Benefits orientation

The current DoD contract for the TRICARE program in Hawaii will change Oct. 1. HMSA will provide orientation sessions for all TRICARE Prime and all TRICARE beneficiaries on the new TRICARE Uniform Benefit Program. These sessions will begin August 1. Briefings will be held at the Boondocker Theater on each Thursday during the months of August and September. The briefings will be from 8 - 10 a.m.. The purpose of this training is to promote CPR awareness within the community, enhance the survival rate of cardiac arrest victims, increase bystanders' willingness to administer CPR, and educate the community on the importance of immediate application of CPR. 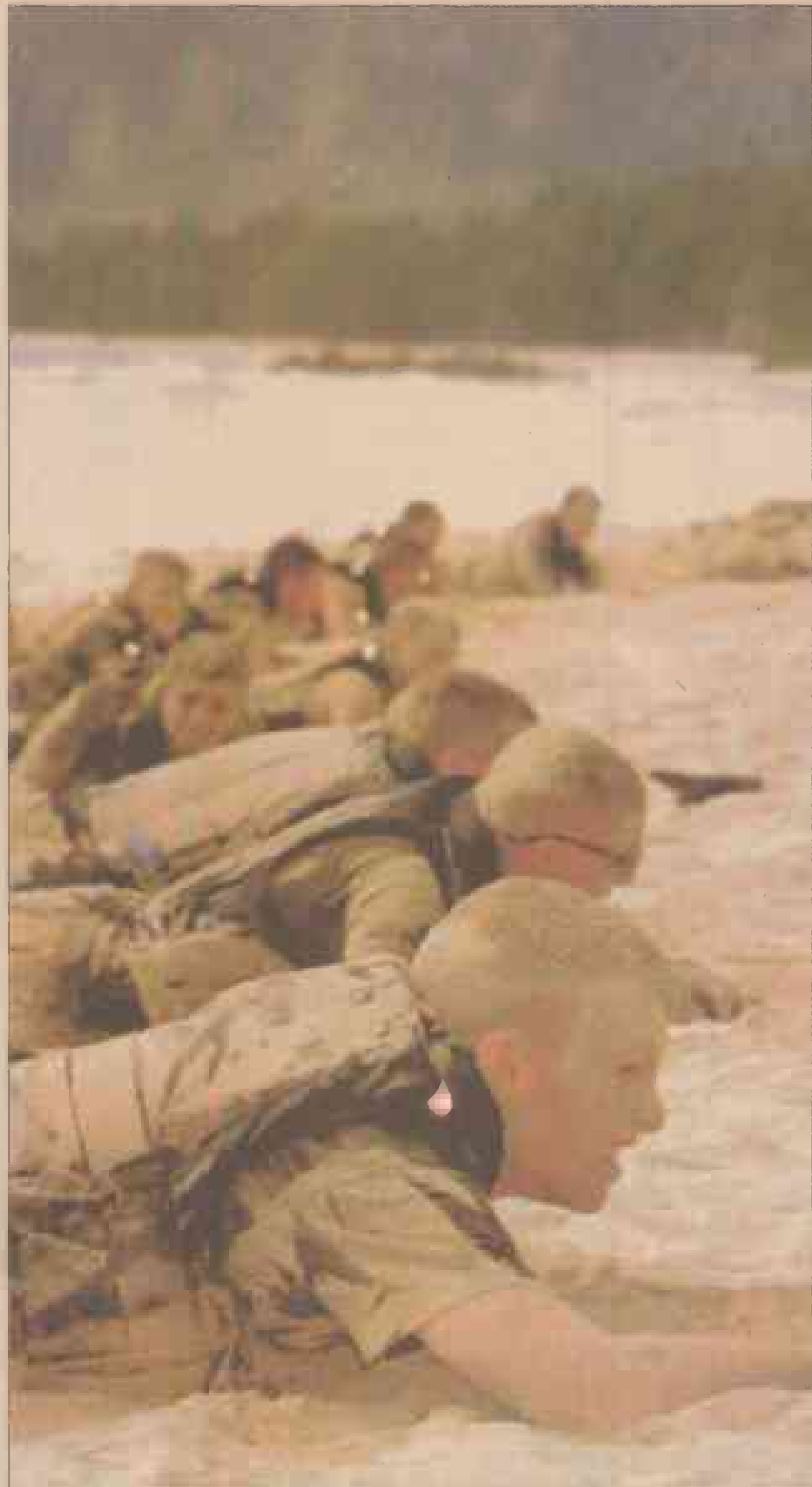

Corps establishes first billet specific award

Marine Corps Recruiting Command

WASHINGTON, DC — The Secretary of the Navy has approved a new Marine Corps service ribbon recognizing the challenges and successes of Marine Corps Recruiters. The Marine Corps Recruiting Service Ribbon is the first billet-specific award established for the Marine Corps.

