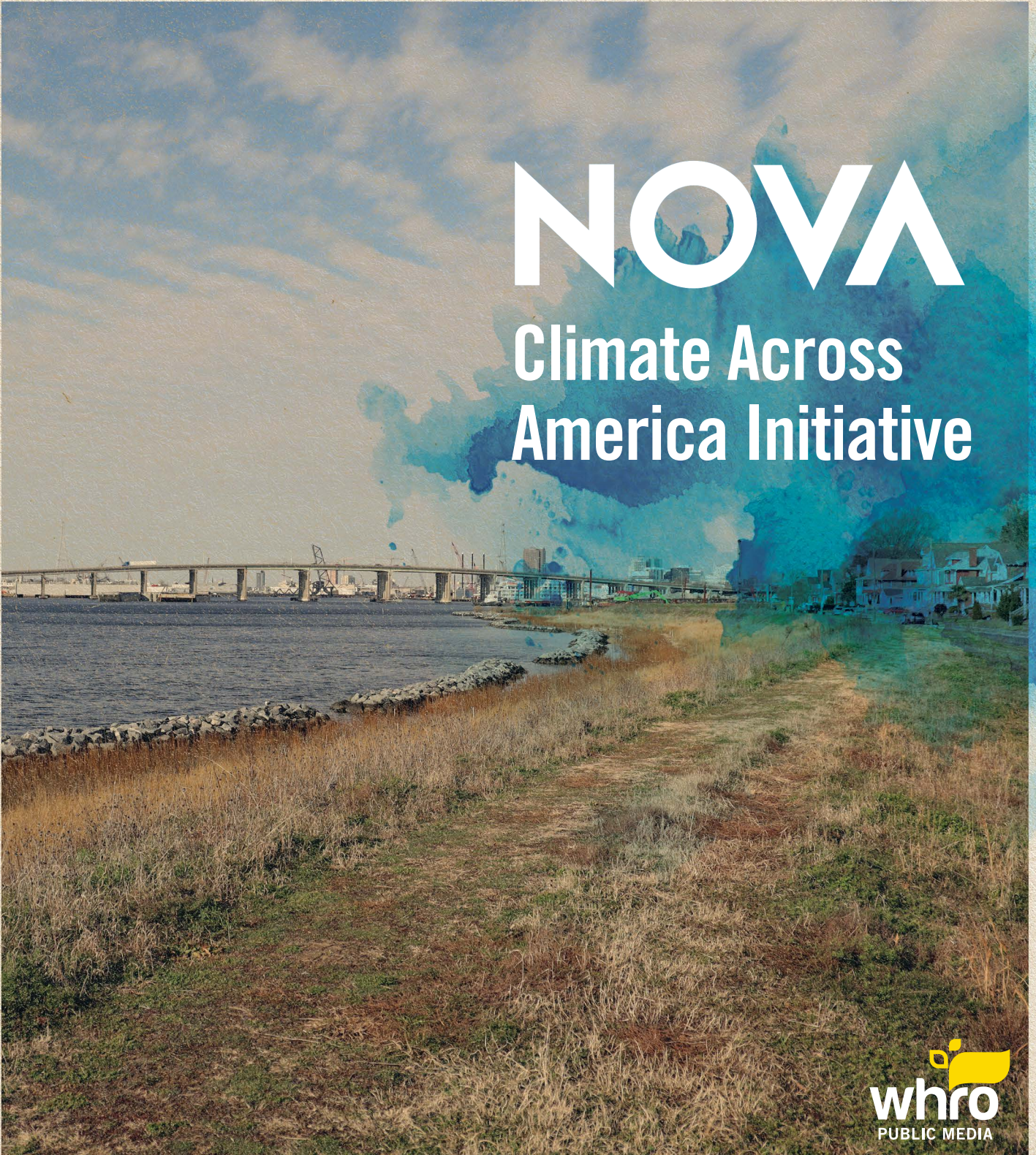

Did you know that April is Jazz Appreciation month? Jazz has been a part of WHRO programming for a long time, and our very own host Jae Sinnett performs and teaches jazz to students locally. WHRO Public Media has always been a huge supporter of local arts in our community. In fact, Jae Sinnett recently won Album of the Year for *Jae Sinnett's Zero to 60 Quartet/Symphonicity, "Live at the Sandler Center"* at the 2023 Veer Awards. Congrats, Jae! Another longtime jazz program that WHRO broadcasts on Saturdays at 8:00 p.m. is *The Vocal Sound of Jazz*, hosted and produced by Jack Frieden. This long-standing program spotlights both jazz and vocal music post 1950s and has been on air since 1980.

