HONORING SEÑOR SACK

Texas Tech will honor the memory of the Red Raider great Gabe Rivera throughout the 2018 season. Rivera, one of five members of the prestigious Texas Tech Ring of Honor, passed away in his hometown of San Antonio on July 16.



Known by fans as "Señor Sack" throughout his career, Rivera compiled 321 career tackles, including 34 that went for a loss, over his four-year career from 1979-82. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame in 2012 and the Texas Tech Ring of Honor in 2014.

SATURDAY STORYLINES



NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Texas Tech will open its home slate Saturday in the friendly confines of Jones AT&T Stadium where the Red Raiders have won each of their last 18 home openers. The Red Raiders have historically defended their home field, winning 64 percent of games inside Jones AT&T Stadium since the start of the 1947 season (257-142-6 overall).
- Texas Tech has scored at least 40 points in each of its last six home openers. The Red Raiders have scored 50 or more points in four of those games and 60 points twice.
- Since 1975, Texas Tech is 14-2 in home openers that have occurred following week one games on the road.



STILL A LONG SEASON TO GO

- Despite dropping its first season opener since 2002 last weekend, Texas Tech still has a great opportunity ahead to finish with a strong season. Tech bounced back from that season-opening loss to No. 12 Ohio State in 2002 by rolling off eight victories during the regular season before defeating Clemson in the Tangerine Bowl. Tech also won nine games in 1995 following a close loss at No. 4 Penn State.
- Texas Tech is 16-10 all-time in the weeks following a season-opening loss. The Red Raiders have rebounded to win their week two game after a season-opening loss in each of the last six occurrences.



RED RAIDERS PROTECT HOME TURF

- Texas Tech enters this weekend having won each of its last seven non-conference games at home and 32 of its last 33 dating back to the 2002 season. The Red Raiders are an impressive 39-2 overall since moving to a spread offense in 2000.
- Texas Tech head coach Kliff Kingsbury is 9-1 against non-conference opponents at home with the one loss coming to Arkansas during the 2014 campaign.
- Overall, Kingsbury is 13-3 overall in regular season non-conference games since taking over the reins of his alma mater in 2013.

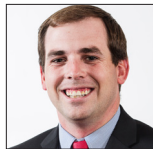

RED RAIDERS IN HOME OPENERS

- Texas Tech has been dominant in home openers during its history as the Red Raiders are 74-17-2 all-time after winning each of their last 18 openers inside Jones AT&T Stadium.
- Since 1980, the Red Raiders are 34-4 in home openers with two of those losses coming to ranked opponents (1992 vs. No. 15 Oklahoma & 1990 vs. No. 18 Houston).
- Texas Tech has scored at least 40 points in each of its last six home openers. The Red Raiders have scored 50 or more points in four of those games and 60 points twice.
- Texas Tech has not dropped a home opener since 1999 when North Texas shocked the Red Raiders, 23-14.
- Since 1975, Texas Tech is 14-2 in home openers that have occurred following week one games on the road.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD

- Since converting to the spread offense in 2000, Texas Tech has averaged 48.6 points per game over the course of 18 home openers. The Red Raiders have scored at least 20 points in all 18 games during that time and at least 50 points eight times, including each of the last three seasons.
- Texas Tech has won each of its last 18 home openers, the majority of which being in a blowout fashion. The Red Raiders have averaged 29.5 points as their margin of victory over the course of the winning streak.

ABILITY TO BOUNCE BACK

- Texas Tech will look to avoid its first 0-2 start since 1990 against Lamar as the Red Raiders' loss to Ole Miss marked just its 27th in season openers over now 94 seasons of collegiate football. The Red Raiders have traditionally bounced back in strong fashion from a season-opening loss as Tech is 16-10 all-time in the week immediately following.
- The Red Raiders have rebounded to win their week two game after a season-opening loss in each of the last six occurrences. In two of those seasons (2002 and 1995), Texas Tech went on to win nine games overall.

