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

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A LOOK TO THE FUTURE

22 years in Hollywood... The COLCOA French Film Festival has become a reference for many and a landmark with a non-stop growing popularity year after year. This longevity has several reasons: the continued support of its creator, the Franco-American Cultural Fund (a unique partnership between DGA, MPA, SACEM and WGA West); the faithfulness of our audience and sponsors; the interest of professionals (American and French filmmakers, distributors, producers, agents, journalists); our unique location – the Directors Guild of America in Hollywood – and, of course, the involvement of a dedicated team.

Now, because of the continuing digital (r)evolution in the film and television series industry, the life of a film or series depends on people who spread the word and create a buzz. More than ever, audiences and professionals need events like COLCOA to share their passion for film. At the same time, from a promotional point of view, the festival remains a visible and unique echo chamber for films to be known before a future release. This is particularly true for foreign films, for which promotion is always a vital challenge.

Talking about the future, French poet Louis Aragon wrote that "woman is the future of man". More than one century after French female director, Alice Guy, moved to the U.S. to be one of the pioneers of the American film industry, we dedicate COLCOA's entire program – the largest ever – to women and to the role they have played in the creation process of cinema and television. A new series, *Women Make History*, is being introduced

this year. The *French NeWave 2.0* lineup on Saturday is composed of first films written and directed by women. The *Focus on a Filmmaker* day will be offered to writer, director, actor Mélanie Laurent and one of our panels will address the role of women in the French film industry.

The future is also about new talent highlighted at the festival. A large number of filmmakers invited to COLCOA this year are newcomers. The popular competition dedicated to short films is back with a record 23 films selected, and first films represent a significant part of the cinema selection. As in 2017, you will also be able to discover the work of new talent through our Television, Digital Series and Virtual Reality selections.

The future is, ultimately, about a new generation of foreign film viewers invited to the festival through our educational program. Thanks to our historic partner, ELMA, for the 11th year, 3,000 High School students and their teachers will attend the High School screenings.

A few innovations are introduced in 2018 to offer you more opportunities to enjoy French films and series. Three films will be presented as a blind date screening from Tuesday to Thursday. For the first time, the Sunday program continues in the evening with four spectacular premieres scheduled in our three theaters dedicated to Cinema, Television and Digital series. And, on that same Sunday afternoon, we will celebrate our longevity with the return of the 22nd anniversary Cake Party.



THE FLESH OF THE ORCHID

Imprisoned in a mental asylum by her greedy aunt, a young heiress escapes, only to meet up with another fugitive, who's on the run from two contract killers. After a decade of groundbreaking theater work, Patrice Chéreau made his film directorial debut with this bleak, visually-stunning thriller, based on James Hadley Chase's 1948 novel of the same name, his sequel to No Orchids from Miss Blandish. A powerful performance by Charlotte Rampling, a stunning cameo from Simone Signoret, the final screen appearance of the legendary Edwige Feuillère, and the magnificent raindrenched cinematography of the great Pierre Lhomme grace this rare gem of a film... One that is far too rarely seen.

A renowned opera and theater director, Patrice Chéreau has mounted productions the world over. The Flesh of the Orchid (1975) was his stunning film directorial debut. He went on to direct 14 more highly acclaimed films, co-writing many of them. His film credits include L'Homme Blessé (1984), which won the César Award for Best Original Screenplay. Queen Margot (1994) was honored with the Jury Prize and Best Actress Award (for Virna Lisi) at the Cannes Film Festival, then nabbed five César Awards. Those Who Love Me Can Take the

Train (1998) earned him a César Award as Best Director. Intimacy (2001) took four prizes at the Berlin Film Festival, and Son Frère had its World Premiere at COLCOA 2003. Patrice Chéreau passed away, at the age of 68, in 2013.

Mélanie Thierry is riveting as a distraught Marguerite Duras in Emmanuel Finkiel's ambitious adaptation of the legendary writer's semiautobiographical collection of writings, The War: A Memoir. The setting is 1944 Nazi-occupied France. Duras and her husband, Robert Antelme, are working for the Resistance. When he's taken prisoner by the Gestapo and deported, she agonizes over his fate and does everything in her power to hasten his release. Enter Vichy collaborator Rabier (a chilling Benoît Magimel) who plays a sinister, flirtatious game with Duras, setting up a series of clandestine meetings and promising information on Robert's whereabouts. But is he sincere or just trying to dig up dirt on the Resistance underground. The film's evocative French title, La Douleur — literally translated as "the pain" - perhaps best captures the film's theme and harrowing depiction of waiting, grief and inner torment in wartime.





