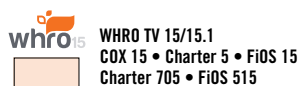

Tuesday, October 4, 9:00 p.m.

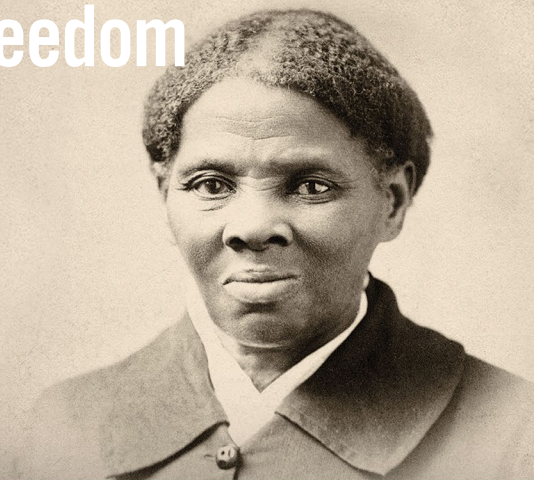

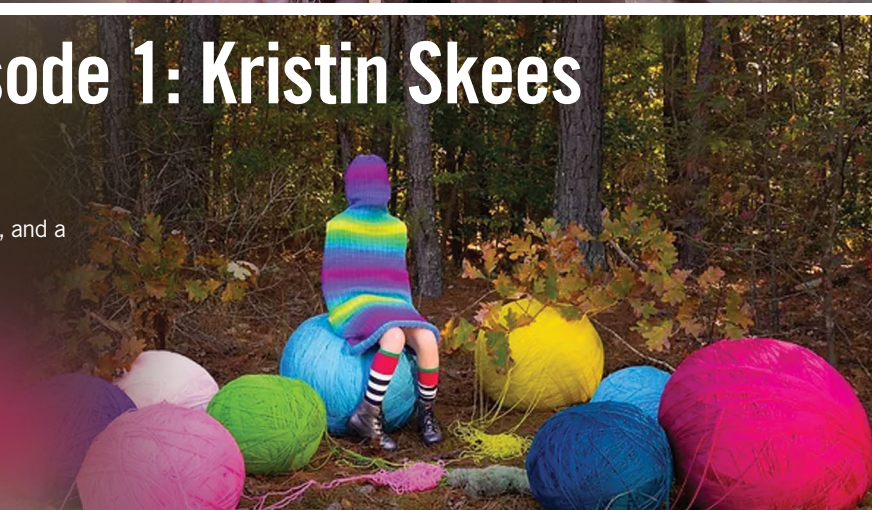

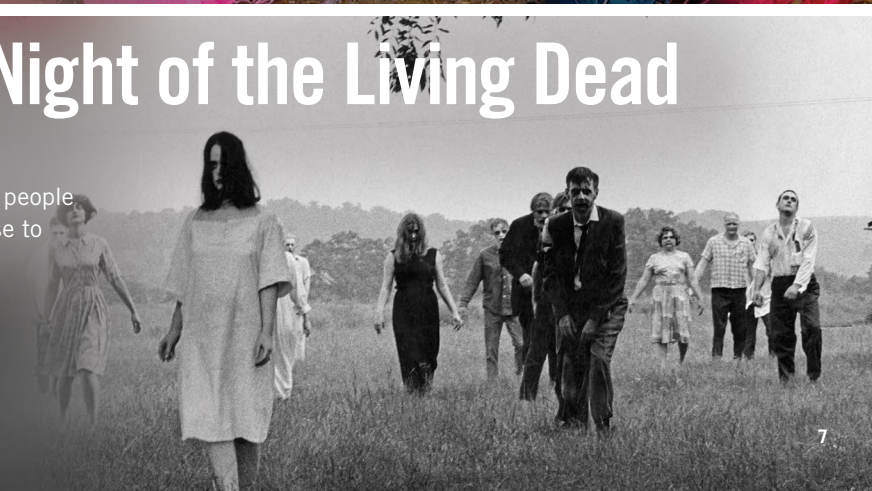

# Getting to Know Smartmouth Brewing Co. President Porter Hardy



**For the Time Machine Radio Network Launch Party, we partnered with local craft brewing company Smartmouth to develop a limited-release beer. We recently sat down with Porter Hardy, the founder and president of Smartmouth, to learn more about this Norfolk lawyer-turned-brewer and how he got started making beer.**

**You initially had a career as a lawyer; what led you to make the leap to running a brewing company?**

As a lawyer, I helped other people start, buy and sell businesses and realized one day that I wanted to be on the other side of the table. I wanted to create something. At the time, my favorite hobby was home brewing beer. My wife, Kim, had gotten me a kit the year I started as a lawyer, and it had become my favorite hobby and what I would read and think about. I loved the blend of art and science in it. So, once I decided I wanted to go out and create something new, a brewery was a natural fit for me. There weren't many breweries in our area then and I found a group of people who wanted to invest in and be a part of a brewery. So, it all just came together.