OLE MISS RECAP

- Texas Tech came into the contest riding a 15-game winning streak in season openers, which ranked as the third-longest active streak in the country trailing only Ohio State (17) and Alabama (16). The Red Raiders had not previously dropped a season opener since falling at No. 12 Ohio State, 45-21, to open the 2002 campaign. Texas Tech's 15-game winning streak in season openers was previously the longest in school history.
- Texas Tech had not previously lost a game where the Red Raiders did not commit a turnover since falling to No. 3 TCU in the final minutes at home in 2015.
- Texas Tech created its first turnover of the season late in the third quarter as John Bonney popped out a fumble that was recovered by Eli Howard. The Red Raiders have now forced at least one turnover in 15-consecutive games dating back to late in the 2016 season.
- Texas Tech had four players make their first career start in the Ole Miss game: **Ta'Zawn Henry** (RB), **Joseph Wallace** (DL), **Thomas Leggett** (S) and **John Bonney** (S).
- Despite the loss, Texas Tech managed to win the turnover battle as **John Bonney** popped out a fumble near midfield late in the third quarter. The fumble was recovered by **Eli Howard**, the first of his career. The Red Raiders were previously 14-3 under **Kliff Kingsbury** when leading the turnover margin.

GROUND READY

- Kliff Kingsbury stayed true to his preseason goal of running the ball more effectively this season as the Red Raiders rushed 39 times for 164 yards and two touchdowns.
- **Da'Leon Ward** handled the majority of the carries early as the sophomore finished with 90 yards and two touchdowns on 17 carries before departing the game early in the second half. It marked the fifth-consecutive game Ward has rushed for at least 80 yards dating back to the end of his 2016 true freshman season. Ward eclipsed the 90-yard mark in three of those final four games.
- Ward found the end zone twice on strong runs as he scored Texas Tech's first touchdown of the season on a 15-yard scamper to close its opening drive. He found the end zone again late in the third quarter, marking his first career game with two touchdowns.
- Ward appeared destined for his first career 100-yard game against the Rebels before he departed the game in favor of **Tre King** over the final quarter. King totaled 31 yards on the ground on 13 carries during that span.

KINGSBURY WITH FRESHMAN QBs

■ Kliff Kingsbury is no stranger to freshman quarterbacks. In fact, if **Alan Bowman** is the starter Saturday, he would be the seventh freshman quarterback to start a game during Kingsbury's career, joining Heisman Trophy winner **Johnny Manziel** and current NFL quarterbacks **Patrick Mahomes II**, **Baker Mayfield** and **Davis Webb**. Kingsbury also started a pair of freshmen in **Terrance Broadway** and **David Piland** during his first season as a full-time assistant coach at the University of Houston in 2010.

■ Bowman is looking to become only the sixth true freshman to start at quarterback in school history, joining **Ron Reeves** (1978), **Aaron Keesee** (1984), **Baker Mayfield** (2013), **Davis Webb** (2013) and **Patrick Mahomes II** (2014).

■ Dating back to 2010, quarterbacks under Kliff Kingsbury are averaging 4,797 passing yards, 5,129 yards of total offense, 46 total touchdowns and just 14 interceptions per year.

BOWMAN SEES FIRST ACTION

■ **Alan Bowman** received his first collegiate action early in the Ole Miss game following an injury to **McLane Carter**. Bowman responded by finishing 29-of-49 overall for 273 yards and a touchdown.

■ Bowman, a four-year starter at Grapevine High School in the Dallas area, connected with **Ja'Deion High** for his first career touchdown pass just before halftime. He found High on a 14-yard strike in the corner with 1:57 remaining in the second quarter.

■ Bowman was the first Red Raider true freshman to appear at quarterback since current NFL starter **Patrick Mahomes II** made his debut at Oklahoma State in 2014.

LEFTY, LEFTY

■ Carter earned the starting nod against Ole Miss, completing four of his first seven passes for 49 yards before suffering an injury on the first play of Texas Tech's third drive of the game. The Gilmore, Texas native is believed to be the first left-handed quarterback to be named the opening-game starter for the Red Raiders in school history.

BIG MEN UP FRONT ALL RETURN

■ After boasting one of the youngest offensive lines in the country a year ago, second-year offensive line coach **Brandon Jones** will reap the benefits of having all five of his starters returning this season.

■ Jones utilized the same starting lineup the final 11 games of last season with **Travis Bruffy** at left tackle, **Madison Akamnonu** at left guard, **Paul Stawarz** at center, **Jack Anderson** at right guard and **Terence Steele** at right tackle. Stawarz will be the only senior in that group as Jones mentored one of the youngest offensive lines in the country a year ago.

