

On the Record

After not dropping a game for the entire season. St. Bedes Mentone Tigers suddenly find themselves in a sudden-death final.

The Tigers have been unbackable favourites to take the C-section title all season but were pipped by Ajax last weekend and are now on equal footing with the Parkdale Vultures, the team that finished fourth.

Well done to Ajax, good luck to the Vultures, but, frankly, here underlies the problem with the McIntyre final four system.

This is purely a personal opinion - and I know the final four serves the VAFA and many a league well - but I struggle with the idea that the only reward for finishing on top is a final against the team that finished second. Basically, the minor premier has to play the second best performed team in the competition and I know vou're thinking, "That's why there is the double chance," but really, you would bloody-well hope so.

Of course, the prize for winning this final is a big carrot. a week off.

But the point is, because you are playing the second best team in the league there is a good chance of losing and, as the Tigers have just discovered, the home-andaway season can quickly amount to very little.

The problem, however, is that there aren't too many alternatives when you have a top four.

First versus fourth and second versus third, seems to be a fairer system but it is an unworkable program.

I like the idea of the top team having its first final on home soil, or - as the case may be for the Old Xaverians - the ground of its choice.

Although this suggestion puts the ball in the top team's court and solves one problem, it seems to me the second-placed team also cops a bum deal under the McIntvre final four.

Your team can finish second, with the same amount of wins as the top team, and again the only reward for a superb year is a final against the minor premier. That's rough justice.

Not only that, the loser of that first semi has to quickly put aside its performance from the previous week and refocus, while the winner



of the second semi is on a high and enters the preliminary final on the back of an easier game.

As I've said, there are not too many alternatives but I think the minor premier should have a home final in the first semi and the loser of the first semi should also have a home final in the preliminary.

Unfortunately, that may mean fewer finals at Elsternwick Park but this is why, in search of a fairer system, the AFL has had to bite the bullet with the MCG and is bracing itself for two preliminary finals in Perth this year.

If you don't like the home final concept, I believe the VAFA should contemplate a top five which rewards the minor premier with a first-up break and the second team with an easier first final.

The argument against a final five in a ten-team competition is that it rewards mediocrity, but I think if you find yourself at the end of the season in the top half you get to play on and if you're not good enough, well, vou will soon know.

I've even heard it suggested by some VAFA historians that the finals should be scrapped and the minor premier is simply the winner, similar to the European soccer leagues.

However, that's one idea I can't entertain. For better or worse. Australian Rules has to have finals and has to have grand finals. That's the law.

IT'S FINALS TIME

Why is it that individual and team performances during home and away games can be of sufficient quality to ensure a finals spot, yet all the hard work, sacrifice and planning is ruined by a disappointing performance and failure to execute skills correctly come the big day?

Many players, often those inexperienced in finals or first year players, fail to recognise the importance of **2**. adhering to the tried and true "recipe" for success which has served them well during the season. Often they allow themselves to become distracted by factors outside the game and the perceived importance of finals

Finals fever can infect the unsuspecting player with nerves, indecision, self doubt and skill errors, culminating in below par performances. Expectations for success can be overwhelming. Physical skills and fitness levels are unlikely to fluctuate greatly between the end of the home and away matches and the start of 4. the finals.

What does vary, however, is the capacity the individual player has to exert mental control over the execution of skills.

Mental control allows a player to compete instinctively. They automatically think in terms of "I can" and "I 5. will". The consistently successful players have the ability to always remain in control of their emotions. Being put to the test is not a threat for the great players playing in the various levels of our competition as they draw upon their Self Belief and Realistic Self Confidence which provides them with the inner strength to seize the initiative and demonstrate their skills in a concise and deliberate manner.

Players can take positive steps to reduce the likelihood of anxiety affecting performance.

Set Goals - Have specific daily targets for doing

that little bit extra at training. "Polish up" in areas of vulnerability and ensure you can perform the required skills under extreme, match like pressure. This will assist in the building of self confidence and the development of both emotional control and self discipline.

