Information for Contributors

The Journal is dedicated to informing public policy and professional practice and to the expansion of knowledge relating to mental health and human development from a multidisciplinary and interprofessional perspective. Especially welcome are research, clinical, theoretical, or policy papers that are directed at development of concept or theory, reconceptualization of major issues and/or previous findings, or policy applications related to human rights and social justice. Selection of articles for publication is based on originality, adequacy of method, significance of findings, contribution to theory, relevance to service delivery and public policy, and clarity and brevity of presentation.

Masked review policy. Articles published in the Journal are selected from unsolicited submissions, papers invited by the Editor, and manuscripts of presentations at the American Orthopsychiatric Association's annual meeting. Whatever their source, all articles considered for publication in the Journal are subject to a process of masked peer review.

Publication policies. Manuscripts of papers presented at Ortho's annual meeting, and intended for publication, must be submitted in timely fashion to the Journal in accordance with submission guidelines. Publication elsewhere than in the Journal or by the Association is prohibited prior to release by the Editor.

Manuscripts must be submitted exclusively for publication in the American Journal of Orthopsychiatry. Papers previously published or now under consideration elsewhere are not eligible for editorial review. Authors of accepted manuscripts will be required to transfer copyright to APA.

Submissions. Electronic submission is preferred. Submit manuscripts electronically (.rtf, PDF, or .doc files) via the Manuscript Submission Portal at www.apa.org/journals/ort/submission.html. General correspondence may be directed to

Manuscript preparation. Mailed submissions should be copied one-sided and double-spaced, and with generous margins. Manuscripts should be in final form, with consistent headings and subheadings in roman typeface (i.e., no boldface, italics, etc.) and have an abstract of no more than 120 words typed on a separate page. They should be prepared for masked review (i.e., with title page free of author[s] name[s], and text free of obvious author-identifying references), and accompanied by a covering letter with mailing address, daytime telephone number, e-mail address, and fax number (if available).

The entire manuscript, including quotations, footnotes, references, and tables, must be double-spaced.

Footnotes should be worked back into the text or deleted, if possible. Where essential, they should appear on a page by themselves following the references and be indicated by superscript arabic numerals.

References should conform with the style set forth in the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (5th ed.).

Figures. Graphics files are welcome if supplied as Tiff, EPS, or PowerPoint. High-quality printouts or glossies are needed for *all* figures. The minimum line weight for line art is 0.5 point for optimal printing. When possible, please place symbol legends below the figure image instead of to the side. Original color figures can be printed in color at the editor's and publisher's discretion and provided the author agrees to pay half of the associated production costs; an estimate of these costs is available from the APA production office on request. Only photocopies or computer-generated duplicates should be submitted, since rejected manuscripts are disposed of following review.

Permissions. Authors are required to obtain and provide to the editor on final acceptance all necessary permissions to reproduce in print and electronic format any copyrighted work, including, for example, text materials (or portions thereof) and photographs of people.

Preparing files for production. If your manuscript is accepted for publication, please follow the guidellines for file formats and naming provided at www.apa.org/journals/preparing_electronic_files.html. If your manuscript was mask reviewed, please ensure that the final version for production includes a byline and full author note for typesetting.