■ Among the offensive line alone, the group has accounted for 88 career starts, led by Steele, who has made 26 starts over the last two years alone. He is followed by Stawarz with 22 starts and then Akamnonu with 21 starts of his own.

■ **Jack Anderson** returns for his sophomore campaign after a stellar debut in 2017 where he was named a Freshman All-American by both ESPN and USA Today. Anderson started in all 13 games at right guard for the Red Raiders. Anderson's selection marked the first time a Red Raider had been named a Freshman All-American since the 2013 season. In addition, he joined current Indianapolis Colts standout **Le'Raven Clark** as the only Texas Tech offensive linemen in school history to garner Freshman All-America accolades.

VASHER MAKES #SCTOP10 CATCH

■ **T.J. Vasher** burst onto the scene due to his big play ability a year ago and displayed that same strength again against Ole Miss, going up to snag two difficult catches, including one down the right sideline that was the top play the following morning on SportsCenter.

■ Vasher closed the Ole Miss game with a team-leading 66 receiving yards after hauling in four passes. His one-handed grab (pictured on page 5) set up Texas Tech's first touchdown, which came on a 15-yard scamper from **Da'Leon Ward**.

■ Dating back to the end of the 2017 season, Vasher has now recorded at least 60 receiving yards in six of his last seven games.

THE OFFENSIVE STANDARD

Texas Tech has long been considered the offensive standard since the Red Raiders moved to its passing attack in 2000. ■ For as improved as the Texas Tech defense was in 2017, **Kliff Kingsbury** and defensive coordinator **David Gibbs** expect the Red Raiders to be even better this season. Part of that belief is the number of returners coming back on the defensive side of the ball as 10 starters and nine additional two-deep players are all back this season.

■ Texas Tech lost just two defensive players from a year ago that saw playing time late in the season as both **Zach Barnes** and **Mychealon Thomas** departed due to graduation. Thomas started in all 13 games at nose tackle and was on the New York Jets' training camp roster.

■ Texas Tech's list of defensive returners account for 184 career starts among them, 154 of which come from the 10 defensive starters who will be back in scarlet and black next fall.

■ **Jah'Shawn Johnson** leads all returning players with 37 starts over his career as the senior has started in every game the past three seasons outside the 2017 meeting against Kansas State and the season opener versus Ole Miss. Johnson had to sit out the first half of that game after being called for a targeting penalty late in the Oklahoma game the previous week.

■ Texas Tech has seven additional defensive players with 10 or more starts during their career as **Jordyn Brooks** leads the group with 23 over just two seasons followed by **Kolin Hill** (21), **Dakota Allen** (19), **John Bonney** (16), **Broderick Washington Jr.** (15), **Vaughnte Dorsey** (12) and **DaMarcus Fields** (12).

■ Johnson teams with both Allen and **Justus Parker** as returning Red Raiders who earned All-Big 12 accolades a year ago. The trio were all named to the All-Big 12 second team last season by the conference coaches, marking the first time since 2012 where Tech had three or more defensive players earn first or second team honors.

■ The trio also earned All-Big 12 preseason honors this summer, the most defensive selections for any conference school.

SIXTH YEAR VETERANS

■ Texas Tech has three sixth-year seniors on its roster that are expected to play significant roles this season in **Zach Austin**, **Kyle Heffron** and **Ja'Deion High**. Austin and High will both contribute to Texas Tech's passing game, while Heffron will enter his third season as the Red Raiders' deep snapper.



ALLEN AMONG NATION'S BEST

■ **Dakota Allen** will enter the 2018 campaign ranked among the top players in the country after the senior linebacker led the Red Raiders with 102 tackles a year ago en route to earning All-Big 12 second team honors by the conference coaches. Allen also produced four of Texas Tech's 29 total takeaways on the season as he had a pair of interceptions to go along with a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

■ This past January, CBS Sports ranked Allen at No. 14 nationally among returning players for the 2018 season. The rankings were compiled using season-long grades from Pro Football Focus along with other stats and information. Allen was the highest-ranked linebacker in the poll and ranked No. 4 overall among Big 12 players.

■ Allen is already a preseason candidate for the Nagurski Award (top defensive player) and the Bednarik Award (top defensive player).

