## Hawaii Marines, Sailors host Secretary of Navy

The Secretary of the Navy, Richard Danzig, brought good news to servicemembers aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, on the unluckiest of days, "Friday the 13th," in his first trip to K-Bay since being sworn in

Danzig spoke with commanding officers of MCB Hawaii's base and tenant commands, including the newest members of the K-Bay family, Commander Patrol and Reconnaissance Force, U. S. Pacific Fleet. who recently made the move to K-Bay from Naval Air Station Barbers Point.

Danzig discussed such issues as the 2000 defense authorization bill, which will include a 4.8 percent pay raise for service-

members Jan. 1 and targeted pay raises of like 1st Radio Battalion. nearly 5.5 percent for July 1; improvements to retirement benefits from lawmakers repealing the Military Retirement Reform Act of 1986; operational tempo; and repair and maintenace backlogs at K-Bay.


He also took time out to "kick boxes" and get some face-time with Marines and Sailors by visiting various units and even taking on a group of servicemembers in a game of full-court basketball at the Semper Fit Center

Specifically, he spoke to 1st Radio Battalion Marines and was a special guest in an awards presentation for three Radio Bn. Marines who received Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals. While there, Danzig expressed the importance of units

"I not only wanted to recognize these three Marines, but also really all of you," he said while speaking to Radio Bn. Marines. "There are only two units like you in the world, and from my standpoint, we need 100 like you."

The Marines were grateful to get the opportunity to meet him.

"It's an honor he would come to our unit and take time out to meet the Marines here," said Master Sgt. Frank Cartledge, the battalion training chief, who was among those presented with a Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal. "It was unusual, because it's not often that you have the Secretary of the Navy present you with an



## Squadron trains off Kauai

There was a whirlwind of aerial activity off the island of Kauai Aug. 11 as Marines set the sky ablaze with training fire.

Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 463 sent Marines on a mission to qualify in different firing maneuvers, including electronic warfare and a .50 caliber machine gun shoot from a CH-53D Sea Stallion helicopter.

"It's always good to be combat ready," said Lance Cpl. Eric Hiemstra, ordnance technician and aerial observer for HMH-463. "Without this kind of training, I wouldn't consider myself combat ready."

Although the CH-53D is primarily used for cargo and troop transportation. Marines on board also have to be ready to fend off attacks.

"We need to be able to defend ourselves at time of combat and provide suppressive fire, so Marines can get in and out of the helicopter," said the HMH-463 crew chief instructor Sgt. Jeff Schott,

For the first part of training and qualification, HMH-463 pilots flew toward the deserted southern coast of Kauai, to detect and counterattack simulated missiles during the helicopter versus groundthreat electronic warfare.

With special equipment on the ground, signals of different missile types were emitted. Pilots had to

use countermeasures, such as firing off flares and chaffs to divert the simulated missiles, while twisting and turning in the sky like a roller coaster with-

"You have to be familiar with different missile systems and search radars." said Master Sgt. Richard W. Holtzom, the maintenance chief for HMH-463. "Your knowledge is the key. You have to know how to defeat different missile systems."

Afterwards, aerial observers got a chance to fire off one of the two .50 caliber machine guns placed on either side of the aircraft. The CH-53D flew several laps as Marines took turns firing at a box

"Overall, I think it was a good learning experience," said Hiemstra, "to actually fire the weapon."

Anyone can read any book they want on firing a .50 caliber machine gun from a CH-53, but they can't really know what it's like until they experience the actual fire, with an unbalanced platform as the helicopter maneuvers in the air and a whirl of fumes as the rounds constantly get eaten by the machine gun — that's when they know what it's like,

"It's a rush when you get behind the gun," said Cpl. Matthew Squillace, an air frames mechanic and aerial observer for HMH-463. "It makes me feel

## Hurricane preparation prevents panic for Hawaii residents

People might think, because Hawaii is a tropical paradise, disaster could never strike here. Because of its tropical location, however, is probably the biggest reason why it can - in the form of a hurricane.

