Many of these are Affiliate members of the BWMCA and we acknowledge the efforts of those Affiliates in proving for the needs of their members and in supporting this Association.


One of the "values" of the BWMCA is to "Advocate to Government and others on matters of importance to members" which of course, includes affiliated organizations.





Our July Art talk is "The Powder and The Glory – Helena Rubenstein: Cosmetics, Art and Wealth" presented by Lucrezia Walker on Sunday 9 July at 3.00pm, Uni SC Lecture Theatre 1



"There are no ugly women, only lazy ones,' quipped Helena Rubinstein, the cosmetics entrepreneur whose company made her one of the world's richest women. Businesswoman, art collector and philanthropist, she was the first self-made female millionaire. She commissioned work from avantgarde artists such as Joan Miró, Pablo Picasso and Salvador Dalí, who designed a powder compact for her. Her exclusive beauty salons influenced and blurred the conceptual boundaries between fashion, art, and the interior. Join us to find out more about this extraordinary woman.

Lucrezia Walker studied in Venice and Perugia, and has worked in Rome. She is a lecturer at the National Gallery London, teaches the London Art History Programme for the University of North Carolina, and has 20 years' experience leading cultural tours in major European cities. Lucrezia was previously Galleries Correspondent for 'The Tablet 'and Lay Canon (Visual Arts) at St Paul's Cathedral, where she continues to serve on the Visual Arts Committee. Barrier Reef. He is an outspoken advocate for scientific integrity and academic freedom.

Dr Ridd now volunteers his time to the Institute of Public Affairs to improve quality assurance systems of "science"

used by Australian governments to make environmental laws and regulations. He runs the **Reef-Rebels** YouTube channel.

At our next event, **Dr Ridd** will present on Great Barrier Reef and contentious issues involving the impact of climate change and agricultural practices on the health of GBR. The information he will share may come as a surprise.

Professor Anthony Gray is a distinguished

faculty member at the School of Law and Justice at the University of Southern Queensland. He has extensive expertise in constitutional law, human rights, comparative law, and civil obligations.

Professor Gray will delve into the high-profile case of Peter Ridd versus James Cook University at the High Court of Australia (**Ridd v James Cook University** [2021] HCA 32). This case has set a legal precedent with serious and far reaching consequences for Freedom of Speech in our universities, schools, workplaces and for our society.

We will explore the implications of the Ridd vs. JCU case and what it means for the future of scientific inquiry and debate.

An interesting fact: This is first ever Public Meeting where a highly esteemed legal scholar will discuss a High Court case where the co-presenter was one of the parties in such a high profile case.
