c. Co-operative House Construction Societies

These societies acquire land construct houses and allot them to members on hire purchase system.

d. Tenancy Housing Society

The society owns site, constructs houses according to the type and designs and rents out them to the members. The relationship between the society and the member is that of a house owner and tenant.

e. Other Housing Society

House Mortgage Bank. Such societies advance loan for repair, remodelling of old houses, on the security of the houses and other landed property.

Such a society purchases materials in bulk and provides improved methods of cultivation among the members without pooling their land and resources.

2. Joint Farming Societies

In this type, the members of the society pool their lands and resources and carry on cultivation jointly under the auspices of the society. The profit is divided among themselves after meeting the cost of the cultivation and other expenses of the society, in proportion to the extent of land held by each.

3. Tenant Farming Societies

Such society acquires or owns the land for cultivation. It parcels out the land in convenient economic units to the members for their independent cultivation, fixing a rent. The relationship between the society and the members is that of a land owner and tenants.

4. Collective Farming Societies

In this type the whole land are owned and held by the society. The cultivation is carried on in the land by the society employing the members. The profits of the society are distributed among members in proportion to the work done by them.

Better farming

Co-operative Joint Farming

- ✧ Ownership of land is retained by the individual member.
- ✧ Members pool their individual plot for joint cultivation.

- ✧ Society will manage the cultivation.
- ✧ Profit is distributed on the basis of wages earned.
- ✧ Pooling of land is compulsory in joint farming.

♦ "Individual farming run on Co-operative basis is called Better farming".

Co-operative Tenant Farming Society

Co-operative Collective Farming Society

- ✧ Collective ownership is the feature of Co-operative Collective Farming Society
- ✧ The members of the society get daily wages.
- ✧ In this type of farming profit is divided on the basis of wages earned by them.
- ✧ Joint ownership and Joint cultivation is seen in Co-operative Collective Farming
- ✧ Pooling of land is ordinarily for a period of **5 years**
- ✧ The members carry on cultivation independently in Co-operative Collective Farming
