




On the Record

After not dropping a game for the entire season, St.Bedes Mentone Tigers suddenly find themselves in a sudden-death final.

The Tigers have been unbackable favourites to take the C-section title all season but were pipped by Ajax last weekend and are now on equal footing with the Parkdale Vultures, the team that finished fourth.

Well done to Ajax, good luck to the Vultures, but, frankly, here underlies the problem with the McIntyre final four system.

This is purely a personal opinion - and I know the final four serves the VAFA and many a league well - but I struggle with the idea that the only reward for finishing on top is a final against the team that finished second. Basically, the minor premier has to play the second best performed team in the competition and I know you're thinking, "That's why there is the double chance," but really, you would bloody-well hope so.

Of course, the prize for winning this final is a big carrot, a week off.

But the point is, because you are playing the second best team in the league there is a good chance of losing and, as the Tigers have just discovered, the home-and-away season can quickly amount to very little.

The problem, however, is that there aren't too many alternatives when you have a top four.

First versus fourth and second versus third, seems to be a fairer system but it is an unworkable program.

I like the idea of the top team having its first final on home soil, or - as the case may be for the Old Xaverians - the ground of its choice.

Although this suggestion puts the ball in the top team's court and solves one problem, it seems to me the second-placed team also cops a bum deal under the McIntyre final four.

Your team can finish second, with the same amount of wins as the top team, and again the only reward for a superb year is a final against the minor premier. That's rough justice.

Not only that, the loser of that first semi has to quickly put aside its performance from the previous week and re-focus, while the winner of the second semi is on a high and enters the preliminary final on the back of an easier game.

As I've said, there are not too many alternatives but I think the minor premier should have a home final in the first semi and the loser of the first semi should also have a home final in the preliminary.

Unfortunately, that may mean fewer finals at Elsternwick Park but this is why, in search of a fairer system, the AFL has had to bite the bullet with the MCG and is bracing itself for two preliminary finals in Perth this year.

If you don't like the home final concept, I believe the VAFA should contemplate a top five which rewards the minor premier with a first-up break and the second team with an easier first final.

The argument against a final five in a ten-team competition is that it rewards mediocrity, but I think if you find yourself at the end of the season in the top half you get to play on and if you're not good enough, well, you will soon know.

I've even heard it suggested by some VAFA historians that the finals should be scrapped and the minor premier is simply the winner, similar to the European soccer leagues.

However, that's one idea I can't entertain. For better or worse, Australian Rules has to have finals and has to have grand finals. That's the law.


2nd Semi Final Preview – Old Xavs v Old Haileybury

IT'S FINALS TIME

Why is it that individual and team performances during home and away games can be of sufficient quality to ensure a finals spot, yet all the hard work, sacrifice and planning is ruined by a disappointing performance and failure to execute skills correctly come the big day?

Many players, often those inexperienced in finals or first year players, fail to recognise the importance of adhering to the tried and true "recipe" for success which has served them well during the season. Often they allow themselves to become distracted by factors outside the game and the perceived importance of finals.

Finals fever can infect the unsuspecting player with nerves, indecision, self doubt and skill errors, culminating in below par performances. Expectations for success can be overwhelming. Physical skills and fitness levels are unlikely to fluctuate greatly between the end of the home and away matches and the start of the finals.

What does vary, however, is the capacity the individual player has to exert mental control over the execution of skills.

Mental control allows a player to compete instinctively. They automatically think in terms of "I can" and "I will". The consistently successful players have the ability to always remain in control of their emotions. Being put to the test is not a threat for the great players playing in the various levels of our competition as they draw upon their Self Belief and Realistic Self Confidence which provides them with the inner strength to seize the initiative and demonstrate their skills in a concise and deliberate manner.

Players can take positive steps to reduce the likelihood of anxiety affecting performance.

1. Set Goals – Have specific daily targets for doing

that little bit extra at training. "Polish up" in areas of vulnerability and ensure you can perform the required skills under extreme, match like pressure. This will assist in the building of self confidence and the development of both emotional control and self discipline.

- 2. Schedule periods for mental preparation** – Once you have received instructions from your coach regarding the upcoming final, spend time relaxing, reflecting and imagining yourself successfully accomplishing all desired tasks.
- 3. Maintain your normal pre-game routines** – Finals are not the time for massive alterations to routines which have proven successful throughout the year. Rest well and ensure that you have the adequate nutrition for the contest, but don't change the routine you know works for you.
- 4. Be honest with yourself and others** – If you are feeling uneasy or worried about the game, talk to trustworthy people who can offer honest, objective feedback and reassurance. Surround yourself with people with people who will be positive and supportive.
- 5. Be a leader, encourage others** – Spread enthusiasm and maintain an encouraging and realistic belief in your ability to play well when needed most. Remind yourself and others that you are in the finals because of recent achievements. You earnt it – You deserve it! Where possible, challenge team mates and promote "fearlessness". Reject the tendency to become over anxious and negative in your thinking by deliberately saying to yourself ... "We can do this, we will do this, you just watch us."

