Species

March -Plant of Botanical interest— Acianthera strupifolia



This unusual and rarely seen species is found in Peru and Brazil at elevations around 1000 metres.

It is a cool to warm growing epiphyte with its pendant inflorescence of small purple speckled flowers

with an upper white petal curved back and striped in purple.

We grow our plant in a shade house under 50% cloth and it likes plenty of moisture during the warmer months and minimal amounts over winter.



It is grown in a mix of sphagnum and coarse perlite and fertilised with Strikeback once a month and Peters Excel CalMag Finisher about 3 times a month weekly.

We don't get many pests and fungal problems , but it is very important to keep your growing areas clean and tidy and have a good look at your plants daily if possible to gauge if plants need any attention.

We like orchids that are different and this is small so Lorraine definitely approves.. Good Growing. **David and Lorraine**