High winds, torrential rainfall and high surf are its weapons, and when it hits, the path of destruction left behind identifies it clearly as a hurricane

In September 1992, Hurricane Iniki rocked the islands of Kauai and Oahu with sustained winds of up to 130 mph. Iniki served as a gentle reminder that, though many hurricanes may miss Hawaii, when

they do hit, they're nothing short of catastrophic. "We started tracking storms in 1950, and Hawaii doesn't have quite the history of places like the Carribean or Guam," said Melvin Nishihara, the hurricane program sustained winds of 74 mph or greater, according to

In reference to tropical cyclones, according to Base Order P3140.5, the Civil Emergency Management Program is based on the forecast arrival time of storms with expected winds of 50 knots (57 mph) or greater.

According to the order, within 24 hours of the storm's impact, it is advised that residents:

 Secure all loose or portable items and possessions.

· Fuel all vehicles to capacity. · Prepare for evacuation from living quarters to shelters.

In the event of a tropical cyclone, base officials will direct residents to evacuate to one of four places. The locations of the four shelters are:

· K-Bay Lanes (bowling alley)

Windward Enlisted Club

The Semper Fit Center

· Anderson Hall Dining Facility Once at a shelter, personnel may not leave until the all clear is given.

"Hawaiian Hurricanes and Safety Measures," a pamphlet published by Federal Emergency Management Agency, Hawaii State Department of Civil Defense, and the National Oceanic and Atmospherie Administration. Hurricane season in Hawaii falls between June and November.

According to the pamphlet, hurricanes are large whirlwinds in which the air moves in a circular motion around a center of very low pressure. Hurricane winds can reach 200 mph, and the storm dominates the ocean's surface and lower atmosphere for

10,000 square miles or greater. Although only three hurricanes have hit the Hawaiian Islands since 1959 -



## Decisions can have deadly consequences

"Lance Cpl. (Blank) died at 0030 this morning when his parents took him off life support ...'

Unfortunately, I've read messages like this far too often in my duties as the Force sergeant major. I just read this one a few minutes ago.



about the death of a Marine, especially one so young, you cannot help but be affected.

A few years ago, a couple of my Marines were killed during Desert Storm. I think of them often; sometimes on Memorial Day or during a mess night, when I see the table draped in black, and sometimes 1 ily of the lance corporal, thinking

think of them out of the clear blue sky. Death on the battlefield is tragic; but because of the nature of our business, you understand and deal

This Marine, however, who died earlier today, had been injured in a motorcycle accident while on liberty a few days ago. He was hovering between life and death while you and I went about our daily lives. I briefed the accident to the commanding general a few days ago, and in a few minutes, I am going in to tell the general

As I sit here writing this, I am struggling to find a way to convey to you the importance of taking care of yourselves and your fellow Marines so that I won't have to read messages like this anymore.

I was also thinking about the fam-

about the pain they must be going through right now - having been informed about the accident and injury of their son just a few days ago, and then hoping he would recover. I was thinking what it must have been like for them to catch a plane to fly to his bedside; praying all the way that the good Lord would allow him to live. I also thought about the agony they must have felt a few hours ago when the doctors advised them that they had done all that they could do, and then putting the decision to discontinue life support in the hands of the two people who gave him life.

When you are young, you think you are invincible.

I am sure that this lance corporal was thinking of many different things as he sped down the road in the last minutes of his life. Maybe he was thinking about his parents, or a girlfriend. Perhaps, he was thinking about an upcoming deployment, or making plans for the future; when his time in the Corps came to a end. We will never know, because he is gone.

When I write about drinking and driving or speeding, I think about the Marines I read about and their families just as I think about my Marines who died in the desert in Kuwait. Some of the deaths I understand many of them I never will.

I try to convince you that your decisions and actions both on duty and off can have deadly consequences. Marines, your country, your Corps and your families need each and every one of you. Don't let a momentary lack of judgment be your last. Think before you act and be safe. Slow down and don't drink and

drive. Semper Fi.

## Committee, K-Bay residents discuss quality of life

Defense Advisory Committee on Women in the Services representative Deborah M. Ching visited Kaneohe Bay Monday to discuss quality of life issues concerning female Marines, as well as all servicemembers.

The committee, commonly known as DACOWITS, is comprised of men and women who are appointed by the Secretary of Defense "to provide recommendations relevant to the optimum utilization of women in America's armed forces," according to a fact sheet published by DACOW-

During Ching's visit here, she, along with Lt.