General Carl E. Mundy Jr., Commandant of the Marine Corps (prior to June 30), provided a strong endorsement on the proposal for the recruiting ribbon. "I recognize that many jobs are tough - off and on. Recruiting is the only job I know that's tough all the time, and where success is measured each and every thirty days times thirty-six months. Recruiters are our life blood," Gen. Mundy said.

Despite the military drawdown, the demands placed on recruiters is increasing. The requirement for new Marine Corps recruits increased 2,751 in Fiscal Year 1995, up from the 1994 requirement of 37,963.

The recruiting service is often referred to as "the only regiment in daily contact with an opposing force." The forces opposing today's Marine recruiters are the Fortune 500 companies and major universities and colleges. The battle being fought is over the annual recruitment of nearly 42,000 individuals who meet the mental, moral and physical qualifications to become Marines.

"As a former recruiting station commanding officer, I have an instant bond and respect for the

enlisted recruiter. The challenges faced on a daily basis are unrivaled in any other duty I have experienced, said BGen Garry L. Parks, commanding general, Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego. Those who have not been 'on the street' cannot appreciate the unrelenting demands of this billet. The recruiting ribbon will appropriately recognize these dedicated Marines."

BGen. Jack W. Klimp, commanding general, Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C./Eastern Recruiting Region, has participated in two wars and commanded Task Force Mogadishu in Operation Restore Hope. He has also commanded a recruiting station. "Of all my assignments, recruiting was by far the most demanding and stressful duty I have been assigned to perform," said BGen. Klimp. "No other assignment placed me under as much sustained stress for as prolonged a period of time as recruiting duty. This is even more the case for our enlisted recruiters under pressure of 'making mission'."

The other services recognize the critical contribution their successful

recruiters make. The Army awards their recruiters with a device worn on their uniforms and the Navy established a recruiting ribbon in February 1989.

Although the other services have awards specifically for recruiters, the only true influence the awards of other services had on the debate for the Marine Corps Recruiting Service Ribbon was to consider a combined Navy-Marine Corps recruiting ribbon.

MWR retail services show marked improvements

A recently-completed Marine Corps Base Hawaii retail survey found that a majority of authorized base patrons are generally satisfied with the Marine Corps Exchange. Overall satisfaction ratings went up 10% over the previous survey, completed in 1993.

The area showing the most marked improvement was customer service, with a 13% rise in overall satisfaction. Customer service has been an area of heavy emphasis over the past two years, according to Merchandise Manager Linda Gulosh. "Mystery shopper programs, 'Mahalo Awards' for outstanding service, and mandatory customer service training for our sales associates are programs that are ongoing, and continue to improve our service to customers," says Gulosh. Over 60% of Exchange employees are military family members.

The survey found that the five merchandise categories primarily shopped-for at the MCX are: (1) gifts, (2) housewares, (3) health & beauty aids, (4) stationery and greeting cards, and (5) sight and sound. Both gift items and housewares made significant increases since the last survey was completed

in 1993. At that time, giftware ranked only fifth in popularity.

Buyer Linda Cezar attributes this sales improvement in large part to enhanced presentation of the merchandise, as well as the unique lines she is able to offer. "The opening of the Home Interiors store enabled us

to free up additional space in the Main Exchange, allowing us to display the gift items and housewares more effectively and attractively. It's easier now for our customers to see the many different items we carry, such as Precious Moments and Boyd's Bears," she explains.

The areas receiving the most improved satisfaction ratings were Stationery/Greeting Cards (17% increase in "Excellent" to "Good" ratings over last survey period) and Furniture (up 11%), again largely

• An anonymous caller reported via telephone to the military police a suspicious person at the intersection of Cochran Street and Moses Street. representative.

• The military police apprehended a suspect for DWI after stopping him at the H-3 gate inbound during a command authorized armed forces identification card check. The intoxilyzer results were .075% blood alcohol content. The military police apprehended the suspect for DWI and released him to his unit representative.

