, however, isn't enough. Robertson has to verify the accuracy of the information and double check coordinates of places identified. To help with this, he uses a global positioning system which uses information from orbiting satellites to pinpoint the exact grid coordinates. Updating and verifying new infor-

mation is a continuous cycle.

Robertson's interest in computers began shortly after he graduated from high school in 1974 in Houston, Texas. He remained in Texas and went to work for an oil company as an apprentice electrician. It was there he learned skills such as drafting, computer-aided design, and computer drafting.

"I reached a point in my career with the oil company where I felt I needed to go on and grow educationally," said Robertson. "So I saved up my money, paid off my bills, fixed up my car, and then quit my job."

He started college in 1984 at the Texas A&M University campus located in Galveston, Texas. He graduated in 1987 with a degree in marine sciences.

Robertson then spent the next five years working at NASA's Johnson Space Center in the Earth Observation office while attending night school and completing a masters degree in Physical Sciences.

"I also worked on an engineering team while I was at NASA," said Robertson. "I helped with design and integration work on the space station. Specifically, I worked on the thermal control system for the space station."

Robertson moved to Hawaii in 1992 where he worked for a local environmental consulting firm. In the fall of 1994, he applied for and was accepted into his current position as decision support systems specialist.

Robertson's hobbies pay testimony to his penchant for adventure. He enjoys sailing, scuba diving and motorcycle riding. He is also one of the builders of the Hawaii Loa, a 60-foot voyaging canoe which recently sailed to the Marquesas Islands in French Polynesia and then back to Hawaii.

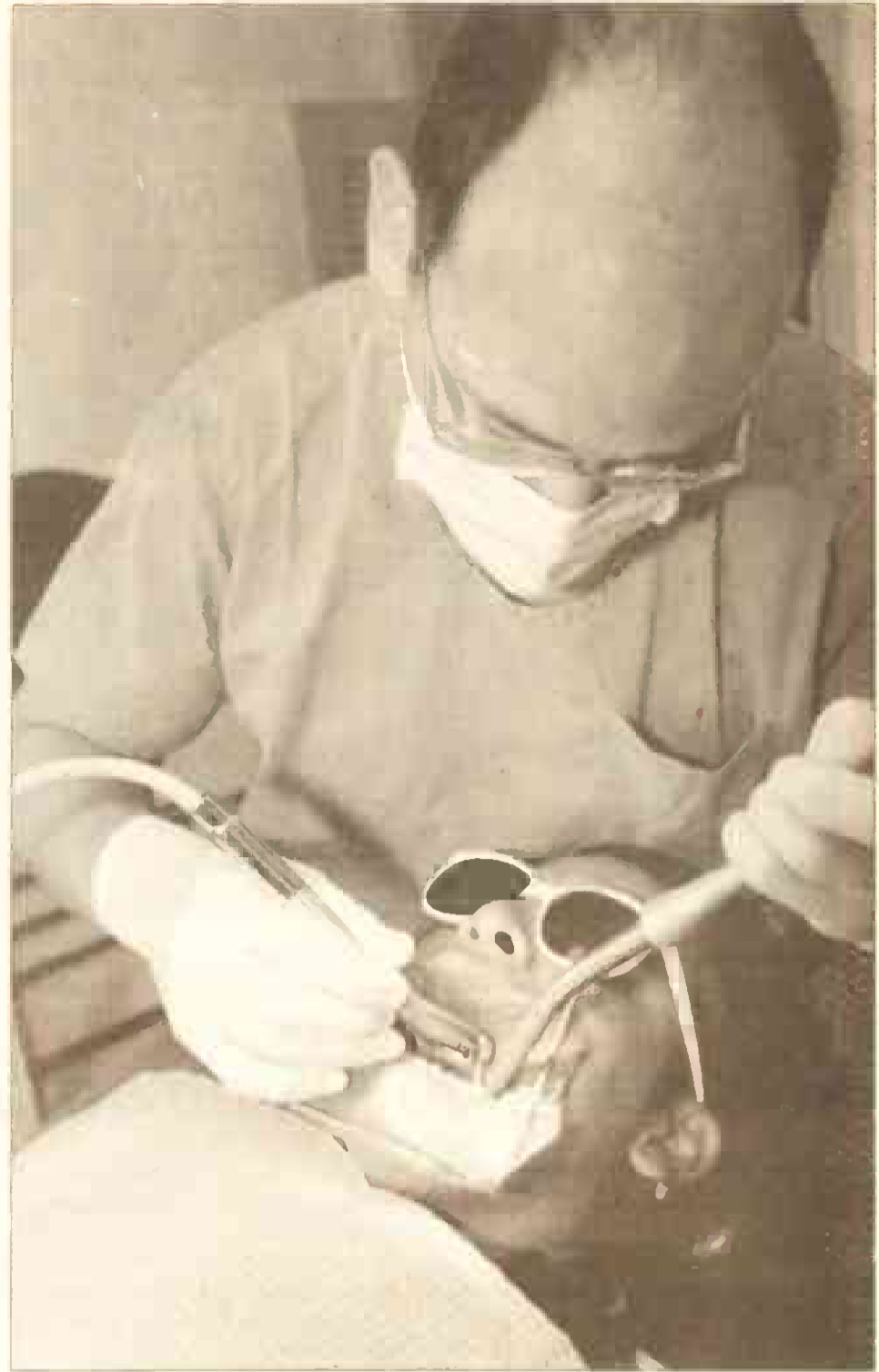
"We see approximately 100 Marines per day. They are provided with a complete aspect of dental care," said Cmdr. Greg Johnson, dental clinic director.