Col. Enrico M. Velasquez, the base inspector, and Master Sgt. Helen A. Josypenko, the equal opportunity advisor, led discussions with four different groups of servicemembers and base residents at the Fairways All-Hands Club.

"The visit here was part of ongoing efforts of women's issues in the military," said Josypenko.

In all, 73 people participated in the discussion groups, which covered issues not only affecting female servicemembers' concerns, but the concems of all servicemembers, said Josypenko. Topics included child care, integration of men and women in military training, bachelor's quarters and medical issues

"We looked at how to work better together," said Josypenko, "and got together to discuss how to bring (servicemembers) closer."

From these groups, Josypenko explained, Ching was able to get a "feel" for what topics concem MCB Hawaii servicemembers. After talking with the groups, Ching used the information she gathered to inform and provide recommendations when she briefed MCB Hawaii Commanding General Brig. Gen. R.E. Parker Jr., base and tenant commands Monday afternoon.

Ching serves as a member of the Forces Development and Utilization Subcommittee and is currently the principal of Ching Consulting, a Honolulu-based marketing firm.

## Marines land roles in movie

MARINE CORPS AIR STA-TION BEAUFORT, S.C. — With bombs bursting and the "fog of war" at its thickest, two MCAS Beaufort Marines were ready to take on the challenges during their mission in Ouarzazarte, Morocco, in northern Africa.

Staff Sgt. Kermit J. Graham, computer services network staff noncommissioned officer in charge here, and Lance Cpl. Jon C. Drew, Training and Audiovisual Support Center combat videographer, had the enviable task of flying to Morocco and taking part in the upcoming film, "Rules of Engagement." All they had to do was be themselves - Marines.

To be considered for roles in the movie, they first had to endure a series of casting calls, competing against approximately 800 other people who showed up for the initial casting call.

Graham said he didn't know anything about the casting call until one of his friends told him there was a movie director in the area looking for people with present or prior military experience.

"During the first casting call, I spoke to the casting director and waited for a call back," said Graham.

Those who were called back went for a second and, for some, a third audition until the director found the people he thought were perfect for the roles.

Once they were selected for the movie, Graham and Drew were willing and ready, but there was a catch. They would have to shoot their portion of the movie on the other side of the Atlantic Ocean; in the deserts of North Africa.

"It was a great experience," said Graham. "It is a dream for a lot of people to be on the other side of the camera. My intention was to see how things were on screen and see how it looked when it's being shot."

Along with Graham, Drew took full advantage of being on a movie set as well as being in a foreign

"It was a good experience of seeing their (Moroccans') unique culture," said Drew. "It was also good to see others working in my field (videography), but on a larger scale."

Before they began filming, the Marines and other actors had to go through a mini "boot camp," which retired Marine Capt. Dale Dye, military advisor for the Paramount Pictures production, requires of his actors and actresses. Dye's credits include "Platoon" and "Saving Private Ryan."

The mini boot camp was not as intense as Marine Corps boot camp, but was designed to get actors familiar with their environment, their roles, the people they had to work with, the weapons, and the

was when Graham met Blair Underwood, an actor who has played major roles in movies and television shows. "When we first got started he (Underwood) was sort of hesitant and uneasy (in) issuing orders," said Graham. "After attending the boot camp, it made him look more natural on screen. Once we hit the set he took over

(really) well." To make things as realistic as

possible, weapons were test-fired using blanks, and everyone was trained to do simple things like aiming in with use of the sights and getting comfortable with the weapons.

Everyone from the Marines to movie stars like Samuel L. Jackson and Ben Kingsley, had to participate in the seven-day boot camp.

Drew and Graham said the movie stars were easy to approach. "They were like normal people,

very friendly and (they) offered advice on their field," said Drew. With the actors' status in the film industry, one would think the interaction between Marines and actors would be one filled with Marines asking questions of the actors, but in reality, the actors had questions about the Corps.

Both Marines said they thought it unusual that people known internationally would take such an interest in a job that is not considered to be as glamorous.