**How did your interest in beer begin?**

I really began to see the possibilities of beer and take it seriously when I studied in Germany for a semester. During law school, I participated in an exchange program where Kim and I lived in Hamburg for about five months. During this time, we traveled Europe on the weekends and got to sample a wider variety of beer than we had experienced in the U.S. That experience really got me thinking about beer being something more than the mass market beer I had consumed prior. The nuances and history of it were very tangible when you got to visit the towns where a style was invented or eat the cuisine that was traditional with a certain style of beer.

**What were your aspirations for Smartmouth? How has it grown and changed since it began?**

When we first started, I hoped Smartmouth would sell throughout Virginia and maybe a little in the mid-Atlantic. I didn't want to send our beer too far but wanted to focus on our local area. That has held pretty true. The biggest shift from the original plan was the legal change that allowed breweries to sell beer by the pint directly to the customer. We had only planned to be a brewery that made beer to distribute and be sold in restaurants and grocery stores. This was a huge game changer and now we have two tasting rooms in Hampton Roads, and it is a huge part of our business and has brought me a lot of joy to be able to engage in our customers directly.

**What can you tell us about the limited release Strawberry Fields beer created for WHRO Public Media?**

I'm really excited for Strawberry Fields and so thankful for the partnership with WHRO. This beer is a Gose, which is

a German-style sour. It is tart but the addition of strawberries will balance the tartness with sweetness. We only use real fruit in our beers which gives them a certain complexity. The name came about from the WHRO crew and is a shout-out to the new Time Machine radio station. I am sure it will be playing some Beatles!

**How long have you been a listener of WHRO's stations?**

I'd say since 2004. When I moved back here after law school, WHRO became part of my commute. *Morning Edition* and *All Things Considered* got me to and from work and kept me up to date on the world. If it was lunchtime, I'd always try and catch Cathy Lewis. In fact, Cathy had me on her show one time and it led to one of the more surreal experiences I've ever had. We recorded the show and then a couple of weeks later I ran out to the bank at lunchtime. I turn on the radio and hear myself coming through the speakers. Crazy! I can still remember right where I was when that happened.

**What do you enjoy most about our radio programs?**

I love the mix of national programming like *All Things Considered*, *Marketplace*, *This American Life*, etc. with local programming. I've already mentioned Cathy, who's now retired, but Jae Sinnett and Paul Shugrue are other favorites of mine. You get the best of both worlds.

**What is your favorite decade or genre of music being played on Time Machine Radio?**

Oh, that's hard. I love the '60s and '70s rock like Jimi Hendrix and Led Zeppelin but also love the blues and jazz of the '50s and '60s from artists like Miles Davis, Art Blakey, Howlin' Wolf and BB King.

# 'The WHRO Voice' Connects Listeners With Local News

Staff and volunteers of *The WHRO Voice* have been hard at work expanding their offerings for the blind and vision impaired members of our community. As they gear up for the busy fall and winter season, we wanted to take a moment and celebrate their achievements over the last couple of years.

## Expanded Local News

Among its many broadcast services, WHRO Public Media has been providing radio reading programs for the blind and visually impaired for more than 40 years with an emphasis on connecting listeners with their local newspapers. As WHRO has expanded its coverage of local news, so has *The WHRO Voice* by adding more community newspaper readings from additional weekly or bi-weekly editions in its broadcast area. As a result, our programming now includes virtually every major daily and weekly newspaper in southeastern Virginia.

Also included are special programs such as *The Voice's* first weekly audio news magazine—*WHRO News Week*—which includes radio news reports produced by WHRO journalists along with news stories by other reporters

from public radio stations across Virginia—and the first Spanish-speaking program, the *Tidewater Hispanic News*. Each week, The Voice also broadcasts information from the ads and circulars from area supermarkets.

## Community Support

*The Voice* recently garnered the support of Virginia Eye Consultants, which signed on as the service's newest underwriter. It also received acknowledgment from Rick Mitchell, the new commissioner of the Virginia Department for the Blind and Vision Impaired (DBVI), in one of his reports submitted to the department in Richmond.

“It is exciting to read about all of the wonderful work WHRO is doing in the Tidewater area,” Mitchell said. “I know it is through the WHRO team's efforts that many individuals with visual impairments are able to access information that they would not be able to normally.”

DBVI provides major funding for *The Voice* through an annual contract with WHRO.

“We are indebted to our wonderful volunteer readers for keeping *The Voice* on the air during the pandemic and for their continued dedication as we return to our expanded weekly schedule,” said James Holzer, who coordinates the programs and volunteer staff for the streaming radio service. “In addition to those who are blind or have serious eye conditions, individuals with low vision and who have difficulty reading small print may be qualified to receive a free device, allowing them to listen to *The WHRO Voice*,” said Holzer.