As much as we appreciate this warm spring weather, climate change is a global problem, and the varied impacts are felt locally. This month, our friends at *NOVA PBS* will lead a national initiative called *Climate Across America* spotlighting how climate change is affecting communities across the country and the innovative solutions being implemented to address the climate crisis. Throughout the year, the Emerging Leaders Board has been working with *Independent Lens* to provide *Indie Lens Pop-Up Screenings*, "a neighborhood series that brings people together for film screenings and community driven conversations." This year's season of screening events features stories of people facing adversity and overcoming incredible odds. Join us for the final event in the *Indie Lens Pop-Up* screening series where we will be showing *Free Chol Soo Lee* on Thursday, April 20 at 6:30 p.m. The film documents the life of Korean immigrant, Chol Soo Lee, who was sentenced to life for a 1973 San Francisco murder, and was set free after a pan-Asian solidarity movement, which included Korean, Japanese, and Chinese Americans, helped to overturn his conviction. After 10 years of fighting for his life inside California state prisons, Lee found himself in a new fight to rise to the expectations of the people who believed in him. # New Music is in Full Bloom This Spring

April always brings a sense of renewal with the fading of winter, the arrival of warmer spring days, and for the producers of WHRV's local music shows, lots of new music and unique features.

Paul Shugrue's *Out of the Box* remains on the cutting edge with new music and this month, hear new releases by The National, The Hold Steady, and the Canadian indie pop band The New Pornographers. Also, listen for the first new release in 24 years by Everything but the Girl. Tune in weeknights at 7 p.m. and Saturday afternoons at 1 p.m.

Our jazz host, Jae Sinnett, debuted his first album since he recorded with the Symphonicity Orchestra in 2022. All month, listen to tracks from the brilliant release *Commitment*. While the talented musicians that Jae finds to record with continues to change, his dedication to

showcasing and producing outstanding music remains the same. *Sinnett in Session* is heard weeknights at 9 p.m. and Sunday afternoons at 1 p.m.

Remember 1992? Bill Clinton is elected President. MTV debuts *The Real World* and The Washington Redskins win Super Bowl XXVI. And...on the radio? Prince, MC Hammer, Toad the Wet Sprocket and Tom Cochrane rule. Tune in as Jeff "The Sandman" Sander revisits the early '90s with some forgotten classics on *Lost in the Shuffle*—just perfect for your Friday night at 10 p.m.

Jack Frieden's *The Vocal Sound of Jazz* is now heard Saturdays at 8 p.m. on 89.5. This month, on April 29, Jack will be celebrating what would have been Blossom Dearie's 99th birthday by spotlighting Blossom's music and songs as well as those of her stylistic cousins Dave Frishberg and Bob Dorough.

And, spring has traditionally been the launch of the Bluegrass Music festivals where countless fans flock to venues to hear their favorite bands perform live. Tune in Sunday nights at 7 p.m. for *Pickin'* where we'll feature live recordings from the Bluegrass greats. We'll hear Reno and Smiley, The Seldom Scene, and Bill Monroe, live in concert. Close your eyes and feel as if you are sitting out and hearing the greats of the genre in performance.

Open a window—celebrate National Burrito Day (April 6), or National Beer Day (April 7) and tune in to 89.5 all month long. Spring has arrived and so has a great opportunity for truly outstanding radio offerings on WHRV.

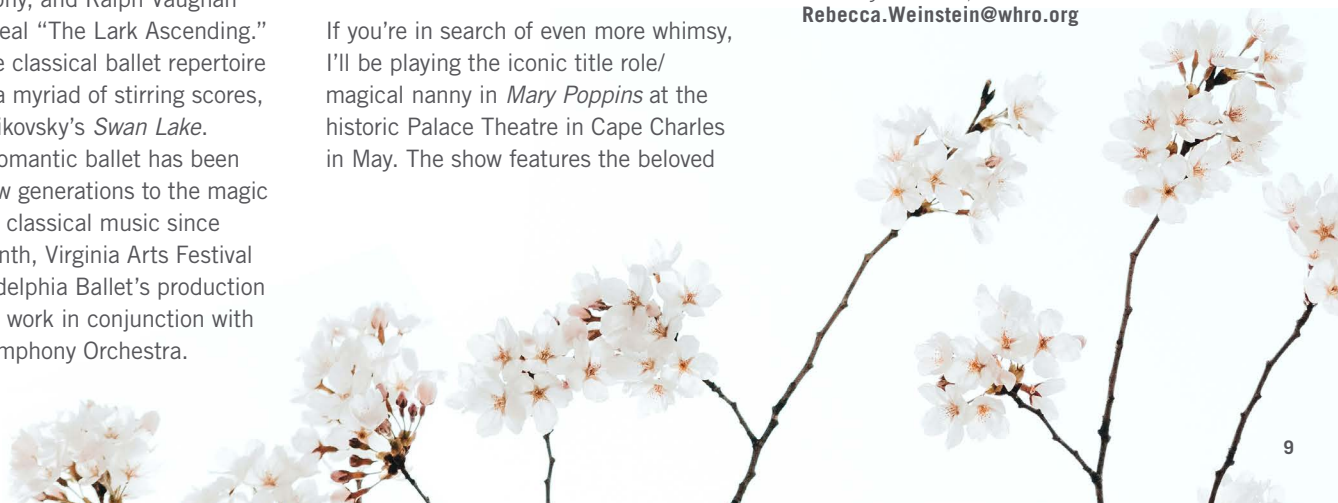

# Norfolk Students and WHRO Partner With NOVA on “Climate Across America” Initiative



WHRO Public Media and *NOVA* are partnering to give Norfolk students the opportunity to explore filmmaking and climate change. WHRO is one of two stations partnering with *NOVA Science Studio* to teach the next generation of science communicators how to produce short-form science videos about the impact of climate change on their communities. Students at Granby High School and The Governor's School for the Arts are participating in the project.