- Schedule periods for mental preparation Once you have received instructions from your coach regarding the upcoming final, spend time relaxing, reflecting and imagining yourself successfully accomplishing all desired tasks.
- 3. Maintain your normal pre-game routines – Finals are not the time for massive alterations to routines. which have proven successful throughout the year. Rest well and ensure that you have the adequate nutrition for the contest, but don't change the routine you know works for you.
- Be honest with vourself and others If you are feeling uneasy or worried about the game, talk to trustworthy people who can offer honest, objective feedback and reassurance. Surround yourself with people with people who will be positive and supportive.
- Be a leader, encourage others Spread enthusiasm and maintain an encouraging and realistic belief in your ability to play well when needed most. Remind vourself and others that you are in the finals because of recent achievements. You earnt it - You deserve it! Where possible. challenge team mates and promote "fearlessness". Reject the tendency to become over anxious and negative in your thinking by deliberately saying to yourself ... "We can do this, we will do this, you just watch us."

Remember, that the prize will be worth the price.







SEMI FINAL REVIEW





5 YEARS AGO - 2001

One of the memorable finals occurred in A Section when the mighty Old Xavs, seeking their seventh consecutive A Grade flag, met arch rivals St Kevins in the knock-out. first semi final. Outstanding coaches, Tim O'Shaughnessy (Xavs) and Mike McArthur-Allen (SKOBS), would ensure that every effort would be displayed on the day. The reserves' game between Marcellin and St Bernards certainly set the scene with a thrilling 1 point victory to Marcellin 12.9 to 12.8. The main game started at a cracking pace with the Giansiracusa brothers, Josh and Michael, along with the athleticism of **Ben Garvey**, responding to Xavs' early onslaught orchestrated in the main by Damien Orlando, Tim Clarke and Dan Richardson. A one goal lead to Xavs at the first break, increased to seven points at half time and three goals at the final break gave an indication of the intensity of the game. Xavs had to try and hold their lead against the breeze in the last and, to cut a long story short, the final siren sounded at the 34 minute-47 second mark with SKOBS 2 points in front, to the absolute delight of their jubilant supporters. The Xavs had fought magnificently and their 2.7 in the final term to SKOBS' 6.3 was full of character. It remained a tight affair in the third quarter although the Blues had wasted some opportunities in front of goals. Despite the best efforts of the Fields, led by the Royals brothers. Monash kicked away in the final term with Jonathan Koop getting amongst the goals and the final result, 13.18 to 9.7, revealed a conclusive victory for Monash. Best players – Logan, Caldwell, Alexander, Hipwell, Ford, Headberry (Monash) and Trevor and Rod Rovals, Whitmee, Harris, Lowe, Cowlishaw (Caulfield Grammarians).

The **E East Section** second semi-final was going according to plan for **Aquinas**, the firm favourites, as they scored 5.4 to **Yarra Valley's** 3 behinds by quarter time. The won at the centre bounces, were first to the ball and took the shortest route to goal, and why wouldn't you with key forward **Jason Livingstone** a terrific target and ready to move into the nineties and maybe a century of goals before the season's end. Yarra Valley suddenly got

it together in the second term and held a 2 point lead by half time. Another terrific under nineteen second semi in **Junior Section 3** as **Old Paradians** came with a rattling run in the last term to win 12.15 to 13.8. Best players – **Regan**, **Pimentel**, **Jowett**, **Peyton**, **Pritchard**, **Smith** (OP) and **Dragovitch**, **Fraser**, **Ferruccio**, **Cincotta**, **Jackson**, **Commins** (St Kida CBC).

30 YEARS AGO - 1976

St Bernards cleaned up Uni Blues in the A Section first semi-final in a high scoring affair, 23.16 to 15.10. When St Bernards took the lead early in the second quarter they were never headed again and the game had exhibited all the skills. Best players — Mitchell, Mahoney (5), K Phelan, Powell (4), Wade, Drennan (St Bernards) and Carmody, Bierwirth, Tyquin (5), Booth, Standish, Brown (Uni Blues).

In the **B Section** first semi-final, **Marcellin** were just 2 points down at three quarter time against **Old Paradians**. In the final quarter Marcellin increased their tempo to run out fairly easy winners in the end, 12.18 to 11.13. Best players — **Cooney, Price, Fitt, Power, T Aloisio, P Gartner** (Marcellin) and **Tellefson, Symes, Denavi, T Considine, Gilmartin, V Considine** (Old Paradians).