Emmanuel Finkiel began his career as an assistant director, a profession he honed for 16 years, working with such directors as Jean-Luc Godard on Nouvelle Vague (1990) and Krzysztof Kieslowski on his Three Colors trilogy: Blue, White and Red (1993-94). Finkiel's first short film, Madame Jacques sur la Croisette, was honored with the César Award for Best Short Film and his feature directorial debut, Voyages (1999), won the Prix de Jeunesse in Cannes and César Awards for Best First Film and Best Editing. Finkiel has continued to direct shorts and documentaries for the past twenty years. His other features include Nulle Part Terre Promise (2008) and Je Ne Suis Pas un Salaud (2015).



"Makala" means charcoal in Swahili. But this solemn, restrained documentary is not about words. It is almost silent. It is the simple story of Kasongo, a 28-year-old man who dreams of building a home for his wife and daughters. To do so, he fells a colossal tree, turns it into charcoal, stuffs it into colossal bags, precariously loads them onto a rickety bicycle, then — Sisyphus-like — pushes his load up a colossal hill, through clouds of dust and exhaust fumes, to market. Emmanuel Gras' exquisitely photographed, existential film, a loving ode to one man's resolve and backbreaking labor, is said to be the first documentary ever selected by International Critics Week in Cannes, where the film was honored with the 2017 Grand Prize and a Golden Eye Special Mention for Best Documentary.







The feature-length sequel to the director's powerful Oscar-nominated short, *Just Before Losing Everything, Custody* recounts the harrowing post-divorce custody battle of the abused wife and violent, controlling husband of his previous film. Masterfully employing an icy, hyper-realistic style, totally devoid of music (which has been compared to the films of Maurice Pialat, Alfred Hitchcock and Claude Chabrol), the thriller comes to a slow boil, as tensions build and the situation becomes almost unbearable. 
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

PLOT 35

"I lived... we all lived with a ghost," says director Éric Caravaca in the voiceover narration of his deeply moving, poetic film, *Plot* 35. The "ghost" is that of the sister he never knew. He never even knew she existed. Christine died at three, before he and his brother were born. Stranger still, his mother burned every photograph and home movie the child appeared in. Reeling from that discovery, Caravaca sets out to investigate the truth and try to find out why Christine's death was so shameful that his parents chose to methodically erase her entire existence. The resulting film is a fascinating, fearless look — not into the grave at plot 35, but into the heartbreaking, dysfunctional nature of family secrets and lies. It is also a rousing, heartfelt affirmation of the unconscious information we carry within us... and of the very act of remembering.



Writer/director/actor Éric Caravaca studied at the National Drama Academy in Paris and the Actor's Studio in New York. He returned to France, worked in theater and gained recognition for his performance in Samuel Beckett's Waiting for Godot. His breakout film was Francois Dupeyron's C'est quoi la vie? (1999), which earned him a César Award for Most Promising Actor. He has appeared in over 70 films, including The Officer's Ward, also by Dupeyron (to whom Plot 35 is dedicated), which earned him a César Best Actor nomination. Other titles include

Neila is a young Arab woman who grew up in the projects on the outskirts of Paris. She dreams of becoming a lawyer. On her first day at a prestigious law school she's raked over the coals by Pierre, a snooty professor known for his provocative behavior and politically incorrect (i.e. racist) blunders. Their exchange is recorded and goes viral, Pierre is reprimanded by the administration and, to make amends, is strong-armed into coaching Neila for an upcoming courtroom eloquence competition. Cynical and demanding, Pierre may just be the mentor she needs... But first they both have to overcome some serious prejudices. Engaging singer-turned-actress Camelia Jordana and the deft Daniel Auteuil bring spunk, emotion and, indeed, much eloquence to Yvan Attal's polished, inspirational yarn. He has appeared in over 50 films, including Jacques Doillon's Amoureuse (1992), Diane Kurys' Love After Love (1992), Jean-Paul Rappeneau's Bon Voyage (2003), Sydney Pollack's Not The Interpreter (2005), Steven Spielberg's Munich (2005), Dany Boon's R.A.I.D. Special Unit (COLCOA 2017), and Guillaume Canet's Rock'n

Roll (2017). His directorial debut, My Wife Is an Actress (2001), starring real-life companion Charlotte Gainsbourg, was nominated for a César Award for Best First Film. His other feature directing credits include Happily Ever After (2004), Do Disturb (2012) and The Jews (2017).