■ In addition to Allen, Texas Tech also returns junior **Jordyn Brooks** and sophomore **Riko Jeffers**, giving the Red Raiders one of the deepest and talented linebacker cores in the country heading into 2018. Brooks has recorded 175 tackles the past two seasons, 86 of which came in 2016 when he became the first Red Raider freshman to lead the team in tackles during the Big 12 era. Jeffers had 22 tackles and a fumble recovery in 2017 as a true freshman.

LEADER OF #806D IS BACK

■ **David Gibbs** signed a new two-year contract with Texas Tech this past December that will keep the popular defensive coordinator in Lubbock through the 2019 season. Texas Tech has not had the same defensive coordinator over four-consecutive seasons since **John Goodner** led the defense through the final five seasons (1995-99) of **Spike Dykes'** tenure as head coach.

■ Among its Big 12 counterparts, Texas Tech will enter 2018 as one of just three league schools to boast the same head coach and defensive coordinator since the start of the 2015 season, joining both Kansas and West Virginia.

■ Following a career in the NFL, Gibbs returned to the college game in 2013 as the defensive coordinator at the University of Houston. Since that time, Gibbs has led defenses that have ranked among the top-25 teams in the country for forced turnovers in four of the past five seasons, including twice in his three years at Tech (2015, 2017).

■ Gibbs' units have caused 140 takeaways over the past five seasons alone, which is tied for the most among defensive coordinators nationally during that span.

JOHNSON AMONG TECH GREATS

■ Each tackle for **Jah'Shawn Johnson** during the 2018 season will inch him closer to the Texas Tech record book as he needs 65 takedowns to crack the top 10 in program history. Johnson is averaging 86 tackles per season over the past three years after notching 85 as a redshirt freshman in 2015, 77 in 2016 and then a career-high 97 a year ago.

■ Johnson has also played a huge role in Texas Tech's rise as one of the top turnover-causing defenses in the country as he has been part of 17 takeaways over his career (5 interceptions, 6 forced fumbles, 6 fumble recoveries), easily the most among active Red Raiders.

■ Since the start of 2000, Johnson's six career forced fumbles rank fourth among Red Raiders, trailing only the totals of **Dwayne Slay** (8 from 2004-05), **Pete Robertson** (8 from 2011-15) and **Brandon Williams** (7 from 2006-08).

■ Johnson's five fumble recoveries, meanwhile, are tied with **Keyunta Dawson** (2003-06) for the most among Red Raiders dating back to the 2000 season. With one full season left to play, Johnson needs two more fumble recoveries to tie **Zach Thomas'** (1992-95) school record.

FINISH

■ The term "finish" has been a popular one around the Football Training Facility since the conclusion of the 2017 campaign as head coach **Kliff Kingsbury** declared the six-letter word as the official team motto for this season. The Red Raiders have dropped seven games by one possession or less (8 points) the last two seasons, over half of their losses during that span.

A LATE ADDITION

■ Texas Tech picked up a valuable late addition to its roster two weeks into training camp in University of Texas transfer **John Bonney**, who began practicing with the Red Raiders on Aug. 15. Bonney arrives in Lubbock after playing in 37 career games with 15 starts for the Longhorns, compiling 87 career tackles (66 solo) to go along with an interception, two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 14 pass breakups.

■ **T.J. Vasher** made the top play on SportsCenter this past Sunday after his leaping one-handed catch early in the first quarter against Ole Miss. Vasher finished with four catches for a team-high 66 yards versus the Rebels.

STRIPPING THE BALL LOOSE

■ One of the key elements of **David Gibbs'** defensive philosophy is creating fumble opportunities. The Red Raiders have caused opponents to lose 34 fumbles over the last three-plus seasons, which is tied for 11th among teams nationally during that span.

■ Among power-five schools, Texas Tech is tied for seventh in fumble recoveries during that same time span.

■ Of Texas Tech's 34 fumble recoveries under Gibbs, 15 alone came during the 2017 season where Texas Tech led the Big 12 and ranked fourth nationally.

■ After sending four wide receivers to NFL training camps following the 2017 season, Texas Tech will look to reload its passing game behind a new quarterback and several new faces at wideout. Tech had no shortage of success at the wide receiver position over the past decade as nine Red Raider wideouts are currently on NFL rosters, including seven from Kliff Kingsbury's tenure.