# 'Read Across America' with WHRO Education

When educators, parents and children hear “WHRO,” they often think of the three vans—Literacy, STEM, and Environmental—that come out to schools, community centers, and libraries bringing books, learning opportunities, and fun. This is just one example of how the Children’s Services team is a vital part of WHRO’s education department. The team provides many exciting programs and events for teachers, young learners, and their families throughout the year.

One of these fun events is Read Across America, a celebration of reading launched by the National Education Association in 1998. On March 2, for Read Across America Day, one of Children’s Services staff, Portia Hightower, went to an Isle of Wight elementary school to reach out to the pre-K and kindergarten students. “Read Across America at Hardy Elementary was so invigorating,” says Hightower.

“I was able to prepare activities about rhyming. The best part was when I started reading *Green Eggs and Ham*, the students started to repeat the lines I read in unison! I really liked when that happened because it kept the students engaged with the story.”

The Children’s Services team makes sure that they are bringing quality educational resources to children across Hampton Roads. They use PBS KIDS materials as well as other well-loved resources to have children participate in educational activities. At the end of an event, children are typically given bags with books, stickers, and other PBS KIDS goodies so they are able to continue their educational fun at home.

“What I enjoy most from doing events like Read Across America is being able to engage with the students and see the joy on their faces when they do an activity,

get an answer right, or when they receive a book. It warms my heart when I hear a child say, ‘This is so fun,’ ‘I’m going to read my new book,’ or when they talk about an activity they are doing with so much confidence. It reassures me that I am truly making a difference in their learning experience,” says Hightower.

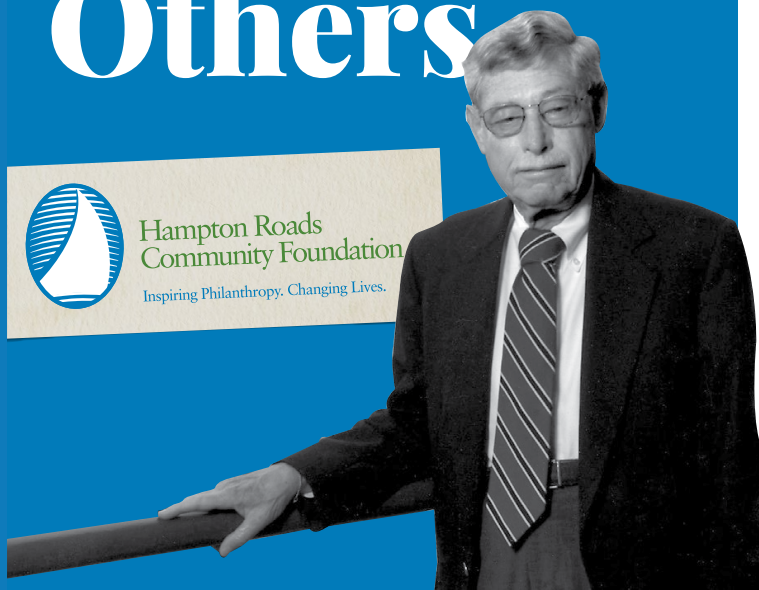

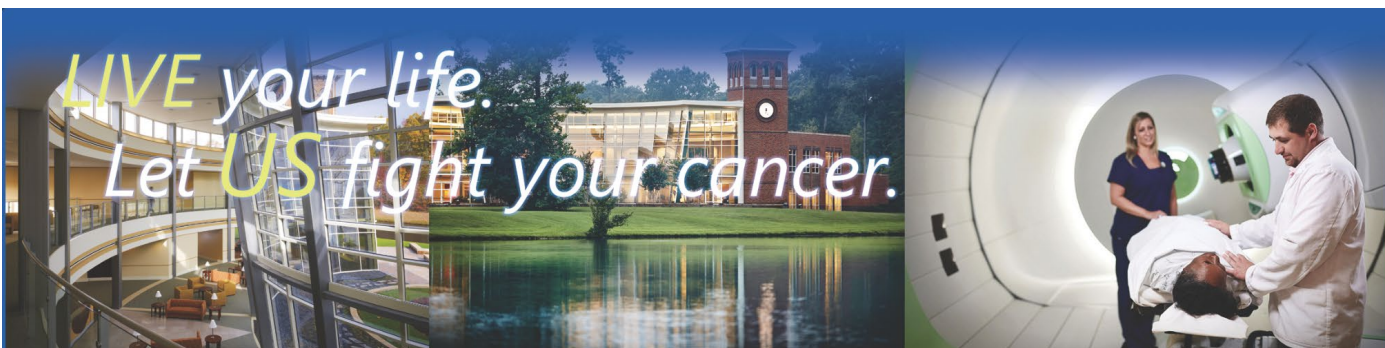