“The students have been tasked with identifying different aspects of sea level rise that affect them in their daily lives,” explained Jason Kypros, the project coordinator. “This is not just rising waters but also identifying alternate environmental catalysts that contribute to the rising sea levels locally and what we can all do to help mitigate those effects.”

Currently, the students are crafting their story pitches and reaching out to community experts for more information and to secure interviews. “It’s a great exercise for the students,” Kypros said, “because it requires them to think critically about a real-world

problem. It also exposes them to the process of filmmaking and teaches them critical skills.”

“It is a great opportunity for these students to work with professionals at *NOVA Science Studio* as well as WHRO,” Kypros said. “This experience encourages them to work together in teams, ask critical questions of themselves and others, and to meet deadlines. The entire process of taking an idea from thought to page to video is both challenging and rewarding.”

WHRO filmmakers will also be creating a short digital video exploring the local impacts of climate change. Their video will focus on Norfolk’s historic Chesterfield Heights neighborhood where homeowners have seen their homes flooded and ravaged in recent years.

The *NOVA Science Studio* is supported by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting as part of *NOVA*’s “Climate Across America” initiative. This national initiative works to spotlight how climate change affects communities across the U.S. and engage





audiences in productive conversations about innovative climate solutions. Content from both the students and WHRO will be published this spring along with two new documentaries being released by *NOVA*.

***Weathering the Future***, premiering Wednesday, April 12, at 9 p.m. ET on PBS, will examine the dramatic ways in which our weather is changing. From longer, hotter heat waves, to more intense rainstorms, to megafires and multi-year droughts, the U.S. is experiencing the full range of impacts from a changing global climate. At the same time, many on the front lines are fighting back—innovating solutions, marshaling ancient wisdom, and developing visionary ideas. The lessons they're learning today can help all of us adapt in the years ahead, as the planet gets warmer and our weather gets more extreme.

***Chasing Carbon Zero***, premiering Wednesday, April 26, at 9 p.m. ET on PBS, will look at the ambitious climate goal recently set by the U.S. to achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2050 and slash emissions in half by 2030. But is that even feasible? What exactly would it take?

The film examines the problem and identifies the most likely real-world technologies that could be up to the task. From expanding the availability of renewable energy options, to designing more energy-efficient buildings, to revolutionizing the transportation sector, and more, the film casts a hopeful but skeptical eye. Can these solutions be scaled and made available and affordable across the country? Find out why there is still hope that we can achieve carbon zero and avoid the worsening impacts of climate change.

The "Climate Across America" initiative is part of *NOVA*'s Science and Society Project. The project is dedicated to telling stories at the intersection of science and society—stories that provide exceptional opportunities for audience engagement, nationally and locally, about the role of science and technology in our lives.

# The Batten Environmental Van Makes Caring for the Environment a Fun Lesson

April may be officially designated as “Earth Month,” but students in our region enjoy learning about taking care of the environment all year long thanks to WHRO Education’s focus on environmental education. Under the Batten Environmental Education Initiative, the result of a generous gift given by Jane Batten, WHRO has developed a wide range of educational products designed to instill positive environmental stewardship habits at an early age. The latest addition to this collection of resources is the Batten Environmental Van program.

Perhaps you’ve seen the colorful van driving around town. The outside features characters from popular PBS Kids television programs as well as characters from WHRO’s own *GreenBeats* video series. Inside the van, four large monitors provide access to interactive games and activities. The WHRO Education team developed a curriculum that provides classroom teachers with pre-

and post-visit lesson plans and interactive learning objects related to the *GreenBeats* video series. WHRO and the Virginia Stage Company have also partnered to offer an optional environmental musical assembly.

The van began visiting schools, libraries and museums in late 2021 and has reached an estimated 2,700 children so far. A typical visit includes lessons on natural resources, how to be good stewards of the environment, and games that test the students’ knowledge. In recent visits, children have explored water conservation, how bugs can enhance the environment, how planting seeds helps the environment, and more. The visits have been a hit with both teachers and students.

“My children couldn’t stop talking about the day—I heard several saying it was ‘the best day ever!’” said Dr. Deborah Fuge, a first-grade teacher at Three Oaks Elementary. “The program has come together so nicely.

I think the show and the lesson worked perfectly. The pre- and post-lesson also rounded out the program well.”

The van has also made appearances at local festivals and children’s events where WHRO staff handed out resources, activity bags, and character masks to attendees. It’s been exciting for staff members to be on the frontlines of educating Virginia’s environmental stewards of tomorrow. We’re looking forward to more exciting van visits throughout this school year!