According to Graham, Underwood was impressed with what Marines do. and now has a different point of view of the armed

Along with meeting Hollywood stars like Underwood, Tommy Lee Jones and others, the Marines had the chance to experience the Moroccan culture. Graham compared the trip to a deployment. Each person had to accomplish their mission, but they also had some time to see how things worked outside the film realm.

"I had the chance to try some of the different cuisines while others went camel-back riding," said Drew, who kept away from what he called the "humped-back horse."

According to both Fightertown Marines, their experience was definitely unusual, and one they will not



## This Month in Marine Corps History

## Each battle played part in history

From Recruit Training, Marines are taught to learn from the Corps' history.

The following are brief accounts of some Marine events that began in August.

 One of America's successful campaigns during the Vietnam War came in August of 1965

Operation Starlight, one of the first major Marine offensive operations in Southeast Asia, began Aug. 18, 1965. The 7th Marine Regiment's four battalions mounted their attack against the 1st Viet Cong Regiment. The operation claimed the lives of more than 900 Viet Cong soldiers, while more than 200 Marines were killed-in-action.

Marines employed close air support, Naval günfire and brash, assertive infantry tactics that matched the determination of the native Viet Cong army. The success of this mission gave the leaders of the 3rd Marine Amphibious Force total confidence in the Corps'warfighting ability.

•"From the Halls of Montezuma, to the Shores of Tripoli...'

So begins the Marines Hymn. Part of the origins of that line comes from the battle at Chapultepec Castle, the Halls of Montezuma, during the Mexican War. Marines, as part of an Army brigade, marched on Mexico City Aug. 6, 1847.

The movement of the Army parent units headed through 30,000 of Mexican dictator Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna's army. Unswayed, the unit pushed on.

After finally reaching the capital city, the Marines in the division had to scale the Hill of Chapultepec — 600 yards long and 200 feet tall -- to reach the Halls of Montezuma. The soldiers hadn't been successful, so it was up to Marine forces to earn victory for America. Casualties were heavy, yet Marine enlisted and officers flowed in waves over the fortress' walls and were instrumental in the efforts to capture the city.

• Also concerning the Marines Hymn, the anthem of the Marine Corps was officially copyrighted August 19, 1919. The tune was popularized by Marine Band leaders Francis M. Scala and John Philip Sousa, but the origins of the hymn are said to have come from a Marine on duty in Mexico in 1847.

Your educational bridge to the new millennium

For 10 noncommissioned officers and a petty officer, knowledge about alcohol, its effects, and how to recognize signs of abuse has become easier thanks to the Squad Leader's Alcohol Awareness Course.

The course, which was held Aug. 4-5 at the Substance Abuse Counseling Center at MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, is designed to help clear up misconceptions about alcohol and its impact on servicemembers.

"A lot of Marines don't know the short- and long-term effects of alcohol." said Gunnery Sgt. James Willis, Alcohol Impact coordinator with SACC.

Instructors said they hoped the course would help students recognize the differences between social drinkers and alcohol abusers, and help them identify warning signs of those who may be dependent on alcohol.

"There are Marines who don't drink all week long and can control it Monday through Friday," explained Willis in class, "but from Friday night to Sunday they're 'tore up from the floor up.' That's something we need to address as NCOs."

Many leaders, as well as junior enlisted Marines, see NCOs as the first line of defense against substance abuse, said Staff Sgt. Tony Joyner. Alcohol Impact instructor "For the most part, it's a lot easier for the troops to identify with NCOs than the staff NCOs because they're closer in age."

Segments of the class taught the students that some Marines, like heavy weekend drinkers, have a problem. even though they may not recognize it as such.

"These are the Marines who go to work and can do their job well," Willis said, "But they still need that drink."

The students discussed the impact American society has on its young people and were encouraged to interact with one another and think about differences between various cultures.

"I think it's family upbringing," said Sgt. Jonathon Knauth, photo lab noncommissioned officer in charge at K-Bay's Training Audiovisual Support Center. "In some countries you can go to a pub at 13 years, but it's not a big deal because you may well be accustomed to drinking a little (versus binge drinking) with every meal at home."