## Vets return to Okinawa 50 years later

CAMP SMEDLEY D. BUTLER, Okinawa, Japan — Proudly they stood at attention, withstanding brisk winds and a glaring Okinawa sun. Ball caps or open hands were laid across rapidly beating chests, tears streamed down the cheeks of some as the order was given. "Post the Colors." A deep swelling pride swept over the audience as the colors posted, followed by the playing of the national anthem.

This was the setting at the Memorial Service and Wreath Laying June 22 at Camp Butler. The ceremony was part of the 50th commemoration of the Battle of Okinawa that honored the veterans of that fierce battle. More than 250 veterans, active duty servicemembers and guests were in attendance to hear remarks from special guest, Gen. Carl E. Mundy Jr., 30th Commandant of the Marine Corps.

"It's good to be with true American heroes — you veterans," said Gen. Mundy. "I want to say something that many of you know because you were here, 50 years ago today, when the final battle of the Pacific war came to an end.

"We're gathered here this afternoon to remember the three Marine

Divisions, along with their Army and, indeed, their Navy counterparts, who made this victory possible. The 1st, 2d and 6th Marine Divisions, supported by Marine aviation, formed the 'heart and soul' of the 10th United States Army.

"A distinguished Marine once wrote that a division is something that comes into being very laboriously and it's created out of many things: out of blood, out of sacrifice and out of the efforts of a good part of the productive life of tens of thousands of individuals who have passed through its ranks. Today we honor those individuals, the men of the three most distinguished divisions ever to fight as part of our United States Marine Corps.

"Here on Okinawa, the valor of these divisions, your valor, enter the names like Motubu, Sugar Loaf, Shuri Castle and Naha, into the register that traces the history of American arms.

"The battle took 82 days and it would claim more than 16,000 Marines, soldiers, sailors and airmen killed in action — including your Army commander, Lt. Gen. Simon Bolivar Buckner, who died observing an attack being conducted by the 8th Marine Regiment. The 10th Army would finish the battle under the command of one of our own, MGen. Roy Geiger.

"Across this gap of a half-century, the sacrifices of those who fought and won Operation Iceberg still stand crystal clear. It was one of the longest, bloodiest and most harshly contested battles of the Pacific war. It was won by infantrymen, artillery men, tankers, signal men, corpsmen, doctors, chaplains, truck drivers and engineers — by all the elements of a combat division.

"Today we pause to remember their sacrifices — your sacrifices — and to renew our faith in what these three divisions accomplished here so long ago. Marines of today recognize your achievements. The shining example of the 1st, 2d and 6th Marine Divisions will never be forgotten so long as America has a Marine Corps — and so long as our Corps honors those who go forward into battle — so long as it honors you. Semper Fidelis."