■ Among Texas Tech's list of NFL standouts is two-time Biletnikoff Award winner Michael Crabtree, the first player in NCAA history to win the prestigious trophy twice.

■ **T.J. Vasher** enters his sophomore year as Texas Tech's top returning receiver after catching 29 passes for 545 yards and six touchdowns. The majority of Vasher's stats came late in the season as he hauled in all but two of his passes over the final eight games. Vasher ended the year ranked 22nd nationally, averaging an impressive 18.8 yards per catch.

THE BALL-HAWK

■ **Justus Parker** developed quite the reputation a year ago as one of the top ball-hawks in the country after picking off four passes while forcing four fumbles and recovering another. Parker, who had a key interception late in the year to boost the come-from-behind victory at Texas, ended the season ranked 20th nationally in forced fumbles per game (0.31) and 29th in total interceptions. He was the only player from a power-five conference to rank in the top 30 nationally for both categories.

CAN'T SHUT US OUT

■ One thing is certain when watching Texas Tech - the Red Raiders are going to find their way onto the scoreboard. Tech is currently riding a consecutive game scoring streak that spans 259 games dating back to the 1997 season.

■ The streak, which began against Texas A&M on Oct. 25, 1997, ranks eighth nationally and is the second-longest active streak in the Big 12 Conference behind TCU.

TEXAS TECH KNOWS OFFENSE

■ Texas Tech is the only school in the country to rank among the top 16 teams for total offense and top 10 for passing of-fense in every season since 2002.

■ Texas Tech has scored 40 or more points regularly under **Kliff Kingsbury**. The Red Raiders have eclipsed the 40-point mark 23 times under Kingsbury and the 50-point plateau a total of 17 times.

■ In 63 games as head coach, **Kliff Kingsbury** has guided the Red Raider offense to at least 500 yards of total offense 37 times during his tenure. During that span, Kingsbury has led Texas Tech to 700 yards of total offense five times, all of which rank among the top-10 totals in program history.

■ The Red Raiders head into the 2018 season having scored at least 50 points in 12 of their last 18 games inside Jones AT&T Stadium, easily the highest total among teams nationally during that span.

ALLEN, JOHNSON TABBED CAPTAINS

■ Texas Tech named six team captains for the 2018 season following a team vote at the conclusion of preseason practices. The Red Raiders selected senior linebacker **Dakota Allen**, junior offensive lineman **Travis Bruffy**, senior wide receiver **Ja'Deion High**, senior defensive back **Jah'Shawn Johnson**, junior offensive lineman **Terence Steele** and junior defensive lineman **Broderick Washington, Jr.**

■ This is the second-straight season Allen and Johnson were both selected as a team captain by their peers.

■ Texas Tech has boasted five or more captains in consecutive seasons and for the third time overall under **Kliff Kingsbury**. Tech played in a bowl game in each of those two previous seasons with a trip to the 2015 AdvoCare V100 Texas Bowl and the 2017 Birmingham Bowl.

GETTING UP EARLY

■ Early kickoff times shouldn't have an effect on the Red Raiders as Texas Tech moved to morning workouts beginning on Aug. 21. Tech will have had two full weeks of early rises before facing Ole Miss as part of a new practice schedule for this season.

■ Texas Tech will utilize morning practices for the duration of the 2018 season. The Red Raiders had previously held afternoon workouts throughout **Kliff Kingsbury's** tenure. Kingsbury moved to morning workouts beginning this past spring.

DEGREES IN HAND

■ Texas Tech will have 10 student-athletes on its roster this fall who have already completed their undergraduate degrees. The list includes **Kisean Allen**, **Zach Austin**, **John Bonney** (graduate transfer), **Demarcus Felton**, **Lonzell Gilmore**, **Preston Gordon** (graduate transfer), **Kyle Heffron**, **Ja'Deion High**, **Eli Howard** and **Michael Mays**.

■ Of that group, both Gilmore and Howard boast multiple years of eligibility remaining as Gilmore is classified as a junior while Howard is listed as only a sophomore.

'08 TEAM TO BE HONORED VS TEXAS

■ The Double T Varsity Club will bring back several members of Texas Tech's 2008 team the weekend of the Texas game. That particular team started the year a perfect 11-0 with top-five wins over both Texas and Oklahoma State before ending its season at the Cotton Bowl.