The students were taught that in some cultures, especially European ones, drinking isn't taboo, and oftentimes it is accept-

ed to drink with the family at the dinner table. Some in the class reasoned this may be why alcohol isn't as glamorized abroad as it is in the United States.

"Other countries don't promote alcohol as much as we do," said Sgt. Dustin Edwards, assistant chief cook at Anderson Halle. "It's glamorized here. Just look at all the sporting events sponsored by beer companies. It's (alcohol) just advertised more."

A sobering moment came to the class when Ginny Higgins, a member of Mothers Against Drunk Driving, sat before the servicemembers and shared her story of grief...

Higgins told the class the story of her daughter; who drove while under the influence of alcohol and lost her life as a result. Tears welled up in her eyes as she explained the "spiraling effect of drinking and driving" and how many families are affected by alcohol.

"I don't enjoy dragging my trash out of the closet," began Higgins, who lost her daughter in 1991. "I don't want to tell you all my story but I will if it will keep even one person from drinking and driving."

Petty Officer 2nd Class Paul Green said Higgins' story was a moment that stuck out because he could see the impact of her tragedy.

"It's unnatural for a parent to bury a child." Higgins told the class. "We are supposed to bury our parents. Not the other way around."


"What people don't realize is that not all DUI offenders are bad people," she continued. "They are just people who made bad choices. It takes very little not to get behind the wheel of a car. It's just common sense. If you don't care about yourself, then think about that family coming home from the movies."

"I felt a lot of pain coming from her," said Sgt. James Stockwell, Subsistence NCOIC at Anderson Hall, of Higgins' story.

"I would feel horribly upset if someone got behind the wheel of a car and wound up taking my child's life." Stockwell said. "But, by the same token, I know I have made some mistakes when I was younger and, by the grace of God, nothing happened to me or anyone else. So I also know how easy it can be to get behind that wheel."

The course also covered illicit drugs and their effects on health and the body. Various films were presented, including one that detailed several different organs damaged by substance abuse and contrasted them with "healthy" organ counterparts taken during autopsies from

victims of automobile accidents. "The most important thing I'm taking from this," Stockwell said, "is that now I have tools to reference. I'm not the kind of person to tell you something just because that's how I feel. Now I can tell my Marines where to find this information."



#### DEFY teaches teamwork

EWA BEACH — Twenty-three of MCB Hawaii's kids participated in a Reality Oriented Personal Experience Services course here Aug. 9 for activities in the Drug Education For Youth program's first phase.

The youths learned confidence and teamwork through different "trust games" and team challenges at the course, explained Elizabeth Hartford, ROPES instructor.

Like the Marine obstacle course and leadership reactionary course, the course required teamwork. The kids had to work together to get the whole team through obstacles to succeed.

"It's a fabulous course," said Hartford, it gets "the kids to think as a team, then take those skills and apply them in different situations."

Before the games or course were conducted, the children and mentors were briefed on what was expected. Much like a military briefing, the kids were told that safety is paramount

The first set of games involved the trust games.

For one of the trust games, the kids stood with their toes touching and held hands. Then they sat down, still holding hands. After sitting, they had to try and stand up together.

The second string of games focussed on teamwork. First was a huge jump rope exercise. Each

DEFY child had to go into the jump rope, jump the same amount of times as everyone else, and leave.

"This is awesome," said Gabrielle Conrad, 9 years old. "The obstacle course was fun - my favorite was the rope maze with the bell."

"It felt good," was a shared response within the group when obstacles were finished.

"Helping each other out; that's what matters," said Susan Shupe. ROPES instructor and recreation coordinator.

After an obstacle was overcome. the kids sat in a circle and talked about what they learned. be it leadership, trust, or honesty. The talk was similar to a mission debrief. During the final part of the field

trip, the kids climbed around on wires suspended 15 feet off the ground. Secured in a harness, with a mentor on the ground belaying them, the kids overcame their fears of heights by encouraging each other to go that extra step.

"This is the most important part," Shupe said. "The kids get past their fears and become more trusting of their mentors."

The kids are also preparing for more field trips, said 11-year-old Rebecca Hurt and 10-year-old Ryan Ziegler. Both said they are looking forward to the lunch scheduled with National Football League Pro Bowl players, as a part of the DEFY program's 2nd phase.

have been close enough to cause damage.