Following Gen. Mundy's remarks, memorial messages were delivered by several distinguished veterans of the campaign. The 1st and 2d Marine Division Associations each dedicated memorial markers which will join the existing 6th Marine Division Association's marker honoring the Marines of each division who fought and died here during that battle.

For active duty Marines, the ceremony served as a reverent gathering

place to recall the valor and honor of all those who fought and died to preserve the freedom of the world. It provided a time to recognize the selfless, heroic actions of those individuals who have earned a place in Marine Corps history.

"We wouldn't be here right now if it were not for the gallant Americans who fought in World

War II," said LCpl. Lewis McComak, G-6, Marine Corps Base. "I am very grateful to the veterans, both to those here at the ceremony and to those who didn't make it, for what they did for our country and our Corps. I know that seeing and talking with all of these World War II veterans makes me very proud to be a Marine."

# Clinic in Okinawa rededicated after Medal of Honor recipient

Fifty years after a wounded 18 year-old corpsman defended his injured patients against a Japanese counterattack during the Battle of Okinawa, veterans of the battle, sailors and Marines gathered to rededicate the clinic that bears his name.

Medal of Honor recipient, Robert E. Bush, and more than 100 guests attended a rededication ceremony at the U.S. Naval Hospital Bush Branch Medical Clinic, Camp Courtney, June 24. Originally dedicated July 14, 1988, the clinic provides medical and dental care to 6,000 servicemembers and their families stationed on the northern half of the island.

During the ceremony, Bush said he was honored to receive such recognition for his actions.

"I'm humbled because what I did that day was only the same thing I had been doing the previous thirty one days of the battle," said Bush.

Bush was on patrol with Rifle Company, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division, when he received serious grenade wounds to his back, stomach, arm and eye. Despite his injury, Bush continued to provide medical aid to his Marines. When a Japanese assault on his position threatened the life of the

Marine officer he was treating, Bush drew his pistol and later found a discarded carbine rifle to repel the attack.

In a speech, Bush explained the special role corpsmen play during combat.

"When you're hurt, you call out to your mother," said Bush. "When you're out there in the field, and you are injured, you want someone as dirty as you are crawling through the mud to save your life."

As part of the ceremony, hospitalman first class Ron Albaugh presented Bush with a plaque representing the inspiration he's given his fellow corpsmen. Albaugh said that Bush exemplifies the true meaning of pride, professionalism and dedication that corpsmen strive to uphold today.

Another plaque inscribed with Bush's Medal of Honor citation was unveiled during the ceremony. It will be displayed in the clinic's lobby.

Distinguished guests attending the ceremony included BGen. David F. Bice, Commanding General, 3d Marine Division, Fleet Marine Force, Okinawa Japan, BGen. J. Michael Hayes, Commanding General, Marine Corps Base Camp S.D. Butler, Rear Adm. Walter W. Doran, Commander, Combined Task Force 76, and J.P. Sheridan, President, 1st Marine Division Association.

The suspects were two local males. Both wore broad brimmed hats. Both were in their early 20's. One suspect wore sunglasses. This suspect was about 5'6" tall and weighed about 180 pounds, of medium to heavy build. He had black, neck-length hair and a tan complexion. The other suspect was 5'8" tall, weighed approximately 160 pounds, with a slim build. He had straight neck-length black hair and a moustache.

# Hawaii Marines dominate Super Squad competition in Okinawa

**Marines from Hawaii compete for the top award for squad readiness**

CAMP HANSEN, OKINAWA, JAPAN — The 3d Marine Division 1995 Super Squad Competition began here recently with the Physical Readiness Test (PRT) at Landing Zone Hansen.

The competition pits four squads against each other during eleven days of events that are designed to test each squad's physical fitness, offensive and defensive tactics, marksmanship, and military operations in urban terrain (MOUT). Squads from 1st, 2nd, and 3d Battalion, 3d Marine Regiment, (from Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii), and one from 1st Battalion, 8th Marine Regiment (from Camp Lejeune, N.C. on the Unit Deployment Program), ran three-miles with a combat load,

climbed the obstacle course rope, walked through a fire and evacuation course, and then tested their water-proofing skills in the pool before the first event came to a close, said Capt. John Nettles, director of Division Schools. "The winning squad has to show teamwork and good marksmanship regardless of their mind frame," Nettles said. "This competition demands a good command of basic Marine Corps skills."

