Dear Magdalene,

I worked on the Buchanans for you this afternoon - without noticing any real proofs one way or another. In two hours you don't get that much done when you really don't knew the material as well as you would if you had done the original searching yourself.

You have done a fine job thus far, but there are several things I think I would do if it were my line.

It looks like the Buchanans came from Warren Co. as Perrin in hi s History of Ky. has stated.

I suggest that you line up the dates of the first purchases of land in Th. and or Ky. and then see if they work out with the deeds in Wargen County. Then I would work on the deeds in Rockingham and Guilford Cos. and see if they would work together....Does Samuel own land in Rockingham before he marries and receives land in Warren Co.? That sort of thing.

You can order copies of the Grantor and Grantee Deed Indices from the county Reg. of Deeds and that will give you a good picture of when they arrived in the county, what other Buchanans lived there etc.

I worked in some of the published material today - Typing the information from the Colonial Records by Clark into the computer and I will print that up for you. The Buchanans in the Guilford/Rockingham area were having something to do with the Regu**h**tors. Then I think that the two tax lists showing the Buchanans in Mutbush District and County Line District I would say are in GuilfordeCo. I am frequently wrong - but, keep this in mind.

The next first thing I would do is work Warren Co. deeds and check into Granville Co. material and see if the Buchanans show up there--Wills, Deeds etc.

Re: Ancestors of SAMUEL BUCHANAN

We do not exactly where or when Samuel was burn, but it was about 1780 because we have copy of a marriage bond showing that he married Mary Sandiford in Warren Co., N.C. 12 Oct. 1802, and deeds show he was given 183 acres of land there in Warren Co. in 1803 by Mary Sandiford's father, James Sandiford, presumably as a wedding gift. The 1810 Warren Co. census shows Samuel and his wife had 6 children under 10 years of age.

Samuel was father of 13 children there in Warren County before he died there in 1834. We have a copy of his will dividing his estate between his 13 children, and it shows that when it was probated in Sept. 1834, sons James C., David, and Henry had already moved to Montgomery County, TN, and James C. (my great, great grandfather) on to Christian Co., KY. Perrin's History of Kentucky says that James C. and wife Martha, and their 3 children - James H., Emily D., and Susan, moved from Warren County, NC in 1847, to Montgomery Co., TN, and in 1849 on to Christian Co., KY. The 1860 census of Christian County, KY, shows only James C. and Martha still living there at that time, as James H. mad married Martha O'Donley in 1854 there in Christian County, his sisters Emily and Susan had also married there, and the three couples had moved on to Ballard County, KY, settling on land they had purchased near Hinkleville and Gage there in Ballard County. Susan married a neighbor John O'Donley, and the O'Donley clan moved with them from Christian to Ballard County. They established a family graveyard on the O'Donley farm, and it is still there today, with stones for James C. Buchanan and wife Martha, Susan and John O'Donley, and perhaps a dozen other stones for other Buchanan and O'Donley family members passing away during the period 1865 to 1912.

From Warren Co., N.C. Estate Records 1718-1920, Deed of Release recorded p. 122 and Administrator's Bond, May ____, 1834, recorded page 469 (copies which I have) we know the names of the other children of Samuel and Mary Sandiford Buchanan.

Other information: Copy of Marriage Bond dated 5 Apr 1773 in Guilford County, N.C. shows that William Buchanan and Catherine McCaleb was issued license to be married there.

Rockingham County, NC, minutes of Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions shows that guardian of William Buchanan's orphan sons William, George, and <u>Samuel</u> was James Patrick, and that Ebenezer Patrick was chosen as guardian for other son James.

Copy of an application for membership to the DAR shows that on 3 Jan 1947 membership was sought on the military record of William Buchanan of Cumberland County, PA, through his son James Buchanan. Data in the application indicates that this William Buchanan was born in 1754 in Ireland, and that he later lived in Cumberland County, PA, from where he served in the Continental Line. Cumberland County Militia, in the Revolutionary War, from 1777 to 1780. His death date is listed as 1830. William Buchanan's children are listed as Betsy, James born 7 Jun 1780 and married Anna Sturman, <u>Samuel</u>, George, and William born 12 Oct 1785 and married Nancy Wortham.

Could our Samuel be the same Samuel listed on the DAR application mentioned above, and also mentioned in the Rockingham County, NC, court minutes as having James Patrick chosen as guardian for William Buchanan's orphan son Samuel?

We have copy of estate of estate settlement of a William Buchanan in Granville County, which record gives no genealogical information whatever, but merely shows that a William Buchanan died and had an estate settlement there in Granville County in August 1789. We have a copy of this settlement, from the State Archives at Raleigh.

From the State Archives at Raleigh we have a copy of a Rockingham County court order dated August 1801, directing commissioners to survey and divide 658 acres of land on Haw River in southeastern corner of Rockingham County, which 658 acres represented the land estate of deceased William Buchanan. No mention in the order is made of William Buchanan's wife, but the division was made between 5 sons: George Buchanan, James Buchanan, <u>Samuel Buchanan</u>, William Buchanan, and John Buchanan, with detailed description of the allotted parcel of land for each son.

It is also interesting to note that on 5 January 1796 another Rockingham County court order directed commissioners to survey and cut off 191 acres of land from the 658 acre estate of deceased William Buchanan, as dower share for widow Frances Buchanan. But in the division of the estate between the 5 sons on Aug. 1801, the division was on the original 658 acres, with no mention of the previously directed order for the 191 acres cut off as Frances Buchanan's dower share. Frances may have died between the dates of the two court orders. No geneological information was shown in the court orders other than what is mentioned above.

Note also, that records indicate that the William Buchanan of Rockingham County, and the William Buchanan of Granville County both died at about the same time. In the estate settlement in Granville County William Buchanan, had 70[±]/₂ acres of land along with other farming essentials, but if they were the same William Buchanan he could easily owned land in both counties. Just a thought! And this Samuel mentioned above <u>could have been</u> our Samuel who married Mary Sandiford.

I am emclosing my check for \$25. At this time I will say limit your research to two hours and let me know the possibilities.
