SUBSHRUB, WOODY PERENNIAL - deciduous.

2 - 5' high, 2 - 4' wide. Stout stems with mostly basal leaves. Fuzzy, lacy leaves to 10" long.

Yellow flowers in terminal clusters - April to August.

Native habitat: Santa Catalina and San Clemente Islands - rocky coastal bluffs below 100'.

Full sun to part shade.

Well-drained soil preferred.

Drought tolerant but can tolerate occasional water.

Larger and woodier than *E. confertiflorum* (Golden Yarrow).

RARE — CNPS List: 1B.3

(Rare, threatened or endangered in California and elsewhere. Not very endangered in California.)