Along with causing damage by ravishing coastlines with high winds, according to the pamphlet, a hurricane also creates storm surge, or abnormally large ocean waves caused by the storm. Widespread loss of power is another element of disaster involved with these storms.

In the event of the threat of a hurricane, there are several precautions to take to ensure safety, according to the pamphlet. If a hurricane watch is issued in the area, residents should:

- · Listen to weather reports.
- · Fill their cars with fuel.
- Stock up on dry and canned goods. · Secure loose items that are out-
- Purchase new batteries for radios
- and flashlights. Tape, board or shutter windows
- to prevent shattering.

Another thing to consider, in the event that a hurricane warning is issued, is whether or not to evacuate the home. People who live near the beach should plan to evacuate, as well as those who live near streams or flood plains, according to the pamphlet. Above all, however, if local authorities recommend evacuation, that is the action that should be taken.

A normal visit by a dignitary of the stature of the Secretary of the Navy might include speeches, luncheons and handshakes.

More than anything, and regardless of the outcome of the game, the servicemembers were impressed by the Secretary of the Navy's desire to "get down and dirty on our level."

"I respect and I appreciate his commitment to spend time with us in this way," Banks said.






## 'From Here to Eternity' beach offers more than just sand, surf

verybody has probably been to a beach where tiptoeing a half-mile through the sea of sunbathers dripping in tanning oil, tripping over at least five beach umbrellas, and taking a butt-chewing for kicking sand into some family's picnic potato salad is necessary to get to the last square foot available on the beach.

Why bother?
Go where the crowds and tourists

Because the famous love scene between Deborah Kerr and Burt Lancaster in the movie "From Here to Eternity" was filmed there, the beach is called From Here to Eternity Beach, or just Eternity Beach by Hawaii residents.

Located next to the Blowhole on Kalanianaole Highway, offers none of the above. No crowds, no cramps, no rules and no potato salad — well, not unless one fancies potato salad.

Though the beach is small—only about 50 yards wide, nestled in between two large volcanic rock masses nearly 100 feet below the highway—there is still plenty of room to roam.

"I come here about every week and I never get bored with it. It's never the same place twice," said a local resident during her trip to the beach. "There's never more than 20 or so people here at one time."

Also, at most beaches, a wave comes in, a wave goes out, a wave comes in, a wave goes out ... it's boring. At Eternity Beach, however, the waves are just one of the beach's dimensions. Because the beach is surrounded by rock, there are plenty of places to take a dive from the rocks into the water. It's almost like a pool.

And as far as the waves are concerned, when they get to rocking, the water resembles that of a giant wave pool. It's pure fun.

Another dimension of the beach is the activities available out of the water. Walking to the Blow Hole lookout point provides a picturesque view on one side of the beach. For the more adventurous types, the rock wall on the far side of the beach is a challenging, but safe, climb to an even better view.

On calmer days, snorkeling and scuba diving is another excellent option at Eternity Beach. The underwater rock formations are magnificent, and with the company of occasional visitors like sea turtles, it makes a swim there even more worthwhile.

Now, at most beaches, there are also 100 rules to follow. No coolers, no pets, no smoking, no loud

music, no ..., no ..., no. ... Eternity Beach is like Outback Steakhouse -- "No Rules, Just Right."

On the downside, especially for those with children, there are no lifeguards on duty, so children must be watched under close supervision. Also, some days the waves may be rather large and violent, so good judgement should be used. If the waves look too big, it probably means swimming there isn't such a great idea.

And if the waves are kicking, it might not be a good idea to walk along the rocks near the water. If one good wave swells in, it can sweep even a large adult off the rocks and into the water.

On most days, though, the water is just fine.

To access the beach, park in the Blowhole parking lot. Parking there is free. The trail that descends to the beach is located near the road by the lot's right-side entrance.

Items that are good to bring there include a radio; a large blanket; reef shoes, water-resistent sandals or flip flops; tanning oil or sun block; snorkeling gear; body boards and a camera.

Just remember: beach trips are supposed to be fun. Take a break from the masses for once, travel to Eternity Beach this weekend and let someone else occupy that square foot of sand.