A completed schedule of events takes each squad over 34 miles of northern Okinawa, to four ranges throughout the central and northern training areas, and through five landing zones.

The marksmanship portion of the competition consists of live fire from static positions and transition movement courses. The squad leaders shoot the M-249 Squad Automatic Weapon, and other members shoot the M-16A2 service rifle for score.

Various defensive and offensive movements are interspersed throughout the competition

schedule. Competing squads have the chance to set up defensive and offensive formations.

"Each squad is evaluated by a team from Division Schools who are familiar with the competition," Nettles said. "They are using target scores and times to compute who is the winner. The scoring remains completely fair if we do this because each team is tasked with the same missions."

The competition is designed to be completely spontaneous, thereby lending itself to real world operations. Nettles said that the original form of the competition did not have any MOUT section. He and his staff added this portion because recent Fleet Marine Force activities have called on this type of warfare.

The competition culminates with an awards ceremony for all squads involved with the winning squad receiving a Navy Achievement Medal. The winning squad will then fly to Washington D.C. in August to be presented a Navy Achievement Medal.

# STS Marine enjoys teaching others about the water

His dad taught him how to swim at the age of two, and by three he was swimming laps in the pool. SSgt. Dirk Lens' most recent accomplishment is almost directly related to that early childhood training.

Lens, the 3d Marine Regiment Special Training Section staff non-commissioned officer-in-charge, recently completed the Marine Combat Instructor Trainer of Water Survival School at MCCDC Quantico, Va., making him one of only two Marines on Oahu who have completed the school.

Although the Holland native's first love is the water and the outdoors, he is a maintenance manager by military occupational speciality.

After attending the New York Military Academy, Lens joined the Marine Corps. Upon graduating from bootcamp in May of 1986, Lens went directly to Maintenance Management School in Little Creek, Va., and even then he knew he wanted to do something more exhilarating than what his MOS called for.

While going through his MOS school, Lens became involved with a project for Marine reconnaissance.

"Although the school was only two weeks long, I ended up staying there for almost a year because I kept volunteering to finish building

an obstacle course," he said.

"Ever since then, I knew that I wanted to be a part of recon," he said.

In May 1993, reconnaissance became more than a dream. Lens took the indoctrination and passed. He was then transferred from Marine Aircraft Group 24, Kaneohe Bay to Reconnaissance Platoon, 3d Marine Regiment.

While he was with recon, he felt he was in his own element. "Staying out in the field, training at every opportunity, that's what being a Marine is all about," Lens said.

During the time he was with recon, the platoon was deployed to Tonga for exercise Tafakula 93.

One year after arriving there, Lens was recalled to MAG-24. After being back for a couple of months Lens requested orders back to 3d Marines. He received the orders and went to work with the Shallow Water Egress Training Platoon at the Special Training Section, 3d Marine Regiment.

There, he used his years of experience in the water to train other Marines.

"I love training Marines, especially those who feel they can't do something. When they finally learn how to do what we are training for, they feel good. In turn, it makes me feel great because I know I have done my job well," Lens said.

Training is the core of the Marine Corps. Providing the fleet with well

trained Marines makes for a better Marine Corps, Lens explained.

"Although a lot of things may change in the Marine Corps, there are many schools such as the Basic Reconnaissance school or the

MCITWS school that still teach things the old way," Lens said. "All schools should be like that - survival of the fittest."

Recently, Lens was put in charge of the Special Training Section.

Although due to a shortage in his MOS, he has not been able to make a lateral move into the recon or infantry field. He says that's one of the things he hopes will happen in the near future.

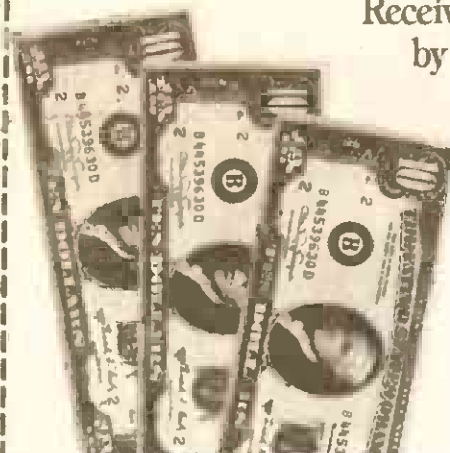

## STREND proves to be a challenging test of skills

Making its debut aboard Marine Corps Base, Hawaii several military and civilian personnel took the STREND challenge on Saturday.