A BANNER YEAR

■ Texas Tech Athletics recorded one of its most successful years in school history during the 2017-18 academic year as six programs - men's track and field (indoor and outdoor), women's tennis, men's basketball, men's golf and baseball - all finished among the top-eight teams in the country for their respective sports.

■ Texas Tech was the only school in the country to play in a bowl game, while also advancing to the Elite Eight in men's basketball and the College World Series in baseball.

SPECIAL TEAMS WATCH

ALL FOUR SPECIALISTS RETURN

- New special teams coach **Adam Scheier** will benefit from the return of all four of Texas Tech's specialists from a year ago in deep snapper **Kyle Heffron**, punter **Dominic Panazzolo**, place kicker **Clayton Hatfield** and kickoff specialist **Michael Barden**.
- Heffron returns for an extra season as he was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA prior to the start of spring practice. Heffron has served as Texas Tech's primary deep snapper during each of the last two seasons.
- All four of Texas Tech's main specialists are listed as seniors, giving Scheier an experienced group in his first season.
- Scheier has been adamant since his hiring that starters on both offense and defense will see action on special teams.

AUSSIE, AUSSIE, AUSSIE

- Australian punter **Dominic Panazzolo** had a strong debut in 2017 as Texas Tech's primary punter. The senior limited opponents to just 12 returns out of his 60 punts on the season, holding foes to just 5.6 yards per return overall.
- Panazzolo averaged 41.4 yards per punt on the year as he downed 15 punts inside the 20 yard line. He only had two punts end in touchbacks as well.

MR. UNDER ARMOUR

- In addition to preparing for the 2018 season, **Dominic Panazzolo** gained some additional career experience this past summer as a week-long intern at Under Armour's world headquarters in Baltimore. Panazzolo worked as a sports marketing intern through the internship promoted to Texas Tech student-athletes through the J.T. and Margaret Talkington Leadership Academy.
- Panazzolo, one of 17 student-athletes from across Under Armour's network of collegiate partners to earn the valuable internship, was part of the winning group that developed the top marketing campaign for an upcoming brand release.

NEW NAMES IN RETURN GAME

- Texas Tech fans will see a new face returning punts for the Red Raiders this season after the departure of current Tennessee Titans wide receiver **Cameron Batson**, who primarily handled the duties each of the past four seasons. Batson averaged 6.1 yards per punt over his four-year career as a Red Raider
- The Red Raiders also lost an explosive threat on kick returns after **Keke Coutee** declared for the NFL Draft. Coutee, who was drafted in the fourth round by the Houston Texans, averaged 31.5 yards per kick return in 2017, the highest single-season clip in program history.
- Scheier will utilize several new faces in the return game as senior **De'Quan Bowman** will get an opportunity alongside sophomore **Adrian Frye** and true freshman **Ta'Zawn Henry**.

HATFIELD MOVING UP RECORD BOOK

- Hatfield heads into his senior season already among the prolific kickers in school history as he ranks ninth all-time with 33 career field goals. Hatfield will need to connect on 17 field goals in 2018 to match Ryan Bustin's career record of 50 field goals from the 2012-14 seasons.
- Hatfield is among the career leaders for point-after-tries as he enters 2018 with 140 over the last three seasons. He needs just 14 PATs next season to pass Bustin for second all-time on the Tech career chart. Alex Trilica still has the Tech career record as he made 233 PATs during the 2004-07 seasons.
- Hatfield has connected on 33-of-40 field goal attempts over his career, which is good for an .825 average that trails only Baylor's Connor Martin (.833) among returning Big 12 kickers. Hatfield's career clip ranks 11th nationally among returning kickers with a minimum of 15 career field goals.

HEAD COACH KLIFF KINGSBURY

Kliff Kingsbury (@TTUKingsbury), the architect of one of the nation's most high-powered offenses, enters his sixth season leading his alma mater as he was named the 15th head coach in Texas Tech history on Dec. 12, 2012.

Upon his hiring, Kingsbury became the first Red Raider to return as the program's head coach. Since then, the Red Raiders have boasted an explosive offense that has annually ranked among the top units in the country.

