SUBSHRUB - deciduous

3' high, 1 to 2' spread.

Flowers are purple with white and green centers - throughout summer and sometimes throughout year. Occasionally flowers are white.

Fruit are like little green tomatoes.

Native habitat: coastal sage scrub below 6500'

Full sun to part shade.

Some water (1 to 2 x /month) should prevent loss of leaves.

Can spread by underground stems. Good in containers, rock gardens or in borders.

All parts of the plant are toxic.

Deer resistant.