• An anonymous caller reported a noise complaint on Cochran Street. The military police made contact with the suspect and asked him for his AFID card. The suspect became argumentative, stated obscenities towards

the military police and departed the area. The military police apprehended the suspect for breach of peace and released him to his unit representative.

Marine broke the family tradition by joining the Corps

Pushups, situps and the camouflage utilities are no stranger to Robert K. Miller. He has been surrounded by these for most of his life. However, instead of wearing the Battle Dress Uniforms of his father and mother, this Army brat chose to complement his attire with the eagle, globe and anchor.

"My father is a Command Master Sergeant in the Army, and my mother was also in the Army," explained the young sergeant. "They were surprised, but very supportive when I chose to be a Marine."

Miller was attending the Leesville High School in Louisiana when a Marine Recruiter called him and asked if they could meet. "I told him he was wasting his time, but that he could come over and talk if he wanted to," Miller said. "I think what got me was the challenge. All my friends said I would be crazy to join and that it was too hard. I decided then that I was going to do it."

So after one year in the Delayed Entry Program, Miller left for recruit training in San Diego on July 17, 1989.

"I originally signed for and was guaranteed to go into the intelligence field,"

Miller explained. "But there was a mix-up in boot camp, and nobody in my series received the interviews for intelligence."

Miller found out that he had been assigned to go to the Military Police School, Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, TX. "At first I was really upset," he explained. "They told me that my orders for the intelligence field would be straightened out when I got to the MP school. They were in the process of fixing the error so I could leave for the intelligence school in Virginia when I decided I would rather stay and become an MP. I was having a great time with all the training and information so I signed paperwork to stay there."

Miller completed the course and reported to his first duty with the Military Police Department, Parris Island, S.C. He remained there for three years before volunteering for Military Security Guard duty.

He was accepted for embassy duty and after completing the MSG School in Quantico, Va., on May 1, 1992, Miller received orders to the Nairobi Embassy, Kenya, Africa. He remained there from May of 1992 through September of 1993.

"It was a great experience," Miller said. "I was able to go on a safari, and I also traveled to some of the other countries in

Africa, like Kampala and Uganda. It is a really different culture and there was a lot to learn.

"During that time period there was a lot of internal strife," he explained. "The first multi-party election for Kenya govern-

ment was held and there were a lot of related incidents that kept us on our toes and made me realize exactly why we were there."

After completing that tour, Miller left for his second embassy duty in Bangkok, Thailand. He was there from October 1993 through April 1995.

"Thailand is a really big deal," Miller explained. "There are a lot of dignitaries that visit. I got to meet former President George Bush and Secretary of State Warren Christopher. I had breakfast with the now Commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. Krulak and Sgt.Maj. Lee. Before I left, I talked with BGen. Vercauteren. When he found out I was going to Hawaii he said 'I'll see you again when you get there.' And he did, he specifically asked for me at one of the Battalion runs," said Miller. "It felt good to know that I had made an impression and that he remembered."

The Bangkok Embassy has a small group of Marines, Miller explained. "It is all very political. We are there to represent the Marine Corps, and provide the security for American visitors. As the former Commandant of the Marine Corps Gen. Gray commented, we are the 'Ambassadors in Green.'"

"As a Marine, we are often invited to

dinner with a variety of heads of state and representatives," Miller said. "These are very influential people who have a high regard for the Marine Corps. I understood exactly why I am a Marine. It is that mystique of Semper Paratus. People never forget the impressions you make so you carry yourself accordingly, at all times."

Miller is currently stationed at the Military Police Department, MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay. He is serving as the Watch Patrol Supervisor at this time, but plans to be involved in any training with the other sections as he can.

"I'm always looking for ways to improve myself," Miller said. "My eventual goal is to work with the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration. I want to do something that really matters and makes a difference in someone's life. Too many people go through life ignoring the problems and turning their back on people in need. Marines never have that problem. They put it on the line and make a difference."

"So whether I serve in the Corps for 20 plus years or work with the DEA," Miller explained that, "I will take every opportunity afforded to broaden my experience and knowledge so that when I look back I know that my life meant something and that I made a difference."

The Navy recruiting ribbon is blue and gold and is awarded to all personnel in the recruiting command.