Tech has made three bowl appearances under Kingsbury with the most-recent trip coming at the 2017 Birmingham Bowl. Kingsbury also led Tech to the 2015 AdvoCare Texas Bowl and the 2013 National University Holiday Bowl where the Red Raiders topped No. 16 Arizona State.

Kingsbury's hiring helped revitalize the Texas Tech fan base as the Red Raiders set a new school record for average home attendance during his first season (57,933 average per game). Tech broke that mark again a year later after averaging 58,934 fans per game and came close to snapping the total again with 58,250 fans per game in 2016.

Known as one of the top offensive minds in college football, Kingsbury has directed a high-octane attack as Tech has ranked among the top-10 teams in the country for passing in each of his five seasons. The Red Raiders have also ranked among the top-16 schools nationally for total offense during that span as well as the top-25 teams in scoring four times.

The highlight of Tech's success offensively came in 2016 when Tech finished as the nation's leader in total offense, marking the sixth-straight year where a Kingsbury-led attack ranked 11th or higher in the category dating back to his time at both Houston and Texas A&M. The Red Raiders were also the nation's leader in passing offense and ranked fifth for scoring offense.

Since joining the coaching profession, Kingsbury has been among the elite quarterback developers in the country with five former pupils moving on to the NFL in Patrick Mahomes (Chiefs), Case Keenum (Broncos), Davis Webb (Giants), Johnny Manziel and 2017 signal caller Nic Shimonek (Chargers). Mahomes' rise into one of the top quarterbacks in school history caught the attention of pro personnel as he was selected 10th overall by the Kansas City Chiefs in the 2017 NFL Draft, marking the highest a Tech quarterback had ever been picked. Mahomes joined Manziel as NFL first-round selections under Kingsbury after the former Heisman winner was picked 22nd overall in the 2014 draft.

OFFENSES UNDER KINGSBURY

Since earning his first coordinator position at Houston in 2010, Kliff Kingsbury has annually produced one of the nation's top offenses. A two-time National Offensive Coordinator of the Year honoree, Kingsbury has produced an offense that has ranked 11th or better nationally in each of the past five seasons. IN ELITE COMPANY

■ **Kliff Kingsbury** is one of only two NCAA FBS coaches that finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting and also played in the National Football League. Kingsbury joins Michigan's Jim Harbaugh as the only two active coaches to accomplish this feat. Harbaugh finished third in the 1986 Heisman Trophy race and played 13 seasons in the NFL. Kingsbury, meanwhile, ranked ninth in the 2002 Heisman Trophy voting and then played five seasons in the NFL with stops with the New England Patriots, New Orleans Saints, New York Jets and Denver Broncos.

WINS IN THE STATE CAPITAL

■ **Kliff Kingsbury** became the first head coach in school history to win back-to-back games in Austin as the Red Raiders closed the 2017 regular season with a 27-23 come-from-behind victory over Texas. Kingsbury, who led Tech to a 48-45 win over Texas in 2015, joins **Spike Dykes** as the only head coaches in program history to have multiple wins over Texas in Austin during their respective careers.

NEW FACES ON STAFF

■ **Kliff Kingsbury** hired five new members to his coaching staff this offseason, bringing in the likes of **Kevin Johns** (offensive coordinator/inside receivers), **Clay McGuire** (co-offensive coordinator/running backs), **Brett Dewhurst** (safeties), **Clay Jennings** (defensive backs) and **Adam Scheier** (special teams).

■ **Johns** arrives in Lubbock after spending the 2017 season in a similar role at Western Michigan and the three seasons before that as the offensive coordinator at Indiana where he helped the Hoosiers snap a total of 54 offensive records during his tenure. Indiana rewrote its record book under **Johns**, setting the single-season marks for points, total yards, passing yards and rushing yards.

■ Both **Dewhurst** and **McGuire** are familiar with Texas Tech and Lubbock from their playing days as Red Raiders. **McGuire** played alongside **Kingsbury** as a blocking back from 2000-04, while **Dewhurst** made 103 tackles during his career as a Red Raider defensive back from 2008-11.

■ **McGuire** returned to Lubbock following six seasons as the offensive line coach at Washington State. This is **McGuire's** second stint as a full-time member of the Texas Tech staff as he served nearly two years as special teams coordinator from 2007-08 and then running backs coach in 2009. He was also a graduate assistant at Tech in 2007.