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


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BARBARA

Jeanne Balibar won the César Award for Best Actress for her role as Brigitte, an actress playing real-life chanteuse Barbara, who remains a beloved musical icon in France some 20 years after her death. Brigitte plies her craft, channeling the late singer for the film's obsessed director... who is played by, none other than, Mathieu Amalric, this film's real-life director. Add to the mix the fact that Balibar and Amalric have a long professional and personal history and you begin to peel away the many layers of this reflexive cinematic onion. This is not your typical biopic! Rather than attempting to fabricate a pat narrative based on the singer's life, Amalric prefers to orchestrate a hypnotic pastiche of overlapping gestures, voices and faces. The result is a delicate, intelligent, moving paean to music, cinema and the art-making process, filled with tenderness — indeed love — for both its eponymous subject and its radiant leading lady. No wonder the film was honored with a special Poetry of Cinema Prize at the 2017 Cannes Film Festival.

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





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THE DINNER GAME

Unbeknownst to him, François is to play the role of Pierre's "jerk" at his weekly "Bring-a-Jerk-to-Dinner" party, where he's sure to impress Pierre's snooty pals and win the evening's top prize. But a series of misadventures, spiraling further and further out of control, keeps the twosome from ever making it to the dinner party. 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

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



Writer/director **Diane Kurys** began her career as an actor. **Peppermint Soda**, her first film behind the camera, won the Prix Louis-Delluc for best first feature. A pivotal figure in the rise of women directors in France, Kurys has always crossed the divide between commercial success and an auteurist, feminist cinema, drawing upon personal experience and memory, and often creating characters based on herself, her sister and her mother. Her second film, *Cocktail Molotov* (1980), recounts Anne's political awakening in the volatile days of

May '68. In Entre Nous (1983), which was nominated for the Best Foreign Film Oscar, Isabelle Huppert plays Kurys' mother, languishing in a loveless marriage and flourishing in the glow of female friendship. And A Man in Love (1987) recounts a woman's journey from frustrated actress to fulfilled writer, much like the director's own career path. Kurys has written and directed 13 films to date, including For a Woman (COLCOA 2014). Her most recent film, Ma Mère est folle, starring Fanny Ardent, is due to be released this year.

Laetitia Dosch is a freewheeling dynamo as Paula, the impulsive, maddening, headstrong, endearing heroine of *Montparnasse Bienvenüe*, writer/director Léonor Serraille's unflinching, picaresque character study of a "young woman" of our times. Paula no sooner arrives in Paris, when she's immediately dumped by her long-term, off-screen lover — a state she is loath to accept. Now virtually homeless, she wanders the streets of the city, crashing with friends, aimlessly adrift, furiously improvising from one moment to the next... and utterly determined to survive.



A native of Lyon, **Léonor Serraille** is a graduate of the La Fémis film school's screenwriting program, and holds a master's degree in comparative literature from La Sorbonne. She previously wrote and directed the short film *Body* (2016). Her first feature, *Montparnasse Bienvenüe* — like Chantal Akerman's 1975 breakout feminist masterpiece *Jeanne Dielman* — was shot with a 100% female crew. The film debuted in the Un Certain Regard section at Cannes in 2017, where it nabbed the coveted Caméra d'Or, the festival's award for best first feature film. The film was also honored, at the 2017 Deauville Film Festival, with the Prix d'Ornano-Valenti for best first film from a French director, an award sponsored by the Franco-American Cultural Fund. The film has also been nominated for César Awards for Best First Film and Most Promising Actress.

But Leila's older brother, Mahmoud, puts the kibosh on those plans the moment he returns from Yemen – complete with beard and prayer beads. He condemns his sister's Western ways and, above all, forbids any contact with her boyfriend. So to get into the family apartment, Armand has a make-over, dons a burga and pretends to be Leila's female Islamic Studies tutor. Plenty of hijinks ensue. But the ruse works... a little too well! Some Like It Veiled takes the cross-dressing conceit of the Billy Wilder classic and brings it to the age of Islamic fundamentalism. The result: an extremely funny, politically-incorrect French farce.



Writer/director/editor **Sou Abadi** was born in Iran and moved to France with her family, at the age of 15, following the Iranian Revolution. She became politically active, studied science for a while, then developed a passion for the cinema. She began her career as an assistant editor, on features like Philippe Le Guay's L'Année Juliette (1995) and Catherine Corsini's *The New Eve* (1999), then worked her way up to editor, with a string of short film and documentary credits to her name. She crossed over into writing and directing with the documentary feature SOS Tehran (2002). Some Like It Veiled is the first narrative feature she has written or directed.

"Hollywood, Bollywood, Nothingwood!" proclaims Salim Shaheen. He has been called the "Afghan Ed Wood" and is certainly the war-torn country's most popular and prolific actor/director/producer.