The STREND (strength/endurance) Fitness Challenge was developed by former Army Sergeant Major Edward Bugarin as a total body fitness program.

"I wanted to put together a program that produced good upper body strength along with cardiovascular endurance," said Bugarin.

"I designed this for myself, but I had people keep telling me I ought to start teaching this program to others," continued Bugarin, "so I organized what is now the Strend Fitness Challenge."

The challenge is a series of six exercises. The first five exercises are for body strength, and the last one is for endurance.

The strength exercises include bench press, pull ups, military press, chin ups and bar dips. The endurance exercise is a three-mile run.

One point is given for each repetition in the strength exercises. The total of these repetitions is then divided by

the run time. The run time is converted into points by giving one point for every minute and then turning the remaining seconds into a decimal. The resulting number is the strend factor. The higher the factor, the better the score for that division.

There are six individual divisions, three male - elite, open, and modified and three female - elite, open, and modified, and there are three team divisions - male, female, and mixed.

The top finishers in the women's elite division during Saturday's challenge were Gina Aradanas in first place with a SF of 3.29, Shevaun Fennell in second place with a SF of 3.08, and Rebecca Cloud in third place with a SF of 2.37. The top finishers in the women's open division were Lara Flath in first place with a SF of 3.48, Brigitte MacNaughton in second place with a SF of 3.11, and Debbie McCracken in third place with a SF of 2.57.

The top finisher in the women's modified division was Carol Jaxon with a SF of 7.96.

The top finishers in the men's elite division were Sonki Hong in first place with a SF of 5.93, Thomas Ward in second place with a SF of 4.23, and Robert Egbert in third place with a SF of 3.99.

The top finishers in the men's open division were Trey Johnson in first place with a SF of 5.42, Mike Cannon in second place with a SF of 5.31, and Patrick Reardon in third place with a SF of 4.80.

The top male teams were Trey Johnson/Mike Cannon in first place with a SF of 10.73, and Francisco Arias/Eric Ruffin in second place with a SF of 8.50.

The top mixed team was Thomas and Delilah Ward with a SF of 6.75.

"This is really a great type of competition," said Shevaun Fennell. "I had a lot of fun."

One of the competitors, Debbie McCracken, heard about the Strend Fitness Challenge while visiting from Maryland.

"I had never heard of anything like this before," said McCracken. "So, when I saw the flyer, I decided to come and try it."

"The guys helping out with the exercises were great. They kept giving encouragement to everyone doing the exercises," continued McCracken. "I do think that the sponsors ought to put the requirements for each exercise on the applications, though, so people know what to expect ahead of time and can train for it if they want."

Although this program has been in existence for about three years this was the first time it has been conducted at MCB Hawaii.

"This is the first time that we have held this event," said Miles Okamura, MWR athletic director. "All the participants I talked with really enjoyed the challenge. Once the word gets out to others, I am sure that it will grow. We may even have another one as soon as November."