"The criteria for the Marine Corps recruiting ribbon is different from the Navy recruiting ribbon," said Cmdr. M.J. Harbacek, from the Office of Deputy Assistant Secretary Navy for Manpower. "That's why there is different ribbons for Navy and Marine Corps recruiting."

The Marine Corps Recruiting Service Ribbon is the first Marine Corps ribbon to restrict eligibility to specific billets. Eligible personnel for the new ribbon include: Marines possessing a military occupational specialty of 8411, recruiter or 8412, career recruiter, who have served in an MOS 8411 or 8412 billet, officers

who have served as a Marine Corps Recruiting Command recruiting station commanding officer, executive officer, operations officer, or officer selection officer and the recruiting station sergeant major. Detailed eligibility requirements for the new ribbon are detailed in ALMAR 95/181, a message from the Commandant of the Marine Corps to all Marines.

Marines eligible to receive the ribbon will receive it upon the successful completion of their tour of duty. Command recruiters and recruiter aids are not eligible for this award. Prior service recruiters are eligible for this award upon completion of 36 months of consecutive service in an 8411 billet.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for this award, recruiting duty is defined as duty performed in an 8411 or 8412 billet as set forth in the table of organization or duty performed at the recruiting station

level in the billet of Marine Corps recruiting station commanding officer, executive officer, operations officer, officer selection officer or sergeant major.

Personnel who were transferred prior to their original projected rotation date are authorized to receive this award if they complete a minimum of 30 months of recruiting. Personnel who were transferred due to relief for cause or relief for the good of the service from recruiting duty are not eligible for the ribbon. Waivers of the 30 month requirement will be considered on a case-by-case basis by the Commanding General, Marine Corps Recruiting Command. Successful tour is defined as the completion of the prescribed tour of duty.

The Marine Corps Recruiting Service Ribbon will be awarded retroactive to January 1, 1973, reflecting the establishment of the all-volunteer force. Authority to

award the Marine Corps Recruiting Ribbon is delegated to commanding officers.

Commanding officers will ensure recruiters currently on recruiting duty have met all criteria set forth in ALMAR 95/181 and will record and enter in the Marine's Service Record Book or Officer Qualification Record denoting the issuance of award. For personnel on active duty but not currently on recruiting duty, the current commanding officer shall determine eligibility from the member's service record and if eligible, award the ribbon.

The Marine Corps Recruiting Service Ribbon symbolizes the dress blue trousers. The ribbon has a red blood stripe centered on a blue back-

ground and consists of a ribbon bar only. No citation or certificate will be issued. The ribbon will be worn after the Navy and Marine Corps overseas service ribbon and before the armed forces reserve medal.

The last two Marine Corps specific awards to be approved were the Marine Corps Reserve Ribbon established in December 1948, and the Marine Corps Expeditionary Medal authorized in May 1919. The Marine Corps Good Conduct Medal which is awarded only to enlisted Marines was approved in July 1896.

Gen. Mundy presented the first Recruiting ribbons during a ceremony at Headquarters Marine Corps on June 26.

The Marine Corps Recruiting Service Ribbon will be available at Marine Corps exchanges in August or may be requisitioned from the Merritt Ribbon Company, 30 Davids Drive, Hauppauge, N.Y. 11788. The phone number is (516) 435-0414.

attributable to the opening of the new furniture store this year. "Home Interiors endeavors to offer our patrons a more value-priced, updated selection than other military exchanges," says Cezar.

Stationery/Greeting Cards buyer Pat Sasaki points to a new personalized card computer, as well as the introduction of new card lines such as Island Heritage, as contributors to the growth in this line.

Many changes and improvements are planned or have already been implemented based on the responses and comments given in the survey. Among the recent changes are an almost doubled inventory of boys'

clothing sizes 8-20, as well as a computer software department.

IBM-compatible software, ranging from \$5.99 budget programs to high-end \$300+ applications, is now located in the Music Department. Several IBM computers are now available in the store as well. Some additional models and software may be ordered through the Exchange's Special Order Department, located in the Household Department. A Spanish music section has also been added due to requests.