Remember, that the prize will be worth the price.



SEMI FINAL REVIEW

At the Junction Oval, the D1 Second Semi Final took place between Old Carey and Old Geelong. Given the three game win differential between the two sides, Old Carey went into the match as warm favourite.

However it was the Oggies, kicking to the Fitzroy Street end, who held the ascendancy early in the game, leading by 19 points at quarter time. Tom Howgate also moved onto Ed Bayles around this time, and this also had an impact on the game's outcome. Howgate managed to get plenty of the ball and use it to great effect, while managing to dampen Bayles' influence. 'Jogger' White also started to make his presence felt. At the main break, Old Carey had taken a seven point lead, thanks largely to their efficiency in front of goal.

Come the start of the third quarter, and with the game still in the balance, there was plenty of fumbling and mishandling of the ball early. After exchanging goals early on, Old Carey started to take a stranglehold on the game, with White, Bull, Ratcliffe and Mullins causing plenty of problems for the Hoops. The usual suspects (Collins and Sweeney for Rupo, Valoppi and Ash Drew for Valley) were very much in the thick of things.

After the third term, Yarra Valley's lead had been whittled down to seven points, and you had the feeling that if Rupo continued to get plenty of scoring opportunities, they may just take the game. And so it proved, the Sunbury side scoring 9.3 to 1.4 to run out 40 points winners come the final siren.

A disappointing end to the Bushrangers' season for sure, but considering many people's pre-season prognostications (including mine, yes...) and the 1-4 start



• Oakleigh Stalwart Receives Honour




50 YEARS AGO - 1956

Senior - (1st XVIII teams) Any registered player with a permit can play finals (except AFL/VFL players with a permit – see below).

Reserve - (2nd XVIII teams) Players must be registered and must have played at least four (4) reserve grade matches and not more than ten (10) senior matches in the home and away games (first round).

Where both first and second XVIII's are playing on the same day the reserve grade player must only have played two (2) games in either the seniors or reserves to qualify.

For clubs with teams drawn in semi finals on different days of the same weekend (ie. 1st semi Saturday, 2nd semi Sunday – read as above teams playing on the same day).

Under-19 teams - Players must be registered and hold a permit. If a player has played an aggregate of more than 5 senior and reserve matches he must have played more than 5 Under-19 matches during the season.

If a player is ineligible due to having played more than 5 senior and reserve matches and does not gain selection in his club's senior team in the first second round match, he is then eligible to play in any subsequent Under 19 final.

Where a team has (2) U19 teams or is involved in hybrid arrangement, the following shall apply.

Where a club has two U19 teams a player must have not played more than 10 matches with the U19 1 side to play in the (2) team.

To represent the hybrid team in the finals the player must have represented the hybrid team in (5) first round matches – not including finals.

Club XVIII teams - Players must be registered and have played

in at least four (4) Club XVIII matches (for the team they wish to represent) and not have played in more than a total of eight (8) senior and reserve matches during the first round.

Where a club has two or more Club XVIII teams a player must have not played more than 8 matches with (either of) the higher placed side(s) to play in the lower team's finals - if teams are in different sections.

Where both Club XVIII teams are in the same section the following to apply:

(i) A player cannot alternate between teams after June 30. Once he plays with a team after June 30 he can only represent that team for the rest of the season. (ii) the player is only allowed to play finals for the team they represent after June 30, (iii) to be eligible for finals with either side, a player must have played a minimum of 4 matches with the side they wish to represent and (iv) the player must have played more games for the side they wish to represent than the other club side in the same section. All Club XVIII teams will be limited to 22 during finals.

An **AFL or VFL listed player** will be eligible to play in the finals for his VAFA club as long as he has played a minimum of five (5) VAFA matches for the team he wishes to represent in the finals. At least two (2) of these matches must have been played after June 30th. If the player wishes to play finals in the U19, these 5 matches can be played in the Seniors or U19 with Reserve Grade matches not counting. This applies for TAC Cup players as well.

A **TAC Under 18 player** must have played five (5) VAFA matches for the VAFA team he wishes to represent in the finals. For TAC players there is no requirement to play a certain number of matches after June 30th.

Congratulations to Andrew Scott and Matt Malmann for taking out the U19 medal last Monday night. Both had fine years and very deserving winners.


