## Rosa minutifolia

## Baja California Wild Rose

SHRUB - semi-deciduous.

3 - 6' high, 5'+ spread. Vining, mounding.

Tiny leaves. Stems and leaves densely covered with prickles.

Flowers pink to deep rose-purple
— December to May.

Rose hips have dense spines.

Native habitat: maritime desert scrub; arroyos and mesas near the coast — northwest Baja California and Otay Mesa.

Full sun to part shade.
Water ~1 x / month once established.

Great in wildlife gardens - can form dense thicket as well as having fruit for birds.

Good flowering accent on dry slope or garden.

Excellent for erosion control and soil stabilization.


Will cascade over walls.