40 YEARS AGO - 1966

In the A Section second semi-final, Melbourne High

School Old Boys displayed some power football in the first half to advance straight into the Grand Final. Kicking against the breeze in the first quarter, MHSOB kicked 1.5 and held Coburg to a mere 2 behinds. They continued to control the play in the second term and at half time held what looked to be a match winning 6.14 to 1.2 lead. Harley, Nelson and Irish were very dangerous up forward for the High and Coburg lacked scoring opportunities. After an even third term and a rally by Coburg in the final term, Melbourne held on to win 9.20 to 8.8. Best players – Irish, Featherby, W Dick, Green, Gilbert, Nelson (MHSOB) and Merrick, McIntosh, Parkes, Callahan, Lawson, Clancy (Coburg).

50 YEARS AGO - 1956

State Savings Bank (second) played Coburg (third) in the A Section first semi-final at the St Kilda Cricket Ground. In those days the "minor premiers" (top after 18 rounds) had the advantage of playing the team that finished fourth in the second semi-final in week two of the finals.

The 'Bankers' were inaccurate in front of goal while Coburg made the most of almost every opportunity. The game was fairly even at half time but Coburg slipped away in the last quarter won 8.4 to the Bank's 4.13. Coburg lauded the efforts of their team play but highlighted the efforts of 19 year old **P Rochow** at centre half back and **C Mitchell** on the wing.

In C Section Hampton Rovers 7.8 defeated Teachers College 4.6 and top team South Melbourne City 9.14 defeated Caulfield Grammarians 4.14.

Reserves Finals



FINALS ELIGIBILITY

Finals eligibility rules are found under Rules 51-55 of the Association. Below is a brief summary.

Senior - (1st XVIII teams) Any registered player with a permit can play finals (except AFL/VFL players with a permit - see below).

Reserve - (2nd XVIII teams) Players must be registered and must have played at least four (4) reserve grade matches and not more than ten (10) senior matches in the home and away games (first round).

Where both first and second XVIII's are playing on the same day the reserve grade player must only have played two (2) games in either the seniors or reserves to qualify.

For clubs with teams drawn in semi finals on different days of the same weekend (ie. 1st semi Saturday, 2nd semi Sunday read as above teams playing on the same day).

Under-19 teams - Players must be registered and hold a permit. If a player has played an aggregate of more than 5 senior and reserve matches he must have played more than 5 Under-19 matches during the season.

If a player is ineligible due to having played more than 5 senior and reserve matches and does not gain selection in his club's senior team in the first second round match, he is then eligible to play in any subsequent Under 19 final.

Where a team has (2) U19 teams or is involved in hybrid arrangement, the following shall apply.

Where a club has two U19 teams a player must have not played more than 10 matches with the U19 1 side to play in the (2)

To represent the hybrid team in the finals the player must have represented the hybrid team in (5) first round matches - not including finals.

Club XVIII teams - Players must be registered and have played

in at least four (4) Club XVIII matches (for the team they wish to represent) and not have played in more than a total of eight (8) senior and reserve matches during the first round.

Where a club has two or more Club XVIII teams a player must have not played more than 8 matches with (either of) the higher placed side(s) to play in the lower team's finals - if teams are in different sections.

Where both Club XVIII teams are in the same section the following to apply:

(i) A player cannot alternate between teams after June 30. Once he plays with a team after June 30 he can only represent that team for the rest of the season. (ii) the player is only allowed to play finals for the team they represent after June 30. (iii) to be eligible for finals with either side, a player must have played a minimum of 4 matches with the side they wish to represent and (iv) the player must have played more games for the side they wish to represent than the other club side in the same section. All Club XVIII teams will be limited to 22 during finals.

An AFL or VFL listed player will be eligible to play in the finals for his VAFA club as long as he has played a minimum of five (5) VAFA matches for the team he wishes to represent in the finals. At least two (2) of these matches must have been played after June 30th. If the player wishes to play finals in the U19, these 5 matches can be played in the Seniors or U19 with Reserve Grade matches not counting. This applies for TAC Cup players as well.

A TAC Under 18 player must have played five (5) VAFA matches for the VAFA team he wishes to represent in the finals. For TAC players there is no requirement to play a certain number of matches after June 30th.
