

LETTER from the CHAIR

2019 was a great year! In many ways, it was the best yet. Companion Animal Alliance raised the overall save rate to a record 77%, up five points from 2018. You may remember that the save rate was only 20% when CAA took over the shelter in 2010. We have certainly come a long way, almost reversing the original numbers.

How did we accomplish a higher save rate? Well, while the numbers improved across the board, let's first look at our higher save rate for cats. Our beautiful new facility, new leaders, and our friendly and knowledgeable staff created a welcoming atmosphere that actually brought a record number of cats into our shelter. And despite the high intake, we can thank our dedicated feline volunteers and fosters for helping us save more lives and find more adoption homes than ever - so much so that we had space to care for 36 cats from a nearby parish in need. It truly takes a village and CAA has a good one.

Our save rate for dogs was also positively influenced by our shelter's expansion in 2019 which included the


fourth adoption room, paid for by a generous donor. The additional kennels, which use soothing colors from the Fear Free palette, can house up to 40 dogs and are quiet and easy to clean. The reduced stress environment means that our dogs are healthier and more adoptable.

While CAA continues to improve the spaces where our pets live, we are also working to provide greater emotional support for the animals in our charge, making them better pets for the families that ultimately adopt them. Some of these innovative activities include exposing our pets to a variety of tastes, smells and sounds, and new, creative ways to keep our furry friends engaged. We now offer our canines frozen peanut butter, soothing music, calming scents, and as much human interaction as possible. Research shows that happier pets stay healthier and are thus more adoptable.

CAA's agreement with East Baton Rouge Parish includes caring for animals in our evacuation shelter during certain emergencies. In 2019, we were able to

complete a test run with Hurricane Barry, which fortunately did not live up to its predictions of potential danger. In the week before the storm, however, we met with City Parish officials to review details of our disaster plan, mobilize fosters and adopters, and ensure that CAA employees were at our facility around-the-clock to manage any unexpected emergencies or influx of animals. Fulfilling a request of Animal Control, the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry dispatched its mobile 50-pet shelter to the F.G. Clark Activity Center at Southern University, where human evacuees would be housed, enabling families to stay near their pets. CAA staff manned that unit as well in order to care for any animals needing assistance.

As always, we couldn't do what we do without the support our community provides. Our volunteers, fosters, donors, staff and all of you who believe in our mission make it possible for CAA to achieve this success. We thank you, one and all and look forward to making even more progress in 2020.

SMELLS, TASTES AND SOUNDS

After a full year in the new shelter with a focus on the physical health of our pets, CAA saw a need to incorporate activities that impacted their emotional well-being. The **Pet Enrichment Program** launched in October 2019 with a goal of enhancing our shelter pets' stay by offering them a variety of tastes, smells and sounds in addition to daily physical activity.

The community instantly showed their love for this initiative. Pounds of peanut butter and pumpkin puree were donated to stuff Kong toys. Music players arrived for every kennel to hear, synced up to a scheduled playlist of storytime and light jazz. Childrens' books were dropped off in droves and groups all over Baton Rouge called about reading to our pets.

Research proves that offering the pets a daily enrichment activity decreases the pets' anxiety and ultimately makes them more adoptable. SECOND CHANCES

CAA has offered second chances for nearly ten years, sometimes even giving third and fourth chances for Baton Rouge's lost and abandoned pets. Now, CAA helps give second chances to former state prisoners through a new partnership with the Louisiana Parole Project. The majority of CAA's newest Animal Caretakers gained parole eligibility after a 2016 U.S. Supreme Court decision found that mandatory life sentences for juveniles were unconstitutional, and Louisiana's 2017 Justice Reinvestment reforms.

As full time Animal Caretakers, their daily duties include cleaning pet kennels, feeding, interacting with and monitoring CAA's pets. The seven current Parole Project employees are all lovers of animals, with one even being previously known as the Angola Cat Whisperer. By bicycle, car or public transit, these Caretakers arrive to work with unmatched enthusiasm and leave with a great sense of satisfaction.

CAA hopes to grow this partnership by hiring additional Parole Project employees. The benefits to the men and to the animals are real. If you are interested in supporting the effort, contact ejackson@caabr.org.





A RECORD SETTING YEAR

Between the increase in adoptions and lost pets returned to their families and the uptake in fosters and volunteers, CAA had a truly record setting year. We were able to focus on the fundamentals of our organization and updated policies and procedures throughout all departments, including enhanced intake and medical protocols, heightened employee support, and additional available trainings. In addition, CAA focused outward to build relationships and partnerships throughout our community. We partnered with local schools and universities, area nonprofits, and animal welfare organizations to increase our mission of serving the people and pets of our parish.