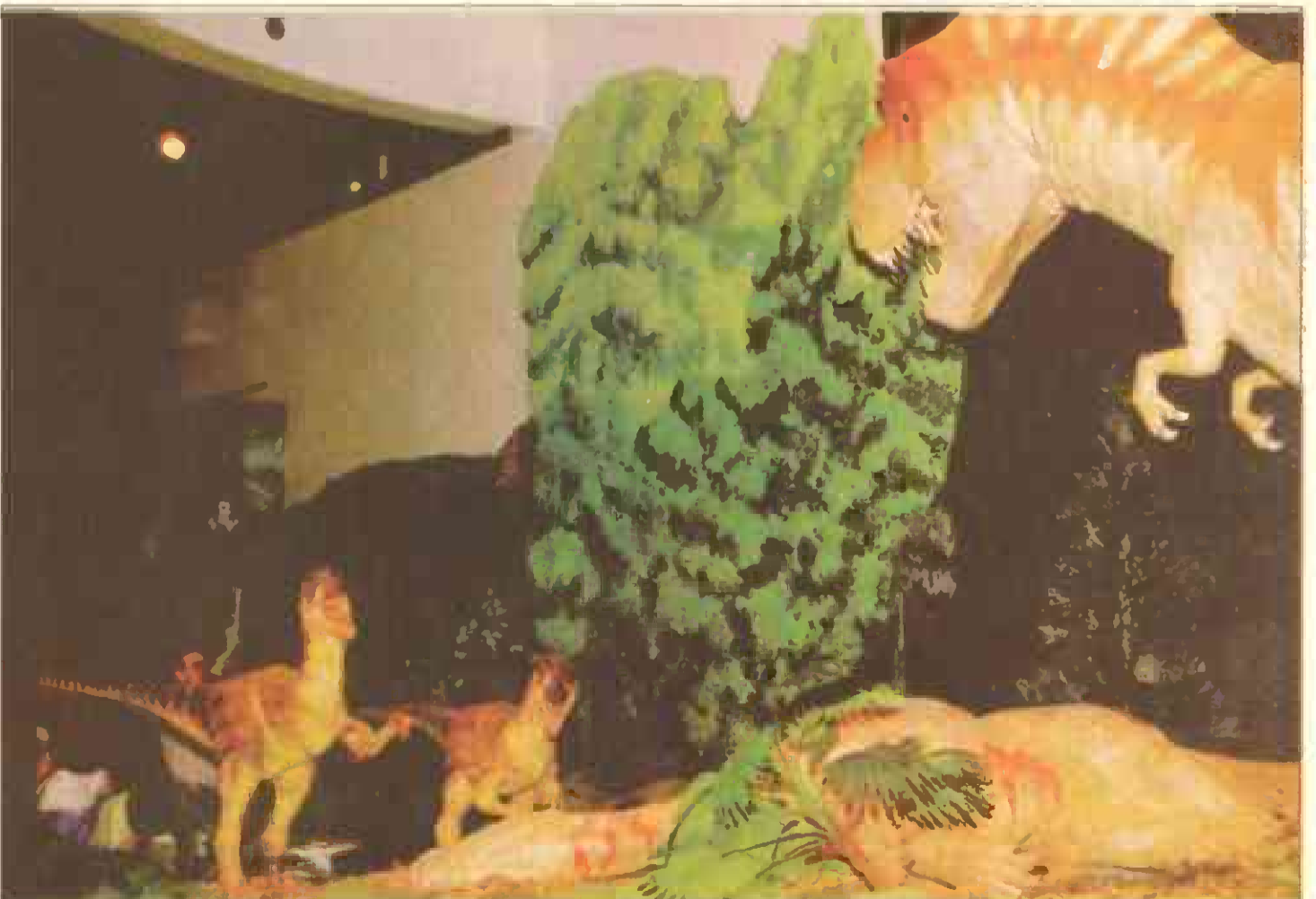

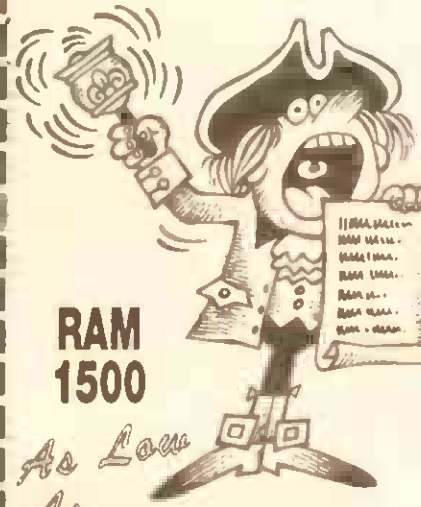

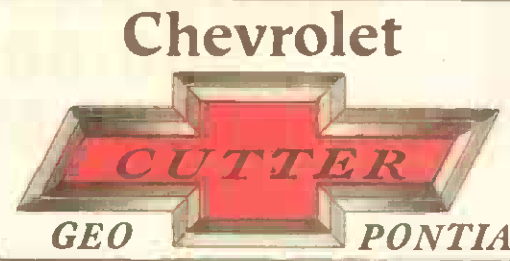