Although the Exchange does carry well-known name-brand lines of women's clothing, such as Liz Claiborne, there have been many requests for more low-priced or budget clothing. According to Ladies' Clothing buyer Iris Tokita, the Claiborne line is very important to the the Exchange, accounting for

19% of total sales. However, in response to the demand for more moderately-priced clothing in all categories, the King's Bay and Basic Concepts lines were added earlier this year. They offer basic items to fit a more casual lifestyle at a lower price. Likewise, the children's shoe assortment has been changed to reflect the need for less-expensive quality shoes with island living in mind. Tokita recommends that budget-conscious customers look for the "MCX Low Price" signs throughout the store, identifying everyday value-priced clothing. This is an area that will continue to expand in the future, she says.

Kaneohe's cowboys will be glad to hear that a Western Wear section has just been added in the Men's Department. Based on customer acceptance, this section will be

expanded into a Western concept shop for the fall season.

An expanded selection in popular merchandise categories is not an option due to the space restrictions of the current Exchange. This will be a reality in the new Exchange scheduled for completion in late 1996 or early 1997: A toy store, bike shop, expanded music department, and sporting goods are among the areas targeted for growth. To accommodate the fitness-minded patrons of MCB Hawaii, a Fitness Shop carrying exercise wear and equipment was recently added to the Main Store, contributing to an 8% increase in sales in this category.

The biannual Retail Survey was conducted by the base Morale, Welfare and Recreation Marketing Department. Five hundred and fif-

teen randomly-selected authorized patrons were surveyed. They completed a self-administered questionnaire that was distributed at the Kaneohe Bay Exchange and various other locations on base, as well as through retiree and reservist groups. Focus groups are conducted regularly for ongoing customer feedback. Patrons with both positive and negative comments or suggestions are encouraged to fill out a "Take Time to Comment" form, available at any MWR location. All forms are sent to both the MWR Director and Activity Manager, with each receiving a personal response.

Profits generated from sales at the Marine Corps Exchange locations support the many free or low-cost recreational programs run by MWR for the benefit of Marines, Sailors and their families.

Diamond Head Crater hike is a cost-free adventure

Thousands of years ago it was a blazing inferno of fire and lava. In the seventies it was the sight of rock concerts and music festivals. Today it is a popular hiking trail and one of the most recognized landmarks in Hawaii.

Diamond Head towers above all other landmarks in Waikiki. But with a brief hike up the trail, the picturesque beauty makes the 45 minute hike well worth the trip.

Diamond Head is a dormant volcano located just a few blocks east of the busy streets of Waikiki. It is perhaps one of the most photographed and visited areas in Hawaii. This towering

crater reaches heights of almost 1,000 feet above the Pacific Ocean.

For those who embark upon this hiking adventure, the steep and winding trail takes approximately 45 minutes to ascend and includes a short walk through a unlit tunnel, a trek up a large series of concrete steps and a two story climb up a spiral staircase. Despite those obstacles, the trip is well worth the effort.

When hikers reach the top they are rewarded with a spectacular view of the beauty which has made Hawaii such a popular place to visit.

The trail, which is clearly marked and includes safety railing throughout, affords families the opportunities to make a morning of this adventure.

For those who embark upon this hike here are a few tips to make the trip an enjoyable one:

- Wear loose and comfortable clothing.
- Wear hiking shoes, boots or some type of heavy duty tennis shoes to protect the feet. Sandals are discouraged.
- Take water in canteens or carry bottled water. There are no water fountains available once the hike up the trail begins.
- Carry a small pocket flashlight to traverse through the unlit tunnel and the spiral staircase.
- If carrying items, try to limit it to necessary items. The steep trail can sometimes make carrying large, cumbersome items difficult.

The park is open at 6 a.m. and the

gate closes at 6 p.m. Those who wish to proclaim "I climbed Diamond Head," should get an early start in order to beat the heat.

As with all other tourist sights in Hawaii, at the base of the trail there are tables set up by local vendors with t-shirts for purchase. The t-shirts proudly proclaim the accomplishments of the hikers descending down the trail.

Diamond Head hiking trail affords a cost-free opportunity to get some exercise, enjoy the beauty of nature and spend some time in the belly of one of the world's most popular volcanos. Most importantly, the hiker should remember to be safe and don't forget the camera to capture those images forever.

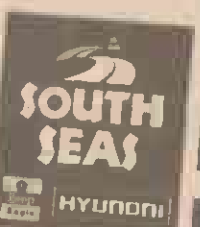

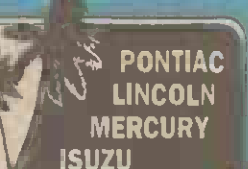
