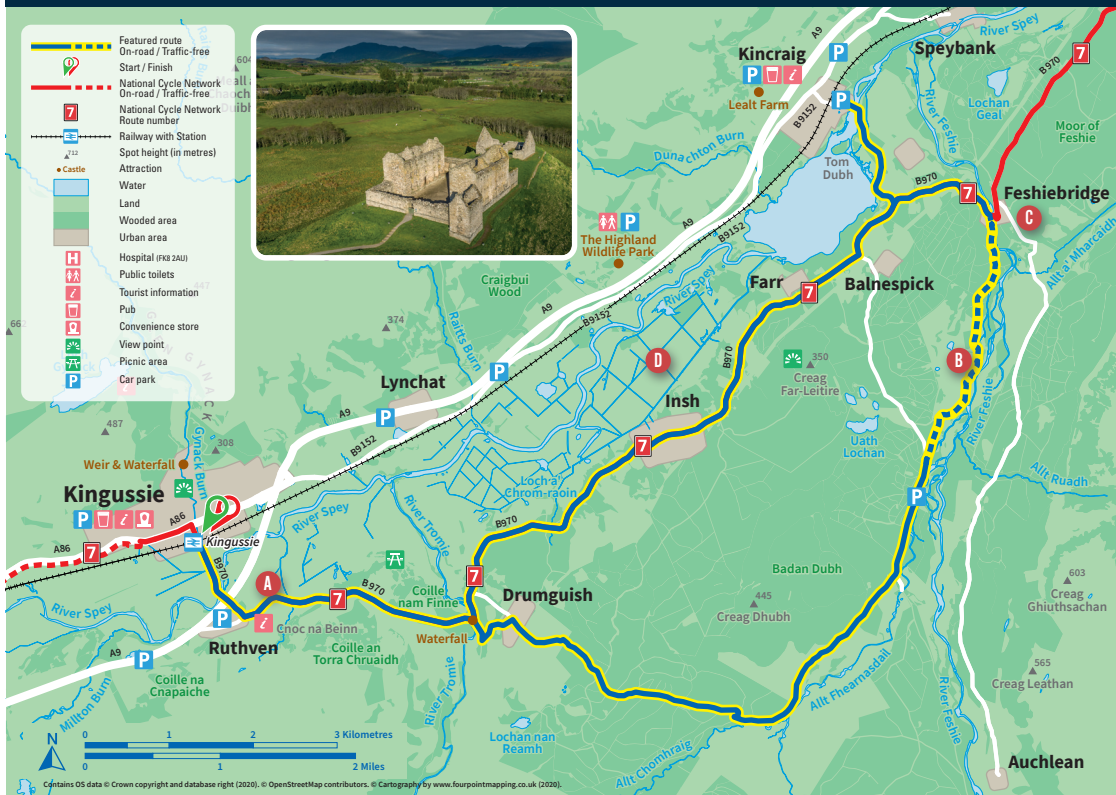
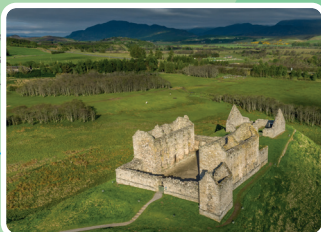

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ROUTE DESCRIPTION

This loop route is a wonderful opportunity to explore the intriguing history and spectacular wildlife of Inshriach Forest and Glen Feshie.

Ruthven Barracks, unmistakable with its dominant position atop a mound, was built by George II's government in the early 1700s after the failed Jacobite uprising of 1715.

Continue past the bulwark for a circuit of Inshriach Forest, home to red squirrels and the shy and elusive Capercaillie, one of Scotland's rarest birds, before retracing the banks of the River Feshie towards Feshiebridge for an easy cycle back.
