VENI SANCTE SPIRITUS

The hymn "Veni Sancte Spiritus" (as it is known from its title in Latin) is sung at our Pentecost Masses. This hymn became part of the Roman Missal used for Mass in the 16th century. It is also known as the "golden sequence" (sequence being a term for a hymn spoken or sung before the Gospel at certain Masses).

The sequence Dawne Mechlinski, our music director, has selected for this Pentecost Sunday invokes the coming of the Holy Spirit to bring comfort and forgiveness to the faithful. It opens with many repetitions of the word "come," and closes with the request to "give." Along the way, it affirms various titles and attributes of the Spirit. The hymn asks the Spirit to shine in the hearts of the singers and to grant healing, strength, forgiveness and salvation.

This sequence used to appear in the liturgy every day during the octave of Pentecost but today it is sung only on the day of Pentecost. The original Latin verses are commonly regarded as one of the greatest masterpieces of sacred poetry ever written. Its beauty and depth have been praised by many. The hymn may have been composed by Pope Innocent III (1161-1216) but history seems to point to Stephen Langton (d 1228), Archbishop of Canterbury, being its author. Spotlight on a Ministry: St. Mark's Rosary Makers

The mission began at St. Mark's in 1992 in response to a request by Father Patrick Peyton, CSC, who had a mission to fight communism by sending one million rosaries to Russia. That's what inspired Celia Ostrowski to approach Msgr. Constance with her idea to invite 10 friends, including Elizabeth Keegan, Marion Wassmer, Maura Boyan, Mary McClusky, Mary Moore and Margaret McGuire, to help her make 500 rosaries to contribute to Fr. Peyton. Celia had a special bond with the pastor because he brought Holy Communion to her ill husband every Friday. When her husband died, Celia became the founder and director of the St. Mark's Rosary Makers. The ministry grew from 7 to 35, with members from ages 60 to 93. Many will remember how Doris Wilson and Nancee McManus continued Celia's legacy.

St. Mark's tens of thousands of rosaries have reached all parts of the world, including Eastern and Central Europe, Asia, Africa, Mexico, North and South America and Central America. One year, 500 rosaries were hand delivered by the pastor of the "Star of the Sea" Parish in Long Branch to an orphanage in the Philippines. In June 1997, when St. Teresa of Calcutta was in Newark, she was presented with a box of rosaries made by St. Mark's Rosary Makers and sent back 35 rosaries that Mother herself had blessed for the members.

Today when members join, they continue the thread of hope spread by this amazing ministry which connects with churches and missionaries throughout the world. Some end up in the hands of our servicemen and women. Monthly gatherings for collecting finished rosaries and receiving more supplies (or learning how to make a rosary) are held on the last Monday, September to June, at 1 PM in Church basement. For the more experienced, it takes about two to three hours to string the beads but no matter how long it takes, it's always a labor of love and much appreciated by the recipient. Over the decades, letters of gratitude have come in from around the US and the world, such as the one below that came in recently from Ohio.

The modern Rosary, which means "garland of roses," was spread by St. Dominic after the Blessed Virgin began appearing to him. Sometimes Our Lady came to him with St. Catherine of Alexandria and St. Cecilia but when She asked the saint to spread the Rosary, She appeared carrying the Baby Jesus in Her arms.

Father Peyton was born on January 9, 1909 in Attymass in the County Mayo, Ireland, about 25 miles from the Shrine of Our Lady of Knock. His devout Catholic parents prayed the rosary together as a family every day and instilled the faith well within their children. After a few failed attempts to become priests, Peyton and his older brother Thomas decided to go to America where later they were both ordained. His father told them before they left, "Go down on your knees and make me a promise here before the picture of the Sacred Heart. From now on there will be nobody but yourself to advise you and to decide for you. But your first responsibility will always be to save your soul, and so I want you to promise to be faithful to Our Lord in America." On December 18, 2017, Pope Francis declared Father Patrick Peyton, founder of Family Rosary Crusade and Family Theater Productions, venerable. In 1989, Sister Anthony, Little Sisters of the Poor, overheard Fr. Peyton on the phone speaking to someone about the fall of the Iron Curtain. He was telling whoever he was speaking to: "Now you can send those rosaries."He would be with the Little Sisters of the Poor in his final hour. *"It was the experience of* a lifetime, to be with a saint as he *was dying,"* said Mother Marguerite. What struck her most was how Father Peyton was *"just like anyone* else in the last moments. Just like somebody that was unknown to anyone, except was totally known by God Himself and was waiting for him."

The Sisters recorded his last words, *"Mary, my Queen, my Mother."*