■ **Dewhurst's** transition back to the Red Raider staff was a simple one as he's familiar with defensive coordinator **David Gibbs' system** after four years as a quality control assistant at both Houston (2013-14) and Texas Tech (2015-16). He spent the 2017 season as the defensive backs coach at Southeastern Louisiana.

■ **Jennings** comes to Texas Tech following one season as the co-defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of Houston. He has an extensive history coaching in the state of Texas with previous stops at Houston (2005-06, 2017) as well as Texas (2016), TCU (2008-13), Baylor (2007) and Sam Houston State (2001-02). He has 21 years of experience coaching at the collegiate level.

■ **Scheier** joined the Texas Tech staff prior to the start of spring practice following one season as a quality control assistant at Ohio State. A 22-year coaching veteran, **Scheier** has spent the majority of his coaching career coordinating special teams with prior stops at Wake Forest (2014-16), Bowling Green (2009-13), Lehigh (2002-08) and Princeton (2000-01). He spent the 2017 season as a quality control assistant at Ohio State.

SERIES HISTORY

■ Texas Tech and Lamar will meet for only the third time in program history Saturday as the Red Raiders are a perfect 2-0 all-time against the Cardinals. Both of the previous meetings between the two in-state schools occurred during the 1987-88 campaigns where Tech prevailed behind 43-14 and 59-28 routs..

RED RAIDERS VERSUS THE FCS

■ Since 1978 when the NCAA divided its Division-I schools into two divisions, Texas Tech has compiled a 21-1 all-time record against FCS opponents. All of those games have been played at Jones AT&T Stadium.

■ Texas Tech has won its last 17-consecutive games against FCS opponents dating back to the 1988 season. The NCAA re-named Division 1A and Division 1-AA to FBS and FCS in 2006 to note the distinction in football programs.

■ This is the ninth time in the past 10 seasons where the Red Raiders have welcomed a FCS program for its home opener. Texas Tech is a perfect 8-0 in those games.

■ Texas Tech's lone loss to a FCS program came in 1988 when North Texas stunned the Red Raiders, 29-24, inside Jones AT&T Stadium.

■ Texas Tech is averaging an impressive 51.8 points per game all-time against FCS opponents. The Red Raiders have reached the 40-point mark in each of their last eight meetings with FCS programs.

HOUSTON (AP) — The Texas Tech football team suffered its first season-opening loss since 2002 on Saturday, falling to Ole Miss, 47-27, at NRG Stadium in Houston.

Da'Leon Ward's second touchdown on a 9-yard run got Texas Tech within 10 later in the third quarter, but Ta'amu found A.J. Brown for a 34-yard touchdown pass on the second play of the fourth quarter to make it 44-27.

Texas Tech freshman Alan Bowman was 29-of-49 for 273 yards and a touchdown after taking over late in the first quarter when starter McLane Carter was injured.

The Red Raiders evened it up when Ward ran 15 yards for a score on their first possession. That touchdown was set up when T.J. Vasher made an Odell Beckham-esque one-handed catch for a 31-yard gain two plays earlier. Vasher grabbed the ball with his right hand as he leapt above the defender and secured it with both hands before crashing to the turf near the sideline.

The Rebels were up 17-7 when Carter appeared to injure his left ankle when he was tackled by a pair of defenders on a run for no gain. He tried to remain in the game but fell to the ground at the line and was helped off the field and then carted to the locker room.

Bowman made a nice throw under heavy pressure for a 14-yard TD pass to Ja'Deion High to cut the lead to 27-17 about two minutes before halftime.

THE TAKEAWAY

Bowman handled things pretty well after being thrown into action following Carter's injury. Texas Tech's defense will also have to figure out how to limit big plays after the Rebels exploited it for several on Saturday.

UP NEXT

Texas Tech: The Red Raiders host Lamar next Saturday in their home opener before the Houston Cougars visit Lubbock on Sept. 15.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Texas Tech created its first turnover of the season as John Bonney popped out a fumble that was recovered by Eli Howard. The Red Raiders have now forced at least one turnover in 15-consecutive games dating back to late in the 2016 season.
- Texas Tech has now scored in 259-straight games dating back to the 1997 season, a streak that now ranks ninth nationally and second in the Big 12 Conference.
